

Notts County enhanced their Play-Off ambitions with a 3-1 win over Carlisle United last Saturday to take their points haul to 66 from 37 games.

It was a good day for Gary Jones the new striker from Southend United who backed himself at 5-1 to open the scoring. He got a vital touch to Gary Strodder's goal-bound header in the 11th minute to make it a golden pay-day. After the game he boasted: "It was my goal and I've got £50 in my back pocket to prove it."

Gary Martindale put Notts further ahead just three minutes later and Jones claimed a second goal for himself in the second half after Warren Aspinall had pulled one back for Carlisle.

This was only the second time
County had scored more than two
goals in a League match since
November 18 when they beat
Chesterfield 4-1 at Meadow Lane.
The arrival of Jones has helped to
put that matter right. Five goals in
nine games suggests it might.

There have been a few changes at meadow Lane this season. Steve Thompson was in charge when they opened the season last August; Devon White and Tony Agana the main strike force. White netted 11 goals in the opening 20 League and Cup engagements and after losing his place in November was transferred to Watford in February.

Also on the move was Chris Marsden, transferred to Stockport County, while Andy Legg, the man with the longest throw in League football, and Paul Devlin have also been moved on to Birmingham City for a combined fee of £500,000.

The new bosses have totally restyled the team with goalkeeper Darren Ward, Tony Agana, and centre-half and skipper Gary Strodder the only survivors from the eleven who opened the season with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham.

Problem positions have included rightback where Wilder. Hoyle. Derry and Atkins have all appeared in the last nine games; and right midfield where Gallagher and Finnan have battled for possession.

Goalkeeper Ward has been the only ever-present; Baraclough is

now entrenched at leftback with Murphy and Rogers in midfield and either Agana or Richardson left side.

Notts County

Vincent Arkins

- STRIKER. Enthusiastic centreforward signed from the Irish Club Shelbourne for a small fee in September 1995. Made his League debut in the 2-2 home draw with Bristol City on November 1, 1995 and registered his first goal in a 3-0 victory at Bristol Rovers on October 21. Has seven goals in all. Born: Dublin 18-9-70.

Lee Ashcroft

- STRIKER. Former Preston North End forward, he was signed just before the transfer deadline on loan from West Bromwich Albion. Lee scored ten goals in 38 League Appearances for the Albion last season but struggled to find his form with the Throstles this season. Born: Preston 7-9-72.

Tony Agana

- FORWARD. A former insurance salesman who started his career on the non-League circuit with Welling then Weymouth. Dave Bassett took him to Watford then when he moved to Bramall Lane he took Tony with him. It was with Sheffield United that we really saw the best of him for he enjoyed a prolific striking partnership with Brian Dean. In November 1991 Notts paid a Club record £250.000 for his services but he was unable to recapture his scoring form at Meadow Lane. Born: London 2-10-63.

lan Baraclough

- FULLBACK. Left sided defender signed from Mansfield Town in October 1995. Ian made his County bow in the 2-1 win over Rotherham United in mid-October. Started his career with Grimsby Town and last season made 36 League appearances for the Stags. Is six-foot-one tall. Born: Leicester 4-12-70.

Tony Battersby

FORWARD. Joined the Bramall Lane staff from school and was leading scorer in the Sheffield United Junior team before signing professional in 1993. A slim, mobile striker who promised much he was unable to fulfil his potential with the Blades through lack of opportunity. Transferred to Notts County in January 1996 and made his League start in a 1-1 draw at Wycombe (13-1-96) having played at York in the AWS. Scored his first goal in the 1-0 win over Peterborough United. Born: Doncaster 30-8-75

Shaun Derry

- RIGHT-BACK. A second year YTS lad who has spent most of the season in the Youth Team. Had a short run in the Reserve side and impressed and made his League debut on March 12, 1996 in the starting line against York City (2-2). Born: Nottingham 6-12-77.

Steve Finnan

- MIDFIELD. Currently on loan from Birmingham City where he has been given little scope to develop his career. Made his County debut against Walsall on March 6.

Graeme Hogg

CENTRAL DEFENDER, Former Scottish Under-21 International who learned his trade with Manchester United. Was five years at Old Trafford making 83 League appearances (1 goal), before moving to Portsmouth in August 1988 for £150,000. Chalked up another 100 League games with Pompey, and 7 on loan with West Brom, before leaving Fratton Park in August 1991 to play for Hearts. In January 1995 he returned to sign for Notts in a £75,000 deal. A tough, rugged competitor. Born: Aberdeen 17-6-64.

James Hunt

- MIDFIELD. Local lad who joined the Club from school he was introduced to the starting line in League football for the 2-0 win at Bournemouth on February 27, 1996. Held his place for the next eight games but dropped to the subs bench last week to make way for Ashcroft.

Born: Nottingham 17-12-76.

Gary Jones

- STRIKER. Signed from Southend United for £150,000 on March 1,-1996 and is already on the goal trail. Scored 11 times last season for Southend having started his career with Doncaster Rovers though he never played in the Yorkshire Club's League side. He was released and went non-League with Boston United until being given a second chance by Southend in 1993. Had stiff competition at Roots Hall this season with Andy Thompson, David Regis, Andy Ansah and Paul Read all contesting the strike roles. Born: Doncaster 6-4-69.



Gary Martindale

STRIKER. Recruited from Peterborough United in the first week of March 1996 Gary was signed from non-League football by Bolton Wanderers, who invested £20,000 for his registration from Burscough in 1993. Peterborough had attempted to buy him at the time and when he was released from Burnden Park on a free transfer, in July 1995 they signed him on. A strong hard working centre-forward he made a scoring debut for Posh in a 3-1 win over Brighton on the opening day of this season and had scored 12 goals before his move to Meadow Lane. Born: Liverpool 24-6-71.

CENTRAL DEFENDER. It was Shaun's performances for Australia in the 1992 Olympics (they reached the semi-final), that attracted attention from Meadow Lane and the Sydney born defender was signed from Perth Italia. Made his English debut in September 1992 as a sub against Burnley and took time to adjust to the pace of League football, Shaun, who has an Irish father and Anglo-Indian mother, prefers playing centre-half though he is often utilised in midfield. Born: Sydney 5-11-70.

lan Richardson


Birmingham City in January 1996 lan did not get a look in with the Blues. Made his Notts debut in the 1-0 home win over Peterborough United on February 3, when he replaced Shaun Murphy.

Paul Rogers

MIDFIELD. December 1995 saw him transfer to Notts County from Sheffield United and make a scoring debut in the FA Cup Third Round defeat (2-1) by Middlesbrough. A tireless grafter he made a late entry into League football and was 26 when Dave Bassett persuaded him to give it a try with Sheffield United in January 1992. Paul, a stockbroker by trade, had played for nine years with Sutton United while running a lucrative business. Made his League entry for the Blades at Luton (22-2-92). Born: Portsmouth 21-3-65.

Darren Ward

- GOALKEEPER. An ever present since his arrival last summer from Mansfield Town in a £150,000 deal. Has kept 22 clean sheets in all competitions this season. Is fivefoot-eleven and a confident performer with a safe pair of hands. Made his League appearances for Mansfield Town last season. Born: Workshop 11-5-74.

Colin Murphy was engaged as General Manager in June 1995 with Steve Thompson in charge of playing matters as Team Manager.

Murphy came into football as a player with Crystal Palace and went on to serve Cork, Hibs and Wimbledon as well before turning his hand to coaching.

In this capacity he worked as

coach and assistant manager with Derby County, Leicester City and Luton Town gaining great respect.

In the summer of 1976 Colin took over from Dave Mackay as manager of Derby County, but was succeeded a year later by Tommy Docherty. He was then appointed by Lincoln City and had ten good years with the Imps.

The next port of call was Stockport County where Colin was manager

in 1986-87 and most recently he had a spell in charge of Southend United. In all he has won promotion as a manager on three occasions.

Steve Thompson's playing career spanned Lincoln City, Charlton Athletic and Sheffield United.

He cut his coaching teeth with Doncaster Rovers and then progressed to management with Lincoln City and Southend United, gaining promotion on two occasions.

Under the Spotlight

Gary Strodder arrived at
Meadow Lane last summer
from West Bromwich Albion
following a £145,000 transfer
and is now installed as the
Notts County skipper.

The son of former Huddersfield
Town and Halifax Town defender
Colin Strodder. Gary was introduced
to League football by Lincoln City.
He was still a raw 17 year-old when
he made his League debut against

Wigan Athletic in August 1982. Strong, tall, powerful and brave he established himself immediately going on to make 132 League appearances (6 goals) for the Imps before he was earmarked for top class football by then West Ham United boss John Lyall.

In March 1987 the Hammers paid Lincoln City £150,000 for the big stopper and he made his First Division bow in a 1-0 defeat at Chelsea on March 21st.


With England International Alvin

Martin and Tony Gale the regular choices Gary's opportunities were limited at Upton Park, but in the 1987-88 season injuries presented "Max" with 29 League outings.

In August 1990 the tall Yorkshireman moved to West Bromwich Albion and established himself as the rock of their defence until last season when he lost his place - making only 19 League appearances.

We claimed the majority of honours in the PFA Division Two representative side with no less than three players chosen as the best in their positions at this level.

Having conceded the fewest goals in the Division this season it is perhaps not surprising that all three were defenders with Shaun Taylor voted the best centre-half in the Division. Welsh International Paul Bodin acknowledged as the best left-back and the cultured lan Culverhouse rewarded for his consistently high standard as a sweeper.

Only one other club had more than one player selected and that was our visitors this afternoon Notts County. Darren Ward, the former Mansfield Town custodian was voted the best goalkeeper in Division Two this season: Wilder the best right-back.

Congratulations to all the award winners and of course this afternoon we will have on show the best defenders in Division Two. Quite a challenge for the forwards and midfield players and one they will no doubt relish.

Blackpool had one player in the representative selection, defensive midfielder Michael Mellon: Crewe had play-maker Neil Lennon who has since moved on to join First Division Leicester City.







Treatment Room &

With Club Physio Jonathan Trigg

Easter time is a very busy period for footballers and the big problem for us is the Monday fixtures because there is just insufficient time to get ordinary bumps and bruises repaired.

Normally it is not the day after a game that the players feel tired it is the day after that and of course any wear and tear on muscles is felt more when the body is tired.

We are hoping we can get through the Easter programme without too many difficulties. The every day knocks such as dead-legs and kicks are not really a problem it is the twists and the strains that cause concern because obviously there is insufficient time to recover from these for the Monday if they are picked up on a Saturday.


So it is fingers crossed we can get through today's game without any such injuries.

We had two casualties last week at Bristol City and one struck down by a virus - David Preece.

Our home game against Millwall was the third match in five days for some of our younger players who had also turned our for the Youth Team so it was quite a demanding schedule for the lads.

I had discussed the matter with Tom because we knew that after the Monday game against West Ham United, when they really did themselves proud against a very experienced side, there was a possibility of a reaction. They had hit a high against the Hammers and as we anticipated came back down with a bang against Millwall.

This is to be expected of young players but despite the loss to the Lions I was quite happy with them overall. They again showed great attitude.

We conceded three bad goals on the day yet just after half-time could have been 3-1 up. We came in at the break one-each went out and got a penalty - missed the penalty and then young Scott Woodman made a great run; got round the back of the Millwall defence, cut the ball back and just as Steven Cowe was about to take aim and stick it in the net the ball bobbled over his foot.

Things like these change the circumstances and after that Millwall got on top when we gave them a sloppy goal. The defenders did not pick-up properly.

The reason for recalling this wondrous memory is to let those of you who have never played football in front of such a big crowd, realise the thrill of it. Imagine how I felt when I collected a pass in my own half and ran through an entire defence, in front of 20,000 onlookers, I swerved passed the last defender and hammered the ball inside the left hand pile of coats nothing will ever erase that glorious memory from my mind. The fact that the goalkeeper was eating a Mars Bar at the time has nothing to do with it!



The last Thursday in March is traditionally transfer mayhem day as clubs rush to sign players for money, or on loan, to boost their promotion or relegation pushes.

In the last few years however the drama has somewhat quietened down basically because clubs do not have the money to spend. The Bosman case no doubt is also having an effect. But though the last minute rush brought very little excitement in the last year since April 1995 to this March deadline a total of £224 million was spent on the transfer market.

The busiest period was April to August when clubs did £126 million worth of business deals. Mad March accounted for £16 million.

We spent £100,000 to secure Steve Cowe from Aston Villa a week after taking him on a loan agreement. We also signed Don "Scott" Leitch on loan from Heart of Midlothian. The former Motherwell man had played there when Luc Nilholt was with them and last season made 21 Scottish League appearances for Hearts.

He made an impressive League debut for us in the 0-0 draw against Bristol City at Ashton Gate last week, when he was chosen to replace David Preece who had gone down with a virus.

Manchester City were the last day's biggest spenders, investing £1.4 million on another Georgian. Mikhail Kavelashvili, but the Second Division was involved in quite a few comings and goings and here is who went where in our League:

BLACKPOOL: Transferred Jonathan Sunderland to Sunderland on a free move.

BOURNEMOUTH: Were very active. They signed John O'Neill from Celtic for an undisclosed fee. Owen Coll from Tottenham Hotspur, Ian Cox from Crystal Palace and Paul Mitchell from

West Ham United all on free transfers.

Mel Machin also let. Scott Moan join West Ham United on loan for now. Harry Redknapp has agreed to pay £200,000 to clear the Second Division club's VAT debt with a further £550,000 to follow.

BRADFORD CITY: Sold Gavin Ward to Bolton Wanderers for a fee of £300,000 and will receive an additional £100,000 if Bolton avoid relegation from the Premiership.

Recruited two players on loan deals. Bobby Gould's goalkeeper son, Jonathan Gould from Coventry City and Glenn Arne Hansen from DFI Norway.

BRIGHTON & HOVE ALBION: Have taken Zeke Rowe on loan from Chelsea and Derek Allen from Southampton.

BRISTOL ROVERS: Signed Nottingham Forest's Craig Armstrong on loan.

BURNLEY: Signed the following players on loan. Charlie Bishop from Barnsley and Paul Mahorn from Tottenham Hotspur.

CARLISLE UNITED: Received £125,000 from Grimsby Town for Anthony Gallimore. Took Wayne Dowell on loan from Burnley.

CHESTERFIELD: Signed Chris Care from Loughborough University as a non-contract player. Took Ian Hathaway and Junior McDougald on loan from Torquay United and Brighton respectively.

On the outward journey Wayne Fairclough moved on loan to Scarborough.

CREWE: Released John Ridings on loan to Hednesford Town.

HULL CITY: Spent a combined fee of £25,000 to recruit Duane Darby and Scott Maxfield from Doncaster Rovers.







I managed to get a couple of goals against them earlier in the season






Gary Williams' U12 squad looked quite poor and inadequate compared to a group of footballers who don't even attend Centre of






