












welcome to today's game



A lot has been said about the controversial decision made by the referee at Bramall Lane last Saturday when a perfectly good goal by Ty Gooden was disallowed.

Suffice to say I was in no doubt that the goal should have stood as the ball had already crossed the line when George Ndah hammered it in as part of his celebration.

Turning point

We were robbed of a good goal and the referees decision to rule it out for off side was a major turning point in the game. At that stage we would have been 2-1 up and in complete control but instead Sheffield came back to sneak the points with a late goal which left us with nothing to show for all our effort.

I thought we played really well, especially in the second half and to go to a place like Sheffield and play the way we did was encouraging.

We deserved something from the game and I don't think Sheffield United could have complained too much if we had returned home with all three points.

Binning Aarn

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of Birmingham City Football Club to the County Ground.

We hope you all enjoy your trip to Wiltshire and that you have a safe journey home after the match. One of the First Division's biggest clubs, and an outfit which has spent millions trying to secure top flight football in recent seasons, Trevor Francis' side have endured something of a roller-coaster ride so far in 1997/98.

They started the season at breakneck speed, notching up four wins and a draw in their first five games, with last season's top scorer Paul Devlin and new signing Peter Ndlovu in great goalscoring form.


However, there then followed a devastating run of just one victory in 14 matches as the club slipped out of contention and rumours began that Francis' days were numbered in the St. Andrews hot-seat. But former **England international Francis** was given a huge vote of confidence by his board - who promised him at least another 18 months in office - and Blues got back to winning ways with a 2-1 victory over Portsmouth at the end of November. Architect of that triumph was ex-Chelsea man Paul Furlong, who scored both goals to underline his return to form. And that win was followed by another three points away at Port Vale, when on loan Tony Cottee, from Premiership Leicester, did the damage for Blues.

Last Saturday Birmingham recovered from the shock of going a goal down to Manchester City after 88 minutes to pull of a remarkable 2-1 win in a thrilling finale. Nicky Forster and Martyn O'Connor both scoring in the last minute to keep the team's

revival on track.In goalkeeper lan Bennett Birmingham possess one of the division's most highly-rated young stoppers, while City can also call on the services of some famous names in defence, such as Gary Ablett (ex-Everton), Steve Bruce (ex-Man Utd) and Darren Wassall (formerly Nott'm Forest).

The recent signing of midfield playmaker Chris Marsden from Stockport has added an extra dimension to their play, while they are able to mix things around up front, using the likes of target men Kevin Francis and Furlong to complement smaller, quicker players like Nicky Forster and Tony Cottee.

As for the free-scoring Devlin, he appears to be on his way out of St. Andrews, despite his impressive goal tally. Already transfer-listed at around £2 million, the unsettled player saw his price tag slashed to £600,000 following a touchline bust-up with Trevor Francis recently.

Trevor Francis the manager

It was a case of 'the return of the prodigal son' when Trevor Francis was appointed to the Birmingham City manager's chair in succession to Barry Fry during the summer of 1996.

For many fans, Francis epitomises everything that is good about St.Andrews, and he certainly brought back memories of brighter days for the Club.

As a player he was a teenage sensation for Blues, making his debut as a 16-year-old and scoring four goals in one match against Bolton in February 1971. He went on to become Britain's first £1million player when he transferred to Nottingham Forest in February 1979.

At Forest Francis scored the winning goal in the 1979 European Cup Final and picked up another winners' medal the following year before moving on to Man City and later enjoying a spell in Italy with Sampdoria and Atalanta.

He returned to Britain to play for Glasgow Rangers before taking his first managerial job - an ill-fated stint as player-boss at QPR - in December 1988. After a brief stay at Loftus Road he joined Sheff Wednesday, initially as a player, but when Ron Atkinson parted company with the Club in 1991, Francis was promoted 'upstairs' once more.

He led the Owls to third place in the old First Division in his first season, and then took them to both major domestic cup finals the following year, although both were lost to Arsenal.

After a period out of the game, Francis was tempted back into management by Birmingham in the summer of 1996 as the Club searched for a big name to act as the figurehead for ambitious plans being put into place at St.Andrews.

A series of high-profile, big money signings quickly followed and, although Blues didn't get off to the best of starts, they rallied to finish in tenth spot in Division One.





5 YEARS AGO

There was no early Christmas present for Glenn Hoddle's men when they travelled to Leicester. A disastrous first half hour saw Swindon fall three goals behind. David Oldfield opened the scoring after his own header had rebounded off the bar in the 11th minute. Further goals from David Lowe and Julian Joachim

followed and then John Moncur limped off with damaged knee ligaments. Micky Hazard pulled a goal back for Swindon, volleying home a pass from substitute Steve White. Any hopes Swindon had of saving something from the game were dashed when Lowe scored his second goal of the game in the 60th minute and 4 minutes later Colin Calderwood received his second

yellow card of the metch and became the fifth Swindon player to be sent off in seven visits to Filbert Street. An own goal by City's Steve Walsh completed the scoring. Goals by Paul Peschisolido and John Frain earned Birmingham City a point in their home game with Watford but they remained just three places from the foot of the Division One table.

10 YEARS AGO

Swindon suffered their fifth successive away defeat at Bramall Lane. Hans Segers had to be on top form in the first half to keep out Bobby Barnes

but the only goal of the game was scored by Sheffield's Richard Cadette when he headed home unmarked following a corner in the 61st minute. Swindon's Jimmy Quinn, with 20 goals, was still the Second Division's leading scorer. City went down 2-0 at Blackburn. They held a mid table position in Division One but by the season's end had slipped to 19th position.

15 YEARS AGO

Paul Rideout set Swindon on the road to victory when he converted a 42nd minute penalty awarded for hands. Opponents Hartlepool were unlucky not to get a penalty themselves early in the second half but further goals by Andy Rowland in the 64th and 73rd minutes gave Swindon a comfortable win which left them just two points behind Bury at the top of the Division Four table. A goal by full back David Langan was not enough to stop City slipping to a 2-1 defeat at White Hart Lane.

It plunged them into a perilous 22nd spot in the Old First Division but at the end of the season they won five of their last six matches to avoid the drop. Trevor Francis was cleared of writing *obnexious comments** about Italian football in his autobiography.

FLASH-BACK

The 1972-3 season saw Birmingham City's manager, Freddie Goodwin, talking about his Birmingham City team having the ability to have a good Cup run with the possibility of getting to Wembley. Swindon Town struggling at the foot of Division Two hardly seemed to be the sort of team that would give City too much trouble even if the Moonrakers had the advantage of a home tie. "Donald would have been the only man we might have feared" said Stan Harland, skipper of the City team and the man who had led Town to their

League Cup triumph in 1969, in a reference to the Town star recently sold to Crystal Palace, much to the annoyance of the Town fans. As it was, it was to be another Town winger, Dave Moss who, on his Cup debut, stole the show and caused a Cup upset. Lashed by manager Les Allen after a 3-0 defeat at the hands of Bristol City, Town responded with a much improved performance against their first Division opponents. The first goal did not come until the 52nd minute when Moss set up Joe Butler who hammered a left foot volley into the roof of the net. Then, in the 78th minute, Moss was hauled down




December 11th




December 13th


After a couple of days off we returned to training with our sights set on a busy Christmas programme. With lots of points up for grabs in a short space of time it was an important period to prepare for.





Obviously, due to the high reward for the winner, the competitive spirit has been extremely high and both Jon and I have been very impressed with the local standard.



"We're always looking for kids to join the Club's Centre of Excellence through our Soccer Centres and Daniel has made great progress through that channel.





probably the ultimate
Christmas gift for the true
football connoisseur.

It comes out of the same stable as the best selling Ultimate Encyclopaedia of Soccer (which every fan should have on his bookshelf) and is just as illuminating.

Excitingly designed, the pages leap out at you while the text, beautifully crafted and splendidly informative, keeps you gripped as you speed through a brief history of the development of football.

The bulk of this work centres on competition in Europe and thus gives us a concentrated account of events from the 1960s, when club competition evolved through the industrial Inter-City Fairs Cup, when Birmingham City featured prominently, to the major European Cup clashes of 1997.

For those who like statistics there is a complete record of all the finals from 1958 to 1997 - Birmingham winning the Fairs Cup in 1960 and 1961 and an account of the footballing heritage of all the nations affiliated to UEFA and features on the top 100 mega stars of the contemporary European football scene.

Illustrated with 174 colour

photographs and 43 classic black-and-white - I particularly liked the 1897 team pic of Juventus in their pink shirts this book has something for everyone.

Rothmans Football Yearbook 1997-98. Yes I know this comes out in August and used to be the pride and joy of every enthusiasts' collection but since prices rocketed not so many have been able to nip out

and buy one. If the football mad person in your household has not got one then this could be the time for you to put that right. For 28 years this yearbook has been the bible of the professional game. It provides the most comprehensive record of last season that you can get with four pages allocated to each Premiership and League club.By referring to page 336 you can see that in this corresponding fixture last season we beat Birmingham City 3-1 with goals from Bullock, Broomes and Cowe.

There's not much that has not been written about this standard of English domestic football which is a statisticians dream. I always find the Milestones diary of day-to-day events a great read and of course in keeping with modern trends it now also gives full coverage to women's football.

Now if you are looking for something a little cheaper as a stocking filler how about The Official FA and England Yearbook. It tells you all you want to know about our national team with complete results from that very first skirmish with Scotland back in 1872. With match reports on last season's fixtures and all the line-ups in the full England XI since 1946, plus Under-21 and "B" caps and results and stats on all competitions under the FA banner, it is an essential record. If you want to know how Swindon Town fared in the FA Cup or the FA Youth Cup last season, the answers are here in 196 pages. A good buy.

Another suggestion for a stocking filler is the Playfair Football Who's Who 1998. Compiled by Jack Rolling, it provides the most comprehensive A-Z listing of British players featuring everyone in the FA Carling Premiership, Nationwide Football League and Scottish Premier Division.

There are no pictures in the 442 pages but if you are keen on players' appearances etc this is a handy reference book to have at hand. We know how many goals Chris Hay has netted this season but how many did he shoot for Celtic last term? It's all in this compact edition with every player's individual records broken down season by season.


City were boosted by the return of German striker

On target with one of them was Steve Finney and it was nice




to see him get on the scoresheet However it was the result that was more important and those three points kept us up in contention in the top six of Division One.


As you know we take a break from league action in a couple of weeks to play in the third round of the FA Cup.

during that game but there were also some things I did that weren't so good, although overall I was fairly satisfied with my first game in a Swindon shirt."






