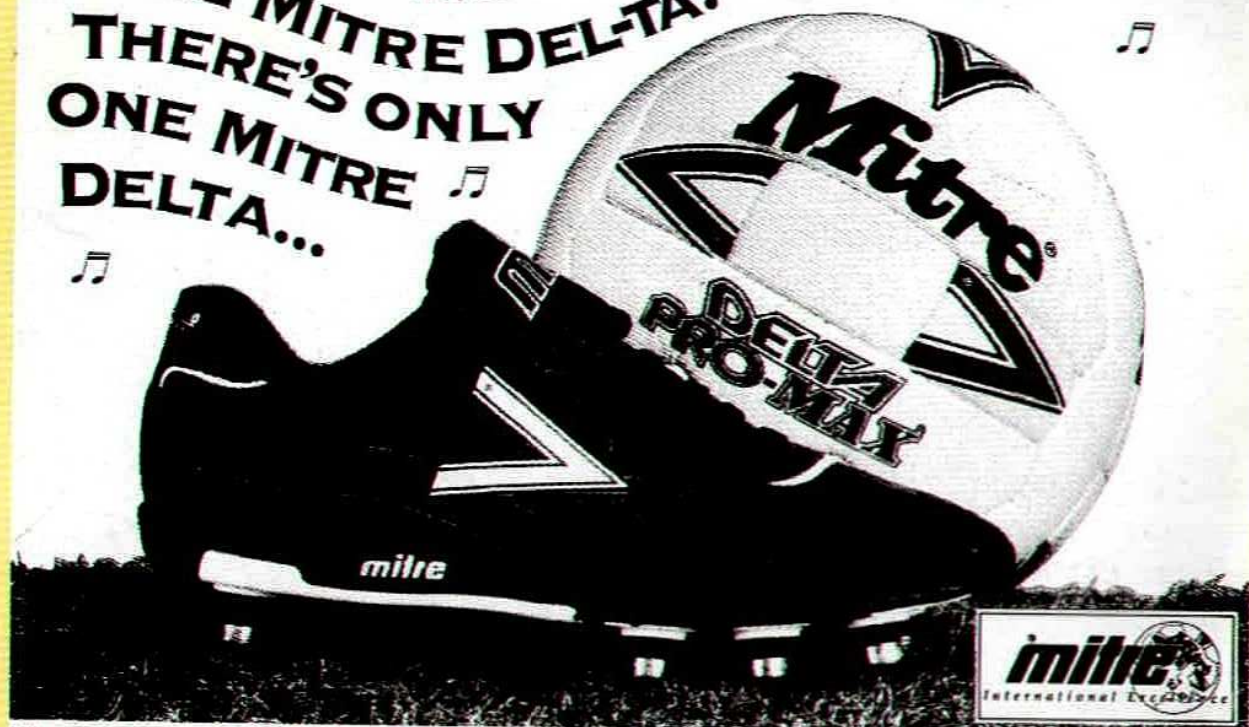

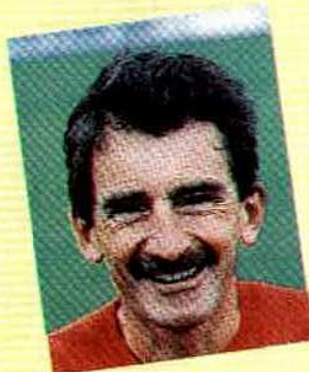

First question to answer is - What will happen to Paul Compton following his "sending off". Well, the Football League and the FA will have something to say about the matter and he could well be fined by them. From a club point of view Compo will be treated the same as a player and will be fined!

Second question is - Did the price reduction achieve anything? The short answer is no, in terms of increased attendance but yes in the terms of making supporters happy! In fairness it was not intended to increase support on the day it was simply a gesture! It may be repeated sometime in the future but club finances do not permit too many such gestures.

Several fans collared me on Saturday to ask what the plans are for the Pop Side. We intend to demolish the complete structure and remove the hump, replacing it with a narrow stand running the full length of the pitch. The area behind will then be utilised and ideas for this are welcome. The only area under threat is the Away End and it is possible that this may be removed completely and converted into a training area but again I am open to suggestions.

There has been much speculation about the possi-

ble sale of certain players. We would obviously welcome offers but I have to say that there are no bargains to be had. There is still life left in the club finances and we are not (yet) in a position where we have to sell to survive.



Having complimented the team for their performance on Saturday I must now compliment you, the fans, for your vocal support. Anyone outside the ground would be forgiven for thinking that we had a 10,000 crowd. I've said it before and I'll say it again, good strong vocal support can lift our team to better and better performances. Tonight as underdog they need even more from you so take a bow and then start shouting.

Welcome to the supporters, officials and players from Swindon Town for what to us is a local Derby game.

SWINDON TOWN

DAVE BENNETT (Age 33, Midfield). Born Manchester, Former F.A. Cup winner with Coventry, signed from Sheffield Wednesday for £50,000 two years ago, but sustained a broken leg in only his second appearance for the Town. Suffered another break while on loan to Shrewsbury in November 1991 and then yet another during a pre-season game at Yeovil. Brother to Sunderland defender Gary.

PAUL BODIN (Age 28, Defender). Born Cardiff. Welsh international full-back signed for a bargain £25,000 from Newport County in March 1988 and previously with Bath City, where he was top scorer with 27 League and Cup goals in 1986/87. Joined Crystal Palace for £550,000 in March 1991 but returned to the County Ground just ten months later.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Age 27, Defender). Born Glasgow. The club captain and currently the longest serving Town player, now in his eighth season at Swindon. The only surviving member of the Town's Fourth Division championship-winning side of 1985/86, Colin has made maximum appearances in four out of seven seasons. His six goals last term was his highest tally to date. Previously with Mansfield Town.

SHAUN CLOSE (Age 26, Striker). Born Islington, London. A £70,000 signing from A.F.C. Bournemouth, Shaun has

made just a dozen full appearances since coming to the County Ground in September 1989. Was top goal-scorer for the Combination side last season, with 25, but has scored just one League goal for the club - after just 33 seconds at Oxford in March.

FRASER DIGBY (Age 25, Goalkeeper). Born Sheffield. For the first time since he arrived at Swindon, six years ago, the former England Under-21 'keeper has not been the club's automatic first choice, having had to share the number one spot with Nicky Hammond during 1991/92. The former Manchester United apprentice has now notched up over 270 appearances for the club.

NICKY HAMMOND (Age 25, goalkeeper). Born Hornchurch, Essex. Made 31 senior appearances for Swindon last season, by far his best return since signing for the club five years ago. Has twice recovered from a broken leg. Arrived on a 'free' transfer from Arsenal, having previously had loan spells with Bristol Rovers, Aberdeen and Peterborough United.

MICKY HAZARD (Age 32, Midfield). Born Sunderland. Signed from Portsmouth in September 1990 for £130,000 after spending eight years at White Hart Lane, during which time he collected both F.A. Cup and UEFA Cup winners' medals. A £300,000 move across London, to Chelsea,

followed in 1985. Now playing some of the best football of his career, he missed just two League games last season.

GLENN HODDLE (Age 34, Defender). Born Hayes, Middx. Joined the Town as player-manager in April 1991, and now normally operates as a 'sweeper'. Capped 53 times for England, Glenn spent 12 years at Tottenham, followed by another three with A.C. Monaco. He was out through injury for half of last season, but began the current campaign in style with a 30-yard winner against Sunderland.

DAVID KERSLAKE (Age 26, Midfield/ Defender). Born Stepney, London. Signed for £110,000 from Queens Park Rangers in November 1989.

David represented England at schoolboy, youth and Under-21 levels. He joined the Loftus Road club as an apprentice, making his first team debut against Partizan Belgrade in a UEFA Cup tie in 1984. Most frequently seen for Swindon as an attacking right-back.

MARTIN LING (Age 26, Midfield). Born West Ham, London. Rejoined the Town a year ago, after almost five years with Southend. A former Exeter City apprentice, Martin was at the County Ground for just 93 days during 1986, making only two senior appearances. In and out of the side last season, the slightly-built midfielder will be hoping for an extended run this time round.

ROSS MacLAREN (Age 30, Midfield/Defender). Born Edinburgh. A £140,000 signing in 1988 from Derby County, where he won a Second Division championship medal, and previously with Shrewsbury Town. Ross is currently recovering from a hernia operation in the spring, having only played three hours pre-season football since. Now nearing his 450th League appearance since his debut in 1980.

CRAIG MASKELL (Age 24, Striker). Born Aldershot. Summer signing from Reading in a £250,000 deal, with Tom Jones moving in the opposite direction. Top scorer for the Elm Park club last season, with 15 goals, Craig was also leading marksman in two seasons with Huddersfield. Began with Southampton and joined Swindon on loan in 1987, scoring six goals in four reserve games.

DAVID MITCHELL (Age 30, Striker). Born Glasgow. Capped 17 times for Australia, David joined the Town a year ago from Chelsea for a nominal fee and found the net eight

times in 28 full appearances. Much travelled goalscorer, having also seen service with Eintracht Frankfurt (Germany), Glasgow Rangers, Feyenoord (Holland) and Newcastle United on loan.

JOHN MONCUR (Age 25, Midfield). Born Stepney, London. A transfer-deadline £80,000 signing from Tottenham last season, John spent almost eight years at White Hart Lane after completing his apprenticeship. He made his League debut while out on loan to Doncaster in 1986, and further loan spells took him to Cambridge, Portsmouth, Brentford and Ipswich.

NICKY SUMMERBEE (Age 21, Defender). Born Altrincham. Started a game for the first time in the final fixture of 1990/91 and made 20 full appearances last season. Began as a striker, but now attacks down the right flank from the back. Has an excellent pedigree, as his father, ex-Swindon, Manchester City and England forward Mike Summerbee, his grandfather and great uncle all played League Football.

SHAUN TAYLOR (Age 29, Defender). Born Plymouth. A £200,000 signing from Exeter City a year ago, Shaun was voted Town's player of the year last season. He was also City's player of the year in their Fourth Division championship side of 1989/90. Came into League football late, signing for the Grecians from western league Bideford Town at the age of 23.

ADRIAN VIVEASH (Age 22, Defender). Born Swindon. Progressed through the 'ranks' at the County Ground, having started his career as a winger. Now plays on the left of the 'back four'. After a League debut that lasted just 21 minutes, he made 27 full appearances in 1990/91, but less than a dozen last season. Currently on monthly contract.

STEVE WHITE (Age 33, Striker). A 'free' transfer signing from Bristol Rovers six years ago, Steve reached a 100-goal milestone for the club last season, before being sidelined with a back injury. Despite playing only 28 games, he was still the club's second highest goalscorer with 15. Began his League career with Rovers in 1977, before 'big money' moves took him to Luton and Charlton.

"PUB TALK"

Football always has been a funny game with a round ball there can never by any exact prediction of how it will bounce or in which direction it will be deflected. Thus when there was speculation as to how the Premier League would affect the game as we know it just about the only certain thing was that it would surprise many people. If the first month is anything to go by than the surprises have exceeded event the wildest speculation.

For not only are two of the most unfashionable clubs in the Premier Division, Norwich City and Coventry City, leading the way in a season when many predicted that they would both struggle to hold on to their places. The managers of these clubs, Mick Walker and Bobby Gould, last season parted company with their previous clubs under something of a cloud, Mick Walker leaving Colchester, who were then in the Vauxhall Conference, and Bobby Gould leaving West Brom, then in Division Three, at a time when just about the only thing that fans, board and players agreed on was that he was not the man for the job.

Now both Walker and Gould have suddenly got together teams who at least in the short term are achieving better results than that multi-million sides for whom it had seemed that the Premier League had been created. In fact Norwich's success has been achieved with a side of no really big names and with a star striker in Mark Robb who was sold by Manchester United at a time when the latter felt that they would be able to mount a challenge for honours perfectly well without him. Another start of this Norwich side is Rob Newman, a player who came into the Football League over a decade ago when after their financial crisis had caused them to dispose of virtually their whole team and send a group of untried youngsters out in their colours. Rob went on to play over 400 games for them but was never thought of as a particular star. When he moved to Norwich in 1991 the fee was a fairly modest £600,000. Now in his 29th year he is proving himself well able to cope at the highest level (if that is in fact what the Premier League is) whether played in defence, midfield or attack.

The Coventry team is even more remarkable in its make up since it consists largely of the men who almost took them out of the top Division last season. One significant addition however is John Williams, who is just about everything a Premier League player might be expected not to be. By the age of 23 he had broken through into the Football League and was in fact playing well down the non-league pyramid for Cradley Town. Then in a 12-month period he played for Swansea City in Division Three, won the Rumbelows Sprint Championship and was snapped up by Bobby Gould. Sceptics might have said that in the cultured football that was envisaged in the Premier League a player capable of such high speed might not be the ideal choice. Yet John Williams the ex-postman is now on everyone's lips after scoring four goals to date and generally making himself useful in a style of football that in general not exactly in the mould that was anticipated for the Premier League.

Nor is Williams the only Premier League graduate from an unlikely source. Other examples include Adrien Littlejohn the winger released by Walsall at a time when they were in the lower half of Division Four who is now making his mark with Sheffield United. It was anticipated originally that the Premier League would be a source of strength to the England line up in a way the old First Division never was. It is early days yet, but shall we eventually see an England line up containing bargain signings from the less fashionable clubs. They may be just the men to be spurred on by new skipper Stuart Pearce who was discovered by the self same Bobby Gould playing for Wealdstone and first made the grade with Coventry City.

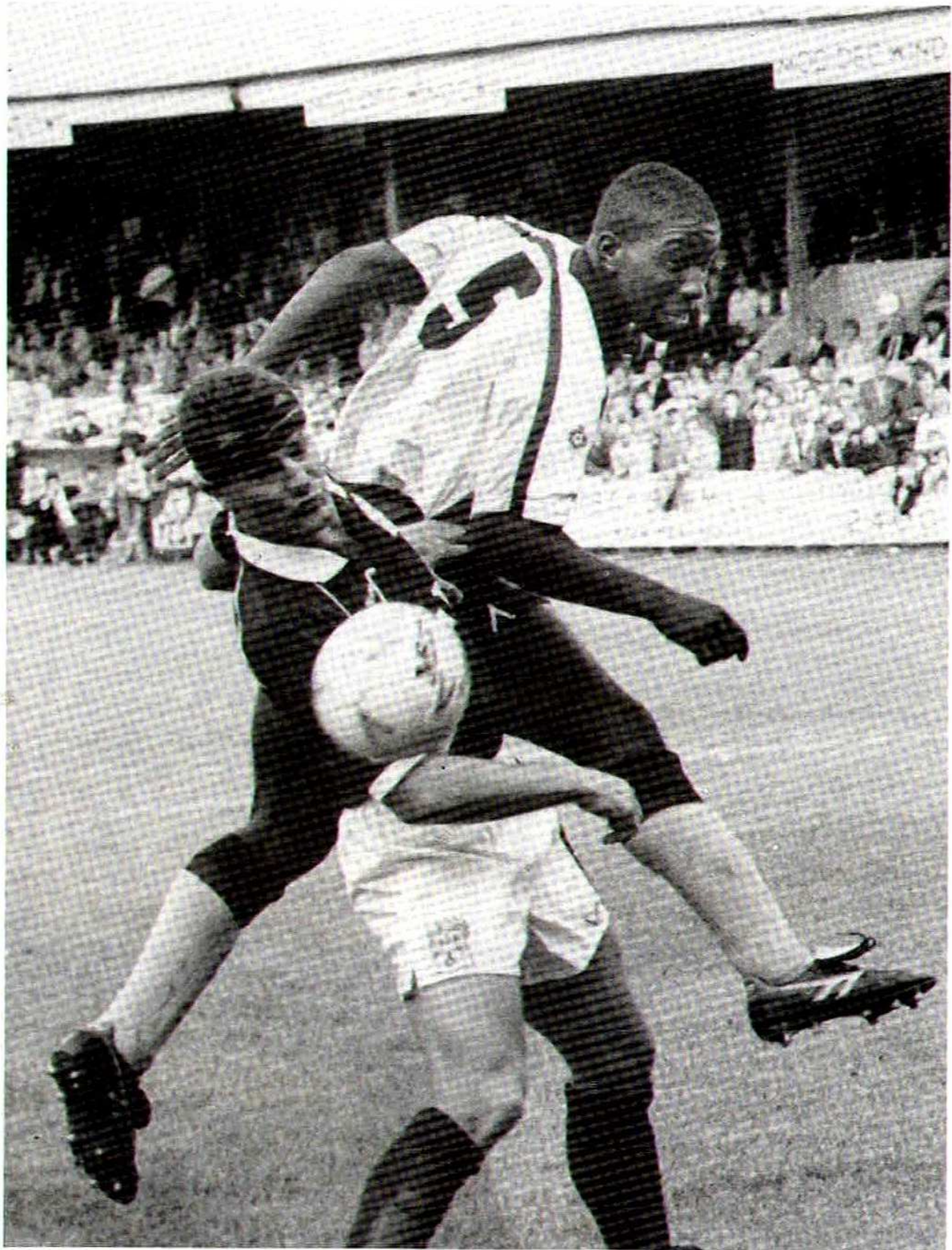

NEWS ON

Despite only losing two of their opening six games Scunthorpe United find themselves bottom of the Football League following Saturday's three all draw with Crewe. United do however have two games in hand on most of the clubs in the division and should they win both of these they could climb to seventh which illustrates how close things are with no side having made a disastrous start. Scunthorpe manager Bill Green will not be too disheartened that The Irons' are at the foot of the table having reached the play off final last May as he has retained the majority of these players with the exception of striker Ian Hamilton who joined West Brom in the summer for £170,000. The Irons will be looking for a good display against Leeds United in the Coca Cola Cup to boost confidence at Glanford Park. When the two sides met in last years competition United held Leeds to a scoreless draw before losing the second leg at Elland Road 3-0.

Cardiff City have every opportunity of progressing to the second round of the European Cup Winners Cup following their one all draw with Austrian side Admira Wacker at Ninian Park on Wednesday. The game attracted a gate of 9,824 who saw Wacker take a half time lead before City equalised through the prolific Chris Pike who has now hit five league and cup goals this season and looks set to continue where he left of last year when he netted twenty two times.

Another striker who is not having any problems finding the back of the net is Steve Norris of

Chesterfield who hit winners in the recent home games against Crewe and Carlisle to take his tally to five for the season. Norris made national headlines two seasons ago when he hit thirty league goals in only thirty nine appearances for Halifax. However following his move to Saltergate last season Norris only scored ten times. The thirty year old striker who began his career at Scarborough looks as though he has refound his goalscoring touch. Despite lying in sixth position in the league Chesterfield have played five of their opening six games at home as a result of the withdrawal of Maidstone and the uneven number of clubs in the division prior to the Stones untimely end.

Walsall have permitted neighbours Aston Villa to use their new Bescot Stadium to stage their reserve team games in the Pontins League. Villa came under criticism following the poor state of the Villa Park turf last season and the move is intended to relive the surface whilst it recovers. Walsall have negotiated a fee of £35,000 to stage the games and will let season ticket holders in for free to watch the games.

Rochdale manager Dave Sutton, under increasing financial pressure at Spotland has blooded the youngest ever player to play for The Dale at their recent away game at Shrewsbury. At only 16 years and 170 days old midfielder Matt McCormack became the club's youngest player of all time and to cap off a perfect day for the teenager The Dale came away with all three points as they won 2-1.

DO YOU REMEMBER?

BARROW

Barrow were a team who we had never played before the setting up of Division Four in 1958, but whom we met 18 times in the 12 seasons and whom we have not met since.

Founded in 1900, they joined the Lancashire League, had to apply for re-election after just one season and then after surviving 1902/3 there they joined the Lancashire Combination Second Division and after just two seasons won promotion to the first. This brought them into contact with the reserves of some famous teams and on one occasion Liverpool reserves visited them with five internationals in their line up. In 1906 they reached the fourth round of the FA Cup for the first time, going down 3-2 to Bradford City, and in 1909 they moved to the Holkar Street Ground where they have played ever since.

They bobbed between First and Second Divisions of the Lancashire League until becoming founder-members of the new Division Three (North) in 1921. Though they had to apply for re-election in 1924 they got into the record books with an FA Cup tie against Gillingham which they eventually won after five games and nine and a half hours of football.

Though they had to apply for re-election five times before the Second World War Barrow chalked up a record 12-1 win against Gateshead in the last game of 1933/4. They closed down during the war years and after re-opening they were several times in the top half of Division Four while star striker Billy Gordon scored 145 goals from 1949 to 1958. They landed in Division Four alongside ourselves when the Fourth Division was created in 1958 and this meant desperately long journeys for both clubs. They attracted 16,340 for an FA Cup tie against Wolves in January 1959 and in the course of those first two Fourth Division seasons we played four very close games winning both of them here by a single goal and drawing on both visits to Holkar Street. Four times in their first seven seasons in Division Four they had to apply for re-election while we met up with them again in 1962 after we had slipped back down again from Division Three.

Of eight games against them we won two, drew two and lost four, chalking up a 6-2 win here in October 1964. Don McEvoy led them to promotion to Division Three in 1967 and after just over a month there they actually topped the table. They ended that season in a respectable eighth position and in their three seasons in Division Three we beat them just twice, 3-1 here in 1968/9 and 4-0 there in 1969/70 just before they were relegated.

Back in Division Four they survived for just three more seasons, having to apply for re-election each time and after what was their eleventh application in all they were pipped by Hereford by 29 votes to 20 in June 1972.

Financially the club were not too badly off and they joined the Northern Premier League, becoming founder/members of the Alliance Premier League in 1983. Three times they have slipped back to the Northern Premier League though they did have their moments in 1987/8 when they reached the semi-final of the FA Trophy. Last season they ended a 3 season spell back in the Vauxhall Conference and back in the HFS Loans League they drew 2-2 at Hyde on Saturday last. Unlike many ex-Football League teams who have disappeared Barrow, still playing at Holkar Street, have dreams of getting back in to the Football League, being currently two steps away.

Tom Capel reduces the arrears for Forest but Hugh Cameron soon restores our two goal advantage before Capel scores a second to make it a nail biting last fifteen minutes for United fans. We hold out for a 3-2 victory in front of an 11,000 crowd. A Maurice Owen goals gives Swindon a 1-0 win over Northampton at the County Ground.

1961

We return to winning ways with a 3-1 success at Lincoln City. Peter Laraman (2) and Reg Jenkins score our goals and our side is: Eddie Marsh, Colin Bettany, Mike Eckersall, Dave Hancock, Brian Lancaster, Geoff Cox, Larry Baxter, Laraman, Tommy Northcott, Jenkins, Ernie Pym.

1964

A second round League Cup tie against Notts County at Plainmoor gives us hope

of further progress and a money-spinner tie in the next round. But we do not perform well against our fellow Fourth Division opponents and a Robin Stubbs goal is all we can manage as we slump to a 2-1 defeat.

1967

We maintain our impressive and unbeaten start to the season with a hard earned 1-1 draw at Grimsby. Our goal is a rather fortuitous own goal scored by Grimsby defender Ron Cockerill but our defence takes the honours, being superbly marshalled by the former West Ham stars John Bond and Ken Brown. 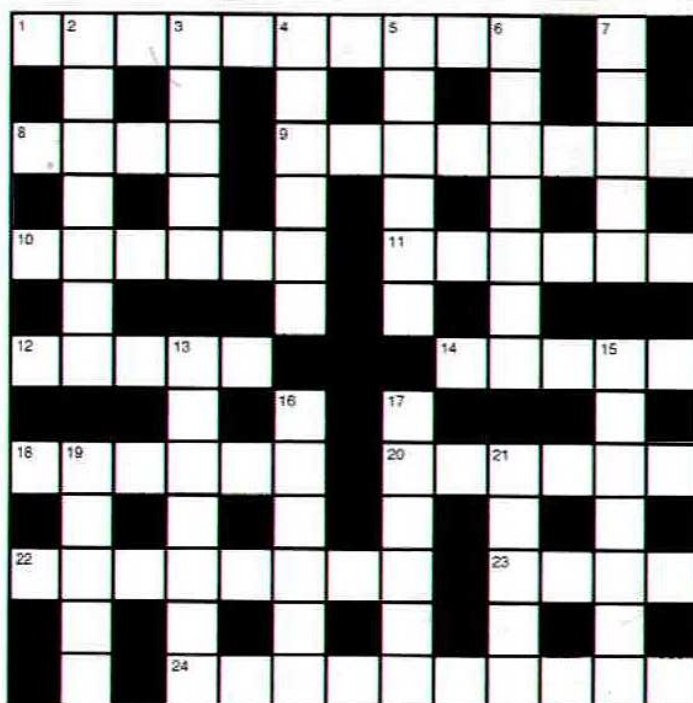

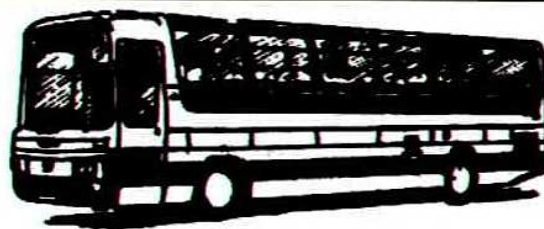

Phil King made 27 appearances for Exeter before Torquay paid £2,000 for Phil in July 1986. After 24 League appearances for the Gulls he first went on loan to Swindon who made the deal permanent in March 1987 by paying £25,000. More importantly, Torquay retained a third of any future profit on a transfer and in November 1989 after 116 games for Swindon, in moved Sheffield Wednesday with a £400,000 transfer. Phil has been a regular player for the Owls and topped over 160 League appearances for them.

As part of the deal that took King to Swindon, Torquay signed Mark Gardiner and Alan McLoughlin from Swindon and took Charlie Henry on loan. Charlie Henry made six appearances for the Gulls

before returning to Swindon. After 223 games for Swindon, Charlie joined Aldershot for whom he played a further 100 games before the Shots went out the League. Mark Gardiner played 10 times for Swindon and soon became a firm favourite at Plainmoor but new Manager Cyril Knowles did not rate Gardiner and after 49 league appearances he was dispatched northwards to Crewe. 4 years later and 140 League appearances have been made by Mark for the Railwaymen. If Gardiner was one of Cyril's mistakes his biggest was Alan McLoughlin. Released by Manchester United, he made 9 appearances for Swindon before joining Torquay in March 1987. After 24 League appearances for the Gulls, he returned to Swindon in October 1987 and after 97 further appearances for Swindon was transferred in December 1990 for £1 million to Southampton.

Other players to play for both include Kenny Allen, David Caldwell, Roy Carter, David Cole, Ernie Edds, Tony Gough, Derek Hall, Charlie Hill, Brian Hughes, Cliff Jackson, Gordon Pembery and Mike Turner.

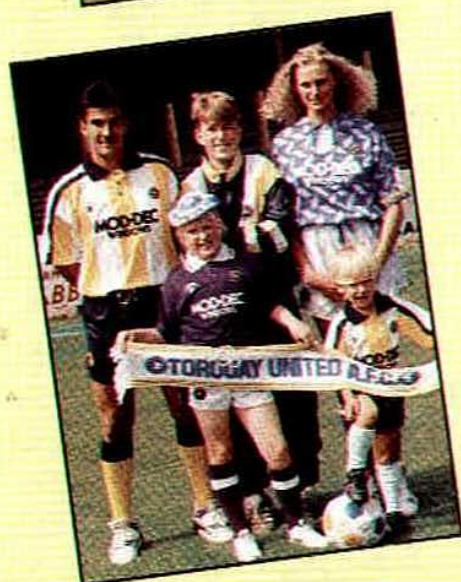
