



#### Blades Too Sharp For Chelsea - by John Nolan



Willie Falconer's 32nd minute header, which was deflected past Chelsea goalkeeper Kharine last week, ended a barren run for the Blades. It provided their first win in 13 Premiership games.

The season had kicked off well for the Yorkshiremen when they secured a 3-1 victory over us at Bramall Lane. Falconer, Bradshaw and Rogers were their marksmen, though the 3-1 margin somewhat flattered them.

A 3-0 defeat at Old Trafford was perhaps not unexpected but Mr Bassett certainly expected more at Goodison Park where they crashed 4-2.

Wimbledon's unbeaten start to the season was then ended at Bramall Lane. A header from Jostein Flo and another goal from Falconer giving Dave Bassett his first win over his former club in seven attempts.

Flo, making his home debut, created constant problems for the opposition. Jonas Wirmola, another Scandinavian import, a £50,000 bargain from Sporvagen (Sweden), also excelled in an unexpected League debut.

Flo was the target in the next two games but against Tottenham Hotspur controversy raged when goalkeeper Kelly had to retire with a cheek wound incurred as Spurs scored their second goal in a 2-2 draw.

Adrian Littlejohn scored both United's goals but he was in trouble on a miserable night at Blackpool. United crashed 3-0 to the Second Division side in the first leg of their Second round Coca-Cola Cup tie.

A 1-0 home defeat inflicted by Manchester City followed and United fans were really low as Southampton forged a 3-1 lead at the Dell. Then Flo took charge with two goals in the last nine minutes to force an incredible draw.

That three goal deficit in the Coca-Cola Cup proved too much however, United's 2-0 win in the second-leg just not enough. In the Premiership three successive draws brought much needed points but this was followed by three straight defeats against Norwich, Aston Villa and Newcastle United.

On loan Leicester City goalkeeper Carl Muggleton was in line for his United debut last Saturday but Kelly was passed fit for action and Kevin Gage was also recovered from injury to take his place in defence.

Jostein Flo and Adrian Littlejohn were still ruled out however and veteran striker Alan Cork had to withdraw with flu.


#### Sheffield United ABC

ALAN CORK - Striker. A veteran of over 465 League appearances he scored his 150th League goal this season. Served his apprenticeship with Derby County - making his League bow on loan with Lincoln City at Oxford United 14-9-77. Wimbledon snapped him up on a free-transfer in February 1978 and in 14 years with the Dons "Corky's" goals lifted the club through all the divisions. Won an FA Cup winners' medal in 1988 and after rejoining Mr Bassett on a "free" in 1992 scored at Wembley last season in the FA Cup semi-final. Born: Derby 4-3-59.

willie FALCONER - Midfield. A great allrounder who is equally at ease in midfield or defence. Established himself as a utility player with Aberdeen who had signed him from Lewis United - before arriving at Watford. Scored 12 goals in 98 League games for the Hornets before continuing his career with Middlesbrough. Cost Sheffield £400,000 in the summer of 1993. Born: Aberdeen 5-4-66.

AREVIN GAGE - Fullback. Clocked up 168 League appearances in 7 seasons with Wimbledon (15 goals). Was the Dons youngest ever League debutant (v Bury 2-5-81) while still an apprentice; and gained England Youth recognition. Hard tackler, he helped Wimbledon climb from the 4th to the 1st Division. In July 1987 £100,000 took him to Villa where he became a firm favourite. Again won promotion (1987-88); but a loss of form cost him his place and Dave Bassett shelled out £150,000 for him in November 1991. Born: Chiswick 21-4-64.

JOHN GANNON - Midfield. A "free" signing from Wimbledon four seasons ago John has established himself as a busy industrious competitor in midfield. Has a sweet left foot and is dangerous with his set-plays. Born: Wimbledon 18-12-66.

charlie Hartfield - Midfield. Like Gannon has a good left-foot but with the added bite of a fiercesome tackle. Can play at fullback. Has taken over from John of late making the breakthrough last season with 12 appearances. Was a trainee with Arsenal - having been on Schoolboy forms with Aston Villa - but after two years as a pro at Highbury without the remotest chance of a game he joined United in August 1991 on a "free". Made his League debut at Crystal Palace 31-8-91. Born: Lambeth 4-9-71.

GLYN HODGES - Left Wing. Excellent crosser of the ball he served his apprenticeship with Wimbledon, making his League debut at Halifax 27-9-80. Played his part in the club's rise to Division One and in 1987 moved to Newcastle United for £200,000. Seven games and three months later he was with Watford (£300,000); and in the summer of 1990 signed for Crystal Palace. Made only 11 senior appearances in a year at Selhurst Park and joined the Blades in January 1991 for £450,000. Born: Streatham 30-4-63.

JAMIE HOYLAND - Midfield. Son of a former United wing-half, Tommy, Jamie started his career with Manchester City, making his entrance in League football v Derby (26-11-83). Made only one further appearance in two years and moved on to Bury where he topped the score-chart in season 1989-90 with 16 goals from midfield. United paid £250,000 for him in July 1990 but it wasn't until the following season that he really established himself. Born: Sheffield 23-1-66.

CHRIS KAMARA - Midfield. Seasoned campaigner who first stepped on the League stage in September 1975 when he played for Portsmouth v Luton. In August 1980 he was signed by Swindon, scoring 21 goals in 147 League outings for Town before returning to Fratton Park in 1981. Eleven games later he was in Brentford's colours and remained at Griffin Park until 1985 when he resigned for Swindon. Added another 87 League games to his tally over the next three seasons before switching to Stoke City. In January 1990 Leeds United made a surprise swoop and Chris helped them clinch the Second Division Championship. After 15-years of senior football Chris was to achieve an ambition and play in the First Division. Played 10 times in the top flight and was then allowed to sign for Luton Town, Impressed Dave Bassett during a loan spell with the Blades last season and was signed from the Hatters on a free in the summer of 1993. Born: Middlesbrough 25-12-57.

ALAN KELLY - Goalkeeper. Signed from Preston North End in the summer of 1992 as cover for Simon Tracey but injury to the latter gave Alan an early chance last season and he performed well, culminating with a starring role at Wembley in the FA Cup semifinal against Sheffield Wednesday. Such was his form that Alan earned a place in Jack Charlton's World Cup squad and he won his first cap for the Republic of Ireland against Hungary. Stands 6' 2" tall and made his debut in the League for Preston at Aldershot in May 1986. Born: Preston 11-8-68.

#### **Sheffield United ABC**

ADRIAN LITTLEJOHN - Striker. Speedy front runner who graduated through the FA School of Excellence at Lilleshall but was later released by West Brom after serving as a trainee. Walsall picked him up and gave him his chance against Huddersfield Town (14-1-90) but after two years at Bescot he was given a free. Dave Bassett offered him a job but it wasn't until the 1992-93 season that he really came to the fore as Brian Dean's partner, Born: Wolverhampton 29-6-70.

ROGER NILSEN - Defender. Norwegian International who has already booked his ticket to the World Cup Finals in the States next summer. Can play left-back or as a central defender though his previous club, Viking Stavanger, with whom he won Norwegian Championship medals, often used him in midfield. Has scored several goals for his country, including a last-minute equaliser in a 2-2 draw with Sweden. Signed for the Blades in November 1993 and will eventually cost £500,000. Age: 24.

**PAUL ROGERS** - Midfield. Tireless grafter who made a late entry into League football at the age of 26. Paul, a stockbroker by profession had played for nine years with Sutton United when Mr Bassett persuaded him to abandon his lucrative business and turn full-time pro with United. That was in January 1992, and Paul made his debut in midfield at Luton (22-2-92). Born: Portsmouth 21-3-65.

simon tracey - Goalkeeper. A shoulder injury restricted Simon to just 10 League appearances last season but he has been back in the team this campaign. A bargain buy from Wimbledon in 1988 he developed so impressively that he was on standby for England before that injury. Joined Wimbledon from school as an apprentice but played only one League game in their colours. Started this season with 123 League appearances for United. Born: Woolwich 9-12-67.

bavid tuttle - Central Defender. A product of the Tottenham Hotspur youth scheme he graduated to make his League debut at Chelsea (1-12-90) in a 3-2 defeat. Only given an occasional outing he made the news with a vital early goal against Hajduk Split in a ECWC tie but then saw his chances blunted by a succession of injuries including a cracked shin picked up while playing on loan for Peterborough United. Joined Sheffield in the summer of 1993 for £350,000. Born: Reading 6-2-72.

MITCH WARD - Right Wing. Has been at Bramall Lane since his schoolboy days making the break into the senior side in September 1990 against Manchester City. Had a spell on loan with Crewe Alexandra to gain experience. Frustrated at not getting a regular place he asked for a transfer at the beginning of last season and though Cambridge United made an offer United refused. Drafted in at fullback during an injury crisis he performed with credit but hit the headlines

last season when he came off the bench to score twice and force an FA Cup 6th Round replay tie with Blackburn into a penalty shoot-out. Mitch duly ramming in the first spot-kick himself! Following that he was named Barclays "Young Eagle of the Month." Born: Sheffield 19-6-71.

DANE WHITEHOUSE - Midfield. Seen by many as the brightest young prospect at Bramall Lane, he like Mitch Ward, has been at the club since his schoolboy days. Drafted into the team at Blackpool (15-10-88), he did not become a regular until 1991-92. Was out for five months with a cracked shinbone, making a surprise return at leftback in the FA Cup tie at Blackburn and continued in this role until after the semi-final at Wembley against the Owls. Then reverted to his normal left midfield position. Born: Sheffield 14-10-70.

Other players in the squad include club skipper Brian Gayle - a record signing from Ipswich in 1991 at £700,000 - who has been missing from the defence with a knee injury. Winger Andy Scott, who made a scoring League debut against Chelsea in the final fixture of last season following a £50,000 move from Sutton United; and Norwegian International striker Jostein Flo, who at 6' 4" was dubbed in Norway as the archetype "British centre-forward." Jostein signed from Sogndal for £400,000 having played one season in Belgium with Lierse.

### The man in charge



#### **Dave Bassett**

Manager

"Harry" played 35 times in their inaugural campaign in Division Four. It was a fitting finale for the lad who had been rejected by both Watford and Chelsea as a youngster.

He became manager Dario Gradi's assistant, running his own insurance agency at the same time. When Dario left Dave took up football management full-time guiding Wimbledon from the Fourth to the First Division of the football League in an amazing four years.

There was one scare for the Dons, in the summer of 1984 after they had reached the Second Division. Ron Noades persuaded Dave to accept the managership of Crystal Palace. But after two days at Selhurst Park he quit and returned to Plough Lane.

After leading Wimbledon to sixth in the First Division in 1987 Dave did quit. He was seen as the ideal replacement for Graham Taylor at Watford but it didn't work out and he left Vicarage Road after a few months,

In January 1988 he was appointed manager of Sheffield United. Relegation that season was quickly followed by successive promotions.



David 'Harry' Bassett is a bubbly character whose enthusiasm for the game is simply infectious. Now in his 13th season as a manager he can look back on a story of remarkable achievement.

As a grafting wing-half he collected 10 amateur caps for England and captained Walton & Hersham to a Wembley triumph over Slough Town in the 1973 FA Amateur Cup Final. The following year he transferred to Wimbledon, then in the Southern League, and helped them gain League status in 1977.

### SPOTLIGHT

Carl Bradshaw - by Colin Benson

Forward. Signed apprenticeship forms with Sheffield Wednesday in 1985 but made a scoring League debut, as an 18-year-old, while on loan to Barnsley (v Crystal Palace 23-8-86). Scored 4 goals in 32 League outings for the Owls before moving to Manchester City in 1988 in a swap for Imre Varadi. Had just one game in a year at Maine Road before signing for the Blades (£50,000) and helping them win promotion to Division One. Had scored 6 goals in 107 League appearances for them by the start of this season. Born: Sheffield 2-10-68.



### Captain's With Shaun Taylo

## CORNER





This is where we came in. Just over three months ago we made our entry into the Premiership against Sheffield United at Bramall Lane.

At the time it was like stepping into the unknown. Hardly any of us had played at this level before and we were not sure what to expect. We lost the game 3-1 which was not really a true reflection on the play and the general feeling after the match was that we could hold our own at this level.

As we know the season for us has followed a very similar pattern right through. We have come away from games pointless after contributing so much.

At Sheffield United we conceded two late goals after looking set to get at least a point. At Leeds United last week the story was much the same. It was 0-0 with ten-minutes to go - you know the rest. After their first goal we were praised open in all aspects of our game.

We had hoped to build on that stimulating win over QPR which was so well earned under difficult circumstances. It wasn't to be and though we were all disappointed it has not dented our enthusiasm or confidence. Leeds are when all said and done second in the Premiership table.

The lads are determined to get win number two this afternoon. With Sheffield United then Oldham and Liverpool away it is imperative we get a result today. Our attitude is positive - we know we can do it.

## HayTALKING



One of the key issues about training is to keep it as bright and interesting as possible. You need to keep players sharp and hungry to play - make it so that they do the hard work without really realising it.

One aspect is to change the environment, the setting in which we work, and at Swindon we have been very lucky in this respect. The community has really stepped forward to help.

We mainly use the Allied Dunbar recreational facilities as well as those at the Nationwide Training Ground and these locations are absolutely first-class. But last week, because of the severe weather, we were offered the use of the Astroturf pitch at Greendown School and areas of Marlborough College.

It was perfect for what we wanted and the change of scenery is almost as good as a break.

At this stage of the season fitness ticks over so we have been concentrating a lot on sharpening up the front men and tightening up at the back. We have definitely shown great improvement of late in both these areas - as was the case last Saturday at Leeds until the last ten-minutes.

We have to maintain the highest level of concentration for 90-minutes and this has been the theme of our work this week. There isn't too much you can do about it in physical terms in training except keep talking about it. In practice matches players are obviously not as committed as they are on a Saturday but we have stressed the point as much as possible and hope to see a response this afternoon.

It is perhaps appropriate that we play hosts to Sheffield United this afternoon. For that I-0 victory over Queens Park Rangers in our last home fixture just prevented us from equalling an unhappy record set by the Blades in the season 1990-91.

It was the Bramall Lane club's first season back in the old First Division and like us they were finding it tough to keep afloat. They failed to register a single win in their first 16 games in which they had mustered just four points from draws with Derby County (1-1); Manchester City (1-1); Chelsea (2-2) and Everton (0-0).

Goalkeeper Simon Tracey had broken a cheekbone in a collision with lan Rush just six minutes into the opening game of the season. It was perhaps an omen as United slumped to rock bottom. Even the recruitment of Brian Marwood - who was with us for a while last season - from Arsenal and Vinnie Jones from Leeds, for a club record fee, failed to stimulate revival.

It was 22nd December before United's fans could cheer a victory. Nottingham Forest were beaten 3-2 at Bramall Lane, Ian Bryson scoring twice, Brian Deane once.

Deane scored again at Luton on Boxing Day to snatch a second successive win before the Blades were blunted by a 4-1 defeat at Highbury.

As the League programme entered February, Sheffield United were still firmly entrenched at the foot of the League table. Dave Bassett signed Glyn Hodges from Crystal Palace and miraculously fortunes turned to gold.

Sheffield United reeled off seven consecutive wins in the First Division. Beaten were Derby County (1-0); Southampton (4-1), Everton, Manchester United and Aston Villa 2-1; Sunderland and Chelsea both 1-0.

It was the best run of the season by any club in the First Division. Astonishingly, their position in the First Division was assured with four games still to play. In the end they finished 13th with 46 points - 12 above the relegation candidates.

It is certainly a story that should give us heart for everywhere we go people express surprise at the quality of our play.

As I was driving back last Saturday a female Leeds supporter rang the popular BBC Radio 5 606 programme to say that she couldn't understand how Swindon Town were bottom of the League. She claimed we had played much better football than Leeds and were a joy to watch.

Great stuff. Unfortunately we need the results to back-up the quality of our approach work. It will come surely as it did for Dave Bassett in 1991.

The lads certainly have not lost heart. They still believe in themselves and in the quality of their football.

Since the abysmal failure of all four home nations in the World Cup I note a sense of media and public awareness now to the skill factors - or to be more precise lack of them - in English football. Perhaps at last the sort of thing John Gorman and David Hay are trying to achieve at Swindon will be better appreciated out there in the real world.

Let's hope so. And while on the subject of providing entertainment just an aside concerning the sending-off of Luc Nijholt against QPR.

Referee Gerald Ashby was no doubt within his rights to show the red card to our Dutch midfielder for swearing at him. But wouldn't it have been much more prudent for him to have dealt with the verbal reaction in a more low key way. A stern warning rather than a red card.

Officials have just as much responsibility for the entertainment value of a game as do the players. Certainly 15,000 paying customers do not wish to see a football match ruined in the 17th minute by the sending-off of a player unless absolutely necessary.

As for Luc, he needs kicking. He could have sworn in three different languages and Mr Ashby would have been none the wiser!



#### December 4 1968: Swindon Town I Burnley 2

This League Cup Semi-Final Second Leg saw first Division Burnley arrive at the County Ground suprisingly trailing 2-1 following the First Leg at Turf Moor. The prize would be a trip to Wembley three months hence, but neither side could have envisaged the eventual outcome of this tie. Following a goalless first period, the drama unfolded when Swindon were floored twice in a minute early in the second half. The Town defence failed to clear a David Thomas free-kick, Brian O'Neil hooked the ball in and Frank Casper pounced. Then a right-wing cross from the dangerous Thomas was palmed out by Peter Downsborough but only to Steve Kindon, who promptly

headed it home. Would this signal the end for Swindon? The Evening Advertiser takes up the story.

"....Had Swindon cracked in the face of two such tremendous blows, one could not really blamed them, but instead they did just the opposite. The goals produced from them fighting spirit which thrilled the 28,000 crowd. And they came within inches on several occasions of clinching a Final place, after John Smith had levelled the overall scores in the 57th minute. Don Rogers, who had rather a disappointing game, dropped a corner short and there was Smith moving in on the ball to flash it just inside the post with his head...." But at the end of ninety minutes, with neither side able to deliver the knock-out punch, the contest went to extra-time which again ended in stalemate. And so the scene was set for the re-match at the Hawthorns two weeks later....


#### 5 Years Ago

When John Gorman proudly announced he had signed a new striker an excited buzz filled the air. But it has to be said that when Keith Scott was introduced the new found optimism was somewhat tempered... The reaction throughout being Keith who?

Well it didn't take us long to find out, a debut goal against Ipswich Town quickly followed by the winner - yes the winner - against highly placed Queens Park Rangers. In two matches Keith had won us four points!



It wasn't only the goals that impressed. Keith showed qualities leading the line we have not seen from International class players. His timing in the air was too good for seasoned campaigners like John Wark and Darren Peacock even and one feels that once Andy Mutch has forged an understanding with the blonde Adonis he will recap the rewards in front of goal.

When I congratulated Keith on his Premiership debut, suggesting he took to it like a duck to water, he laughed: "I only hope people will be saying that after 25 games. But I enjoyed it, which was the main thing, and was pleased with the way it went."

"Basically I started rather late," he says. "I played local Sunday league football in Leicester until I was about 19; then I started to play on Saturday's for Hinckley Athletic. From there I went into the Southern League with Bedworth United.

"I moved back to Hinckley, then joined Leicester United at 22 and then signed for Lincoln City. I had a bad year with them, playing just II games in the League. It taught me a lot about professional football though.

"Before I signed for them I thought that once you became a professional footballer that was it. All the hard work had to stop and you had made it. But it doesn't. When you become a professional that is when the hard work starts.

"Anyway after that bad experience Martin O'Neill at Wycombe Wanderers showed great faith in me and he made me a better player.

"I really enjoyed my three years with Wycombe which of course culminated in us entering the Football League this season.

"Fortunately the gaffer here has shown faith in me and given me this opportunity. He knows I have got weaknesses in my game which I am aware of, but he says during the time I'm here he will make me a better player - which I'm sure he will. When you have a manager like that it makes the game a lot easier for you."

What are the weaknesses you have to hone?

"Can't you tell," is Keith's instant and authorative response.


"I know what they are, the gaffer knows what they are and we will work on them in training."


Keith looked impressive enough in his opening two appearances; laying the ball off nicely and making some really good positive runs into the heart of the opposing defence.

## Premier NEWS



The only winners at the bottom end of the Premiership table last week were Sheffield United and Oldham Athletic. Bad news that for Town fans for it left us trailing five points behind the Latics who were joined on 14 points by Chelsea, and Southampton - who played West Ham on Monday.

It is in our own hands this afternoon to narrow the gap between ourselves and the Blades, in what is a virtual six-pointer, while we will rely on Ipswich Town to keep Oldham out of the points at Portman Road.

Ipswich, who have not been firing on all cylinders this season, came good last Saturday thanks to Eddie Youd's first ever goal for the club. It was enough to beat Blackburn Rovers and secure the Suffolk side's first home win since August 21st.

As for Kenny Dalglish's £22-million side it was a bad day. One scribe wrote: "Quality Street? Blackburn's football seemed straight out of Poverty Street, bereft of imagination, skill, even commitment."

Could it be that Chelsea will feel the backlash in tomorrow's televised game at Ewood Park? Without wishing Glenn Hoddle any discomfort we certainly hope he goes home with the blues!

Glenn's team slumped to another defeat at Bramall Lane last week - Chelsea's seventh defeat in eight games - and he now admits it will take more than crusading football to save them. It was the familiar scenario suffered by most struggling sides; Willie Falconer's 32nd minute header taking a deflection off Steve Clarke to leave Kharine stranded.

Southampton, seem to revel in live telecasts from the Dell, and they will be hoping to improve their precarious position at Goodison Park this afternoon. It is not often visiting sides to Everton would fancy their chances but the Toffeemen have come unstuck at home this season losing four and drawing one of their eight Premiership fixtures thus far.

Manchester City, thrashed 3-1 at home by Sheffield Wednesday, try to do better at Elland Road this afternoon. City are a club under siege. Their football is far from convincing while behind the scenes a power battle rages. There were further demonstrations after the game last week and manager Brian Horton believes the turmoil is wrecking his team.

City could be without Niall Quinn today - he damaged knee ligaments - but even so Leeds should be favourites at home. Not that they matched the 3-

O scoreline against us. Three months of magic from veteran Gordon Strachan in the last ten-minutes proved our undoing.

Coventry City, now under the managership of Phil Neal, were unfortunate against Manchester United. Eric Cantona celebrated a year at Old Trafford with the only goal but it was the Sky Blues who had impressed, hustling United out of their rhythm.

Formidable as that points lead must seem, United will be anxious to endorse their position with a win over Norwich City at Old Trafford. Bigger margins than United's have been eroded in the past and last time out at home they were held to a goalless draw by Ipswich Town.

The Canaries - sick as parrots after their I-0 home defeat by Inter Milan - failed to bounce back at Boundary Park. Their football was sweet enough but it didn't go for them on the day. It was Norwich City's first away defeat of the season.

Of the chasing teams Arsenal, at Coventry today, look the most menacing. They added quality to their power in a spectacular win over Newcastle United at Highbury with Ian Wright delivering the goods in his shoot-out with young pretender for the England shirt Andy Cole.

The Kevin Keegan circus roles into White Hart Lane for what promises to be a classic this afternoon. Viewers of Match of the Day will have been enthralled by Tottenham's late equaliser at QPR - the build-up exquisitely vintage stuff.




