# Straight Down The Line

As the new Dean Court rises steadily in front of our eyes, everyone is struggling manfully with the obvious and not so obvious problems that the development has caused.

Our first goals and first points were gained at probably one of the most difficult places, Ninian Park, Cardiff. The hostile atmosphere experienced by our supporters was also reciprocated to the players and quite a tidy sum in coins was picked up in the post match warm-down. It would be quite ironic if their good fortune in attracting Sam Hamman to the club and their obvious plans to progress to the Premiership are alienated by the behaviour of their supporters. Unfortunately, the point gained came at a cost. Young Amos on his league debut suffered a fractured tibia and although his injury will heal, it stretches an already thin squad even further.

There are a lot of players available at the moment, but as always the better ones at all levels are a sought after commodity. A reserve First Division striker who we enquired about, his wages were quoted at £7,000 a week and as you can imagine, our interest was quickly terminated. Whether you have millions to spend or nothing, the need to get the right player in, in the

right position, at the right cost is of the paramount importance, regardless of whether it be short term loans or long term investments. It seems these days, more time is spent on motorways than on training pitches and it is a worrying trend, which will ultimately detract from the most precious commodity, 'the teams performance.'

Much has been written in the press on the incident last week at Cambridge. We would like to thank the 264 away supporters who supported the team at the Abbey Stadium. 265 actually travelled and my thoughts on the other individual have been well documented. On behalf of Chukki, thank you for the e-mails and letters of support, they were all most appreciated.

On a happier note, congratulations to Warren Feeney who gained his first Under 21 cap with Northern Ireland and by all accounts, did very well. Hopefully a call up to the full squad is not too far away.

Football is a passionate, emotive game not only to those who play, but especially for you who Support. Support means help, encouragement and guidance, so as always, support your local team.

## From The Boardroom

Over the last five years people have often asked the question: 'what exactly is a Community Club? In reality it is a difficult question to answer in a simple line. It means different things to different people. There are however certain values at the heart of everything we stand for. A refusal to tolerate any form of racism is one of them.

The vast majority of you will be aware of what happened in the recent away match against Cambridge. For those that aren't, Chukki was the target of racial abuse by a mindless minority of our own so-called fans. You only had to see the reaction of Sean, Peter and the players to understand just how deeply effected everyone was by events at the Abbey Stadium.

I must stress that I don't think we have a 'racism problem' at this club. Ninety-nine per cent of our supporters enjoy their football without resorting to abuse. The reaction to the incident at Cambridge highlights the outrage everyone felt and several people have passed information onto the police. However, one comment by one individual is one too many.

The Cambridge incident made national headlines because it was a Bournemouth player being targeted by his own supporters. The reality is that racism occurs in grounds up and down the country every week. The Campaign to Kick Racism out of Football does some excellent work; the Government have introduced new legislation to deal with the problem inside grounds, and close circuit television has helped identify faces in crowds. But ultimately it is left to all of us to make a stand.

Today I am appealing to every single one of you to help make sure this kind of behaviour is never tolerated at our club. There is a special police line available - 07773 929845 - where all calls will be treated with absolute anonymity. If you witness any racist behaviour, please don't turn a blind eye, but register a complaint and make a stand.

We are on the brink of completing a new stadium, which is something the entire community can be proud of. If we cannot stand up and be counted in opposition to racism, we don't deserve to be a club, let alone a Community Club.

Take the A338 to Ringwood, then the A31, M27 and M3 and join the M25 at junction 12 signposted Heathrow. Join the A1(M) north at junction 23. Use the A1 through Stilton and then Norman Cross. About 2 miles after Norman Cross leave the A1 and turn right at the roundabout onto the A1139. Leave the A1139 after about 0.4 miles. Take the 2nd exit at the roundabout into Orton Parkway and continue to the next roundabout. Go straight over the roundabout and at the next roundabout after about half a mile turn right into the A605 Oundle Road. Follow this road for about 3.5 miles to the ground. There is a large car park at the ground and other car parking in the nearby town centre. Cherries supporters wishing to stand should use the Moyes Stand using turnstiles 32-34. Admission is **£10 adults, £7 concessions**. There are 800 seats also available in the main stand using turnstiles 2 & 3, admission is **£15 adults and £7 concessions**. Programmes are **£2**.

**DISABLED SUPPORTERS INFORMATION:** There are two areas in the ground for disabled supporters in the Family Stand and the Main Stand. Parking is available adjacent to both areas and pre-booking is not required.

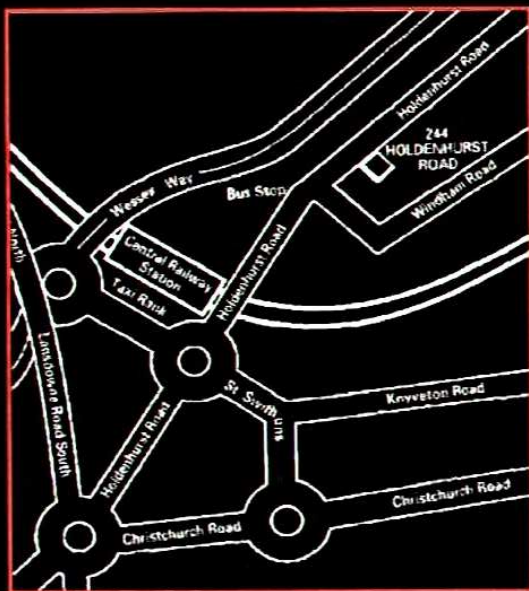

## DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL - ROY EVANS

Born in Bootle, Merseyside, Roy joined Liverpool as a youngster and appeared for England at Schoolboy level. He made just nine league appearances in defence for the Reds from 1969 to 1973, but became part of the legendary Anfield 'Boot Room'. He was appointed as manager at Liverpool in January 1994 and celebrated his first season in charge by guiding his side to League Cup success and a year later led them to the FA Cup final. After putting the foundations down at Liverpool that has turned them into such a great success, he was then joint manager with Gerard Houllier for a short spell before ending his long association with the club. He was appointed Director of Football at Swindon during the summer.

# Bits and Pieces



Swindon Town can trace their roots back to 1881 when the Reverend William Pitt formed a club as an offshoot of the local cricket club and were known as Spartans, taking the name Swindon Town in 1883 when Spartans merged with St. Marks Young Men's Friendly Society. They became founder members of Division Three in 1920 and started life as a League club in sensational style with a 9-1 win over Luton. They were the second longest serving Division Three club behind Bournemouth as it took them until 1963 to gain promotion and in 1969, back in Division Three, they captured the hearts of the nation with a 3-1 win over Arsenal in the League Cup final at Wembley. They hit the headlines again in 1990 when after they gained promotion to the top flight, they were denied their place due to financial irregularities. They showed great resilience as a club though and gained promotion to the Premier League in 1993 and although their stay lasted just one season, it was a great adventure for the Wiltshire club who less than ten years before had been in Division Four.

Since then, they were relegated again in 1995 to Division Two, bouncing straight back to the First before being relegated again in 2000 to Division Two.

## FIRST OPPONENTS

Swindon Town will forever be in the Cherries record books as the first ever League matches for the Cherries were against the Robins. After gaining election to the Football League, Bournemouth faced Swindon at the County Ground on 25 August 1923. A crowd of 9,545 saw Swindon dominate throughout and run out comfortable 3-1 winners with Jim Lister scoring the first ever goal in the Football League for Boscombe. The first league match at Dean Court was due to be against Watford, but torrential rain caused that game to be postponed and it was the following Saturday when Swindon visited that league football

came to Bournemouth. That game finished 0-0 as the Cherries gained their first ever point.

## BEST WIN

Swindon were also the opponents for the Cherries record league victory. When the Robins visited Dean Court on 22 September 1956, the Cherries rattled seven past them with no reply. Bournemouth had beaten Northampton 10-0 in August 1939, but that result was expunged from the records due to the outbreak of World War Two.

## FIRST WIN FOR SEAN



Cherries boss Sean O'Driscoll will have fond memories of Swindon Town as he gained his first ever win as manager against the Robins last season. That win came almost a year ago on 12 September 2000 when two goals from Steve Fletcher and one from James Hayter secured a 3-0 win. The crowd on the night was just 3,673 due to the fuel crisis. In the return game, a late equaliser from Richard Hughes gave Bournemouth a share of the spoils in a 1-1 draw.





## MEMORABLE SEASON

The 1986-87 proved to be a very memorable campaign for both Bournemouth and Swindon. The Cherries won the Third Division Championship for the first time and Swindon were the first club to gain promotion via the newly introduced play-off system. In the first match between the two clubs on New Years Day 1987, the largest crowd of the season so far, 10,537 turned up to see a titanic struggle between third placed Bournemouth and sixth placed Swindon. Both clubs were on a good run and as the game was heading towards a 0-0 draw, Carl Richards, despite carrying an injury, bravely latched on to a through ball and slid it home with just two minutes left. In a tense finale to the game, Jimmy Quinn put the ball in to the Cherries net, but it was mysteriously disallowed - much to the delight of the home contingent. By the time the two clubs met at the County Ground on 18 April 1987, the Cherries had gained a healthy lead at the top of the table with Swindon challenging strongly in third place. Thousands of Bournemouth supporters made the 70 mile trip and were squeezed into the tightest of areas at the Wiltshire ground. It helped to create the Robins largest crowd of the season by a good 3,000 as 14,302 packed the stadium. It was another colossal struggle between the clubs with Bournemouth taking the lead through a well-worked corner and John Williams heading home. David Hockaday equalised in the second half, but it was a result that suited Bournemouth far more than Swindon. Whilst the Cherries celebrated with the Championship, Swindon finished third and had to battle it out in the play-offs. In the first season of the innovation, the side finishing third from bottom of Division Two were also involved. That side were Sunderland and they were beaten by Gillingham whilst Swindon beat Wigan 3-2 on aggregate, all the goals coming in the first leg at Springfield Park. In the final,

Swindon beat Gillingham 1-0 at the County Ground before losing 2-1 at the Priestfield Stadium. Confusingly, away goals counted in the play off semi-finals, but not the final matches, so a replay was held at Selhurst Park with Swindon finally gaining promotion with a 2-0 win.

## CHAMPION ROBINS

After quickly falling two divisions, Swindon gained promotion immediately to Division One in 1996 in fine style. They lost just four matches all season under Steve McMahon, but had winning runs twice halted by a stubborn Bournemouth side. At a foggy Dean Court on 31 October 1995, Steve Jones went close twice for Bournemouth as no side managed to make a breakthrough in a 0-0 draw. Jones though was far more successful during the Easter Bank holiday as he netted twice at the County Ground as the Cherries gained a highly creditable 2-2 draw.

## THE MIGHTY QUINN

Jimmy Quinn had highly successful spells at both AFC Bournemouth and Swindon Town. He started his professional career with the Robins after he signed from Oswestry in 1981 and made 60 appearances, scoring 18 goals before moving to Blackburn in 1984. He spent two years at Ewood Park before returning to Swindon in 1986 where he netted an impressive 43 goals in a further 86 appearances. He left again in 1988 and after spells at Leicester, Bradford and West Ham, he joined Bournemouth in August 1991. After a slow start to his Cherries career, the Dean Court crowd warmed to him as the goals started to flow and he netted on 24 occasions in 54 appearances. His stay though lasted just a year and he went on to become a highly successful player and then joint manager at Reading and also returned to Swindon for a spell as manager. Last season saw him turn out for three Conference clubs and he is now manager of early surprise leaders, Northwich Victoria.

# On This Day

## On this day 8 September

On this day in 1858, Abraham Lincoln said, "You can fool all of the people some of the time, and some of the people all of the time, but you cannot fool all of the people all of the time."

On this day in 1971, the Cherries went out of the League Cup at home against second division Blackpool. The visitors won 2-0 in front of an 15,649 crowd.

On this day in 1979, the Cherries lost 2-1 at home to Wigan in a Division Four match. In a disappointing game, the only consolation for Bournemouth was a Hinnigan own goal. Swindon also had a disappointing day, going down 3-0 at home against Rotherham in the Third Division.

On this day in 1984, Bournemouth won their first game of the Third Division campaign thanks to a Billy Rafferty hat-trick against Rotherham at Dean Court. All three of his goals came in the second half without reply. Just 3,180 turned up at the County Ground to see Swindon slump to a 3-1 home defeat against Torquay in Division Four.

On this day in 1990, the Cherries went down to a highly disappointing 2-0 defeat at Wigan in Division Three. Second Division Swindon drew 1-1 at Hull City.

On this day in 1998, a crowd of 26,696 saw the Cherries lose 2-1 at Manchester City with Steve Fletcher scoring the Cherries goal.

## WEDNESDAY 22 AUGUST 2001

Roy Evans enjoyed his first success as Swindon boss with an excellent 2-1 win at First Division Wolves in the Worthington Cup.

## SATURDAY 25 AUGUST 2001

The Cherries gained their first point of the season in the most unlikely setting of big spending Cardiff City. The strong and powerful Bluebirds were two up and cruising when a Warren Feeney penalty lifted the



Cherries confidence and three minutes later, Jason Tindall who was moved up front grabbed the equaliser in front over 13,000 fervent Cardiff supporters. Swindon disappointingly lost 2-0 at home against Oldham. Elsewhere, there were wins for Stoke, Brentford, Huddersfield, Notts County, Port Vale and Bristol City. City are now the only club with a 100% record and top the table by two points. The Cherries youth side lost 4-0 at Cheltenham.

## MONDAY 27 AUGUST 2001

Swindon gained their first win under Roy Evans with a comfortable 3-0 success at Bury. Colchester went to the top of the table with a 2-0 win over Port Vale and there were also wins for Brentford, Brighton,

Huddersfield, Tranmere and Wycombe.

## TUESDAY 28 AUGUST 2001

It was revealed that Amos Foyewa sustained a broken leg at Cardiff. Christopher Wreh trained with the side and there is a possibility of a short-term deal being struck.

## SATURDAY 1 SEPTEMBER 2001

The Cherries twice came from behind to ensure a share of the spoils at Cambridge United. Alex Revell gave the home side the lead but Wade Elliott equalised with a superb strike on 20 minutes. Cambridge played the sort of football you would expect under John Beck, but the Cherries style and composure unlocked them on numerous occasions. However, they did retake the lead on 70 minute through Dave Kitson. There was no panic from Bournemouth and that patience was rewarded with five minutes left with another excellent strike from Elliott to earn a point.

Swindon enjoyed a 1-0 home win over previously unbeaten Colchester. Neil Ruddock marked his Robins debut with the only goal of the game. There were wins for Peterborough and Reading whilst Tranmere and Oldham drew 2-2.

## P.G.s Tips A Level Playing Field



It is well known in my native Scotland that the game there is now dominated by two clubs with little hope of the others challenging them for the top two positions. In Division Two, that could not be further than the truth though as I believe that it is a very level playing field.

We have proved that when we've played against all the other clubs in our division and when we've played against First Division clubs in Cup competitions. It's on the day when you have to perform and no matter how much you've spent on the team, when they cross that white line, it all counts for nothing. In Scotland, if a Premier League club plays a lower division club, then they usually blow them out of the water, but here, despite the fact we have no money we have proved that we can match anyone because we have good quality players who are technically very good and with belief, anything is possible for them.

This has been proved in our opening five games how level everything is. At Huddersfield, we played well and deserved at least a point. We were disappointed against Blackpool, not only in the game but in the fact that our preparation didn't go as well as we had expected. We could use that as an excuse but we won't because we didn't perform on the day. Against Torquay again it was disappointing. The boys didn't pass the ball well and didn't believe in themselves. In both those games we couldn't fault them for effort and commitment, but what we had to ask them after that was to think a little more about their game and to do that you have to have confidence in your game and to trust each other.

There was a great deal of improvement at both Cardiff and Cambridge where in both games they tried to bombard us, but the boys stood up physically strong to them. At Cardiff, as soon as we scored one, the belief and confidence returned to the side and by the end of the game there was only one team who looked like winning the game. At the start of last season, we were playing some great football but not winning games. We then went to Bury and won 5-2 and both myself and Sean thought it was one of the worst performances of the season, but it just proves how much confidence goals can give you.

We showed great form at the end of last season with probably the most limited resources of any club in the

division and glimpses of that form have returned in the last couple of games. You look last Saturday and could see the way the confidence was returning. Chukki was fantastic for us, winning everything in the air and working hard for the team. What Chukki needs is belief in himself, because we have plenty of belief in him and that is the same for players such as James Hayter and Garreth O'Connor. The team is now getting its shape, its organisation. They can't work any harder, but what is delighting us is that they are beginning to think about and that was what was lacking in the first couple of games, which was a disappointment.

The lads here are very young, but they have a years experience behind them and it doesn't matter if you have one or twenty years experience behind you, it's how you use that experience. Our lads gained great experience last season, but it's only good if they use it properly and that is what we are trying to instill in them. We have lost experienced players this season with Claus going and injuries and the boys who have come in and been desperate to do well, possibly too desperate at times, but I believe they've got over that now and hopefully we can go out this afternoon and win the game because that what we want to do and we want to do that by playing well. We are asking them to do it the hard way because we want them to pass the ball whereas a lot of teams will just launch it forward. Fair play to teams who want to do that, we have no argument with teams who want to play that way. Teams will always play to their strengths and we believe that we have a team that are capable of passing the ball and they are also capable of mixing with the best of them as well if need be which they proved last season.

They can't work any harder - they can only think that little bit harder. We may not have the finances that other clubs have, but we have proved and I'm sure we'll prove again that this is truly a level playing field.

**Could you live without television?**

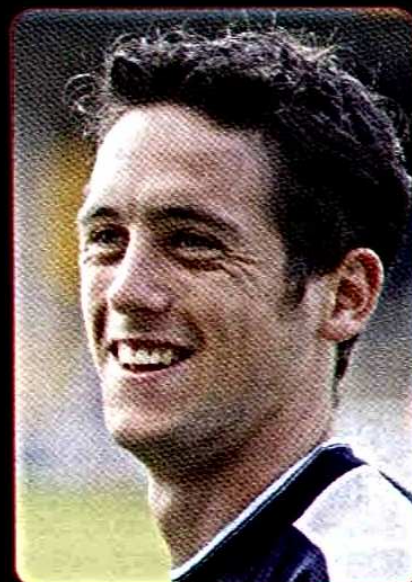

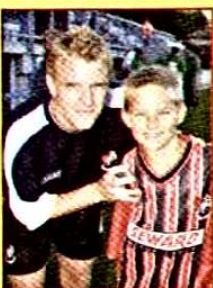

That was followed by his first game as a fully fledged Bournemouth player against Torquay and although both games ended in defeat, the side have returned from two away games unbeaten although he knows that with the way the side are playing, success is surely not too far away. "We had two very disappointing results in my first two games particularly as we all knew we could do better than we did. It was the same story at Cambridge last week when we gave away two soft goals, and I blame myself for the second one. We have to learn now and cut out those sort of errors. We have created a lot of chances in the last couple of games, but that's the way the Gaffer has got us playing, very positive, and playing that way we'll do well in this league. When we put the ball down and play, there's very few teams that can live with us. We proved that at Cardiff with over 13,000 screaming at us,

but when we got the ball down and started playing, we could have even won it."

It was the penalty decision at Cardiff that could well prove to be the turning point at this early stage of the season as the whole side visibly lifted and fought back to gain a memorable point. "To start off with at Cardiff we took a step back and defended deeply, but when that goal went in, you could see the confidence in the side return. We carried that on at Cambridge and we started a lot brighter than at Cardiff. When we start like that we are always capable of creating chances and we did that for 90 minutes last week which was a good sign."

Shaun is still looking to have his first taste of victory as a Bournemouth player and he will be delighted if that comes today against Swindon, a club who he was linked with during the summer. "Absolutely, and I think that there isn't a game in the league this season that we can't win. All we have to do is to cut out the silly little mistakes in defence and as long as we can keep creating the chances at the other end then we'll be fine. It will be nice to get off the mark at Dorchester because it's up to us to get used to it. We know we haven't played well in the two games here so far and we'll be looking to rectify that today. We're obviously all looking forward to returning to Bournemouth, but at the moment, Dorchester is our home ground and we want to make it a place that teams fear to come too. It's all very well having fancy stands and everything that goes with it, you have to make wherever your playing a fortress and hopefully we can do that here at the Avenue and then we can do the same when we return to Dean Court." It has taken a long time for Shaun Maher to finally sign for Bournemouth - but with his performances so far - it has indeed been worth the wait.

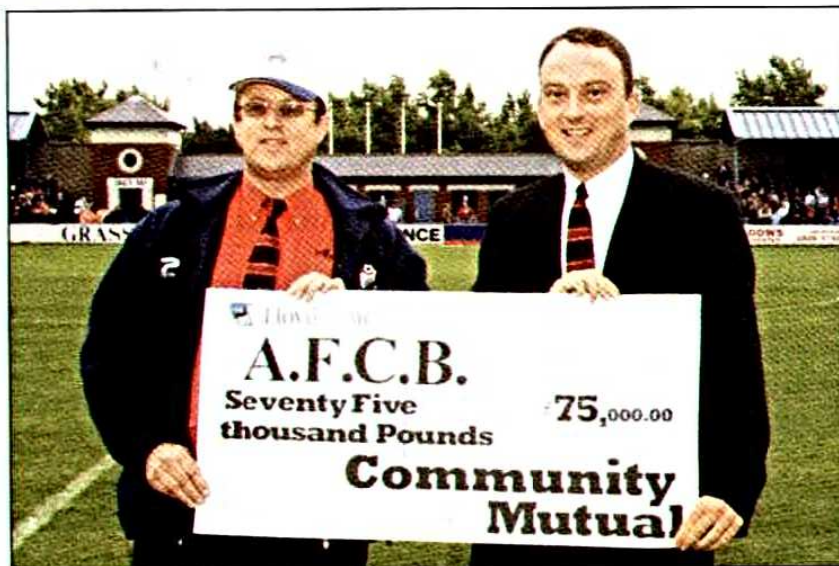
