The former Arsenal number two decided to accept the job of getting Rangers back into the top flight to end weeks of speculation as to who was going to be Ray Wilkins' successor.

Good luck to Stewart but I'm afraid we're not that keen on him making a winning start to his new career.

Rovers run over

After three successive defeats, Swindon

returned to winning form last Saturday with a comfortable 2-1 triumph over Tranmere Rovers.

Mark Walters set the wheels in motion with a first half penalty after he had been bundled over in the box. His spot kick opened his goal-scoring account for the Club and we hope there are many more to follow.

A 76th minute strike by Kevin Horlock - his first of the campaign - put the issue beyond doubt and although that old war horse John Aldridge pegged one back, it was too little too late for the visitors.

New signing at Swindon

Everyone at the Club would like to welcome former Wimbledon player Gary Elkins on board.

The 30 year old defender signed a three year contract on Monday with the fee being £80,000.

"Gary is an exceptional player with a great left foot. I tried to get him last year so I am very pleased we have finally managed to sign him," said Town boss Steve McMahon.


Elkins isn't cup tied so we could well get our first glimpse of him tonight - keep your eyes peeled!


> Tonight's match is the first of three in a row against QPR. This sort of thing always seems to happen when you get drawn in the Cup against the team you are playing in the League.

This evening we welcome the players, supporters and staff of a Queens Park Rangers side with whom we are going to become very well acquainted in the next few days.

Tonight's meeting will be the first of three games in a week against our west London visitors - we travel to Loftus Road on Saturday in the Nationwide League, and we are there again next Wednesday night in the second leg of today's competition.

Rangers, of course, have undergone their fair share of turmoil in the last couple of weeks, following the surprise resignation of manager Ray Wilkins.

Despite taking the Superhoops to relegation last season, Wilkins had fashioned an attractive passing side at Loftus Road and there were signs that things were starting to turn round for him after a promising start to the new campaign. But Wilkins decided

that he had

had enough, and walked away from the post, leaving assistant Frank Sibley in charge on a caretaker basis.

Earlier this week Stewart Houston took over as manager to end weeks of speculation regarding the vacant job at Loftus Road.

QPR will be without the services of their highly-rated England U21 star striker Kevin Gallen for most of the season, after recent tests showed a severe cruciate ligament problem for the youngster.

On the positive side, the Club have managed to hold onto their brightest jewel, striker Trevor Sinclair, who has been the subject of envious glances from many Premiership admirers.

Having come down from the FA Premiership last season, QPR were not involved in the last round of the Coca-Cola Cup.

Having spent six months out of action with glandular fever, highly-rated midfielder Nigel Quashie will be keen to get his career back on track this season.

The slightly-built youngster made his first appearance since March when he played in the 2-1 League defeat at home to Bolton a couple of weeks ago and he is anxious to build on the good work he put in during 1995/96.

Having signed professional just two weeks after his 17th birthday in August 1995, Nigel was one of the few plus points to come out of last season for QPR supporters, particularly so as he was a product of the Club's impressive Youth set-up.

A stylish central midfielder who loves to push forward with the ball at his feet, he served notice of a bright future with an outstanding debut against Manchester United at Old Trafford and also a quite superb goal against Chelsea in the Fourth Round of the FA Cup.

That strike made Quashie the second youngest player ever to score in the FA Cup proper, and he ended the campaign with two goals in 13 League and Cup appearances.

Schooled in the midfield arts by Ray Wilkins, it should come as little surprise that the impressive young Quashie



is comfortable on the ball and is always able to spot an opening and finds it with a telling pass.

His return to the firstteam fold is a bonus indeed for Rangers, at a time when some good news is badly needed.

Following the recent departure of Ray Wilkins, Queens Park Rangers, who are currently sitting in sixth place in the First Division, have appointed Stewart Houston to lead their battle to regain Premiership status following last season's relegation dogfight.

Houston has experienced the highs and lows of top level management taking over as caretaker manager of Arsenal twice in two seasons. The departure of George Graham two seasons ago and more recently Bruce Rioch leaving, the Gunners' were looking to Houston (No.2) to keep the ship afloat.

So it is to tonight's Coca-Cola Cup tie that Houston will be looking to begin his managerial career on the right note, with his bright Queens Park Rangers outfit hoping to secure victory and give them the advantage in the second leg at Loftus Road.

Within days he will face stern opposition in the league when Swindon's red army come to town!

DESTABLE PARK RANGERS OF THE PARK RANGERS

Now established as QPR's first choice goalkeeper, United States International WERGEN SOMMER was signed from Luton Town for a fee of £625,000 in August 1995 and at 6ft 5in forms an imposing barrier.

His deputy is the popular Welsh cap

ONLY ROSENTS, who progressed through the
junior ranks at Loftus Road to sign professional in
July 1987. He has found his first-team chances
limited since his debut in December 1987, thanks
mainly to the high quality of other 'keepers
at the Club.

SIEB DYKSTRA is a Dutch 'keeper who signed from Motherwell in July 1994, but has yet to really establish himself at Loftus Road.

As you would expect from a side only recently relegated from the Premiership, QPR can boast a wealth of quality performers in their line-up, not least former England full-back

parties BARDSTEY (2 caps). A consistent performer who loves to get forward on the overlap, David moved to Loftus Road from Oxford in September 1989, for a fee of £500,000, and also played for Watford in the 1984 FA Cup Final.

trainee who signed professional in July 1994 and made his senior debut in the Coca-Cola Cup in October 1995 - and was voted Man of the Match.

Having spent several years in the shadow of Clive Wilson - now Tottenham -

RUFUS BREVETT

established himself as the Club's regular leftback in 1995/96. He began with Doncaster Rovers and moved to West London in February 1991, with the Superhoops paying £250,000 for his services. Fast approaching 100 senior games, Rufus' only goal for the Club came in a 3-0 win over Southampton in March of this year.

His main rival for the left-back spot comes from former Club trainee **REVOR** CHALLES**, who signed professional in July 1994. Has only played a handful of first-team games at Loftus Road - but did enough to impress the England set-up, as he won two U21 caps during last summer's Toulon Tournament in France.

Rangers' longest serving player, and the Club Captain, is the hugely experienced Northern Ireland International ALAM MCDONALD.

Alan has been with the Club since turning pro in August 1981, although ironically he made his League debut during a spell on loan at Charlton in April 1983.

Regarded as one of the best man markers in the game, was snapped up on a free transfer from Tottenham in July 1987 and has now fully recovered from a nasty foot injury that for a time threatened to finish his career.

CHRIS PLUMMER has the unusual distinction of having made his England U21 debut before he ever played a senior game for his Club. Prior to this season Chris had made one first-team appearance for Rangers - as sub v Nottm Forest

 but had five U21 caps to his credit. With a record like that, this young defender is sure to have bright future.

Welsh 'B' International

KARL READY is a versatile defender
who can play in central defence or either
of the full-back positions. He is a former
apprentice with the Club.

Player's Player of the Year for 1995/96 was central defender or right-back

signed for £650,000 from Bristol Rovers in August 1993. He has only every scored one League goal and that came against Aston Villa in January 1995.



PLAYERPROFILE

ERICSSON

Not surprisingly for a side recently managed by Ray Wilkins, QPR show a degree of class in the midfield area, where MANAGE is a regular performer. Simon began life at Blackburn before moving to Loftus Road in £400,000 deal in the summer of 1988.

ANDY MEDERMOTT

is a product of the fruitful Australian Institute of Sport, and he signed for Rangers in August 1995 after spending the pre-season training with the Club. He has yet to establish himself in the first-team, but at just 19-years-old he has time on his side.

May 1996 saw the signing of highly-rated Carlisle midfielder MAN MURRAY for an initial fee of £300,000, although that could rise to £750,000 depending on appearances.

Only 17-years-old, MARK PERRY is a former Club apprentice who is expected to go far by the Loftus Road coaching staff. Mark was invited to assist with the Full England squad twice last season, and he has been predicted a bright future.

It is up front where QPR look, on paper at least, to be at their best, even without the services of the injured Kevin Gallen or Mark Hateley, who is currently on loan at Leeds United.

In DANIELLE DICHIO

they have a former England Schools star who came through the ranks at Loftus Road to make his debut in October 1994. A loan spell at Welling Utd, where he scored four times in his first

match, did enough to convince Rangers he was a stunning prospect and he proved them right by finishing as top scorer in 1995/96 with 13 goals. ANDY IMPEY was snapped up from non-League Yeading in June 1990 for a bargain fee of £35,000, after a non-stop display in the FA Vase Final at Wembley impressed watching QPR scouts. An established U21 star, Andy was rewarded for his dangerous wing play with a call-up to an England squad training weekend recently.

The man that many were surprised to see still at Loftus Road at the start of this season was

TREVOR SINCLAIR,

sure to be one of the First Division's leading lights this season.

A £750,000 signing from Blackpool, Trevor's skill on the ball and eye for goal have marked him out as a real hot property and he was recently included in the Full England squad. Voted

supporters' Player of the Year for 1995/96, Sinclair could well hold the key to Rangers' season.

Frustrated by a lack of progress at Spurs, 20-year-old striker

STEVE SLADE moved across
London during the summer to join QPR for a tribunal set fee of £250,000. An England U21 International, Slade scored twice in four games

during last summer's Toulon Tournament.

Other front men for the R's include:

LEE CHARLES, signed from non-League Chertsey Town after scoring a hattrick v QPR Reserves, former trainee

MARK GRAHAM

- a Northern Ireland 'B' International - and the elaborately-named WICHAEL WANONEY-IOHNSON, also a former YTS at the Club.




The time the goals went in for QPR at both ends last season.

Dick Mattick looks back ...

When Swindon Town met Queens Park Rangers in the third round of the FA Cup in the 1970/71 season, to say that a crowd of 14,840 saw the game would be a slight exaggeration!



The timing seems wrong this time as the Dons have just hit form. The Pompey chimes should be silenced.




























neighbours Reading where they fought out a 3-3 draw.


















Winning Ways By Dave Hollister







Cowe, who celebrates his 22nd birthday later this month, moved to the County Ground on transfer deadline day last March for £100,000.




He wasn't part of the squad early on but was drafted in for the 1-0 win over Oldham Athletic and since then has struck twice to give his early season confidence a boost.


With a quarter of an hour remaining Kerie Garwood added a fourth for Town to secure the points. This was a much better performance and it was good to get the first win in the higher Division.

In 1920 they were again relegated to re-enter the following season via the newly formed Division Three (North). More recently they were relegated from the old Division Four into the Vauxhall Conference but as in every previous instance sprang straight back this time as Vauxhall Conference Champions in season 1987-88.

OnyerBarrow

When Barrow played Gillingham on October 9, 1961 in a Division Four match, the game was abandoned in the 75th minute due to bad light. The Gillingham team had been late arriving after missing their train before hiring a charter

plane to fulfil the fixture. The Gills were anxious for the game to be replayed but the result at the time of abandonment was ordered to stand by the Football League and Barrow won the match 7-0!

September 5, 1885 was a blistering day in the Scottish FA Cup. Dundee Harps set an alltime British record score of 35-0 by beating Aberdeen Rovers. That was until news broke through on the very same day that Arbroath had beaten Bon Accord 36-0. Excellent scores for both sides but commiserations for Dundee who after 90 minutes must have felt their scoreline would be a record for years to come! The highest individual score in one match in first class football is J. Petrie who scored 13 for Arbroath when they beat Bon Accord.




