






(above) Take that - Dele Adebola lets fly with his favourite left foot against Chesterfield

At one time, it was a widely held view that the Easter programme undertaken by clubs in the Football League was a time when several of the promotion and relegation issues could be, and sometimes were settled. That has to quite an extent altered, clubs do not now undertake the punishing schedule that used to apply i.e. games on Good Friday, Easter Saturday and then Easter Monday.

For one thing, it often meant that if a player was injured in the first game there was very little time for him to be able to regain full fitness for the others. This season, we will of course have games on Easter Saturday and then Easter Monday and in some cases on the Tuesday. The rewards of three points for a win and just one for a draw has also seen competition between the clubs at one end of the league table or the other become much tighter. In some divisions it is already apparent that some issues will not be decided until the very last day of the season.

To show the importance of that last day of the season, we now read that the games on the traditional last Saturday will now be put back 24 hours until the Sunday, such is the power of Television where such changes can be made to suit the schedules of the programmers in the various regions.

Gradually, we are now also seeing the build up to the European Championships being held in this country during the summer months. For those football followers who collect

programmes, they are going to be in for a hectic and also expensive time. From information already to hand it would seem that there will be a separate programme issue for every game in the competition. In all, including the final there will be a total of 25 issues. priced, I understand at £4.00 each. It does not need a calculator to work out that if you are going for the full set then it is going to cost you over £100. Just think, if you were to forfeit such an outlay it would go a long way towards the purchase of a Season Ticket at your particular club! Obviously a certain amount of market research has already been done to come up with such a saturation cover. Past tournaments have often seen a brochure type issue, at least until the later stages when individual issues then take over.

As in all things, there will be those that will decide to get them and others who will resist the temptation. Still on the same subject of Programme Prices, the Coca Cola Cup Final between Aston Villa and Leeds United was a £5.00 issue and it is already known that this year's F.A. Cup Final will cost £6.00, this represents a 20% increase on last year's price of £5.00. We will, as always be ordering copies for those who wish to purchase them, but it would only be right to point out that only firm orders will be taken. Please let us know in the Programme Shop, situated on the car park at the rear of the Main Stand.

In his build up to the European Championships, Terry Venables, still in charge, saw his side record another win, this time over Bulgaria, although it must be said that it did seem that Bulgaria had managed to get an equaliser. For all the England party there would have been relief on the England bench when the match referee turned their appeals down for handball.


Neil Lennon won his sixth cap for Northern Ireland, unhappily

the game did not end in a win. Still talking about Neil, it was good to see him in the P.F.A. team for the Second Division the name of Neil Lennon appeared once more. The voting for that team having been carried out while Neil was still an Alex player. That was the third successive season that Neil had been included in a P.F.A. side. once in the old Third Division and now twice in the Second Division. We now have to hope that when the same time of year comes round once more that we shall see another Crewe player appearing in such a selection the question being, which one of our players could it be next time around?

In the Fair Play Award again operating in the Football League, it is good to see that Crewe Alexandra are still leading the field in our own Division, every time a home goal goes in it gives us two extra points and four for an away goal. We can of course lose points for a booking, one point or two for a sending off, happily in that vein yellow and red cards are not a common occurrence. In that context it was unusual to see a comment in a recent Chesterfield programme talking about this award and particularly how Crewe Alexandra are described. We were shown as the "Traditional goodie goodies" - there is nothing wrong with that, we have after all won 20 league games at the time of writing and drawn 7, that proves there is no lack of commitment on the part of our players. A player does not have to get booked or sent off to win a game!

No replays were necessary in the F.A. Cup Semi-Finals, it will be a North West Final Liverpool v Manchester United. It should prove to be a real classic tie. Can Rob Jones claim his second winner's medal this year - we all hope so.

Welcome to SWINDON TOWN

At the end of Season 1994/95, Swindon Town had finished in 21st position in Division One with a total of 48 points, some six points behind Sunderland who had escaped relegation and were thus relegated to Division Two. Steve McMahon had been appointed as Manager in November 1994 and that was in fact his first such Managerial appointment.

Promotion back to Division One at the earliest possible moment was the target that he set and all during the current season they have been right in the leading positions, most of the time in top spot. It was not until the 30th September that they were to be defeated for the first time going down 4-3 to Wrexham. At home they remained unbeaten until Shrewsbury Town visited there on the 25th November and the Gay Meadow side went home after winning 1-0.

So far this season they have proved to be formidable opposition, particularly when on their travels, winning 10 drawing 5 and losing 3 in total, at Wrexham as already mentioned, at York and so very recently in a midweek game at Oxford. The 3-0 reverse at Oxford was in fact their heaviest of the season to date.

Support for Swindon Town throughout the season has been good, around the 10,000 mark. They had started the season with an attendance of 7746 for the visit of York City in mid August but things have improved since then. The highest for a league game being the 13,041 for the visit of rivals Oxford United and the crowd for the Wycombe game of 12,976 not being very far behind.

Cup competition have seen some attractive opposition come down to the County Ground. It all started in the Coca Cola Cup second round, when Blackburn Rovers were the visitors, they had earned that tie with a first round win over Cambridge United on a 3-2 aggregate scoreline. Blackburn did dismiss them but both ties had excellent attendances.


When F.A. Cup time came around, they were favoured with a series of home draws, round one saw Cambridge United there once more but this time they were soundly beaten 4-1, Cardiff City came next, to be defeated 2-0. Round three saw non league opposition in the form of Woking. another home win 2-0 and then it was Oldham Athletic, from Division One. The lone goal scored by Steve McMahon proved vital for it was the one that dismissed the Boundary Park side from the competition. Swindon were in Round 5 and they got the home draw with Southampton who had only overcome Crewe Alex after a replay. The Saints did not win this one at the first attempt, they were held 1-1 at the County Ground but then won the replay 2-0.

The Auto Windscreens Shield saw them draw at Torquay and then beat Colchester United but they were to go out in the next stage, beaten by Hereford United by that narrowest of margins 1-0. The combination of Wayne Allison and Steve Finney up front has accounted for half of the Swindon goals tally but due to the unfortunate injury to Finney in the away game at Burnley they will have to manage without him


for the remainder of the season. With strength in depth they will have been working on yet another pairing to keep the goals flowing along.

Representing The Men from the County Ground

It is only in recent times that the name of STEVE McMAHON has not regularly been appearing on the team sheet for Swindon Town. He is their Player Manager and since his appointment in November 1994 there has been a big turn round in the affairs down at the County Ground. A most experienced player at the top level he has done much to create a team that seems destined to get back into the higher echelons at the first attempt after their relegation at the end of last season. As his assistant, he has ANDY **ROWLAND** another former player whose career had started with Derby County and Bury before arriving at Swindon in 1978 and when his playing career finished in the 1985/86 Season he was appointed as Reserve Team Manager and then

Now claiming the No. 1 spot in the side is an Australian, FRANK TALIA who was born in Melbourne, Blackburn Rovers had signed him from Sunshine George Cross in August 1992 and had some time on loan with Hartlepool United. He was unable to get first team football at Ewood Park and signed for Swindon in November 1995 after having spent a month on loan with them. His first senior appearance for Swindon was on the 9th September last against Chesterfield.

later as First Team Coach

FRASER DIGBY is the keeper who has recently been displaced in the side. He has been with Swindon Town since September 1986 after coming from Manchester United. His total appearances for the club now exceed 400. Signed a new contract with the club last November which now takes him through to 1998.

Defender IAN CULVERHOUSE was a former Norwich City player and when he moved in December 1994 the fee was the subject of a tribunal and a figure of £250,000 was the eventual outcome. Started as an apprentice with Spurs and had made one full appearance for them before moving to Norwich City. Has made the No. 2 spot his own.

Partnering him will be the experienced PAUL BODIN.
Cardiff born, he was initially signed from the former league side Newport County for £25,000 in March 1988. He then went to Crystal Palace for £550,000 in 1991. He spent less than a year with Palace before coming back to join Swindon once more. Missed some of last season due to injury and has also been out of the side on occasions this season. Has been capped at full level by Wales.

At No. 4 will be newcomer, DON
LEITCH only having moved
down from Scotland on the
transfer deadline day from
Hearts. He is at present on loan

with the club and it was in the away fixture at Bristol City that he made his debut.

PAUL ALLEN is a member of the renowned footballing Allen family. Previously with West Ham United and then Southampton he came to the club in October 1995. However, it was with Spurs where he made most of his appearances totalling 377. Has been capped at Under 21 and 'B' level for England.

SHAUN TAYLOR. Born in Plymouth. He started out with non league side Bideford in the Western League before moving to Exeter City when 23 years of age. Before leaving Exeter for Swindon he had made over 200 league appearances for the Grecians. Has only missed a few games in the last three years.

MARK ROBINSON. Although born in Lancashire, at Rochdale he started as an apprentice with the Midlands side, West Bromwich Albion after leaving school in 1985. From there he went to Barnsley before going to join Newcastle United for a £450,000 in 1993. When signing for Swindon in July 1994 it was for a club record fee of £600,000.

WAYNE O'SULLIVAN. He was born in Cyprus and it was in 1992 that he made his debut for them against Oxford United. He came through the club's trainee ranks and has worked hard to become a regular first team player. He was selected to play

in the Eire Under 21 squad to play Latvia in October 1995.

peter thorne was recruited from Blackburn Rovers in January 1995. He had started out as a trainee with Rovers and become a full time player in the 1991 close season. He was only to make one appearance at senior level, as substitute in the Charity Shield at Wembley against Manchester United. Has been amongst the goals this season.

The one to watch out for is WAYNE ALLISON, the leading scorer with the club this season. He was signed from Bristol City for a fee of £475,000 in July 1995. He had been an apprentice

with Halifax Town before moving to Watford for £250,000 in July 1989 and it was a year later that he moved to Ashton Gate.

STEVEN COWE is another player who has only recently signed for the club for a sizeable fee from Aston Villa and has already had his first outing with the first team.

MARTIN LING. An experienced player who had started out as an apprentice with Exeter City and later became a first team player. From Exeter he went down to Roots Hall to join Southend United. Had spells on loan with Mansfield Town and Swindon but later joined County on a permanent basis. Can also be

relied upon to score some vital goals.

MARK SEAGRAVES. A central defender who was signed from Bolton Wanderers for £100,000 in June 1995. During his career to date has also been an apprentice with Liverpool, on loan with Norwich City and then had a spell with Manchester City.

REVIN HORLOCK. Born in Plumstead he has represented Northern Ireland at full and Under 21 level. He was signed from West Ham United on free transfer in the summer of 1992 and made his debut for the club in Season 1992/93.

CREWE ALEX AND SWINDON TOWN THE STORY SO FAR



This afternoon's game will only be the 12th time the clubs have met in league encounters. Our association with the Wiltshire club only started in Season 1968/69. For Crewe it was a meeting as the result of Crewe having achieved promotion to Division Three at that time.

Gresty Road was the setting of the first encounter, the date Monday, 4th April 1969. An attendance of 9053 saw the visitors win 2-1, the Alex goal coming from the penalty spot, a successful conversion by Kevin McHale. Swindon went on to complete the double winning 1-0 at the County Ground on the 16th April 1969, the crowd being 20,100, the highest figure for such a meeting between the clubs. The keeper for the Alex was the late Willie Mailey and others players well remembered from those times were John Inglis, Keith Stott, Mick Gannon, Alan Tarbuck and Alan Bradshaw.

13 Seasons then passed before the clubs were to meet again, starting in Season 1982/83 there were 4 successive meetings with both clubs at that time being in the 4th Division. What is most surprising about those meetings is by just how many the crowds had dropped at both grounds. In that 1982/83 meeting a mere 2536 were present to see Crewe win 3-0 through goals from Lewis own goal, Edwards and Waller, it was not so much better down at Swindon there were 2967 present to see a single goal from Rowlands secure the points for the home side.

1983/84 saw another home win for Crewe, Spittle and Scott being the marksmen this time, the attendance now down to 2111. At Swindon, only one goal separated the teams once more, it was Hockaday of Swindon who scored the winner this time, their crowd 2960. Next Season 1984/85 Crewe won the home points once more, but this time Swindon did score twice, happily the Alex got three Gary Blissett, John Crabbe

and Peter Farrell got those valuable goals. The attendance was now down to 1909. There was however a surprise when the Alex went down to Swindon in this season, they scored their first goal there, John Crabbe got it and earned us our first point there, attendance 2485.

Season 1985/86 and although the season was to end in promotion for Swindon they were still unable to win at Gresty Road again, a mere 1699 saw the two future England Internationals, Geoff Thomas and David Platt getting the important goals. The trip down to Swindon was one of the occasions where you were in fact going to someone else's party. A win for Swindon gave them promotion and this they duly got. It took an Alex old boy to do the damage before a fervent home crowd of 10,976, the highest since that initial meeting. Due to injuries, the Alex had Rob Powner in goal, he did have a fine game but could not prevent their winner. Crewe had to leave the field amidst scenes of great excitement for the home fans. Crewe had tried hard but could not get anything from the game.

We now come up to date for Season 1995/96 saw Swindon down from Division One and the Alex in their second season in Division Two. It turned out to be an exciting affair and an excellent atmosphere generated by an attendance of 12,633. Swindon took the lead, the Alex fought back through Steve Garvey and it looked as though they had earned a point until that fateful minute when Swindon got the late penalty. We all know what happened then. We are eagerly awaiting this return encounter, there will be an excellent attendance hopefully matched by a game worthy of top teams in the Division, and, dare we say it, a reversal of that result at the County Ground last October.

With the other Southern League clubs they went into the Third Division of the League and are still members of this competition.



Swindon Town were another of the clubs to feature in the series of AFC Nickname cards issued by Ogdens in 1936.

At that time, Swindon was a Railway Town and like the Alex they too were known as the "Railwaymen". Both teams had thriving Railway Works, time has taken its toll and that same emphasis on the industry no longer applies.

These will then take place as follows.


Team No. 6 will play team No. 3




