





The players too are hungry to grab their chance. Lads like Aldo, Pat Nevin, Eric Nixon and Mark Proctor didn't jump abord to look for an easy life outside the Premier Division. They came because Tranmere Rovers is an ambitious and progressive club and they wanted to help steer us to the top flight.

For the younger players and those who have never played at the top level, our current position represents a new and exciting challenge - one they have all dreamt of and together we are all riding a wave which we hope will carry us from the bottom of the Fourth Division to football's Everest.

We know however that there is much to be done yet before we can all bask in the glory of Premier Division sunshine.

Swindon are a very good side, orchestrated by one of the greatest players this country has seen in the last two decades, Glenn Hoddle, but so are we as I think our form over the last ten League matches has proved.

We weren't in second position during November, December and January without good reason. The fact that we slumped after that was. I believe. directly attributable to the loss of John Aldridge, but once the boys realised they could still win without his goals, his return has been a tremendous bonus. We also had to shake things up a bit and that is why I brought in Mark Proctor and Tommy Coyne who have both played their part in our revival to finish fourth.

We kept the momentum going against Watford and Sunderland, two sides with much to prove. Watford are a big, awk-

ward side that play very directly and whose manager, Steve Perryman, is mystified why his side aren't top of the league! They gave us problems on the day but we showed sufficient character to overcome the loss of two defenders and a late penalty award against us to snatch a victory at the death courtesy of the coolest player on the park, Aldo.

That goal secured our place in the Play Offs but we needed to keep the pot boiling against Sunderland who needed three points for very different reasons. We deserved our victory on the night but I'm pleased Sunderland avoided the drop. A club of their stature should not be in danger of relegation.

Our point at Peterborough was not achieved without its problems. Danny

Covne was so unlucky to be sent off. You felt for the lad as he'd done well up to then. He came for the ball but lost his bearings fractionally, like opening a door and finding you have fallen down the steps. But we didn't expect anything other than the letter of the law from Mr. Lewis and as usual he was true to form. Even the Peterborough players and crowd appealed on the lads behalf. Danny will come again, that's for sure, and be stronger and wiser for that experience.

After Danny went, Higgy opted to go in goal. Who else would be confidently clowning with the crowd in such a situation? The rest of the lads though were tremendous in protecting Higgy and could with a bit of luck even won the

Whatever happens tonight it has still been a tremendous season. Win or lose the hard work doesn't end tonight. There is much yet to be done. Contract negotiations with several players during the summer and a very important application to the Central League for membership are just two items on the agenda. There is no point in us reaching for the Premier Division if we cannot be sure of quality reserve football for those out of the first team.

Hopefully, there will be packed house tonight to cheer us on to Wembley. While we would obviously like to see Prenton 3 Park full regularly, this should be one of those special nights - to score two goals to level the tie is not impoossible. We didnt enjoy much luck at Swindon what with the own goal and Aldo's perfectly good goal being ruled out perhaps we are due a change of fortune tonight and I would appeal to you to shout yourselves hoarse in the cause. Let's hear the noise rolling down from the stands and terrraces. Together we can do it. Let's go for it!

The script writers have been at it again. The word "play-off" will forever be a link between Tranmere and Swindon, caused by events three years ago and finally to be settled tonight. At least this time it will be on the field of play and not some smoke-filled room in the corridors of power.

For the uninitiated the trouble began before and after Swindon won promotion to the top flight via a Wembley showdown with Sunderland. In the aftermath came a league ruling that they should forfeit that win and go down TWO divisions as a punishment for contract crimes. In their place, it was believed, would go Tranmere. who had failed by a narrow margin against Notts County, in their own play-off game a division down. So by a quirk of fate and not little naughtiness Rovers had finally won promotion. The celebrations were such that preparations for the following season were well under way when the FA reversed the League decision and decided the half measure of putting Swindon into the old Second Division was the best course. There was no promotion for Tranmere!

Ever since, the name Swindon has been muttered darkly in these parts. Talking of darkly there was also the case of the failing floodlights earlier this season, with Rovers in sight of a great away win. The replay, with the punters being charged for the privilege, went the other way.

So it was no surprise that pumped up Rovers settled at least one score in the last home game, with a Kenny Irons hat-trick. The result did much to fire a run to fourth place by our own lads and did not help Swindon's bid for automatic promotion. Thanks to the system that allows consolation prizes for the teams finishing out of the top two, horns are locked again tonight.

This game has enough passion and meaning already, but the throwing together of these sides with that recent history promises that the tie should be one of those occasions that join

folklore and will keep grandfathers in stories to grandchildren well into the next century.

THE MANAGEMENT

Glenn Hoddle must wonder what all of this rivalry is about. He was still an aristocrat in France with Monaco when the Swindon scandals were dogging the headlines. The departure of Ossie Ardiles, part prompted by the fallout of that row, opened the door for Hoddle. After that eyebrow-raising move the cynics have been forced to admit it was an inspired choice.

Hoddle the player was and at this level still is, a genius, but was never fully rewarded with medals or caps. He could easily have been a butterfly consigned to the pages of history as a nice player who entertained but never carved a notch at the places that mattered. But as a boss he has shown a depth of knowledge and commitment that belies his slender frame and those twinkling feet.

There will be a big club some day for Hoddle to boss and he may be a leader of the game, bringing back old virtues of passing and skill. Like Kevin Keegan he has proved that good players can become good bosses without selling out their principles.

Whether Swindon can sustain his irresistible rise is another matter. Money has been short, as was his temper when they sold David Kerslake to Leeds. There are many big clubs who are just waiting for Swindon to fail to test Hoddle's keenness for personal promotion, Chelsea, Derby County, you name them.


Hoddle has learned his trade well and quickly, but above all he has put his stamp on the side. They will play classy football tonight and if they match that with guts then this should be a classic.

THE TEAM

Many of this side are remnants of the team that won and then lost promotion three years ago. It is hard not to feel sympathy for them as people rather than the agents of a plot that was unearthed by investigations. Rules were broken but they still sweated their way to a promotion they deserved on the pitch.


That row seemed certain to wreck the side and force them away, but many have lived to fight this other day. With that background it is unlikely they will give up the fight while there is hope.

Colin Calderwood has been the leader since the early days back in the old Third and Fourth










Division. A no-nonsense defender it is amazing that he has not progressed. Worse Scottish players than him have won caps, some of them in Portugal last month.

Ross McLaren is another Scot who has spent his senior days down south. He was given away by Rangers at a time when they could not afford such mistakes. It was the best thing that could have happened for him. At every club he has done well especially Shrewsbury and Derby County.

Keeper Fraser Digby and both Paul Bodin and Martin Ling did move on in the wake of the play-off pantomime but all came back. Since our last game **Craig Maskell**, their leading scorer, has been recalled and responded with a couple in that unbelievable 6-4 success at Birmingham.





Unfortunately, I'm not sure that the long wait has been worthwhile! I could find a total of only FOUR pages of reading matter, which I suspect is a record for this season.



Priendliest fans: The atmosphere at West Ham, particularly outside the ground, was reminiscent of the pre-hooligan days when fans of both sides could mingle happily with never a hint of trouble.

Least friendly fans: At Derby exactly the opposite was the case. Enough said!

Most helpful police/stewards: I feel that the authorities' approach to fans in general is improving almost everywhere as the threat of hooliganism subsides, but the police and stewards at Luton stood out as being particularly friendly and co-operative.

So there you have my memories of following Tranmere this season. No doubt you have many more, but here's hoping that they are all surpassed by the events at Wembley on May 31st.

IN THE EVENT OF VICTORY IN THE SEMI-FINALS . . . YOUR ROUTE TO WEMBLEY STADIUM

Use M6, M1 to A406 (North Circular Road). Use either Neasden Lane, Forty Lane and Empire Way to reach stadium or continue along North Circular and exit into Drury Way and Great Central Way to Stadium.

As an alternative to the North Circular Road, M1 Junction, which often becomes quite congested. Police ask you to consider using the M1, M25, A40, A406 route approaching from Harrow Road and Wembley Hill Road. Please give yourself plenty of journey time.

By bus: Nos. 83, 92 and 182 come to Wembley Arena, 18 comes to the Triangle (5 minutes walk). 297 (alight at Wembley Park Station) and 245 (alight at Bridge Road) serve the complex.

By train (Underground): To Wembley Park by Metropolitan Line or Jubilee (Stanmore) Line. To Wembley Central by Bakerloo Line (peak hours). British Rail: To Wembley Central from Euston or Broad Street. To Wembley Stadium from Marylebone.

Severe parking restrictions are in operation around the Stadium area. If you leave a vehicle within the 'No Parking' zone it will be removed and will cost over £100 to get it back. On top of that there will be £28 to pay for the parking ticket. So please use the Stadium Car Parks (£15 per coach and £6 per car) or travel by public transport.

Match programme – An A4 size full colour production produced by the Football League not Wembley.

Poles supporting flags, and banners are liable to confiscation, before entering the stadium. Small flags only with a cane or wood handle, not exceeding 18in. are permissable however. Banners without poles are OK, providing they are not offensive. Golf style umbrellas are also banned.

Ticket prices £12, £16, £19, £21, £25, £29. Family enclosure £21, £19. U16/OAP half price.

The gradual slide that had started in 1955 gathered momentum in 1956-57 season to leave Rovers facing a re-election nail-biter at the end of the season. Noel Kelly's first full season in charge was memorable for all the wrong reasons.

Indeed, the first 18 matches produced just two victories and it never got any better with only seven victories all season – our worst ever record apart from 1938-39. Goals were a problem. New signing Jim Dodd registered only 10 from centre forward in a side that was creaking and in need of a major overhaul. Even the FA Cup failed to lift spirits, Rovers being dumped out by non-leaguers Bishop Auckland, 2-1 away, at the first hurdle.

The chance of Liverpool Senior Cup glory died at the semi-final stage to Everton, while defeat by Stockport in the Cheshire Bowl final put the cap on a miserable campaign.

Not surprisingly for a team in 23rd place, gates were down to an average of 5,963. It was with great relief therefore that re-election was successful at the League AGM in June.

Behind the Scenes... BOB EVANS

Rovers' chief steward Bob Evans has been a Tranmere supporter for 56 years, and a steward for 20 of those years. He has been in his current position as chief steward for three years and the stadium safety officer for the past 18 months. He defines the main responsibility of his job as seeing that all the supporters get into Prenton Park safely, are safe while they are in there and then leave again in a safe manner. This responsibility is broad-based as Bob liaises with the Police, the Fire Brigade, the Red Cross and so on. He generally arrives three hours before kick off and is here for about two hours after the final whistle. All the stewards report to Bob - in fact, his brother is his deputy - and his match-day base is the Control Room. The stewards' briefing takes place in the Main Stand before the gates are opened, where the match in prospect is discussed in terms of the number of visitors expected, any potential problems, known trouble-makers and emergency actions to be taken in case of any incidents. From 50-75 stewards are required for each League game, depending on the size of the crowd expected. Away from Tranmere, Bob lives in Prenton and works for Port Dredging in Bromborough. He spent 14 years in the Merchant Navy as an engineering officer, during which time he saw most of the world.

On a personal note, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all my "victims" of the Backstage feature this season for their courtesy and co-operation, often at very short notice. It's been fun and informative talking to everyone, and I hope I haven't unduly upset or libelled anyone!






