



ON THE MARK

THERE seemed no stopping Swindon Town on home soil under the guidance of Lou Macari back in 1987 . . . until, that is, we visited the County Ground.

The Wiltshire club had gone 12 months without losing a home game, during which time they had won 20 times out of 22, drawing the other two games.

That had helped them to storm to the old Fourth Division Championship in the 1986-87 campaign.

But all good things have to come an end sooner or later, and we upset the applecart by running out 2-1 winners, our reward for a highly resilient display.

lan McParland put us ahead on that occasion, and although Steve White equalised for the home side, it was Mark Goodwin who popped up with the second half winner.

HAPPIER TIMES

IT'S SOMETHING of a relief that we meet Swindon Town in happier circumstances this afternoon... because our last encounter with them was one of the lowest points of a disastrous season.

Swindon's emphatic 3-0 victory on that occasion at the County Ground back in May was not only our heaviest defeat of the campaign, it also condemned us to bottom place in the First Division.

Two goals from Peter Thorne and another from Chris Hamon capped what was a miserable performance and it completed a Swindon double over us in that particular League programme.

The only player who had something to remember that day was young winger lan Ridgway who was given his first taste of League action as a second half substitute.

Visitors

SWINDON TOWN may still be in a deep state of shock after their dramatic nosedive over the past two years ... but it certainly hasn't been evident in the way they have performed so far this season.

The unfashionable Wiltshire club have bounced back well from successive relegation disasters, ones that sent them plummeting from the Premiership's dizzy heights to the Second Division.

A flying start to the current campaign has, however, established them as firm favourites to regain some of that lost ground, and it has restored a smile to the face of the club in the process.

Summer signings Wayne Allison and Steve Finney have made highly productive starts to their Swindon careers and that has helped them to hit the promotion trail with a flurry of goals.

Indeed, player-manager Steve McMahon has plenty of firepower at his disposal with highly-rated striker Peter Thorne is commanding a lot of attention from some of the bigger clubs.

That situation is a welcome change of fortune for the former England midfielder who had to sell Norwegian international Jan Fjortoft soon after taking over from the outgoing John Gorman.

It was a bitter blow to McMahon, and indeed Swindon, in the desperate battle to avoid a relegation, one from which they never really recovered in losing seven of their last 11 matches.

But in setting about his rebuilding plans in the summer, the midfielder signed Allison from nearby Bristol City for £475,000 and snapped up Finney on a free transfer from Manchester City.

Defensive stability has been just as important to Swindon's recent success though, and the £100,000 arrival of Mark Seagraves from Bolton Wanderers has been a key factor in that sense.

Seagraves has formed a solid partnership with Shaun Taylor at the heart of the back four, while the experience of former Norwich City sweeper Ian Culverhouse, another McMahon capture last season for £250,000, has made life tough for opposing strikers.

Swindon also possess arguably the most experienced midfield in the division now, following Paul Allen's recent arrival from Southampton on a free transfer to operate alongside McMahon.

That can only improve their prospects of taking one step back up the ladder at the first attempt, maybe even a step towards regaining the Premiership status they held for such a short time.

FRASER DIGBY (Goalkeeper)

Long serving goalkeeper who has now made more than 400 senior appearances for the club. Began his career as an apprentice with Manchester United and did in fact return to Old Trafford for a short loan spell during the 1992-93 season. The 28-year-old also had a loan spell with Oldham before joining Swindon in 1986.

IAN CULVERHOUSE (Defender)

Experienced defender snapped up in a £250,000 transfer from Norwich City last year after a long spell at Carrow Road. A former Tottenham apprentice, he made only one first team appearance at White Hart Lane before moving to Norwich where he played in over 300 senior games

SHAUN TAYLOR (Defender)

The £200,000 signing from Exeter City has proved to be a shrewd acquisition over the past four years, and has been an everpresent for the past two seasons. Made a late entry into League football after a spell with Bideford Town, but made a big impression at Exeter which led to his switch to the County Ground.

PAUL BODIN (Defender)

Welsh international full back who is now in his second spell with the club. Initially signed from Newport County for £25,000 in 1988, his rapid emergence at Swindon not only led to international honours but also a £550,000 move to Crystal Palace. But he failed to settle there and made a swift return to the County Ground.

JASON DRYSDALE (Defender)

Former England youth international who signed for Swindon in a £340,000 deal from Newcastle United on transfer deadline day in March. The 25-year-old made 160 appearances for Watford, leading to a £425,000 transfer to Newcastle, but he was unable to pin down a first team place at St James' Park.

MARK SEAGRAVES (Defender)

Big strong central defender who was signed from Bolton Wanderers in a £100,000 transfer in the summer. The 29-year-old began his career with Liverpool but moved on to spend four years with Manchester City before joining Bolton, where he played a significant part in their successive promotion triumphs.

MARK ROBINSON (Defender)

Like Jason Drysdale, the Rochdale-born defender found his way to Swindon after an unproductive spell at Newcastle. After being initially rejected by West Brom, the 26-year-old made a big enough impression at Barnsley to prompt Newcastle to pay £450,000 for him, but his hopes there weren't helped by injuries.

WAYNE O'SULLIVAN (Defender)

Cyprus-born defender who has proved just as effective in other positions since breaking into the first team. A former trainee at the County Ground, the 21-year-old made his first team debut three years ago and has gradually developed into a valuable member of Swindon's squad due to his versatility.

KEVIN HORLOCK (Midfielder)

Northern Ireland international who has made an impact in both midfield and full

back positions for Swindon. The 22-yearold arrived at the County Ground after being given a free transfer by West Ham three years ago and has made rapid progress since being given that chance by Glenn Hoddle.

TY GOODEN (Midfielder)

Talented midfielder who has bounced back well from the disappointment of being rejected by Wycombe Wanderers when they were promoted to the Football League at the end of the 1992-93 season. The 23-year-old was signed up by John Gorman after a successful trial period at the County Ground.

STEVE McMAHON (Midfielder)

The former England international has not let his managerial duties prevent him from continuing what has been long and productive playing career. As a midfield powerhouse, the 34-year-old enjoyed successful spells with Everton, Aston Villa, Liverpool and Manchester City, before being appointed Swindon's player-boss last year.

PAUL ALLEN (Midfielder)

The former Tottenham and Southampton star was signed on a free transfer recently and his link-up with Steve McMahon gives Swindon the most experienced midfield in the Second Division. After an initial spell with West Ham, the 33-year-old made 292 appearances in his long spell at White Hart Lane.

MARTIN LING (Midfielder)


The 29-year-old midfielder has proved to be a bargain buy after being snapped up by Glenn Hoddle in a £15,000 deal for what is his second spell with Swindon, although he has been hit by injury troubles recently. Has also had spells with Exeter City and Southend, as well as a month on loan with Mansfield Town.

WAYNE ALLISON (Striker)

Summer signing from Bristol City in a deal that was set at £475,000 by a transfer tribunal, the 27-year-old frontman has repaid some of that outlay with his goalscoring already. Initially an apprentice with Halifax Town, he made his first real impression in a spell with Watford before moving to Ashton Gate for £300,000.

STEVE FINNEY (Striker)

Steve McMahon returned to his former club Manchester City to acquire the 22-year-old Hexham-born striker on a free transfer during the summer. Began his career with Preston prior to City signing him but made little headway with either club. However, he has made up for that in his short time at the County Ground.




PETER THORNE (Striker)

Highly-rated striker who has caught the eye of several Premiership clubs in his short time at Swindon after joining them for an undisclosed fee in January. Began his career with Blackburn Rovers but soon found that the presence of Alan Shearer, Chris Sutton and Mike Newell restricted his chances.

ANDY MUTCH (Striker)

Former England B international striker who made a name for himself in a highly productive goalscoring partnership with Steve Bull at Wolves. The 32-year-old Merseysider eventually joined Swindon in a £250,000 deal two years ago, but has been out of favour recently and had a spell on loan at Wigan.





IT has certainly been that for Steve and me since we arrived at Meadow Lane and I cannot see it being any different in the foreseeable future.

Although it's not really for me to say, I like to think that progress has been made in licking this club into shape again - although we are still only scratching the surface.

Our priority over the past few months has been to identify a group of players we want to work with (and who also want to work for this club - which is important) and set out to improve them, individually and collectively.

As part of that process, we have also been involved in drawing up a list of players whose interests might be best served by moving elsewhere.

They say there's no peace for the wicked but living at a hectic pace is no better me. Those who handle the maximum amount of pressure with the minimum of fuss will always be the most successful.

THREE MORE unbeaten matches in the League and Notts will have equalled an eleven-match run in the 1990-91 season and not emulated since. It's

an appetising challenge.

Such sequences seem to start in the most unpromising of circumstances. The current one began after a pretty miserable defeat at Brighton, hardly one of the best teams in the division. And in 1990 nobody could have guessed that County were on the brink of such fine consistency.

When West Ham United visited Meadow Lane on 3rd November, 1990, manager Neil Warnock apologised in his programme notes for the poverty of County's display the previous Tuesday, a 2-2 draw with Charlton Athletic, the seventh consecutive League and Cup game without a win. Charlton's second equaliser had come in the dving stages of a lifeless contest.

What's more, West Ham won 1-0 - a quite thrilling goal by Nottingham-born Tony Morley settled it - to stretch that unhappy run to eight, but Warnock made a significant change to County's formation, playing with a sweeper and handing the role to Don

O'Riordan.

The win slightly flattered The Hammers and a week later Notts, this time facing West Bromwich Albion at Meadow Lane, broke the ice with a 4-3 win in a match they had led 4-1 just after half-time. Kevin Bartlett scored twice, Mark

Draper converted a penalty - and big Dave Regis notched his first goal for the club.

County's confidence was immediately boosted and the following Saturday, at Ipswich, they totally dominated for 90 minutes (proof of that was the winning of 16 corners) but had to be satisfied with a goalless draw, as they did in the next outing, against Swindon at Meadow Lane.

December's first day took County to Sheffield Wednesday, who were riding high: unbeaten at Hillsborough in eleven League and Cup matches and ahead as early as the second minute, John Sheridan converted a controversial penalty. awarded for an innocuous-looking challenge by Mark Draper on Trevor Francis. Just before half-time David Hirst hit Wednesday's second, but another penalty award, shortly after the break, put County back in the game when Draper found the net. Bartlett had one effort disallowed before hammering the equaliser on 77 minutes.

I described it on Radio Nottingham as "a ripping match... County's best performance since their return to the Second Division and a nice 42nd birthday present for Sheffield-born Neil Warnock." But I added that it was Sheffieldborn Phil Turner who was County's star on the field... against the club he supported as a boy.

The best was yet to come as Notts chalked up five successive victories over Hull, Bristol City, Blackburn Rovers, Newcastle and Brighton. The wins over Blackburn,

1-0, and Newcastle, 2-0, were both achieved away from home, to bring the old year to a close on a triumphant and promising note.

The influence of O'Riordan in all this must not be under-estimated and in the win over Bristol City he made the 450th League appearance of his career.

Bartlett hit the only goal scored against Blackburn but when a flu epidemic struck before the trip to Newcastle it seemed a tough task to keep the run going. The bug kept Warnock off the bench and Turner and Gary Lund at home as well, while Charlie Palmer - sent off against Bristol City - was suspended. Newcastle included new boy Gavin Peacock and John Burridge in goal. Bartlett's 65th minute goal took him to ten for the season and five in the month, and Chris Short added a late penalty.

The New Year brought the win over Brighton, on 1st January, the fifth successive win, equalling a sequence of the previous season. It ought to have been six on the trot, but after leading 3-1 at Oxford with less than ten minutes to go, Notts conceded two late goals and finished 3-3.

It was back to winning ways the following week, 3-2 over Middlesbrough, the first over any club in the top eight. Boro twice led a thrilling match.

And the run ended on 22nd January, 1991 with a 3-1 defeat at Charlton... the same opponents who, three eventful months earlier, had prompted Warnock to make that apology!
