Please be a little patient for us, but have my personal assurance that I'll do everything I can and will never give less than 100% in trying to achieve it!

## Introducing Today's Visitors SWNDON TOWN

Should City boss Bruce Rioch sit down with Robins chief Jim Quinn later this evening and ponder a few what-might-have-beens, it is more than likely that the two managers will have much in common.

Not necessarily in terms of their respective playing careers - the former Northern Ireland striker's nine-club career fails to cross any of Rioch's playing paths, but more of their club's fates this season.

In particular, that hoary old chestnut of how to win at home and a shared inability to hang on to a twogoal lead.

For before last Saturday's 2-0 home triumph over Grimsby Town which effectively ended Swindon's interest in the First Division drop zone - that they can now leave to West Country neighbours Oxford and Bristol City - Town had failed to register a single success at the County Ground this year.

True that sorry record had yet to provoke the same pitch demonstrations that prompted Steve McMahon's exit in September following the 4-1 home defeat by Watford, but 6-0 home slaughters at home to Ipswich hardly eased the locals' mood six months in to Quinn's second stab at management.

It was also his third spell in Wiltshire after the Robins offered Quinn his first break in pro football after impressing at Oswestry Town, before eagerly taking him back after two seasons at Blackburn Rovers in the mid-80s.

His first spell in the management hot-seat, of course, came half an hour down the M4 at Reading where the powerful Belfast-born frontman formed a player-manager twosome with Royals defender Mick Gooding.

But as Elm Park waved good-bye both to the First Division and, indeed, football itself, Quinn was packing his kit-bag for Peterborough and a No2 slot to Barry Fry.

It was from there that Swindon secured his services last October and it is probably a sign of the straitened times in this division that Quinn's spending since has amounted to just £10,000 - enough to secure the services of young striker Charlie Griffin from non-league neighbours Chippenham Town.

Otherwise it has been the all-too familiar story of digging around the loan market for a few fresh faces as two-goal advantages against both Portsmouth and Bolton were thrown away in similarly familiar fashion to events in Norfolk.



In from Peterborough on loan came right-back Des Linton, while Southampton Reserves yielded Shayne Bradley on deadline day. And in common with a clutch of other clubs, Swindon picked up one of Crystal Palace's fleeing stars - in their case centre-half Gareth Davies who popped up on a free before twanging his hamstring.

The other local link takes in Tuesday night's events at Windsor Park, Belfast, where Yarmouth's Adrian Coote made his first senior appearance for Northern Ireland in the 1-1 draw with Canada.

And there the Canary striker follows in some illustrious footsteps - not least in the shape 39-year-old James Martin Quinn, whose 48 international caps was due reward for a career littered with goals. Amongst the hatfuls grabbed up and down the land, the 71 from his 182 Reading appearances as a battle-hardened thirtysomething speaks volumes. If Master Coote follows in the tradition of the mighty Quinn, everyone round this neck of the woods will be more than delighted.

# **SWINDON TOWN**

Manager **JIM QUINN**. Jim returned to manage the team he once "graced" on the field. Scorer of countless goals at a number of clubs and also international level, his performances deserved his usual nickname of "Mighty." Became manager at a time when Second Division football was a possibility. Married to a Swindon fan, has retained the tag "Mighty" both at home and with the fans following our survival this season.

FRANK TALIA is an antipodean shot stopper who spends much of his time on the field mirroring the antics of another resident of his homeland by hopping about in and around his penalty area. Just like a well trained kangaroo, Frank also carries a hefty punch and fans thought they may see this in action a season or so ago as Frank raced 70 yards from his goal to join a 23 man meleé at Crystal Palace.

**CRAIG TAYLOR** is one half of the famous "Taylors" of Swindon family and by far and away the youngest. Craig has a secret desire to become a goalkeeper, noticed so far only referees, as he has already been sent off twice this season for punching shots away from his own goal-line. Just as brave as his big brother he also carries a hefty wallop in his left leg.

BRIAN BORROWS is a long time servant of the game and is now in his 38th year. Model professional at this level. Has announced his intention to retire from playing at the end of this season and as you may be witnessing his final away game of his career give him the reception he deserves.



**DAVID KERSLAKE** is now in his third spell with Swindon during which injury has curtailed his activity. Used to be known as a fast raiding wing-back, always effective until he reached the oppositions' penalty area. His goalscoring prowess extends to one goal in three spells, but as this was against Oxford, will always be recognised as a goalscorer of note.

**GEORGE NDAH** is the quickest player seen in a Swindon shirt for many a season, if ever. His blistering pace often carries him the length of the field leaving opponents and his own teammates in his wake. Has developed the knack of scoring spectacular goals, with each goal scored at home being recognised by the tune "Ndah the Moon of Love" booming out over the tannoy. Definitely one to liven up a dark or even sunny afternoon.

**SOL DAVIS** has consistently appeared in the left wing back role vacated by Jason, so there wasn't too much of an act to follow. (Jason by the way is off to Wembley with Forest Green Rovers – who is that mystery man?) Sol's claim to fame this season was being punched by Southampton's ex-England international Stuart Ripley in a Reserve game a couple of weeks ago. Ripley was sent-off for his trouble (was it worth it? – Stuart).

IFFY ONUORA is a man of towering physique which he uses to brush off lesser mortals. Has the strength to not only go around opponents but also straight through them. Developed a hot streak for goalscoring and was always popping up in the six yard box to score. Has been less prolific of late but if cries of "I I lffy" can be heard today then he has stuck another in the back of the net.

MARK WALTERS is an exceptionally gifted player who has developed a whole array of stepovers to bamboozle defenders. A scorer of many spectacular goals during his time with Swindon, he has also created loads more. A fans' player who has enough ability, to one day be world-class and/or another anonymous.

CHRIS HAY is a goalscoring enigma who set the First Division alight last year with his goalscoring exploits which contributed significantly to the Town reaching top position. Injury, suspension and loss of form put his First Team appearances into a nosedive but recently has returned to his goalscoring self. His goals announced by the Beatles tune "Hay you've got to ......"

**QARETH DAVIES** is a committed and enthusiastic individual who joined the Club in the last month or so. Despite both injuries and suspensions is recognised as an individual who will be able to offer more over the course of next season, unless of course he signs for Real Madrid in a £5 million deal. SCOTT LEITCH is a hard working, tough tackling Scot who has made the ball winning position his own. Sometimes spoils his good work by giving the ball away again even when under no pressure. Has been known to serve a number of suspensions in his time. Will be missing today through injury due in part to a tackle on our own George Ndah, which exposed Scott's legbone as his flesh peeled away.

JIMMY GLASS has been understudy to Frank Talia in goal and had the "shattering" experience of conceding 6 and 4 in his last two games for the First Team. Also kept in a 4-1 defeat of Oxford! Jimmy will be missing today as he has gone on an after the deadline deal to Carlisle to try to keep them in the Nationwide League, following their goalkeeping crisis. Good luck Carlisle!

**GARETH HALL** joined the Club from Sunderland and has given many solid "all-round" performances. Although not blessed with blistering pace uses knowledge of the game and positional sense to get him out of many scrapes. Mr Consistency makes very few real mistakes and has even weighed in with a goal or two.

**DES LINTON** is on loan to us from Peterborough until the end of the season in an attempt to earn a contract. Played early games as a wing back but adopted a more central role when injuries depleted the team at Crystal Palace. Prefers to keep the ball on his right foot, using left only occasionally.

MARK ROBINSON is a stalwart of many campaigns who always gives his all despite not quite achieving superstar status. A welcome addition to any Swindon Town XI particularly as a fast raiding wing back. For regular watchers of ITV's "Nationwide Extra", "Robbo" is seen scoring a spectacular goal in the opening credits.

**KEVIN WATSON** is perhaps the unluckiest player never to have scored 2 goals for Swindon, his "second" being ruled out by abandonment of a match. Is apparently known by the nickname "Chipper". He is an exquisite passer of the ball although this is usually sideways or backwards.

LEE COLLINS has missed much of the season following a shoulder operation. Times his tackles superbly although in his early days his tigerish approach brought problems with officialdom. Produced good performances last season prior to injury.

**TY GOODEN** is a left sided player adding balance to the team. Able to use his pace effectively to go by defenders and deliver crosses from tight angles – some better than others. Recent performance in our 6-0 home defeat by Ipswich was outstanding given the circumstances, particular as he needs a hemia op.

**BOBBY HOWE** has sprung to attention in the second half of this season after a while in the wilderness. Has an accent akin to Gascoigne and carries himself in a vague resemblance to ex-Town player Micky Hazzard, although he can also score goals and tackle.

**ROBIN HULBERT** is a talented youngster who has made a First Team breakthrough this season. Sent to Newcastle last year for experience but fortunately returned. Plays game in correct manner.



SHANE BRADLEY is a loan signing from Southampton. He is powerful and strong for 19 and has ably led front line in a number of games without as yet getting the vital scoring breakthrough.

As Swindon clinched safety last weekend it is possible a number of young players may be given an opportunity today and amongst these may be WILLIAMS, at 16, the second youngest player to have played First Team football for Swindon, PAUL MCAREAVEY, FRASER MCHUGH, SAM

CAMPAGNA and CHARLIE ORIFFIN a striker signed from Chippenham, for around £10,000.

Traveller's Tales FANS REPORT

### BEEN THERE - DONE THAT!! OXFORD UNITED

Our last trip of the season along the A14, and sadly the last chance to visit Mike Carroll's regular toilet stop at Brampton Hut services. Our pub stop, The Falkland Arms in the village of Great Tew (one of the most picturesque in the country) involved a detour into the Cotswolds. We arrived in Oxford early enough to watch the closing minutes of a local game on the park pitch next to the Manor Ground, although given the standard it seemed unlikely any Oxford scouts attended regularly, in spite of the short travelling distance. Round trip: 340 miles. Season to date: 9769 miles.

#### GROUND

The Manor Ground was a ramshackle collection of ten low rise stands scattered haphazardly around an immaculate, award-winning pitch which undulated up hill and down dale towards the home end. The toilet scored 7/10 on Mike Carroll's 'Campaign for Real Toilet' scale, gaining marks for its cave like nature, puddles, old style troughs and cast iron cisterns, but this was still nowhere near enough to make it a candidate for 'Real Toilet of the season'. All the more galling for Oxford is that their bitter rivals, Swindon Town, are this year's first division recipients for their Stratton Bank effort. The view from the away terrace was somewhat restricted by the high fence – ten years on from Hillsborough, it's about time Oxford were more responsible and removed it.

#### HOME FANS

A good turnout for what was for them a vital game left very little spare space in the seven home stands. They produced a vibrant atmosphere until our second goal, when they clearly thought we had won the game. The official attendance presumably excluded the two small boys watching ape-like from the trees behind the away end, although they seemed more interested in swinging the branches back and forth than actually supporting their team.

#### AWAY FANS

A reasonable turnout of 1,340 considering that the result couldn't affect our league status. We occupied two seated stands and the open terrace, from where unfortunately any noise generated dissipated into the balmy Spring air. Even so, the delight was obvious when results came through from both Portman and Loftus Roads – the icing on a very palatable cake.

#### POLICING/STEWARDING

With no sign of police inside the ground, the stewards were left to control everything. As they were seemingly fully occupied guarding the fence in front of the terrace, they certainly didn't concern themselves with us.

#### TEAM PERFORMANCE

This match evidenced a significant improvement over recent end-ofseason games in that it was heartening to visit a Club that needed the points more desperately than we did and still produce a professional and winning performance. The home team's need for victory resulted in a very open and entertaining game in which the result could have been considerably more emphatic had our finishing matched our excellent approach play.

Oxford's greatest regret must have been lending the team their spare shorts and socks following a colour clash, since the players would surely not have played so well in their underpants!

## ON THE ROAD TO ... BRISTOL CITY

Our plans for this trip to be a monster promotion party have gone horribly wrong, so it's just a boring early morning slog along the M4 to finish the season. As we are into the silly season on the roads, the journey is also likely to take that little bit longer, and we'll also pass the 10,000 mile barrier for the season.

#### GROUND

This will be a new ground for the majority of Norwich supporters and, with Bristol City in the relegation mire, one which we may not visit again for a while. Ashton Gate is one of the best stadia in the division with the old open terrace being replaced by a smart new structure with yet another strange title – The Carling Atyeo Stand. Norwich fans are allocated part of The Database Computers stand, which is a low roofed ex-terrace with backless seats bolted on, but it should be good for noise amplification if nothing else.

#### HOME FANS

This will be our first visit to Ashton Gate for almost twenty years, so the antics of the locals can't be easily predicted, but the Bristol City fans do have a reputation for not being the most friendly in the land. The possibility that their team could be relegated on the season's final weekend will also add another massive lump of wood to the simmering fire. Colour wearing may well have to be fairly discreet.

#### POLICING/STEWARDING

Again, trips to the Avon constabulary area have been pretty thin on the ground recently, so actual experience of the police's behaviour is a bit of an unknown. However, after alleged events at the recent Birmingham match, Bruce and Bryan may wish to take a little more care near stewards than Trevor Francis managed. If Captain Canary thinks of attending, he would also do well to steer clear of the Bristol pigs, who have indulged in a bit of handbags on the pitch this season. (We mean, of course, the Bristol mascots ..., what else did you think!?)

#### PAST RECORD

Ashton Gate is actually one of our more successful away venues, with seven wins in our last twelve visits. Our last match resulted in a 3-2 victory in 1979/80, with goals from Martin Peters and Keith Robson.

#### HOW TO GET THERE

A11, M25, M4. Exit M4 J19 s/p Bristol M32. After about five miles turn left and follow signs for Bristol airport. After two roundabouts follow Taunton A38 onto the A3029 Brunel Way. The ground is on the left, but the tricky part is finding somewhere to park – the industrial estate off the A3029 may be a good bet.

## AT HOME WITH Daryl Sutch

As Norwich City's season ends, Daryl Sutch's great adventure is just about to begin.

City's popular defender is on red alert for his big day and awaiting the call that will change his life forever.

Daryl's just about to become a father for the first time and may even now be at his wife Sarah's bedside at the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital.

The baby's officially due a week tomorrow - the day City play their final league match at Bristol City.

But if Daryl's name is missing from the squad for today's game with Swindon, you'll know that young Sutch has probably arrived early.

All of which leaves the Sutch household in a state of excitement and Daryl struggling to concentrate on the job in hand.

"The mobile phone's on all the time and I'm ready to head off to the hospital at a moment's notice," he said: "Obviously no player wants to miss games, but also no father wants to miss the birth of his child especially the first one. That's my priority."

Every City fan will sympathise with his dilemma and wish him well in what should be a lively few weeks ahead. The worst case scenario would be to get a call at Bristol on Saturday night, but hopefully baby will have arrived before that or more considerately - will wait until after Dad gets home on the Sunday night.

"It's quite a tense time," Daryl admitted. "The phone went when I was on my way to Oxford, and I thought 'this is it.' Actually it wasn't but I panic every time I hear it ring. And there's always a feeling at the back of your mind that it could be one of the lads messing about and pretending something's happening."

As it transpired, Sutch was rested for the game at the Manor Ground as Bruce Rioch continued to rotate the side with a view to next season.

He understands the manager's policy and is clearly anxious that he'll be high up in the pecking order when August comes around. The Catch 22 situation is that he has a very good domestic reason for perhaps missing a match, but is concerned about the possible consequences.

"It's interesting when footballers miss games through injury or suspension," he said. "They want the team to do well in their absence, but secretly they hope the replacement player doesn't really shine. Once you lose



your place it can often be so difficult to get back in."

Sutch discovered that to his own cost earlier this season. He suffered a hamstring injury at Portsmouth and with the team in winning form then, it was some time before he returned.

But given the consistency of the Lowestoft-born defender in his time with the Canaries, it was only a matter of time before he was back in contention.

There's another very good reason for 27-year-old Sutch to be in the frame. This is his testimonial season and he clearly wants to be in the public eye.

"Fortunately the events have gone very well so far We've had a golf day, a race night and a casino evening and I'm grateful that they've been so well supported. I must also pay tribute to my testimonial committee. They've been a terrific help."

The focal point of the season will be his testimonial game on Friday July 30th - City's final warm up match before the new Division One season. It should be an absolute cracker because he's lined up top German opposition in Borussia Moenchengladbach.

"I must pay tribute to our Chief Executive Gordon Bennett. He pulled them out of the hat and I couldn't be more pleased. They've got a real pedigree and with us wanting to make a good impression before the start of the new season I think it'll be a really competitive game."

Certainly the fans can be expected to turn out for Daryl Sutch. They've always appreciated the Suffolk-born defender for opting to choose to join the Canaries and he's been a model of consistency in his ten years at Carrow Road.

He's also one of the few remaining links with the good old days when the Canaries blazed the trail through the Premiership and then Europe.

Daryl was fortunate to be part of that great European adventure and the history books will always chronicle his contribution to that amazing 2-1 win over Bayern Munich in October 1993.

"I came on as a substitute for the injured Mark Robins shortly after Jerry Goss' wonder goal," he recalled. "That's got to be the highlight of my time at Norwich. Sometimes 1 can't believe it really happened. To be part of the first English team to beat Bayern in Munich was something I'll always treasure."

In those days the Canaries could do no wrong and Sutch was linked with several moves to Premiership clubs. But he stayed and since then City's fortunes have waned dramatically.

"I've really known the highs and lows of life at Norwich," he said. "Some of our younger supporters probably can't believe that we once led the Premiership by seven points just before Christmas. Hopefully their Dads will tell them what a good side we were."

Daryl will one day tell his own children about that great adventure in 1993. He doubts that a provincial club will ever again challenge so vigorously for the Premiership.

"I think we'll be the last 'small' club to make a serious attempt. There's just so much money involved now that you just can't see it happening. Chelsea for instance have spent millions and it looks as if they'll go away from the title race empty-handed."

But Such is optimistic about the future at Carrow Road

and with two seasons left on his contract, he hopes to play an important part. "When you think that Craig Bellamy's still only 19 and he's played virtually two full seasons, that's important experience to carry over to next season

'Lee Marshall's getting that experience, so is Darren Kenton and Darel Russell - they're all still young players. And Andy Marshall's still a young goalkeeper. Add to that the experience we've got in the side and I honestly believe we will do well - if we can just cure our habit of falling away at Christmas."

By the time next season starts, young Sutch will be blooming and father should just about have mastered those early stages of parenthood.

'It's funny Sarah's mother has been badgering us about having a baby and now it's imminent I'm quite nervous. We've been to all the classes and I think we're as ready as we'll ever be."

He diplomatically refuses to reveal whether he'd prefer a son or daughter - "I just want it to be healthy," he insists. And not even a hint of possible names. "We're agreed what it'll be called if it's a girl but are still discussing three options for a boy"

Much as he loves his football, Daryl's also keenly anticipating the six-week break before pre-season training starts in June. "No time for a holiday, but I'll just enjoy every hour spent with Sarah and the baby. We know we'll have sleepless nights but we just can't wait."

City fans will wish him healthy baby, a bumper testimonial match and a key role in the Canaries' promotion challenge next season!

# Ian Culverbouse

Mention Ian Culverhouse to any Norwich City supporter and chances are that the words "cultured" and "classy" will soon be entering the conversation. Blessed with a superb ability to read the game, always comfortable on the ball and an excellent timer of tackles it was hardly surprising that many of Ian's games were played at sweeper, a position he seemed tailor made to play.

Now the reserve team coach at Brighton, Ian feels that the position which he filled so well in the latter stages of his Norwich career and also during his time at today's opponents Swindon is in danger of becoming extinct. "Some teams around the time I was playing experimented with the sweeper system. It certainly worked tremendously well at Norwich and it worked for a time at Swindon also. I always found it a good position to play and perhaps it kept my career going for a few extra years. However these days the fashion seems to be to play with a flat back four and that's what nearly every team is doing."

Ian joined Norwich from Spurs, following a well worn road to the Canaries from Tottenham's reserve side.

"I wasn't really getting a look in at Tottenham and so when Ken Brown came in with an offer for me of £50,000 I jumped at the chance. I had played in the same reserve side as Ian

Crook, Mark Bowen and John Polston at Spurs so we all knew each other well and followed the same route to Norwich."

"Norwich were in the Second Division when I joined having won the Milk Cup and then being relegated the previous season but everything just clicked together from the off. I was a bit of a good luck charm at the beginning as I was never on the losing side in my first 18 games at the Club. We came straight back up again and from then on we were always in the top flight which was quite unbelievable, and we held our own every year."

"Ken Brown and Mel Machin were a very good management combination who complemented each other well. Mel Machin was an excellent coach and Ken Brown was good at lifting the lads and getting the best out of them. Ken was always the one who put his arm around players and Mel was the one who gave out the discipline when necessary."

"After them the two David's took over. David Williams did most of the coaching and I learnt a lot from him. He was an excellent coach with lots of great ideas. David Stringer was a great bloke who was quite simply Norwich through and through."

When the two David's departed a certain Mike Walker took over at the helm.

"Mike came in and things just took off. We finished third in the first ever Premier League and qualified for Europe. To get into Europe was just a dream come true and to play against Bayern Munich and Inter Milan was almost unbelievable at the time. It was a fantastic achievement and it seemed as though the whole county of Norfolk was behind the team."

"It was just such a shame that the whole thing disbanded so quickly. It seemed to become big league and to be more of a business than a football club. Within a year the whole team seemed to have broken up and Chris Sutton, Ruel Fox and Efan Ekoku were all sold. John Deehan and Gary Megson wanted their own type of players and so I moved on."

"I was Steve McMahon's first signing at Swindon and when I went there it reminded me of how Norwich were when I first signed for them. Things went quite well at Swindon and we won the Division Two championship and since then they've held their own in Division One."

"In the end I was released by Swindon and Brighton picked me up. I recently had the opportunity to take over the reserve side here and I took it straight away. Coaching is what I want to get into and I'm grateful to Brighton for giving me the chance."

Although he is planning for the future Ian admits to often looking back fondly on his Norwich days.

"I had nine brilliant years there and it was unquestionably the best time of my career. Its a lovely area to live and so many ex Norwich players want to go back there when their career is over. I always look back on it with great affection."

## IN MY VIEW with Mark Burchett

"The recent 40th anniversary celebrations of the great 1959 Norwich City FA Cup run, set me thinking. The excellent rapport between that magnificent team of players and the supporters was very evident, even 40 years on. That closeness just doesn't exist in professional football anymore."

It's not the only reason but TV companies and the money they have been able to wave about at the Leagues supremos has a lot to answer for. Also the players now with the means, are able to choose where they live, so no longer living cheek by jowl with the supporters.

I don't begrudge any professional footballer the huge wages that the top players can earn, as they have no idea how long their illustrious careers may last. It also acts as a carrot to the trainees who strive to become better players so that they too can share in the bounty. But particularly in the Premiership where the rewards are so great, it is important that they can still appreciate the fans that support them through thick and thin. I don't think fans of the Canaries, a Club that isn't remote from the community they are part of, are taken for granted at all.

The top players, however, whether they like it or not, are role models and must set a good example. Whether the children watching are in the stadium or at home in front of the television they will take notice of what the stars do, albeit good or bad. Not only will these will become the supporters of tomorrow but even before then, will imitate what the likes of Liverpool's Robbie Fowler get up to. I'm not singling him out but just using him as an example. His recent outrageous goal celebrations landed him a four-match ban that other pro' players said was too high. I don't think the punishment was high enough.

"I know this deprives the fans of seeing some of the best players but if the stars cannot show the right attitude whilst in the public eye, then they should think twice about whether they want to be in such a high profile job. After all they are only too happy to take the money they can earn each week which is higher than a lot of fans earn in a year."

Probably a better way for the footballing authorities to deal with these episodes is to significantly increase the fines. That way it is the player that is deprived not the paying spectator.

Another worrying trend of the satellite TV sponsorship money flooding into football in this country is that it has been followed by a huge influx of foreign players. It may add a very interesting dimension to watching what was a very traditional English game of football but the downside is it limits the opportunities for younger players.

Not only is it unusual to find an Englishman in the Chelsea line-up but a Great Britain too and that is detrimental to the development of home-grown players. When we get back into the Premiership it is going to be very hard to compete financially with the larger Club's like Chelsea and makes the Canaries investment into the New League Academy's even more important to develop our very own stars.

With more foreigners in our game, it also means you now have the likes of Robert Fleck, forced through injury to quit the game at the higher level, now down at non-league Gorleston. (No disrespect to Flecky or Dale Gordon's Gorleston.)

I can remember watching the likes of Mick Channon and Martin Peters finishing their careers at First Division Norwich. These days players like 33 year old Fleck aren't even able to get into Second or Third Division sides as they are taking more of the surplus players graduating out of the top Clubs' training schemes.

Living in Bury St Edmunds, Suffolk I have had to take a fair bit of stick from Ipswich fans in recent years. But, thanks to the two excellent results achieved by our players this season I have had the last laugh. Those four points we took off them could just make the difference between them getting automatic promotion and having to cope with the play-offs for the third year running.

An interesting thought to end with. How about changing the points awarded for results and introduce

2 points for a scoring draw. This has nothing to do of course with the fact that Norwich has drawn 17 games (only 6 of which were goal-less) this season! It might though encourage more sides to attack when say losing by a single goal, i.e. 2-1.
