LET'S HAVE FAIR PLAY

One of the biggest changes that has taken place in football this season has been a new interpretation of the laws of the game by referees.

Peter Burrowes looks at the new law changes

The directives given to referees in the World Cup during the summer have been made mandatory by FIFA and the aim is to place a greater emphasis on fair play, skilful play, and attacking play.

There have, as predicted, been an early season spate of yellow cards, and a few red ones, although most of the red would have been administered in any event and are not directly down to the new clampdown.

Certainly attacking football has been encouraged with defenders finding it much more difficult to tackle illegally, more goals are being scored, and strikers are getting more freedom and more protection from officiols.

The main problem worrying managers is the old chestnut of lack of consistency amongst the officials with some referees still being more lenient than others, but as the season progresses hopefully things will settle down.

TACKLING

All club's have been visited by a top ex-referee and had the law changes explained to them, and John Martin from Hampshire, who retired from the League list last season, visited the Charlton training ground to speak to the players.

Here are some of the new directives given to referees this season:

TACKLING... A sliding tockle with one or both legs is permissable if, in the opinion of the referee, it is not dangerous. If, however, the player making the tackle, instead of making contact with the ball, trips his opponents, the referee shall award a direct free kick to the opposing team and shall caution the offending player.

A tackle from behind which is violent with little or no attempt to play the ball is prohibited and will be punished by a direct free kick and the dismissal from the field of play of the offender.

FREE KICKS... Any player, who for any reason, deliberately delays a free kick being taken by the opposing team shall be cautioned.

Any player who prematurely rushes forward from the defensive wall before the ball has been kicked shall be cautioned.

While the law states that all opposing players should retire to a distance of at least 10 yards from the ball, the referee discretionary powers to disregard this requirement to enable a free kick to be taken quickly and this is to be encouraged.

WASTING TIME... This occurs when a player feigns injury; takes a free kick from the wrong position; appears to prepare for a throw in but leaves it to one of his team mates; kicks the ball away; stands in front of the ball when a free kick has been awarded; delays leaving the field when being substituted and a goalkeeper employing tactics with the intention of gaining time for his team.

Referees must add on to the normal playing time the time lost through time wasting or for any other reason such as injury or substitution.

ATTITUDE TOWARDS MATCH
OFFICIALS.. Any player who
protests at a referees decision shall
be cautioned and a player who
uses foul and or abusive language
will be dismissed from the field of
play. The captain of the team,
although responsible for his teams

behaviour, has no special rights.
INJURY OF A PLAYER..

Team officials are permitted to enter the field of play with the referees permission solely for the purpose of assessing the injury -

not to treat it- and to arrange for the players removal.

OFFSIDE. It is not an offence in itself to be in an offside position

A player shall be penalised for being offside, if at the moment the ball touches, or is played by, one of his team, he is in the opinion of the referee involved in the active play by interfering with the play, or with an opponent, or seeking to gain and advantage by being in that position.

A player shall not be declared offside by the referee merely because of his being in an offside position and a linesman should not signal merely because a player is in an offside position.

LADY LINESMAN

Supporters may have already noticed this season the absence, in Endsleigh League games, of some of the familiar faces who used to referee games at The Valley. A few have retired, but a number of the others are now officiating exclusively on the Premier Division who have their own select list and the Football League have theirs. It means the league are using a number of first year referees with less experience, mainly in Division Three games. The assessing system has also been changed with Match Observers instead of assessors being used in some instances.

History has also been made this season with the appointment of the first lady linesman in the Football League, Mrs Wendy Toms from Dorset, who has already officiated at her first league match. It will obviously be her ambition to referee a league games, but that could be a few years away yet. For the moment she is just pleased to be making that little piece of football history.

HEAD2GA3H

with MICKEY BENNETT

After a couple of traumatic years when his soccer career slid downhill, Mickey Bennett was delighted to return home last season and rejoin Charlton Athletic. Now he looking to regain his first team spot and play a part in making it a successful season for the club.

ickey started his career as an apprentice with Charlton in November, 1986 and gained two England under 20 international caps. A serious knee injury in December 1988 threatened his career and he was sidelined for nine months before battling back to fitness.

Surprisingly he joined Wimbledon for £250,000 in January, 1990 and then moved to Brentford two years later but he was never able to fully establish himself at either club.

"I don't regret the experience of playing for Wimbledon", he said, "They are very much a one-off club but I never really got a look in once Bobby Gould, who signed me, left".

At Brentford Mickey was often played out of position up front and he left the Griffin Park club on a free transfer after a much publicised frocas with another player. "The incident, which I don't really want to elaborate on, was probably the straw that broke the



camels back", said Mickey.

WELCOME

Apparently on the scrapheap he asked if he could train with Charlton and after a period playing for the reserves on a monthly contract he signed a new deal just before the transfer deadline in March. Mickey almost immediately got into the team making his second debut for the club against Southend United at The Valley on Easter Saturday and kept his place for the rest of the season scoring in the drawn match at Notts County.

"It was great to be back in the team and the players and supporters made me very welcome. It felt as though I had never left, so I did not have much chance to be nervous".

Mickey received a lot of help from Keith Peacock who ironed out some of the blemishes in his game.

Mickey is obviously disappointed that he has not yet made the first team this season but he will just keep plugging away, with hopefully some steady performances in the reserves under his belt, in the hope of first team selection. He has recently been out of action with a groin strain but is now fully fit again.

"I thought I did quite well in the pre-season games I played in and I don't mind whether I am at full back or on the wing as long as I am in the team".

BATTERED PRIDE RESTORED

Swindon will be looking to restore some of their battered pride this season after a baptism of fire in the Premiership. The top flight's whipping boys managed only five league wins during last season and were never off the foot of the table.

The euphoria at their thrilling play-off victory over Leicester City soon wore off as thrashings against Liverpool and Southampton set the tone for a dismal season.

But despite the numerous lows, there were some highs as well, including two fine performances against champions Manchester United and victories over Tottenham Hotspur, Coventry City, Southampton and Queens Park Rangers who they did the double over.

THRILLING

Highly rated midfielder Nicky Summerbee joined Manchester City in a deal worth £1.6 million and John Moncur, who only missed one game last season, also remained in the Premiership joining West Ham United. Another departure was took unsettled Joey Beauchamp to the County Ground. Beauchamp, one of football's brightest young prospects became home sick on joining the East London club and left them without kicking a ball. He was joined by Mark Robinson who arrived at Swindon from Newcastle United, having previously played for Barnsley.

The strength of the Premiership is illustrated by Swindon's fine start to the season and they are currently hot on the heels of Brian Robson's Middlesbrough. Victories have come over Port Vale, Watford, and Notts County, although there was defeat at Tranmere when, in a thrilling game, two John Aldridge goals and a Pat Nevin strike overshadowed Jan-Aage Fjortoft's two first half goals.

PROMISE

Already Fjortoft, the Norwegian international, has netted four league goals and great promise has been shown by the emerging youngster Wayne O'Sullivan. A blend of youth and experience seems to be Swindon's key with the experience coming in the form of the well travelled defender Brian Kilcline, former England international Terry Fenwick, and ever present last season Shaun Taylor.

Swindon's reputation for entertaining means they will always concede goals, but with their fire power up front, a return to the Premiership looks to be well within their reach this term.



"WEWILL GET TO KNOW FACH OTHER" says Gorman.

Swindon Town have got off to the best possible start to the season as they bid to make a quick return to the Premiership after relegation last season following just one year in the top flight.

A fter seven league games they were in second place in the division, a position they hope to stay in and manager John Gorman feels they have a team capable of doing well this season.

Swindon had a disastrous time last season finishing bottom of the Premier with just 30 points from 42 games but that is now behind them and there is a new optimism at the County Ground.

"This is a very different division and nowhere near as strong although there are some good sides in the First", said Gorman, "We lost a lot of games heavily last season because we always went out to try and win. Matches this season will obviously be much closer.

EXCITED

"He has settled in well", said Gorman "and has signed a long term contract with us which I am delighted about".

Gorman's two latest signings are full back Mark Robinson from Newcastle and Joey Beauchamp who recently moved to the Wiltshire club after the much publicised row with West Ham United following his move there from Oxford.

"I do not know what all the fuss is about", said Gorman "If he had come to us in the first place everything would have been all right".

Unfortunately for Gorman the little midfield player will miss todays match because of suspension which is certainly a blow for Swindon. He got sent off in the match at Notts County two weeks ago.

Despite having a number of experienced players in his squad Gorman has given a chance this season to two promising youngsters, 20 year old defender Andy Thomson and midfielder Wayne O'Sullivan and they have been keeping Terry Femwick and Brian Kilcline out of the side. "They have been impressive and deserved their chance", said Gorman.

The Swindon boss is looking forward to playing Charlton three times in the next ten days with two Coca Cola Cup clashes following todays league game.

"We will certainly get to know each other", he said, "I have the upmost respect for Steve and Alan who have done a marvellous job on limited resources and I know the matches will be hard. I don't think there will be any less interest because we play each other so much".

Swindon only have one long term injury at the moment, defender Adrian Viveash who broke his leg but his squad is strong enough to provide him with a sound base for success in the division. "We kept clean sheets in four of our first five games and we should have got at least a point at Tranmere where we lost 3-2".

Swindon played on Sunday at home to Derby County and were looking to further consolidate that excellent start they have had. "It is going well at the moment and I am pleased with our start".

prolific goalscorer the from North East, Arthur joined Middlesbrough as an apprentice in 1962 and turned professional in July 1963. He gained an England Youth cap against Spain in 1964 and went on to score 51 league goals for 'Boro in 111 matches, helping them to win promotion back to Division 2 in 1967. Newcastle signed him for £17,500 in January, 1969 and he sampled First Division football, scoring three times in his nine appearances, at the end of that season.

In May, 1969 he joined League Cup holders Swindon Town, newly promoted back to Division 2, for £17,000. Over the next three seasons he hit 42 league goals in 108 outings and gained two Anglo Italian Cup winners medals, scoring a hat trick in the 1969 final against Roma.

When Ray Treacy moved from Charlton to Swindon in June 1972, Arthur (valued at £15,000) and £20,000 moved in the opposite direction. He proved to be a popular figure at The Valley, earning the nickname King Arthur as he plundered 54 goals in his 139 league outings. He formed a formidable partnership with Derek Hales and helped us clinch promotion back to Division 2 in 1975. He also played effectively at centre half on several occasions.

He moved to Watford for £20,000 in September,1975 and scored 16 times in his 78 matches for The Hornets. In 1977 he joined Dartford and later coached their youth team. Since leaving the game Arthur has worked as a club steward in Gravesend and in later years for Parcel Force at Charlton.

10 YEARS AGO



Swindon's current assistant manager Andy Rowland and a certain Garry Nelson were the scorers as Swindon beat Tranmere 2-0.


20 YEARS AGO
