





Certainly, if the likes of Newcastle, Millwall, West Ham, Swindon and ourselves can make it to the Premier Division, then we can take our philosophies with us.


Today should see the debut of Bjorn Kristensen who has joined us on loan from Newcastle United.

As I have mentioned in these notes previously, I am always trying to improve the quality of the squad. Certainly, with the injury situation this season, supporters have seen a number of different players and formations.


I will be delighted when I can settle on one pattern of play with a settled-side. If we can win today, then hopefully we can use that as a platform to launch us on a winning run.

windon Jown are certainly one of the most attractive teams to watch in the First Division. Led by player-manager Glenn Hoddle, the Wiltshire side always try to be positive.

Sceptics say it is too difficult to climb out of this division playing pure football, as Swindon do. But their high league position and excellent results so far this season surely go a long way towards disproving that view.

Hoddle's predecessor Ossie Ardiles, another man from the Tottenham Hotspur school of football, had Swindon playing the same way. He created a marvellous team which was actually promoted to the old First Division via the play-offs, in 1990, only to be promptly relegated because of financial irregularities. Having never played at the highest level, that was a massive blow to the club.

This season may well offer them their best opportunity to finally join the big boys in the Premier League. Since taking over the manager's hot seat in April 1991, Hoddle has gradually built a team, which now has a settled look. Last time around they finished eighth, five points off a play-off place. That was a disappointing final position for a team which lay second this time last year. A collapse in form either side of Christmas was what really killed their chances.

But surely they won't make the same mistake this time, and will go a lot closer to contention for one of the automatic promotion places. If they do achieve that aim, then they will not only prove that it is possible to escape from the First Division by always playing football, but also that it is not essential to spend lots of money.

This present Swindon side has been put together without paying out by fees, especially compared to the likes of Derby County and Blackburn Rovers. Hoddle has used his enormous experience of football at the highest level to really help his players to develop. He has sold players to the value of £1.6m, but spent less than half of that amount

on replacements. The men who have come in to the Swindon team have benefited from rubbing shoulders daily with arguably England's best player in the last 15 years. To many of them, he was their hero as youngsters dreaming of a career in professional soccer.

But not all great players become successful managers. Hoddle has shown he has what it takes by making some shrewd moves. His first was to appoint an old friend, John Gorman as his assistant. Gorman had been the coach at Leyton Orient and so knew the lower divisions extremely well. This knowledge would prove invaluable to a man taking his first steps in management, as he knew many players in his team would have to come from the league's breeding ground.

Top scorer Craig Maskell, who has been one of the revelations of the season so far, was taken from Reading. Another big success has been the acquisition of midfielder Martin Ling from Southend for just £15,000.

The man who directs most of Swindon's moves in midfield, Micky Hazard, our 'One to Watch', is perhaps an exception. He played at the top with Hoddle at White Hart Lane, before moving to Chelsea. But even he didn't cost a lot of money, and his experience gives the side

some balance.

After beating Torquay United 9 - 2 on aggregate in the second round of the Coca-Cola Cup, they went out to Premier League Oldham 0 - 1 at home.

Here's a run-down on the Swindon first team squad:

Goalkeeper Nicky Hammond, a free transfer from Arsenal, is in his fifth season at the County Ground. He is keeping the more experienced Fraser Digby out of the side at present. Nicky has twice recovered from a broken leg.

Player-boss Glenn Hoddle, now 34, marshalls the back line from his position as a sweeper. He was capped 53 times by England and spent 12 years with Spurs before going to France and playing for Monaco for three years. It was a brave decision for him to take on the job at Swindon, especially as the threat of relegation was a very real one at the time.

He plays behind the two centre backs, captain Colin Calderwood, who is the longest serving player, and last season's Player of the Year, Shaun Taylor, who was signed from Exeter for £200,000 a year ago.

One to watch

MICKY HAZARD



Micky Hazard is now playing some of the best football of his career and is one of the key players in the Swindon side.

Now 32, he has proved to be a bargain buy since his £130,000 move from Portsmouth in September 1990.

At only 5ft 7ins tall and weighing only 10 stone 5 lbs, he is obviously not in the team for his [physical presence. Micky is always buzzing around in midfield creating openings for the strikers to exploit.

He is also a consistent performer, who only missed two league games last season. A great passer of the ball, he ranks among the best midfielders in the country.

During a long career he spent nine seasons at White Hart lane, winning UEFA Cup and FA Cup winners medals, before going on to play in a blue shirt at Stamford Bridge for five seasons. He then wore another blue shirt for Portsmouth for two years.

Our Opponents Today - Swindon Town

Former England Under 21 international **David Kerslake** plays at right back, with free signing **Kevin Horlock** filling the left back spot in place of the injured Paul Bodin.

Alongside Hazard in midfield, Martin Ling is in his second spell at the County Ground and says he wishes he had played for Hoddle before now. Another Tottenham old boy, John Moncur, is in contention for a place in the midfield, although Nicky Summerbee has deputised in recent weeks following an injury to Morcur.

The main strikeforce consists of 24

year-old Craig Maskell, who was Reading's top scorer last season with 15 goals, before joining Swindon for £250,000 in the summer. The muchtravelled Dave Mitchell is Maskell's partner up front. He has an impressive list of clubs which includes Eintracht Frankfurt, Glasgow Rangers and Feyenoord. He is 30 and Steve White is three years older. Often used as a substitute. White was a free transfer from Bristol Rovers. The addition of Maskell has helped to fill the gap left by the departure of Duncan Shearer, who left for Blackburn before going to Aberdeen.



10 YEARS ON ...

Wembley Triumph

Wembley on 24th May 1986 is a moment that will remain in the memory of every City fan. That was the club's first appearance in a Cup Final at the famous ground, ending in a superb 3 - 0 win over Bolton Wanderers in the Freight Rover competition. Yet the Wembley trail started improbably at chilly Plymouth in January with a goal-less draw. City scraped through into the next stage after winning 2 - 1 at Walsall to finish top of the three club group. The Southern quarter-final against Northampton attracted 3,038 fans to Ashton Gate to see Steve Neville head.

Northampton attracted 3,038 fans to Ashton Gate to see Steve Neville head the late winner in a 3 - 2 success after earlier goals by Glyn Riley and Bobby Hutchinson.

Interest was aroused when City were drawn at home to Gillingham in the Southern semi-final. A crowd of 5,707 saw goals from Neville, Alan Walsh (penalty) and Riley set up a 3 - 0 win and a place in the regional final against Hereford United.

Hereford had knocked City from the Milk Cup at the start of the season and again the tie was over two legs. But, in the first game at Edgar Street, it seemed as if the Hereford jinx was about to strike again.

Hereford won 2 - 0 in front of 7,608, leaving City with a monumental task in the return at Ashton Gate. After a goalless first half on 9th May, City's chances were ebbing away.

But the luck turned. A Riley header went through the goalkeeper's fingers and a shot from Howard Pritchard was deflected into his own net by Mike Pejic to take the game into extra time. Neville's goal clinched it.

That set up the greatest football excitement in Bristol for decades. In the two weeks before the final, the whole area was buzzing.

The players and staff were measured for new Cup Final suits, souvenirs were hastily ordered and secretary Jean Harrison and her office workers spent every available minute trying to satisfy the huge demand for Wembley tickets.

The players were given a rousing send-off when they travelled by coach to London on the Friday, and they all experienced a great thrill when they walked over the hallowed Wembley turf on arrival.

Back home, the radio, television and press prepared for the big day with special broadcasts and editions, while an estimated 30,000 fans from the area carefully looked out red and white scarves and rosettes to confirm their allegiance to the Reds.

From dawn on the big day a convoy of cars, mini buses, coaches and even double decker buses streamed eastwards on the M4 towards Wembley. The motorway and exits to the ground were jammed.

But the atmosphere was tremendous happy, smiling faces of young and old looking forward to their greatest day out following Bristol City. It was dubbed "the friendly Cup Final" and that was exactly how it was.

Supporters from Bolton and all parts of Lancashire mingled freely with West Country fans from Bristol, Somerset, Gloucestershire and Wiltshire.

There was one last-minute injury scare. David Harle, signed on loan from Leeds, was troubled by a hamstring strain. But he recovered and Cooper named the following team:

Waugh, Newman, Moyes, Curle, Williams, Pritchard, Hutchinson, Harle, Walsh, Riley, Neville. Subs: Llewellyn, Marshall.

It was a momentus day for Clive Middlemass, the assistant manager Cooper decided to reward his efforts by allowing him to lead out the team. Bolton player-manager Phil Neal's strength at right-back and the skills of former Scottish international Asa Hartford in midfield kept City out until the 44th minute.

Then the red bobble hats were flung into the air in jubilation as Bobby Hutchinson challenged for Keith Curle's free kick and the ball fell for Glyn Riley to score.

That set the pattern and when Steve Neville's 73rd minute shot was parried, Howard Pritchard swept in the second. Six minutes from time Neville capped a Man of the Match display by crossing from the left for Riley to head in the third.

City's profit from the 54,502 crowd (receipts £286,000) was estimated at £80,000. And they received a £15,000 mini-bus as well.

Proud Hutchinson received the trophy as the tearful City players received their medals.


"It is the most emotional occasion of my life," said Cooper. "It was a day for all our supporters. I hope this type of match brings some sanity into the game."

Said Hutchinson: "Showing the trophy to our wonderful supporters gave me the sort of feeling you can't put into words."


Curle even took his two month old son Thomas onto the pitch "To make sure he has been on the Wembley turf," he said

And, as the celebrations continued, level-headed chairman Des Williams carefully gained possession of the cup and stowed it away in the team coach. His concern was understandable for it signified the first great triumph of the re-built BCFC (1982) company.

Sheffield-born Martin Scott started out as a midfield player and it was only later in his career that he became a left-back.

After two seasons appearing for Sheffield Boys and in Sunday football, he joined Rotherham United as a schoolboy, training at Millmoor during the holidays.

He also appeared in Rotherham's young Sunday side, Millmoor Juniors, until he was old enough to become a YTS youngster. Phil Henson, now Rotherham's manager, was assistant to George Kerr at the time and helped Martin's development.

He was brought into the League team for the final three games of the 1984-85 season against York, Cambridge and Wigan. Then Norman Hunter, the former City favourite, took over, and Martin made only one substitute appearance the following season.

But his big chance came the year after when the regular first team left-back Phil Crosby broke his leg. Martin, who was being tried at left-back in the reserves, came in for the final 15 games.

He signed a new two-year contract and retained his place on merit. Then he had a hernia operation and needed another operation soon afterwards to clear a pelvic injury which kept him out for eight months.

By this time Billy McEwan was manager and, with Rotherham placed fourth in the Fourth Division, Martin came in for the last 20 matches and helped the club win the championship.


Rotherham started well in the Third Division but after being second at Christmas, slipped to ninth. He was signed by Jimmy Lumsden for £200,000 in December 1990 and has been a regular in the City side since.


"It was a good move," said Martin, who is now 24. "It was a chance to better myself and step up a division."

"I am working hard to improve even more, having started off near the bottom and making steady progress."

He rates the promotion season with Rotherham as the highlight of his career so far.
