

RESERVES




REDUCED SEASONS

The coaching programme is based on a 'taster' session and if found favourable a follow up assessment of the team by viewing a match. Hopefully regular coaching sessions are then arranged.



When it comes to cup football you can ask no more than for a home draw and in this respect we have been lucky in both the Rumbelows League Cup and FA Cup competitions.

Tonight we try to further our League Cup ambitions against Crystal Palace. A first Division side we respect but do not fear. We are really looking forward to this one and hope that we can get the ball down and play some football. It will be a contrast of styles for Palace play it differently to us. They squeeze up to the half-way line to try and contain the play in the opponents half. They are much more direct than us. But cup games are all about passion and form on the night and we are determined to give a good account of ourselves this evening.

Steve Coppell has to be admired for what he has done at Selhurst Park. He turned a struggling club into a successful one and noboby will forget that dramatic FA Cup semi-final victory over Liverpool. They turned the form-book that afternoon. That is the magic of cup football. It is a tremendous stimulant both for the crowd

and competitors.

It was our programme editor who opinioned that this was a new experience for me. That before I have always been associated with the gaint killers. He is right in that respect but with regard to this game I do not see us as underdogs.

I am sure that Palace do not see coming away to a good Second Division side as an easy task. The fear-factor of being

beaten by a team from a lower division must be in the back of their minds.

If Peterborough United can beat Liverpool no side is safe. That is the yardstick for everyone.

It should be a hard competitive game tonight and we shall have to dig deep to match Palace physically. The challenge is there to pit our skills and wits against players of International stature.

Chelsea presented us with a similar task in the Zenith Data Systems Cup. Their style is very close to that of Crystal Palace and I was pleased with the way we handled that game at Stamford Bridge.

I expect us to be positive in our thinking and actions this evening. For the winners there is another home tie - against either Nottingham Forest or Southampton. It would be nice to be involved in that round.

We are assured of another home cup match of course in the FA Cup when we entertain Watford. It is ironic that I should be facing Steve Perryman again so soon. I remember once we went to Wembley together with Spurs having played only one game outside London... You need the luck of the draw if you are to do well in these competitions.


But that date is next year. First it is on with the show against Crystal Palace so get behind the lads and cheer them on. Your support could be the deciding factor



Blackburn Manager, Kenny Dalglish, could have taken his side to top of the table at Cambridge last Tuesday but ,with the game standing at 0-0, the referee abandoned the game due to a frozen pitch. The two managers had conflicting views of the situation. John Beck, whose players all wore track suit bottoms throughout the game, was disappointed. "Having played half the game, we could have, and should have. completed the game. Conditions were not good, the pitch was frozen, but the players were adapting to it and I've certainly played on worse surfaces. We wanted to carry on but Blackburn were not keen, maybe because we looked the more likely to score."

Rovers Manager Dalglish disagreed, "I think the referee was 100 per cent correct. He gave the pitch a chance but he had to consider the safety of the players. Two of the players were injured and it wasn't really fair to expect them to compete in those conditions."

Oxford United have put their entire playing squad, consisting of 28 professionals, up for sale, following the resignation of four directors (including Robert Maxwell's daughter, Ghislaine) from the Board. The Club is reported to be £2 million in debt and although Kevin Maxwell remains as the Club's Chairman, there will be no more cash available from the Maxwell family. United Manager, Brian Horton, has sold the first player to Jeave, Lee Nogan, to Watford for £275,000. Horton remains realistic: "This will give us some breathing space. I did not want to lose Lee but, in the circumstances, I feel we have got a good fee for him. I've got to forget my own feelings, as obviously I don't like selling my better players - but I have to accept it. I've told the players they will have to get on with it. The supporters must realise that the Club has to do this to survive."

Plymouth Argyle Manager, Dave Kemp, has again dusted the cobwebs off his cheque book and paid £175,000 to Bristol City for winger Dave Smith. The financial position of



the Club, which restricted transfers to free buys and low cost deals, has changed since the arrival of new Chairman, Dan McCavley. "My association with the Club will be for ever and I'm going to make sure we're the top side in the South West. I love football but know nothing about tactics and I shall never interfere in any way with team affairs. I have the greatest confidence in Dave Kemp and I will make money available as and when he needs it."

Port Vale's goalkeeper Trevor Woods has been put on the transfer list, at his own request. A regular last season, Woods has played only 37 games for Vale and is only 23 years old - yet is highly rated in the game. Wood is keen for a fresh shirt elsewhere. "I was Young Player of the Year last season and voted among the top 10 players in the Second Division. I was one place behind Watford's David James and I was hoping to make a real impression this season. I was injured in February and lost my place to Mark Grew, and now there doesn't seem any prospect of first team football at Vale. I would consider anything and just hope they don't ask silly money for me.

Sunderland striker, Thomas Hauser, looks set to leave Roker Park following an achilles injury. The German striker made only two appearances last season and is hoping to join his former Club, FC Basle in Switzerland. "I honestly thought I could establish myself this year, but the injury has come at the worst possible time. I think the boss is under pressure to sell me and it's in the best interests of all concerned that I make a fresh

start elsewhere.

CHASING THE DOUBLE





After the excitement of this evening's cup clash with Crystal Palace there is more top class football for you to relish this coming **FRIDAY**, when Town take on promotion rivals Ipswich Town in a crucial Second Division fixture.

Town put on one of their best shows of the season at Portman Road back in September when Glenn Hoddle inspired the demolition of the then table-topping Suffolk side. The boss made the first two goals as the Robins hit four with Steve White, Shaun Taylor, Colin Calderwood and Micky Hazard all on target in a 4-1 win

Now Swindon go in search of the "double" over John Lyall's promising side, an achievement that is very difficult at this level of the game and even harder against one of the top sides.

So can Town do it against an Ipswich side that fell unexpectedly at lowly Plymouth last week?

Well one thing in our favour is Ipswich Town's open style of play. They will come here to make a game of it and that can only be good for our lads and for you the spectator too.

Like ourselves lpswich have had their injury problems and centre-back Eddie Youds, a recent big-money signing from Everton is unlikely to be available for this game. But they have the resourceful John Wark alongside David Linighan.

Their away record stands scrutiny too, with that defeat at Plymouth only their third suffered in a dozen trips. Victories have benn registered at Blackburn (2-1); Grimsby (2-1) and Wolves (2-1).

A good performace at Stamford Bridge, where they took a 2-1 lead in the 85th minute in the Zenith Data Systems Cup before being caught and beaten on penalties, is further evidence of the quality of the Suffolk challengers.

John Lyall claims his side have shown "tremendous resilience and character in adversity" while without key players this season. Lyall, like Glenn Hoddle believes in the attacking game though his strategy might not be quite as adventurous as our own. But it all augers well for the fans on friday.





ROSS MacLAREN

PLAYING FOR HIS PLACE

NO PLAYER in the Swindon team is under greater pressure than Scot, Ross MacLaren, the 29-year-old midfielder or defender.

Ross you see is the player charged with the role normally performed by player-manager Glenn Hoddle and though all agree he has done an admirable job in the sweeper role, where he can combine his midfield and defensive qualities to the full, the reality of the situation is that there is no real substitute for the magic of the boss.

This is Ross's twelfth season in professional football, and his fourth at the County Ground, where he has proved to be a durable competitor missing but one game in the last two and a half seasons, that through suspension.

Says Ross: "I have been enjoying my sweeper role. It isn't a new postion for me because I played there for a long time for Shrewsbury Town although the concept was not quite the same then. At Shrewsbury it was seen more as a totally defensive strategy where as the way we are playing it here it is more often the first line of attack.

"I am a natural defender so the creative side of my game is relatively fresh. Glenn has encouraged us all to play on the ball and I feel this season I have added something to my own game. It is very satisfying and in the sweeper position, as we play it, you get a lot of the ball so you are always involved.

"I know I have to keep playing well because when the boss is fit he will want to play and as the other lads are all performing so well it will be hard to find a place in the side. We all know that nothing is guaranted in this game and if I'm dropped it could take some time to get back."

Ross won a Second Division championship medal with Derby County in 1987 and he believes he can collect another with Swindon Town. He says: "The squad we have here is good enough to take the title but we need to start winning games again."

"We are not getting beaten but we are losing valuable points with draws. The Portsmouth game I felt was there for the taking and we were succerpunched right at the death from set-pieces which we usually deal well with. I think that was just a one-off lapse on our behalf. But it taught us that

we must be more ruthless when we are on top and kill these teams off.

"It was a great feeling when we went top of the League although we lost our position pretty quickly. But every team goes through a sticky patch during a season and a long as you can keep in touch with the front-runners during that spell you have a chance."

"What it means for us is that every game is now crucially important to us. We have slipped up and therefore we can not allow things to slide but as long as we are in the top four or five in the Second Division over Christmas we will be quite happy. As long as we are in touch it gives us hope.


"We showed at Middlesbrough that there is plenty of character in the side and tonight in the Rumbelows League Cup we have the opportunity to see just how capable we are of matching First Division opposition.

"We gained a lot of satisfaction from our performance at Chelsea in the Zenith Data Systems Cup last month and I think we scared them a little with the quality of our football. We felt we had done enough to win but then got caught in the final minutes."

"This evening with our home crowd behind us we will really be wound up and I think that we will show again just how well we can play. The fans have been great to us this season and we would love to reward then by beating Crystal Palace this evening. With Nottingham Forest or Southampton awaiting the winner there is much to play for."

"In many of our League games here at the County Ground this season we have found our opponents have made it very difficult for us by stringing ten-men behind the ball. They have packed their defence and stopped us playing. I don't anticipate this will be the case tonight for Crystal Palace are the favourites - they are the ones with the Division One pedigree, and they will be here to win. So it has all the hallmarks of being a great game."

"We know that a good show from us will really give our confidence a boost and set us up nicely for the game here against Ipswich Town on Friday."

PALACE OVERCOME THE BLUES

Inevitably it was Mark Bright who fired the first salvo in Crystal Palace's League Cup campaign shooting the Londoners into a 11th minute lead at Hartlepool in the first-leg of their Second Round tie, But the Third Division side hit back through Brian Honour in the 52nd minute to set up an interesting return at Selhurst Park.

Bright was again in scintilating form opening the scoring after 30 minutes and setting up Marco Gabbiadini for his first Palace goal, after his £1.8 million transfer from Sunderland two weeks prior, a minute before half-time. Further goals from Andy Thorn, Andy Gray and Stan Collymore wrapped it up for the Eagles, Tinkler's reply for Hartlepool being scant consolation to the Cleveland side.

Another Third Division side, Birmingham City, proved much more difficult to overcome. An Andy Gray goal, just three minutes from time, earning Palace a replay they never looked like getting.

This time it was a last-gasp effort by Geoff Thomas that averted a major upset. His header deep into extra-time equalising Nigel Gleghorn's opening strike for Birmingham. And the drama was by no means over for in the second replay, again at Selhurst Park, the Blues fought back to almost force extra-time after goals from Andy Gray - a penalty in the 18th minute - and Andy Thorn had given Palace a first-half lead.

Peer had replied for the Blues on the stroke of half-time and Paskin seemed to have forced extra-time when he shot for an empty net late in the tie only to see Southgate arrive to make a desperate goal-line clearance.

So Palace held on to earn this evening's joust with Swindon. Awin tonight would certainly help Steve Coppell who following the enforced transfer of star striker lan Wright to Arsenal and the unfortunate injury to England winger John Salako has to reshuffle his pack.



THE ABC OF CRYSTAL PALACE

MARK BRIGHT - Striker. Age 28. Well-respected by fans and players alike, Mark has the natural ability, as a striker, to hold the ball up and distribute it to supporting team-mates. He signed from Leicester City in November 1986 for a bargain £75,000. Graham Taylor installed Mark as a standby for the England'B' International side last term and this coming season the 6'0' forward will be hoping for further international representative calls.

CHRIS COLEMAN - Defender. Age 21. This young defender joined the 'Eagles' from Swansea City during the summer of 1991 for a fee fixed by a League Tribunal at £275,000. Chris made his League debut at Stockport County (15.8.87) and totalled 160 League games for the Swans. He also appeared in their European Cup Winners Cup matches against Panathinaikos and gained Welsh International Under-21 Honours.

STAN COLLYMORE - Forward. Age 21. Popular striker who was signed from non-League Stafford Rangers for £100,000 in December 1990. His prolific Combination scoring rate led to Steve Coppell giving him a taste of first team action, and he made his debut in February 1990 at home to QPR.

MARCO GABBIADINI - Striker. Has found it hard to settle following his £1.8 m transfer from Sunderland as the replacement for lan Wright. Makes his second appearance of the season here having scored for Sunderland in September. Had been the top shot in each of his four seasons with Rokerites but managed just four goals in his first fourteen games for Palace. Previously with York City he is an England (B) and Under-21 International. Born Nottingham 2.1.68.

ANDY GRAY - Midfield. Age 27. Andy is in his third spell at Palace, having originally joined the Club as a schoolboy. He left Palace in 1987 for Aston Villa where he served under the present England Manager, Graham Taylor. He again signed for Palace from QPR at the start of the 89/90 campaign, for a fee of £500,000, to re-establish a flourishing midfield partnership with Geoff Thomas. Has also played for Corinthian Casuals and Dulwich Hamlet. An England Under-21 cap.

NIGEL MARTYN - Goalkeeper. Became Britain's first £1m goalkeeper in November 1989 when he moved from Bristol Rovers to Palace. Had already earned England Under-21 recognition and has since played for the 'B' side as well. Made his League debut versus Rotherham in August 1987 and finished his first season with Palace with an F.A.Cup runners-up medal. Born St. Austell 11.8.66.

EDDIE McGOLDRICK - Midfielder. Age 25. Eddie has the natural ability to perform with a great deal of assurance, either as a winger, midfielder or as a sweeper. The 5'10" was signed from Northampton Town for a fee of £200,000 in January 1989. A Londoner he started his career with Nuneaton Borough.

SIMON OSBORN - Midfielder. Age 19. 'Ossie' made his first team debut at Brighton in the Zenith Data Systems Cup and showed a great degree of maturity. He is very popular with the supporters and shows enthusiasm and an eagerness to venture forward into the opposing half of the field. Simon is one of the youngest players to have played at first team level under Manager Steve Coppell.

SIMON RODGER. - Midfielder. A tenacious player who emerged from junior football to star for the Reserves last season. Highly rated by the Palace management he made his senior debut in the previous round of this competition against Birmingham City at St. Andrews. Equally at home in defence or midfield. Born Sussex 3.10.71.

GARETH SOUTHGATE - Right Back. Former Youth Team captain he made his first team debut at Southend in the Rumbelows League Cup last season. Also had one run out in the First D'vision in that campaign but is now making number two shirt his own. Born Watford, he is 21.

GEOFF THOMAS - Midfield. Age 26. Now firmly established in the Full England International squad, Geoff made his debut for his country in Turkey in May, in a European Championship Qualifier. The Manchester born midfielder joined Palace from Crewe Alexandra in the summer of 1987, having had a short spell with Rochdale. This is his fourth season as the Captain of Crystal Palace. Has been out with ankle ligament problems but is expected to return to the side tonight.

ANDY THORN - Central Defender. Won five England Under-21 caps with Wimbledon after making his debut for the Dons, at 18, at Notts County in April 1985. Had a brief spell with Newcastle United before returning to London in November 1989 when Palace paid £650,000 for his transfer. Has played in two Cup Finals for Wimbledon and Palace. Born Carshalton 12.11.66.

ERIC YOUNG - Central Defender. Age 31. Singapore born Welsh International, who was signed from Wimbledon for a fee of £850,000 before the start of the 1990/91 season. It was Brighton who spotted his potential when he was with Slough Town and he made his League bow for them at Blackburn (24.9.83).

BENNO'S BRIEF



THERE is nothing quite as stimulating as the romance of the cup and the Rumbelows League Cup, which started life as the Football League Cup 31 years ago, has a strange way of levelling out the odds in perhaps a fashion that no other domestic competition quite achieves.

Just look at the casualities that have already littered this season's road to Wembley. Arsenal, the League Champions and winners of the Littlewoods Cup in 1987 and runners-up in 1988, ousted in the third round by Coventry City. Manchester City beaten by Middlesbrough and the shock K.O. of the season thus far. Peterborough United's 1-0 victory over Liverpool.

But then that is what cup football is all about isn't it. The possibility of David slaying Goliath. And Swindon Town have enjoyed their moments in this respect with the likes of West Ham - Bobby Moore and all - Arsenal and of course more recently Norwich City, all victims of the Robins giant-killing escapades.

It was in this competition - then labelled The Football League Cup - that Swindon achieved the ultimate success when in 1969 they beat Arsenal on a Wembley mud-slick of a pitch to become the ninth winners of the trophy.

The League Cup, or as it is known today, The Rumbelows League Cup, is a somewhat intimate affair between the top 93 clubs in the country and a glance down the roll call of honour provides an interesting revelation.

Yes, of course, there is the usual galaxy of familiar names such as Aston Villa, Arsenal, Tottenham Hotspur, Nottingham Forest, Manchester City and Liverpool. But nestling amidst the Everton's and Chelsea's there are some unexpected names. Queens Park Rangers for instance, winners of the Wembley final in 1967, while still in the Third Division.

Swindon who again carried the Third Division banner all the way; Stoke City - the League's second oldest club - who claimed their one and only major trophy by beating Chelsea in 1972; Norwich City who have twice laid claim to the silverware and Oxford United who have won it as recently as 1986.

So this is very much an open competition and one in which the likes of Swindon Town have as good a chance as, say, Crystal Palace of making an impact.

Palace too have experienced the glamour of a Wembley final, their great occassion being achieved when they reached the final of the 1990 FA Cup competition with Manchester United. The majority of the players who represented them in that twice played final are still on duty of course and will be all the hungrier to return to the Mecca of English football. But Palace's rearguard - the foundation of last year's success - is suddenly leaking goals and though they are continuing to knock them in at the other end the Eagles uncertainty at the back could well be exploited by the goal-hungry Robins.



continues to look back at previous encounters with today's visitors

There has been just one meeting between the two clubs in this competition, but tonight we

take a look back thirty years, to a Christmas encounter in Division Three in 1961.

The Town had not won in their previous seven games, whereas Palace had recorded a 7-2 win over Torquay a week earlier.

Bert Head, then in charge at the County Ground and later to move to Selhurst Park, fielded a very young side. Even with 37 years old skipper Maurice Owen, the average age was 21! Four including the two full-backs, were eighteen and the goalkeeper, Mike O'Hara, was just seventeen. Bill Atkins had recently returned to the club after National Service and another newcomer, from RAF Box, was Eric Weaver. It took almost half an hour for Swindon to open their account. Peter Chamberlain's cross was nodded down by Mike Summerbee and Jack Smith reacted quickly to push the ball past keeper Vic Rouse.

Summerbee then set up a second goal for the Town just before the interval. Rouse, under pressure from Smith, failed to reach the winger's free-kick and Atkins header home just inside the far post.

And before Palace could get into their stride in the second half, Swindon struck again in the 51st minute.

Young Summerbee was involved yet again, beating Terry Long down the right before crossing to Smith whose header flashed into the net. Just a minute later, Smith found Atkins and his low drive left the keeper helpless as the Town went 4-0 up. A third goal in the space of four minutes finally killed any lingering thoughts

of Palace salvaging a point, Ernie Hunt getting on the scoresheet.


Swindon almost grabbed a sixth with fifteen minutes left, when Rouse was completely stranded as an Atkins shot took a deflection off Brian Wood, but the crossbar saved the visitors from any further punishment.


The five-goal victory equalled the Town's best ever against Palace. Since that day, ten encounters have taken place at the County Ground, with Swindon winning just four. There is no time like the present to start to redress the balance!



Brentford played their normal power game and we found it hard to play our passing game, we were under pressure for long periods in the first half but two early openings could have given us the ideal start. Two






Shaun Taylor commanding the midfield.


