A lot of people made the long



Most people who come to home games get behind the club and cause no bother at all. However, since attendances here have gone up, a small minority have been taking advantage. There have been some complaints about bad language and unnecessary aggression, especially in the Walkersteel stand, where some fans have been running to the fence to wave fists at players and rival fans. There have also been complaints about behaviour at the rear of the Blackburn End terraces.

We don't want things to get out of hand here, especially with the team performing so well. We want visiting fans to leave this ground impressed with the quality of our play and with the noisy, but tolerant, quality of our support. This message is aimed at the few who are in danger of going 'over the top'. Enjoy yourselves, but don't spoil it for other fans.

All supporters will know that we have CCTV here and the Police will arrest those people who break the law. They have our full support in that. But, no-one wants arrests at Ewood Park. We want the fans to get behind the team without causing any 'aggro.' The police and everyone else here want the club in the Premier League next season, but not at the cost of falling from our own high standards.

Thanks for your co-operation in this. Enjoy the game, get behind the team and discourage others from causing us problems.

### SCENE & HEARD

THE 'bond' schemes which have caused such unrest and heartache at Arsenal and West Ham have prompted Leeds United to tread softly, softly as they consider ways of financing ground development at Elland Road.

And the signs are that it could well pay off, with supporters club chiefs proving amenable to proposals to issue a £500 bond to help raise part of

the cash for a £5.5 million stand.

Leeds will still go ahead with plans to obtain the views of season-ticket holders before deciding whether to introduce the scheme. But they believe their bond could be a winner, because it offers a £200 bonus through a £100 discount on a season ticket over seven years.

That's more like it. If you ask fans to put up money, you must give them something back in return. Something, that is, apart from simply the right to buy a season ticket as Leeds have clearly

realised.

With corporate hospitality, sponsorship and executive boxes having an ever-increasing presence and influence at major sports events, football would do well to remember one thing. The cash they bring in may be vital but, without the thousands of ordinary fans cheering for their team, professional football — as a spectacle and an occasion — wouldn't mean a thing.

STILL on the subject of supporters — missing ones — Crystal Palace chairman Ron Noades has been sounding warnings at Selhurst Park.

Angry that Palace's Rumbelows Cup home tie

against Nottingham Forest saw the lowest gate of the quarter finals, he said: "I have been criticised for setting high admission prices in the past. The charges were rock bottom at £10 a seat and £6 standing, yet many supporters still did not come."

Mr Noades also warned that Palace wouldn't be able to hold on to their star players or develop the club unless income improved.

Trouble and strife at Selhurst it seems.

### CUP DRAW REVIVES MEMORIES OF KENNY'S LATE WINNER

IT was difficult to get excited about last Sunday's F.A. Cup Fifth Round draw. When you still have to play a Fourth Round tie away to First Division opposition that's hardly surprising and I dare say it was the same for many football fans up and down the country.

Still, being paired — if Rovers go through! — with either Norwich or Millwall did prompt a few memories. The last time Rovers met both these teams in F.A. Cup action they were also involved

in RELEGATION seasons!

Norwich were Fifth Round opponents way back in 1965-66 at Carrow Road and I can remember only too clearly how the home team pulled back a two-goal deficit in the last 10 minutes. Rovers, however, went on to win the Ewood replay 3-2.

As for Millwall, they visited Ewood in the 1978-79 season for a 'home' F.A. Cup tie, having been banned from The Den. And there's another

twist to this particular saga.

Rovers won 2-1 and qualified for a trip to Anfield where they were beaten 1-0 by a late goal from KENNY DALGEISH. Robbed! I'm sure he was offside/handled the ball/fouled somebody...

Interestingly Millwall's assistant manager Ian McNeill, confident his team can win at Norwich, echoed the thoughts of many people in the game when he said: "It looks like a good year. Once every 10 years or so a Second Division team gets to the final. With so many First Division clubs already out, this could be the year."

# VISITORS FILE

COLIN CALDERWOOD. Defender. The only surviving member of Town's Fourth Division championship-winning side of 1985/86. Colin has made over 250 League and cup appearances since being signed for just £27,500 from Mansfield Town prior to that record-breaking campaign.

SHAUN CLOSE. Striker. Signed from AFC Bournemouth for £70,000 two years ago. Went to Dean Court in March, 1988, from Tottenham, where he

began his career as a trainee.

FRASER DIBGY. Goalkeeper. This former England Under-21 keeper has missed just a handful of games for Swindon in the last three seasons and passed the 200-appearances milestone last spring. An ex-Manchester United apprentice, he first arrived at the County Ground from Old Trafford, on loan, in March, 1986. Signed on a permanent basis in December of that year.

RICHARD GREEN. Defender. Released by Shrewsbury Town in the 1990 close season. Richard signed for Swindon in January, 1991, following a successful trial. Began his career as an apprentice at Gay Meadow and went on to record almost 150 first-

team appearances for the Shropshire club.

MICKÝ HAZARD. Midfield. Signed from Portsmouth for £130,000 in September, 1990, Micky inherited the Town's number four shirt from the transferred Alan McLoughlin. Last season he made 38 League and cup appearances, scoring eight goals — his best tallies since 1981/82 when he was an up-and-coming star at White Hart Lane. He won both F.A. Cup and UEFA Cup medals with Tottenham before joining Chelsea for £300,000.

PAUL HUNT. Midfield. One of only two locally-born players in the current squad. A former club trainee, Paul signed full professional forms in July, 1989, and made his League debut against Barnsley two months

TOM JONES. Midfield. Has missed just five league games since arriving at the County Ground from Aberdeen for £80,000 in September, 1988. Formerly an apprentice at Chelsea, he was released in 1983 and joined Farnborough Town, moving on to Weymouth in 1986. Filled in at right-back for the absent David Kerslake on five occasions last season.

DAVID KERSLAKE. Midfield/Defender. A £110,000 signing from Queens Park Rangers in November, 1989.

### Welcome to SWINDON TOWN

David has struggled to gain a regular first-team spot in more than six years at Loftus Road. Gained England honours at Schoolboy, Youth and Under-21 levels. All his appearances for Swindon have been at right-back.

MARTIN LING. Midfield. Slightly-built midfielder now in his second spell at the County Ground, having rejoined Town from Southend United for a small fee. Began his career with Exeter City before signing from Swindon in July, 1986, but after just two League appearances moved on to Roots Hall 93 days later.

NESTOR LORENZO. Defender. Arrived at the County Ground on loan from Italian League club Bari in November, 1990 and signed for £160,000 a month later. Scored on his Football League debut against Portsmouth. Capped 25 times for Argentina and

appeared in the 1990 World Cup Final.

ROSS MacLAREN. Midfield/Defender. In his 12th season as a professional and his fourth at Swindon. Absent only once during the last two campaigns, through suspension, Ross normally plays just in front or just behind the back four. With Shrewsbury for five years, he joined Derby in 1985 for £67,500 and picked up a Second Division championship medal there two years later.

DAVID MITCHELL. Striker. Capped 17 times for Australia, David was signed in July from Chelsea for a nominal fee. Made just one appearance last season for the London club, which he joined from Feijenoord for £200,000 in December, 1988. Previously with Glasgow Rangers, where he scored 10 goals in only 26 full appearances between 1983 and 1985.

DÜNCAN SHEARER. Striker. Has maintained an impressive goal-every-other-game average since making his Football League debut for Chelsea in February, 1986. A club-record £230,000 signing from Huddersfield Town in June, 1988, Duncan has recorded tallies of 16, 27 and 23 for Swindon.

NICKY SUMMERBEE. Striker. Nicky has a bright future and a good football pedigree, as his father, grand-father and great uncle all had careers in the Football League. His father is the former Swindon,



GLENN HODDLE was born in Hayes, Middlesex, 33 years ago and was appointed Swindon Town manager upon the sudden departure of Ossie Ardiles to Newcastle at the end of last March. The former England midfield man will be hoping to add to the 370 Football League appearances and 88 goals he recorded in a 12-year career at Tottenham,

prior to leaving for Monaco in the summer of 1987. He made a number of appearances in Swindon's reserve side last season — as sweeper.

Assistant Manager John Gorman is 42, was born in Winchburgh, Scotland and arrived with Glen Hoddle last April. He is a former Celtic, Carlisle United and Tottenham full-back.

FITZROY SIMPSON. Midfield. Signed as a trainee in July, 1987, making his League debut 30 seconds from the end of the Town's visit to Shrewsbury in December, 1988. Made 30 full appearances last season, wearing every outfield shirt except the number two, and scored four times.

SHAUN TAYLOR. Defender. A £200,000 signing from Exeter, Shaun was City's captain and Player of the Year in their Fourth Division championship-winning side of 1989/90. Came into League football late, being 23 when he arrived at St. James's Park from Western League club Bideford Town. Strong and durable central

defender who has missed just two games in the last three seasons.

ADRIAN VIVEASH. Defender. This Swindon-born 21-year-old progressed through the ranks at the County Ground, starting his career as a winger. Has now slotted into a back-four position and featured at left-back in the latter part of last season.

STEVE WHITE. Striker. Now approaching the veteran stage, Steve was a free transfer signing five years ago from Bristol Rovers, where he began his League career in 1977. Moved to Luton and Charlton for fees totalling £350,000 between his two spells in Bristol.

# SHOOTING STARS

HAROLD FLEMING was not only a prolific scorer in Swindon's early days but was also club captain. He could scarcely have given them a better start to their Football League history than by scoring four of the goals in a 9-1 win against Luton in their first-ever Football League game. It still stands as a club record over 60 years later. Jack Johnson and Tommy Phillipson, who went on to play for Wolves, were other useful goalscorers of the early Twenties while Ted Nash was a most consistent goalkeeper for some 15 seasons in the Twenties and Thirties.

Then there was Harry Morris (whose real name was David) who banged home 216 goals between 1926 and 1933, including 47 in 1926/27. Later in the Thirties Bert Morton and Alan Fowler had their moments as strikers and then after the war came Maurice Owen who, after getting well over a hundred goals as a striker, had a successful spell as a defender with his career at his one and only Football League club stretching over 16 seasons.

The Fifties saw Northern Ireland international Norman Uprichard in goal, George Hudson a stouthearted defender and Andy Micklewright a more than useful striker. Sam Burton had many good years in goal and then, in the Sixties, came Bert Head's team of outstanding young talent. Mike Summerbee, a tearaway winger equally happy in the centre

of the attack, Bobby Woodruff the long-throw specialist, Ernie Hunt the chunky little inside forward, all made outstanding contributions while Don Rogers, a most talented left-winger, won the Football League Cup final against Arsenal in 1969 in extra time.

Peter Noble, a splendid utility player, and goalkeeper Peter Downsborough both stayed into the Seventies when the skills of Trevor Anderson and diminutive Alan Mayes were to the fore. Nor must we forget the prolific David Moss, who went on to do equally well for Luton and then returned to Swindon in 1985.

John Trollope, who made 770 appearances between 1960 and 1980, deserves an article to himself. Then there has been the goalscoring of Andy Rowland in the Eighties. Colin Gordon also had his moments as a striker as did Jimmy Quinn, while in goal Fraser Digby joined the long list of excellent Swindon goalkeepers.

And so to Duncan Shearer, another great goalscorer, and a second generation of young players coming along in Nicky Summerbee and Paul Trollope. The fount of talent known as Swindon Town is still there.

## C H A T T E R B O X

OBVIOUSLY there have been major changes at the club during the last 12 months, and two months spring to mind in particular.

January, 1991, Jack Walker became the major shareholder.

October, 1991, saw Kenny Dalglish appointed manager of the club.

Kenny arrived in a blaze of publicity, bringing Ray Harford with him to join Tony Parkes and

Asa Hartford in his 'Boot room'.

What has happened on the playing side is well know to you all. We find ourselves at the top of the division and looking forward to visiting Notts County on Tuesday in the rearranged cup tie — in fact match days are days to look forward to again. Last season's match days were sometimes non too pleasant!

It is early days yet, but we must make sure we are FIRST over the LAST fence — no other fence

matters.

Activity

Away from the playing side much hard work is being done by the Board and office staff. Results on the field lead to greater activity off it and there are several topics on which I should like to bring

you up to date.

All-ticket matches: Our home gates are over 40% up on last year and the capacity for home fans is 15,147 and 4,800 for away fans. We did request that the Darwen End Enclosure be brought back into use for the Cambridge game but, although it was seriously considered by the Licensing Authority, they felt it was impractical now that the temporary Police Control Box is in the vicinity. We are therefore bound to use the Darwen End for visitors for the time being.

We have been near capacity for home fans and we took the decision to make matches all ticket for the rest of the season in conjunction with the police because we do not want to see any of our own spectators locked out on matchdays. Surely it is better to buy a ticket and guarantee getting

into a match.

We have reprinted season tickets for the rest of the season and people are realising that season ticket holders this season get priority when

purchasing for next.

We also appreciate that it is not convenient for everyone to get to Ewood during the week so we have arranged outlets for buying terrace tickets. Details can be found in the local press or by ringing Ewood.

Ticketed games also have the advantage of quicker entry to the ground — no waiting for change etc. Obviously some fixtures are more attractive than others and produce better 'gates' and some people may ask why we do not just make those fixtures all-ticket. We believe that

there would be more confusion by varying the system.

Ticket sales: We are currently selling tickets for two games or so in advance, but we are also exploring a computerised system which will speed up bookings and enable bookings to be

made for games well in advance.

Ground Development: There has been much publicity about this, naturally. The unfortunate thing is that both the press and the public think that ALL information, ALL drawings, ALL details are available immediately an idea is put forward. They want the information before it is available.

#### Discussion

Everyone has been working hard on the plans for the ground — Where does everything go? How does the ground need to work on matchdays? What facilities do we need on non-match days? How many boxes? — the list seems endless.

We are discussing the development with the local residents and their committee and before the plans are formally submitted to the Borough we shall discuss the scheme with the Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Service and the Licensing Authority as well as obviously the planners themselves.

Contrary to the opinion of some we are in

discussion with many parties.

However the simple fact is that, as yet, not even the Board has seen the final plans and elevations of the proposed development which will be used by the architects when they submit the planning application to the Borough. As soon as the planning application is submitted these will be made public.

Mr Walker is intent on providing a facility of which the town can be proud and which can be used by generation of Blackburnians to come.


#### Effort


Mike Newell blasts at goal in the game against Bristol City.






