The players have set incredible standards for themselves with their consistent performances this season. They have taken credit when it has been due, but I have to say they have played much better than they did at Crystal Palace on Tuesday. Nevertheless, their character shone through yet again and, even though the equaliser came with just seconds to go.

I thought we deserved the point. The commitment, the effort and the never-say-die spirit was terrific.

I said before the game that I expected Palace to provide us with our sternest test. I've been saying for some time that I thought they would be up there in contention for a promotion place and I had that opinion reinforced when I saw their win at Oxford last Saturday. They looked a very good side indeed, and play the game as it should be played.

Assessing the quality of the opposition and the fact that we only had 48 hours rest after our tough game against West Brom, I knew we were in for a really hard game. So it proved. All credit to the players though.

There were some tired legs out there - that was why I made three

substitutions midway through the second-half... but they kept going right to the end, and I reckon we just about deserved the draw. I know the players were absolutely delighted.

I think the performance said a lot about their determination, they are staying focused, just as I have asked them to, and they aren't concerning themselves with League positions or points. It's premature to talk about what might happen somewhere down the line. There are a still a lot of points to be played for and the only game we should have in our minds is this afternoon's.

Much has been said and written about the exciting move to the new stadium and there is another move which has been going on for some time and is now looking near to completion.

As you may know, we have been using the Ordnance Factory recreation site at Euxton for a couple of seasons. The facilities have been so good that we are now in the process of making the site our permanent training base.

In the coming weeks we will move to Euxton lock, stock and barrel. We already have office facilities there and Ewan Simpson has his treatment room set up too. It's a pleasant environment and the players are happy working there, which is what it counts.

If the Championship gave this particular fan a lot to celebrate, it was also excellent for everybody connected with the club.

Swindon Town have seen more ups and downs in the past few seasons than the traffic controllers at Luton Airport. There have been four successive promotions and relegations, and Manager Steve McMahon is quite clear about which of the two he prefers.

"You can make a player fitter by giving him a pay rise. He works harder and he is happier at home."

Like every other club, they started this season with high hopes. Mark Walters joined the club after being given a free transfer by Southampton last summer. Walters says, 'When I first came here, I told the other players that they were a match for virtually anyone in this League.

The victories over Barnsley, Manchester City and Palace have proved that I was right.' But they have also lost too often. Their 2-0 defeat at Charlton was their eighth in eleven games. Defender Wayne O'Sullivan says, 'We have not been playing well enough to deserve anything better.' And the win at Palace was followed by a bad run.

After losing 2-0 at Stoke, manager Steve MacMahon said, 'We have lost five out of six now and that is relegation form.' Swindon are actually safe from relegation, and may yet make the play-offs.

Results may have been inconsistent, but everyone agrees that Swindon are always tough to play against. The victory by 2-1 at Crystal Palace came in a match that brought one red card and eight bookings and some obvious ill-feeling between the players.

But after the match Manager Steve McMahon was unrepentant, 'My players were protecting each other,' he says, 'I am not saying that it is a good thing if players square up to each other, but as long as noone raises his fists, it is not necessarily a bad thing.' Palace star David Hopkin commented, 'Swindon came here to wind up. They knew that if we are allowed to play football, we rip teams apart.'

Former Swindon player Joey Beauchamp has also commented on his former club. After playing against Swindon for Oxford, he said 'I do not think the Referee gave me much protection. I went down a couple of times, but he did nothing. I thought some of the Swindon players were my friends, but it did not seem to make much difference.'

Yet when Bolton played at Swindon earlier in the season, there was absolutely nothing untoward in the Club's approach to the game.



Swindon have to be a selling club. Former striker Jan Aage Fjortoft made his debut for Sheffield United against them recently. Striker Kevin Horlock was recently transferred to Manchester City. Manager Steve MacMahon believes that his side will do even better once they develop real ambition. After the 2-1 defeat at Grimsby, he said, 'I cannot understand why we did not start playing earlier. We were a different side after the break. We have to compete for 90 minutes'.

Midfielder Mark Walters has already dented Wanderers' promotion hopes once this season with a goal out of the blue in our 2-2 draw at Swindon earlier in the season. The former Liverpool man has picked up three bicycles this season for being nominated as man of the match. The first came for his display against Wolverhampton, the second came in the home match against QPR and the third in the away match against QPR. All three cycles are top-of-the-range mountain bikes, and Club Chairman Mike Spearman has remarked. Walters should open a bike shop! In saying this, the Chairman is of course indulging in very lighthearted frivolity. The former England winger has rejuvenated his career this season at Swindon. I am not opening a bike shop, he says, I am enjoying every minute of my time here after being a bit-part player for the last couple of years. At Liverpool I was only given limited opportunities in my final years, and then at Southampton I was not really given a go. The system used by the manager there did not give Players like me and Matt Le Tissier the freedom to express ourselves fully. But here it is different. I like the system that Swindon play, and the Manager encourages us to pass the ball to feet. This suits me perfectly.

Striker Steve Cowe has made a big impression since signing from Aston Villa and just as important has had his fair share of luck.

His club's only goal in the 2-1 defeat at Bradford came from a penalty given when Marco Sas obstructed him in a way that usually goes unpunished. The 22 year old was a thorn in the side of Sheffield United as Swindon beat them 2-1 and he scored with a superb effort in the 3-1 win at Southend. He netted with a neat finish in the 3-1 win at Grimsby from Peter Thome's knock down.

Striker Peter Thorne scored a hattrick in the 6-0 defeat of.
Huddersfield. His goal against
Huddersfield completed a golden streak of six goals in five games.
Manager McMahon says. Thorne is as good as John Spencer, who recently moved for big money. He has great touch and balance and a great future. Thorne says, 'It is flattering to keep hearing that Premiership teams are interested in me. I just want to play football.'



Defender **Ian Culverhouse** was sent off after 52 seconds of the Cup match at Everton for handling on the line. But Swindon Manager Steve McMahon said, 'it hit him on the chest.'

Goalkeeper Fraser Digby saved a penalty from Pat Nevin in the 2-1 defeat at Tranmere. He saved his side from an even bigger hammering in the 2-0 defeat at Charlton, but everyone that he was lucky

to stay on after fouling Carl Leaburn just outside the box. Swindon defender Wayne O'Sullivan said, Fraser was very lucky not to get sent off. If it had happened to us, we should have expected the keeper to go.'

Swindon boss Steve McMahon agrees, 'I thought our keeper was going off,' he said, 'and I certainly thought that they were going to get a penalty.'

Defender **Gary Elkins** was signed from Wimbledon and is a great admirer of player-manager Steve McMahon. 'He goes out, gets in a good first tackle, and we have got to follow,' says Elkins, 'If not, he will have a right go at us. If you go in in a half-hearted manner or get kicked yourself, it means that the opponent has won the challenge,' Elkins scored the opening goal in the 2-1 win over Sheffield United.

Defender Jason Drysdale was pleased when player-manager Steve McMahon signed a five-year contract last month. He said, "It is great news for the Players and fans. It means stability. Every time we have had a good manager in the past, they have eved on to bigger club.





Corsican defender **Frederik Darras** is a tough tackler who upset dainty striker John Aldridge in the home match against Tranmere. Aldridge said, 'He was out of order.'

Scottish midfielder **Scott Leitch** needed ten stitches in his lip after the 2-1 win at Crystal Palace, but there was controversy after he picked up his injury. Swindon goalkeeper Talia threw the ball into touch in order to allow Leitch to be treated by the trainer. Swindon Manager Steve McMahon was incensed when Palace refused to return the ball.

Instead Palace launched a long throw into the Swindon box in search of a last gasp equaliser. McMahon said 'I shall remember that when Palace come to us. It was outrageous.. But Palace Manager Dave Bassett retorted, 'Leitch was injured near the touchline, got up, and carried on. Then he chose to collapse in the middle. He just wanted to waste time. Why did he not stay down on the touchline? If that is the only way that Swindon can win games, I feel sorry for them.'

Leitch said, 'I ran from the touchline before going down because I did not want the Manager to haul me off. Bassett can say what he likes about me. We have got the points and that is what counts.'

Midfielder **Kevin Watson** has been yet another victim of the harsh winter. He scored the best goal of his career earlier this season and then saw it frozen out. The ex-Spurs Player scored from 25 yards in the home match against Grimsby, but less than a minute later Referee Mark Halsey called the game off because of the frozen pitch.

The 22 year old said, 'It was like a skating rink out there and the game should not have gone ahead,' Manager Steve McMahon did not agree with him and was furious at being robbed of the lead. He said, 'I do not know why the Referee could not wait till half time when he could have spoken to both managers.' The Referee said, 'Both sets of Players pleaded with me to call the game off before the goal went in.'

First team coach **Mike Walsh** was one of the most wonderful centre-halves ever to play for Bolton Wanderers.

Club Captain **Mark Seagraves** is a model professional who is happy playing at a level where he can make a real contribution. The

Merseysider was formerly with Manchester City and Bolton.




If it comes down to choice between winning friends and winning matches, Swindon player-manager Steve McMahon is only ever going to vote one way.







The United defence proved to be the heroes of the game as they kept out the Wanderers frantic pressure for the opening half hour. Bolton threw everything at them and the man who wanted to put one over on them failed in the 19th minute.

Discarded by United as a youngster, Hugh Curran, one of the most experienced strikers in the game, lost his composure in front of goal just when he had the opportunity to open the scoring.

United got what turned out to be the winner on the half hour.

Stewart Houston clears off the line for United

A corner by Steve Coppell, who was making his full first team debut, was headed onto the bar by Stewart Houston. The rebound fell to Stuart Pearson to head into the corner of the goal. Bolton tried desperately after the sickener but could never recapture their early rhythm.

Marco Minchella makes his fourth appearance for the Scottish youth international side when he comes on as a substitute against England at a windswept Gigg Lane. England run out 4-1 winners.

19th FEBRUARY 1997

Scott Taylor wins his first representative honour with the Wanderers when he makes a substitute appearance for the Nationwide Football League under 21 side against their Italian counterparts in Genoa. The League came from behind to draw 1-1 with their goal coming from another substitute, Charlton's Shaun Newton.





22nd FEBRUARY 1997

The Wanderers come from behind to win 2-1 against Huddersfield at the McAlpine Stadium.

It is the first time that the Wanderers have managed to hit two goals at Huddersfield in a League game since March 1952.

Both goals came from the Wanderers defensive duo of Chris Fairclough and Gerry Taggart. Fairclough equalised in the 23rd minute whilst Taggart swooped for the winner in the 47th minute. The Wanderers showed plenty of character, having gone behind to a back post header from Tom Cowan in the 17th minute, they levelled when Fairclough notched his fifth of the season.

It was set up by Scott Sellars, whose cross found John McGinlay and although Steve Francis made a good save Fairclough was on hand to head into the net.

Two minutes after the interval a Sellars corner was only cleared as far as Per Frandsen and he put the ball back in for Taggart to run in and head beyond Francis.



24th FEBRUARY 1997

Work on the Wanderers' new stadium is on schedule and the club are confident that it will be ready for the new season.

Even so, both the Football League and the Premier League have been informed of the tight schedule, leading to contingencies being set up.

25th FEBRUARY 1997

The youth side went out of the Lancashire FA Youth Cup when Everton ran out 2-1 winners in an afternoon fixture staged at Hilton park, Leigh.

Everton came from behind, just as they had done in the FA Youth Cup at Burnden in January, their winner coming four minutes into the second period of extra time.

Marco Minchella had put Bolton

ahead in the 18th minute and the Wanderers had a number of chances to increase that advantage without success.

Everton equalised with fifteen minutes remaining and took the tie as the Bolton lads ran out of steam with injuries taking their toll.



26th FEBRUARY 1997

The reserves record their first back to back win when Blackburn Rovers are defeated 2-0 at Burnden. Both goals come after the interval from Scott Taylor, his eleventh of the season, and Steve McAnespie, his first of the campaign.

COLLECTOR'S

Programme Collecting for Non-Anoraks! A series of articles by the Editor of PROGRAMME MONTHLY magazine describing the different varieties of programmes that can form a collection.

FIRST LEAGUE CUP COMPETITION

We have mentioned earlier in this series that League Cup (now Coca-Cola Cup) programmes are an attractive series to collect, as they stretch back 'only' 37 years. Since the competition was launched as comparatively recently as 1960-61 season, a most interesting sub-set to collect are the programmes from the first-ever League Cup competition.

But be warned - many of these are very much sought after by collectors, and fetch inordinately high prices in offers.

The reason for this is that the competition was not taken terribly seriously in its early years and many clubs adopted a half-hearted attitude in the first season. Upsets, according to League position, were numerous and many of the larger clubs anticipated the lower

attendances the struggling competition attracted, and printed programmes to suit.

There are, therefore, many single sheet and folded-sheet programmes, as clubs thought the competition unworthy of a full programme, and (while the limited print runs probably satisfied those who attended the match) it meant that fewer have survived for collectors almost four decades later. Even if a collector's ambitions do not run to a full set of these programmes, it is worth keeping an eye open for them turning up, as most of them are now quite valuable.

Take, for instance, the Exeter City-Manchester United match. City issued a full programme, but it is now very much sought after, particularly by the army of United collectors. The replay at Old Trafford, a 12 page effort, is not particularly scarce, but will fetch four or five times the price of a normal 1960-61 League programme. Coventry City issued a four-page programme for the visit of Barrow in the first round, and this is now extremely scarce, as is the four-page Everton programme for the visit of Accrington Stanley.

A crowd of 18,246 attended the match, compared with Everton's average of 43,450. Accrington played just two league Cup games before they resigned from the League, the other being at Lincoln in season 1961-62. The programme from that game is an even rarer single sheet!

In the first round Bolton
Wanderers drew 0-0 at Hull, who
issued a 16-page programme,
while Wanderers produced an
8-pager for the replay, which they
won 5-1.

In comparison with others that season, the Burnden programme is not particularly difficult to obtain, nor is the one issued for the second round tie against Crimsby Town (another 8-pager).

In the third round Bolton set the ground attendance record at The Feethams, as Darlington issued a full 16-page programme. Expect to bid up to \$10 for that one, although the home side printed accordingly to accomodate a massive 20,724 all-ticket crowd. Bolton's initial League Cup run came to an end at home in the fourth round, with eventual finalists Rotherham United winning 2-0.


Another 8-page programme was done for this tie, and it is only slightly harder to obtain than the two home programmes from that season.


Among the many other programmes from that season's competition to look out for are two issued for the Burnley v. Nottingham Forest tie - the first was for the postponed game on the 19th December and the second for the fixture which was played on the 10th January. Bids for each of these programmes start at \$20.


The Portsmouth v. Chelsea programme for the 4th round tie is an extremely rare single sheet; the Southampton v. Leeds United programme in the same round is also hard to get hold of, while perhaps the most difficult programme from the 1960-61 League Cup competition is the one published for the Chesterfield v. Leeds United clash.

This tie kicked-off at 2.15pm and attracted only 2,021 spectators - the four-page folded sheet now fetches in excess of £100.





TONY DUNNE

Dublin born full back Tony Dunne began his career with League of Ireland side Shelbourne. He went on to win practically every honour in the game with Manchester United before seeing out his career with the Wanderers which included a second division championship medal in 1978. He joined the Old Trafford club in August 1956 and went on to make 414 appearances, collecting League Championship, FA Cup and European Cup winners medals. He was a regular in the Eire side and won a total of 33 caps, nine of which were won whilst he was at Burnden Park. Jimmy Armfield signed Dunne in August 1973 when the full back was already 32 years old. He made his debut on the opening day of the season in a 1-0 reverse at Bristol City and didn't get a run in the side until later that term when Don McAllister moved into the middle of defence. He became a regular in the Bolton side that consolidated their place in the second division under lan Greaves and then pushed for promotion

In April 1979 the Wanderers went to Manchester United and won 2-1 with Dunne, Willie Morgan


to the top flight in three consecutive seasons.

He was still a regular in the Bolton side at 37 but one of his final games for the club came at his old




A more straight forward route than some of our more recent Southern expeditions, this one. Take the M6 to join the M1, looking to leave the Motorway along the A14.

Leave the A14 at the sign for Ipswich West and North, passing over two roundabouts before entering Bury Road which itself eventually becomes Norwich Road.

After a short distance of less than two miles, you will aarrive at another roundabout opposite a pub (The Inkerman) where you must turn right, following signs for Colchester on the A12 into Chevallier Street. Carry straight on for just under a mile, passing over a set of traffic lights and eventually turning into West End Road.

Here you must turn left for the ground's parking spaces in Chancery Road. For the ground itself, continue into Chancery Road and you will see the actual floodlights directly ahead of you.

At the T-Junction turn left into Princes Street and then left again into Portman Road. If you get lost around the two, a good idea is to look out for signs to the Railway Station which is situated near to the Ground.
