
Since his return to Vicarage Road,

Whatever the future holds for Taylor, you can never underestimate his sides and today is no different. With plenty of noise from the crowd to get the lads going, maybe we can continue the run of unbeaten home games!



The last week has been very unsettling at Swindon Town. Now we have to focus our thoughts on the season ahead and get ourselves into the top half of the league.

One thing is for sure the attitude of the players has been exceptional and it is they who deserve credit for the games we've won recently.

Since I last
put pen to
paper for the
programme
we've faced Oxford
United and
Portsmouth. It would
be fair to say that
these were two starkly
differing performances.

Against Oxford we played well as a unit. The defence, midfield and forwards all did their job in the tense atmosphere of a local derby. In addition, we enjoyed a fabulous individual performance from Mark Walters. When you

combine all these things you have the ingredients for a cracking game and that is exactly what we got.

The 4-1 win was just what we needed to give the players some added

confidence and bring some atmosphere back to the County Ground.

It was just a shame we couldn't build on this with our trip to Portsmouth. The 5-2 scoreline tells the whole story: we created enough chances to win the game, but it was schoolboy defensive errors that cost us.

At this level you cannot afford to make mistakes in front of your own goal, if you do you will get punished.

That said, it was great to see Ndah and Onuora notch up a few more goals. The two strikers have been working very hard in training and on the pitch so the goals they score are richly deserved. If they continue in this vein they will be a big part in the success of the club, come the end of the season.

So our last two games have seen us go from the sublime to the ridiculous. Now we have to start getting some consistency against Watford and recapture our best form.

This league is about a whole season, not a couple of games, so we must start by stringing a few results together. When our two strikers grab a couple of goals the rest of the team must make sure that this means we earn the win rather than defeat.

I'd like to welcome my opposite number at Watford, Graham Taylor, to today's game. Graham is one of the great tactical managers and has shown this with Watford's promotion last season. You know that against his sides you are in for a very hard game and we are expecting no less this afternoon.

A tremendous competitor who never stops running and has an eye for goal.

## The manager GRAHAVI TAYLOR



#### The Watford manager needs little introduction.

Graham Taylor is one of the most successful club bosses of recent times, as well as having spent a three year, 38-game spell in charge of the national squad.

Now in his second spell as manager at Vicarage Road, he is once again proving his

undoubted qualities. Re-appointed as General Manager in May 1996 at the club that first took him to fame back in the 1980s, Taylor returned too late to prevent the Hornets slipping out of the First Division - but he acted quickly to secure their return.

The 1996/97 campaign was one of consolidation, but Taylor slipped on the tracksuit once more last term and inspired his side to the Second Division Championship, bringing back memories of the Watford glory days for older supporters.

It was the latest in a line of successes that the likeable Taylor has enjoyed since retiring as a player in 1972.

His first managerial appointment was at Lincoln City later that year, and he spent five years cutting his teeth with the Imps before moving on to Watford for the first time and taking the club on a dizzy ten-year ride to the heights.

He took Watford all the way from Division Four to runners-up spot in the old First Division, to an FA Cup Final (lost 2-0 to Everton) and into Europe.

In 1987 he was rewarded for his efforts with the challenge of taking over at one of the country's biggest clubs, Aston Villa. He led Villa out of the old Second Division at the first attempt, and spent three years moulding together an effective and efficient side before the ultimate challenge - the England job - was offered in the autumn of 1990.

It was always going to be a tough task following in the footsteps of Bobby Robson - who left after taking England to the Semi-Finals of Italia 90. Despite some good results, and a record that bears comparison with any of his predecessors, Taylor's relationship with the FA and sections of the media gradually deteriorated until, in 1993, he decided to call it a day.

On leaving the England post he was appointed manager at Wolves, in March 1994, but stayed only until December the following year before moving on, to be replaced by Mark McGhee at Molineux.

But Watford remained his spiritual home and, in May 1996, manager and club were reunited.





#### League Positions throughout the season






#### How The Hornets have scored goals... and conceded them





Just our luck was my initial felling as the lads came off the Vicarage Road pitch on Saturday.


Mike Walker, making his debut in their goal after signing from York City, produced a display which made one think that Ken Furphy had got a real bargain when he signed the Welsh Under 23 international. On reflection though, if we can take a point at Watford, I cannot see why we should not do even better on other away trips. Also our record of consecutive clean sheets is now extended to five matches and we are now the only club not to have conceded a League goal. For one moment I thought this record was going but Peter Downsborough produced a great save to keep out Stewart Scullion's shot.

While our defence has done well, the forward line have failed to score in three of our five League games. Chris Jones, Willie Penment and Barry Lowes are all fit now and the lads in possession of the places at present know there is fierce competition for places.

We must guard against over confidence in tonight's League Cup match against Bradford City. In the match back in my native Yorkshire last week they showed real Northern grit in coming back to equalise after it looked as though Roger Smart's header would be enough to give us victory. We must not allow the fact that they are a Division Four side to cause us to underestimate them. Tommy Hallett their captain is sure to want to put one over on his former club and the fact that Bruce Walker, who scored that marvellous goal for us in the Cup match with Forest, cannot hold down a regular place should be warning signs enough for us.

John Trollope is making good progress recovering from the broken arm sustained at Hartlepool, which ended his run of 368 consecutive games, but even so he is unlikely to be fit to play again much before Christmas. How typical of John that his main concern in hospital was to learn that we had held on to a point in his absence and how strange that he should be injured in the first game missed by Don Rogers after four seasons in which they had both been ever present.

I could not end these notes without mentioning Mr Wilf Castle, who has retired after eighteen years as Chairman.



The respect he directors was shown by the fact that he was was held in by his tellow immediately elected President of the Club. It is a matter of great regret that I have not been able to bring him a promotion to celebrate but perhaps I can do that for his successor Mr Eric Lane and, if we get the right result tonight who knows - both gentlemen might be sitting in the Royal Box at Wembley.




## weekly diary...September

The players and coaching staff enjoyed a well deserved day off.




#### Friday 11th

## Last week was an extremely difficult one for everyone here at the Club.

Whenever staff changes are made, the mood in that particular company at that time is naturally downbeat and football clubs are no different. The task for everyone concerned therefore is to pick themselves up and to be professional. This is exactly what the staff at this Club did and last week the fabulous 4 - 1 victory over Oxford was just what the doctor ordered! However, I do want to formally put the record straight regarding the issue of the so-called 'sacking' of the programme sellers which, for one reason or another, was allowed to escalate into a far bigger problem than the situation warranted. Firstly, let's be clear on one thing, the programme sellers were volunteers they were not employed by this Club and as such, they could not be sacked. For a while now, Swindon Town's match programmes have been sold by volunteers in return for a match ticket. Whilst I can understand the financial imperatives that prompted the existence of this system, it could not have been allowed to continue, not if this club is serious about it's intention to become a major First Division outfit and

ultimately to get back its place in the FA Premier League. A decision was therefore made a few weeks ago to investigate the possibility of utilising the services of Gate Promotions, a professional programme selling company, and one that is well versed in professional football and operates at several major football grounds. However, as the co-ordinator of the existing sellers was made redundant on the Monday before the Oxford match, and as we were told on the Tuesday morning that no personal records of the sellers were kept i.e. names, addresses and telephone numbers, it appeared that the Club had no chance to formally explain the situation. I then took the decision to bring in Gate Promotions sooner than was planned. All the existing sellers were given free tickets to the next 3 matches on arrival at the ground as a thank you for their past efforts and I tried personally to explain the background to the situation to several of the sellers. However as we did, the sellers found it hard to believe that we had no way of contacting them.

What then transpired was seriously disappointing and was blown out of all proportion which is regrettable.

Unfortunately, in a difficult week
when 8 good people
lost their

full-time jobs due to restructuring at this Club, the major issue that seems to have occupied everybody's time here is the fact that 24 people in three matches time will lose their perk of a free ticket. This to me is the world gone mad.

My message to everyone is simple. There are major changes happening within professional football and only the strongest Clubs will survive. The Chief Executive of the Premier League, Peter Leaver, went on record last year to state that this country can only sustain 40 professional Clubs. BSkyS's purchase of Manchester United last week, the threat of a European Super League and the likely banning of collective selling of Television rights, are all warning shots to Clubs like Swindon that, unless you get your act together and soon, the opportunity to compete with this country's top Clubs will disappear. Undoubtedly, Swindon Town has the potential to be in that top 40, but only if everyone, Directors, management, players, staff and supporters reorganise the work that needs to be done.

My final comment and it is my final comment, is that Gate Promotions would like to hear from all or any of our previous programme sellers or from any other supporter who are interested in working on matchdays. These positions, like our matchday stewards, will receive a fee. Those interested should contact Richard Mackey at the Club on

Derby games are always competitive; this one was no exception. The game was a real battle with both sides working hard in blustery conditions.

The Oxford team made it difficult for our passing tactics because they pressed and harried us at every opportunity.

The first fifteen minutes were played at a frantic pace. We found it difficult to make on impact on the opposition, although we did produce two or three good chances to go ahead.

Neil Dix had a good chance to open the scoring on the half hour mark. He reacted quickly to a poor back pass but couldn't quite connect with the ball.

At half time we reminded the players that we had to "up the tempo" of our game and get at Oxford in the final third.

The second 45 saw an improved performance as we looked more creative going forward and our strikers were starting to see more of the ball.

One such chance fell to McAreavey. It started with a good forward run by Nicky Burke who found McAreavey, but the young Irishman drove the ball across the face of the goal.

At the other end James Bittner pulled off a great save palming the ball onto the crossbar from a powerful close range shot.

After these chances, I felt we finished by far the stronger side. In the dying minutes we pushed Oxford back into their own half and pressed for a dramatic winner. Oxford had been pressing every pass we made and their players were starting to look tired but we still couldn't break the deadlock.

Oxford seemed content with the point and concentrated on surviving rather than winning. At the end of ninety minutes I felt the whole side worked very hard with both Mills and Bitner doing particularly well.

What we must change was our reaction to the way they wouldn't let us settle. Plenty of sides will do this to us, what we have to do is keep the passing sharp and take chances when they come.

But it wasn't long before we found our rhythm and moved up a gear. We started to get better supply to our front two while Beauchamp showed all his ability when running at the Swindon defence.



But after this our chances began to dry up as Swindon pinned us back. Gooden was finding too much space on the left and Ndah was starting to show his speed with the ball at his feet.


After getting beat 4-1 it is a long journey home. Hopefully we can return the favour when Swindon travel to the Manor Ground.






A As a schoolboy I played in a Warwickshire League. The standard was very good, and there were scouts watching games all the time. This was how I got trials with different clubs.

Q Were these trials your first taste of professional football?


A Yes. I had trials for Manchester United, Chelsea and Sheffield United but I decided on Coventry.

> Q Why did you choose Coventry, it is hardly the most glamourous of sides?

A No, I suppose not. To be honest I was a Coventry fan from when I was a young lad. I was at Wembley when they won the cup in 1987 so I've always had a soft spot for them, and couldn't turn them down. It wasn't just about being a fan though. The facilities at Coventry were second to none, that was also an important factor.

> Q Were your youth team days successful?

A Yes, we had a very good team. In my first year we won the League Cup and got to the quarterfinals of the FA Youth Cup. In my second year we won the League Cup again. Marcus Hall, who is now doing very well at Coventry, was a team mate of mine in those days.



# Q Those years at Coventry were turbulent times, what was it like?

A: I enjoyed three years as a pro at Coventry and saw a few managers come and go in that time. Terry Butcher signed me as schoolboy. From then, I played under Bobby Goold, Don Howe, Phil Neal, Ron Atkinson and Gordon Strachan. In many ways this was quite good, because in a short space of time you get to see the contrasting styles of different managers.



# Q But you never really broke into the first team.

A: That was the real frustration for me. To be training all week and preparing for the game on Saturday, yet the chance never comes. I was on the bench for Coventry about four times but never got on.



# Q Was that why you wanted to move on?

A: Exactly. You get to a point when you think it is time to try another club. Even though I never made it into the first eleven, those years were vitally important to my development as a player. Most importantly, of course, it meant that Brian Borrows knew who I was.



Q Brian Borrows was instrumental in bringing you to Swindon, how did that work out?

A: I was basically told that I didn't have a future at Coventry. At the same time Brian came back to Coventry during a day off from Swindon and chatted with Gordon Strachan and a few of the coaches. 'Bugsy' believed I could do a job at Swindon Town and got me a couple of trial games at the County Ground. I did reasonably well and signed a two year contract as a result.



### Q How have you settled in?

A: It has been fine. I've had the end of last season and the Ireland tour to get to know the lads and now my next priority is to get into the first team.



# Q How do you rate your chances?

A: Obviously it is going to be hard work.

Reeves and 'Bugsy' are playing well
together. I know it sounds harsh, but I'm
just waiting for suspensions and injuries
to get my chance. And when the
opportunity comes I want to keep my
place on merit.

Q It would be quite an irony if Brian Borrows had to make way for you after it was he who brought you to Swindon!

A: Yes maybe. It would be nice to take over from a Coventry legend, but 'Bugsy' is a top quality defender and has plenty of games left in him yet.






