

Jim Quinn gives his view...

When I first joined Swindon Town I said we wouldn't change things overnight.

But so far things do seem to be going in the right direction as we move away from the relegation zone.

And after playing so long without an away win it is especially pleasing to be able to talk about our 2-0 victory over Crewe. It was just a shame we couldn't repeat the score line at Bradford a week later.

Looking closer at the first game I felt we did extremely well. We knew Crewe were struggling a bit, particularly up front, but they are a good footballing side and we needed to have a

game plan.

We took the approach of defending deep because they have some good players, and they are a young team with plenty of legs that could exploit any space we left. We defended well and it was down to the big man in attack, Iffy Onuora, to bag two brilliant goals.

The fans on the day were absolutely fantastic. They really got behind the team from start to finish and this gave the players a terrific boost.

A week later we were on our travels again, this time to Bradford City. They are a good side who are battling for the playoffs so we knew it would be tough. Up to half time I felt we did ever so well without creating too much ourselves.

We defended well and when you're playing sides like Bradford who have spent a bit of money you have to give them respect. I really feel that if we'd have kept a clean sheet we could've got a point or maybe even nicked all three.

> But on the day, a refereeing decision went against us and that changed the shape of the game.

But the lads played well and the 3-0 result was not a true reflection of the game. Even when we were down to ten men we outplayed and matched them for long spells.


Neale Fenn came into the side and was terrific. He worked hard and held the ball up well alongside Iffy Onuora, who has done everything a manager could possibly ask over the last few games.

You don't mind losing to a great move or goal, but to lose to a ref's decision is always hard. But I put it down to experience and look forward to today's big game with Crystal Palace.

Palace have had a mixed season so far. They have plenty of quality in their side and have played very well, but they do seem a bit weak away from home. They are a side we have to respect, but there is no reason to fear them.

I would like welcome my opposite number, Terry Venables, to the County Ground and, of course, ex-Swindon favourite, Fraser Digby. Let's hope we can make it an unhappy return for Fraser today!

Once again I would like to pay tribute to the fans who have supported us. Football Clubs are not just about players and on a Saturday afternoon you can play as bigger part as anyone by getting behind the players and giving them a real lift.

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of Crystal Palace Football Club to the County Ground for this Nationwide League Division One game.

We hope you all enjoy the game and have a safe journey home afterwards. After the traumas of the 1997/98 Premiership campaign, you could make a case for Palace supporters being glad to be back in the calmer waters of Division One this season.

Palace endured the toughest of years in the top flight, with three managers, a succession of ill-advised purchases, a protracted and, at times, painful takeover bid, huge injury problems, and the small matter of no home wins until it was all too late. Things, as they say, can only get better.

New Chairman Mark Goldberg finally took control towards the end of the season, and he moved to install former England boss, Terry Venables, as the new head coach at Selhurst Park - although even that appointment was fraught with difficulties and took a lengthy period of time to complete.

The upheaval has continued this season. Venables has brought in a succession new faces, as well as saying goodbye to old favourites such as defenders Dean Gordon, Marc Edworthy and Herman Hreidarsson, and last season's Premiership strikeforce of Neil Shipperley and Bruce Dyer, as well as the hapless trio of Tomas Brolin. Michele Padovano and Valerien Ismael.

Recent newcomers have included Yugoslav international defender Gordan Petric, from Glasgow Rangers, striker Lee Bradbury and on-loan youngster Jason Crowe, from Arsenal, while Venables also caused a big stir with his double signing from China of internationals Sun Jihai and Fan Zhiyi.

Not surprisingly with such a massive turnaround in playing staff, results so far have been varied, although the quality of football on display has certainly been an improvement on last year.

At home, the Eagles have been in irresistible form. Last Saturday's 2-1 triumph over Bristol City was a sixth successive victory at Selhurst Park, and Palace have lost only once there in nine games so far in 1998/99.

But away from south London, Venables' troops have suffered, with only one win on their travels compared to five defeats and 28 goals conceded. Jimmy Quinn's troops - including former Palace striker George Ndah - will be keen to keep that dismal run of form going this afternoon.

But on their day, the Eagles can be mighty predators, as handsome victories over the likes of Norwich City (5-1) and Portsmouth (4-1) show.

Palace began the 1998/99 campaign as one of the favourites for promotion and, when the dust settles, they are sure to be up among the Division's front-runners once more.

He was persuaded to stay at the relegated club after the appointment of Terry Venables and has been everpresent so far in 1998/99 - scoring three goals in the process.

Able to play out wide or through the centre, Marcus scored five goals in 16 games after moving up from the Second Division for £250,000 last season. His impressive pace and skill earned him a call-up to the England U21 side during the summer, but injury sidelined him for the early part of the current campaign and he now finds himself behind Jansen and Bradbury in the Palace pecking order.

The manager TERRY VENABLES

Managerial names don't come much bigger than Crystal Palace's new head coach, the former England and Tottenham boss Terry Venables, now in his second spell with the club.

> Headhunted by Selhurst Park supremo Mark Goldberg from his role in charge of the Australian national side, Venables' career has come full circle with his return to south London.

A charismatic and highly knowledgeable football-man, Venables was a stylish player with Chelsea, Tottenham, QPR, Palace and England before beginning his coaching career under Malcolm Allison at Selhurst Park in the mid-1970s.

After 'Big Mal's' departure, Venables took Palace up from Division Three in 1977, and then into the old First Division two years later, before leaving for QPR following a boardroom row in October 1980.

Glory years followed with QPR, Barcelona and Tottenham before his sensational sacking from White Hart Lane in May 1993 and his subsequent high profile falling out with Spurs' Chairman Alan Sugar.

An appointment as England's head coach followed, and he took the national side to the Semi-Finals of Euro '96, but the FA failed to renew his contract and Venables once more moved on to pastures new, accepting a role as Australia's head coach and Chief Executive at Portsmouth.

But when Goldberg - a lifelong Palace fan - took over the Selhurst Park reigns in April, he made it his prime objective to bring back the man who had built the so-called 'Team of the Eighties'.

Venables' return caused mixed emotions in London SE25, as a number of fans still believed that

Venables was directly responsible for the club's fall from grace in the early 1980s, but his blend of charm, wit and excellent coaching credentials seem to have now won over the Palace faithful.

BOB SMITH WRITES NOVEMBER 1978

Some improvement - room for more,

is probably how I would sum up our progress so far this season.

Results, especially away from home, have been disappointing at times but we are gradually becoming more consistent. This is born out by the fact that we have won five of our last six games. Chic Bates gave us a flying start at Mansfield and despite the penalty miss by Ray McHale (incredibly we have now missed five penalties in a row) we were a lot tighter in defence and held on to secure our second away win of the season.

Injuries have been a real problem this season and already there are just five players: Andy Ford, Ray McHale, Kenny Stroud and Chic Bates who have not missed a match. Thankfully, Andy Rowland came through the reserve match against Chelsea and for the first time in a least three months all our senior players are available for selection. To further strengthen our pool of players I have signed Bryan Hamilton the Northern Ireland international for £15,000. He is a player not only of high ability but one who possesses the qualities I look for in a professional. I am certain he will help make Swindon a more successful club.

I would also like to clarify two other situations concerning players. I have always believed in honesty to players and to this end I told Colin Prophett that I consider Kenny Stroud to be the better player. Like most good professionals Colin wants first team football and I agreed to let him go when a decent offer came along. A similar situation existed with Chris Guthrie once I had signed Andy Rowlands. I have worked with Andy before at Bury where Andy showed himself to be a consistent scorer whether the team was playing well or not. In many ways he and Chris were similar players and it would be difficult to play them both in the same team. Consequently when Fulham showed an interest in Chris I let him go.

Hopefully, as time goes on we can produce more home-grown talent and, to this end, John Trollope is setting up a team for 15 and 16 year olds. This will enable us to be in a better position when it comes to selecting boys to become apprentices and will help us to begin to develop good habits in players at an

Today we welcome Shrewsbury Town, who are early age. second in the Third Division table and just four points and three places above us in the table. A win today will really see us challenging for promotion so get behind the lads and make sure to come along again next week when non-League March Town will be making their first ever visit to the County Ground in the F A Cup.





Weekly diary... Nov

Monday 9th

Nationwid

We started today with a good warm-up and concentrated on running a few laps of the pitch, then we went into small-sided games with different conditioning: two touch, below head height that sort of thing.

And then we stopped it to do some more running.

We continued with small-sided games with running in between. Despite the Crewe game being only days away we gave the players a very physical morning, although we kept the balls involved to keep the players interested.

Tuesday 10th

At the end of training today, both Iffy and Jim led teams with efforts to score from free kicks and open play, with the hope that their skills rub off on the rest of the players!

There's an element of fun to this part of the session, but naturally it develops a competitive edge - I don't think I can say which team came out on top, though!

After the session a number of the players were on the Pro Certificate run by the FA.

This is a preliminary course in football coaching and both myself and Jim feel it is important that players take part in such courses because it gives them a better appreciation of what the coaching staff are doing.

Wednesday 11th

We started today with another good warm-up followed by some medium distance running.

Then we worked on the strikers in attacking positions in the penalty area with a few defenders to oppose them. The point of this was to get the strikers used to making different runs and to sharpen up their finishing as well.

After this we were able to have a training match with eleven against eleven. We stopped and started it to show the players how to improve what they're doing.

A constructive session.

In the afternoon myself and Jim travelled over to St Albans to watch Tottenham's reserve team, in particular Neale Fenn. We'd seen him before in view of a loan deal but wanted another look before we formally approached Spurs.

Thursday 12th

Today 'Bugsy' took the warm-up, which is a follow-up to the coaching he's been trying to do.

It gives him a bit more responsibility plus it is a different voice for the players, rather than having to listen to myself and Jim all the time.

We worked on eight versus eight including the keepers. This was on the main pitch with the big area between the two goals. We played for an hour and introduced different conditions, such as two touch etc.

We then finished with getting Saturday's starting back five defending against different attacks on half the pitch. It was also the press day and there were one or two impressed comments by watching reporters.

Friday 13th


Early departure today, setting off to Bradford at 9.30am.

We all eat on the coach to save time and arrive around lunchtime, then immediately change and head for our nearby training ground. With the match now just hours away we don't want to run the players too hard. At this stage it's important to get the players to gel and become mentally tuned in to the game. The pitch for training isn't the best but we carry on with nine against nine on a small pitch to keep it tight and sharp and then we went through set pieces for tomorrow's game.

Saturday 11th

Confidence is high this morning and we arrive at Valley Parade early.

Jim has a few last minute words for the players before they go out. The first half settles down to go entirely to plan and the half-time talk is really just about "more of the same". The first incident of the second half though hands the initiative straight back to Bradford, with a penalty and a red card for Craig Taylor. We're bitterly disappointed for Craig and the team, but we just can't seem to pull it round after this. The plus points were seeing us hold out for so long and watching Neale Fenn put in an encouraging performance, especially with some great first touches.

First Team Latest

With back-to-back victories against QPR and Crewe maybe we should have expected fate to intervene in the turn around in fortunes since the arrival of Jim Quinn.

Our mini-run of unbeaten results foundered at Valley Parade, from where we managed to take only a red card and another suspension back home with us. But Swindon's stout resistance in the first half was commendable, especially with the likes of Reeves, Bullock, Leitch and Ndah all absent, and it left most travelling supporters ruing the crucial refereeing decisions that seemed to tilt the game Bradford's way.

Whilst such positives did come out of the game for us, Jim Quinn's reaction conveyed the impression that there's a long way to go for Town. He heaped praise on Bradford's front line of Lee Mills and Isiah Rankin, saying "They have probably the best pairing up front in the division." This comment came after a fortnight-long hunt for a striker to pair with multi-talented lffy Onuora -journalist, wit and just lately scorer of some classy goals. Iffy's partner turned out to be Tottenham's Neale Fenn, of

course, on loan to us for a month. Jim had travelled to see Fenn and chose him in front of one or two other possibilities, eventually securing the loan deal on Thursday night. This left Neale to complete the necessary papers in time for the 1200 Friday deadline, before rushing up on the train to link up with his new team-mates at their hotel.


Fenn was joined there by Craig Taylor, who had likewise speedily travelled to be with the squad following Jim Quinn's decision to cancel a proposed extension to his temporary transfer to Plymouth Argyle. Craig actually had two days left on his original loan contract, and our thanks go to the South Coast side for their cooperation. After a spate of injuries to the squad, Craig found himself straight back in the team but ended up facing a red card for deliberate handball. Craig will now receive a one-match ban and is likely to be out for the trip to Grimsby.

Special mention must go to Sam Campagna, who made his first team debut on Saturday, on the heels of his inclusion for the squad a week earlier.

Sam's impressive season in Tom Jones' youth structure looks as if it is maturing into greater heights after a series of consistent and high-grade performances in the 'A' youth team. Sam's appearance is the clearest signal yet to the youths that Jim Quinn is ready to promote them up to the senior level if they can prove their worth. With one eve on youth development and the other on the Club's financial plight Jim has been seen paying close attention to the reserve and youth squads since his arrival, and he has even rewarded certain YTs with inclusion in his first team training sessions.

Youth Team News

Perhaps after an indifferent start things are beginning to improve generally for our youth teams.

A brief residence at the bottom of the South East Counties League was sharply followed by victories against Cambridge (4-0) and Colchester (1-2) for our 'A' team, though they were then just shaded by top-of-the-table Luton by one goal to nil. The 'B' team also picked up a brace of wins against Bashley and Bristol Rovers, and now look to be climbing the South West Counties League after some early disappointing results. In the mid-week Wilts County FA we have maintained the run that positions us as favourites to top the League come the Spring. On Monday we earned our biggest victory so far with a thumping 14-1 result against Bemerton Heath Harlequin. This was preceded the day before in the second round of the Wilts Cup with defeat of local rivals Highworth 1-2 at The Elms.


In the Midland Cup 2nd Round here at the County Ground, Wolverhampton Wanderers' youths proved as impressive as they are expensive as they cut a 2-0 lead over Town, despite further encouraging performances by the Irishmen Paul McAreavey and Ricky Culbertson as well as 15-year-old Alan Young. Alan is actually one of Phil Cannon's Centre of Excellence players but, just like Sam Campagna, has impressed so much that Manager Tom Jones has selected him to play in a league more senior to his age.

Centre of Exellence

The Centre in which Alan has played most of his football endured unusual inactivity recently after the run of inclement weather, although the Under-13s and 14s restored order with the weekend games against Bournemouth.



Having delighted Centre Director Phil Cannon all season, the Under-13s continued to set the standard for all age groups with goals coming from Michael Pook (2), Justin McKay and Dave Stanbra. After an uninspiring performance a fortnight ago, Cannon called on some trialists for the Under-14s for what turned out to be an improved effort. Explaining his decision afterwards Cannon stated, "We realise that players will have off days but what we do expect is 110% commitment on the day of a game. Anything less isn't acceptable if these lads are to make the transition from schoolboys to professionals at any football club".







Our last home game against QPR was the type of match a physio has nightmares about.

Two of your players take each other out of the game and then a defender lands badly on his ankle. By halftime we had used all three substitutes. What more could go wrong?

Both Scott Leitch and George Ndah, the two players who collided, have been working hard to get back to full fitness. George took a nasty knock to the knee which has resulted in internal bruising. At the time of writing it is difficult to say whether he'll be back to face his old team today. But we're doing our best to make him available.

In writing these notes we have to pay tribute to the effort and determination showed by Scott Leitch. He has had 22 stitches to the deep wound he suffered against QPR yet he has been adamant he'll be back as soon as possible. He has been resting after the stitches were put in and slowly started to build up his activity. Now we are close to getting him back to full training which means he could be a possibility for today's game. Whatever happens Leitchy is a great example to his fellow professionals.

Unfortunately progress is not so quick for David Kerslake. His is an abdominal injury and these are notoriously slow healers. We have been working David hard in the gym with static bike work and swimming. All we can do is deal with it day by day and keep treating the injury.

The other casualty of the QPR game is Alan Reeves. We have started him running again which should mean a swift recovery from here.

Lee Collins continues to make steady progress with his shoulder injury. He is now up to ten lengths in the pool. He is still in a lot of discomfort and we use pain as a guide as to how much he can do.

FITNESS TIPS

As physio's we are always being asked the best way to get fit. So here are a few basic guidelines that will make your training more productive:

Always warm-up before exercise. Muscles and tendons work more effectively and effeciently when warm. You should do this for at least 15 to 20 minutes. Always have a set routine.

Don't overdo it! Your own body is a good guide to telling you when you've had enough. If you push yourself too hard you can end up with what is known as 'over-use injuries'. One of the most common injuries is the inflammation of the tendon sheaths around the wrist or ankle (tenosynovitis).

Always allow plenty of time for recovery. The human body has a terrific capacity for healing itself providing you give it time to do so. This means making sure you're not out running the day after a hard training session.

If you do pick up an acute injury, such as a sprained ankle, you should stop competitive activity immediately and apply ice and compression to the affected area. You should also rest the limb in an elevated position. If it persists always consult a physiotherapist or doctor.

If you follow these tips you should find you pick up less injuries, recover from training faster and improve your overall fitness.







STUDY CENTRE

Swindon Town Gets Hi-Tech For Kids

The County Ground is the site for an exciting new Study Centre that will give local children the chance to surf the net and learn about computers.

The Study Centre is part of a national initiative to raise educational standards in urban areas. The government, in partnership with the Premier League and the Football League, is establishing Study Support Centres where primary and secondary pupils aged 10-14 can learn after school and in their holidays.

The centre is a unique partnership between DFEE, Swindon Borough Council, Swindon College and Swindon Town Football Club. The Centre Spot bar in the South Stand has been completely refurbished to become a hi-tech Study Centre.

With 26 state-of-the-art computers the centre can accommodate a class of children with a team of student 'mentors' and youth trainees to work alongside them during their after-school sessions.

Centre manager Martin Turnbull said: "This is a really exciting project with all the parties involved wanting it to be a great success. The children and students are all volunteers. The learning experience will focus on 'real-life' activities that are fun.

"Both Fil Came of Learning Works and myself have

developed a programme for the children which includes working in a team to fulfil a challenge. There will also be individual study time when the children can have access to the Internet, CD ROM's and a library of reference books and material to research projects pr complete school homework."


The first six schools to use the centre are Drove Road Primary, Ferndale Junior, Mountford Manor Junior, Churchfields, Oakfields and Headlands schools beginning the 16th November and finishing in February. Another group of schools will then start the Study Centre course in March.

Children, parents and teachers have already been invited to a series of presentation evenings where they can begin to use the facilities.



ENGLAND Aston Villa goalkeeper Mark Bosnich is the pundits' top tip to succeed Peter Schmeichel between the posts at Old Trafford. The Danish captain says he's quitting Manchester United at the end of the season because his body can no longer take the pressure of playing two games a week. I was interested by the comments from Pat Jennings - now he truly was a world-

class keeper - who said that he thought that was eyewash and that it was more likely Schmeichel couldn't take the pressure of trying to win trophies every year.

Anyway, Bosnich would seem to be an obvious choice as he might well have been United's number one in the first place had not red tape intervened. He was at Old Trafford as a teenager but when United could not get a renewal of his work permit there were obvious problems. Alex Ferguson wanted

Mark to join a European club on loan but he did not fancy that and returned to Australia before marrying an English girl and so qualifying to return and play for Villa.

At the commencement of this season Bosnich made it clear he would leave Villa at the end of this season if they did not win anything. They are, of course, heading the chase for the championship at the moment so there could be complications if they maintain their form.

GERMANY Bayern Munich's Brazilian striker Elber has found himself in trouble. Coach Ottmar Hitzfield was not impressed when he picked up his fifth yellow card of the season and a subsequent suspension and fined him nearly £3,000. Hitzfield asks - what good to him are stars he can't play because of suspension? He imposed a similar fine on midfielder Stefan Efffenberg last month.

REPUBLIC OF IRELAND National team manager Mick McCarthy was rightly furious with FIFA for relaxing the five-day rule for the release of players to the national team prior to this week's crucial Euro 2000 qualifying tie in Belgrade against Yugoslavia. "It's a joke", he scoffed. "I've no axe to grind with the club bosses. It's FIFA I'm angry with. You either have a five-day rule or you don't!" The Yorkshire-born Irishman is quite right of course but this

again is another blatant case of the establishment running roughshod over the minnows. FIFA claim it was a "a pragmatic solution" after clubs had requested the

release of players for last Saturday's

League programme. I bet they would not
have agreed had Germany, France, Italy
or England been involved.

The truth is all the major pawns in Euro 2000 are not competing again until next March only five fixtures being played this week. And all of them, apart from the two games involving the two teams from Ireland (Northern Ireland were home to Moldova) involve the smaller fry of Europe.

Mick's team topped Group 8 with six points from two games and seven goals scored and none conceded. Croatia also have six points (7 goals for 5 against) but from three games played. So Wednesday in Belgrade

was very special, particularly as it was Yugoslavia's first game in the group.

SAUDI ARABIA Saudi's World Cup finals team were somewhat surprised when they were held 0-0 by Qatar in Bahrain. It was a game they expected to win. Saudi Arabia still lead, however, in the Gulf Cup competition.

SCOTLAND Brazilian strikers seem to be in the news everywhere at the moment. Dunfermline Athletic has managed to persuade Edinho to join them from

Bradford City on a three-month loan agreement.

The 31-year-old was in City's starting line on the opening day at Stockport but has spent most of the campaign on the bench and has yet to score this season.

SINGAPORE FIFA will have no player-release problems for an international soccer tournament to by played in Singapore later this month. The RoboCup is to be competed for by 'robot' footballers.

SPAIN Croatian World Cup striker
Goran Vlaovic is not a happy man. After
appearing in all of seven minutes of Spanish
League football after undergoing surgery on a
groin last August, Vlaovic says he is perfectly fit
but the Valencia coach Claudio Ranieri is not of
the same opinion and refuses to pay him.

Now the Croatian star wants a transfer.



UNITED Agree Belgian Link

A European
Super League may
still be some way
off, but Manchester
United are moving
onto the continent
by agreeing a formal



by agreeing a formal link-up with Belgian club Royal Antwerp.

The idea, first mooted at the end of September, will see Antwerp acting as a feeder club to make it easier for United to attract talented youngsters from outside the European Union to Old Trafford, Secretary Paul Bastio said that the idea had developed following a meeting between the two club chairmen in 1996. United youngster Danny Higginbotham, a 19-year-old defender, is already on loan at Antwerp and United manager Alex Ferguson and director Maurice Watkins travelled to Belgium on Monday to conclude a "memorandum of co-operation" between the clubs. Details of the financial arrangement between the two clubs have not been revealed but Bastio said: "Let's say that each side will bear the financial burden according to it's possibilities." Current regulations mean the UK government will not grant work permits to non-EU players unless they have been capped by their country at senior international level and even then, will not renew them unless a player appears in 75 per cent of a club's game in the first season. The scheme would see players spending two seasons in Belgium to earn EU citizenship and then moving to United without restriction.
"What we are hoping to achieve here is a co-operation with Royal Antwerp which will work for the benefit of our respective footballing businesses. "It will enable us to have a look at players from outside the European Union through the medium of the Antwerp team, whereas at the moment we cannot look at players - particularly young players - because of the immigration rules and Premier League rules," said Watkins. The two clubs will be able to play each other competitively in Europe if drawn to face each other in future despite the link-up. "There is no question of that being a problem because Manchester United would not be obtaining any interest in Royal Antwerp, so there is no conflict with any of UEFA's rules and regulations with regard to their competitions," Watkin added.





There was a spontaneous and uplifting chant from the Luton fans at Kenilworth Road when their side scored the first of two goals that dumped Premiership Coventry City out of the Worthington Cup in a third round tie.

'One-nil to the Nationwide' swept round the ground ... a call from the 9,000 crowd that put into realistic perspective the elitist views of Henry Winter in the Daily Telegraph that morning. He claimed that the League Cup could stand accused of bringing domestic football into disrepute for "distracting and draining clubs who can cover the English game in glory".

Mr Winter wrote that United and Arsenal were trying to win the European Cup ... "a crown jewel of a trophy compared with the trinket that is the Football League's beloved bauble".

Just to put the boot in a bit further, the Telegraph later that week suggested that people in the game were referring to the competition as the "worthless cup" ... a remark since repeated by Alan Green on BBC Radio Five. This argument is based on the fact that Arsenal, Manchester United and, perhaps, Chelsea and Aston Villa field 'weakened' teams in the Worthington Cup because European competition is more important to them.

> What arrant nonsense. There are 92 teams in the Premier and Nationwide Leagues and some 90 per cent of them see the Worthington Cup as a worthy competition, a chance to get to Wembley and into Europe to try, like United and Arsenal, to cover

The Worthington Cup is more than just a jewel in the Football League's crown. It is a competition that is vitally important to all League clubs, from Arsenal to York City. For many clubs, away from the elitist world of Old Trafford and Highbury, the Worthington Cup provides some 20 per cent of much needed income.


Messrs Winter and Green, who do the game in this country a disservice by their knocking remarks, should take into account a few pertinent facts before leaping into print or air space.

More people watch Nationwide football every week than watch the Premiership. A crowd of 52,495 watched Manchester United against Bury in the Worthington Cup - comparing more than favourable with Barcelona's visit to Old Trafford as Alex Ferguson chases his 'Holy Grail'. Cash-strapped Luton, Northampton and Tranmere attracted bigger crowds for League Cup games than their average attendances. The League accepts the use of squad systems by teams playing in Europe.

It is a misconception that Swindon and Palace fans are more interested in England internationals and Manchester United and Arsenal achieving European success than they are in today's game. Both sets of supporters have tasted life at the top and would like some more. But Holy Grails for both at the moment are three points this afternoon towards a play-off place at Wembley or a Cup run in the New Year.

The memory of Glenn Hoddle's days at Swindon and the Terry Venables reign at Palace are more relevant to most of you here this afternoon that Euro '96, Euro 2000 or even the long-range venue of World Cup 2006.

At least this year's Worthington Cup Final will take place with the twin towers of Wembley intact. That, on its own, makes it worthy and worthwhile.










Barnslev chairman John Dennis has turned down the latest big-money offer for Ashley Ward as he waits for the star striker to pledge his future to the Tykes.



A. I really don't know. From Jim Quinn's first game I've been put straight on the bench, so I guess he must have seen me play in the reserves before he got the job.


Q. Quinn's 'sexy football' is obviously based on having players in midfield that have skill and can pass.


Q. Among the players you're known as 'Chipper'. Why is that?




