The Man In Charge Steve McMahon

Led Swindon to the Second Division Championship during his first full season as player/manager, making 21 appearance along the way. Rates this as the highlight of his career so far, despite having collected almost all the honours available for both Club and country as a player. Playing appearances limited to just one as a substitute last season and it looks increasingly likely that a persistent back injury will soon force him to concentrate purely on management. Began his career at Everton, making 100 League appearances before a £175,000 move to Aston Villa. Kenny Dalglish then took him to Liverpool for £375,000 where he emerged as a midfield general of the highest quality, bagging League and F.A. Cup winners medals during the glory years at Anfield. Also gained international recognition with 17 full England Caps and was a member of the 1990 World Cup squad in Italy. Later moved to Manchester City before taking charge at Swindon in November 1994. Born: Liverpool 20.8.61

Goalkeepers

Jimmy Glass - Former Bournemouth number one snapped up on a free transfer in the Summer. Started his career as a trainee with Crystal Palace before seizing the chance of first team football at Dean Court. His goalkeeping heroics helped Bournemouth reach last season's Auto Windscreens Shield Final at Wembley where he was unlucky to finish on the losing side. Born Epsom 1.8.73.

Frank Talia - Spotted playing for Australia's Under 21 team and after trials with several English clubs, eventually signed for Blackburn Rovers in August 1992. Failed to make a first team appearance and was brought in on loan at Swindon before signing in November 1995. Hoping to be back to his best after surgery on the knee injury which sidelined him for most of last season. Born Melbourne, Australia 20.7.72.



Defenders

Mark Robinson - Started his career at West Bromwich Albion, joined Barnsley on a free in June 1986 and such was his form there that Newcastle snapped him up for £450,000 in March 1993. After losing his place in the first team through injury, Swindon paid a club record £600,000 for his services in July 1994 and he has been a regular and consistent performer since then. Can play at full-back, central defence and was also a success as a sweeper last season before injury ruled him out for three months. Born Rochdale 21.11.68.

Brian Borrows - This former Everton, Bolton and Coventry defender signed an 18 month contract in November 1997 following a highly successful two month loan spell from Highfield Road where he made well over

400 appearances. Comfortable anywhere along the back line as a marker or a sweeper, Brian won manager Steve McMahon's vote as player of the year last season. Born Liverpool 20.12.60.

David Kerslake - Now enjoying his third stint at the County Ground having joined on a free transfer from Ipswich Town in March 98. Made 165 appearances for Swindon in his first spell before leaving to join Leeds United in a £500,000 deal. Later also played in the Premier League for Tottenham. Most effective in right wing back role though he was also deployed as a sweeper towards the end of last season. Had a loan spell at Wycombe last season making a total of 11 first team appearances. Born Stepney 19.6.66.

Sol Davis - Left-sided fullback/wing back who was offered his first pro contract in the summer of 1998 after a series of impressive performances in the reserves. Made his League debut as a substitute at home to QPR, shortly after his 18th birthday. First start in a Swindon shirt came six months later in the heat of a local derby clash away at Oxford United. Born Cheltenham 4.9.79.

Gareth Hall - Joined from Sunderland in May 1998 under the Bosman ruling. Versatile player, who can operate at fullback, centreback or in midfield. Made more than 100 League appearances for his first club Chelsea, where he played under former Swindon boss Glenn Hoddle, before moving to Wearside in a £250,000 deal in December 1995. Capped nine times for Wales. Born Croydon 12.3.69.

Alan Reeves - Left Wimbledon's Crazy Gang in search of first team football with Swindon. Cost the Dons £300,000 when signed from Rochdale as a replacement for John Scales four years ago, but arrived at their County Ground on a free under the Bosman ruling. Tall centreback, he can be a danger in attack on set pieces as well as adding experience at the back. Born Birkenhead 19.11.67.

Midfielders

Darren Bullock - A tough tackling midfielder, Darren signed a three and half year deal in February 1997 after a £400,000 move from Huddersfield Town. Scored 20 goals in 156 appearances for the Terriers and netted on his debut for Swindon Town against Birmingham City. But the goals have since dried up and a loss of confidence and form cost him his place in the side for a short period last season. Can always be relied upon for 100 per cent, bulldog spirit. Born Worcester, 12.2.69.

Ty Gooden - Signed by John Gorman in 1993 having been released by Wycombe Wanderers. Established himself for the first time in Swindon's Second Division Championship season and was ever-present last term until troubled by injury towards the end of the campaign. A good crosser of the ball, who packs a fierce shot in his

left boot, he can play in midfield or as an attacking left wing back. Born Canvey Island 23.10.72.

FORWARDS



Chris Hay - This pacey young striker was drafted in from Scottish giants Celtic for £330,000 a week before the 1997/98 campaign started and looked a real bargain when scoring 13 goals in 20 appearances before Christmas. A sudden loss of form, coinciding with sale of fellow frontman Wayne Allison, meant he added just one more to that tally. Confessed to being homesick for Scotland, but has vowed to get back to his goalscoring best this term. Born Glasgow, 28.8.74.

Mark Walters - A former England international, Mark signed for Town in July 1996 after being released by Southampton and immediately showed the silky skills which had made him such a hit at Aston Villa, Glasgow Rangers and Liverpool. Scorer of some sensational goals for the club, he signed off for the summer with a solo spectacular in the final game of last season against Sunderland. Born Birmingham 2.6.64.

Kevin Watson - Came through Tottenham's junior ranks and made 12 first team appearances for Spurs under Terry Venables before being loaned out to Bristol City and Barnet. Joined Swindon on a free in July 1996, and has made his mark with some superb displays in the midfield. Packs a powerful shot from long range. Born Hackney 3.1.74.



George Ndah - After the departure of Wayne Allison to Huddersfield, Steve McMahon moved quickly to find a replacement and was delighted to pick up the lightning quick Ndah from Crystal Palace in a £500,000 deal in November 1997. Scored a stunner on a his debut against Middlesbrough, but missed the last few games of the season with a knee injury. A former England Youth international. Born Dulwich 23.12.74.

Philippe Cuervo - This gifted Frenchman impressed during a trial period and was quickly signed on a three year contract from Sochaux (free transfer) just before the start of last season. Was a revelation during the first few games but then spent several months out with a hip problem. Rangy running styles makes him look awkward at times, but belies his undoubted skill on the ball. Born Ris-Orangis, France 13.8.69.

Forwards

Ifem (Iffy) Onuora - Ex-Huddersfield, Mansfield and Gillingham striker, who was signed in a £100,000 deal in March 1998. Made the perfect start for his new club, heading the winning goal on his debut v QPR. But his luck changed for the worse four games later against Charlton when an accidental clash with the referee left him with a fractured cheekbone and he finished the season playing in a special, protective mask. Born Glasgow 28.7.67.

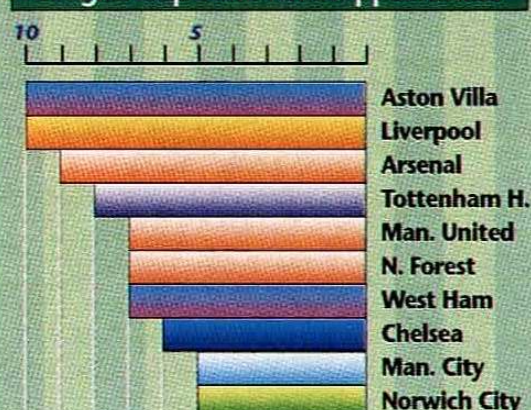

WYCOMBE WANDERERS AND THE LEAGUE CUP



(Programme Editor Adrian Wood with some "anorak" facts and figures)

1. This is our sixth season in the League Cup Competition. We have yet to reach the third round - we've reached the second round on three occasions, and fallen twice at the first hurdle. All our matches to date have thus been played over 2 "legs".
2. Swindon Town will be only the eighth different opponents we have faced - we have however drawn Leyton Orient twice.
3. At home we've played 8 "legs", winning 4, drawing 2, and losing 2. The largest attendance at Adams Park was 7,443 for the second round visit of Manchester City in 1995/96. In the same season only 3,310 saw the visit of Leyton Orient - our lowest for a home League Cup fixture.
4. On our travels, the largest attendance was 11,474 for our visit to Manchester City in 1995/96. This is the only time we have played a League Cup tie in front of a five figure crowd. Our lowest away attendance was 2,478 - at Leyton Orient in 1995/96.
5. We have won just one away League Cup fixture - 2-0 at Leyton Orient in 1993/94, our first ever game in the Competition. Of the remaining seven away legs, we've drawn two, and lost five.
6. We have netted a total of 21 goals in the 16 individual matches - we have conceded 25. We scored four against Coventry City at home in 1993/94, but have conceded four twice - away to Manchester City in 1995/96 and at Fulham last season.
7. Keith Scott is our leading goalscorer in the competition with 3. There are four players each with 2 - Keith Ryan, Terry Evans, Miquel Desouza and John Williams.
8. Two of our second round matches went to extra time. Both second legs were at Adams

Park and each time we were eventually defeated - by Coventry City (1993/94) and Nottingham Forest (1996/97).

9. During 1995/96 we went four and a half hours without scoring - the first round (2nd leg) against Leyton Orient, and the two second round legs against Manchester City.
10. With both Paul Hyde and Paul Hardyman "seeing red", we ended the 1995/96 game at Orient with 9 players. Fortunately reserve keeper Chuck Moussaddik was on the bench that night and thus made a rare first team appearance.

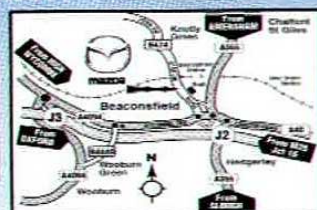

The excitement started early on - in the eighth minute Ndah seized on a Cousins' error but shot wide of the far post, then a minute later Read went agonisingly close with a lob from a tight angle. Swindon enjoyed most of the possession but Wycombe countered with some good passing movements. McCarthy however was somewhat fortunate to escape a second booking for a foul on the dangerous Hay. With the half time interval beckoning, Stallard ran onto a long Taylor clearance but shot just wide of the far post. Taylor then saved superbly from Hay but from the resulting corner The Robins took the lead - psychologically a desperate time to concede a goal. The end to end action continued after the break. Cornforth created excellent chances for first Stallard, then for Read, which both went begging. It took however a superb reflex save by Taylor to deny Swindon a third goal when a Walters cross took a wicked deflection. That kept the tie very much alive with everything to play for this evening.

Just For The Record

(Some facts about today's visitors unearthed by Neil Smith)

Remarkably, Swindon's record League victory - a 9-1 success over Luton Town - came in their first ever Football League match in 1920. They were soon brought down to earth with a bump however - losing 4-0 to Southampton in their next fixture.

During the 1965/66 season Swindon appeared to have unearthed a genuine goalscoring centre forward when Keith East struck rich scoring form. Signed from Portsmouth (where he had failed to break through) he scored four goals against Merthyr in the F.A. Cup, and then went one better with five against Mansfield Town the following week. Goals then followed in the next two fixtures. It was not however to last - within 12 months he had departed for Stockport County, not quite the player they had hoped. Swindon have the distinction of being the last non-League club to reach the last four of the F.A. Cup. Then members of the Southern League, they did so in 1912 when beaten by Barnsley after a replay. Two years earlier they had also been beaten at the penultimate hurdle when losing to Newcastle United 0-2. There is little chance that this record will ever be eclipsed.

Little should be read into a club's start to a new season. Look at Swindon during their record breaking season 1985/86. They were eventually promoted by the first week in April and totalled a record 102 points. However, they were beaten in their opening home game by Wrexham, were beaten five times in their first eight games, and failed to score in five of those games. They were 21st in the table at the end of September. Exactly three months later they stood proudly at the top of the Division where they remained. The team were defeated just three times in the next 38 games. Some turn around in fortunes!!

Capped eight times by England and the winner of League, League Cup, F.A. Cup and Cup Winners Cup medals, Mike Summerbee remains one of Swindon's finest ever players. Yet remarkably as a boy he suffered from Polio and for a time wore leg braces.

During the 1925/26 season, Swindon found themselves trailing 0-2 to Bournemouth after just 10 minutes. By the end of the game The Robins were chirping in no uncertain fashion as they ran out 8-2 winners!

With Dannie Bulman and Andy Baird impressive up front we looked to cause Yeading's defence a number of problems but were frustrated as we failed to find the finish to our efforts. Paul McCarthy, playing his first full 90 minutes since February, nearly gifted Markman a golden chance in the 34th minute. The second half was much of a non event as both sides had to contend with the wind and driving rain. Of the few chances made our best when a chipped free kick by John Cornforth nearly opened the way for Michael Simpson, but he was denied by a well timed tackle from Yeading's number 2 Grant Eaton. While Yeading's Jerome Bioudo was uncomfortably close with a shot in the final five minutes. "All round it was a good work out for the players and it was pleasing that Macca came through after his long lay off" was Gary Goodchild's verdict.

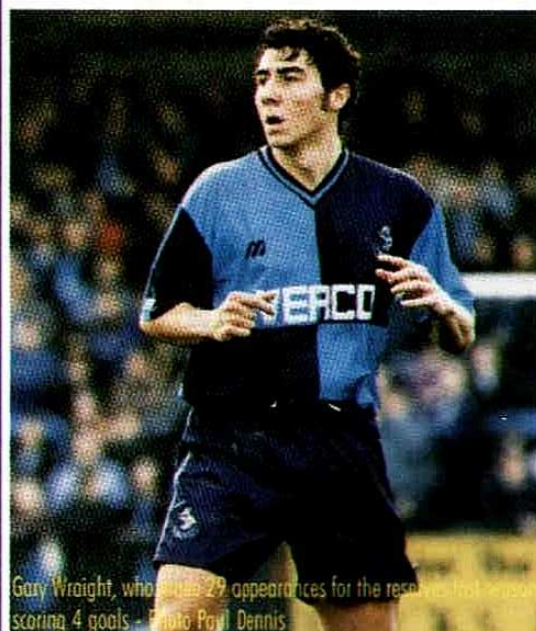

'AP REPORTING'

With better finishing in the first leg at the county Ground we could have been going into tonight's tie with a comfortable lead instead of a one goal deficit. I know that Swindon also missed some scoring chances - and in fairness they had more possession than Wycombe over the 90 minutes - but I have rarely seen Wanderers create so many clear cut openings only to finish with a single goal.

I thought our performance at Swindon was very encouraging. Remember, they are a First Division club who were playing in the Premier League only three years ago. Half their team have played at the highest level and their combined transfer fees and weekly wage bill leave our players looking like poor relations.

Remember, too that because of the away goals rule a 1-0 victory for Wycombe tonight would be sufficient to send us into the second round with the possibility of meeting a major Premiership club. The revenue generated by a couple of ties against top flight opposition could be enough to buy a new player - that's why it's so important that we do well tonight.

I know that I keep returning to the theme of finance, but in modern day football it really does rule everything that you do. We would have been delighted to give Neil Smillie a treasure chest to spend on strengthening his squad, but the money is simply not there.

I heard one or two rumbles from spectators at our opening game against Luton. They were clearly upset that the club hadn't brought in many new players during the summer break. But the cash required to fund transfer fees and players salaries has to be earned somehow and with our attendance figures it just isn't possible.

I was particularly concerned that some supporters vented their frustration against our Chairman. It is not just being loyal to a fellow director when I say that no one is more dedicated to the Wycombe cause than Ivor Beeks. I speak from the heart when I tell you that without Ivor we would probably still be playing in the Vauxhall Conference.

The Chairman devotes more time to the Wanderers than anyone at the club. He is not employed by Wycombe Wanderers - he does it because he loves the club so much. He dedicates his time at the expense of his own company and his family life and he doesn't take a penny out of the club.

We are very fortunate to have a chairman with so much drive and enthusiasm. He is very highly thought of at Football League headquarters and from personal knowledge I can say that he's a cut above many of his contemporaries. Believe me, when you're having a go at Ivor Beeks, you're having a go at the wrong man.

It's going to be a long, hard season and it's vital that we all stick together and get behind the players in every game. By all means have a moan in the bar afterwards or on your way home, but let's present a united front when we're trying to win a game.

Finally, I hope that you are impressed with the new look programme. Editor Adrian Wood does a fantastic job compiling so much material - and chasing correspondents like your columnist! He's always keen to hear ideas from fans on what you'd like to see in the programme - so feel free to drop him a line.

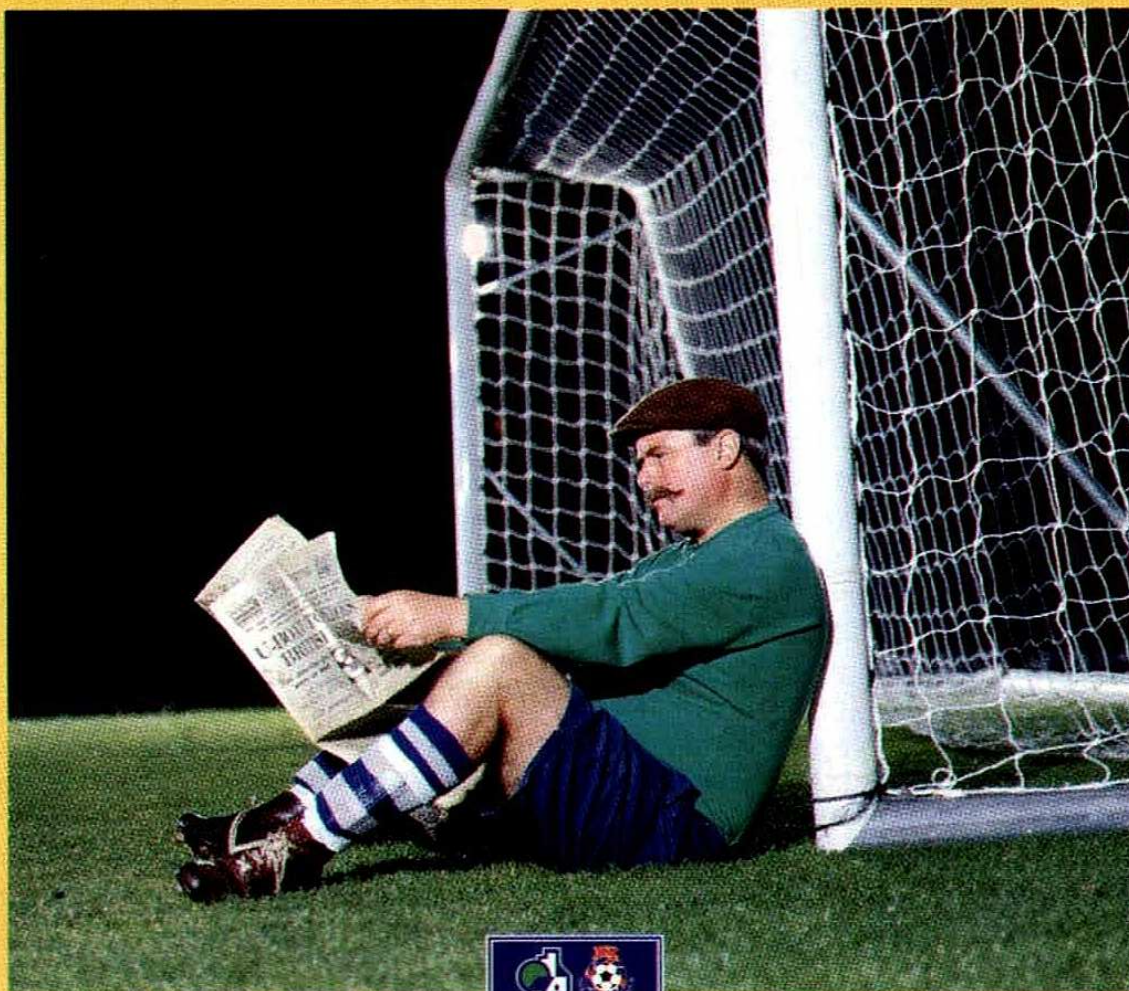

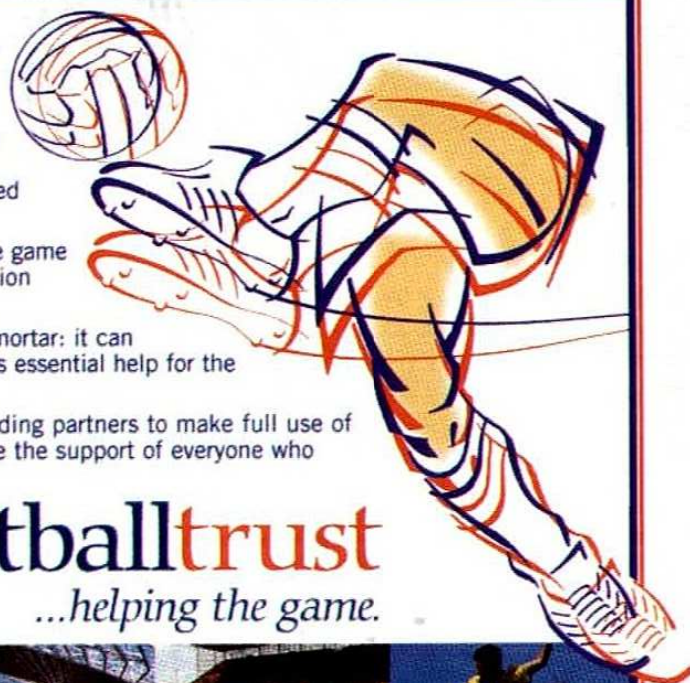

WITH ROY GRANT

Welcome to this evening's Worthington League Cup tie with first division Swindon Town. After the first leg the game's well set up for an exciting second game and Paul Read's goal could prove to be very important. In the first legs honours were even for Division One clubs with nine winners and nine losers with the other six games ending all square. Best placed for a place in Round Two would appear to be Manchester City who defeated fellow Division One Notts County 2-0 at Meadow Lane with goals from Georgian Kakhaber Tskhadadze (how I love typing that name!) and a second in injury time from Daniel Alsop. Bournemouth also won 2-0 but have to travel to Colchester tonight for the second game. Other winners were Blackpool 1-0 (Scunthorpe), Fulham 2-1 (Cardiff), Macclesfield 3-1 (Stoke - an excellent result), Northampton 2-1 (Brighton), Oldham 3-2 (Crewe), Wigan 1-0 Rochdale) with the only other away win being Chesterfield succeeding 1-0 at Rotherham. Millwall and York are up against it after losing 0-2 at home to Division One clubs whilst Wrexham after an excellent opening day League result crashed 0-2 at home to League newcomers Halifax.

A briefer than usual summary tonight so that I can take a look at the summer's transfers. Most clubs saw a lot of activity even if most of them saw more players leaving than joining, a trend backed up in a new report which saw that there is a lot less money in the Nationwide League clubs - understatement or what!! Only three clubs, Wycombe being one of them, actually increased the number of players on their books with some clubs making vast reductions to their wage bills by releasing or transferring large numbers of players. As could be expected the relegated clubs saw major outgoings with Manchester City seeing 17 players leaving with only one coming in (but then City manager Joe Royle had 54 players when he arrived and bought in five to try and keep them up). Stoke had nine go and four come in but not a penny either way in transfer monies. The third relegated side, Reading had only a small difference with five in and seven out but were the divisions major spenders (more of that in a minute). Other clubs to lose large numbers were Millwall (14), Blackpool and Burnley (11) and Oldham with ten departures. The three to increase the staff were promoted pair Notts County and Macclesfield as well as ourselves. In all 89 new players came in with 181 departing. It does prove that holding out for transfer fees cannot always be looked at as a way of making a club money, instead a saving is made by reducing the wage bills!!

Only eleven clubs in our section actually paid any money for a player during the summer with our signing from Ashford Town - Dannie Bulman, putting us in 11th spot with £10,000. Notts County were just above the signing of Gary Owers for £15,000 from Bristol City. Bournemouth's Mark Ovendale cost £30,000 from another non-League side - Barry Town whilst both Oldham (Steve Whitehall) and Lincoln (John Finnegan) splashed out

£50,000. Oldham could well afford that having sold highly rated full back Carl Serrant to Newcastle for a fee that should total £600,000. Interesting to see that he had been talked of as a £2 million player during last season - a sign that a club's hopes of a fee and the reality prove to be poles apart. Whitehall was a regular goalscorer for Mansfield whilst Finnegan was a Forest youngster. Northampton invested some of their play off money when paying £60,000 to Southampton for Duncan Spedding. Fulham came next

with a fee of around £80,000 for German striker Dirk Lehmann. Bristol Rovers acted quickly following the sale of Peter Beadle by signing former Chairboys youth player Jason Roberts from Wolves for £250,000 whilst Manchester City's only signing was unknown (to me anyway) Danny Tiatto from F.C. Baden for £300,000, funded easily with the £5.5 million received for their "star" player Georgi Kinkladze from Ajax. Interesting that the other 16 departures from Maine Road never brought in any transfer fees but saw the likes of Ian Brightwell, Kit Symons, Uwe Rosler, Gerry Creaney and Eddie McGoldrick released. Second place in the top transfer money paid out was Gillingham whose one investment was for Bob Taylor from Brentford for £500,000. They too had received major money in when they sold top scorer Ade Akinbiyi (Bristol City) for £1.2 million and promising youngster Jamie Corbett whose fee could reach £1 million when Blackburn stepped in for him. This just leaves top spenders Reading who

paid out £1.158 million on three players, they paid York £700,000 for Graeme Murty, Manchester United £300,000 for Grant Brebner and invested £158,000 to Split for Croatian winger Mass Sarr. It gave a clear indication that Reading Chairman John Madejski is looking to fill their new 25,000 stadium and gain promotion at the first time.

Other notable moves include Wrexham gaining Ian Rush on a free and selling Wayne Phillips for £400,000 and Neil Cartwright for a fee that could bring in £350,000. Walsall lost their top scorer Roger Boli to Dundee for just £150,000. Fulham sold three players with the highest fee being paid for Tony Thorpe (£1 million) after only buying him a few months before. Nine clubs paid or received no money with only Preston not adding to their squad.

So although there is little transfer movement for money there will still be some former Premiership players moving into Division One, Ian Rush I have already mentioned. Joining him are Mark Stein at Bournemouth, David Bardsley at Blackpool, John Salako and Kit Symons at Fulham, Jimmy Carter at Millwall and ex Everton defender Neil Poynton at Walsall. Manchester City are, as expected, the bookies favourites at 7-4 (put your money on now), Fulham second favourites at 5-1 then Reading at 8-1 and Stoke 9-1. Wycombe and York are 40-1 with outsiders (making them favourites for relegation) being Macclesfield, Lincoln, Colchester and Walsall all at 50-1. But then what do the bookies know!!

Record Transfer

Tall striker Keith Scott moved from Wycombe Wanderers to Swindon Town for a record £375,000 in November 1993. Moving to Adams Park from Lincoln City for £30,000 in March 1991, he starred in Wycombe's 1992/93 Conference title & F.A. Trophy 'double' triumph and was three

times leading marksman with 54 goals in 96 League outings prior to joining Swindon. He scored 12 times in 51 League games for this evening's visitor before sold to Stoke City for £300,000 in December 1994 and rejoined Wycombe from Norwich City for £55,000 last summer after a loan spell.

Promotion Winners



Wycombe Wanderers' former loanee pair Paul Bodin and David Kerslake featured prominently in Swindon Town's 1992/93 promotion campaign as they secured top flight status for the first time. Welsh international defender Bodin also starred in Swindon's 1995/96 Second Division title campaign.

Cup Hero.

One-time Wycombe Wanderers striker Alan Mayes starred as Swindon Town reached the league Cup semi-finals in 1979/80. Moving to the County Ground from Watford for £72,5000 in February 1979, he was sold to Chelsea for £175,000 in December 1980 and rejoined Swindon on a free transfer in July 1983. He was top scorer in 1983/84 and netted 65 goals in 151 League games overall prior to joining Carlisle United in July 1985. Moving to Wycombe from Blackpool in August 1987, he made ten Conference League appearances before joining Chalfont St. Peter in March 1988.

Title Triumph



Swindon Town's midfielder Ty Gooden was a member of Wycombe Wanderers' 1992/93 Conference title & F.A. Trophy 'double' squad. A former Arsenal trainee, he made 11 Conference League appearances while at Adams park prior to joining Swindon on a free transfer in September 1993. He made a significant

contribution to their 1995/96 Second Division title triumph and remains a popular member of Steve McMahon's First Division squad with eight goals in 98 League outings for the Robins to date.

Ever-Present

former Swindon Town right-back Steve Abley was ever-present for Wycombe Wanderers in 1988/89. Moving to the County Ground from Parks in October 1979, he made 23 Third Division appearances for Swindon prior to joining Witney Town in July 1982. He joined Wycombe from Cheltenham Town for £500 in July 1988 and his sole goal in 63 Conference League games came in Wanderers' 3-2 defeat at Chorley a month later, moving to Tonbridge Town in July 1990.

Posh Strike

Former Wycombe Wanderers defender Paul Franklin had a loan spell at Swindon Town during their 1986/87 promotion campaign. He joined the Robins on loan from Watford in November 1986 and his sole goal in five League outings came in that month's 2-0 victory at Carlisle United. Moving to Wycombe on a free transfer from Reading in July 1989, he netted once in 20 Conference League games prior to joining the coaching staff. Fellow defender Nigel Gray also played for both clubs.

England Semi-Pro winger Steve Guppy was a key figure in Wycombe's successes under Martin O'Neill and the first Wanderers player to score a Football League goal at Carlisle in August 1993.

A former Southampton trainee, he joined Wycombe in August 1989 and was an F.A. Trophy winner in 1990/91, then starred in the 1992/93 Conference League title & F.A. Trophy 'double' triumph. He also featured prominently as Wycombe clinched promotion via the Wembley play-offs in 1993/94 and scored 25

League/Third Division games before sold to star-studded Newcastle United for £150,000 in August 1994. He failed to make an impact on Tyneside and joined Port Vale for £225,000 three months later, playing at Wembley in the 1995/96 Anglo-Italian Cup final. Reunited with Martin O'Neill at Leicester City for £850,000 in February 1997, he missed only one Premiership game at left wing-back last season and played against Atletico Madrid in the UEFA Cup.

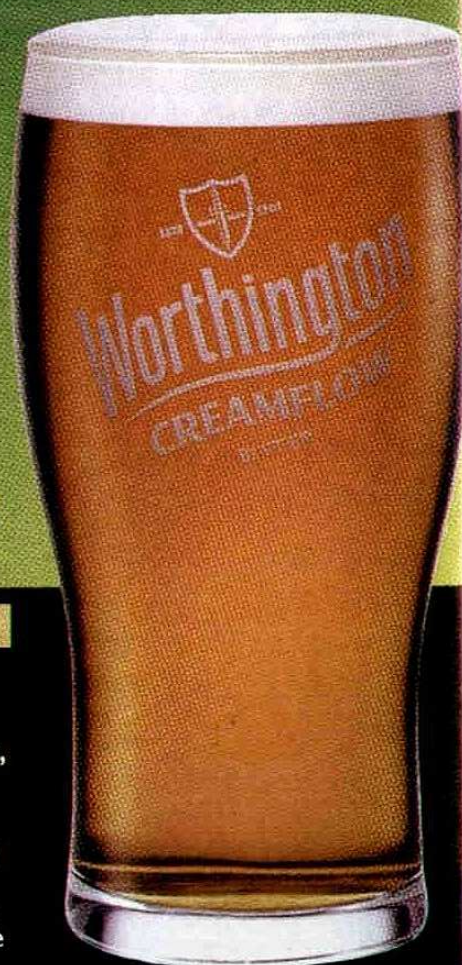

Milestones

From time to time on this page I will delve into the past and as our new mascot has been named after him, I thought I would clear up a little matter regarding our all-time maker and goalscorer, Tony "Bodger" Horseman. I know one or two of you wonder why the figures in the official history book differ to the 525 goals in 900 appearances which is always put forward. These figures are approximate and include every game he has played. When I collated the statistics for the book, I decided to only count what I considered to be competitive first team games. So, for a start, friendlies and one-off games like the Wycombe Hospital Cup (which was sometimes played against invitation XI's) were out. I also didn't include the Premier Midweek Floodlight League or the Shaw & Kilburn Floodlight League.

When we entered these competition, there was no reserve team. The object was to give the squad players a game, along with various trialists. In fact, we often borrowed players for games preceding important Isthmian League games. For one game, at home to Hillingdon in 1970, we used seven Reading Youth Team players, while, a year later, Flackwell Heath, then in the Wycombe & District League, supplied all 12 players for a game at Chesham. They performed exceptionally well and only lost by the odd goal incidentally.

I included the East Anglian Cup, Smith Memorial Cup, A.F.A. Invitation Cup, Wycombe Floodlight Cup and Mithras Cup, all of which were played when we had a reserve side and for which we always used our full first team. In fact, in it's first season (1965-66), the Wycombe Floodlight Cup had a separate reserve competition and players couldn't appear in both. The Smith Memorial Cup was a knockout competition organised by the Oxfordshire F.A. in honour of one of their long-serving officials.

Damien Markman, on for the last ten minutes, created the opening for the final goal when he threaded a pass through to Gary Patterson. His shot rebounded off the unfortunate Digby for FARRELL to fire home.

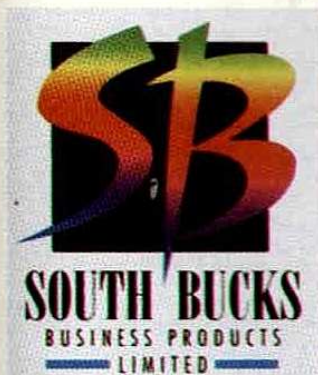
