

OUR 4-1 VICTORY at Barnsley last Saturday was a terrific confidence booster and I was delighted with many aspects of the performance.

But there is still room for improvement. While you won't get too many complaints from any manager whose side have won away, scoring four goals, I know we can play better.

Barnsley had a couple of really good chances in the first half and if they had taken them it might have been a different story. I have stressed before how important the opening goal is in determining the outcome of our matches. Once we got it I always had the gut feeling that we would go on to win.

One pleasing aspect was that after conceding early in the second half to be only 2-1 ahead we stood firm and gave ourselves the platform to score twice more.

I was also pleased with the way we kept our discipline in the closing stages when the game became more physical. It was understandable that Barnsley would show some frustration and at times it was necessary to turn the other cheek.

Hopefully, the fact that the players were able to demonstrate self-control shows a growing maturity. We have already had three players sent off in away games this season and don't want to be hit by any more suspensions.

It was a big day for Christian Roberts at Barnsley with his first senior hat-trick. We have been working on getting him into the box more because he sometimes tends to concentrate too much on linking the play. I had said after the Chesterfield game that he was capable of scoring a lot of goals because he is getting into more and more good positions.

I also have to pay tribute to Peter Beadle's contribution over the last few games, which has been immense. Peter may not able to charge all over the pitch, but he has a great touch and he and Christian complement each other well.

This afternoon I would like to welcome my old friends Andy King and Malcolm Crosby, Although Swindon are experiencing difficult times at the moment I am confident they will turn things round.

Today's game is a local derby and that often means you can throw the form book out of the window. Swindon came from two goals down to draw with Colchester last weekend, which shows a spirit we need to respect. They may be at the wrong end of the table, but we have prepared in exactly the same way as we would if they were near the top.

This afternoon we are also joining in the national campaign to eliminate racism from football, which I wholeheartedly support.

A big thank-you to the fans who gave us such terrific support at Barnsley. More of the same today and we'll do our best to reward it.

Working towards a professional lifestyle

IT IS PERHAPS slightly ironic that fans who have adopted "Drink Up Thy Zider" as a club anthem are so ferocious when it comes to whether players should be allowed to have an alcoholic drink.

But this is the subject I have been bombarded with more than anything else since becoming Chairman.

The players are expected to adopt a professional approach at all times, keeping themselves fit and healthy in order that they can perform to the highest possible standard on match days.

A healthy lifestyle is part and parcel of this, and a great deal of time and effort is dedicated to helping them get the best out of themselves.

We are very pleased to have on board Frank Nuttall a highly respected fitness coach, who over the next three months will be working hard for the players on their physical fitness, diet and helping to improve their recovery time from injury.

Not only will Frank be working with the players, but will train our coaches to enable them to carry on this work in the future.

Our Club Doctor Heather Montague has recently been awarded a grant by the



Football Association to carry out research into the lifestyle of players and how this affects their physical fitness and in particular their recovery rate from injury.

This work is incredibly beneficial to the club as a whole, whilst at the same time illustrating the high esteem with which the work we do is held nationally.

A healthy body makes for a healthy mind, but a little help here also does not go amiss.

Brian Jones, a top sports psychologist from the North East, continues to work with the players to ensure they are always focused on getting the best out of themselves. The evidence is there for you to see that we work hard to get the best out of the players. In return, we expect them to look after themselves. In this respect a few drinks on the night after a game when they are not expected for training the next day is acceptable, but the rest of the time it is not.

If anyone steps outside of this, they know they are letting their team mates down and should expect to be dealt with accordingly.

Now here's to three points and we can all have a drink tonight.

MIKE FACING LONGER LAY-OFF MIKE STOWELL IS facing at least

another five weeks on the sidelines with his frustrating shoulder injury.

It is already more than two months since the experienced goalkeeper had surgery to cure a problem that has proved much more serious than at first thought.

Mike explained: "When I went into hospital I was looking at being out for three or four weeks. But when I came around after the operation I was told it would be more like three or four months.

"It was a real shock. The surgeon found much more extensive damage than expected. It is really the shoulder equivalent of a cruciate ligament injury in the knee.

"At the moment I am basically doing another pre-season, running with Kevin Amankwaah and Louis Carey. They're half my age so it's tough to keep up with them. I thought I had long legs until I met Kevin!"

Louis actually returned to full training this week, having missed the entire season so far following knee surgery.



In fact everything seemed fine, but we've only won one game since - at home to Northampton Town - and have slipped down the table to the bottom four.


Manager Andy King is still in his job, but is coming under some increasing pressure from the local press. Most fans seem to be sticking by King, although there are a small number who want him to go.

THE MANAGER

ANDY KING

Born: Luton, August 1956. Re-instated as manager in December last season following a boardroom upheaval at the County Ground.

He pent his playing days as a midfielder with Luton Town (twice). Everton, Queens Park Rangers, West Bromwich Albion, Dutch side Cambuur, Wolves and Aldershot.

His first managerial appointment was in charge of Mansfield Town whom he guided to a Division Three play-off semi-final in 1994/95.

King then worked alongside former Everton team-mate Peter Reid at Sunderland as a scout. before Colin Todd took him to Swindon in the summer of 2000, taking over as manager following Todd's departure to join Derby County that November.

His first season with Swindon saw the Wiltshire club avoid relegation on the final day of the season, and

he was briefly replaced by ex-Liverpool manager Roy Evans for the first half of 2001/02.

But after the club's new owners arrived he took legal action regarding his dismissal and he was given his job back.

JIMMY DAVIES Born: Bromsgrove, 6.2.83. Striker who is a loan signing from Manchester United, for whom he has made a single full appearance in the Worthington Cup. has also played on loan for Antwerp. Total Swindon appearances: 7+2, 1 goal

DAVID DUKE Born: Inverness, 7.11.78. Left-sided midfielder who was a free transfer signing from Sunderland, for whom he failed to make a first-team appearance, in 2000. Has made the left-back position his own this season since the departure of Sol Davis. 88+16, 3




moves to Torquay and the Royals. playing in their 4-0 defeat at Ashton Gate in 2000/2001. 59+9, 0



Played for Major Soccer League side Chicago Fire before moving across the Atlantic to join Portsmouth in March 1999. Moved to the County Ground on a free transfer this summer. 10+1, 0.

SAM PARKIN Born: Roehampton, 14.3.81. Striker who was a free transfer signing from Chelsea this summer after scoring 11 goals in Division Two in a string of successful loan spells for Millwall, Wycombe, Oldham and Northampton in recent seasons. 11+1,5

ALAN REEVES Born: Birkenhead. 19.11.67. Experienced centre-back who has been a key figure in games between the two sides in recent seasons, scoring the winner at Ashton Gate in September 2000 only to be sent-off at the County Ground last January. Signed a new one-year deal in the summer.. Has also played for Norwich City, Gillingham (loan), Chester City, Rochdale and Wimbledon. 151+6, 10

STEVE ROBINSON Born: Nottingham, 17.1.75. Tough-tackling central or right-sided midfielder who was snapped up from Birmingham City for £50,000 in February 2001. Began his career as a trainee with the Blues and has also played for Peterborough and

Kidderminster on loan. 72+3, 2

ERIC SABIN Born: Sarcelles (France), 26.1.75. Pacy French striker compared by manger Andy King to Arsenal's Thierry Henry when he was signed from French Second Division club Wasquehall last summer. Has not quite lived up to that tag since, scoring just five times in his first season with the club. 51+1, 7

ADAM WILLIS Born: Nuneaton, 21.9.76. Centre-back who arrived on a free transfer from Coventry where he was a trainee - in 1998 and was ex-Robins boss Steve McMahon's last signing for the club. 
Matthew Hill scored his first goal for the club to cap a memorable week which also saw the birth of his first child.



Apart from Boaz Myhill, our on-loan goalkeeper from Aston Villa, every player was either currently attached to our Academy or had progressed through it.







Howard Pritchard

WELSH INTERNATIONAL WINGER

Howard Pritchard was ever-present in City's 1983/84 promotion campaign.

Initially an apprentice at Ashton Gate, he signed professional under Alan Dicks in August 1976 and made his First Division debut in City's 1-0 victory at home to Aston Villa in August 1978. He had to wait until the corresponding fixture midway through the following season for his next full League appearance and helped City to reach the FA Cup fifth round in 1980/81, but was allowed to join Swindon Town on a free transfer in August 1981.

Playing alongside Paul Rideout in their attack, he experienced relegation for the third successive season in 1981/82 and netted 11 goals in 65 League games for today's visitors prior to rejoining City in August 1983.


He gained his sole Welsh cap as a substitute against Norway in February 1985 and scored at Wembley in City's 1986 Freight Rover Trophy final triumph.


Netting 24 goals in 157 League games overall during his two spells at Ashton Gate, he was sold to Gillingham for £22,500 in August 1986, and was everpresent that season as the Gills reached the Third Division playoff final only to lose to Swindon in a replay.

He then moved to Walsall for £20,000 in July 1988, and had spells at Maidstone United, Yeovil Town, Yate and Nailsea.

Subsequently a driver for Frenchay Health Authority, he has also run his own driving school in Backwell.



Loans: solution or curse?

LEROY LITA'S BLAZING strike into the roof of the Port Vale net marked the arrival on the Football League scene of a bright, talented new prospect.

Yet without the astuteness of City's Academy recruitment team Lita's abundant ability might have been allowed to drift into obscurity.

The young striker's move from Chelsea last summer reflected a climate in which young footballers must attempt to forge a career for themselves. With clubs such as Chelsea relying on players of international renown to lead their challenge for domestic and European honours, the opportunity for the likes of Lita to emerge at the top level has been reduced significantly, and in some respects that has been a boon for lower division clubs able to snatch the scraps.

The increasing trend of Second Division clubs taking Premiership Academy players on long-term loans rather than signing them on permanent deals is, however, arguably a double-edged sword.

Although the clubs enjoy a quick injection of real talent over the course of a season, and supporters are offered the chance to observe stars in the making at close quarters, there is a sense in which such signings can amount to the papering over of cracks rather than the actual fixing of problems.

That is an argument applicable to both Bournemouth and Huddersfield Town, After enjoying

18 goals from West Ham's Jermain Defoe in 2000/01, the Cherries were relegated the following season; and, in the absence of Chelsea's Leon Knight, Huddersfield's 16-goal top-scorer last season, the West Yorkshire club are flirting with relegation trouble in the Second Division this time round.

All of which brings into question the advisability of the Football League's close-season loosening of regulations on loan signings. Although there is no doubt a place for the use of loan signings to cover short-term problems (perhaps a role that Tony Butler is fulfilling at Ashton Gate in the absence of Louis Carey, Keith Millen and Kevin Amankwaah) it would seem that they can prove a false friend when used as a fix over a longer period.

That is something that many Second Division clubs will have to consider in the coming months the sustainability of Queens Park Rangers' form without Tommy Williams (Birmingham City), Jerome Thomas (Arsenal) and Simon Royce (Leicester City) will no doubt concern manager Ian Holloway; whilst today' visitors Swindon Town are seemingly having problems integrating Jimmy Davis of Manchester United and Tottenham's Johnnie Jackson, Evidence, perhaps, that loan deals can sometimes generate as many problems as they resolve.

Reading our goal!





without Sara Cox's dulcet tones in the morning. WHO OR WHAT MAKES YOU LAUGH?


Matthew Hill because he NEVER shuts up. WHAT'S YOUR MOST EMBARRASSING MOMENT IN TRAINING?

I think it tends to depend how much you want to hear! City fans have been great to me up to now. however, so there are no complaints on that score.


Sprinter Darren Campbell, who trains in Wales, often joined in with the Cardiff City players while I was there.



When you hope for the best But prepare for the . . . It's just like watching Bristol City.







Why we must never forget. The Ashton Gate Eight

















FEBRUARY 2ND 1982 is a date that should be etched into the consciousness of every Bristol City supporter, young and old. That was the day our club came within an hour of disappearing

This fact - and the people instrumental in preventing it from happening, should never be forgotten by any of us.

That was more than 20 years ago now and, as 2002 marks such a significant anniversary, now would surely be the perfect time for our directors to pay tribute to the men who played a significant part in ensuring the club had a future. I'm talking, of course, about the Ashton Gate Eight: Peter Aitken, Chris Garland. Jimmy Mann, Julian Marshall, Geoff Merrick. David Rodgers, Gerry Sweeney and Trevor Tainton.

Without getting too bogged down in the details of this enormously traumatic period of our club's history, these players accepted redundancy and tore up their contracts, thus saving the club from a compulsory winding up order and clearing the way for Bristol City (1982) plc to take over. Anyone with an association with the club owes a debt of gratitude to the Eight, whose actions played no small part in securing the club's future.

I believe the time is now right for their sacrifice to be acknowledged publicly and for us. the supporters, to let it be known that they may be gone but they will never be forgotten. Surely, 20 years on, the club could invite these players back to Ashton Gate and allow us all to

show our appreciation by presenting them on the pitch so we can say a collective thank you.

Football is once again in troubled financial waters, and we are all somewhat hardened to reports of this or that club going into administration. We are possibly guilty of taking such news with a pinch of salt and assuming a rescue package will prevent any club from actually folding. But 1982 was very real for City. We were on the precipice and looked over the edge into an abyss.

Yet over the past two decades the Ashton Gate Eight have gone largely unrecognised for their contribution in helping to ensure the future of the club we love.

Come on City! Invite them back and let us all treat them to the heroes' reception they have deserved for far too long and are yet to receive. "EDSON" (HUW GRIFFITHS)

EDITOR'S NOTE: In autumn 1981, with City's financial plight worsening by the day, a rescue package was proposed by two local businessmen, Deryn Coller and Ken Sage. They suggested the formation of a new board - Bristol City (1982) - but told eight players the new company would not be able to honour their contracts. With just one hour to go before the deadline of midday, February 2nd - the day the club's future would be decided - the players took the ultimate decision to terminate their contracts and ensure City's survival. The club continued as Bristol City (1982) PLC.



A question of identity


YOU COULD BE forgiven for thinking that both Paul Weller and Michael Jackson have played at Wembley, but neither of them actually have. They haven't even appeared at Cardiff's Millennium stadium.

No, I'm not talking about the Mr Weller who once fronted The Jam, or the wacko Jacko who used to moonwalk for a living. I am, of course, referring to Paul Weller of Burnley "fame" and Michael Jackson of Preston North End.

These are just two of today's footballers who share their names with well-known celebrities. Others include Paul McKenna at Preston, and Stockport County's Lee Evans. City fans will now be familiar with Robbie Williams, who made his home debut for Barnsley last weekend.

To add to the confusion several ex-City players also have namesakes in the same sport. There is a Rob Edwards at Chesterfield, a Steve Jones at both Crewe Alexandra and Cheltenham Town, and a Steve Torpey who joined Port Vale from Liverpool earlier this year.

The subject of names in football is quite interesting. There are several players known by one name only. Arsenal seem to have an abundance of these - Silvinho. Edu, and youngsters Israel and Juan, who all hail from Sao Paulo. Other one-namers in the game include Marcelo (Walsall).



Yordi (Blackburn), Jordao (WBA), and Emerson (Sunderland).

Then there are those names that can lead to confusion. especially when relying on radio commentary. These suggest that maybe the player should be elsewhere. For example: Simon Charlton (Bolton). Wayne Carlisle (Bristol Rovers), David Birmingham (Bournemouth), Jermaine Darlington (Wimbledon), and Jack Lester (Nottingham Forest).

Meanwhile names, such as Jamie Victory (Cheltenham Town), and Danny Invincible (Swindon), are every sports journalists' dream when it comes to newspaper headlines.

There are a few footballers out there with particularly unusual or unfortunate names spare a thought for

A header in the 27th minute, an opportunist left-footed strike near the hour and a superb right-footed free kick rounded off an afternoon to remember for the Welshman.


Kiwi sub Leo Bertos netted a consolation goal for sorry Barnsley, who are currently in deep financial trouble.
