


GLENN'S VIDEO

Having just completed three successive away games we are now faced with three home games on the trot. This Saturday we entertain Leicester City, kicking-off at 3.00 p.m. before meeting Barnsley here for our final home League game of the season on Saturday 4 May 1991. The curtain comes down on this season on Saturday 11 May when we travel to the City of Stoke when we take on Port Vale at Vale Park, kicking-off at 3.00 p.m.

THE WINNING COMBINATION

SEASON BY SEASON

We continue our look back at Swindon Town through the years . . .

1981/82

NEW FACES

A lot of new faces had arrived at the County Ground during the close season. A player swop brought Gary Emanual from Bristol Rovers in exchange for Brian Williams, while former Swindon Boys player, Kevin Baddeley, arrived on a free transfer from the other Bristol club. Another free transfer brought defender Mike Graham from Bolton. Ian Miller went to Blackburn Rovers for £70,000 and some £30,000 of this money was spent on Gary Williams, a full back come midfield player from Blackpool. There were also changes in the coaching staff with Ken Beamish being appointed as player/coach and Don Rogers taking over as Youth team manager.

CENTENARY MATCH

To celebrate the Club's centenary, Cup holders Ipswich Town visited the County Ground. Ipswich won the game 2-0 but left behind many friends with their generosity in coming to play along with a beautiful porcelain Shire horse which still adorns the Board Room Trophy Cabinet.

FINE START

The opening game saw Town put four goals past Wimbledon's Dave Beasant in a 4-1' win and they went one better in the next home game, beating Preston 4-0. If there was disappointment in a 5-2 aggregate League cup defeat by Wrexham, great consolation followed when a 2-1 win at Exeter put Swindon on top of the Division Three table.

GOODBYE FRED AND HARRY It was sad to note the passing in quick succession of two men who

had played important roles in the club. Fred Ford, who had completed what was a probably unique treble of being manager of Swindon, Bristol City and Bristol Rovers before going on to be an extremely successful Youth team manager of Oxford United, died. He was soon followed by Harry Cousins, who had played 263 League games for the club and done much to re-establish football at the County Ground after World War II. Harry had been first team trainer for 20 years before a spell of six years in charge of the Youth team. Later in the season, Mayor, Arthur Miles, opened the Harry Cousins Suite in his memory.

HOWARD PRITCHARD AND THE CUP

Howard Pritchard had arrived from Bristol City at the start of the season. He earned the nickname 'the flying camel' from some supporters on account of his fast but ungainly style. He certainly gave Swindon's non-League opponents the hump in the Cup. Taunton had taken the lead in the First Round only to go down to two Pritchard goals in the space of three minutes just before half time. Only 2,890 were at the County Ground to see Swindon beat Sutton 2-1 in Round Two. This time 'the camel' flew in with a winner just ten seconds from time.

CUP FURY AND CASH CRISIS

The F.A. Cup Third Round saw Swindon drawn to play at Luton. Town went behind to a goal from the penalty spot but had fought back to equalise when Paul Rideout broke through. Luton goalkeeper, Jake Findlay, raced out of his area and bundled him over, but the Swindon player regained his balance and ran on to

'score'. However, referee Gray had blown up and awarded a free kick. Swindon went down 2-1 and at the end of the game even the normally mild mannered John Trollope was provoked to protest over what he claimed was the worst decision he had ever seen. Chairman Cecil Green pointed out how the decision had probably cost Swindon thousands of pounds at a time the club could ill afford it. The previous year's accounts had shown a profit of £62,455 but this was only due to a profit of £190,000 on transfers. The club was losing £3,500 a week and John Trollope was not allowed any money to strengthen his squad. Arkell's brewery helped out by donating 5p to the club for every pint of beer sold at the County Ground.

SUNDAY SOCCER EXPERIMENT

The weather gods had not been with Swindon's aim to experiment with Sunday soccer. Snow prevented planned Sunday matches against Chester and Oxford, but when the match with Exeter did get played Kevin Baddeley scored his first goal for the club to give Swindon a 3-2 victory.

SUPPORTERS CO-OPERATIVE

Manager John Trollope, along with Secretary Bob Jefferies and Ken Beamish, launched a fund to buy a player and a Supporters Cooperative was set up to help raise funds for the club. This led to the arrival of Mike Carter on loan from Bolton. An E.G.M. saw two resolutions passed; one allowing one vote per share, the other the issue of an additional £200,000 worth of share capital with which it was hoped to reduce the club's debts.

F.A. Cup Soccer

A Sunday afternoon slumped in front of the television every April now seems inevitable with the advent of the F.A. Cup semi-finals being screened live continuously, save for a soap opera interruption in the shape of Eastenders.

There have been goals galore on this occasion in 1990 and 1991 – let's hope it's an omen for the future.

There's always a great day out for the armchair viewer on Cup Final day itself. I had to ask for Saturday afternoons off school in the late 1970s so as not to miss a minute of the action. I think Wembley matches in those days made the most mark on me.

My earliest memories are Chelsea/Leeds 21 years ago, the replay winner headed home in extra-time by David Webb. Twelve months later Arsenal clinched half of the double, again in the additional thirty minutes, through a scrambled goal by Eddie Kelly – earlier Charlie

George's long range strike set the crowd alight. In 1972 Mick Jones dislocated his arm as Alan Clarke's header beat the Gunners for Leeds, who went on to lose to Bob Stokoe's Sunderland including goalkeeping hero Jim Montgomery and scorer Ian Porterfield.

Liverpool were next to lift the famous trophy thanks to their 3-0 defeat of Newcastle. Remember Alan Taylor, who hit the headlines as West Ham won against Fulham, or Bobby Stokes, Southampton's marksman against Manchester United?

glory, at Liverpool's
expense. One year on
Ipswich were triumphant,
thanks to Roger Osbourne,
runners-up Arsenal then
defeated the Old Trafford
side 3-2 with all the action in

Alan Sunderland's decisive
strike, before losing to West
Ham and a Trevor

Tottenham took the first trip up the famous thirtynine steps for the next two campaigns, replay winners over Manchester City and Queens Park Rangers respectively. Who can forget Ricky Villa's dribble or Glenn Hoddle's penalty nine years ago.





Having been defeated at Meadow Lane by Tottenham Hotspur in the F.A. Cup, Notts County must now face their rivals from across the Trent playing at Wembley in the Final last month. However, for the second year in succession County will themselves be out for an appearance at the Twin Towers in the end of season Barclays League play-offs.

In 1984 and 1985 County tumbled from the First Division to the Third before manager Neil Warnock took them to last season's play-offs. Like us they were successful, yet here we are playing each other this season!

Notts County are, in fact, the oldest club in the Football League. Formed in 1862, County were founder members of the League in 1888. Since the formation of the League County have swapped Divisions no fewer than 22 times.

Neil Warnock took over as manager at Meadow Lane in January 1989. As a player he wore the colours of eight different clubs but is better known for steering Scarborough to the GM Vauxhall Conference championship and a place in the Football League in 1987.

Lining-up this evening we should see in goal Steve Cherry who is, in fact, Nottingham born. He earned England Youth honours while with Derby County and has spent spells with Walsall and Plymouth Argyle as well as time on loan with Port Vale and Chesterfield. He has given excellent value for money since County paid £70,000 to bring him back to his home town. He was ever-present last season and equalled the club record of 18 clean sheets in League matches.


Two brothers currently at Notts County are Christian and Craig Short. Both were previously with Neil Warnock at Scarborough. Christian broke into League football last year at Seamar Road and soon attracted the attention of top clubs. He went on tour with Manchester United who wanted to sign the 20 year old full back, but a fee could not be agreed so County paid £100,000 to re-unite him with Craig who made his debut for County in August 1988. He didn't go unnoticed last season and was the subject of a £600,000 offer from Norwich City during the summer.

Mitcham born Paul Harding was valued at £60,000 when he joined County from Barnett in September last year as part of an £85,000 package which also involved David Regis. He struggled to make the breakthrough into League football until Neil Warnock invited him to take a gamble at the age of 26.

County's longest serving player is 23 year old Dean Yates. A former England U-21 International, Yates has had numerous big bids rejected by the club for his services

including a £3/4m offer from Aston Villa during the close season.

Don O'Riordan rejected the chance to become player/ manager of Grimsby Town and now coaches the Reserve Team at Meadow Lane as well as playing a vital part in the County defence.

Dean Thomas moved to Meadow Lane for £175,000 shortly before last season's deadline and instead of dropping into Division Four with Northampton Town he now finds himself two Divisions higher. It was the end of a long chase by Neil Warnock when he finally clinched the deal to sign Thomas, who made an immediate impact during the final shove towards promotion.

29 year old club captain Phil Turner was rated at £125,000 in the deal which took Gary Mills to Leicester City for £300,000 in March 1989. He made his debut for County against Reading in the same year and has now made over 100 appearances.

Fully justifying his £150,000 fee paid to West Bromwich Albion, Portsmouth born Kevin Bartlett's pace earned him nine goals in 19 League matches last season.

Mark Draper is a promising midfielder who joined County on the Youth Trainee scheme and was signed as a professional while still a 17 year old. He made his debut in September 1988 in the Littlewoods Cup.

Like Draper, Tommy Johnson was a Trainee at County and is in the middle of a three year contract. Born in Gateshead, Johnson joined County in preference to his local team Newcastle United because he felt that he had a better chance of making an early impact. He has no cause for complaint, scoring 20 goals in his first full season including one in the play-off final last year against Tranmere Rovers.

David Regis is another who made a late entry into League football when, at the age of 26, he moved from Barnet. The cousin of Cyril Regis, David impressed Neil Warnock when Notts County played a pre-season friendly against the Conference side.

Alan Paris played in excess of 200 games for Peterborough United and Leicester City and has created a keen competition for places since his arrival from Filbert Street

THE Y.T. IN FOOTBALL

The Youth Trainee scheme in Professional Football was first introduced in 1983, and at present all but one of the Football League clubs are taking on apprentices through the Y.T. scheme in place of the old apprenticeship scheme. We ourselves are on the scheme and at present have 10 players on our books.

The Y.T. compares favourably with the old apprenticeship scheme for several reasons. It is at present funded by the Manpower Services Commission (although this changes at the end of the season) and not the club themselves as in previous years. With the financial burden eased, clubs are able to take on more apprentices – giving them a larger pool of younger players to choose from. For example, prior to the Y.T. scheme League clubs had approximately 200 apprentices in comparison to the present number of over 600.


More importantly the Y.T. provides the apprentices with the opportunity to extend their range of skills beyond football practice. Apprentices are required to spend at least 20

weeks in 'off the job' training. This allows them to obtain 10 nationally recognised qualifications in the leisure and recreation field. Trainces who want to further their education can use their time studying for the 'A' level of their choice.

Our trainees presently attend college in Oxford or Bristol.

As well as the usual football training the lads also have a programme of work experience where they learn about all aspects of a football club which includes working in the Box Office, Promotions and Administration Offices as well as ground maintenance and with the club physio, Kevin Morris, on the prevention and treatment of injuries.

A Y.T. contract lasts for two years and during that time the club tries to ensure that the trainees understand the importance of organisation and discipline and how these qualities can be channelled to enhance their performance on the pitch.



Another keen interest is driving, having passed his test just four days after his seventeenth birthday.
