The Canaries looked to have swooped in for maximum spoils as they led 4-2 with just six minutes remaining but Charlton produced a late

Following the high achievements of last season when for a long time the Addicks looked likely to secure the second automatic promotion place, before slipping away to sixth spot and losing out in the Play-Off Semi-Finals to neighbours Crystal Palace - the 1996/97 campaign has been something of a disappointment.

A difficulty scoring goals has been Charlton's downfall - they had failed to find the net in 15 of 31 games at the time of writing - and although Alan Curbishley's side look to be safe from the drop, they will be anxious for a

return to the form of recent seasons. when they have been


one of the First Division's leading lights.

The signing of midfield powerhouse Mark Kinsella was a positive move for Charlton, and the player - who can also drop back and play sweeper - has chipped in with some valuable goals this season as the Addicks have been forced to cope without a crop of

injured players. Another new face has arrived in the form of ex-West Ham and Bournemouth hit-man Steve Jones, and The Valley faithful will be hoping that the former Hammer can use his pace and strength to good effect in the remainder of the season.

Swindon and Charlton have already met in the League this term, with the London club recording a 2-0 win over Town back in early December, courtesy of goals from front pair Carl Leaburn and David Whyte.

Steve McMahon's troops will be anxious to redress the balance this afternoon, as Swindon bid to close in on a Play-Off place.

One of several youngsters to have grown up at Charlton, and progressed through the ranks together to the first-team.

Shaun made a big impression in the Addicks' senior side when he made his debut as a raw 17-year-old, and he is adept and comfortable enough in the side to play anywhere across the midfield or at full-back, and also packs a ferocious shot which has resulted in some spectacular goals.

An exciting player in possession of the ball, he is always looking to make things

happen and with a new advanced role in the side last season he was able to use his tremendous pace and good crossing ability to lay on chances for the likes of Leaburn, Whyte and Garry Nelson (now Torquay).

With seven goals last term, including five in the League, he is one of Charlton's main threats going forward and it is only surprising that he didn't join team-mates Richard Rufus, Lee Bowyer (now Leeds) and Jamie Stuart in the England Under-21 side for last summer's Toulon Tournament.

Alan Curbishley

After four years as half of a double-act running the playing side at The Valley, Alan Curbishley took sole control of the Charlton first-team in June 1995.

Charlton

His partnership with Steve Gritt had been a relatively successful one considering the limited budget the pair were working within, and in their first year together they guided the Addicks to within one victory of a Play-Off place.

But, having parted company with Gritt, who is now manager at Brighton, The Valley board decided to try Alan on his own, and in his first year of control he led the Club to sixth place in the First Division, and a Play-Off Semi-Final, which they lost over two legs to south London rivals Crystal Palace.

Still retained

on a playing contract, midfielder Alan did not make a single first-team appearance last season and has been stuck on 98 appearances for the past couple of years.

He began with West Ham United and also had spells with Birmingham City and Aston Villa before first joining Charlton in 1984. After helping the

Addicks to promotion in 1986, and a season in the old Division One, he moved on to Brighton.

But Charlton is a friendly, family Club and in 1990 he returned to the south Londoners as Reserve team coach under Lennie Lawrence, before progressing 'upstairs' in July 1991.

Despite meagre resources at The Valley, Charlton are proud of bringing youngsters up through the ranks and Alan was instrumental in the development of such budding stars as Shaun Newton, Richard Rufus and Lee Bowyer, who joined Leeds for £2.6 million in the summer.



playerprofile

First choice 'keeper at The Valley is former Blackburn man **MIKE SALMON** who is now firmly established in the side following his £100,000 move from Wrexham in July 1989 and enjoyed his best season so far in 1995/96.

A well travelled player who has also had spells with Chester, Stockport and Bolton, Mike missed a chunk of last season through injury, but returned to help the Club into the Play-Offs.

His deputy is ANDY PETTERSON who had a short period on loan here at the County Ground back in 1988/89, although he never played for Town. Formerly with Luton, Australian Andy joined Charlton in July 1994 for £35,000. Andy went on loan to Ipswich, Colchester, Plymouth and Bradford last season.

Former Scottish Youth international STUART BALMER moved to south London from Celtic in the summer of 1990 for a fee of £100,000. A reliable defender who likes to have the ball at his feet, Stuart was the Club's 'Player of the Year' for 1992/93 and has recently signed a new three year deal at The Valley.

STEVE BROWN has played right across the back four, in midfield and even in goal for Charlton, who are his only professional Club. A former apprentice at The Valley, he overcame a couple of serious injuries to force his way into the first-team.

Central defender **DEAN CHANDLER** has the distinction of scoring on his debut for the Club, although he has only managed one more senior appearance since he took that bow, against Reading in the final game of the 1994/95 campaign. At the time of writing, Dean had yet to figure in the League for Athletic this season.

Another player to have scored a debut goal from the back for Charlton is Norwich-born **PHIL CHAPPLE**. A former Canaries apprentice, Phil failed to make the grade at Carrow Road and moved to Cambridge, from where the Addicks signed him for £100,000 in August 1993. At 6ft 3in he presents a formidable barrier at the back for Charlton.

One of several bright young players to have come up through the ranks at The Valley is

21-year-old *RICHARD RUFUS*, a very highly-rated central defender who is calm and unruffled in possession, as well as being a strong tackler and an excellent all-round athlete. Captain of England's U21 side, Richard made Charlton history when he was voted the Club's 'Player of the Year' and 'Young Player of the Year' in the same season in 1994/95.

Former Birmingham City full-back

GARY POOLE transferred to Charlton in

November 1996 after failing to figure

prominently in new manager Trevor Francis'

plans at St.Andrews. Appointed club

captain at City last season in succession to

Liam Daish, he missed several games

towards the end of the campaign

through injury.

A regular choice in the left-back slot is another youngster in the shape of 20-year-old **JAMIE STUART**. Jamie made his

League debut 'live' on TV, against
WBA, in February 1995 and he
joined team-mates Richard Rufus
and Lee Bowyer (now Leeds) as a
member of the England U21
squad in Toulon last summer.

Battling it out with Jamie for the number three shirt is former apprentice *PHIL STURGESS* who has overcome an ankle ligament injury to challenge for a first-team place in 1996/97.

Currently enjoying his second spell at The Valley is ANTHONY BARNESS, who is a talented young player equally happy in either of the full-back slots. Having progressed through the ranks to the first-team at Charlton, Anthony moved to

Chelsea for £350,000 in September 1992, before returning to south east London for £165,000 in August of this year. At the time of writing he has missed just one game for the Addicks this term.

BRENDAN O'CONNELL joined Charlton from Barnsley in July 1996 for a fee of £125,000. An exciting midfield player who was previously with Exeter, Burnley and Huddersfield, Brendan loves to push forward and have a go at goal, although he has only hit the target once so far this term, at home to Birmingham in a 2-1 win in November.

PLAYER PROFILE

Team captain is former Chelsea man KEITH JONES who suffered a string of injuries last season including a fractured cheekbone sustained against Portsmouth in March. A hardworking and committed midfielder, Keith was also previously with Brentford and Southend, from where he joined Charlton for £150,000 in September 1994. He made his Addicks debut against Swindon the same month.

PAUL LINGER has yet to really establish himself in the Charlton first-team, although he scored his first senior goal for the Club in their 5-1 win at Ipswich last season. Known to his teammates as 'Cloughie' because of his accurate passing, Paul broke his leg at Port Vale in April 1996 and hasn't figured in the side since.

Back at Charlton for a second spell as part of the transfer deal that took Darren Pitcher to Crystal Palace is former England U21 star PAUL MORTIMER. Happy to play anywhere across midfield, or at left-back, Paul has also played for Brentford (loan) and Aston Villa. A snapped Achilles tendon ruled him out of part of last season, but he is now back in the senior frame at The Vallev.

Former Colchester powerhouse

MARK KINSELLA is a player that
several higher division clubs had looked at,
but decided against buying, before
Charlton took the plunge in October 1996.
An Eire U21 international, Mark was
Colchester's 'Player of the Year' for last
season and is famed for his powerful
shooting, which has already brought him four
goals in the League
for Charlton.

A famous name up front for the Addicks is former QPR and England U21 man BRADLEY ALLEN. Bradley - a member of the famous Allen footballing family which also includes brother Clive and cousins Martin and Paul - moved from Loftus Road for a fee of £400,000 in March 1996. He was quick off the mark in Charlton colours, scoring on his debut at Norwich and adding two more League strikes before the end of the season.

Charlton like to play with two wingers, and they have two fine exponents of the dribblers' art in JOHN ROBINSON and MARK ROBSON. A full Welsh international, Robinson was voted the Club's 'Player of the Year' for last season after finally shaking off a string of injuries which had

plagued him since signing from Brighton for £75,000 in September 1992.

Robson is a former Exeter, Tottenham and West Ham player who provides many valuable 'assists' for team-mates.

Much is expected this season of highly-rated 25year-old striker *DAVID WHYTE* who moved to Charlton along with Paul Mortimer in the summer of 1994, as part of the deal which took Darren Pitcher to Selhurst Park.

David scored 23 goals in his first season at The Valley - second only to John Aldridge in the League - but he missed huge chunks of last term through injury. At the time of writing he is

the Addicks leading scorer for 1996/97, with seven goals to his credit including one in their 2-0 victory over Swindon at The Valley in December.

One of the most feared strikers outside the Premiership is CARL LEABURN a big, strong, awkward customer who scored his first ever hat-trick for the Addicks at Ipswich last season and grabbed Charlton's other goal in December's match with Swindon. Top scorer for 1995/96, Leaburn has left behind the taunts of his early days, when he scored just three goals in his first 60 League outings for the Club.

A recent signing has seen former West Ham and Bournemouth striker STEVE JONES move to The Valley

for £400,000. The Cherries' leading scorer for the second successive campaign last season - with 20 goals - Steve began his career with West Ham, who picked him up from non-League Billericay Town. His good form last term prompted the Hammers to take him back to Upton Park in March 1996, but he failed to settle and jumped at the chance of a move across London.

Currently on loan at The Valley is Nottingham Forest front man JASON LEE, who scored an important equaliser at home to Barnsley in his second game back at the club where he launched his career. Having begun at Charlton, Lee moved to Stockport (loan), Lincoln and Southend before transferring to the City Ground in March 1994.

Eighteen-year-old KEVIN LISBIE is the latest young starlet off the production line at The Valley, and he opened his goal account for the club with a strike in the 2-2 draw with Reading in January.





Dick Mattick looks back ...

The 1964/65 season was only four matches old for Swindon when they travelled to Charlton.

The Valley had little problem in accommodating the crowd of 15,809 as the vast East Terrace alone was capable of holding 35,000 in these pre Safety Committee days.

Swindon's team showed two changes; Owen Dawson replaced Terry Wollen at right back in a switch which ended the latter's first team career.

Meanwhile the much travelled Frank Large replaced Ken Sheen at centre forward.

The Charlton team featured John Hewie and Eddie Firmani, both originating from South Africa but capped by Scotland and Italy respectively.

Swindon, playing in a changed strip of all blue, survived an early Charlton onslaught and began to play some neat football.

Summerbee with a header and Hunt, Smart and Atkins with shots, all threatened the Charlton goal.

Five minutes before half time Large pushed a ball back into the path of "Big Bill" Atkins who cracked home a fierce low shot from fully 35 yards to give Swindon the advantage at half time.

But Town's lead did not last long. Tony Hicks, a diminutive but portly keeper had already done well to save an effort from Kenning but could do nothing about Matthews' shot from inside the area in the 50th minute.

Following two Charlton

corners, Cliff Durandt put the Londoners in the lead - it was shades of Zola's recent Wembley goal - for Hicks might well have stopped the original shot but a desperate leap by Dawson saw the ball skim off the side of his head and deflect past the keeper.

Twelve minutes from time Swindon seemed to have earned the point they richly deserved

the point they richly deserved

when another cracking long shot from Atkins spun out of Wakeham's grasp and rolled over the line.

Charlton however roared back in this game of swaying fortunes. Swindon skipper Keith Morgan cleared off the line after Firmani's shot had beaten Hicks but with just two minutes remaining, the Italian set up Matthews for the winner.

The following week's Adver Sports Postbag showed the dissatisfaction of many supporters.

Twelve furious fans from the BR works complained;" We are not going to pay four shillings per head to watch the present team," and demanded the Board lash out £25,000.

Bert Head did enter the transfer market but without great success especially in the case of Frank Haffey, a Scottish international, who lasted just four games in the first team.

The end of the season saw Swindon relegated into the old Division Three by the narrow margin of one point.

The loss at Charlton was regarded by most reporters as an unfortunate one. Just how unfortunate was shown at the end of the season when one could reflect that but for that late Matthews goal scored in the September sun shine, Swindon might not have been relegated the following May.





I suppose it was inevitable that should we not find our winning ways at Maine Road last week it would be the ghosts of Kevin Horlock and Nicky Summerbee that would haunt us - and haunt us they did with a goal from each.

Frank Clark has certainly turned things around at City. He took over a team that was truly ailing and looking more into the jowls of the Second Division than towards the Premiership.

One or two signings, including that of Kevin Horlock, and a little tactical tinkering has brought a different complexion and 12 points from 18 has their fans breathing a little easier.

Manchester City are still hovering just above the relegation zone but they should improve their position at Bradford City today. Chris Kamara's club have experienced the worst of bad luck in recent weeks and though putting up a gallant fight against Sheffield Wednesday in the cup, have yet to produce that form at League level.

A 2-1 win at *Oldham* reduced the pain while the sale of Australian goalkeeper Mark Schwarzer to *Middlesbrough* has considerably swelled the bank balance but they might have to settle for a point today, though no doubt Chris Waddle will be really keyed up for this one.

The transfer of Schwarzer represents a fine bit of business for the Yorkshire club. They snapped him up for £200,000 and only introduced him into the side last November. Now the £1.5 million move has reaped an almost instant and substantial profit which Kamara is investing on improving his side.

It was business as usual for **Bolton Wanderers** last week, Gerry Taggart's third goal of the season clinching a 2-1 win at **Huddersfield Town** to send the Burnden Park outfit 10 points clear of **Wolverhampton**.

The League leaders play host to West Brom tomorrow and should be good for another three points, though they can't take anything for granted. The Albion, like Wolves, are better away from home where Portsmouth inflected a seventh defeat of the season last Saturday.

Six wins and seven draws on the road is only marginally poorer than **Bolton's** own away record, so the Trotters will need to get into top gear.

Talking of Wolves, who chalked up their 10th away win last week with an emphatic 3-1 victory at Barnsley, brings us to their game with Ipswich Town. Like West Brom, Wolves have lost seven at home which is hardly in keeping with a team that has serious ambitions of playing Premiership football next season and last time out at Molineux they were beaten 3-0 by Crystal Palace to dash hopes that they had overcome the home bogie.

Only a fortnight ago *Port Vale* boss John Rudge was praising *Ipswich* as one of the best teams in Division One, following a 2-2 draw at Burslem. It echoed Brian Horton a few weeks earlier, who was just as

impressed even though his Huddersfield side had won 2-0.

Town boss George Burley said: "It's nice to hear managers complementing us because we do like to get the ball down and pass it about. But it is no good if we are not getting the three points we deserve." Well they might just achieve that this afternoon.

Barnsley went on the defensive against Wolves and were eaten alive but we can anticipate a more positive response from Danny Wilson at Southend. He is expected to recall Liddell to partner Wilkinson in attack and should keep the promotion chase on track.

A hat trick from former Town striker Jan Aage Fjortoft in a 3-1 win over *Grimsby* relit *Sheffield United's* promotion fuse but the Blades face a tough assignment this afternoon at Fratton Park.

Portsmouth, with veteran keeper Alan Knight in inspirational form having been recalled from the reserves, have put together a seven match league and cup winning run. The Pompey chimes are ringing loud and clear.

Crystal Palace, who ended Wolves' run of four successive wins with a 3-0 success at Molineux, tripped up themselves at home to Tranmere and will not relish the trip to Oxford where United hope to hand out a soccer lesson. Yet so inconsistent are "Harry" Bassett's men - anything is possible.

Norwich shared eight goals with Charlton - they will be pleased with just one this afternoon if it proves the winner against Huddersfield.

Dennogives his view

The arrival of Charlton Athletic unlocks memories of my schooldays when Charlton's former FA Cup winning captain, Don Welsh, was manager of Bournemouth and Boscombe Athletic.

I remember this tall bald figure addressing the whole school in the assembley hall and although I obviously can not remember everything he said, I most certainly got the gist of his speech.

Don was talking about the importance of maintaining a healthy body and emphasised the need for personal hygiene. The two main points which lodged indelibly in my mind were, first that we should look after our feet and wash them every day and secondly that if we wanted to live long active lives we should never smoke.

Now I do confess that I have not washed my feet every day but equally true is the fact that I have never smoked in my life. Just how much of this is due to the impression Mr. Welsh made on me I can not be certain for I already had an insatiable fanaticism for fitness, but I am sure that advice given to impressionable youngsters by top sportsmen can be beneficial to at least some of the audience.

The strange thing is I know far more about Don Welsh now than I did then. Apart from the fact that he had captained Charlton to their most glorious triumph when they won the FA Cup in 1947 and that he was manager of Bournemouth, he was just an "old" man as far as I was concerned.

I wonder if his words would have had more impact had we known exactly what he had

achieved. Jimmy Seed paid Torquay United £3,250 for Welsh and it proved money well spent.

He played in all the key positions for Charlton - centre half, centre-forward, inside forward and wing-half.

When he hung up his boots after the Second World War he became manager of Brighton.

While still in charge of the Sussex club, Don was invited to add his name to a shortlist of candidates for the Liverpool job. The Reds' boss, George Kay, was relinquishing the position through ill health after 15 years. Don knew most of the players from his war-time quest appearances with the Anfield club while stationed at a rehabilitation hospital in Chester and it was no surprise when in March 1951 the directors appointed him.



Liverpool were then in the First Division and Don, a fitness fanatic, strove to make them the fittest team in the League. He stressed the importance in training of physical jerks and was enthusiastic enough to ioin in with a hand stand or two himself.

A big strong player himself, Don looked for size and power to represent him at Liverpool but eventually results went against him and on the eve of

the FA Cup final in 1956 he resigned to retreat to Bovey Tracey in Devon where he ran a hotel.

For months Mr Welsh's relationship with the directors had been brittle and relegation - their first for 50 years followed by the failure to regain promotion lead to a cleavage of the kind that has no future.

But Welsh had not been given sole command of the team and its selection and many felt that consequently the blame for failure could not be landed on his shoulders alone.

Even in the days of George Kay - who had enjoyed conspicuous success - the Anfield tradition of the directors having a hand in selection was paramount.

I can still picture that scene in the school hall that sunny Wednesday afternoon so many years ago and recall Welsh's breezy, effervescent personality as he addressed 600 boys. I suppose, though I never saw him play and didn't even realise that he had been capped three times by England and had scored England's last goal before the Second World War in a 2-0 victory over Rumania, his impact on me has had a lasting influence on my life. I have never supported Charlton, yet Don Welsh is one of my heroes.


Today's personalties will probably have a similar impact on tomorrow's young men.

It is to be hoped that they understand the power invested in them by virtue of their standing in society and that they put it to good use within our community.

Football is not solely a game, it is a reflection on life and it is not just what is achieved on the field of play that influences others.

Chairman's Statement

On behalf of the Board of Directors, it gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the year ended 31st May 1996.

After the disappointment of the previous two seasons, we were determined to bounce right back, and that is just what we did, finishing as outright Champions.

Success on the field was not however, without a cost. At the end of the 1994/95 season, the Board committed to the rebuilding of the team with a view to a quick return to the First Division. Over £1 million was spent by Steve McMahon to establish a Championshipwinning squad. Thirteen players were put on the transfer list in the rebuilding process, raising just £176,875 against the background of a depressed transfer market as the ramifications of the Bosman case and the subsequent influx of overseas players started to take effect. This was also to have an impact on our wage bill, with players remaining on our books longer than originally expected, resulting in extra costs of over £350,000 including contract termination costs of £92,411. The overall investment in rebuilding the squad was, therefore, in excess of £1.2 million and with bonuses payable as a result of promotion of £209,017, these two factors accounted for the vast majority of the operating loss before interest for the year of £1,507,793.

This investment was funded by increased loans and bank borrowings, producing increased interest charges during the year. To ensure the long-term financial security of the Club, we need to reduce the interest-bearing debt and increase the capital base. A significant step

was taken towards this with a 4:1 rights issue, offering existing shareholders the opportunity to increase significantly their shareholding by taking up their rights and applying for excess shares, with a view to increasing the share capital from £104,618 to £0.5 million. Whilst the rights issue fell short of our expectations, it was successful compared with previous rights issues, trebling the share capital and raising £193,080, thanks to the support of our shareholders who participated.

The impact of operating in a lower league resulted in a 7% reduction in turnover over the previous year, largely due to shortfalls in TV income, sponsorships and league income. Gate receipts were also affected as a result of a decision to reduce ticket prices by an average of 16.9%, but encouragingly this was compensated partly by the 11.7% increase in average attendances from 9,201 in the previous season to 10,280.

Despite relegation to the Second Division and the prospect of reduced income, the Board took a long-term view by retaining staffing levels to ensure that the momentum of the continuing development of the business was maintained. As a result, the Commercial side of the business produced an income of just under £1.5 million, an increase of 18.6% over the 1994/95 season and 2.0% over the Premier League season of 1993/94. Special tribute should be paid to the staff for this achievement and their continuing hard work and devotion to the Club. I would also like to thank the increasing number of local businesses who continue to support the Club

through sponsorship, corporate hospitality, advertising and use of our conference and banqueting facilities.

Rikki Hunt, as Director of Football, has continued to work hard at bringing the wage bill in line with our income with significant success. Excluding the one-off termination costs and promotion bonuses, there was a 7.0% saving of £221,637. This included a substantial saving in signing-on fees which will not only have a beneficial effect on cash flow, but also reduces the Club's future liabilities in the event of termination of contracts. Furthermore, excluding the additional wages resulting from the delay in releasing players, the underlying wage bill was reduced by a valuable 14.9%, a saving of £471,637.

Administration costs showed an overall increase of £81,855 including an increase in rent and rates of £102,525. This is as a result of a one-off reduction in rent during the previous season under the terms of the new lease for the County Ground with Thamesdown Borough Council. The investment in Youth development expenses during the year also saw an increase of 38.6%, with the Board committed to building a strong youth policy for the future. Other areas of increased expenditure included maintenance, as we continually strive to improve facilities here at the County Ground.

As we look forward to the future, there are some important developments both in the football industry and locally in Swindon which will impact on our future results and our ability to achieve our vision, which is to "create the financial security which will enable sustainable Premiership football."

Swindon Town 1996

There has been a noticeable increase in interest in the game at all levels, and more money than ever before is being made available through TV rights and sponsorship. We all have a duty to ensure that this money is invested wisely for the longterm benefit of the game, and is not eroded by hyper-inflation in players' wages. As the impact of the Bosman ruling takes effect, there is a very real threat of this happening unless action is taken by the industry as a whole. Here at Swindon Town, we have put in place measures which will ensure that our wage bill is kept under control, and have demonstrated that we can still attract quality players on a wage structure geared to success.

In recent months the football


industry has seen increased interest from the financial markets, and your Board are monitoring these developments closely and currently investigating the options available to it. We also continue to look for new business opportunities as part of our aim to put Swindon Town on a solid financial footing. As an indication of the ambition and foresight of the Board, with the proposed deregulation of the Casino industry, we identifed an opportunity for a high-class casino at the County Ground. We were delighted to complete a deal with the market leaders, Grosvenor Casinos Limited for this unique and innovative development, which will not only provide the Club with an ongoing source of additional revenue, but will also make better use of and

improve the facilities of the Club. This is without doubt the biggest single deal ever done here at the County Ground, and firmly puts us at the forefront of commercial thinking in the football industry, being the first Club in Europe (if not the World) to have a Casino actually at their ground. I look forward to the exciting times ahead.


