

It is good to be back on home territory after our recent away day marathon and Steve McMahon's men are keen to repeat the performance they gave when they were last here at the County Ground.

The 3-0 verdict over Barnsley included a rare header from Mark Walters, a bullet of a shot from Ty Gooden and a poachers special by Steve Finney.

And a replay of that impressive display should be enough to send the Royals back down the M4 empty handed.

However the Berkshire side have picked up some useful results of late including a 2-1 triumph over QPR last Saturday followed by a 0-0 home draw with Birmingham City on Tuesday night.

But by all accounts it was a bit of a bore draw with the highlight being a streaker racing across the pitch.

#### No Joy on our travles

Tuesday night's 2-0 defeat at Sheffield United left us pointless from our three most recent away trips.

Gareth Taylor's sixth minute strike knocked us back and a second half goal by Petr Katchouro sealed the points.

Paul Furlong struck the only goal of the game in our 1-0 defeat at Birmingham City last Saturday.

Northern Ireland International Kevin Horlock went close to levelling twice with well taken free kicks but the woodwork and Steve Sutton denied him.

It was a case of too little too late at Ipswich last week as Town tumbled to a 3-2 reverse at Portman Road.

Poor defending allowed Ipswich to race into a 3-0 lead with goals from James Scowcroft, Gerry Creaney and Steve Sedgley (penalty).

Mark Walters missed a spot kick before Peter Thorne and Wayne Allison found the net to make the final scoreline more respectable.

#### David signs on loan


Welcome back to David Kerslake who has rejoined Swindon on a month's loan from Tottenham Hotspur.



## the manager Steve McMahon says



Having lost three games in a row away from home you have to start asking questions about the character of some of the players here.

It's ok winning at home but you have to pick up results away as well and recently we have not been performing particularly well on our travels.

We have not been defending properly. Take the game at Ipswich for example. We conceded a goal after 23 seconds - and we had the kick-off!

Then on Tuesday at Sheffield United we fell behind in the sixth minute. It is just not good enough because straight away we were chasing the game again.

At Birmingham our defending wasn't much better and overall we just didn't seem to have the self belief which I find very difficult to understand when we have beaten the likes of Barnsley and Manchester City.

Of course our cause hasn't been helped by injuries and unavailabilities. We've missed the likes of Mark Seagraves, Frederic Darras and lan Culverhouse but it really isn't an excuse for the way we have played.

On the other hand I've been pleased with the way David Kerslake has settled in. He was arguably our best player at Sheffield and his experience will be a great help during his loan spell here. He's done a terrific job but as far as signing him on a more permanent basis is concerned we'll just have to wait and see how things progress.

Finances dictate that we have to be careful but perhaps we'll be able to do some deals on the transfer market - it's a matter of sitting tight and seeing what happens.

Talking of deals, over the past few weeks we have been trying to get several players to sign extended contracts to keep them here for the foreseeable future.

It is unfortunate that some players have refused to make a decision but we can't sit around and wait for them to make their minds up.

There is no more money


available and when it comes to it, no player is bigger than the Club - it is up to them.


Enough of that, this afternoon we have got to regroup and it will be a case of all hands to the pump against a Reading team who have had a good run of late.

It will be a very difficult game against Jimmy Quinn and Mick Gooding's side, particularly after our three successive defeats.

Earlier in the season we lost 2-0 at Elm Park but today it is not simply a case of gaining revengeit's about getting our form back.

## today's visitors

READING F.C.

The 1996/97 campaign hasn't been the best of times for Reading so far - although Royals fans will be keen to remind us of a certain 2-0 victory they secured at Elm Park on October 26th.

Swindon, of course, were the victims that day and the Royals will be keen for a repeat of that scoreline this afternoon as they bid to climb away from relegation worries near the foot of the Division One table.

Man of the moment for Berkshire's finest is former West Ham and Manchester City striker Trevor Morley, who has found the net eight times in the League at the time of writing, and is by some distance the Royals' top scorer this term.

Morley grabbed both goals in that 'derby' game of a few weeks ago including one from the penalty spot - and it is good to see the popular forward back to his best after a horrific skull injury which threatened to prematurely finish his career last season.

Elsewhere, the Royals have mixed good, bad

and indifferent in equal measure this season On the

plus side they have

scored memorable victories over Sheffield United, Manchester City, Wolves and in-form Oxford United; while on the indifferent they could only manage draws at the likes of Grimsby and Oldham.

They have had a couple of big shocks,

too, with a 5-2 defeat at Ipswich - albeit after the dismissal of goalkeeper Bobby Mihailov for a professional foul - followed by a comprehensive 6-1 hammering at Crystal Palace.

Their biggest problem - Morley apart - has been in scoring goals, with their prolific ex-Swindon star Jimmy Quinn often restricting himself to the subs bench these days.

Two years ago, Quinn and his management partner Gooding guided Reading to second place in the First Division - only missing out on promotion after a heart-

breaking Wembley Play-Off Final.



## a closer lookat

When Reading signed Bulgarian international goalkeeper Borislav ('Bobby') Mihailov at the beginning of the 1995/96 season there was a rumour doing the rounds that the popular number one had seen a video of

Reading's Play-Off Final appearance against Bolton, and thought that Wembley was the Royals' home ground!

It is, of course, an apocryphal tale. Mihailov who won his 97th international cap during Euro 96 - watched his new team-mates in action at Portsmouth before becoming this country's second Bulgarian import, behind ex-lpswich Town player Bontcho Guentchey, now at Luton. At the time of his signing, Bobby's fee made him Reading's most expensive ever player, but a

series of back and hamstring injuries restricted him to just 17 senior games last season.

A world class custodian, Bobby captained his country against England at Wembley during the 1995/96 campaign and has proved himself to be one of the First Division's leading stoppers.

He is known as 'wiggy' due to the hairpiece he wears during games.

and although last year saw the Royals slide out of the reckoning early on, there were still positive signs to give hope for the current campaign.

Reading may have narrowly missed out on promotion two seasons ago, avoided

relegation by an equally slender margin last term and seen a steady trickle of leading players leaving the Club, but in Mick Gooding and Jimmy Quinn they can boast a management pair

that give their all on and off the field.

The experienced double act guided the Royals to second spot in 1994/95s final table, before a heart-breaking Play-Off Final defeat at the hands of Bolton denied them promotion, Mick Gooding had done the rounds as a

journeyman lower division player with Rotherham

(twice), Chesterfield and Peterborough before joining Wolves in 1988.

After 44 games with the Molineux Club, Gooding joined Reading for £50,000 in December 1989. A tireless midfielder or full-back, he won the Club's Player of the Year award for the third time in five years last season.

> Alongside Gooding in the manager's office - and on the pitch - at Elm Park is 36-year-old Northern Ireland international and former County Ground favourite Jimmy Quinn.

A prolific goalscorer throughout his 15-year professional career, Quinn had spells with Swindon (twice), Blackburn, Leicester, Bradford, West Ham and Bournemouth before joining the Royals for £55,000 in July 1992.

## playerprofile

#### READING FOOTBALL CLUB

Understudy to Bulgarian International Bobby Mihailov is former County Ground favourite **NICKY HAMMOND**, who followed a spell on loan last season with signing permanently for the Elm Park club for £40,000 in January 1996. Reading's goalkeeper injury curse struck Hammond low soon after arrival at the Club, however, and the former Swindon man underwent cartilage surgery on his back during the summer having missed the final three months of last season.

Australian International **ANDY BERNAL** is currently enjoying his second spell in English football, having moved to Elm Park from Sydney Olympic in July 1994. Bernal had previously spent three seasons at Ipswich Town in the late 1980s and endured a rocky spell earlier this season when he was sent-off twice in three games.

There is a familiar face at left-back, where former Swindon man **PAUL BODIN** is playing following his summer transfer from the County Ground. A Welsh International. Bodin signed on a free transfer after helping guide the Robins to the 1995/96 Second Division title.

JEFF HOPKINS is another Welsh star (16 caps) who joined Reading from Crystal Palace, after a brief spell on loan at Bristol Rovers.

A powerful central defender, Hopkins skippered the side during the Division Two title win in 1993/94.

Former Coventry player MARTYN BOOTY

signed from Crewe last season and has looked a sound performer in the right-back slot while central defender

**KEITH McPHERSON** is an ex-Club captain who cost £100,000 from Northampton in the summer of 1990.

Young **STEVE SWALES** is a pacey full-back who was signed

for £70,000 from Scarborough in July 1995 and the exotically named **DARIUSZ WDOWCZYK** is a Polish international, and former national captain, who came on a free from Celtic in Aug '94.

Solid central defender **BARRY HUNTER** was appointed the new Club captain after joining from Wrexham in July for a fee of £400,000. He is the nephew of former lpswich and Northern Ireland star Allan Hunter and has recovered well from two broken legs earlier in his career.

Midfielder **DAVID BASS** is a youngster who missed much of 1994/95 with cruciate damage, but is tipped for a bright future by the Reading coaching staff.

#### DEREK SIMPSON

is another young player to have progressed up through the ranks at Elm Park.

Joint Player/Manager MICK GOODING -

'Player of the Year' for 1995/96 - is a powerful central midfield force, as is the all-action

PHIL PARKINSON

who signed from Bury for £37,500 in July 1992 and went on to help the Royals in their 1993/94 Division Two Championship success.

A recent capture, and the Club's record signing at £700,000, is the talented midfield playmaker **DARREN CASKEY**, who joined the

club from Tottenham at the tail end of February.

PAUL HOLSGROVE is a well-travelled midfielder who joined Reading on a free transfer from Millwall in August 1994 and has also had spells at Aldershot, Wimbledon, West Brom and Luton.

## PLAYERPROFILE

**ANDY FREEMAN** joined the Royals from the Palace during the second year of his YTS contract at Selhurst Park and made one subs appearance last term.

Highly-rated 21-year-old **ALAN CAREY** is a striker who has scored a pile of goals for the Youth and Reserve sides at Elm Park and is sure to make a big impact when he finally holds down a regular first-team spot. Injury wrecked the 1995/96 campaign for him.

**MICHAEL GILKES** has played in defence, midfield and up front for the Royals during his 12 seasons with the Club and has established himself as a great crowd favourite. Highly skilful, with tremendous pace, Gilkes had spells on loan at Southampton and Chelsea in 1991/92.

Third top scorer last season - with nine goals in all competitions - was Aussieborn **STUART LOVELL**, who is a product of the Club's fruitful Youth policy. Still only 24, he has had trials for the Australian national side.



## abrief look Dack

Dick Mattick looks back ...

The 1957/58 campaign was a critical one for clubs in the old Third Division South for at the end of the season the teams finishing second to 12th would form a new nation wide Third Division, with the bottom 12 becoming a Fourth Division.

Having finished 24th in 1955 and 23rd in 1956/57, Swindon seemed prime candidates for the latter, but when they travelled to Elm Park at the end of March

seeking revenge against the team which had knocked them out of the FA Cup that season, the Robins were high up the table and had an outside chance of promotion.

The improvement in form had brought manager Bert Head recognition and his name was being linked with a managerial vacancy at Newcastle.

In his Advertiser report, R.C.E.

described Town's 4-0 victory as; "every bit as convincing as the margin suggests."

All the goals came in the first half with Andy Micklewright deputising for the injured John Richards (who finished the season as Town's leading scorer with 16 league goals) shooting home from a difficult angle after 15 minutes.

Two people later to become successful as a painter and decorator, and physiotherapist in the Town, combined for Swindon's second goal, when

Bert Head's first signing Arnold Darcy centred for Johnny Skull to push home.


Swindon put the game out of Reading's reach in the minutes before half time with Andy Micklewright heading his second goal and then Jim Kelly just getting an outstretched foot to the ball in a chase with a defender.

Despite left back Ray Reeves and centre forward and leading scorer Tommy Dixon swopping positions, Reading failed to reply in the second half although they programme for the Reading team from which I do not know if there were any changes.

Probably due to the extensive reporting of Saturday matches in the Football Pink, the teams were not given in the Advertiser, so I have had to rely on the





Reading, like ourselves were in action on Tuesday evening when they played hosts to a Birmingham City side looking for their fourth win in five games.

It was £1.5 million striker Paul Furlong who put the skids under us last Saturday when he snatched the only goal of the game at St. Andrews' and City's third win in four games lifted them into 10th place in the table, equal with us on 26 points with a game in hand.

These are tough times for Town. Birmingham last Saturday, Bramall Lane on Tuesday and next Charlton, then Stoke City away. Reading is our only home game in a sequence of five and consequently a victory would be well appreciated to help keep us in touch.

Today we complete our derby double with the Royals having lost 2-0 at Elm Park just over a month ago. It is the only local derby game in Division One on this the last day of November.

There are some smashing games in prospect around the country however with league leaders **Bolton** at home to third placed **Barnsley** as good as any.

The Trotters have only slipped up twice at home, the last being a draw with *Crystal Palace*, while the Tykes have lost only once on their travels here at the County Ground.

It has the hallmarks of a draw though surely **Bolton** must be

due a win.

Just how unpredictable the First Division is this season was illustrated by *Crystal Palace* last week.

Having carved out a glorious 2-2 draw with *Bolton* at Burnden Park a fortnight ago, thanks to midfielder David Hopkin who scored his 12th goal of the season, they then lost 3-2 at home to *Wolves*.

Palace were two down, got back to 2-2, then lost to a 61st minute winner inflicted by a former player, Geoff Thomas! Ouch, that hurt, but surely this afternoon Dave Bassett's team will overcome the icy blasts from the North Sea at bottom of the table Grimsby Town at Cleethorpes to re-establish their promotion credentials.

The Selhurst Park mob are the top guns away from home with 22 goals and here they are up against the leakiest defence in the Division, the Mariners having conceded 39 goals prior to Tuesday's trip to *Charlton*, 20 of them on home soil. It looks all too easy doesn't it? An away banker that surely will come unstuck. Must be a draw.

Over in East Anglia, Norwich City are beginning to slip. A combination of lost points at home and postponed games the problem. Sunday's match at West Brom lost to the weather. Held at home by both Southend United and more recently Reading (former Town striker Keith Scott scored the equaliser) the Canaries have dropped too many home points with five games drawn and one lost and must really bounce back with a victory over Birmingham City today. I fancy them to do just that.

Talking of the unpredictable,

what about *Ipswich Town*? You can't rule them out even this afternoon at Prenton Park where *Tranmere Rovers* have scored plenty and let in lots. Could be an early goal here too.

The Suffolk side scored against us in 25 seconds and were one down to *Port Vale* inside 66 seconds last Saturday before bouncing back 2-1.

The opening two minutes could be a nightmare for both goalkeepers.

What then of *Wolves*? They play tomorrow but despite that 3-2 win at Selhurst Park, you can't back them as they are at home to *Manchester City*. It is not the Maine Road club that fills you with doubt, their recent record hardly impresses anyone, it is the fact the game is at Molineux. You see *Wolves* are experiencing a similar run to that which we enjoyed last season. Remarkably good away form, disappointingly average at home.

Wolves have lost only once away and won six. But home fans have only had two wins to cheer all season with five defeats and three draws testing their resolve to the full. You might say Steve Bull and his colleagues are due another Molineux victory - but can you be sure?

Lou Macari has followed in Steve McMahon's footsteps by hiring the services of a former player on loan. Striker Mark Stein has rejoined Stoke from Chelsea where most of his shots appeared to be blank. Stein gets a chance to fire some real bullets at Portsmouth where Stoke might find the going a bit rough.

**Sheffield United** will certainly be in good heart at Loftus Road where they play QPR.














Chris Collins was outstanding at the heart of the defence.


The Under 13's are getting a tremendous team spirit going and that spirit helped see them to a convincing 5-1 victory at Braydon Forest.

As I am sure you are all well aware, skipper Mark

Seagraves was injured during the match at

Birmingham City last Saturday and will now subsequently miss the next four weeks after damaging the meniscus, more commonly referred to as cartilage in his right knee.



The cartilages act as buffers between the bones that make up the knee joint and can be damaged by pressure from these bones when an abnormal force twists the bones against each other. This is exactly what happened


to Mark at St. Andrews and on Wednesday he underwent a cartilage operation known as a menisectomy to remove the torn fragment of cartilage at the Ridgeway Hospital.

The torn cartilage has to be removed surgically as it will not heal or mend itself naturally.

This is performed arthroscopically, looking into the knee with a small periscope camera while

Mark is under anaesthetic.

We do not envisage any further complications and we hope Mark will return to the squad early next year.

Kevin Horlock was brought on as a substitute and went on to make 32 (6) appearances in the Premiership but the only ones left on our staff today from that initial starting line-up, just 39 months ago, are Fraser Digby, who played on Tuesday night and Ross MacLaren who was involved but as a member of the coaching staff now.

So where are they all?
Where have they gone? Nicky
Summerbee of course is with
Manchester City and is looking
up at us these days. Luc Nijholt
went back to Holland last year
after losing his place in Steve
McMahon's team. Shaun Taylor,
as you know, moved down the
road to Bristol City earlier this
season and is doing well.

Adrian Whitbread, who we secured as a promising young defender from Leyton Orient, has not enjoyed much success since leaving us for West Ham United in August 1994 in a deal which brought us in £300,000 plus Joey Beauchamp.

Adrian, languishing in the stiffs, is looking for a move having only made a handful of games for the Hammers since he went to Upton Park.

He thought he would be the natural successor to Alvin Martin but now finds himself in the shadows of foreign imports Slaven Bilic and Marc Rieper.

John Moncur is also with the Hammers and doing well though he has missed much of the season through injury. John left us in June 1994 for £850,000 and likes it in the East End. Glenn Hoddle tried to sign him for Chelsea but he turned the move down.

Martin Ling was released by Steve McMahon last summer on a free transfer and is now pulling the strings in Leyton Orient's midfield in Division Three. Craig Maskell, a former topshot with Reading before us, went back to the Dell but only had fleeting moments of success with the Saints. Craig is now with Brighton.

"Chalkie" went to Hereford United after just six Premiership outings, three of them as a sub, while Fjortoft initially enjoyed glory with Middlesbrough after his big money move to Ayresome Park in the summer of '94.

It all turned sour for the Norwegian International after the arrival of Juninho and then Ravanelli and Jan does not even feature on the subs bench any more at Boro where in total he has scored 11 goals in 43 league and cup appearances. There is talk of a return to either Vienna or Norway.

Another of our Premiership gang was Paul Bodin but injury delayed his debut until mid September when he helped us collect our first home point in a rousing 2-2 draw with Newcastle United.

Paul missed only a couple of games after that and finished

highest scorer in the Premiership with seven goals in 27 (4) appearances.

He too was released by Steve McMahon last summer after helping us win the Second Division







"But it is good to have competition for


places - it keeps everyone on their toes."


Wayne's career highlights so far include winning the Second Division title last season along with making two appearances for the Republic of Ireland Under 21 team.





## football shorts by M.J. Evans

#### Rise & Fall

Cardiff City were forced to seek re-election at the end of season 1933-1934 to Division 3 (Southern Section) following relegation from Division 1 in 1929 and two years later from Division 2. But 10 years earlier they had missed winning the championship of Division One merely on goal average. This 10 year fall from grace had also seen the Welshmen reach Wembley on two occasions losing the 1925 final before becoming the first team outside of England to ever win the trophy in 1927.

Two referees controlling the same match has been suggested many times over recent years and in 1935 a proposal for this was turned down by 35 votes to 18. The dual control plan was

tried out in two England representative matches played at West Bromwich Albion, but obviously they found one referee more than enough.

Glasgow rivals Celtic and Rangers have been involved in many memorable games in the past and their League encounter on May 21, 1979 proved to be no exception to the rule. Rangers with games in hand only needed to beat their arch rivals to guarantee the Scottish Premier League Championship. However, the expectant crowd of over 50,000 saw the visitors take a 1-0 lead at Parkhead. Celtic's anxiety was heightened when John Doyle's dismissal reduced them to 10 men at the beginning of the second half. A 67th minute equaliser revived

their hope before eventually taking a 2-1 lead. But Rangers were to pile on the agony when the scores were levelled on 2-2 before Celtic sealed victory with a further two goals and eventually winning the Scottish Championship.

#### leaded Penalty

Eddie Hapgood of Arsenal had the unique privilege of scoring from the penalty spot with a header. Liverpool 'keeper Riley fisted the ball back from the spot kick to which Hapgood obligingly headed home.

#### **Home** Record


