We can't afford to start like that again and we'll need to improve on the performance we gave up there if we are to get anything out of the game.

Grimsby have picked up of late and are a difficult side to beat. Their league position doesn't tell a true story and we will have to keep our wits about us.

The games are coming thick and fast at the moment and on New Year's Day Queens Park Rangers are the visitors to the County Ground.

This will be our fourth meeting with Rangers - and we're only just half way through the season so both sides know a lot about each other.

But previous results count for nothing now and on Wednesday I'm sure it will be a totally different game.

Rangers have spent heavily since we last met them with Stewart Houston bringing in John Spencer from Chelsea and Gavin Peacock on loan.

He has got lots of quality with the likes of Trevor Sinclair in attack as well as expertise at the back in Alan McDonald

I know from experience that it takes time for a new manager to settle in and I'm sure that has been the case with Stewart.

Although Stewart had a spell in charge at Arsenal, this is really his first managerial job and he is very different to the previous manager Ray Wilkins


It takes a while to get to know the players and for them to get to know you, but from what I've seen, Stewart and his assistant Bruce Rioch are settling in well. A lot has changed since our three match series with QPR earlier in the season but we showed then that we can compete on a par with the likes of Rangers even though they have got far more money to spend on players.

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of Grimsby Town Football Club to the County Ground. We hope that everybody enjoys the match and has a safe journey home after the game.

After an indifferent start to the 1996/97 campaign, Grimsby parted company with manager Brian Laws a few weeks ago - and have enjoyed a corresponding upturn in fortunes.

Laws has been replaced temporarily at least - by his assistant Kenny Swain, and that appointment seems to have injected new life into a side who at one stage looked cast iron certainties for the drop.

Only one win in their first eight matches - ironically enough against Swindon - sent the Blundell Park side tumbling down the table; and they stretched that to just three victories in 19 games before Swain steadied the Mariners' ship.

Even in the middle of such a confidence-draining run there were glimmers of hope, with victories over high-flying Barnsley and recent Premiership side QPR lifting the gloom.

But more recently, successive triumphs away at Charlton and then at home to second place Crystal Palace - who just weeks earlier had comprehensively beaten Town 3-0 at Selhurst Park - saw a new-found self-belief coursing through Grimsby veins.

A major reason for this turnaround has been the re-emergence of Grimsby's front-pairing of Clive Mendonca and Steve Livingstone as a potent force, with the pair having grabbed thirteen

between them in the League at the time of writing.

Mendonca missed much of last term through injury as the Mariners slid away following a great start to finish in 17th spot, but he returned to show he's still got the goalscoring knack with a

hat-trick against lpswich in his second game back in April.

His partnership with Livingstone - top scorer last term with 13 goals - was always likely to be crucial to Grimsby's chances of success this term...and it has only recently started firing on all cylinders.

Steve McMahon and Co will be hoping to throw a spanner in the works of the Grimsby goal machine this afternoon.

After more than a season struggling against an injury which many observers felt could end his career, the quick-footed Grimsby striker returned to first-team football for the last eight games of 1995/96.

Keen to make up for lost time, Mendonca promptly scored a hattrick in only his second game back - a 3-1 win against Ipswich and finished the campaign with four goals to his credit.

Anxious to make a better start this time around, Mendonca opened 1996/97 with a flourish, scoring four times in the first five games, with two of those strikes coming against Swindon at Blundell Park in a 2-1 victory for the Mariners - their only success in a poor early run.

He began life as an apprentice with Sheffield United but, despite scoring four goals in 13 matches for the Blades was unable to hold down a regular first-team spot and moved on to Rotherham for £35,000 in March 1988.

He made such an impression at Millmoor that
Sheffield United forked out £110,000 to take him
back to Bramall Lane, but again he failed to settle. After a successful
loan spell, Clive joined Grimsby for a bargain £85,000 in August 1992
and has proved to be an astute purchase by the East Coast Club.


Under the guidance of the new man, however, the Blundell Park Club

seem to have got their act together and are now playing with a real sense of purpose - a fact shown by their recent back-to-back victories over Charlton and Crystal Palace in the League.

As a player, Birkenhead-born Swain was a no-nonsense right-back who began his professional career with

Chelsea, who he joined from then non-League Wycombe Wanderers in August 1973

A glittering career took him to Aston Villa, where he tasted European Cup glory in 1982, and Nottingham Forest, as well as spells at Portsmouth, West Brom and Crewe, before hanging up his boots in 1991.



Grimsby have a class stopper in the shape of JASON PEARCEY, who became Brian Laws' first signing for the club when he joined from Mansfield for a nominal fee in December 1994. In and out of the side during his time at Blundell Park, Jason has been the man in possession of the number one shirt in recent weeks.

In the centre of defence, Grimsby call upon the services of **PETER HANDYSIDE** and MARK LEVER.

Handyside is a regular in Scotland's Under-21 side, and was picked up by the Blundell Park outfit from Scottish junior football, signing professional in November 1992. Strong in the air and relaxed on the ball, injury ruled him out for much of the second

half of last season, and seemed to have had an a dverse affect on his confidence once he did return to action.

The 26-year-old Lever is a product of the Club's successful youth policy who made his debut in the 'derby' match against Scunthorpe in September 1988 and has now completed more than 200 senior appearances for Grimsby. At 6ft 3in, he is a constant threat from set-pieces, although he missed a chunk of last season through injury.

Other defenders include ex-Sheffield United man ASHLEY FICKLING, who joined the Mariners on transfer deadline day 1995,

KEVIN JOBLING, JOHN McDERMOTT and GRAHAM RODGER.

Ideally a full-back, former Leicester City man Jobling has found difficulty breaking into the firstteam in recent seasons, but was a regular choice

during the Club's rapid rise from the old Fourth to Second Divisions. He missed all but three games last term thanks to a broken leg.

McDermott is the longest-serving professional on Grimsby's books and is currently enjoying his

Testimonial season with the Club. He has been through two promotions and two

> relegations with the Club since his senior debut in 1987. He scored his first goal of the season during a 3-1 win over high-flying Barnsley in September.


FA Cup winner Graham Rodger (with Coventry in 1987) has suffered from a string of injuries since joining the Mariners from Luton Town in February 1992. He

has won England Under-21 caps and made 16 senior appearances in

the League last season. He scored a late winner as the Mariners turned over fancied Crystal Palace at Blundell Park at the end of November.

RICHARD SMITH is an intelligent defender who reads the game well and joined Grimsby in a £100,000 transfer from Leicester in March 1996, while TONY GALLIMORE is a highly-rated full-back who signed for £125,000 from Carlisle at the same time.

Now in his seventh season with the Blundell Park outfit is attacking midfielder GARY CHILDS. who signed on a free transfer from Birmingham City having already been on the books with West Brom and Walsall. He has made more than 200 senior appearances for the Mariners. A former England Youth international, Childs makes the Mariners tick when he is on song.

PLAYER PROFILE

Record signing **TOMMY WIDDRINGTON** moved back towards his native north east when he transferred for £300,000 from Southampton during the summer. A right-sided midfielder, his experience in the top flight could be crucial for Grimsby this term.

JOHN WALKER was released by Glasgow Rangers early last season and spent a long period on trial at Blundell Park. He made his League debut as a substitute against Watford - and scored within minutes of coming on.

Other midfielders include the former West Brom player **CRAIG SHAKESPEARE**, former Hartlepool favourite **NICKY SOUTHALL**, and ex-Forest and Northern Ireland star

KINGSLEY BLACK.

Southall was rated as one of the lower divisions' most promising players in 1994/95, and Grimsby snapped him up for a cut-price fee of just £40,000. He has yet to fully justify his reputation in the higher echelons, but still looks a good player on his day.

Shakespeare has been dogged by injuries since moving to Blundell Park in July 1993, but enjoyed his best season to date in 1995/96 and is expected to play a big part with his ball-winning skills as the Mariners bid to continue their recent improvement in form.

Kingsley Black shot to fame as an exciting leftwing talent with Luton in the mid-1980s, earning himself a big money transfer to Nottingham Forest. But he failed to live up to expectations at the City Ground after a bright start, and had spells on loan at Sheffield United and Millwall before moving to Grimsby.

NEIL WOODS

finished 1994/95 as the Mariners' leading scorer, with 14
League goals to his credit. Lost his goal touch a little last term, and at the time of writing has yet to find the net this time around.

STEVE LIVINGSTONE.

formerly with Chelsea, Blackburn and Coventry





abrief look back

Dick Mattick looks back ...

The appeal of the FA Cup to a Third Division South team with a chance of beating a First Division club was demonstrated when Swindon managed to hold Grimsby to a draw and bring them back to the County Ground in January 1938.

Only 14,000 had seen the match at Grimsby (or rather Cleethorpes, for Grimsby do not actually play in Grimsby itself).

Swindon's right winger Jones had given his side the lead after 27 minutes but the Mariners struck back when their English international Bestall laid on an equaliser for Tomlinson.

For the replay, the number of police at the County Ground was increased from four to seven and club purchased two megaphones to help with crowd control. With such scant resources was a crowd of 23,000 happily controlled.

The match was fought out on a pitch only made payable by the spreading of large quantities of sand especially purchased from Porthcawl.

Swindon lost the toss and attacked the Town end in the first half. Grimsby looked a class or two above Swindon in the opening period and it came as no surprise when Bryan could only punch out a centre to Tomlinson who put the visitors in front.

Swindon came more into the game in the second

half and Jones forced two brilliant saves from Tweedy in the Grimsby goal.

Only five minutes remained when Swindon eventually got their equaliser, the goal came from Ben Morton.

Morton had been Swindon's first £1000 signing when he joined them from Torquay. It seemed a very poor investment indeed when after 17 games he had failed to score a single goal but in this match he finally broke his Swindon duck. His goal produced the following description: "Flat out on bogland Grimsby's blond

keeper saw Morton scoop the ball into the net, Colleagues hugged Morton as though he were Josephine Baker and when he fell, injured like Nelson in his hour of triumph, the crowd gave him a cheer that might have frightened the fish up Grimsby way."

A stop press entry in the Adver described the goal as having produced cheering that lasted for five minutes and was heard three miles away.

Five minutes of extra time remained when Alan Fowler, who was later to be one of three Town players killed in World War Two, converted a cross by left winger Heatherington to put Swindon into the Fourth Round where Luton ended the Robins' cup hopes.

Portsmouth seem to have unearthed a real star in new signing Mathias Svensson, a tall bustling Swedish striker from Elfsborg. He's only 22 and cost what seems a true bargain at £200,000.

There have been several pre-Christmas movements involving First Division clubs. Ipswich also got a gem in the form of Tottenham centre-half Jason Cundy, while Pompey have gained some real experience in David Hillier - signed from Arsenal.

Neil Heaney left the relegation battle in the Premiership to participate in one in this division when he said goodbye to the Dell and pulled on the Man City shirt. And John Spencer's move from Stamford Bridge to Loftus Road seems to have given QPR a sharper cutting edge.

Ruud Gullit indeed seems to have been off-loading, for QPR also have that gifted little forward Gavin Peacock on loan from Chelsea.

Another loan deal from Chelsea took Mark Stein to Stoke City, as we know to our cost as he scored both goals against us on our recent trip to the Victoria Ground.

Other moves included John Dreyer joining Bradford City from Stoke; Gary Poole moving from Birmingham City to Charlton and Martin O'Connor spending his first Christmas at St. Andrews after leaving Peterborough.

But back to this afternoon

and the possibility of collecting six points in two days can make a big impression on the First Division table. Bolton Wanderers for instance seemed to be floating away with the Championship even when they began to drop points in drawn games there seemed to be no threat to their position.

Then along come Ipswich Town to deliver some Suffolk punch and inflict a shock 2-1 defeat on the leaders at Burnden Park. Suddenly the Trotters were only a point clear of Barnsley having played a game more. As Christmas approached, Bolton could no longer be guaranteed a place on top of the tree.

Oxford versus Reading has the uncertainty of any derby but don't be surprised if Oxford win at Wolves and drop points to the Royals.

Norwich City just can't win at Carrow Road these days but if they don't beat Bradford City there today, they probably never will!

Crystal Palace are high scorers and weak defenders and Stoke will test their resolve at Selhurst Park. But Sheffield United will surely be too good for Oldham Athletic at Bramall Lane.

If any club looks likely to celebrate a six point Christmas it must be the Blades, who must have won at Bradford on Boxing Day.



We made it 3-0 just after the half time interval as good work by Scott Woodman allowed Finlayson to bag his second of the game.





As the game wore on, Cardiff began to take control but we went into the intervall a goal to the good and continued to defend well as the second half progressed.


The home team missed several chances before they finally scored an equaliser 15 minutes from time.

There was a time you know when we never ever returned from Grimsby empty handed. If we did not manage a point or two, as often was the case, there was always the box of fresh fish packed in alongside the kit basket in the

luggage compartment of

the team bus.

It came courtesy of the hospitable Grimsby Town directors and was as fresh as the North wind that blows over Blundell Park.

Times have changed, some for the better (ask the laundry lady), some for the worse (ask those in the ailing fish industry). Many's the peculian stare glanced in the direction of a footballer returning home late at night on the local bus after an away trip to Cleethorpes, smelling of fish; a couple of Cod clutched to his bosom wrapped in a few pages of that morning's Daily Express.

It is all much more sophisticated these days of course with players affluent and owning their own cars etc. The culture of society and the game has developed and so too has the meaning of Christmas, from a footballing point of view that is.

There was a time when part of the tradition of Christmas was to play a full Football League programme on both Christmas and Boxing Days.

Quite the norm was to play the same opposition home and away over this period...You can imagine what trouble that led to at times with vendettas raging on the field between certain excitable individuals.

But the Christmas fare was well appreciated by the fans and some of the biggest gates of the season were recorded on the festive holiday.

Football did not often let its followers down either. Over the years the Christmas treat proved a real cracker, the tradition goes back to 1889 when Preston North End beat Aston Villa 3-2 in the first ever Football League game on Christmas morning.

Town's league debut on this most auspicious day came about in 1920, when we lost 3-2 Meanwhile, across in the east end of London, Blackburn Rovers were running riot at Upton Park. Jim Standen was beaten eight times as West Ham United with Peters, Moore and Hurst in the team crashed 8-2 in front of their own fans!

In the Second Division too, Christmas spirit did not extend to all, as at Maine Road, Manchester City put paid to any aspirations Scunthorpe United might have nurtured about goodwill to all men by thumping the visitors 8-1.

Now such rogue scorelines are incredible at any time but the point about these particular

games was the outcome of the return matches two days later. Ipswich beat Fulham 4-2 at Portman Road; the Hammers overcame their ignominious

performance to win 3-1 at Ewood Park.

Mind you the Christmas crackers of all time have to be Norwich City....They netted 18 goals without reply against Brighton on Christmas Day 1940. It was exceptional circumstances of course, being war-time.

Brighton had hoped to recruit players en route but arrived at Carrow Road with just five. A few joined them from the crowd and Norwich reserves made up the balance.

Fred Chadwick (Ipswich Town) scored six and the half time tally of 10 goals was the most ever recorded in one half by one team in a League fixture and the 18-0 at the final count was again the highest margin in the history of the Football League.

You see it always has been a Happy Christmas for some.

at Reading in a Third Division (Southern Section) game. A decade later, on Christmas Day 1930, we beat Fulham (I'm sure Jimmy Hill was not in the team that day) 4-1 here....Twenty four hours later at Craven Cottage we crashed 6-1!

Yet such contradictions in terms were so often the case in these seasonal double headers....The record breaking Christmas of all time was that of 1963, they did not play on December 25th then, the Christmas Day programme was scrapped in 1959, but on Boxing Day that year no less than 66 goals were blasted in 10 First Division games.

Fulham led the rout by thrashing poor Ipswich Town 10-1 at Craven Cottage, Scottish international Graham Leggat scoring three in three minutes in the first half to record the fastest First Division hat-trick since the War.





In 1978 Millwall incurred a £1,500 fine and had their old ground 'The Den' closed for two weeks following crowd disturbances during an FA Cup tie with lpswich Town. This was the fourth time the ground had been closed the first time 1934 followed in 1947 and also in 1950.

It is most rare for a player to be sent off at Wembley and they number very few. Boris Stankovic was the first ever whilst captaining Yugoslavia versus Sweden in the 1948 Olympic Games on August 13, 1948. The next player was the Argentinian skipper Antonio Rattin during the 1966 World Cup finals. Eight years later the first British players received a sending off when Leeds captain Billy Bremner and Liverpool star Kevin Keegan came to blows in the FA Charity Shield on August 10, 1974. Gilbert Presch, playing for Luxembourg on March 30, 1977 was the next player in Wembley's short-list of roques gallery to finish the match ahead of his team-mates for the wrong reasons.

On September 24, 1980 the Yugoslavian national goalkeeper Dragon Pantelic scored three times from the penalty spot in a League match for Radniki Nis versus NK Zagreb and also went on to save a penalty kick at his own end.


