





The steady progress and notable achievements since those dark days have been well chronicled elsewhere but the rise from the battle against Exeter to stay in the Football League to our current position of fighting for a play off place for the Premier Division has prompted many people to ask various questions, for example; how has it been achieved? what have been the highlights? how do you and the Chairman feel when we are suffering a heavy home defeat? do you ever believe we could sus-

tain Premier Division football? and indeed

these questions are thought provoking as we look back on how the past six years

have flown by and that is my first personal

observation. Nothing could have been achieved without the financial backing and guidance of Chairman Peter Johnson, whose unstinting support has given the club stability and a secure background within which to operate. Marketing, publicity, media co-operation and the bringing together of all the different economical and social groups within Wirral under the umbrella of the football club has been an undoubted achievement. It is therefore disappointing to sit and watch a home defeat and to see the club suffer a loss of form but I hope our tried and tested formula of striving to keep the momentum forward will overcome these temporary setbacks.

Looking back, highlights have to be our various Wembley appearances with the play-off against Bolton perhaps the most notable achievement of all, but off the field the past six years have also provided enormous satisfaction in seeing the people of Wirral respond to our initiatives.

They will almost certainly enjoy a place in the Vauxhall Conference next season and I would be personally surprised if they did not add the Liverpool Senior Cup to League and League Cup trophies also. Their Chairman, Charlie Clapham, has been in regular touch with me over the past six years and shares the ambitions that we have for Tranmere Rovers. Southport is a club that can do it and we wish Charlie and everybody else at Haig Avenue every success in the seasons

Finally, some words of congratulations to John Aldridge for his recent PFA Award, to Tommy Coyne and Pat Nevin for international selection, and to Danny Coyne for his selection as an under 21 candidate between the sticks. Well done to all. Tonight our visitors are Swindon Town and despite the many words spoken and written we extend the customary Tranmere welcome to the Board, Manager and players for what we hope will be a good game of football between two of the divisions most entertaining sides. Enjoy tonight's game and the remainder of the season and remember your support from the stand and terraces is vital.

It's not just a six-pointer, but a historic fixture in the football calendar. Some things are inescapable, like the agony felt three seasons ago at Swindon and also Tranmere because of their notorious 'relegation' and the phoney promotion handed to and then removed from Rovers. There is no point denying this undercurrent exists.

And talking of current there is also the floodlight failure that put a dimmer on Tranmere's shortened success at the County Ground earlier in the season. The fact that the return went Swindon's way only heightened the feelings that run deep at Prenton Park. It rubbed further salt in an old wound.

If Rovers were sitting in mid-table, bothered by neither promotion nor relegation, there would still be a cutting edge to this game. The fact that it represents Tranmere's play-off hopes and, possibly Swindon's, makes it one of those occasions that even the script-writers would not dare imagine.

For all that, there is a respect among football lovers for the way Swindon play. It was a style they developed under Ossie Ardiles, albeit with Lou Macari's men and their contracts. Glenn Hoddle has taken it on and made Swindon realistic challengers for the elite they thought they had reached not so long ago.

Even their harshest critics would have to admit that if Swindon do make it this time it will be on merit. Nothing else. Whoever wins today, it will settle a few arguments.

The Management

Glenn Hoddle was always a great player for Spurs, where he was appreciated. The fact that he never became an international superstar is a mystery. He could play passes from heaven, but for his country it often did not happen. Perhaps that is one of the reasons why Hoddle chose management when he returned from a successful spell in France with Monaco. Hoddle's arrival was greeted with scepticism in some quarters, but he has proved people wrong. He means it and could go all the way.

Hoddle has suffered because of

Swindon's money troubles and was furious that they sold David Kerslake to Leeds. If a bigger club came in over the close season he would possibly leave. And there are many who have admired his work so far.

The only cloud on Hoddle's horizon is when he will lose his best player, himself. Now a sweeper, Hoddle is still as good as anything around in this division.

Hoddle's number two is old Spurs colleague, **John Gorman**, a handy Scottish full back in his day who also played for that good Carlisle side of the last decade.

The signings

Hoddle and Swindon have been strapped for cash, so much so that they spent deadline week trying to

sign free-transfer right backs or men on loan to get them through the season. The only arrival of note was **Brian Marwood**, whose career lost its way after winning a title medal with Arsenal that barmy evening at Liverpool.

Marwood went to Sheffield United where he also disappeared before finally Hoddle had the faith that there was life in the old right winger. He was a cracking player in his Sheffield Wednesday days and could still provide some telling crosses.

Hoddle will be hoping that some of the money from the sale of Kerslake comes his way, however after a similar sale which saw Fitzroy Simpson move to Manchester City last season he's unlikely to hold his breath in anticipation. It looks as though he will be expected to make a penny do the work of a pound in the transfer mar-

The Stars

Apart from Hoddle, Swindon have several well-known faces on the First Division scene. They have kept the nucleus of their side and in the case of Paul Bodin, brought them back to the fold.

Left back Bodin, a Welsh International, was a star in the old days who went off to Crystal Palace. Very quickly he fell out of the side, not an uncommon thing at that club, and eventually escaped to his old stamping ground. Bodin is a threat going forward and also packs a shot.

Keeper Fraser Digby is back in favour after a bad couple of seasons when he lost his place. Strangely he was allowed to go to Manchester United, his old club, for a loan spell before being recalled and taking possession of the gloves again.


Skipper Colin Calderwood is talked of as being the next departure, the one that would anger Hoddle the most too. The Scottish centre half is consistency itself and is good enough to play at a higher level. His problem is that he has been with the one club too long that talent scouts are taking him for granted.


Beside Calderwood and in front of Hoddle is the strong-man, Shaun Taylor, who was picked up from Exeter City. The big Devonian was a stout performer for them after being found in the under-rated Western League. Taylor can score and will also spill blood to stop an opponent.

Nicky Summerbee, son of the famous Mike, has made a niche for himself at right back since the departure of Kerslake but is normally a winger.

In midfield there is the canny figure of Ross MacLaren, who was once

TRANSFER VALUATION MADNESS

Has the transfer deadline ever passed with so little activity between clubs? It is indicative of the inflated state of the market and the shortage of real cash (Jack Walker excepted) within the game, that the biggest deal on Thursday 25th March was Efan Ekoko's £765,000 move from Bournemouth to title chasing Norwich City, although the previous day Blackburn, almost inevitably were wheeling and dealing with Kevin Gallacher of Coventry swapping clubs with Roy Wegerlie in a deal rated at £2,000,000. Dalglish also swapped striker Steve Livingstone for Chelsea's Graeme Le Saux.

Good as Stan Colleymore may be at the moment, its hard to swallow Southends' valuation of £2M for a player they bought earlier in the season for £150,000! Are we to believe he is 13 times the player he was eight months ago?

Some 18 months ago when Colleymore was playing for Stafford Rangers, Rovers were one of several clubs who had him under the microscope. The verdict then was he was 'ungainly with poor ball control', but Crystal Palace boss Steve Coppell gambled £100,000 on him in January 1991. In his dozen or so appearances for Palace he made little impression and judging by reports Coppell was more than happy to offload him at a £50,000 profit.

Yet here we are eight months on and a dozen goals to his credit, asked to believe his 'value' has soared to £2,000,000!

If you think thats crazy what about Stockport's valuation on their gangling 'Basketball' player, Kevin Francis. They apparently value the big man at £3,000,000.

It is little wonder therefore that clubs continue to look to Scandinavia, much to the chagrin of the P.F.A., for value for money imports.

Surely the time has come for a panel to put a ceiling on transfer valuations, based on age and international experience, before the game strangles itself and the only people who can afford to buy are Jack Walker at Blackburn and Derby benefactor Lionel Pickering.

SID THOMPSON R.I.P.

Club Officials were saddened to learn of the death on March 25th of Vice-President Sid Thompson. For many years, Sid was the Manager of the Birkenhead branch of the Allied Irish Bank – the clubs bankers – and as such played a major role keeping the club afloat in the dark days. A regular fan, he was last at Prenton for the Portsmouth match two days earlier. We send our condolences to his family.

But we would point out that when an underground cable burned out we had no prior warning and the local Electricity Board Engineers could not fix the fault immediately,

unlike Swindon who were, we believe, aware of the possibility of a power failure **before** the match.

Capped while with Rovers by David Ogden

Recent followers of Rovers may not realise that the days of international players in the side were until recently a rare phenomenon. Pat Nevin scored for Scotland against Malta in February and John Aldridge hit a hat trick for the Republic of Ireland against Latvia earlier this season. Aldo's Eire team mate Tommy Coyne has also joined the fold with the promise of adding to his nine caps, but still no Rovers player has represented England at full international level.

How many Rovers fans can name the earlier international stars? Dixie Dean quickly comes to mind, having scored eighteen goals in sixteen England appearances in the 20's. However he was not capped during his brief Tranmere career, all his international appearances coming during his outstanding career with Everton. Similarly, Roy McFarland won twenty eight caps for England while with Derby County and Steve Coppell gained forty two caps with Manchester United. A current ex-Tranmere international is Colin Clarke, Portsmouth's Northern Irish striker. He was called up while at Rovers but never played.

All these players went on to international recognition after they left Rovers for clubs in higher divisions. What about the lesser known stars of their day who achieved international call ups during their Prenton career?



national player in the days before the club joined the Football League. He played for Wales in their 0-2 defeat by England at Cardiff on 16 March 1914. Rowlands left for Reading at the end of the season, having helped Rovers win the Lancashire Combination title.

Jack Brown, a team mate of Dixie Dean was Rover's next international star. Signed from Glenavon, where he had already been capped for Ireland, Brown won two more caps while with Rovers in 1924. Normally an inside right, he switched to the right wing against England to accommodate Tucker Croft in the side. Brown later recalled that Croft failed to appear until twenty minutes before kick off, claiming to have downed four pints of porter. It certainly calmed his nerves, for Croft scored the winning goal in a 2-1 win for the Irish. Brown's final appearance for his country was in a 1-2 defeat to Wales. He scored eleven goals in forty eight league matches for Rovers.



Bert Gray, a Welsh keeper was Rover's most capped player until Aldo's international exploits. In 1931 the Home International series was held in the last three months of the year and despite three defeats, Gray kept his place in the Welsh side. A 2-3 home defeat to Scotland was followed by a 1-3 defeat to England at Liverpool. A 0-4 defeat in Ireland completed his long held record run of appearances. Gray played in a total of one hundred and ninety two league games for Tranmere and led the

side to victory in the Welsh Cup in 1935. He was also capped during his spells with Oldham, Manchester City, Manchester Central (!) and Chester, earning a total of twenty four caps for his country.

For the record, A.C. Lewis, a right winger who played in eight league games for Rovers was selected for the Wales amateur side in 1932/33. T.L. Davis won two of his four Ireland caps in 1938 while with Rovers against Czechoslovakia and Poland. An inside right, he scored six goals in ten league games for Tranmere.



Finally, the last Rovers international before the present era was Tony Rowley, a centre forward who cost £3,500 from Liverpool. In 1959 he played for Wales in a 1-4 defeat to Northern Ireland in Belfast, his only cap at the age of twenty nine. The previous Saturday he had scored four for Tranmere in a 9-0 win over Accrington. 'His intelligent and artistic touches were as delightful as ever' reported the Birkenhead News. Rowley scored fifty one times in his one hundred and eight league appearances for Rovers.

Who will be the next Rovers player to earn full international recognition? Eric Nixon for England, Danny Coyne for Wales? Whoever, the club's ascent up the league structure will surely mean that international calls will be far more frequent than in Rover's darker days.



To be fair, things do improve after that, but rarely rise above the mediocre.

Like most things connected with the set up at Upton Park, the Hammers' programme is more than ready for the Premier League.

Although the clubs who enjoy relatively high attendances and, therefore, programme sales, should always be able to produce better quality publications, this is not always the case. Editor Tony McDonald and his team deserve full credit then for a programme packed with interesting well-written features, top quality photographs and a tremendous array of statistics, all presented in a tidy, but attractive layout style.

The Rovers coverage is fairly brief, but well researched, apart from the seemingly commonly held view (judging by several other programmes this season) that we PAID £120,000 for Ronnie Moore to Cardiff City. In those days,

The role of agents in football once again came under fire last week from PFA Chairman Gordon Taylor.

Football's wheeler-dealers were accused of turning the game into a state similar to the 'slave trade' with their involvement in bank-busting transfer feals – and that's a view shared by increasing numbers.

More and more players are holding out for the best offers as clubs barter with their contracted agents who take a percentage cut in the deal. And, while some players benefit, others lose out to the less proficient men-in-themiddle... and so do the clubs.

Tranmere Chairman Peter Johnson is one of the growing band to show distaste in their involvement. He voiced his concern in an interview in the Wirral News earlier this season. He too believed that agents were a major reason for transfer prices rocketing and 'silly money' being paid in personal terms for players.

Transfer fees often help football with large sums being passed down invariably from big, wealthy clubs to their more poverty-stricken rivals of the lower leagues.

Yet agents' involvement can mean deals breaking down because clubs aren't prepared to be pushed into a corner and break their pay structure – subsequently clubs are also no prepared to pay the transfer fee.

Players can also lose out when an agent doesn't fulfill initial promises to find sponsorship deals and other fringe benefits open to them if sought out.

So more the reason for reducing their involvement in the game. But then again football has invited these people into its confidence and indeed many agents are former players.

Some obviously work out better for players, probably at the right price, but the only way out now seems to be to try and reduce the involvement of agents and consider it a lesson learnt.

Some players won't be happy, while for others it will be a relief – it certainly will be to managers and chairmen. So it seems the only way forward is to put limits on agents' working within deals between clubs and players but for other 'outside' projects leave the onus and risk with the player. Maybe then there will be less greed in the game and more clubs less financially stricken.






All three teams will now be involved in the Everton Park Cup competition with hopefully more success coming to our Club.





The Way We Were ... in 1953-54

The fact that Rovers attendances dropped drastically to a post war lowest average of 9517, reflected a poor campaign which saw the team finish 14th with 43 points form 46 matches, having started badly with a 2-5 home defeat by Mansfield.

When Rovers thrashed Wrexham 6-1 with Cyril Done scoring a hat-trick hopes were high that they had at last turned the corner, but just two weeks later the same side were humiliated 0-6 at Stockport to highlight their inconsistency. Nevertheless, Done still finished top scorer with 25 league goals plus six in the F.A. Cup from 35 matches. Harold Atkinson netted 11, but other than that the marksmanship from others was sadly lacking.

None of the new signings that season, Don Woan, Pat Jackson, Mike Fleming, Keith Davies and Derek Jones made much impact so it was left to the old stagers yet again to lift spirits. In the F.A. Cup an away victory at Gateshead (2-1) was followed by a 2-2 draw at Accrington before Rovers won 5-1 (Done 3) in the home replay. But in the 3rd round Leyton Orient held us to a 2-2 draw at home, and finished off the job 4-1 at Brisbane Road, in front of 14249 fans. The reserves meanwhile lost to Liverpool, 1-2, in the semi-final of the Liverpool Senior Cup and to Chester after a replay in the Cheshire Bowl final. The pressure was beginning to mount on Manager/Secretary Blackburn...

Behind the Scenes . . .



Barbara Moore and the Red Cross Team

The Red Cross have been in attendance at Tranmere Rovers' matches for about 20 years, and Barbara Moore herself has been coming to Prenton Park for 15 of those years. She has been a Red Cross member for nearly 50 years, having joined them, rather than St. John's Ambulance Brigade, for their international connections and humane reputation, at the end of the War.

Barbara is originally from Harrogate and trained as a nurse at St. James' Hospital, Leeds. She came to the Wirral 35 years ago with her late husband, who, incidentally, was a rugby follower. Barbara says that she is not a football fanatic herself, but does always look out for Rovers's results.

She is the undisputed Red Cross leader at Tranmere, and she teaches, examines and trains both her own team and the Rovers' stewards. She also liaises with the Ambulance Service and the Police. Had she had any thoughts of giving this position up, her mind was changed by the events at Hillsborough.

Barbara is in attendance at every home game, and normally arrives bout an hour and a half before the kick off. She is usually one of the last to leave, as well as one of the first to arrive, especially if a player has been badly injured and needs attention, and can sometimes still be at the ground at 10.30pm. She and her team consist of about a dozen people, all of whom give up their time and skills voluntarily for the Red Cross; they are based in the First Aid Room under the Main Stand.

Away from Rovers, Barbara, who lives in Oxton, enjoys reading, driving and music – she likes to go to the Philharmonic Hall – and is very involved with her local Church.
