

Bristol City. I felt that we owed it to our fans, especially after the home defeat here at the start of the season.



Enjoy the game this afternoon and as always cheer the lads on and I look forward to hopefully seeing you back here on Monday night for the F.A. Cup replay.



# **Programme Collecting**

When people began to go back to the game after the second world war it was a long awaited matter and crowds used to flock to matches bringing along a renewed healthy, happy atmosphere. In these days Clubs would print programmes for 1d, 2d or 3d each according to the size of the paper and programme.

A programme was just a programme then and nobody wanted to keep them, little did they know of what considerable value the printed sheets would be worth in the years to come. If a programme sold out it didn't matter in the least – a reminder of the days action was not important then, only the final score was!

Programme collecting did not begin to flourish until the late 1950's when collectors used to write to the Clubs asking for one or two of their spare programmes – many Clubs were indeed glad to get rid of the unwanted rubbish which was taking up valuable office space.

Dealers would go around the Clubs, usually without an appointment, and make large purchases. A popular line to start with was 10 programmes for 2/- (about 10p today). This continued for many years and gradually it began to catch the eye of youngsters to what is now one of the games most popular pastimes, but on a much different scale.

In the 1970's the nation went decimal and at first this did not make any difference to the prices and the increasing interest in collecting. However the 1972 F.A. Cup Final between Arsenal and Leeds United raised many voices of complaint because the price went up from 10p to 15p! Today the programme alone can cost well over £5.

The great interest in programme collecting remains but there have been several changes in recent years with the collectors' habits and with the printing and distribution of the programmes. Some collectors are rethinking what they should now purchase due to the greatly increased prices. This particularly applies to the specialist collectors who tend to collect certain issues only. Noticeably many are turning to non-League issues whih are individual and there are so many to collect.

Either way, the collecting of football programmes is a thriving, continuously growing, popular pastime.

# SEASON BY SEASON

PAUL PLOWMAN continues his look back at Swindon Town through the years . . .

#### 1974/75

The season did not start on a happy note for the Town. They suffered an opening day defeat, 0-2 at home to Bury. One of the visitors' goals was scored by a young striker making his League debut that day, Andy Rowland.

Only one victory was recorded in the first six games, which included an early exit from the League Cup. Portsmouth recorded a single goal win at the County Ground. A slightly more alarming feature was Swindon's 6-2 demise at Crystal Palace, who were 5-0 ahead with little more than twenty minutes played. Peter Eastoe scored both Town goals and went on to grab a brace on three more occasions during the next month. He finished with 31 goals, five of them came in the F.A. Cup.

Peter should have been declared the Football League's




joint top goalscorer for 1974/ 75, along with Dixie McNeil of Hereford. But McNeil managed to purloin an own goal from somewhere and claim the distinction, much to Mr Eastoe's chagrin.

Danny Williams had wasted no time in securing the permanent transfer of young Eastoe from Wolves, just a week after his return as team boss in March 1974. And the candid Yorkshireman made other shrewd signings in the next few months that brought much needed ability to the club following relegation.

Jim Barron, the former Wolves, Chelsea and Oxford goalkeeper arrived from Nottingham Forest in August and defender Colin Prophett followed, from Norwich, three weeks into the season. Mr Williams also brought the gifted Northern Ireland International Trevor Anderson to the County Ground from Manchester United for £25,000. Another newcomer in the summer was Hugh MacLean, one of Danny's few failures in the transfer market.

The Town came close to regaining their Second Division place at the first attempt. Seven wins out of eleven, with only one defeat, during October and November, put them into second place. But nine losses by mid-March saw them slip back to eighth and although they finished with a flourish, with five wins in the last six games, it was not quite enough. Swindon were still two points behind third placed, and



promoted, Charlton at the death.

In the F.A. Cup, the Town were presented with home ties in each of the first three rounds. Fourth Division sides Reading and Lincoln provided the opposition in the First and Third, Reading offering little resistance and suffering a 4-0 defeat. Lincoln held Swindon to two. In the Second Round, non-League Maidstone tried to confuse their hosts with a strage numbering system (12 and 13 both starting the game!) but still succumbed 3-1. Eastoe scored in all three rounds and was on target again in the Town's 1-1 draw at Upton Park in the Fourth. But Swindon went out 2-1 in the replay, after taking a half-time lead through Anderson. The game brought a new receipts record for the County Ground, despite some of the takings being stolen.

# **Statistics**

Once again this week we've swallowed the statistical guide to the game to report many things you didn't know you didn't know about football.

Amongst British goalscoring records, pride of place belongs to John Petrie with thirteen for Abroath against Bon Accord in September 1885.

The leading League Cup marksman in one match is Frankie Bunn, only last season, with six for Oldham in their Boundary Park defeat of Scarborough. I'm also old enough to remember Ted McDougall stealing back page headlines with his one man demolition of Margate in the F.A. Cup twenty years ago when he netted nine for Bournemouth at Dean Court.

The longest fixture lasted three hours 23 minutes between Stockport and Doncaster in the Second Leg of the Third Division (North) cup at Edgeley Park just after the Second World War.

The most postponements relate to a Scottish cup tie involving Inverness Thistle and Falkirk during 1978/79, called off 29 times because of weather conditions (Swindon Town v Orient has some way to go!!).

The highest transfer fee is loadsalira – the equivalent of 7.7 million pounds was paid by Juventus to Fiorentina for Roberto Baggio – he did score a great goal in Italia '90!!

**British International** appearance records are dominated by modern day players - Peter Shilton's 125 for England and, of course, he missed out on many more caps to Ray Clemence during their period of friendly rivalry for a place between the posts. Pat Jennings 119 for Northern Ireland, again as a goalkeeper. Kenny Dalglish up front for Scotland on 102 occasions. Joey Jones 72 with Wales and equal recognition for the Republic of Ireland's Liam Brady.

The fastest League goals have been clocked at six seconds, most recently by Queens Park Rangers' Tommy Langley in the Second Division encounter with Bolton on October 11th 1980. It's six seconds for the fastest 'own goal' as well – Pat Kruse of Torquay putting past his own 'keeper for Cambridge on January 3rd 1977.

Amongst the 'stoppers', the British club record for preserving a clean sheet in all competitive outings is 1196 minutes, set by Chris Woods with Rangers, 26.11.86 until 31.1.87.

It's timely to note the most protracted F.A. Cup tie in the competition proper was in the Third Round between Stoke and Bury. The Potters triumphed in the *fifth* meeting, 3-2 after 9 hours and 22 minutes



in January 1955.

Closest calls in the championship race have depended on goal average and number scored. Under the former rules Huddersfield were 0.02 ahead of Cardiff in 1923/24 and 15 years later Arsenal had an eight goal advantage over Liverpool after finishing level on points and the difference between their 'for' and 'against' columns. Who can forget the drama of that 'televised tie' – on the radio.

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Little-woods, Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.



## **HULL CITY**

Struggling Hull City have lost their last nine successive away games. They have won just once on their travels this season, 1-0 at Watford in October. Caretaker-Manager Tom Wilson, a former City centre-half, has a number of injury casualties which could restrict his options of team selection today.

With Zambian-born goalkeeper IAIN HESFORD sidelined last week, KEVIN DEARDEN was secured on loan from Tottenham. The 20-year old was on loan here at Swindon during last season and helped the Town to a 2-1 win at Bournemouth in April. Hesford has become a firm favourite with the fans at Boothferry Park following his arrival from Sunderland two years ago.

Hull have also taken fullback DAVID NORTON on loan from Notts County after losing former Swindon player DAVE HOCKADAY early in the Tigers 5-1 defeat at Portsmouth on New Years Day. WAYNE JACOBS Has been a regular occupant of the left-back berth since his arrival from Sheffield Wednesday for £30,000 in March 1988. The central defenders are likely to be NEIL BUCKLEY and MALCOLM SHOTTON.

Hull-born Buckley scored at both ends in City's recent F.A. Cup exit against Notts County. His only previous goal this season was against the Town in the 1-1 draw at Boothferry Park in September. Shotton, now 33, won two championship medals in a seven year spell with Oxford, but has spent the last three years in Yorkshire, with Huddersfield, Barnsley and now Hull. Another injury casualty has been DAVID MAIL, the Bristolian who was with Blackburn for eight years before becoming one of previous manager Stan Ternent's expensive buys last summer. RUSSELL WILCOX also arrived during the close season, from Northampton, but has been unable to command a regular place.

KEN DE MANGE has been recalled from a loan spell at Cardiff to assist City's midfield department. The Irishman, signed from Leeds for £85,000 nearly three years ago, began the season at right-back. Local youngsters GRAEME ATKINSON and PAUL WAITES, both 19, and MIKE SMITH, 22, have also been drafted into midfield recently. HERRY NGATA, a 19year old New Zealander has been on the substitutes bench. More experience is

provided by LEIGH PALIN and IAN McPARLAND. Hull is 25-year old Palin's sixth League club, having arrived from Bradford City for £100,000 last March. McParland, 29, is another former Notts County player, spending eight years at Meadow Lane, where he scored nearly seventy League goals. Yet another loss through injury has been that of long-serving GARRETH ROBERTS, who has been with the club since 1977 and has clocked up more than 400 League appearances.

The Tigers were also without their two leading goalscorers, ANDY PAYTON, 16 goals, and the versatile PETER SWAN (11) in last weekend's 1-0 defeat by Sheffield Wednesday. The two led the way last season, scoring 28 times between them. Payton, a former apprentice, has been with Hull for nearly six years while Swan was signed as a defender from Leeds for £200,000 in March 1989. City's lack of strikers might have brought a recall for former Town man Dave Bamber, but his loan to Blackpool was made permanent a fortnight ago. Instead, McParland was pushed forward and was partnered by PAUL HUNTER. A Scot, Hunter joined Hull from East Fife for £150,000 last March.


#### YOUTH INTERNATIONAL



#### FOCUS ON YOUTH No. 2 **EDWIN MURRAY**

Our young centre back Edwin Murray could well have been on the books of Norwich City Football Club having attended the Centre of Excellence at Carrow Road for two years before his fathers work brought the family to Wiltshire two years ago. While living in Oulton Broad near Lowestoft, Edwin trained with the Canaries and was fortunate enough to travel abroad to play in Youth Tournaments with the First Division outfit.

A change of job brought new surroundings for the Murray family and Edwin applied to Swindon Town to join their Centre of Excellence under Youth Team Manager John Trollope. He was accepted and after leaving Highworth Warneford Comprehensive School he was offered a trainee contract at the County Ground.

Edwin says that the professional players and coaching staff treat the younger players well and that the Club gives players every opportunity to progress having already made himself a regular in the Reserves although still only 17 vears old.

A great believer in the Centre of Excellence, Edwin says that young players can learn a great deal irrespective of the level of football they might be involved in.

Not a great lover of training in the cold weather, Edwin does not relish the early Saturday starts the Youth Team has to make to away games or the late nights when travelling back from Football Combination fixtures as he has to be back in at the County Ground early the next day for the usual apprentice players chores!

A keen West Ham United fan. having been born in Wanstead, Edwin confirmed that although playing at Upton Park was a great experience, his favourite ground so far in his career has been Highbury - mainly for all its facilities. His main ambition in the game is first to be offered a full professional contract with Swindon Town and then to play for the Club at Anfield.
