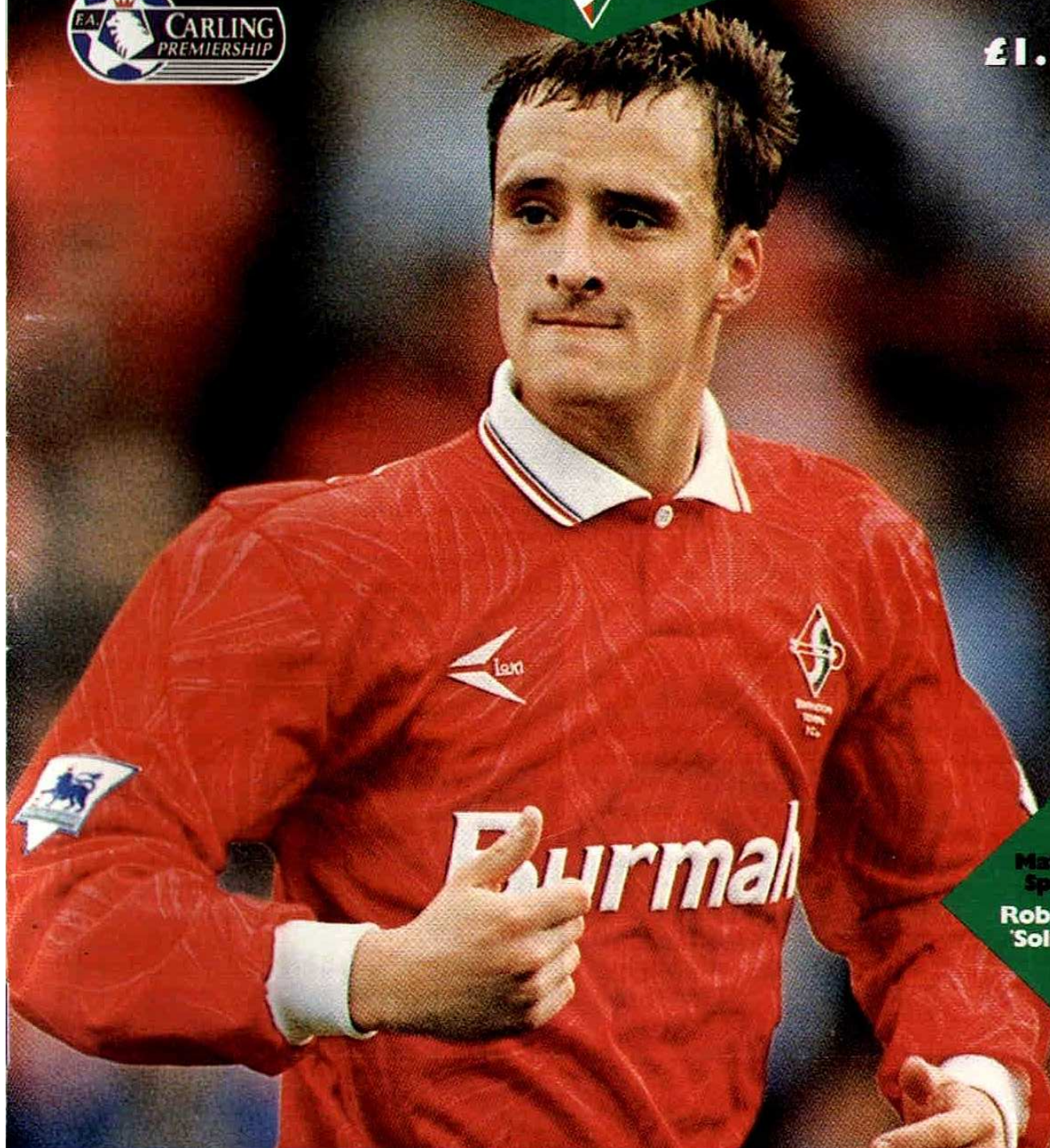

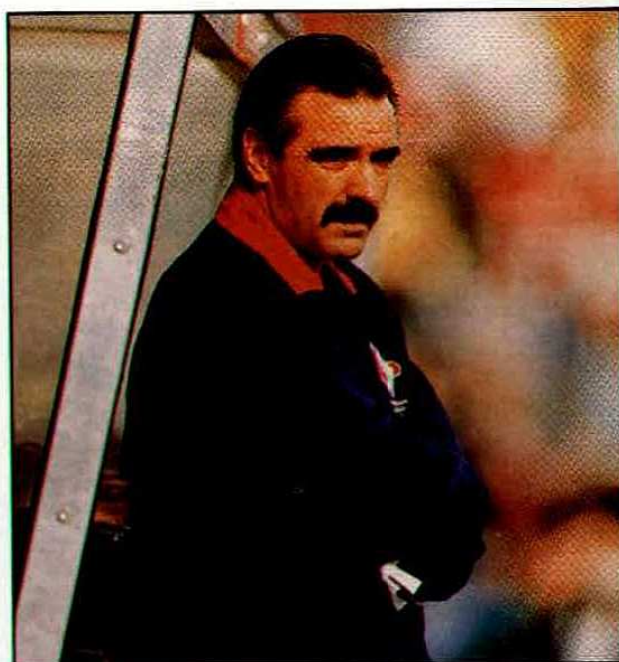

I think referees are now too hasty in showing the red card. It's not been easy for us. All we ask is for a fair crack of the whip on some decisions that continually go against us.

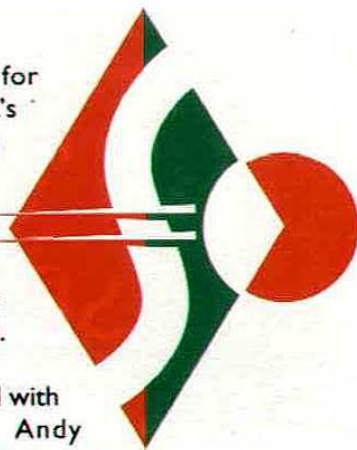
Having said all that the lads came back brilliantly to recover from two down. Not many teams could do that under our circumstances.

## **No Game**

Unfortunately no game for the first team next Saturday which is F.A. Cup 4th round day.

## **Premiership**

Our next game in the Premiership is here at The County Ground in two weeks time when Coventry City are our visitors in a game brought forward from the end of March.

On Saturday 12 February we travel to Villa Park where we meet Coca-Cola Cup semi-finalists Aston Villa. Tickets for this game will initially be on sale to Season Ticket holders only. Any remaining will be put on general sale from Wednesday 9 February.

Our home game with Norwich City will depend on The Canaries result in their F.A. Cup 4th round tie with Manchester United next Sunday.

A victory for Norwich will see the game redated.

## The Visitors

### Micky Hazard Orchestrates The Spurs - by John Nolan

**This has been a traumatic season for Tottenham Hotspur so far. More has been written about the club's behind the scenes activities than those on the field of play where injuries and illness have also left their mark.**

The brutal destruction of Gary Mabbutt has been well aired and manager Ossie Ardiles claims: "Losing Gary has been a big blow to us because he is not just a great player but also our captain, our inspiration and our leader."

Gary is on the road to recovery but it is doubtful he will play again this season.

Staying on the injury front another big blow has been the problems sidelining Spurs' top scorer Teddy Sheringham, who underwent another cartilage operation at the end of November and who has just returned from a break in Tenerife hopeful he could resume training this week. Teddy had scored 11 goals in 13 appearances this season but has not played since October 16th when Spurs were beaten 2-1 at Manchester United.

David Howells, another knee victim, looked like he would require further surgery as well but in the wake of his injury crisis Ardiles has been pleasantly surprised by the response of some of his young players thrown in at the deep end.

The Tottenham boss made a shrewd move when he took Micky Hazard back to White Hart Lane. Hazard's touch, vision and prompting has helped orchestrate the youngsters and inspired the likes of Darren Caskey, Vinny Samways and the exciting Darren Anderton.

Two other former Swindon players have been recruited this season in defenders David Kerslake and Colin Calderwood, while striker Gordon Durie has left for Rangers.

There was a recall for young goalkeeper Ian Walker last week as Erik Thorstvedt was on International duty with Norway. Jason Dozzell missed the 1-0 defeat by Manchester United because of an ankle injury but Justin Edinburgh and Sol Campbell, a defender thrown into an attacking role, were back.

## Tottenham Hotspur ABC

**DEAN AUSTIN** - Right-back. Southend signed Dean from St Albans City in 1990, after previous experience with Hendon, and he went straight into their Third Division promotion team. Spurs paid an initial £375,000 for his transfer in May 1992 and he made his debut in their colours against Crystal Palace in August 1992. Born: Hemel Hempstead 26-4-70.

**NICKY BARMBY** - Striker. The son of the old Hull City player, Jeff, Nicky really made the headlines last season with some scintillating performances for Spurs and the England Youth side. Spurs were reluctant to let him go to Australia for the World Youth Championships last season but the FA got their way. Born: Hull 11-2-74.

**COLIN CALDERWOOD** - Central Defender. Captained Swindon to promotion to the Premiership last season after eight years with the club, during which he chalked up 330 League games. Colin came into pro football with Mansfield Town in 1982, moving on to Swindon in 1985 for £30,000. Bought by Ardiles to replace Neil Ruddock, Colin has added a new dimension to the defence since his £1.25-million move. Born: Stranraer 20-1-65.

**SULZER (SOL) CAMPBELL** - Midfield. Strong powerful youngster who has burst onto the senior stage this season with some match-winning performances. Can play at fullback, in the centre of defence, in midfield or as utilised recently in attack. His Premiership debut was at Chelsea in December 1992. Born: Newham 18-9-74.

**JASON DOZZELL** - Forward. Became the youngest ever player to score in a Football League Division One game when he netted a cracking goal for Ipswich Town in a 3-1 win against Coventry City, in February 1984, at the age of 16 years 56 days. Suffered the agonies of a broken leg in February 1989, against Barnsley, when he was Town's leading scorer, and didn't play again in the first team that season. Made 332 League appearances for Town (52 goals), before moving to Spurs for nearly £2-million at the beginning of this season. Capped by England at Youth and Under-21 levels. Born: Ipswich 9-12-67.

**JUSTIN EDINBURGH** - Left-back. Discovered by Southend United he made 37 League appearances for them before a £150,000 transfer to Tottenham in the summer of 1990. Won an FA Cup winners' medal in 1991. Born: Brentwood 18-12-69.

**MICKY HAZARD** - Midfield. Signed from Swindon for £50,000 in November 1993 the little midfield play-maker went straight into the Spurs side against Leeds United. White Hart Lane is where it all began for Micky as an apprentice in 1976. Made his League debut against Everton in April 1990. Small in stature but big in heart Micky, who was a County cross-country runner as a boy in his native Sunderland, soon established himself as a

favourite with the fans. Won FA Cup and UEFA Cup winners' medals and was included in a full England squad in 1983-84. In September 1985 Chelsea signed him for a record £310,000 and five years later he moved to Portsmouth. Swindon paid £130,000 for Micky in September 1990 and he made 199 League appearances for Town. Born: Sunderland 5-2-60.

**DAVID HOWELS** - Midfield. Joined Spurs in 1984 on the YTS and scored the winning goal on his League debut against Sheffield Wednesday (22-2-86). Started as a forward but is better equipped as a defensive midfielder where his man-marking ability can be used to the full. Collected an FA Cup winners' medal in 1991 and started this season with 152 League games under his belt. Born: Guildford 15-12-67.

**DAVID KERSLAKE** - Right-back. Former England Schoolboy International he served his apprenticeship with QPR. Introduced to League Football at Newcastle 13-4-85 but was not able to command a regular place in midfield. In November 1989 Ardiles signed him for Swindon Town and played him at right-back where he matured into a top class player. In March 1993 Leeds United paid £500,000 for his services but he was allowed to move onto Spurs in October 1993. Born: Stepney 19-6-66.

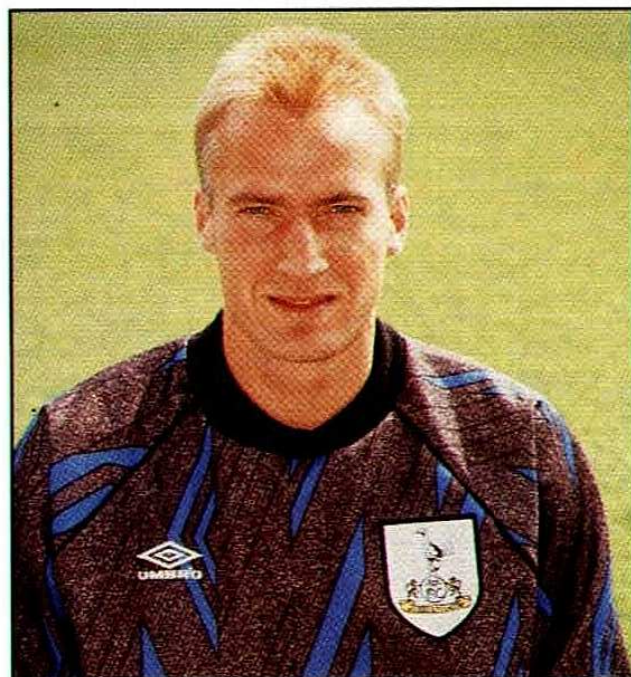


## Tottenham Hotspur

**VINNY SAMWAYS** - Midfield. Made his League bow against Nottingham Forest 2-5-87 having signed for Spurs as an apprentice in 1985. A busy midfielder with vision and good passing technique he has now played in over 170 League games. Born: Bethnal Green 27-10-68.

**STEVE SEDGLEY** - Central Defender. Developed through the youth ranks at Highfield Road, Steve made his League bow against Arsenal 26-8-86 in midfield. In 1989 Spurs paid £750,000 for his transfer and Steve has since made over 130 League appearances for the North London Club. Born: Enfield 26-5-68.

**TEDDY SHERINGHAM** - Striker. Former Millwall apprentice he was introduced to League football against Brentford in January 1984. After a loan spell with Aldershot Teddy developed into a first-class striker netting 93 goals in 220 League games with the Lions. Brian Clough paid £2-million for him in July 1991 and he scored 14 goals in 42 League outings with Nottingham Forest before he was suprisingly allowed to leave and sign for Spurs in a £2.1-million deal in August 1992. After a mixed start Teddy soon found his form and celebrated his 300th League game against Oldham with two penalty conversions. 29 goals in 38 Premiership games earned him the "Golden Boot" and a call-up to the England squad. Capped at Youth, Under-21, "B" and full levels (twice) - he played in the World Cup qualifiers against Poland and Norway. Born: Walthamstow 2-4-66.



**ERIK THORSTVEDT** - Goalkeeper. Had trials for Spurs, Arsenal, QPR and Borussia Moechengladbach as

long ago as 1984 when he was with Norwegian sides EIK Tonsberg and Viking Stavanger; but joined IFK Gothenberg. In 1988 Erik eventually arrived at White Hart Lane for £400,000 and had missed just one game this season as we entered the holiday programme. Made his League debut v Nottingham Forest 15-1-89 and played his 150th League game against Everton at the beginning of October 1993. A Norwegian International. Born: Stravanger, Norway 28-10-62.

**IAN WALKER** - Goalkeeper. Son of Everton manager Mike he is relevantly inexperienced with just 38 League appearances for Spurs. An England Youth and Under-21 international Ian is a former pupil at the FAGM School Of Excellence. Born: Watford 31-10-71.

## The man in charge



**Ossie Ardiles**

Manager

### Ossie Ardiles returned to White Hart Lane as manager in June 1993.

Had first arrived on the scene in the summer of 1978 when Keith Burkinshaw pulled off a remarkable double by signing Ossie and Ricky Villa two of Argentina's World Cup winning squad.

A creative midfield general he won 43 caps for Argentina and scored 29 goals in 315 senior appearances for Tottenham Hotspur, collecting an FA Cup winners' medal in 1981 and a UEFA Cup finalists trophy in 1984.

He played for Red Star Cordoba Instituto and Huracan (Buenos Aires) in Argentina.

Played on loan for Paris St Germain (July-December 1982) and Blackburn Rovers (March-May 1988), before transferring to QPR in 1988. Played 11 times for Rangers and had a month in the USA with Fort Lauderdale Strikers in the summer of 1989 before returning to take over as manager of Swindon Town.

Led Swindon to play-off success at Wembley only to have the achievement wiped out for off the field irregularities at the Club. Was manager of Newcastle United from March 1991 until February 1992 and took over at WBA in May that same year.

# SPOTLIGHT

**Darren Anderton** - by Colin Benson

Forward. Brilliant left-winger who made the headlines during Portsmouth's FA Cup run in season 1991/92. Signed as an associate schoolboy at Fratton Park in September 1986 before moving through the ranks where he signed as a trainee in February 1988 and professional two years later.

He made his Football League debut against Wolverhampton Wanderers at Fratton Park (30/11/90) and was challenging for a regular first team place towards the end of the season.



He scored both of Portsmouth's goals in their 4th round FA Cup win over Leyton Orient and another brace in Pompey's 4-2 win at Middlesbrough in the following round.

In the semi-finals he scored the goal which looked destined to take Portsmouth to Wembley for the first time since 1939 but Liverpool's late equaliser saw the tie go to a replay and Pompey's dream was shattered at the end of extra time as The Reds went through after a penalty shoot out.

Portsmouth lost their prize asset soon after the end of the season when he signed for Tottenham Hotspur and made his Premier League bow for Spurs at Southampton on the opening day of the 1992/93 season.

His excellent performances have also warranted his call-ups to the England U21 squad where he scored three goals in as many games. Born: Southampton 3-3-72.

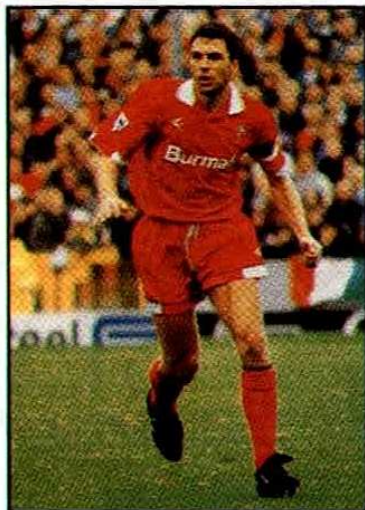

**Today is the day of the 1996 European Football Championship Draw, a moment when the FA can put on a brave face and, temporarily at least, forget about the failure to qualify for the World Cup Finals in the USA this summer.**

No. This one is all about the summer of 1996 and we will be there! No need to qualify as we are the hosts.

This is going to be the biggest European Championship Finals ever, with 16 nations participating in a competition the FA claim will make a profit of £10-million. Not bad when the best so far had been £2-million!

The tournament will take place at eight venues in England but the draw today is to sort out the qualifying groups, with almost 50 countries entering the draw.

The Finals of this Championship will represent the largest sporting event to be staged in England for 30 years.

The FA were hoping to be able to parade the new England manager at this prestigious occasion but come last weekend Chief Executive Graham Kelly ruled the chances as only 50-50.

Meanwhile Terry Venables remained the media's choice, which is probably right as the delay in making the appointment suggests that the FA's decision hinges on an embarrassing week in which Spurs chairman Alan Sugar attended a Premier League board of inquiry with a dossier of evidence about financial dealings at White Hart Lane.

Any implications connected to Venables could cost him the England managership.

I must admit that I have not been one who has advocated Terry as the next England chief, simply because I feel John Lyall or Ron Atkinson would do a better job in this position, but it would be sad if such a popular and talented man was eliminated because of his wheelings and dealings behind the scenes.

While on the subject of England managers I see that Bobby Robson has turned down the Welsh job because he is not Welsh.

Bobby, speaking from his villa in Portugal, - a nice touch that - said: "I was very flattered but I think the job should go to a Welshman, in the same way that the England job should go to an Englishman and Scotland to a Scot."

Interesting. Yet Wales experienced their best years at International level under the direction of Mike Smith, an Englishman, and of course you just have to look across the Irish Sea to see what an impact Jack Charlton has made on the Republic of Ireland.

Was it sour grapes when Portsmouth boss Jim Smith had another knock at the Play-Offs last week?

Jim, not happy that Manchester United had got away with a blatant penalty against his battling Pompey side at Old Trafford, though he claimed they should have had three, suggested that his team would have fared much better than Swindon in the Premiership this season.

Portsmouth did finish above us in the League it is true but that, as so often has been proved, is no indication of how a team will react the following season.

## 25 Years Ago

### January 24 1969: Tranmere Rovers 3 Swindon Town 5

Town recovered from an 11th minute set-back to record their first ever win at Prenton Park in this eight-goal thriller. A slip by skipper Stan Harland was severely punished by Joe Pritchard. But Swindon hit back with two goals in five minutes. Both came from Chris Jones, who had previously failed to score since his summer move from Manchester City. Rovers' keeper Jimmy Cumbes - also a county cricketer - spilled a shot from Don Rogers and Jones pounced for the first. He then powered a header in from a Don Heath cross from the right. Town made it 3-1 on the stroke of half-time when Rogers evaded two desperate tackles, drew the keeper and slotted the ball home with his usual aplomb. Gerry Casey pulled a goal back mid-way through the second half with a bullet header off the underside of the crossbar and Rovers briefly threatened to snatch the initiative. But Swindon again struck with another two goals in a five minute burst and victory was all but clinched.



In the 73rd minute Cumbes failed to clear an Owen Dawson free-kick, his weak punch going straight to Roger Smart, whose clever chip sailed into the net over the head of defender Frank Gill covering the line. Rogers instigated the move which brought the fifth goal, feeding Peter Noble who slotted home Jones' return pass.

Rogers almost grabbed a sixth five minutes from time. He beat two defenders before skipping past Cumbes, but when Noble popped up on the goalline to make sure, the effort was ruled out for offside. Rovers grabbed a consolation three minutes from the end through Roy Sinclair.

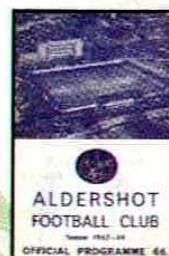

"We have got characters here too who are not going to throw the towel in. They will keep going all the way."

"We like to play quality football but obviously this year we have found this isn't the only thing that will get us results. We have to work hard and blend the two together."

"Whenever we have played the big sides we have played some really good football against them and this game could be a classic. It will be very hard, as they have been better away from home as well of late, but we felt we put in a really good performance at White Hart Lane and probably deserved to win there - so we won't be shy."

"We know that the game will have no bearing this afternoon and that Spurs are always dangerous. They have so many skilful players who can open you up they can never be taken for granted."

"Friends of mine who I have played with - five or six are in the squad - like Vinny Samways, who in my opinion should be playing for England. There is Darren Caskey, who is a very good player and Nick Barmby. Players with big futures ahead of them. and obviously Micky's gone there as well."

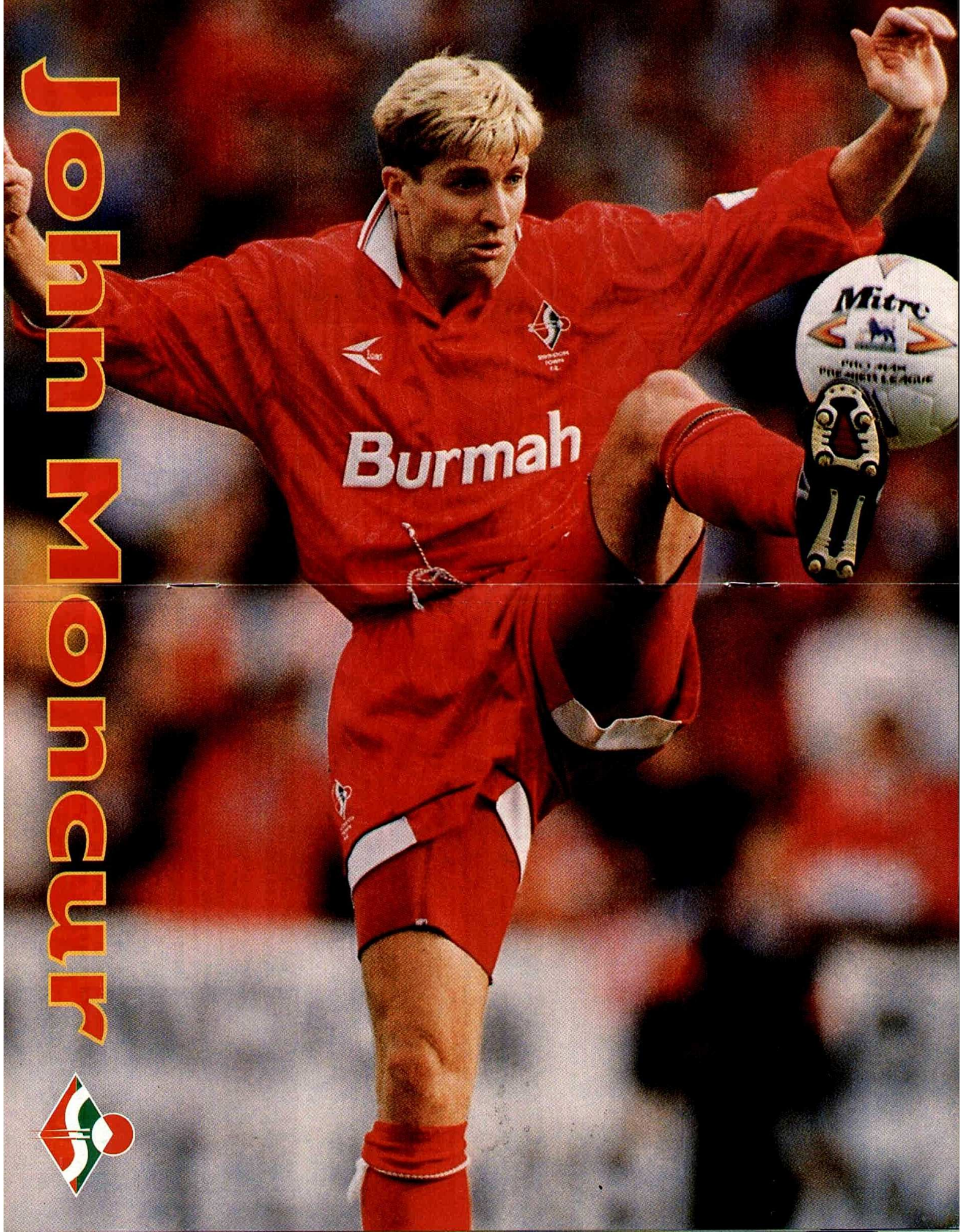
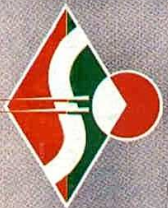
"I knew Micky when I was very young and learned quite a bit from him at Spurs. He is another with tremendous ability - he is second to none for actual skill on the ball in my book."

# Premier PREVIEW



**Manchester United now lead bottom club Swindon Town by a staggering 45 points as their incredible run continues. Undefeated for four months now and 25 games.**

The next to test themselves at Old Trafford today are Everton, boosted by the arrival of new boss Mike Walker and by that 6-2 defeat of Town last Saturday, when former Hammers' star Tony Cottee registered his sixth hat-trick in Everton's colours.

Even so the scoreline flattered the Toffeemen and the pools pundits prediction for a home banker looks a pretty safe bet.

Second placed Blackburn Rovers don't play until tomorrow and could lose further ground against Leeds. Kenny Dalglish's team trail United by 13 points already so can ill afford to see the gap widened further. With less than half the programme remaining it needs a swing of at least four wins in Rovers' favour over United for them to make any impression and that seems a tall order.

Leeds, who until recently, looked the only side with a real chance of catching the leaders, slipped up at home to Ipswich Town last week, the Suffolk club collecting another valuable point from a goalless draw.

Manager Mick McGiven made no apologies for the defensive web that choked the Leeds attack and prompted the home fans to chant "Boring boring Ipswich."

That is a reference which has been levelled at Arsenal for much of this season and they will want to put that right against Oldham Athletic at Highbury today. The Gunners put in another sub-standard performance at Maine Road last week where former Highbury star, David Rocastle, put on a super show for Manchester City.

Arsenal have now gone six games undefeated with six clean sheets, an indication of the strength of their defence. But it is in attack, where they are probably better equipped than most of their rivals, that they have not delivered the goods.

Joe Royle will be hoping the Wright Campbell combination doesn't explode into shooting form this afternoon for the Latics - beaten at home 3-0 by Liverpool on Saturday - are just three points better off than Swindon and three points short of

Southampton and Manchester City above them. It was Julian Dicks who sparked Liverpool's triumph - his first goal for the Anfield club being a memorable one from fully 30-yards.

Southampton could well have appointed a new manager by the time they take the field at St James' Park this afternoon. Former boss Lawrie McMenemy, now on the Board, intimated he would like to take charge with a younger man taking control of the coaching. That ruled out Peter Shilton, who would never be anything but his own man, and opened the door for another former Dell favourite, Alan Ball.

Whoever is in charge today will be up against it as the Kevin Keegan inspired Newcastle United have definite championship aims. The Geordies have two games in hand on Manchester United but even so the 19 point deficit would seem too much to bridge. Yet Keegan insists "anything is possible."

Manchester City will certainly hope so as they take on Liverpool at Anfield; while the much criticised Sheffield United will be banking on the traditional derby day atmosphere to upset Wednesday at Hillsborough.

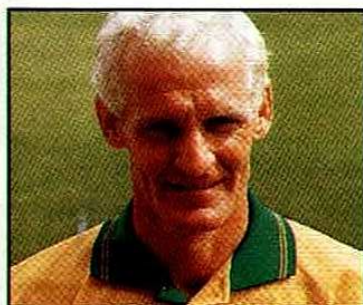
