Just before kick off



If today's game ends in a draw, the replay will take place on Wednesday February 8; kick-off at the County Ground will be 7.45pm. (NOT all-ticket).

You'll find full ticket and travel information for this possible game on page 27, but we would also like to draw your attention to the following arrangements, regarding purchase of your match tickets.

Watford supporters have been allocated 750 covered seats, priced £11.50 adults and £7.00 under-16's/senior citizens. These tickets are available in advance. However, there is an additional allocation of 1600 uncovered seats. priced £10.00 adults and £5.00 concessions. These seats are available on the night only - pay at the turnstiles.

Anyone wishing to purchase tickets in advance should note the following: · Personal callers: Season ticket holders will be given priority booking on Monday January 30 and Tuesday January 31. Tickets will be limited to two per season ticket book. Any remaining tickets will be available on general sale, from Wednesday February 1; again limited to two per person.

· Postal applications: Postal requests from season ticket holders will be dealt with from Tuesday January 31. Please remember to quote your patron number (to the left of your name on the inside front cover of your book) and enclose your cheque and a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

General postal requests will be answered as from Wednesday February 1 and should also include a cheque and s.a.e..

Please note that the same limit of two tickets per application applies. Credit card bookings (by 'phone): Subject to a booking fee of £1.00. Season ticket holders may book from Tuesday January 31 - please remember to quote patron number. Any remaining tickets will be available for general bookings by credit card from Wednesday February 1 until 5.00pm on Friday February 3

The limit of two tickets per person is still applicable.

Periodically through the season, a special tone will sound prior to kick-off and the Police will give out a message to supporters. This is just to test the system whereby the Police can override the club's PA System should they wish to broadcast an emergency message to those inside the ground. Should the tone sound at any time during the game – please listen carefully!

here has been no accounting for Swindon's form this season. A run of 14 games without a win placed them in serious danger of relegation from the First Division – this, following the loss of their Premiership status last May – yet they ended that barren run with a fine 2-1 victory over leaders Middlesbrough, a fortnight ago.

Yet, whilst they have been struggling to obtain results in the League, the Robins have battled their way to the semi-finals of the Coca-Cola Cup and come to Vicarage Road looking for further success in the FA Cup.

Swindon's prospects in the Coca-Cola Cup seemed to have disappeared when they lost 3-1 at home to Charlton in the first leg of round two. However, with the aid of a hat-trick from Jan Aage Fjortoft, they won the return game 4-1 at The Valley.

They then drew 1-1 at Brighton, before winning the replay 4-1. Derby County were their next victims, beaten 2-1 at The County Ground, where Millwall were beaten 3-1 in round five.

That took Swindon into the semi-finals for the first time since 1980.

Goals from Fjortoft and Luc Nijholt gave Swindon a 2-0 victory over Marlow in the third round of the FA Cup.

windon's emphasis upon attacking football has not been changed by new player/manager Steve McMahon, although he has tried to add more steel to their play and has brought about a notable improvement in defence.

Norwegian international striker Jan Aage Fjortoft has now totally acclimatised to the English game and he is now the First Division's leading scorer with 23 goals in all competitions.

He has become particularly adept at scoring in Cup football with eight goals – including a hat-trick against **Charlton** – in their run to the semi-final of the **Coca-Cola Cup**, adding one more Cup goal in Swindon's 2-0 victory over non-League **Marlow** in the last round of the **FA Cup**.

Andy Mutch, who has been recalled to partner Fjortoft in attack, scored twice in Swindon's recent 3-1 Coca-Cola Cup win over Millwall.

Mr McMahon has played only three games since his arrival in November, preferring to retain a settled midfield of



Martin Ling, Luc Nijholt, Kevin Hurlock and Joey Beauchamp.

Holland under-21 international midfielder Luc Nijholt started his career with Haarley, moving on to AZ-67, Utrecht and Old Boys (Basle) before coming to the UK to join Motherwell in 1990. Swindon signed him during the summer of 1993.

Wayne O'Sullivan, another midfield player, is usually included among the substitutes.

Ian Culverhouse, who signed from Norwich City in December for a fee to be decided by a tribunal, has moved in along-side Shaun Taylor in the middle of defence.

Mark Robinson, signed from Newcastle United for a club record fee of £600,000 in the summer, has settled in at right-back, with Paul Bodin continuing on the opposite flank.

Nicky Hammond, who had sat so patiently for so long on the substitutes' bench, was recalled in goal last month and has been playing for the past few weeks, with Fraser Digby taking his turn as substitute 'keeper.

me time was just ripe for Steve McMahon when he was offered the job as Swindon's player/manager in November. He had achieved many honours during a playing career that had embraced both Merseyside clubs and a run of 17 games in the England team.

Now he is hoping to carve out a similarly successful career in management.

Mr McMahon joined Everton whilst still at school, turning professional in 1979. Soon after making his senior debut the following year, he was in the England under-21 side, winning six caps at that level.

Aston Villa signed him for £300,000 in 1983 and he remained with them for just over two years before returning to Merseyside with Liverpool. Whilst at Anfield, he won three League Championship medals, played in two FA Cup finals and one League Cup final and collected all of his full England caps.

He moved on to Manchester City for £895,000 in December 1991, remaining with them until taking up his present post.

Throughout his career, Mr McMahon has been associated with attack-minded teams, so he has naturally encouraged his Swindon men to continue with the pleasing style of play favoured by

Rapid Vienna for £500,000 (then a Swindon club record) in July 1993. It took him a few months to settle into the English game, but he came good with 12 goals in his closing 15 games last season and has been maintaining a fabulous scoring rate this term.

He began his career with Lillestrom, moving on to Rapid in 1990. Jan Aage was a member of the Norway team in last summer's World Cup finals and he has now played for his country on more than 50 occasions.

The Robins invested a club record fee of £700,000 to sign Joey Beauchamp from West Ham at the start of the season. He had joined Oxford as a trainee and made his name as a creative midfielder with them. He agreed to sign for West Ham last summer, but soon realised he had made a mistake. He moved on to Swindon without kicking a competitive ball for the Hammers.


Left-back Paul Bodin has been a member of the Wales squad for several years, collecting his 23rd cap against Albania in September. Paul spent his early years with Chelsea and Newport, but it was after signing for Cardiff City that he got his chance in League football in 1982.


He later went non-League with Bath City before returning to the League fold with Newport County. He originally joined Swindon in 1988 but he moved on to Crystal Palace in 1991, later serving Newcastle on loan before returning to The County Ground in 1992.






A statistical look at Swindon's season so far:














atford's final League match of 1962 saw Carlisle United make the long journey south to Vicarage Road for a Division Three encounter. Watford, under the guidance of manager Ron Burgess, were challenging for promotion and although many games were being

postponed due to the onset of bad weather this particular match was given the go-ahead and 8,472 fans braved the conditions to witness the wintry proceedings. The Winter of 1962-63 was destined to become one of the worst of the century and after the clash with the Cumbrians, the Hornets were not to play another League game until February 23rd. The FA Cup third round tie with

Rotherham United, too, was postponed many times and was eventually played on February 20th, when the

Brentford; making 59 League appearances for the Hornets in this time. Peter McConnell, Carlisle United's left-half, then had a chance after 23 minutes to equalise with a powerful shot, but Watford 'keeper Dave Underwood saved his effort on this occasion. The Hornets' custodian was not so lucky ten minutes later after his full-back Ken Nicholas was ruled to have handled the ball in the box. McConnell, who went on

> to play more than 270 League games for the Cumbrians, took the penalty himself and made no mistake this time.

Ward then restored Watford's lead with a header from Fraser's John after cross Carlisle had lost Alan McBain and

John Marsden following a collision. Watford briefly faced nine men in

the days before substitutes had been introduced and while they enjoyed a numerical advantage Ward completed his hat-trick with a shot inside the

After the break, although McBain returned, Marsden was unable to resume and Watford scored a further two goals against Carlisle's ten men. The Cumbrians held out until the 81st minute, however, but were powerless to prevent John Fraser scoring with a solo effort. Fraser, who had earlier set up Ward's second goal, joined Watford in July 1962 from Margate after previous spells with Glentoran, Sunderland and





Portsmouth. Fittingly, Dai Ward was instrumental in creating Watford's fifth with just two minutes remaining when his pass found Watford winger George Harris, a recruit from Newport County in April 1962.

The worsening weather conditions after this game blew Watford's promotion plans off course, however, and the Hornets were not to win another League game until April 9th.



Craig's form in front of goal last month was straight out of the Dalglish copy-book. "I was pleased with my powerful header in the 2-0 win against Portsmouth. It was travelling at such a speed that I don't think many goalkeepers would have stopped it going in to the net. It was great to score the injury-time winner in the five-goal thriller against Port Vale. I got a lot of stick from the lads, as they were surprised to see me running after the ball in the 90th minute of a match! The goals have been going in for me recently, because I have found myself in good situations at the right time."

Craig's successive goals in three matches, during the holiday period, took him to the top of Watford's goalscoring chart for this season, following the transfer of the previous top-scorer, Lee Nogan, to Reading.

"I've not finished the scoring yet," says the former Derby County man. "I hope to bag a few more goals before the season is out and I would love to score a goal today



to get me off and running in this year's FA Cup."

What are Craig's thoughts on today's important Cup-tie? "We have a good base from which to start against Swindon today, as we have been so difficult to beat at Vicarage Road. All you ask when the draw is made is a home tie and we have got that important home advantage, so we look forward to today's match with plenty of confidence."

Craig appears to be fastbecoming Watford's 'Mr versatile', as he has played in several different positions this season. "I have played as an out-and-out striker, in midfield and at the front of the diamond formation," says Craig, who celebrates his first anniversary at the club next month.

"I am a better attacker than I am a defender, so I prefer playing up front. I like it when we adopt the diamond formation approach, as it allows me to run at opposition defenders more often."

"Without question, the highlight of my career so far was when I played for the England under-21 side. It was a very proud moment for me when I put on my England shirt for the very first time.

"I've been struck down with so many injuries during my career to date that it is nice to have had a good run in the team this season. Hessy and I are having a good battle, as we are the only two ever-present players in the first-team."

"My career to date has a huge gap in it as I have had major injury problems in the past. I was out injured for two consecutive seasons, during my time at the Baseball Ground. THE FA CUP
FOURTH ROUND GATEWAY TO
GLORY?

F you can describe any FA Cup round as 'nondescript', it's the fourth round.

There's none of the romance of the third round, when the 'big boys' and 'minnows' first clash. Neither does anyone genuinely harbour thoughts of Wembley.

But by the fifth round, and a place in the last 16, the 'it's going to be our year' talk begins in earnest.

Looking at the post-War years, Watford's own record in the fourth round of the FA Cup is, well, nondescript.

No, that's probably unfair. We have recorded ten wins in the 16 times the club has competed at this stage since WW2.

Those victories have led to two sojourns which stopped at the semi-final stage, one which went all the way to Wembley - but equally four departures in round five. Three quarter-finals were also reached,

The only conclusion one can make is that victory at this stage - no matter who the opponents - has no bearing on the likely longevity of a Cup run.

Fourth round ties which stand out over the years must surely include the games against Manchester United - in 1949/50 and 1968/69. In the first of these, Watford were in Division Three (South), but lost out only to a single goal - from Jack Rowley. But the game will be remembered for a 'goal' from Watford's Taffy Davies that everyone in the ground thought crossed the line except the referee. Nearly 20 years on and another great goalscorer put paid to our hopes in 1968/69 - Denis Law striking twice for United, after we had

brought the Red Devils back to Vicarage Road for a replay.

From underdogs in those days, roles became reversed as we moved up the divisions - with a closerun thing against non-League **Harlow Town** in January 1980. Four Watford goals only just saw off three strikes from the Essex men.

Four years later, a solid 2-0 win at Charlton Athletic in round four was undoubtedly the gateway to glory, as three more Cup wins followed—to set up the club's only Wembley appearance to date.


Since then, a Luther Blissett goal saw off Chelsea at this stage in 1987. It was the first of three ties against London opposition that season. We beat Arsenal famously at Highbury in round six, but came unstuck against Tottenham Hotspur in the last four.

Spurs were beaten by **Coventry City** in the Final that year, and we then removed the holders from the competition the next season - **Trevor Senior** netting the only goal at Highfield Road. Sadly, that season ended in relegation, and although we competed in round four in the ensuing two campaigns, we haven't since.

And so to today...
