


Right now our season is going through mixed fortunes. Our last home game saw a good performance against Bury produce our first home win in the League this season, on the back of a 2-2 draw against Wigan that was no less pleasing.

Although our first half performance was not the greatest, we improved in the second and a solid display saw us take three points from the game. Hopefully this will kickstart our home form and allow us to go on a 'roll'.

It was therefore disappointing to travel to Peterborough and lose a game in which neither team played particularly. It was disappointing in the way we performed, particularly when you bear in mind the victory we had worked so hard for in the previous match.

We have shown too much inconsistency in our performances this season - if we want to improve our results and our position in the league table, then we have to establish more consistency in our displays than we currently achieve.

Today we have the added blow of two important players missing through suspension - Mark Stallard and Andy Hughes. Mark in particular as we have relied on his contribution in front of goal heavily this season. Both players lost their appeal against their suspension, which was disappointing as I felt that both of the red cards were very harsh. Unfortunately, the Referee in charge of the game deemed that they had committed serious offences, which is a consequence that we now have to deal with. Having said that, this opens the door for other players to take this opportunity and stake their claim. I am continually looking for new players to bring in - I feel that the squad in it's current condition does not have enough depth to deal with this situation. It is when we suffer injuries or suspensions that you realise how small the squad is. I will be doing everything possible in the coming weeks to bring good, quality players to the Club to aid us in our ambitions. For now, we must carry on and a good performance today would contribute in no small part to realising our aim of climbing the table.







On The Road To Recovery





COLIN TODD - MANAGER

Began his career as a central defender with Sunderland turning professional in December 1966 and going on to play 173 League games for them. In 1971 he joined Derby and won League Championship medals with the Rams in 1972 and 1975, making 293 league appearances in the process, under the guidance of Brian Clough. He moved to Everton for a year in 1978 and had spells with Birmingham, Nottingham Forest and Oxford before ending his playing career with Luton. A steady career as a professional was complimented with 27 full England caps, 14 under-23 appearances and represented the Football League and England at Youth level.

His first break in coaching came with Middlesbrough, helping them to promotion from the old Third Division in 1987 and from the Second Division a year later. As manager he took Middlesbrough to the 1991 Second Division play offs and joined Bolton as

coach to Bruce Rioch in 1992. After coaching Bolton to promotion in 1993 and again in 1995, he took over as manager with Roy McFarland at start of 1995/96 Premiership season. Todd took sole charge in January 1996 guiding them to a record breaking promotion from the First Division in 1997 and to the play offs last season.

Under his tutelage the Wanderers played an attractive flowing brand of football, but ironically, being coached by a former England defender, were vulnerable at the back. As a manager his dealings in the transfer market, particularly in Scandanavia have been shrewd. He is essentially an honest manager who demands high standards from his staff and showed he is a man of principle when he turned his back on Middlesbrough and then Bolton. After such success at Bolton, Todd will now be hoping to emulate that feat at the County Ground.

BART GRIEMINK

The 6 ft 4 Dutch goalkeeper played second fiddle to England U-21 International Mark Tyler at Peterborough for the past couple of seasons. After only making 44 league appearances for The Posh he decided it was time for a new challenge when his contract expired during the summer. Bart spent a twomonth loan period with Town last season and impressed in difficult circumstances. His arrival plus the appointment of former Aston Villa hero Nigel Spink as goalkeeping coach should go a long way to ease Town's goalkeeping problems after Frank Talia. Jimmy Glass and Alan Flanagan left the club.

STEVE MILDENHALL

One of Swindon's home grown talents, Steve is in his fourth year as a professional after successfully coming through the Club's YTS system. Made two first team appearances in 1995/96, came off the bench to play as an outfield player in 1996/97 and made his full league debut between the posts for Swindon

in October 1997, 'Mildy' made 6 (2 as substitute) appearances for Town last season. He spent most of the season in the reserves earning praise for his resolute performances, however, he was rarely relied upon to make the step up to the first team.

MARK ROBINSON

Started his career at West Bromwich Albion, joined Barnsley on a free in June 1986 and such was his form there that Newcastle snapped him up for

£450,000 in March 1993. After losing his place in the first team through injury, Mark is now the Town's longest serving player since Swindon paid a Club record £600,000 for his services in July 1994. He has been a consistent and versatile performer ever since. however, he could face competition from new signing Juan Cobian for the right-back slot this season.

GARETH DAVIES

Was signed on a free transfer in March 1999. Gareth made the short trip down the M4 from Reading and despite being a firm favourite with the Royals' fans, he did not figure in Tommy Burns' plans. Gareth is an infectious character but is well known for his commitment and aggressive style. However, Town fans only caught glimpses of him in action due to several injuries, mainly a problematic knee injury, wrecking his last campaign only making 16 starts in all. He should make a return to full fitness in the

coming weeks.

ADAM WILLIS

Released by the Sky Blues after failing to make the grade in the Premiership. Adam was called into action from the reserves towards the end of last season to cover for injuries and suspensions. Adam worked very hard in the gym after training to improve his physical presence and it paid off. His confident displays

earned him a place in the starting line-up on merit and he was rewarded with a new contract under Colin Todd after being previously told that he could leave the club.

ALAN REEVES

Quit Wimbledon's "Crazy Gang" in search of

first team football with Swindon, Tall central defender, who cost the Dons £300,000 from Rochdale, Excellent header of the ball, 32vear-old Reeves can be an asset in attack on set pieces, scoring 2 goals in 24 appearances last season. Despite being linked with several clubs in the summer. Reeves is working hard to command a first team place under new manager Colin Todd.

Danny Invincible




SOL DAVIS

Left-sided fullback back who was offered his first professional contract in the summer of 1998 after a series of impressive performances in the reserves. Made his league debut as a substitute at home to

QPR, shortly after his 18th birthday. First start in a Swindon shirt came six months later in the heat of a local derby clash away at Oxford United, Last season Sol. made over 25 appearances for Town in both the fullback and wingback positions and his commitment was exemplified by some very tough tackling.

JAMES WILLIAMS

James, still only 18,



burst onto the scene towards the end of the 1998/99 season. He was duly rewarded with the number 32 shirt at the start of last season and the young defender/midfielder became a very useful asset to the dwindling squad. James can be called upon to play in a variety of positions and although he made an impact on the first team his form dropped. He will be hoping for more consistent performances in the new campaign.

JUAN COBIAN

Juan Cobian joined Aberdeen from Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer in November '99. Cobian, a rampaging right-sided defender, made a promising start to 1998-99 with the Owls having joined the club for a nominal fee during the 1998 close season. This summer he moved, again on a free transfer, to the County Ground despite offers from a number of clubs. His attacking style will be very much in demand in Colin Todd's new-look side.

KIM HEISELBERG

An attacking left-sided fullback, Kim Heiselberg is another player to join the Swindon ranks on a free transfer in July. He returned from Denmark this summer for his second spell in English football after spending one year on Wearside with Sunderland. Signed by the Black Cats in 1998 for £125,000 he failed to hold down a regular first team place and returned to his native Denmark. A technical player that likes to pass the ball and get into dangerous forward positions.

ANTOINE VAN DER LINDEN

Central defender whose composure on the ball will make him a vital asset to Todd's

> team. Looks to set up attacks from the back with his sweet left foot. Agile and solid.

MARKO TUOMELA

Defender Marko Tuomela has joined the Town on a three-month loan deal (10-09-00) from Tromso. Tuomela has played 16 times for Finland, regularly lining up alongside Liverpool captain Sami Hyypia. The 28-year-old centre back watched the win over Bristol City at



Ashton Gate and then got his first taste of the action in the second half of Tuesday's match at Bournemouth.

Manager Colin Todd is hoping that Tuomela will add steel to his defence and wants opposing strikers to feel intimidated by his size and strength.

ANDY WILLIAMS

Andy moved from Southampton in October 1999 in a £65,000 deal after an impressive loan spell at the County Ground. Andy is an extremely versatile player and has taken on a variety of defensive and midfield duties. Formerly a regular Welsh Under-21 international he became a strong candidate for Player of the Season last term which showed how well he settled into the side.

FRAZER McHUGH

Made his impression in the first team last season but failed to hold down a regular place. This season will be his second as a pro and he will want to step up his claim for a regular start under Colin Todd. A hardworking and tenacious midfielder who can hit a hard tackle as well as an accurate pass, this could well be the year that he breaks through.

BOBBY HOWE

Stephen, who likes to be known as Bobby, is an attacking midfielder who signed for Swindon in January 1998 from Nottingham Forest, where his first team opportunities had dried up. Bobby's confidence suffered last season and fell out of favour in the first team. However, after being told he could leave the club he has worked hard to re-establish himself in the side.

MATTHEW HEWLETT

An attacking midfielder that signed for Town on a free transfer in July 2000. A hot prospect at local rivals Bristol City in 1998/99. At the time a succession of injuries meant that he missed most of the season and failed to live up to his potential. A fresh start may be just the challenge he needs and there will be no

better place to impress and improve his performances than at the County Ground this season. If he can find his form he may just be the attacking spark the Town midfield is so dearly missing.

DAVID DUKE

Another young player with a great deal of potential. A left-sided midfielder, he was unable to command a first-team start at

Premiership Sunderland after joining them in June'97 from Redby. Impressed new boss Colin Todd in several pre-season friendlies and signed on a free transfer in July.

KEITH O'HALLORAN

He made six starts for Middlesbrough where he came through the youth ranks before joining St Johnstone in March' 97 for £50,000. Keith went on to make over 60 appearances for the Saints but relished the opportunity of proving himself in England after a very successful period at McDiarmid Park. Despite being offered a new contract north of the border, he chose to join Swindon's new era under Colin Todd.

The Town fans will be delighted to see a natural right-sided midfielder at the club after it became a huge problem position last campaign.

DANIEL INVINCIBILE

Coin Todd believes that midfielder Danny Invincibile can become a real star after completing a deal to sign the Australian on a free transfer in July. Todd moved swiftly to tie up a deal for Invincible after spotting the 20-year-old playing for West Ham in a trial match. The former Marconi Stallions star scored on his Town debut in a 1-1 draw against West Brom at the Hawthorns. Invincibile, a former Australian under-20's star, plays predominantly on the right hand

side of midfield, possess blistering pace and his arrival at the County Ground will increase the number of options available to Todd.

MARK ROBERTSON

Mark teamed up with fellow countryman Danny Invincibile after leaving Burnley for Town on a free transfer.. The young Aussie had only made on appearance for the Clarets during his time there and

had been on trial with Colin Todd's side for some weeks before putting pen to paper at the end of last month. A predominantly rightsided attacking player he will add muchneeded strength in depth in the midfield.

GIULIANO GRAZIOLI

ai)nwide

Signed in June 1999 on a free transfer from his former club Peterborough Utd. Giuliano's previous visit to the County Ground was in 1997 with Stevenage Town in the FA Cup 3rd round. His winning goal dumped Swindon out and handed Stevenage a money-making 4th round tie against Newcastle Utd. Missed most of last season through injury, but when he did play he was the shining light in a very

dull season for Swindon. Following the departures of fellow strikers Chris Hay and Iffy Onuora, 'Graz' established himself as the Town's main threat. If he stays fit, he will be a handful for opposing defences this season.



Steve is a nippy, darting forward with good vision and very quick feet. Rarely called upon under former manager Jim Quinn, Steve

tried to find another club after he was told he had no future with the Robins. However, Steve was another player that came in from the football wilderness to finish the season strongly and do well enough to warrant a new contract with Colin Todd.

CHARLIE GRIFFIN

Charlie started his career in non-league football. He was signed for £10,000 from Chippenham Town where he was top scorer in the Screwfix League with 30 goals. At 21 years of age he is still a prospect for the future and the coaching staff believe that, with a handful of first team games under his belt, he will be ready to challenge for a regular place in the side.


MARTIN WILLIAMS


Left Reading in search of a new challenge. A firm favourite with the fans at the Madejski, he topped the scoring charts two seasons ago with 11 goals in 31 games until he sustained a knee injury three months from the end of the campaign. His strength and pace will complement both the guile of Giuliano Grazioli and the youthful endeavor of Gary Alexander. His move, which was delayed by another untimely knee injury over the summer, could solve Town's early goalscoring problems.

GARY ALEXANDER

Highly-rated 21-year-old who joined the Robins in early August from West Ham United in a £300,000 deal. Gary spent most of last season on loan at Exeter City where he made a big impression - scoring 16 goals in 20 appearances and keeping The Grecians out of relegation trouble in the process. A powerful and hard-working forward, Alexander could be the one to watch this season.




Supporters Club Quiz

Apart from the result there's one other statistic that will be looked at even more closely than usual this afternoon - the size of gate.

Swindon Town's Meadow Lane visit comes at the end of a busy week, during which Notts announced their new campaign to attract more support to home matches.

Under the banner, Eight through the Gate, it has the ambition of seeing Meadow Lane attendances rise to 8,000 over the next 18 to 24 months. The aim has been backed by positive inducements, including - the most important factor of all - a review of admission prices and attempt to attract more families.

The sheer size of the task should not be underestimated

Over the last five seasons, in which Notts have played a total of 115 home League matches, the gate has exceeded 8,000 on only nine occasions, a shade under eight per cent.

Taking the five seasons in sequence, there was just one 8,000-plus gate in 1995-96 and, by a curious coincidence, it was against Swindon. Notts were chasing promotion from the Second Division and Swindon's visit attracted 8,725.

so totally reversed that Notts were battling against relegation - and being unsuccessful, went down - not a single gate reached that target 8,000 figure.

Only one season was spent on the bottom rung, for 1997-98 brought the success of

winning the Third Division championship in a record-breaking season. The upturn was reflected in increased attendances. three exceeding the 8,000 mark.


First, the visit Peterborough United attracted 8,006. Then, on the day when Notts clinched promotion, a Mark Robson goal beating Leyton Orient 1-0, this was watched by 8,383. And, easily the best of all, a crowd of 12,430 turned up on the very last day of the season.

Billed as a gala day, with pre-match entertainment, a parade of old Notts stars and the presentation of championship and players' medals, it tempted not only the largest attendance of the season but note this - also the largest of all the five seasons under review. For good measure visitors Rotherham United were thumped 5-2, five of the seven goals coming in a whirlwind second half. Great stuff indeed!

In the following season, 1998-99, there was an early gate of 10,136. Hardly surprising was that the gate was for the best-supported team in the Second Division, Manchester City, followed by only one other 8,000+ gate, against Stoke City.

Last season brought just three such gates as Notts for so long battled to reach a higher sphere.

The following season, when fortunes were All three such occasions were against fellow-promotion aspirants. Wigan were top of the table (but not ultimately promoted) when they arrived at Meadow Lane on Boxing Day and a combination of the importance of the points and the holiday season attracted a gate of the 8,176.

The same factors applied again only a few day slater, when Burnley became the first visitors of the new Millennium, with a crowd of 8,229.

Finally, once again it was Stoke City who proved such an attraction with the best gate of the three, 9,677, for their visit on 11th March.

What lessons are to be drawn from all these facts?

Chiefly that relegation from the First Division has been very costly in terms of support. When Notts last played at that level, in 1994-95, there were six matches out of the 23 which were watched by more than 8,000 spectators.

Wolves, Stoke, Sunderland, West Bromwich, Sheffield United and Middlesbrough were the visitors on these occasions. All, of course, brought good followings with them, far greater than the average support for Second or Third Division clubs.

It adds up to showing that there are economic, as well as other reasons, why Notts number one priority has to be to regain First Division status.




