As it is the last time this season I will be writing to you, can I wish you all an enjoyable summer and look forward to seeing you back here, refreshed, in August.

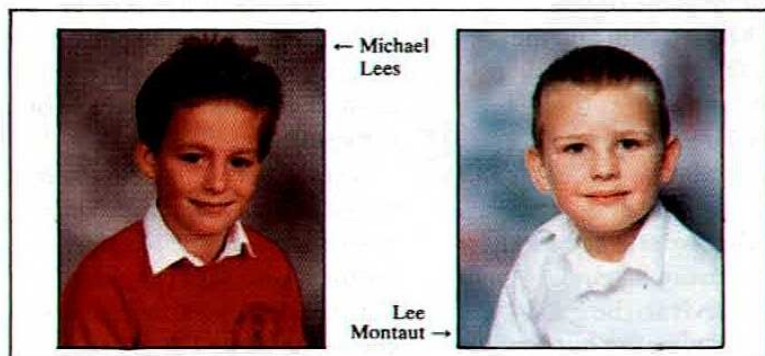

This morning the Youth Team travelled to play Bristol Rovers at Keynsham in the South East Counties League. They play their final game of this term against Maidstone United at Fawkham in Kent next Saturday.

FINAL

The Reserves will play their Wiltshire F.A. Premier Shield Final vs Calne Town on Tuesday 7th May 1991. This game is to be played at Trowbridge Town F.C., kicking-off at 7.30 p.m.

PROGRAMME FAIRS

Collectors will be interested in the following Football Programme Fairs on Sunday week. The 13th Annual Swindon Fair is being staged at the Supporters Club at the County Ground from 10.30 a.m. until 2.00 p.m. Admission is 30p. 2.30 p.m. and on Sunday 23rd June 1991 at Royals Rendezvous, Reading Football Club, Tilehurst Road, Reading, again from 11.00 a.m. until 2.30 p.m. Leading national dealers are to be in attendance at all venues.

BARCLAYS LEAGUE PLAY-OFFS PROFILE

As the season approaches its climax, the significant number of issues which remain undecided is a testimony to the present League structure. The introduction of the Play-Off system in 1986-87 has without doubt had a tremendous impact upon the closing stages of each successive season. This, combined with three points for a win, has meant that more clubs than ever before remain in contention for promotion from the Second, Third and Fourth Divisions right up to the final Saturday of the season.

This year, of course, there is the added incentive for chasing clubs of additional promotion places, the most that have ever been available. With the end of the current campaign only two weeks away, there are still around thirty clubs actively involved in the hunt for a promotion place, either automatically or via the Barclays League Play-Offs.

The structure of the Barclays League Play-Offs remains the same as in previous years. Semi-Finals are contested on a home and away basis, with extra-time only being played if aggregate scores remain level at the end of the second leg. If any tie is still undecided, then the away goals rule would apply, followed, if necessary, by penalties.

The Barclays League Play-Off Finals will again be held at Wembley Stadium, but, with the Spring Bank Holiday a week

earlier this year, over a Friday, Saturday and Sunday period. The timetable is as follows:

Friday 31st May

Fourth Division Play-Off Final (kick-off 8.00 p.m.)

Saturday 1st June

Third Division Play-Off Final (kick-off 3.00 p.m.)

Sunday 2nd June

Second Division Play-Off Final (kick-off 3.00 p.m.)

PRESENTATIONS

Prior to kick-off this afternoon there are the usual end of season presentations to the Player(s) of the Season. The Travel Club are making their presentation along with the Evening Advertiser's readers award which is being made to the winner by Alan Johnson, the Sports Editor at The Adver.

SUMMER

Contrary to belief the Club doesn't close down straight after the last game of the season – in fact things are just as busy during the close season as during the actual playing season.

The Ticket Office will shortly be sending out the Season Ticket renewal forms – but with the changes in Shrivenham Road, supporters in this area may not hear from us at the time as ticket holders in other parts of the ground. Numerous other changes are planned to bring the facilities at the County Ground up to the standard expected of the club.

NEW SEASON

Discussions are underway to bring a top class European side to the County Ground for a prestigious pre-season friendly as a curtain raiser for the 1991/92 Barclays League season, which kicks-off on Saturday 17th August 1991.

SEASON BY SEASON

We continue our look back
at Swindon Town through the years . . .

1983/84

Some indication of the rapid change of personnel at this time is shown by the fact that of the 30 players featured on the club's pre-season photo the previous year only nine remained with the club. Among the newcomers were Dave Hockaday from Blackpool, Nigel Gray from Orient, Gary Nelson from Southend and Alan Mayes, who returned on a free transfer only two and a half years after Chelsea paid £200,000 for him. There were also changes in the Boardroom, with Maurice Earle replacing Cecil Green as Chairman. Prior to the start of the season Paul Rideout had been sold to Aston Villa in a deal which eventually proved worth £250,000. This did not seem to hinder the team's striking power in the first home game of the season when Chester City were defeated 4-0. Alas, this form was not maintained and a defeat at Darlington before the month was out had Adver reporter Clive King comparing the players' killer instincts to those of a cage of hamsters.

SPINE CHANGE

October saw the whole spine of the Swindon team change. First, in the home match with Rochdale, Jimmy Allan suffered an arm injury which sadly brought his career to an end at the age of thirty. He had made 371 appearances for Swindon and, in a position where players tend to mature with age, might have made many more. Scott

Endersby, a close season signing from Carlisle, replaced him and quickly proved popular, winning the Swindon Player of the Year award at the end of the season. Nigel Gibson, a tall and elegant centre half, gave way to Scottish Youth International Simon Gibson, who came on loan from Chelsea and later signed full-time for the Town. Up front Jimmy Quinn, a regular scorer with the reserves, was brought in with Andy Rowland dropping back to strengthen the defence.

CUP SUCCESS

The Milk Cup had seen Swindon go out 4-2 on aggregate to Plymouth in the First Round. They enjoyed more luck in the F.A. Cup. The First Round saw them travel to Kettering where they gained revenge for a defeat by the Poppies in the sixties with an emphatic 7-0 victory. Round Two saw Swindon given the tough task of going to the Den where they overcame Millwall 3-3. The defeat was soured by the sending off of Charlie Henry and the Third Round Draw, made on the evening of the match thus denying fans the weekend dreams of Manchester United or Liverpool at home. Swindon were faced with a trip to Carlisle's Brunton Park and death without glory. Swindon held on for a 1-1 draw in Cumbria and goals by Quinn, Batty and Rowland in the replay took them through to Round Four. At last Swindon got a home draw. Quinn scored his sixth cup goal of the

season but it was not enough to stop Blackburn winning 3-1. At least gate receipts of £19,650 produced some consolation.

LEAGUE FAILURE

A 3-1 home defeat by Chesterfield left Swindon in sixteenth position with 29 points from 23 games. By the end of the season they had slipped one place lower with a final total of 58 from 46. The crowds were hardly flocking to the County Ground and the average home gate was just 3,155. The clock on the Stratton Bank, presented by local jewellers Deacons when the Town won promotion, blew down and seemed to symbolise the club's declining fortunes. Some cheers was provided by a 3-1 victory over Oxford in the Associate Members Cup but defeat in Round Three at Millwall meant Swindon could not even make the easy way to Wembley. Even the Wilts Centenary Cup nearly eluded the club's grasp, penalties being needed at the end of 120 minutes to defeat Trowbridge at the County Ground.

MAYES TOP SCORER

Mayes was the club's leading League scorer with 17, nobody else even reached double figures. Gary Emmanuel made most appearance with 41 and a little historical footnote was made when Robert Woodruff Junior played in the last home match of the season against Peterborough to join the ranks of fathers and sons who have played for the same League club.

We were sent all the 'bumph' well in advance of the play-offs and reserved our places conditional on Swindon getting there – the chance to report on Blackburn v Sunderland wouldn't have appealed to us as Wiltshire's radio.

With our engineers' inside knowledge, we opted to sit on the opposite side to the normal 'radio room' and positioned ourselves high up on the TV gantry, very near where John Motson will be for the forthcoming F.A. Cup Final. It gave us a perfect view, although we seemed to be carrying our equipment up staircase after staircase to get there! Our passes allowed us into this part of the ground as well as the pitch area of the famous stadium and the

necessary tea-lounge for refreshment, although I don't remember having the time to indulge. The main memore has to be standing on the grass by the goalposts where the World Cup was won, numerous F.A. Cup Finals played and countless pop promotions staged. We've been lucky enough to 'broadcast live' from a number of grounds, although we're not yet members of the distinguished '92' club. Our vantage points could be almost anywhere – at Ewood Park we were in with the Rovers' fans who didn't understand the excitement in our voices when WE went in front. Plymouth's Home Park also saw us in amongst the supporters – all very well, but the language can sometimes be . . . colourful!

The press seats are the obvious option, although at Carrow Road in this season's F.A. Cup the windows steamed over – for whatever reason! It must



be the air in Norwich.

The reporter's lot is not always a happy one – what DO you do if the mobile phone breaks down or the presenter at the studio doesn't answer?

Talking to colleagues across the country there is one aspect of the job I understand we're lucky with at the County Ground – the Town's willingness to talk. Long may it continue, and thanks for your co-operation in 1990/91.

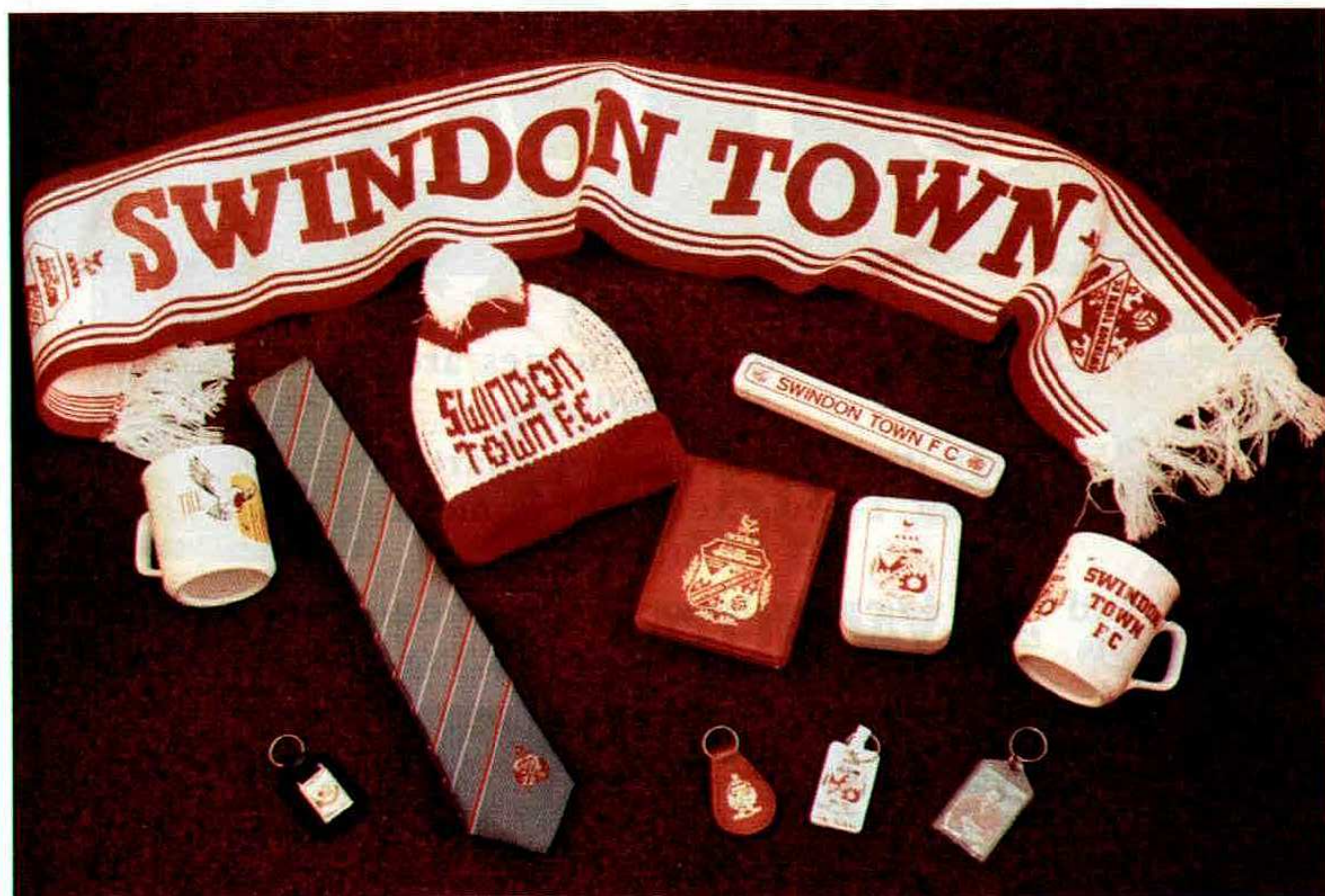

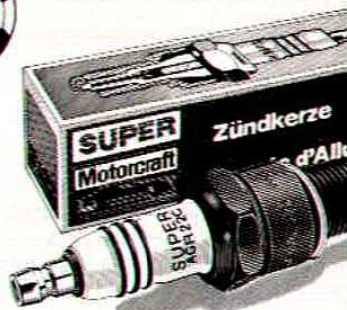

Barnsley came to the County Ground this afternoon having slipped up in recent weeks in their drive for a place in the end of season Play-Offs which could have given the South Yorkshire outfit the chance of First Division football for the first time in their 104 year history.

Manager Mel Machin moved in at Oakwell following the departure of Allan Clarke in December 1989. Machin, a former player with Port Vale, Gillingham, A.F.C. Bournemouth and Norwich City, was Assistant Manager at Carrow Road before a move to Maine Road where, as manager, he took Manchester City back into Division One. In his first game at Oakwell, on Saturday 30th December, Machin led his new team to a 1-0 victory over the Second Division leaders Leeds United, and that was the start of an excellent spell which brought only seven defeats in twenty eight League and Cup matches. Machin rang the changes to such an extent that only four players who had played earlier in the season, survived the clear out. As new players came into the club they began playing with such style Machin avoided relegation in his first season and a new wave of optimism swept across Oakwell.

Another ex-Canary at Barnsley is 'keeper Clive Baker, who joined Norwich City straight from school at the age of 18 and made his League debut one year later against Newcastle United. In seven seasons at Carrow Road he made only fourteen appearances in the First Division during which time he was understudy to Kevin Keelan and Chris Woods. His move to Barnsley in August 1984 gave him a first team opportunity after three years in the Canaries Reserves. Clive has been an ever-present this season, highlighted by a

memorable performance against Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough in the Zenith Data Systems Cup.

Brian McCord, a native of Derby, joined his home town club on leaving school. The 21 year old made a big impression during a five match loan spell at Oakwell just before Christmas 1989 and was signed from County in March the following year for a fee of £80,000.

Defender Gary Fleming linked up again with Mel Machin in March 1990 from Manchester City, who paid Nottingham Forest £150,000 for his services for whom he made seventy four first team appearances. Recently recalled to the Northern Ireland squad, Fleming has played in a variety of defensive positions this season, with equal distinction, although he probably enjoyed his best spell as sweeper.

Ian Banks originally joined the Oakwell staff in 1977 as an apprentice and progressed through the ranks before establishing himself as a first team regular. In August 1983 he moved to Leicester City for a fee of £100,000 and subsequently played for Huddersfield Town, Bradford City and West Bromwich Albion before rejoining Barnsley in July 1989.

A model of consistency in the heart of defence is 29 year old Mark Smith, who spent ten years with Sheffield Wednesday before moving to Plymouth Argyle in the summer of 1988. A temporary transfer to Oakwell in November was made permanent one month later.

Former Youth Trainee Carl Tiler made his first team debut for Barnsley at West Bromwich Albion at the end of the 1987/88 season

while still an apprentice. He signed apprentice forms at the start of the following season and has recently been involved with the England U-21 team.

23 year old Brendan O'Connell was born in London and started his career with Portsmouth but did not make his Football League debut until joining Exeter City in the 1986/87 season. From Exeter he moved North where he joined Burnley and in his first season there finished top scorer with thirteen goals. He signed in at Oakwell during March 1990 for a fee of £45,000.

Striker Andy Rammell joined Barnsley in September 1990 from Manchester United. Nuneaton born, Andy originally played for Nuneaton Borough and Atherstone in the Beazer Homes League before his move to Old Trafford.

High-scoring Andy Saville joined his home town Club of Hull City when he left school and had a subsequent move to Walsall in 1989. He moved to Barnsley just before deadline day at the end of last season and has only missed two games this season.

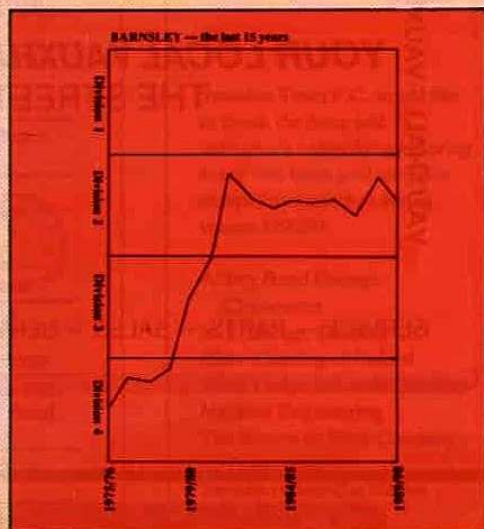
A former Barnsley Schoolboy player, Steve Agnew, joined the Oakwell staff as an apprentice in 1982 and signed professional in November 1983. He made his League debut against Charlton Athletic in April the following year. His debut lasted for all of fifteen seconds when he came on as substitute for Carl Airey. Steve was appointed Team Captain last season and always tries to lead by example from midfield.

Glaswegian Owen Archdeacon joined Celtic on leaving school and progressed through the ranks to make seventy first team appearances including European Competitions. He has two

Scottish Premiership medals to his name as well as a Skol Cup runners up medal. A former Scottish Youth and U-21 International, he joined Barnsley in June 1989 for a fee of £80,000. 20 year old Gerry Taggart signed from Manchester City shortly after the arrival at Oakwell of his former manager in January 1990 for £70,000. He was born in Northern Ireland and has just retired from duty with the International party.

Former England U-21 International John Deehan rejoined Mel Machin in January 1990 on a free transfer from Maine Road. A former apprentice with Aston Villa, Deehan moved to West Bromwich Albion for £400,000 in September 1976. A Milk Cup winners medal was to come his way during his four year spell with Norwich City before a player exchange deal took him to East Anglian neighbours Ipswich Town in June 1986. Deehan joined Manchester City for £10,000 in 1988 but did not feature in their first team.

Stuart Rimmer was an apprentice at Everton and made just three first team appearances at Goodison when a £10,000 transfer took the Southport born youngster to Chester City with whom he made in excess of 100 appearances. Rimmer was transferred for £205,000 to Watford in March 1988 but, after 10 appearances for The Hornets, a similar fee eight months later took him to Notts County. He was to spend even less time at Meadow Lane as a £150,000 deal in February 1989 was to take him to Walsall. The financially troubled West Midlands outfit recouped their money just on deadline day this year when Rimmer moved to Oakwell.

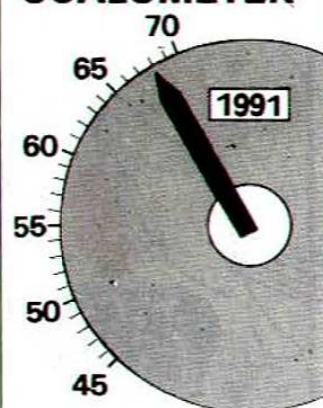

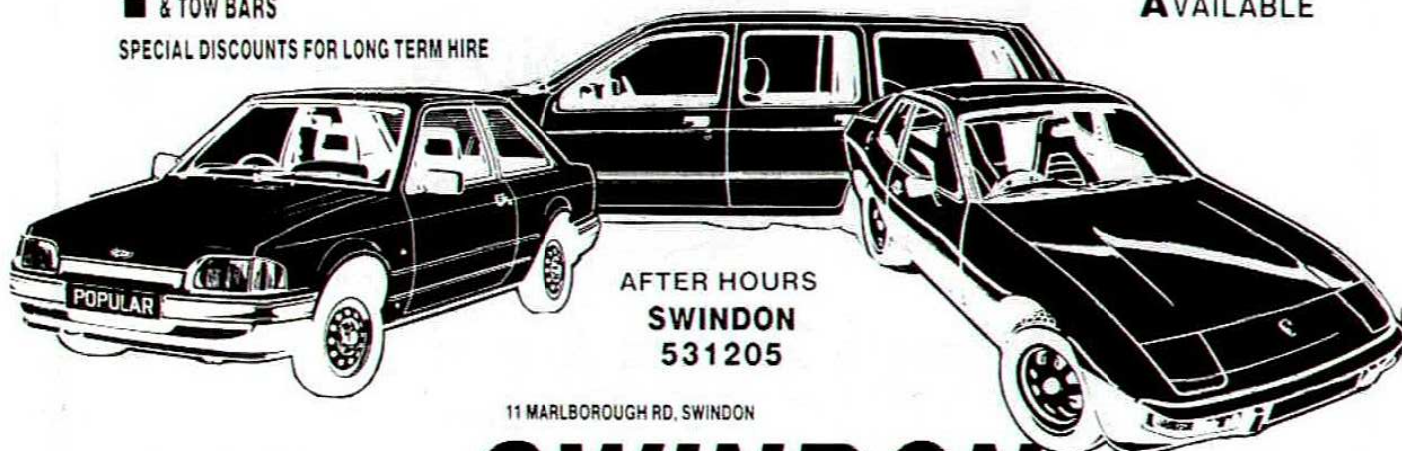

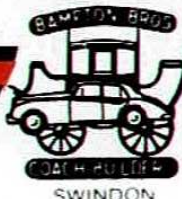

MAY 4th

4th May 1970. Swindon Town are just beginning their Anglo Italian Cup Campaign. They have made a good start two days earlier by defeating Juventus at the County Ground. Swindon go on to top the English clubs section of Swindon, Middlesbrough, Wolves, WBA, Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday. Swindon go on to win the cup, defeating Napoli in Italy 3-0 and are awarded the cup although the game was abandoned in the 79th minute due to rioting by Italian spectators.

4th May 1976. Liverpool clinch the League Championship for a record ninth time.

4th May 1984. The day after the Football League announce they are proposing to introduce new rules which could eliminate a number of financially embarrassed clubs from their competition. It is further announced by the Football League that they are making enquiries into complaints that Wolves are 12 months behind in paying bonus monies.

4th May 1987. Everton win 1-0 at Norwich City to clinch the Division 1 Championship, a goal by Pat

Van Den Hauwe in the first minute. Aston Villa relegated to Division 2. A.F.C. Bournemouth clinch promotion to Division 2 for the first time. Lincoln City play their last game in Division 4 and become the first club to be automatically relegated from the Football League.

4th May 1988. Glasgow Rangers acting captain Graham Roberts is to be allowed to leave following a dressing room row with player/manager Graeme Souness.

4th May 1990. The start of a weekend when Leeds United supporters spoil a season of real progress in getting English clubs back into Europe by rioting, looting and assault at Bournemouth. The police make 120 arrests and complain that they warned the Football League about holding this fixture on a Bank Holiday weekend but their worries were ignored. The Football League had insisted the game started at 3.00 p.m. League's President Bill Fox admits to an "error" in not complying with police requests to change date.

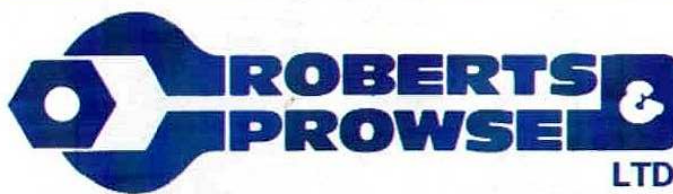

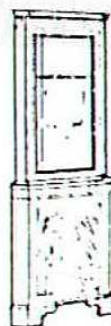

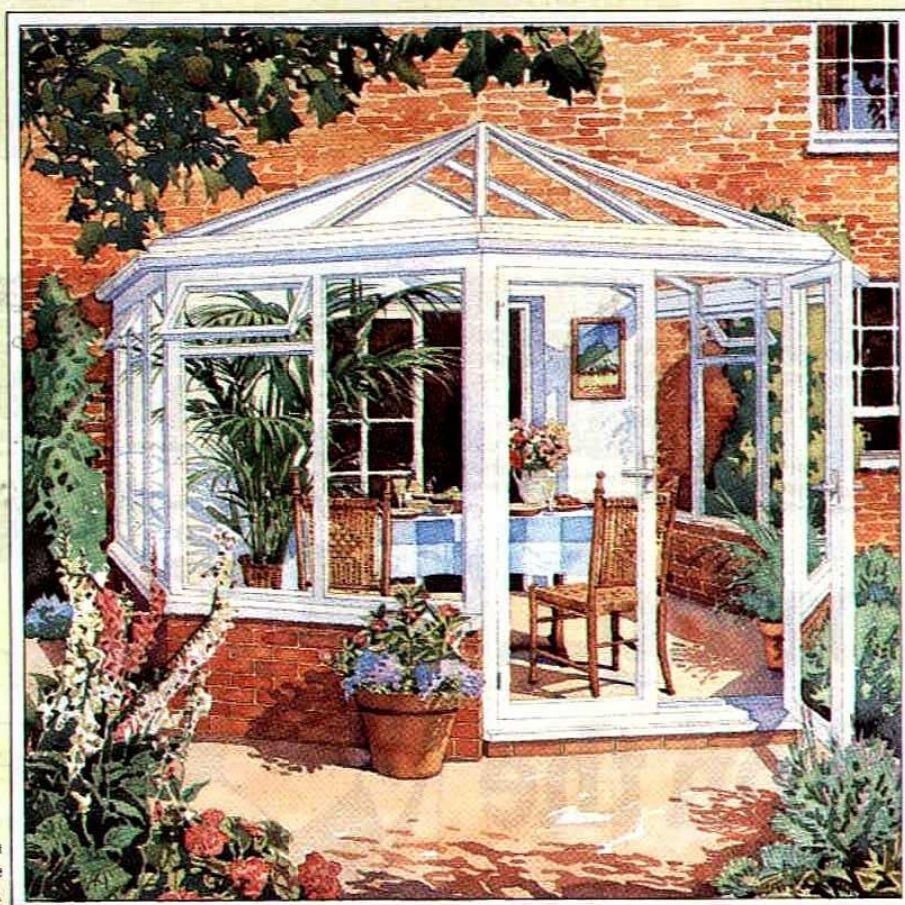
