SECOND GLANCE

Saturday's Second Division programme was dominated by the riot at the Goldstone Ground, which caused the Brighton v York game to be abandoned after just 16 minutes. No doubt the implications of those happenings will rumble on for some time. More importantly, just about all the results elsewhere went in Bradford City's favour!

Wrexham crashed 2-0 at home to relegation threatened Burnley, for whom Liam Robinson and Kurt Nogan netted before half-time. Chesterfield also lost 2-0, their third successive reverse, as Bournemouth's Steve Robinson and Steve Jones netted at Dean Court.

Play-off contenders Stockport County did manage to win on Saturday, 2-0 at home against Bristol Rovers, another side still with promotion aspirations.

The outcome of all those results (and The Bantams' 2-1 victory over Brentford here on Friday night) is that if the worse comes to the worse, and Swindon win tonight, Bradford City will still have their own destiny in their own hands when they visit Hull City on Saturday. Looking at matters more positively, only a near impossible goal avalanche by Stockport or Chesterfield will deprive The Bantams of a play-off place if Swindon are beaten here tonight!

Having wrapped up the title last Tuesday, Swindon followed up with their thirteenth away win, at Shrewsbury, on Saturday. Kevin Horlock and Shaun Taylor netted for the Robins, while Darren Currie replied for the Shrews.

With one match to play, Oxford United have climbed into an automatic promotion place. Despite having Stuart Massey sent-off, Denis Smith's side collected a splendid 2-1 win at fellow contenders Crewe. Oxford took a 2-0 lead through Paul Moody and Joey Beauchamp before Steve Macauley replied late on for the Alex.

Blackpool dropped down to third spot after crashing 2-1 at home to Walsall. It was only the shaky Seasiders' fourth home defeat of the campaign. Fourth placed Notts. County maintained their outside chance of gaining promotion automatically with a 4-0 defeat of Swansea City at Meadow Lane. Jan Molby's side will join Hull and Brighton in the basement next season.

The one remaining relegation berth is between Carlisle United (one game left), who lost 4-0 at Wycombe on Saturday, and York City (3 games left including the replayed Brighton fixture). The Minstermen have a three point advantage and require just one point to send Mervyn Day's side down.

OUT & ABOUT

Swindon Town's fully deserved capture of the Second Division title caps a hectic four seasons for the Wiltshire club. It comes hard on the heels of two relegations which followed the club's one season first taste of top-flight football in 1993-94. In fact Swindon have changed Divisions six times in the last eleven seasons. That does not include 1989-90 when, under Ossie Ardiles' stewardship, they gained promotion to the old First Division via the play-offs only to be 'relegated' two flights because of financial irregularities. Then, finally placed back in the Second Division after an appeal.

However, Swindon have only been making up for lost time as, after being founder members of the Football League's Third Division (in 1920-21), it was not until their 36th campaign that they finally won their first promotion in 1962-63 (to the old Division Two). The Robins' first relegation came two years later and this term's promotion is their sixth, in contrast to five relegations (in 69 campaigns). Meanwhile Bradford City's changes of status have been a more evenly spaced six promotions and seven relegations (in the 81 seasons before this one). City won promotion to the top-flight at only their fifth attempt and only once have changed Divisions in successive seasons, when they fell straight back to the Fourth Division in 1977-78.

Swindon were involved in one of the most exciting games that I have ever attended when they threw away a 3-0 lead before beating Leicester City with a late penalty in the 1993 Play-Off Final for a place among the elite. That match was actually put in the shade by another 7 goal thriller in the equivalent Wembley final last season, when I witnessed Bolton edge out Reading. However, I hope the memories of both those nerve-wreckers will soon be usurped by another glorious Wembley occasion in a month's time, when Bradford City make it 7-7!

Whatever the result of tonight's match against Swindon - or, for that matter the last match at Hull City on Saturday - the fact that Bradford City have gone into the last week of the season on the verge of a play-off place reflects great credit on manager Chris Kamara and the players.

They have shown ambition and spirit in the last six weeks to put pressure on the teams above them as they gradually hauled themselves back into the top six.

On the other hand, Hull have had a miserable season and their relegation fate is already sealed.

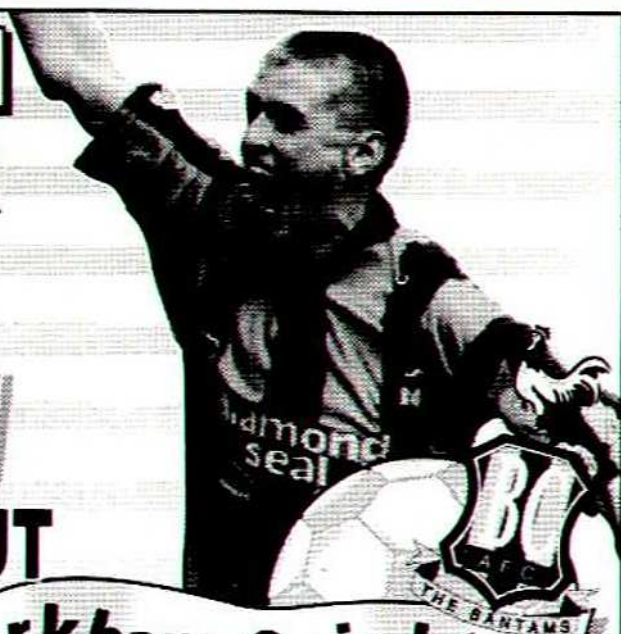

Tonight we welcome the divisional Champions to what is bound to be a passionate, noisy and tense Valley Parade; what we would give to be in Swindon's shoes, their season as good as over, the Championship in the bag and First Division football guaranteed. But at least our fate is in our own hands as victory tonight and at Hull on Saturday will ensure a play-off place.

If the matches against Chesterfield and Brentford are anything to go by then this evening will be another rollercoaster through every emotion possible. Against the Spirelites we came from a goal behind, whereas in the Brentford match we managed to miss two penalties, still go two up, concede late on and set-up a tense finish. But that's the beauty of the play-offs, from floundering in mid-table we've suddenly appeared on the rails to mount a challenge for a top six spot; rather this tension and anxiety than last season's dreary run-in watched by a disinterested few thousand.

Any sort of result tonight will spark a mass exodus down the M62 to Boothferry Park on Saturday. The City-Tigers derbies have always been fractious affairs, more so since Terry Dolan brought in a large number of ex-City players, however, the derbies have lacked the edge of the mid-eighties encounters. This season's match at Valley Parade epitomized the nineties meetings between the clubs: one sending off, a twenty one man punch up in the back of the Kop goal; a poor 1-1 draw; a few hundred fans from Humberside and a total attendance of only 5,830. Far removed from the heady days of 1984/85 when 15,000, which included around 4,000 travelling fans from Bradford, saw a keeperless City triumph 2-0 at a packed and passionate Boothferry Park. Doubtless a similar number will travel the hour or so down the motorway, they will probably be met by a near empty Boothferry Park as Hull are long relegated, however, I'm certain that Terry Dolan will have his men fired up to be the party poopers.

TRANSFER NEWS

It appears that Middlesbrough were visitors to Valley Parade on Friday night to watch Brentford full-back **Ijah Anderson**. Boro are also keen on Danish forward **Michael Beck**, who starred against Scotland recently. They will face competition from Glasgow Rangers for his signature. West Yorkshire neighbours Leeds United could be facing a difficult summer. It is reported that **Gary McAllister** will quit Leeds if the club does not spend in the close season, he is a target for Arsenal. This departure on top of probable exits of **Gary Speed** to Everton and **Tomas Brolin** to who knows where will concern Leeds supporters. However, £2m rated **Andy Booth** at Huddersfield is a possible target for Elland Road. Leeds also fancy **John Beresford** at Newcastle as a replacement for injury prone Tony Dorigo, but promoted Derby might have a say in things, as might the player, who prefers Sheffield United. Another Newcastle player under scrutiny is **Warren Barton** who interests Arsenal. Manchester City keeper **Andy Dibble** is being lined up for a move to Sheffield United to replace **Alan Kelly** who seems certain to join Everton. If Joe Royle at Everton does not get Gary Speed, expect a shock move for **Ian Woan** at Forest. Frank Clark is reluctant to sell but needs the money for a striker, which does not seem good news for **Kevin Campbell** who has disappointed since his arrival from Arsenal. If Crystal Palace make it back to the Premier League, Campbell may get an opportunity to move back to London. The confirmed relegation of Bolton and Q.P.R. will have alerted a number of clubs to the fact that **Alan Stubbs** at Bolton and **Trevor Sinclair** at Q.P.R. will not want Endsleigh League football next season. The quality of these relegated sides has been seen at times this season and is a benchmark as to where our visitors Swindon and hopefully The Bantams will need to aim next season. These are only two sides out of a number, such as Wolves, Sheffield United and Crystal Palace who may have strong financial clout in an attempt to gain the ultimate prize - promotion to the Premier League. Consolidation would suffice I think for Swindon or Bradford City.

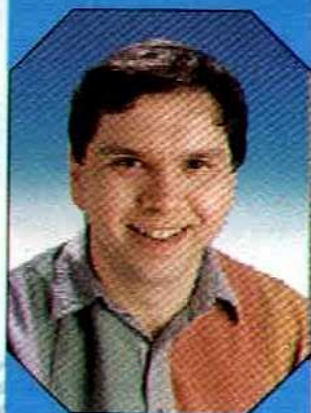

VISITORS ON VIEW

The Robins were formed in 1879 before turning professional in 1894, previously members of the Southern League, they were elected to Division Three in 1920 and found themselves in Division Three (South) from 1921 to 1958. What went on after 1958 hardly bears comparison to more recent events. It would be fair to say that the last ten seasons have been the most eventful in the club's history. Ten tortuous seasons in which Swindon moved up from the Third Division; won promotion to the old First Division in 1989-90 after beating Sunderland in the Play-Off Final before a Wembley crowd of 72,873 only to be demoted to the Second Division by the Football League for illegal payments to players; won promotion to the Premier League in 1992-93 only to drop back to their present position in Division Two in the last two successive seasons. That depressing run has ended this campaign with the claiming of the Second Division Championship. The role of honour before this latest triumph was a Division Four Championship in 1985-86 as well as a League Cup Final victory in 1968-69 (and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970).

Before tonight Swindon had lost only four out of forty-four games played and have the best defensive record in the division with thirty-three goals conceded. Huddersfield-born Wayne Allison is leading scorer in the League campaign with fifteen, he has been ably assisted by among others Steve Finney, Peter Thorne and of late Kevin Horlock. Success this season has seen The Robins as the best supported club in the division with an average attendance of 9,828 - compared to The Bantams' 5,416.

Steve McMahon (player-manager) - Appointed player-manager at the end of November, 1994 following John Gorman's departure. An associate schoolboy with Everton, he was deeply hurt when they overlooked him when handing out apprenticeships - but he battled back and soon impressed enough to make his League debut at Sunderland in August, 1980. He went on to register 11 goals in 100 League games for Everton before a £300,000 transfer to Aston Villa in the summer of 1983. By then Steve was a seasoned England U-21 international, having made his debut against the Republic of Ireland at Fratton Park in February, 1981 and he continued in the squad to be part of England's European U-21 Championship winning side in 1984. With Villa Steve proved to be a midfield general of the highest quality but his career in the Midlands was short lived as Kenny Dalglish splashed out £375,000 to land him in his first major deal for Liverpool in September, 1985. McMahon filled the position vacated by Graeme Souness and played his first game for Liverpool at Oxford. By the end of the season he had League and Cup medals to flaunt as Liverpool clinched the 'double'. Further trophies were added to his collection as Steve shared in Anfield's phenomenal success, while at international level Bobby Robson drafted him into the 1990 England World Cup squad as cover for Bryan Robson. He was capped 17 times. On Christmas Eve 1991 Manchester City paid £900,000 for his registration and until his move to Swindon, McMahon has continued to demonstrate his agility at the highest level.

Paul Bodin (defender) - Welsh international now in his second spell at The County Ground. Paul was initially signed from the now defunct Newport County for £25,000 in March, 1988. Three years later he was transferred to Crystal Palace for a fee of £550,000 but was unable to command a place at Selhurst Park and just ten months later he returned to Swindon.

Shaun Taylor (defender) - An ever-present in the team again last season for the second consecutive year. Shaun was signed from Exeter City in July, 1991 for £200,000. He came into professional football late, signing for The Grecians from Western League Bideford Town at the age of 23. He played 233 first team games for Exeter before he joined Swindon Town. He has signed a new contract which will keep him at The County Ground until 1997.

Mark Seagraves (defender) - Big strong central defender signed from Bolton Wanderers for £100,000 in June, 1995. Mark forms a solid defensive partnership with Shaun Taylor. A former Liverpool apprentice, Mark had a loan spell with Norwich City before a £100,000 move to Manchester City in 1986. In 1990 he moved to Burnden Park but was unable to command a place in last season's side who gained promotion to the Premiership.

Kevin Horlock (defender) - Northern Ireland full and U-21 international, Kevin was signed from West Ham United on a free transfer in the summer of 1992 and made his League debut in the 3-1 defeat at Portsmouth that year after injury sidelined regular full-back Paul Bodin.

Wayne O'Sullivan (defender) - Full-back Wayne made his debut for Swindon Town in an Anglo-Italian Cup tie against Oxford United at The Manor Ground in September, 1992. A former trainee with the club he made his League debut as substitute in the first game of the 1994-95 season at home to Port Vale and started a League game for the first time in the following 1-0 home win over Watford. Has since progressed and become a regular first team member and was selected for the Eire U-21 squad to play Latvia in Galway in October, 1995.

Frank Talia (goalkeeper) - Blackburn Rovers signed Frank from Sunshine George Cross in Australia during 1992 and spent some time on loan at Hartlepool that season making 15 appearances. Unable to break into the first team at Ewood Park, Frank signed for Swindon in November, 1995 having spent a month on loan earlier in the season.

Alex Smith (defender) - Signed on a free transfer from Everton in January, 1996 where he was a former trainee. Whilst he had not played in the Premiership Alex has played in Everton's European Cup Winners' Cup campaign this season.

Mark Robinson (defender) - Signed as an apprentice for West Bromwich Albion on leaving school in June, 1985 and made his Football League debut against Sheffield Wednesday in April, 1986. Surprisingly he was not offered a contract at the end of his apprenticeship and was picked up by Barnsley but had to wait until 1989 before earning an extended run in the first team. In March, 1993 he was transferred to Newcastle United for £450,000 but injury and the vast squad at St. James' Park prevented Mark from getting an extended first team run. In July, 1994 he moved to Wiltshire for a then Swindon Town club record of £600,000.

Martin Ling (midfielder) - A former Exeter City apprentice, Martin is another in his second spell at The County Ground. He initially signed for £25,000 in July, 1986 but just 93 days later he was on the move to Southend United where he made 138 League appearances, scoring 31 goals. Whilst at Roots Hall he spent some time on loan to Mansfield Town and indeed at The County Ground. In the summer of 1991 Glenn Hoddle acquired his services for a mere £15,000.

Lee Collins (midfielder) - Signed in November, 1995 for a fee of £15,000 from Scottish Division Three side Albion Rovers after impressing in trial games for Swindon Town reserves. Made his first team debut in the Auto Windscreens Shield defeat by Hereford United at The County Ground at the end of November.

John Drysdale (defender) - A former England Youth international Jason signed in at The County Ground on transfer deadline day in 1995 for a fee of £340,000 from Newcastle United. A former trainee with Watford where he won an F.A. Youth Cup winners' medal. Jason made 160 appearances for The Hornets scoring 13 goals once he signed professional forms in September, 1988. A fee of £425,000 in August, 1994 took him to Newcastle United but after less than seven months at St. James' Park Jason joined Swindon having not been able to command a first team place.

Paul Allen (midfield) - One of the renowned footballing Allen family, Paul was signed by Swindon Town on a free transfer in October, 1995 having been released from Southampton. Previously with West Ham United with whom he signed as an apprentice in August, 1979 and went on to make 197 appearances, scoring 11 goals. In June, 1985 a £400,000 move took him across London to White Hart Lane where he made 377 appearances for Spurs scoring 28 goals. In September, 1993 he transferred to Southampton for a fee of £550,000 but with the departure of manager Ian Branfoot, Paul was only to make 43 appearances for the Saints. During his time at The Dell he went on loan to Luton Town and Stoke City. Paul is an England 'B', U-21 and Youth international.

Ian Culverhouse (defender) - Signed from Norwich City at the end of December, 1994 for a fee of £250,000 decided by a Football League tribunal after Norwich's request of £900,000 was turned down by Swindon. Ian was a former apprentice at Tottenham Hotspur before turning professional and making his League debut as a substitute at Notts. County in October, 1985 for £50,000. He featured in The Canaries UEFA Cup successes last season but was unable to agree new terms at Carrow Road.

Wayne Allison (forward) - A Football League tribunal decided that Swindon had to pay £475,000 for the registration of Wayne from local rivals Bristol City, for whom he was top scorer last season, in July, 1995. Born in Huddersfield, Wayne started his career as an apprentice at Halifax Town before moving to Watford for £250,000 in July, 1989. The following year a £300,000 deal took him to Ashton Gate where he became a firm favourite with the fans.

Steve Finney (forward) - Manager Steve McMahon knew of Steve when they were both at Manchester City and took Finney on a free transfer from Maine Road during the summer. He scored his first goal for Swindon on the club's pre-season tour of Finland. Following an injury to Peter Thorne, Steve was given an unexpected run in the first team at the beginning of this season.

Peter Thorne (forward) - Young striker signed from Blackburn Rovers for an undisclosed fee in January, 1995. Was signed on as a trainee player at Ewood Park in July, 1989 before progressing to the professional ranks in the 1991 close season. First team opportunities were restricted because of the form of the likes of Alan Shearer, Chris Sutton and Mike Newell and Peter relished the chance of a move to Swindon with the opportunity of regular action. His only first team appearance for Blackburn was when he came on as substitute in the Charity Shield at Wembley against Manchester United.

Steven Cowe - This Gloucester-born twenty-one year old signed permanently from Aston Villa in a £100,000 deal during transfer deadline week. The midfielder did not get a first team opportunity at Villa Park where his career started as a trainee.

David Preece - This influential midfield player joined on loan from Derby County last month. His career started as an apprentice at Walsall in 1980 and he went on to make over 100 appearances for them before signing for Luton in 1984. Almost 400 games later he moved on to Derby but had limited opportunities under Jim Smith, this led to the loan move to The Robins. A tenacious ball-winner, David operates mainly down the left side. An excellent passer of the ball.

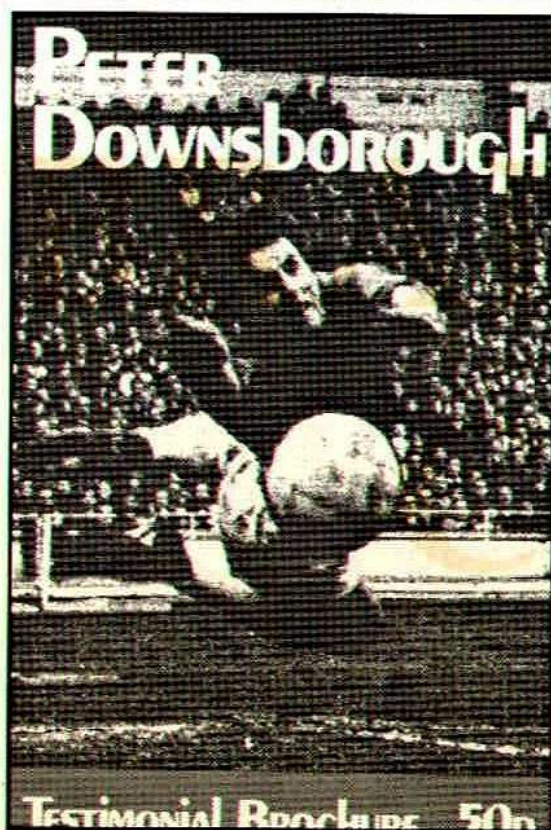

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH TESTIMONIAL - 16th MAY, 1980



If there is a former player held in equal affection by both City and Swindon fans it has to be Peter Downsborough. Halifax-born Downsborough made a total of 650 League appearances including 148 for Halifax Town, 274 for Swindon, 3 for Brighton (on loan) and 225 for City between 1973 and 1979. He was the hero of Swindon's League Cup victory over Arsenal in 1969 but is also well remembered for his part in City's F.A. Cup run 20 years ago that took The Paraders as far as the sixth round. Peter Downsborough was also a hero of City's promotion winning team of 1977. His testimonial against Huddersfield in May, 1980 came shortly after City had narrowly missed promotion following defeat in the last game of the season; the disappointment of a bad day in Peterborough probably accounted for why only 1,026 attended Peter's benefit game.

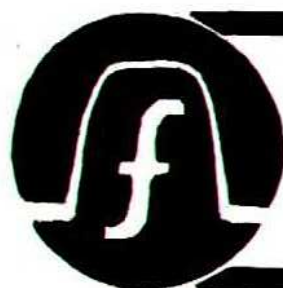

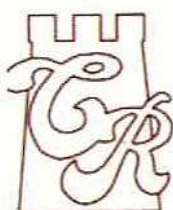
PROGRAMMES FROM THE PAST

BRADFORD CITY 2 v SWINDON TOWN 1 - Division Three - 22nd October, 1960

Swindon Town visit The Pulse Stadium at Valley Parade today in a strong position in the League table. In contrast, back in season 1960-61 both City and Town were struggling in the lower half of the table. Town eventually finished in 16th position on 43 points but City were unable to avoid relegation finishing third from bottom on 36 points, four points short of safety. City did manage to beat Town 2-1 with goals from David Jackson and Webb, Cliff Jackson replying for Town.

Swindon had some names in their line-up which became well known in football circles. Mike Summerbee being the most famous and his exploits with Bell, Lee and Co. at Manchester City in the late sixties and early seventies helped bring many cups into the Maine Road trophy cabinet. David 'Bronco' Layne was centre forward and he later became a firm favourite at Valley Parade. John Trollope was a 17 year old full-back and became one of Swindon's most consistent performers playing in no less than 770 League games between 1960 and 1980. Also playing in only his second League campaign and still a teenager was Ernie Hunt who later played many times for Coventry City.
