





THE WINNING COMBINATION

SEASON BY SEASON

We continue our look back at Swindon Town through the years . . .

1982/83

NEW LAWS

A new rule was brought in at the beginning of this season which forced the goalkeeper to release the ball at four paces. The F.A. also sent out a directive that a player who committed a deliberate foul with the intention of preventing a goal should be sent off.

GOOD START

Swindon's first ever season in Division Four opened with a home game against Port Vale. Swindon looked by far the better side, but squandered chances leaving Rideout's goal the decider in a 1-0 win. Town were less successful in their first away match, going down at Blackpool 2-1 with debutant Ray Baverstock giving away a penalty. After eleven games, Swindon were lying in sixth position with nineteen points.

SOUR END TO MILK CUP

A disputed goal just before half time at Ashton Gate saw Swindon go out in the First Round of the Milk Cup, beaten 3-2 on aggregate by Bristol City after winning the first leg 2-1.

CARTER DISPUTE

Roy Carter had been placed on the transfer list at his own request and was not featuring in the first team. With the club still in a grave financial situation with a £93,749 loss on the previous season and losing £3,000 a week, this was regarded as something of a luxury by the Board. Manager, John Trollope, was unhappy that Carter should be allowed to go on loan to promotion rivals Torquay and, as if to rub the salt in the wound, it was a foul on Carter that led to Swindon's Howard Pritchard being

sent off in the 1-1 draw between the two clubs at Plainmoor. Later in the season Roy Carter, who made 199 League appearances for Swindon, joined the Devon club for a small fee. Happily by this time finances were a little easier as four new directors had joined the club, bringing with them a cash injection of £100,000.

CUP SUCCESS

Goals from Charlie Henry and Paul Rideout account for non-League Wealdstone in the First Round of the Cup. However, in Round Two they made less good use of home advantage, allowing a two goal lead against Brentford to slip away. In the fiercely fought replay, which saw Swindon's Kevin Baddeley and Brentford's Terry Hurlock sent off, extra time goals by Pritchard and Paul Batty, who had an excellent game, gave Swindon victory by 3 goals to 1. Round Three saw Swindon achieve a crushing 7-0 victory over Aldershot, Both Howard Pritchard and Andy Rowlands scored hat tricks in this match. The latter's was a hat trick in the genuine sense of the word, all three goals coming in succession in the space of 16 minutes. Despite giving a fine account of themselves the Robins went down 3-1 at Turf Moor, largely due to defensive errors.

ASHTON GATE AGONY

It is often said those whom the gods wish to destroy they first make mad. The destruction of Swindon's promotion hopes began at Ashton Gate. Bristol City scored a last minute equaliser when the ball appeared to be kicked from the hands of Jimmy Allan. Gary Emanuel protested too fiercely and was sent off by referee Maurice

Robinson. Swindon were still well placed with 42 points from 22 games putting them fourth, high enough to get them up if they maintained that position. Sadly, after this game it all began to fall apart. The team still had its moments, as with a Rideout hat trick in the victory over Rochdale, but more often it was a tale of misfortunes and missed chances. Swindon, denied what seemed a penalty, drew 1-1 at home to Bury, Rideout missed a penalty in the game at Mansfield and Swindon lost 1-0.

TROLLOPE'S REIGN ENDS

Home defeats against Chester (3-2) and Darlington (2-1) left the crowd baying for blood and they got it when Trollope resigned to take over Youth team duties. Ken Beamish, his assistant, was appointed caretaker/manager and saw the team achieve a goalless draw at York in his first game in charge.

THAMES VALLEY ROYALS

Amidst the gloom, one piece of good news was that Robert Maxwell was not going to include Swindon in his proposed merger of Oxford United and Reading. Chairman Cecil Green dismissed any suggestion of amalgamation, refusing to take lessons from a club just out of the Southern League.

SWINDON BOYS

With cash in short supply, the Town had turned to local talent and no fewer than five members of former Swindon Boys teams featured in matches. They were Kevin Baddeley, Ray Baverstock, Martin Blackler, Charlie Henry and Paul Rideout (top scorer with 23 goals).

MUSICAL SOCCER!

It's that time of year again – the traditional F.A. Cup songs are recorded!

According to reports, the fact that Arsenal went into a studio before their semi-final against Tottenham inspired Spurs to victory – now the White Hart Lane club has a song called 'The Arsenal' with Chas & Dave, which hasn't apparently gone down well at Highbury!

Musical soccer memories, I suppose, start in 1970 with the England World Cup squad's 'Back Home' as something for them to hum while they were away in Mexico. It reached number one in the hit parade and was on the charts for sixteen weeks. Twelve years later, 'This Time (We'll Get It Right)/ England We'll Fly The Flag' was a number two tune. The 1986 effort wasn't nearly as popular - 'We've Got The Whole World At Our Feet/ When We Are Far From Home' peaked(!) at 66!

By 1988, the International squad had teamed up with the sound of Stock, Aitken & Waterman for 'All The Way' – no higher than 64 in the top 100.

Last year – 'World in Motion' by New Order was the nation's favourite in June – helped, no doubt, by the Kenneth Woolstenholme commentary – they think it's all over and John Barnes' rapping ability.

Club songs were 'Trendy' two decades ago with 'Blue Is The Colour', the Chelsea anthem and 'Nice One Cyril, Nice One Son, Nice One Cyril, Let's 'Ave Another One' for Tottenham, 'I'm Forever Blowing Bubbles' with the West Ham faithful and 'You'll Never Walk Alone' adopted by the Kop at Anfield.

Who could forget 'Ossie's Dream' on reaching Wembley ten years ago, the fifth most popular song with the record-buying public or

four years ago – Hoddle

as a male vocal duo – from
the United Kingdom – with
'Diamond Lights' –
catalogue number Kick 1 on





Recent results have, like ourselves, put Leicester City into the relegation zone battling to avoid the drop into the Third Division for the first time in the history of the club.

Former Everton Manager Gordon Lee took over the hot seat at Filbert Street earlier this season following David Pleats departure. Lee was formerly Assistant Manager at the club.

The coaching staff at Filbert Street is completed with the experience of Bobby Roberts, Colin Murphy and Ali Mauchlen who acts as player/coach.

Keeper Martin Hodge, was ever-present last season but has only just returned to the side, having made just three first team appearances earlier this season. Made available for transfer during the summer, Hodge signed in at Leicester City for £½2m in August 1988 from Sheffield Wednesday with whom he made in excess of 250 appearances in his five years at Hillsborough. He has previously been with Plymouth Argyle and Everton and has had loan spells with Oldham Athletic, Gillingham and Preston North End.

Marc North joined Leicester City from Grimsby Town in March 1989 but his early progress was hampered by a broken leg. Last season he featured regularly on the substitute bench and had the knack of coming on and scoring some vital goals.

Romford born Tony Spearing was another who suffered injury problems last season and has only featured in a handful of games this term. A former apprentice with Norwich City, Spearing made 82 first team appearances while at Carrow Road and has had loan periods at Stoke City and Oxford United. A £100,000 transfer took him to Filbert Street in July 1988.


Captain, Ali Mauchlen, joined City in August 1985 from Motherwell in a joint deal along with Gary McAllister. He has now made well over 200 appearances for the club and is also currently involved on the coaching side of the team.

26 year old Fulwood born Steve Walsh was a Wembley winner with his previous club, Wigan Athletic, in the 1985 Freight Rover Final before joining Leicester in June 1986 He had a reputation for a fiery temperament in his youth but has now matured into a confident central defender.

Tony James established himself as a first team regular towards the end of last season following his signing from Lincoln City on the first day of the season. He has been a

regular in the side this season and is noted for his prodigious throw-ins.

A £300,000 signing from Oldham Athletic in August 1989 is 25 year old Tommy Wright who has also been with Leeds United. He has added balance to City's left side and has Scottish Youth and U-21 caps to his credit.

Leading scorer this season is David Kelly who soon recaptured his goalscoring touch once he had settled in at Filbert Street following his £300,000 move from West Ham United in March 1990. Formerly with Walsall, Kelly regained his Republic of Ireland place in time to be included in their squad for the World Cup in Italy.

Midfielder Ricky Hill joined Leicester City in August last year after a season abroad with French Second Division side Le Havre. Born in Hammersmith he has earned three full England caps during a 13 year career at Luton Town where he appeared in two Littlewoods Cup finals and clocked up over 500 appearances notching over 60 goals.

Gary Mills recovered from a serious early season injury last year to earn a club double at Filbert Street of 'Player of the Season' and 'Goal of the Season'. Signed from Notts County in March 1989 for £275,000, Gary had previously been a European Cup winner while with neighbours Nottingham Forest. He has two England U-21 caps amongst his collection.

England Youth International Kevin Russell was signed from Wrexham, with whom he spent two seasons, in June 1989 for a fee of £175,000. Another of the unfortunates to be hampered by injury last year Russell has netted four goals since his return to the first team last month.

Although born in Perth in Australia, 20 year old David Oldfield is an England U-21 International who joined Leicester City in January 1990 in the exchange deal which took Wayne Clarke to Maine Road. Oldfield started his League career as an apprentice with Luton Town.

Another of the ex-Kenilworth Road contingent now with Leicester City, Rob Johnson moved to Filbert Street in a part exchange deal for Mick Kennedy on the eve of last season. Born in Bedford, Johnson made his debut for The Hatters as long ago as 1983 and won a Littlewoods Cup winners medal during his time there.

So to this afternoon, and a game when both sides know that three points could well ensure Second Division survival.







27th April 1926. Football League teams review the first season in which the offside law was changed (from three defenders to two required in front of an attacker). Three days later Huddersfield Town clinch their third successive Football League First Division Championship, the first club to achieve this feat since professional football was first established in England in 1888. The offside change seemed to work, an extra tally of 23 goals for the Division One champions. Plymouth Argyle, in Division Three (South), go from 77 to 107 goals as they finish second in successive seasons, for Swindon fans only an extra three goals in sixth place.

27th April 1955. Swindon defeat Coventry City 3-0 at the County Ground but finish 21st in Division Three (South). Worse is to follow as they finish bottom and next to bottom in the following seasons.

27th April 1957. Swindon defeat Colchester United 4-1 but this does not stop them from finishing 23rd in Division Three (South). Norwich City finish in bottom spot but their East Anglian neighbours Ipswich Town top the League and gain promotion to Division Two.


27th April 1963. Swindon win 2-1 at the County Ground defeating Bournemouth and Bert Head's 'Babes' take another giant step towards their first promotion in the Football League.

27th April 1985. Only 6,172 at Molineux and even a sit down protest attracts only one spectator as Wolves await the drop to Division Three, on their way to Division Four for the first time.

27th April 1987. Swindon Town prepare for their Third Division promotion game with Notts County the next day. Swindon win 3-2, the first team to win at Meadow Lane in 18 games.

27th April 1988. Gary Pallister makes a good international debut in England's 0-0 draw in Hungary.
