

Justin Locke is a member of West Brom's Under-14 Centre of Excellence Team and recently scooped a National Award when playing for Menzies School in West Bromwich.

14 year-old Justin is the latest winner of the Heinz Ketchup Player of the Month award presented to the country's most talented young footballers for outstanding achievement.



Team Captain Justin has been the backbone of his school's excellent run to the 6th Round of the Heinz Ketchup Cup and his greatest achievement was scoring the golden goal in the 1-0 victory over Market Bosworth HS to reach the 6th Rd; Justin started with the ball just outside his own penalty area, dribbled past half a dozen of the opposition before slamming the ball past the 'keeper.

The Heinz Ketchup Cup, is the largest schoolboy football tournament in England organised with the English Schools Football Association. It also marks the first schoolboy competition to include golden goals and penalty shootouts to decide matches.

Menzies team coach Nick Mummery said of the young star: "Justin is definitely a future talent, as captain he certainly leads by example.

"Let's hope he follows in the footsteps of previous pupils, who have recently signed pro' contracts; Adam Oliver at West Brom; John Newall at QPR and Neil Ross at Leeds."



Welcome to tonight's re-arranged fixture against Swindon Town. Since the game's original fixture date on March 27, it's been a tough time for everyone involved with West Bromwich Albion and we need to get a victory under our belts tonight to disperse some of the doom and gloom that has gathered around The Hawthorns. Saturday's fixture against QPR again saw us miss out on the points but after such an atrocious result against Crewe, the lads went some way to regaining a little pride with a competitive performance. It was good to see the players respond to the criticism levelled at them after Crewe - from all quarters - with a battling display. Unfortunately, though the lads couldn't really be faulted for their commitment, this comes as little consolation after the result went against us. Anyone who went down to Loftus Road will know that the score was tough on the team but that's football, when things aren't going your way, performances do not necessarily get their reward. The Crewe performance was unacceptable. We didn't deal with their style of play at all adequately. The problem we have is that we try to play an attractive passing game in a similar vein to Crewe and if we struggle to achieve that style of football we have to change our game plan to a more workman-like one. It's a tough balancing act. We want to entertain - and have in many games this season - yet we also need to have the steel to prevent Clubs like Crewe being successful against us. The problem therefore lies in sacrificing flair for players who are more destructive, rather than constructive. Of course the great players such as Keane, Davids and Petit excel in both departments, but these type of footballers tend to cost a bob or two! My teams have always played good football and I am not going to overhaul the personnel here to create a battling side with little creativity, but a balance needs to be found so results like that against Crewe never happen again whilst I'm manager of this Club. On this point I'd like to quickly mention the good job Jason van Blerk has done for the team in midfield. Like a number of players, Jason has been asked to play in a position somewhat alien to him, but whilst the situation with injuries and suspensions at the Club remains so desperate, we have to be resourceful, with the lads proving to me that they will give their best wherever they are asked to play. On a positive note, Micky Evans return gives our striking options a boost, Lee Hughes has struggled with injury since the Oxford United game and, though this has been a huge loss to us, Micky's return softens the blow somewhat. I believe you have to set yourself and your players targets in football and we are now aiming to finish in a top 10 position, which would be the most successful season for this Football Club in a long time. Obviously to do this we have to return to winning ways and put the disappointing recent run behind us. Of course the last week or so has been tough for everyone concerned at the Club but my mind remains focussed on trying to get three points from each and every game. The situation here at the Club is not about individuals - managers, chairmen or players - we're working together as a team and I certainly believe that you, the supporters, are one of the most important elements of this team. A warm welcome to Jimmy Quinn and his Swindon side. Jimmy has proved a successful young manager firstly at Reading and now at Swindon. However, tonight is not a night for admiring the work of other teams, tonight is a night to put the Crewe result behind us in no uncertain terms with all three points. 

By Swindon Town standards, this season has been a relatively quiet one with only the departure of Steve McMahon causing any ripples in this decade of drama at the County Ground.

Jimmy Quinn is now in charge of a club with an identity crisis. The Robins are trying to establish themselves in the First Division whilst still harbouring memories of recent seasons in both the Premiership and the Second Division. Their one season in the sun came six years ago, following one of Wembley's most astonishing games — a 4-3 play-off defeat of Leicester City under then Player Manager Glenn Hoddle. When Hoddle left for Chelsea, John Gorman oversaw their Premiership odyssey and though it was a campaign they would sooner rather forget, their adherence to a positive brand of football at least won them respect, if not points. Nevertheless, the team broke up and couldn't arrest a further slide into the Second Division where ignominy beckoned. A bold championship campaign righted the ship though and took them back to the relatively calm waters of Division One. Even last season, Town endured a choppy ride once more having been on the crest of a wave in November topping the table - only for an appaling run of three wins in their last 25 games to drag them into danger.

More struggles at the start of this campaign ended Steve McMahon's tenure and it was former favourite Quinn who arrived to steer Swindon away from the bottom of the table, without as yet being able to fashion a total march away from danger.

Indeed, after a stunning 6-0 home defeat on Easter Saturday against Ipswich, Swindon were just three places above the drop zone. The Ipswich debacle being the culmination of a shocking run of form during March, when Quinn's men lost at home to Crewe and Tranmere, drew against Bolton, also at home, and lost away fixtures at Stockport and QPR.

The Bank Holiday Monday fixture at The McAlpine Stadium seemed unlikely to give them any respite – Huddersfield having lost only once at home all season. But a superb, shock 2-1 victory, thanks to goals from Bobby Howe and Chris Hay, could well be the result that virtually gives Jimmy Quinn and his Chairman Rikki Hunt guaranteed First Division status into the new Millennium.

## The Manager

Former Town favourite **Jimmy Quinn** already had managerial experience with Reading, although he arrived at the County Ground from the playing staff of Peterborough.

Quinn had been joint manager at Reading with Mick Gooding between '94 and '97, though his prowess as a goalscorer saw him regularly supplementing the Royals' attack, Gianluca Vialli style. As a player he gathered a wealth of experience playing for sides such as Blackburn, Leicester, Bradford, West Ham Bournemouth before managing Reading and he can be considered unlucky never to have starred for a truly major Club during his pomp in the '80's.

Jimmy has also picked up 48 caps for Northern Ireland and scored 43 goals in 86 games for Swindon as a player at the County Ground, though the 39 year-old has not felt the need to swap the tracksuit top for the first-team shirt this season.

## In Goal

Former Australia Under-21 international *Frank Talia* was spotted by several English clubs' scouts before eventually being picked up by Blackburn in 1992. Frank failed to make an appearance for the Ewood Park outfit before signing for Swindon in November 1995. Has recently signed a new three year deal with the Wiltshire Club.

### In Nefence

Experienced defender **Gareth Hall** signed from Sunderland last season having spent three seasons with the Wearside club. Formerly with Chelsea, the 30 year-old has also been capped nine times by Wales, despite playing for England Schoolboys, and can play

anywhere across the back four.


Alan Reeves is another with Premiership experience having spent four seasons with Wimbledon. The tall 31 year-old centre half started his career with Norwich from where he joined Chester, then Rochdale, he was spotted at Spotland by The Dons who paid £300K for him. The Scouser can be an asset at set pieces as well as in defence.

Craig Taylor is the younger brother of former Town favourite Shaun and signed a three year contract in April 1997 having impressed during a trial period at the County Ground. He cost Swindon £25,000 from non-league Dorchester Town and made a dream debut when he scored a 35 yarder on his debut. Like his brother, dominates in the air

Brian Borrows built up a wealth of experience at Coventry City where he made over 400 appearances. A scouser, Brian has also enjoyed spells with Everton and Bolton and is another experienced pro who can settle into any position. The 38 year-old has appeared in most of Town's games this season, though Brian hasn't scored a league goal since 1992.

**Des Linton** is currently on loan at the Club from Peterborough United. The 27 year-old right-back started his career at Leicester City before a stint at Luton prior to heading to London Road for £25K. The 6'1", 14 stone Birmingham lad has slotted straight into the Swindon defence since his recent arrival.

Gareth Davies joined Swindon Town this season from Reading whom he had joined from Crystal Palace the previous season. The slender 25 year-old, left-back was born in Hereford and played four seasons at his home-town Club making over 100 appearances, before heading south to Selhurst Park.

## In Midfield

**Ty Gooden** was signed by John Gorman in '93 having been released by Wycombe and starred in Swindon's Second Division championship winning season. After a spell out through injury, he has returned to the Swindon midfield with aplomb.

**Scott Leitch** was formerly with Hearts, Motherwell and Dunfermline and was signed by Swindon in 1996 for the bargain price of £15K having enjoyed a successful loan spell at the County Ground.

Former England international *Mark Walters* signed for Town in 1996 having been released by Southampton and immediately showed the silky skills that made him such a hit at Aston Villa, Glasgow Rangers and Liverpool. Back in the first team and scoring trademark spectacular goals, although he has featured mainly from the bench in recent weeks.

**Robin Hulbert** is a gifted young midfielder who has recently forced his way into the first-team squad. The 19 year-old was loaned to Newcastle last term, where he trained with some of the Premiership's finest and was formerly a member of the England U-18 squad.

**Bobby Howe** signed from Nott'm Forest in Jan '98 having spent loan spells at Ipswich and Kettering Town. He made 17 appearances for Forest before his move to the County Ground and, on recent form, Forest may regret having released the dynamic midfielder who was a goalscoring Man of the Match at Huddersfield recently.


## In Attack




**Chris Hay** is a pacy striker who cost £330K from Glasgow Celtic at the start of last season. The 24 year-old scored 13 goals in 20 games last season and after a barren spell has hit form again this term, scoring the second on Bank Holiday Monday at Huddersfield.


George Ndah was picked up by Steve McMahon in November '97 following the departure of Wayne Allison to Huddersfield. He cost £500K from Crystal Palace where he made over 100 appearances. Blessed with great pace, he's forged a devastating partnership with Onuora and has scored 9 goals this season.


Iffy Onuora caught the eye at Gillingham and was picked up by Steve McMahon in a £100K deal a year ago. His form this season has been excellent, scoring 17 times so far this term. ## JIMMY COOKSON

Centre-forward Jimmy Cookson was West Brom's leading marksman in three successive seasons.

Initially with Clayton and Manchester North End, he signed professional for Manchester City in November 1923 but failed to secure a First Division slot at Maine Road and joined Chesterfield in July 1925. 'Cooky' impressed with his prolific goalscoring and moved to The Hawthorns in June 1927, netting a club record six goals at home to Blackpool three months later and setting the record for the quickest individual century of goals from the start of a player's League career that season.

He helped Albion to regain topflight status in 1930/31, scoring an incredible 103 goals in 122 League outings before being displaced by WG Richardson. Moving to Plymouth Argyle in August 1933, he joined Swindon Town in July 1936 and was leading marksman in 1936/37. He scored 31 times in 50 Third Division (South) games for today's opponents, then became a local publican and died in Warminster in December1970.

## PETER EASTOE

Former England Youth international striker Peter Eastoe partnered Cyrille Regis in West Brom's attack.

Signing professional for Wolves in June 1971, he gained top-flight experience prior to joining Swindon Town for a record £88,000 in November 1973. He was leading marksman in two successive seasons for today's visitors, scoring 43 times in 91 League outings



before being sold to QPR for £80,000 in March 1976 as Swindon legend Don Rogers moved in the opposite direction. Netting their extra-time equaliser in the 1976/77 League Cup semi-final second-leg, he also played in that season's UEFA Cup quarter-final and was Rangers' top scorer in 1977/78.Swapped for Everton's Mickey Walsh in March 1979, he helped to reach the FA Cup semifinals in 1979/80 and was leading goalscorer in 1980/81. Moving to The Hawthorns in exchange for Andy King in August 1982, he had Ioan spells at Leicester City, Huddersfield Town, Walsall and Wolves and netted eight goals in 31 First Division games for Albion prior to joining Sporting Farense in July 1985. He subsequently assisted Atherstone United, Bridgnorth Town (P/C), Alvechurch (P/M) and Nuneaton Borough (A-M) and is now a van driver in Hagley.

## JIMMY MURPHY

Welsh international right-half Jimmy Murphy was capped 15 times while at The Hawthorns.

He impressed with Mid-Rhondda Boys prior to joining West Brom in February 1928 and made his League debut at Blackpool in March 1930. Displacing Tommy Magee during the 1931/32 campaign, he featured in the 1935 FA Cup final against Sheffield Wednesday and played 204 League games alongside the likes of Bill Richardson and Jimmy Edwards prior to joining Swindon Town in March 1939.

Making four Third Division (South) appearances for today's visitors before the outbreak of war, he befriended Matt Busby during war-time service overseas in the




Eighth Army and subsequently assisted him at Manchester United. He was caretaker-boss at Old Trafford following the Munich Air Disaster and also managed the Welsh national side for seven years, guiding them to the World Cup quarterfinals in 1958. After resigning at United in 1971, he continued in a scouting capacity until 1982 and died in Stockport in November 1989.

Eire international striker Ray Treacy was capped six times during two spells at The Hawthorns.


Signing professional for West Brom in June 1964, he scored on his League debut to clinch a 2-2 draw at Sunderland in October 1966 and made a further four First Division appearances prior to joining Charlton Athletic for £17,500 in February 1968. Leading marksman in three consecutive seasons at The Valley, he moved to Swindon Town for £35,000 in June 1972 and was top scorer in 1972/73 with 16 goals in 55 League outings for today's opponents before being sold to Preston North End for £30,000 in December 1973.



He partnered player-manager Bobby Charlton in their attack and was loaned to Oldham Athletic before his Eire international teammate Johnny Giles brought him back to newly-promoted Albion in August 1976. Scoring a further six goals in 21 First Division games, he followed Giles to Shamrock Rovers in July 1977 and starred in that season's Irish Cup triumph. Subsequently Shamrock's manager, for the past 21 years he has run his own travel agency in Dublin.


Good evening to all you Junior Supporters!

## Des Ray Oi In Darkness

...I'm desperate to get back now, get back

Prior to his home debut against Ipswich, many Albion fans' knowledge of Daniel Gabbidon was similar to Robbie Fowler's capacity for common sense – pretty much non-existent. But after an assured debut and mature performance at the Stadium of Light, the young Welshman has been haled as Albion's right back of the future.

The stomach injury that crept up on 'Des' over the Bank Holiday weekend was therefore a blow for both the 19 year-old and the Club...

"Yeah, I'd played two games, thought I'd done all right, and was hoping to be in for the rest of the season and then I go and get injured." He explains.

"I was fine after the game, travelling back and all that, it was basically when I tried to get to sleep that I felt it. I couldn't turn over in bed without it hurting.

"Nick (Worth) says it's to do with my back. Something's tight at the side of my back and that's affecting how my stomach feels like."

Denis Smith can thank the Albion Scouting system for unearthing Gabbidon from the Welsh valleys and Des explains how a lad who should really be playing for the Bluebirds of Cardiff is thankfully a Throstle.

"I'm from Cwmbran in South Wales. My Mum's from Barbados and Dad comes from Jamaica but I was born in Wales."

"How did I get to the Albion? There was an Albion Scout called Dave Harry, who unfortunately died recently, and he saw me play for my Sunday team in a local Welsh League. I'd known him for a few years because he used to be a Scout for someone else as well. Anyway, he came to watch me and brought me up to the Albion for a week's trial and that's where it all started really."

It can't be much fun at 16, leaving your family for a career many miles away, but Des explains that he was lucky to have a good friend when he needed one...

"When I got here I was in digs with Dominic Heath and when we had to move we moved together. Dominic's a great mate so it wasn't too bad, he can talk to absolutely anyone, he's so friendly, and he really helped me, making it easier to be away from home.

"I now live with Clint, (Clint Roberts, Community Department) Clint's a top man. He's the best landlord I've had and I've had four or five before him."

Des may be an adopted son of the Black Country, but his broad Welsh accent remains and he is obviously proud to be part of the Welsh Under-21 set-up – even if the coaches do give the Young Dragons a bit of a hard time...

"Tom Whalley manages the team, he's also a coach at Watford. The Under-21 coaches really shout at you and get on your back and get a bit aggressive really, trying to intimidate you. They like to see how you react which is all pretty good experience I suppose."

Good experience for what? For playing in front of 41,000 at The Stadium of Light for a start. Des tells us about Sunderland, but first explains his surprise when he first got the nod from Denis Smith...

"I was shocked to be honest! I'd been training all week and thought I'd done all right, but to be honest I thought it was going to be the same as every other week; the Gaffer would name the squad, and I wouldn't be in it and I'd just come down and watch the game from the stands on Saturday.

"Then in the morning, when I came in, he said I was in the squad and I was quite pleased like, I thought I still might not make sub but I was just pleased to be in the squad. Then by the time I got to the training ground Denis had called me over and told me I was playing, which like I said was a real shock. That got me thinking then, and I was a little bit nervous, but then I was fine once it came to the game and you run out on the pitch. "...and as for The Stadium of Light?

"Sunderland was amazing, you can't explain really how it feels. The crowd's so noisy, you couldn't hear yourself think – I've never experienced anything like it before. When we arrived and went to have a look at the pitch, there was no-one there and you don't go back on the pitch till the game's about to start and then it's just amazing."


Des's taste of the big time has made him determined to nail down the right back slot at the Club...very determined!

"I think there's a chance of me making that spot my own. The two games I played I thought I'd done OK and now I want to be the number one right back here.

"That's my aim and that's what I'll be trying to do. When I get back fit I don't want it to be how it was earlier in the season – not being able to get in the reserve team because of other players. I want to be first choice. That's why I'm desperate to get back now, get back in the team and cement my position."

Albion manager Denis Smith has likened him to a young Carlton Palmer; Des Walker is the source of his nickname and the permanent smile and friendly, easy going nature are reminiscent of Dwight Yorke, but you get the feeling that West Bromwich Albion supporters will soon be content that there's, 'only one Daniel Gabbidon'.







## Weaver West Bromwich Albion Winner




## Forward Thi

Our next game here at The Hawthorns is in just four days time against Portsmouth, another side who are probably just about safe from the prospect of relegation to Division Two.

Like so many teams away from the Premiership promised land, Portsmouth FC has been rocked in recent times by desperate financial problems, that caused intense feeling from the south coast fans to former Chairman Martin Gregory and his Board.

Now the administrators are running Pompey and their job of stripping away all unnecessary costs appears to be being conducted with ruthless efficiency. The well documented removal of Alan Ball's Club car, may conjure up amusing images of Bally in the bus queue with the school kids, but the situation was a telling indicator of just how the purse-strings have been drawn at Fratton Park.

It's all a far cry from the halcyon days after the war when Pompey won the Division One title in 1949 and '50 with Jimmy Dickinson pulling the strings. But Pompey have also seen recent success. In 1987 they joined Division One, thanks to the goals of the portly Mick Quinn, but their time at the top lasted for the shortest possible period and they returned to Division Two where they have remained ever since.







Last season Portsmouth flirted with the drop to Division Two, finishing just one point above Manchester City in 20th place and with the problems behind the scenes already apparent, this season wasn't viewed with a great deal of optimism by the fans. In many ways supporters' concerns have been justified as Pompey have rarely ventured into mid-table, never mind challenging for the play-offs. However, with the Club in such obvious turmoil, keeping their Division One status this term is perhaps as much as they could have wished for, and the Club can be thankful to the heart-on-sleeve attitude of Alan Ball, that imbues remarkable loyalty and character into his players.

Pompey's recent form has been poor. Prior to Saturday's game at Bradford they'd taken just two points from the previous five games, losing their last three; at Wolves and at home to Barnsley and Bristol City. The talent at Ball's disposal is, in the most part, of veteran status. Andy Awford, Jeff Peron, Fitzroy Simpson, Alan McLoughlin, John Durnin, Steve Claridge and Alan Knight – who was between Pompey's sticks when Marie Rose was still seaworthy — all provide the kind of invaluable experience that enables a team to keep its head above water in this division.

Of course, not all Portsmouth's players are the wrong side of 30. Sammy Igoe is a young midfielder consistently linked with Premiership Clubs and former 'Scummer' (Southampton player!) Matthew Robinson has settled in at full-back, but perhaps the most exciting talent to come out of Fratton Park since Darren Anderton is 18 year-old winger Luke Nightingale, who will have to be watched carefully by the Baggies defence, especially as he scored both goals against us at Fratton Park back in November.
