

Since you were last with us there have been some changes both on and off the pitch. Steve Cross has been appointed as Coach, his experience and enthusiasm will prove invaluable to me.

We would also like to welcome **Paul Hardyman** from Sunderland who became Rovers' record signing, after the fee was fixed at the tribunal last week.

This new rule was a major influence in our defeat at Oxford on Saturday in what was a slightly disappointing performance; we now have two home games in the space of 4 days and we must ensure that we do not let the points slip from our grasp.

Your support has been proved on many occasions and can make the difference in a tight finish. Enjoy the game.






COUNTY GROUND NEWS

It is a mere four months since Swindon Town's last visit to Twerton and we should expect to see many familiar faces among the players selected to wear the famous red shirts this evening. The most likely area to feature an unfamiliar face will be in attack where some close season transfer activity has taken place in an attempt to fill the gap left by the move of record goal scorer Duncan Shearer to Blackburn and then onto Aberdeen.

Ollie Morah has been signed for a two month loan period

from Tottenham to provide an extra bit of competition for the striking positions but the most likely newcomer to make an appearance is Craig Maskell. The Aldershot born striker has spent the last two years at Reading but has been unable to reproduce the goal touch that made him a regular on the scoring lists while at Huddersfield Town. He is no stranger to the County Ground having been on loan from Southampton, the club that gave him his apprenticeship, five years ago. He is also no stranger to following in the

footsteps of Duncan Shearer since it was he who took over from the Scotsman when he left Huddersfield for Swindon in the 1988 close season. Craig scored the second goal in a one-sided 2-0 victory over Exeter City ten days ago and will be hoping that it will be a prelude to a successful league season.

The Exeter game rounded off an uninspired pre-season with a performance full of quality that produced countless goal scoring chances for the Robins. The first strike was converted by

Martin Ling at the end of a superb move that manager Hoddle rated as unlikely to be bettered all season. Martin made over 100 appearances for Exeter at the outset of his career as did defender Shaun Taylor who begins his second season at the County Ground as an established member of the defence. The Exeter game had special significance for Shaun as his younger brother Craig was among the opposition.

Shaun's partner in the centre of the rearguard is the club's professional, senior Colin Calderwood, the only surviving member of the Town's Fourth Division Championship-winning side of 1985-86. Colin has been at the County Ground since July 1985, eighteen months longer than goalkeeper Frazer Digby his main challenger for current appearances. They both stand little prospect of overhauling John Trollope's club record of 767 league outings between 1960 and 1981.

In fact Fraser will have his work cut out to keep his place between the posts in the face of stiff competition from ex-Rover Nicky Hammond. Both keepers had the best of groundings for their league careers with Digby having been apprenticed at Old Trafford and Hammond at Highbury. It was while at Arsenal that Nicky made three on-loan appearances for the Gas during Bobby Gould's second reign.

If penalty-taking plays any part in the goalkeeping selection process then Nicky will be in

trouble. During the Borsele Trophy held in Holland at the beginning of August, Swindon drew 1-1 with Iraklis, the Greek club, in the third place play-off match. The situation that all keepers must dread actually occurred when all ten outfield players on each side converted their kicks in the resultant penalty competition. Poor Nicky fired high over the bar and to rub salt into the would his opposite number scored from the spot a few moments later.

It is normally in midfield that Swindon exhibit their classic pattern of play. In addition to Martin Ling we can expect the experienced Micky Hazard to be ably assisted by full backs David Kerslake and Paul Bodin moving forward into wide positions. All four have strong London connections. Ling and Kerslake through birth, Sunderland born Hazard through his spells at Spurs and Chelsea and Bodin from an unhappy period at Crystal Palace. Paul will know the Twerton pitch well enough from his days with our landlords Bath City. It will be of added interest to see if he can use his local knowledge to the benefit of his team tonight.




THE ENGINE ROOM

Glenn Hoddle begins his second full campaign in management with a very different pre-season experience than twelve months ago. Last time a sequence of good results boded well for a successful start to the League but only one point was earned from the first two matches. This vear things have not gone as well from a results point of view and several players have suffered from injury including Glenn himself. In fact, with only a week to go to the opening game at Sunderland the player-manager had only completed one full ninety minute outing leaving a difficult team selection decision ahead.

Glenn won 53 full England caps during an illustrious playing career. Nine of them came while at French club Monaco whom he joined in 1987 but of course his name is more closely associated with Spurs. During thirteen years at White Hart Lane he won UEFA and FA Cup Winners medals. He became manager of the Robins in April last year.



A GAME TO REMEMBER


Swindon Town 4 Bristol Rovers 3 October 5 1965 (Division 3)

It was not just the high score of this game and the twists that took place within it that make it one of the most memorable games between the two sides. What happened at the County Ground that evening was also to bear an uncanny similarity to the fortunes of the teams for the rest of the season. Before the game, Rovers were eighth, their early results had included a 5-1 win away at York City and promotion was being discussed at Eastville. Swindon had played three previous home league games that season without a goal being scored and their fans were becoming impatient. After 24 minutes they must have been thinking about going home:

Bobby Jones and Harold Jarman had put Rovers 2-0 ahead. But by half-time the scores were level. Don Rogers, then just 19, made goals for Eric Weaver and Roger Smart. Rovers hit back after the break, Jarman scoring with a right-foot shot from the edge of the area. Rovers remained on top but in three incredible minutes, Town stole victory with goals from Dennis Brown and Smart. The turn around was to be matched by the contrasting fortunes of the two teams from that time on. Rovers tumbled down the table and finished 16th, just six points above relegation while Town recovered to complete 1964-65 in a respectable 7th place.

A NAME TO REMEMBER John Gorman (Born Winchburgh, 16/8/49)

Any Rovers or Swindon fan who believes that, despite all the promising
signs of the last few seasons, their club
will never be big enough to win promotion to the premier league need look no
further than the Town dugout today.
The Assistant manager to Glenn Hoddle
is John Gorman and he, more than
anyone at Twerton Park tonight, knows
the "impossible" can be achieved.
Gorman was a key member of the unfashionable Carlisle United team who
stunned the football world by winning
promotion to the first division in 197374. Bill Shankley, a former manager of

Carlisle, described the achievement as "a miracle" and much of it was down to the performances of attacking left-back Gorman. He played a total of 228 games for the Cumbrians between 1970 and 1976 after failing to make the grade with Celtic. Then came his much-deserved move to a big club when he joined Tottenham Hotspur. A promising start ended in disaster with a badly broken leg and he played a total of just 30 games for Spurs. Gorman managed a playing return in America with Tampa Bay Rowdies before returning to England as coach at Gillingham and then reserve and youth team manager at Leyton Orient. And when Hoddle was appointed manager at the County Ground the first "signing" he made was Gorman - a friendship that started at Spurs may this season see Gorman win his second promotion to join the elite of the English game.

•FOOTNOTE: When Carlisle won promotion to the then first division, Manchester United were relegated. Unfortunately for the Cumbrians they swapped divisions again the very next season!

An interesting change this season is the new rule regarding passing back to the goalkeeper. Many players and managers have spoken out against this change to the rules and we have only seen the implementation just recently in the friendly fixtures and the G.F.A. Cup Final. Since then, I think some views may have changed but it will be quite a talking point this season. An explanation of this rule is printed elsewhere in the programme.

Next month we compete in a new competition, the Anglo-Italian Cup. The matches against West Ham and Southend will be very important if we are to progress towards another Cup Final at Wembley.

We earnestly thank you for your tremendous support in the past and look forward to that continuity throughout the season.

DENIS DUNFORD CHAIRMAN

My last programme notes summarised the new law on passing back to the goalkeeper. Scrap those – further amendments have been made by F.I.F.A. and confusion reigns even before the season has started. Episode 2 is as follows:

"Subject to the terms of Law XII, a player may pass the ball to his own goalkeepr using his head or chest or knee, etc. If however, in the opinion of the referee, a player uses a deliberate trick in order to circumvent the amendment to Law XII, the player will be guilty of ungentlemanly conduct and will be punished accordingly in terms of Law XII, that is to day, the player will be cautioned and an indirect free-kick will be awarded to the opposing team from the place where the player committed the offence."

Examples of such tricks would include: a player who deliberately flicks the ball with his feet up onto his head in order to head the ball to his goalkeeper; or, a player who kneels down and deliberately pushes the ball to the goalkeeper with his knee, etc.

Match officials have been handed an extra responsibility with a great deal depending on their interpretation of the new law. Referees, players and fans are only human and, to put it mildly, I anticipate considerable debate for the early part of the season at least.

On behalf of everyone at Rovers I extend a warm welcome to you all for the start of a new season, our seventh at Twerton.





Rovers officials, having contacted the Archdeacon of Bath for advice on an appointment, invited **The Reverend Simon Stevenette** to be honorary club chaplain in May and, having met Simon recently, I would like to say what an excellent signing he is and, on behalf of all of you, welcome him to Twerton Park.

Simon, who is thirty years old, hails from Brighton and is a sports fanatic. He studied Law and Politics at Hull University but after obtaining his degree, took a year off when he undertook a year's nursing at Weybridge Hospital before embarking on a three year

Theological course at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford. He was ordained in 1987 and moved on to a curacy at Overton, near Oxford and, in fact, was chaplain to the Witney Wildcats American Football Team during his time there.

He moved to Keynsham in 1990, where he is one of a team of vicars, with a particular role in education, training and youth work. He works closely with local schools and enjoys working in the local community.

Matches are played on Sunday afternoons, so Simon has to go easy on the communion wine on Sunday mornings, in order to be fit for the afternoons exertions. He then has to have a quick shower and change back into his working clothes, to take the evening service!

Scriously, Simon says he has

been made very welcome by everyone at the club. He has met the players, Directors and most of the staff and is "impressed with the family atmosphere at the club".

He places great emphasis on the confidential nature of his role. He will be there to listen to problems and build up friendships and help, advise and counsel staff and players. He himself has received a great deal of help from Derek Cleave, club chaplain at Bristol City and he will be attending the national conference of club chaplains organised by 'Christians in Sport'.

He has already impressed Rovers trainees, not for his sporting prowess, but for his appearance at the Pilton Pop Festival, where he conducted a service!

He is ably supported by his wife Nicola, but has yet to convert her to becoming a football fan, though hopes are high that 11 month old son, Thomas, will follow in dad's sporting footsteps.

Weddings permitting, Simon will attend as many matches as possible at Twerton Park; though I'm sure we all hope that he can do more for us than he did for Brighton last season. As a Brighton supporter, Simon was on the terraces to see the Seagulls lose 4-1 which confirmed their relegation.

I know that Simon is looking forward to his time with the club. With him and God on our side, the only way is up!!!

ARCHIE STEPHENS


Stephens. Liverpool born Archie was indeed a late entrant to professional football at the age of 27. He came to the attention of Rovers manager Terry Cooper after scoring goals for Western League Melksham in 1981. I remember his Rovers debut in a pre-season friendly against Wigan Athletic and just weeks later his super two goal performance on his league debut against Burnley. Archie netted eleven times in his first season with Rovers. An all action striker Archie formed a formidable goal scoring partnership with Paul Randall and latterly Steve White and in total Stephens managed 40 league goals in 100 full appearances. Rovers accepted an offer of £40,000 from Middlesbrough in March 1985, 92 league appearances – 24 goals. He assisted

Boro in their climb from Division 3 to Division 1 before moving to Carlisle United in December 1987 (18 apps – 1 goal), before Archie completed his league career at Darlington on loan in March 1989. He actually scored their last goal in the league before losing their league status. Archie had a brief spell with Darlington in the Conference before playing for part-timers Guisborough Town.

That's that for four years then. A series of mainly forgettable matches between teams that seemed out of sorts for one reason or another. Not wishing to knock the achievements of the eventual winners of the European Championships, it was a bit of a bore wasn't it?

Denmark's approach was refreshing, ('Did you have a few beers after beating Holland?' one player was asked. 'No' he replied. 'We had a lot.') but you have to ask yourself whether they would have adopted the same approach if they had qualified as of right and not been allowed to compete due to the misery and suffering in the name of 'liberty' in Yugoslavia. Arriving in the competition at ten days' notice and not being given much hope of success, their bandwagon gradually gained momentum as they progressed and if their victory over the over-confident Dutch in the semis was slightly fortunate, (being via a penalty shoot-out), they certainly deserved to defeat a surprisingly lack-lustre Germany in the final.

And what of England? There are those that will have you believe that Graham Taylor should be out on his ear. Replacements? Well, to old chestnuts such as Brian Clough and Terry Venables have been added the likes of Ron Atkinson and Howard Wilkinson but this is always assuming that they would want to give up the day-to-day cut and thrust of league management. And for what? Maybe the lonely existance of team supremo at Lancaster Gate with all the frustrations imaginable. Taylor is the right man for the job. I don't agree with every selection he makes but I do believe that they are made honestly.


What I would question is the attitude of those who think that the national side have a divine right to be successful no matter who they play. England's record in major competitions whilst not bad is not exactly brilliant either. World Cup winners once and fourth place in '90; in the Europeans, 3rd as long ago as '68.

I think that the side in Sweden suffered from harsh press criticism too. However, it has to be said that the relationship between media and squad isn't helped by comments such as Carlton Palmer's gem, 'we're not here to entertain. We're here to get a result.' (Or something similar).

So, where do we go from here? Well, providing those off the pitch behave themselves, (supporters and officials), the Championships will be here in '96 so we don't have to qualify! How about something really revolutionary? Give the manager a four year contract. Tell him that results, although important, are not the be-all and end-all and allow him time to develop a squad that can take on the best. A bit naive, I guess. About as daft as thinking that a side could enter a championship at the last minute and two weeks later be crowned European Champions!






David Mehew - Winner -





DIVISION TWO REVISITED

With the revamped Football League starting last Saturday, it is a good opportunity to look back on the happenings of the Second Division last season.

The season was just over two weeks old when Don Mackay became the first managerial casualty when Blackburn Rovers then in the bottom three, disposed of his services. By the end of September Middlesbrough opened a five point gap at the top of the table ahead of Ipswich and Swindon. At the bottom were ourselves, Newcastle and Oxford. October our indifferent start under Martin Dobson.

dismissed after three months in Blackburn appointed charge. Kenny Dalglish as manager who within weeks started his rebuilding programme with the purchase of Alan Wright. By the end of the month Middlesbrough's lead at the top was cut to a single point of Cambridge. ahead Charlton with Swindon, Ipswich and Derby in hot pursuit. Newcastle were replaced in the bottom three by Plymouth who slipped to bottom with ourselves and Oxford four points adrift of the safev line. November saw the Ewood Park cheque book come into evidence again with Colin Hendry, Mike Newell and

Gordon Cowans helping the club by the end of the month move into fourth place. Cambridge, in the meantime moved into pole position a point ahead of previous occupants, Middlesbrough while Derby were third. At the bottom Plymouth and Oxford were anchored four points behind Grimsby who in 22nd place were only a point adift of Sunderland who were in 15th place.

Derby dormant in the transfer market for some time. following month signed Ian Ormondrovd. Sunderland lost the services of Denis Smith. Following the death of Robert Maxwell, Oxford's complete playing staff were put up for sale, within days Lee Nogan joined Watford. Ipswich join Blackburn at the top with surprise package Southend moving to third. Brighton replaced Plymouth in the bottom three. In January Derby paid their record fee for Marco Gabbiadini while Blackburn, Ipswich and Southend again occupied the top three places. Grimsby moved out of the bottom three being replaced by Newcastle.

February saw Blackburn and Derby once again active in the transfer market with Tim Sherwood and Chris Price joining the Ewood Park ranks and Paul

Simpson moving to the Baseball Ground. Ossie Ardiles made room for Kevin Keegan at Newcastle. David Kemp and Jimmy Lumsden both lost their jobs at Plymouth and Bristol City. Blackburn and Ipswich were joined by Cambridge in the top three while Plymouth, Oxford and Brighton maintain the bottom three.

The managerial merry go round continued in March with Bruce Rioch leaving Millwall where Mick McCarthy took over. Denis Smith was appointed at Ashton Gate and Peter Shilton moved into the hot seat for the first time at Plymouth. Blackburn and Derby continued the cheque book game with Roy Wegerle, Duncan Shearer (since moved Aberdeen) and Matt Dickins moving to Ewood Park while Steve Sutton and Paul Kitson made short journeys to the Baseball Ground. Ipswich took over in pole position from Blackburn with Cambridge in third. Port Vale after a disastrous run fall to bottom. With the promotion race hotting up in April, Ipswich held on to top spot with Leicester, Cambridge, Middlesbrough in contention for the second automatic promotion place. The final table saw the Suffolk club take the title with the Teessiders gaining promotion. Oxford escaped relegation on the final day with Port Vale, Brighton and Plymouth occupying the bottom three places.

In the play offs Blackburn after overcoming Derby made it a fifth unsuccessful trip to Wembley for Leicester who defeated Cambridge in the Semi final.

As many regular fans will know the bulk of these programme articles have been written by fellow supporters for the past five seasons.

The club was faced with a void following the departure of secretary Gordon Bennett, who had a printing background, and had produced The Pirate almost single-handed for many seasons. 
The programme team and I am sure that you the fans will miss his regular historic or statistical articles.


Tony Bennett has rediscovered his Californian heart and means business this year.


Steve Yates holds aloft the Gloucestershire Cup.
