#### A WARM WELCOME TO THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME AGAINST OPR, A GAME THAT TWO WEEKS AGO I IMAGINE MANY OF YOU WOULD HAVE SEEN AS A KEY FIXTURE IN TERMS OF OUR SURGE TOWARDS THE PLAY-OFFS.

Unfortunately that dream seems to have died in our last two games and it has been a frustrating couple of weeks. I must admit that I expected much more than one point from two games, especially when you look at the opposition we were facing, but that is what has happened and we must now return to winning ways.

I was more disappointed with the nature of our performances rather than the results themselves. Against Wycombe, for whatever reason we had seven or eight players playing under par and last week at Vale, we just didn't take the game by the scruff of the neck. As I always say you can sometimes get away with one or two performing badly, but when it's most of the team you are always likely to struggle. Wycombe, to be fair to them came here with a game plan and stuck to it and did a good job in preventing our lads from playing their usual game. But after what I hoped would be a one-off blip, I asked for much more from the side at Port Vale and to be honest, it was another poor game and against poor opposition. Defensively Vale weren't that strong, but then we never really put them under enough pressure. They weren't even a great attacking force and so to go a goal down, so quickly after half time put us under unnecessary pressure – the good thing is that we managed to come back quickly.

I just felt that had we taken the game to them more, and had we stepped up a gear we would have won easily – unfortunately we just couldn't find that gear. Perhaps more worrying was the lack of real chances. Danny had a good chance in the first half and Sam almost scored from the rebound, but it wasn't until Eric Sabin came on that we looked to

get behind their defence. But I always try and take the positives away from the game and the fact is we didn't lose. There were those that were predicting a slump after the Wycombe game and we showed great resolve in coming back. The pitch made it difficult for both teams and so we couldn't play our passing game, but I think the team worked tremendously hard and to be fair, they were the better team. I was pleased for Sam – I had spoken to him in the week and he needed that goal, it's a great confidence booster for him and I'm sure he'll be looking to reach that 20-mark today.

This afternoon we face a side in the top six and on a rich vein of form. QPR, as we know from our previous encounter are a strong side with great attacking prowess and we must play better than we have done if we are to compete with them. They are chasing the play-offs and have recently put a good run together, but if we are to harbour any aspirations of climbing the table, and that is all we can do now – then we must perform to a higher level.

Changing the subject slightly, this weekend I am proud to be wearing a Goal badge supporting child protection in football. Fellow managers up and down the country will also be wearing them and will also be taking the time to write about putting children first as part of an FA initiative. Goal is about doing things the right way, doing things properly. It's about allowing children to enjoy the game without abuse of any kind. That means bullying, physical, emotional or sexual abuse and neglect. Child protection is high on The FA's agenda and a priority at this club too. We already have someone responsible for child protection issues. The goal is to have someone at every club in the country aware of child protection and best practice, whether it's a Premiership Academy or a Sunday morning park side. Already over 45,000 people have attended The FA's Child protection and best practice courses. These people are mostly volunteers who care about the game. I'm lucky - I get paid for managing a football team. But like those who turn out to help run kids' sides every weekend, I care about the future of football. And that means putting children first.

I hope you will all get behind this campaign and for now, enjoy today's game.

Former Town keeper Frank Talia lined up in the Wycombe Wanderers goal in front of the Town End and received the predictable vocals from the Town End, which was at near capacity. Town's faithful sensed an outside shot at the play-offs, however it was Sanchez's side that won all three points and in doing so, leapfrogged Town in the league table.

In the early exchanges Town had the better of possession but Wycombe created the first opening with a shot from Craig Faulconbridge that fell into the arms of Griemink.

Town enjoyed their first proper chance on 16 minutes when a neat ball from Miglioranzi found Parkin whose acute inside ball found Invincibile who cut inside into the box. Unfortunately his attempted shot was blocked by former Town player Andy Thompson, who performed well upon his return to The County Ground. On twenty minutes Matt Hewlett was fouled on the edge of the box to present Andy Gurney with a chance to put some quality into the box. The ball in was headed on by Reeves to Invincibile who headed straight at Talia in front of the Town End.

The opening goal came from a goalmouth melee that saw Keith Ryan score after Steve Brown's header rebounded off the bar. Straight after Miglioranzi skipped past a challenge before laying the ball onto Marney who played in Parkin on the right hand side. Parkin cut inside and saw his angled effort palmed away by Talia as the visitors held on to a one-goal lead.

Swindon began the second period attacking the Stratton Bank and Miglioranzi saw his clearance deflected into the path of Roberts whose looping effort fell the wrong side of Griemink's post for the visitors.

> Soon after Wycombe scored their second goal, effectively killing the game off on 55 minutes. Following a Town attack, Talia rolled the ball out and a combination of passes found Stuart Roberts who fed Danny Bulman. The youngster coolly slotted past Griemink following some neat close control from just eight yards out.

However just a minute after the second goal Invincibile rattled the crossbar with a 30 yard thunderbolt.

This got the crowd going once again and Town boss Andy King made a double change shortly after the goal. Matt Hewlett and Dean Marney were replaced by Eric Sabin and Jerel Ifil, who was making his home debut after impressive substitute appearances at Barnsley and Tranmere Rovers last weekend.

Invincibile then saw his attempted lob just fall the wrong side of the post as Town continued to search for their opener. Sabin's control let him down on 70 minutes as he tried to play through Invincibile.

Swindon went 3-0 down on 73 minutes as a cross from Brown found Faulconbridge whose header floated across Griemink and into the net at the back post. Goal scorer and former Coventry striker Faulconbridge was replaced by Holligan to a standing ovation from the visiting fans in the corner of the Arkell's stand.

With ten minutes to go substitute Jerel Ifil hit a stinging 30-yard drive that was well saved by Talia who did well to palm the ball away for a corner. The subsequent corner found Ifil but his shot found the empty seats in the Stratton Bank as fans headed for the exits.

### PORT VALE 1 ARMSTRONG 46 SWINDON TOWN 1 PARKIN 54

A case of two points dropped for Andy King's side last week as Town drew 1-1 at Vale Park. Sam Parkin's 19th of the season wasn't enough to ensure that Town returned to winning ways and instead, the 368 Town Fans went home feeling frustrated by their team's efforts - or lack of them.

ACTION

A dour first half saw just one chance fall to either side and whilst an early Vale goal courtesy of lan Armstrong threatened to ignite the game, there was little in the second period to suggest that either side deserved anything more than a point. Invincibile, who looked bright in the opening stages saw a right-footed effort rebound off the post before Stephen Brooker forced Griemink into a reflex save from eight yards with a powerful strike.

There was just one change to Town's starting line-up with Jerel Ifil replacing Dean Marney on the right hand side of midfield. Ifil was quiet throughout and it was the home side that enjoyed the first chance of the game. Adrian Littlejohn, having joined the club on a short contract basis earlier in the week, had Vale's first effort when the former Sheffield United striker put in a teasing cross. Griemink, seemingly under no pressure, palmed the ball round the goal for the first corner of the game. At the other end Town controlled possession without really threatening and Town's army had to wait until the 18th minute for an effort on goal. Invincibile beat two players and, having given himself a yard to shoot, hit a low effort against Vale's post. Sam Parkin collected the rebound but could only see his right-footed drive rebound over the bar for a corner. Town continued to edge forward with Miglioranzi controlling the play in the centre of the park. Duke looked to be a good outlet on the left and Hewlett threatened with a speculative drive from the edge of the area before Brooker came close for the Valiants. A cross from the right hand side wasn't cleared by Town's defence and Brooker, with three goals to his name this season, hit a fierce drive towards Griemink. Fortunately for

Town Griemink was on hand to push the ball round the post as the referee blew his whistle for half time.

The second half started catastrophically for the visitors as lan Armstrong gave Vale the lead within 18 seconds of the re-start. Armstrong latched on to a through ball and his low shot beat Griemink from 12 yards. Town seemed stunned, yet had little in return and Vale could have made it two soon after. McPhee and Brooker linked well and McPhee hit a right-footed effort before Griemink pushed the ball away from danger. Just as Vale looked to be taking control of the game Town equalised with a scrappy goal from Sam Parkin.

Swindon grew in confidence, yet despite their growing pressure couldn't apply the final through ball. It all seemed laborious and when Town pushed forward again through Marney, they really should have done better. In the end the momentum was lost by the time Gurney supplied Milglioranzi with the ball on the edge of the box. However, Town's Brazilian midfielder did enough to force Goodlad into a low save.

Marney, on for Ifil looked dangerous - but across the board there was not enough urgency in Town's attack - only the introduction of Eric Sabin livening up the proceedings. ### FANS SEIZE CONTROLOF PORT VALE



Fans of troubled Second Division club Port Vale have taken over the club. Supporters' group Valiant 2001 won the battle to become the new owners after administrators announced it as the preferred bid.

The decision, which has to be approved at a creditors' meeting on March 17, allays Vale fears of a merger with Potteries rivals Stoke City. Stoke's Icelandic owners were among those looking to gain control of the club. That raised the spectre among Vale fans of a ground share at Stoke's Britannia Stadium, with an eventual merger of the two clubs. Adminstrator Bob Young, of Poppleton and Appleby, chose the supporters' group ahead of rival bids from Waterworld owner Mo Chaudry, Summerbank Management, business partners Steve Ball and Jain McIntosh, and Stoke's owners. Peter Walker from Valiant 2001 told BBC Radio Stoke: "We're very pleased with the announcement and the hard work has paid off so far. We want it to be a club owned and run by its supporters."



Huddersfield Town are hoping to have their transfer embargo lifted to allow them to sign a replacement goalkeeper. A groin injury to on-loan Southampton keeper Scott Bevan has left Terriers boss Mick Wadsworth with only Phil Senior, who has started just one League game for the club, to call on. The Terriers are under an embargo because of help needed from the PFA to pay wages earlier this season.

They hope they will be permitted to bring in another keeper to help their fight against the drop. Chairman David Taylor said: "If Scott Bevan is out for four or five weeks then I am sure we would be able to bring in a back-up keeper. We do have an embargo but the FA could make particular concessions in extreme cases. We would have to make a case to the Football League and the PFA in order to bring someone in," Taylor told the club's website.





### ROBINS HOPING FOR PERMANENT ROBINS DEAL



On-loan striker Mark Robins is interested in earning a permanent move to Bristol City. The former Manchester United star is spending a month at Ashton Gate after finding himself out of favour at first division play-off hopefuls Rotherham, and after making a scoring debut against Cambridge in the LDV Vans Trophy on Tuesday he admitted that he is interested in a permanent move. "I am very keen to hold down a first-team place and help the team consolidate its place in the play-offs," he told the club's official website. "It is still early days yet and, as far as I am aware, I am only here for a month. Whether I stay on obviously depends on what happens here and how well Rotherham are doing."

### CHAIRBOYS TO WIELD THE AXE?

It's bound to feed down to the players," admitted the 36-year-old. "There's 11 of us up in June and we have to just wait for the gaffer to sort the finances out. It's out of our hands but I can only see it getting worse. We have to take it on the chin." Manager Lawrie Sanchez has promised Rammell and the other ten players a decision on their futures before transfer deadline day.

## QUEENS PARK RANGERS

IT'S NOT JUST THOSE THAT SPEND THEIR SATURDAY AFTERNOONS INSIDE 'THE LOFT' THAT ARE ASKING THEMSELVES JUST WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO OPR IN

RECENT YEARS.

Following a 'close-call' in 1998/99 in which a last ditch 6-0 victory against Crystal Palace contrived to see the Hoops avoid the drop, there were those that thought that the disastrous season may have been a temporary blip, and that the damage would be repaired as they looked to return to the heady heights of the top half of the table.

However, after a season of relative safety, any signs of survival and future prosperity were quashed a year later when, two managers, one caretaker manager and assistant manager later – the Superhoops slipped into Division Two. It was the first time in over 30 years that the club had plied its trade outside of the top two divisions.

Amazingly, unlike so many other Clubs that have since endured similar falls from grace, (including ourselves and the likes of Oldham, Luton and Huddersfield) the glory days weren't that long ago. In fact many a Hoops' fan will tell you that it wasn't so long ago that they were the highest placed London side in the country, and that in 1976 they were just 13 minutes from winning the league (three goals from Liverpool away at Wolves prevented them from doing so).

Yet quite where the West Londoners have gone wrong in recent years is open to debate, but what is clear is that the level of high wages forked out on underachieving stars contrived, not only to take the side down two divisions, but also threatened the very foundation of a club trying its best to keep up with local rivals, Chelsea. For too many years the Club from Loftus Road became embroiled in tales of off-field controversy and financial mis-management and whilst the Club may still be finding its feet in Division Two, at least financial security and clarity seems to have been achieved by its current management.

On the field lan Holloway is doing his utmost to make sure that the Club he represented so valiantly as a player returns to whence it came. Joining Rangers from Bristol Rovers, Holloway could not prevent QPR from slipping through the relegation trap door in his first season. With Kenny Jackett installed as Assistant Manager, his side started last year's campaign brightly and they were rarely out of the top eight all season. However, inconsistency and a reliance on one man (Andy Thomson) to score the goals saw them miss out last time around —failure this year is unthinkable.

Amazingly, and despite another overwhelming sense of 'here we go again' following a run of 12 games without a win (in all competitions) before the new year, more than 13,000 saw them beat Port Vale last week. The victory saw them register another win in a run that has seen them lose just twice in the last eight and the fact that they're still attracting Division One –sized grounds speaks volumes for their loyal support. A win today will see them edge away from Blackpool in seventh place and they must be confident of victory – Town are yet to register a goal against them in their previous three encounters. Hopefully today will see a change in fortunes...

lan returned to Loftus Road in February 2001, taking over from the departing manager Gerry Francis with QPR fighting against relegation to Division Two.

Having made his senior debut as a player for Bristol Rovers back in April 1981, when he made a substitute appearance against Wrexham, he left in 1985 for Wimbledon before going to Brentford. He returned to the Memorial Stadium in 1987 under Gerry Francis and spent a further four years in The Pirates' midfield.

He followed Francis to Loftus Road in 1991 and spent five years at QPR, making 147 appearances and becoming a firm favourite with the Loftus Road fans, before returning to Bristol Rovers as player/manager in May 1996.

After a tricky start to his managerial career, Ian led The Pirates to the Second Division play-offs in 1998, where they lost to Northampton in the semi-finals, then narrowly missed out on a play-off berth in 1999/2000. Bristol Rovers were also struggling against relegation - in Division Two - when lan was dismissed in January 2001, ending his third spell with his hometown club. Although he was disappointed, he was quickly given the opportunity to return to management, and facing a similar challenge at QPR.

Unable to break into the United side, Nick played four matches on loan at Hull City during the 1999/00 season and then spent the entire 2000/01 season on loan at Bristol Rovers where he made fifty four appearances. Returned to United for 2001/02 but then went out on loan again, this time to Scottish Club Livingstone where he benefited from more first team football.

### MARCUS BEAN

Marcus came through the youth ranks at Rangers after first joining the Club as an eleven year old. His first team debut in August 2002 is one that he will want to forget though, as not only did Rangers lose 4-1 at Wycombe, but he was also sent off only eight minutes after coming on as a substitute.

#### MARC BIRCHAM

Lifelong Rangers fan Marc joined Rangers on a free transfer from Millwall in July 2002. Marc was a Trainee at The New Den before he first broke into their team in the 1996/97 season when he made six the Lions. appearances for Established himself in the Millwall team at the start of the 1998/99 season and his energetic midfield displays also earned him call up to the Canadian National Team for whom he has now made thirteen full appearances and scored one goal.

### TERRELL FORBES

Versatile defender signed on a free transfer from West Ham in July 2001. Came through the youth system at Upton Park but never made a first team appearance for the Hammers in his two seasons there. Made three appearances on loan at AFC Bournemouth in 1999/00.

#### PAUL FURLONG

Experienced striker who joined Rangers in September 2002 on a free transfer from Birmingham City after an initial loan spell at Loftus Road. Paul began his career in the nonleague ranks at Enfield Town before Coventry City snapped him up for £130,000 in July 1991. A year later he moved on to Watford before Chelsea paid £2.3M for Paul in May 1994. Just two seasons later Paul was on the move again, this time to Birmingham City for £1.5M.



Former England Youth and Under 21 striker who rejoined Rangers in November 2001 on a free transfer from Barnsley. Kevin left Rangers at the end of the 1999/00 season to join Huddersfield town where he scored ten goals in thirty nine appearances for the Terriers. Barnsley signed him at the start of the 2001/02 season but less than four months later Kevin returned to Loftus Road where he had previously been brought up through



the Clubs Youth system.

### DANIEL SHITTU

Powerfully built central defender signed in January 2002 from Charlton Athletic for an initial fee of £250,000, after previously spending two months on loan at Loftus Road. Daniel never played a competitive match for Charlton but made 19 appearances on loan at Blackpool towards the end of the 2000/01 season, scoring two goals. Daniel has now established himself in the heart of the Rangers defence and his impressive displays earned him an International call-up in March 2002.

#### LEROY GRIFFITHS

Striker signed from Hampton & Richmond for £40,000 in May 2001 after he impressed in a Reserve match on trial. Leroy began his career at Corinthian Casuals where he scored 23 goals in 49 appearances for the Ryman League Club. He then joined Hampton & Richmond where he netted a further 22 goals in 58 starts.

### RICHARD LANGLEY

Former Trainee who signed professional in December 1996. Has represented England at Under 16 and Youth level. Richard made his first team debut in October 1998 when he appeared as a substitute against Town, he went on to score his first goal for Rangers on his home debut against Barnsley three days later.



Local player who progressed through the Youth ranks and signed professionally on his seventeenth birthday. Strongly built striker who was a regular goalscorer during his youth team days, once scoring all four goals against Liverpool in a 4-4 draw in an Under 18 match. Richard made his debut for Rangers as an eighteen year old but will remember it with mixed emotions as it came on the day Rangers were relegated from the First Division at Huddersfield in April 2001

### STEVE PALMER

Highly experienced defender signed on a free transfer from Watford in July 2001. Graduate of Cambridge University, Steve joined Ipswich Town in August 1989 and went on to make 130 appearances for the Suffolk club, scoring three times. He joined Watford for £135,000 in September 1995 and during one particular season for the Hornets actually played in every position including goalkeeper.

### GINO PADULA

Left back who was first signed by lan Holloway for Bristol Rovers from Xerez in Spain in October 1999. Gino then joined Walsall a month later where he went on to make twenty seven appearances before joining Wigan Athletic on a free transfer in July 2000. Joined Rangers in July 2002 and made his debut in August 2002 away at Barnsley.

## **THEM AND US**

Born in Salford in November 1955, Brian Williams made his debut for Bury in a Fourth Division away defeat at Hereford on December 9 1972 while still an apprentice. Signing as a professional in April 1973, he operated in midfield and over 150 Shakers' League games were to feature Brian's name on the team sheet during his spell at Gigg Lane where he took to the field alongside other future Swindon signings in Andy Rowland and Ian Miller. Managed by another future Town recruit Bobby Smith, Bury clinched promotion from the Fourth Division in 1973/74.

In July 1977, Brian was tempted to London to sign for QPR in return for £70,000, a move that stepped him up to the top division and teamed him up with Gerry Francis and Peter Eastoe. His stay at Loftus Road was to last less than a year and less than 20 appearances before Bobby Smith, now in the Town manager's chair, called to renew acquaintances and bring Williams to Wiltshire. Loftus Road received £50,000 of their initial outlay.

Brian joined a Third Division team that was full of confidence as Smith performed a round up of his old Bury charges. Rowland and Miller were also persuaded to join the club as money was found to bolster the squad in a way that would make Andy King green with envy today. Full reward was tantalisingly close as in 1979/80 Town reached the League Cup semi-finals and looked likely to take the step up to Division Two. Adopting the affectionate nickname 'Animal', either through his physical similarity to the Muppet character or his style of play (take your pick), Brian made almost 100 appearances for Swindon before moving on to Bristol Rovers (with the Town promotion dream unfulfilled) in a swap with the Pirates' midfielder Gary Emmanuel in July 1981.

In four seasons at Eastville he took to the field 192 times before moving on to rivals Bristol City in July 1985, spending all his time in Bristol in the old Division Three. In July 1987 at almost 32 Brian moved up into Division Two joining Shrewsbury and finishing his career at Gay Meadow after an extremely impressive 642 League games. Alan McDonald joined Swindon when he was

released from his playing contract from QPR in the summer 1997. Steve McMahon decided on a defensive old head to help steady the rearguard, and 6'3" Alan's aerial power had performed wonders for Rangers for whom he had signed professionally in August 1981 after serving an apprenticeship.

He actually made his League debut on loan at Charlton where he played the last nine games of 1982/83 and helped the Valiants avoid the drop into Division Three, but at the same time across London QPR were claiming the Second Division championship and breaking into the top division. Making the Rangers first team the following September Alan made five appearances which included games against Arsenal and Liverpool, all along side another future Swindon defender Terry Fenwick.

402 League appearances and 13 goals would follow at Loftus Road as Alan became the first name on the team sheet. Fifth place finishes in the top flight were achieved in 1984, 88 and 93 until Alan suffered the first relegation of his career in 1995/96.

At Swindon McDonald initially tearned up with Mark Seagraves in the heart of defence but by October Craig Taylor had established himself as Alan's partner as Town fought to avoid relegation to Division Two. Appearing in 33 of the 46 League games, he marked his spell in Wiltshire with his only goal for Swindon in a 1-1 home draw with Stockport. If a goal was rare for Alan, it wasn't much more common for Swindon who incredibly scored just ten goals in the last 24 games of the season but still finished four points and four places clear of third from bottom and relegated Manchester City. Finishing just one place above the drop zone that year were QPR

The Belfast born defender gained 52 caps and perhaps the highlight of his career was his trip to Mexico in 1986 on duty for Northern Ireland where he played in the 3-0 defeat to Brazil. Alan was released from his contract with Swindon at the age of 35 at the end of his only season in the West Country, when he returned to Loftus Road to commence coaching duties.



## THE BOY FROM BRAZIL

SO MANY PLAYERS FROM EUROPE AND BEYOND TRY THEIR LUCK IN THE ENGLISH GAME, WITH MANY OF THEM FALLING BY THE WAY SIDE NEVER TO BE HEARD OF AGAIN. YET THERE ARE SOME THAT SHINE AND WHEN STEFANI MIGLIORANZI LEFT THE SOUTH-COAST TO JOIN SWINDON IN THE SUMMER, TOWN CERTAINLY PICKED UP THEIR OWN LITTLE GEM AS NICK JUDD EXPLAINS.

It can be a difficult decision for managers. So many players offering them their services, with many claiming to have a glowing background including experience with continental clubs. Just think of the list of names that have been and gone in the last few years; Kim Heisleberg, Mark Tuomelo, Antoine Van Der Linden, not to mention the countless number of unsuccessful trialists that have failed to impress in the last three seasons.

Yet every so often one comes along that outshines the rest and based upon his efforts this season, Stefani Milioranzi seems to be such a case. Strong, elegant and with time on the ball that others can only dream of – he's been nothing short of a revelation in Andy King's midfield.

Yet when you consider 'Mig's' sporting and cultural upbringing it is easy to see why he plays the way he does. With an Italian passport and a father that once played with Rivelino back in Brazil – it's hardly surprising to see why Stef's excelled since coming to England.

"My Father was a good player but unfortunately his career was cut short by a knee injury. He started playing for our hometown club, Caldense, before moving on to Corinthians for a short while. Of course Rivelino was there at the time, but unfortunately my Dad returned to Caldense, partly because he wanted to be with my Mother. He then picked up an injury and had five reconstruction operations in an attempt to sort himself out – unfortunately it wasn't to be and he gave it up at just 22."

Miglioranzi started his own footballing life in America whilst at College. "I started with one of the best Youth Development Clubs in New York, FC Westchester, before going on to college. I did well once at College and by the time I went to St Johns University, I decided that I really wanted to pursue a career in it."



In 1999 he decided to try his luck in England and, after an unsuccessful trial at Everton, he turned his attentions to the south-coast and Portsmouth. "Several scouts spoke to me in America and in the end, I went to Everton for a couple of months. I did well there, but unfortunately because of the weather I didn't get to play any games and I subsequently went down to Portsmouth for some match experience. Alan Ball liked what he saw and signed me on a short-term contract."

Unfortunately things didn't work out for our favourite New Yorkan and after 42 appearances (and two goals spread over a period of nearly two and a half years) – he set about finding a new Club, with Swindon offering him a trial with a view to him signing a month-to-month contract. "By the time my contract ran out at Portsmouth I was looking for another Club. Andy King invited me to join the Club to see what I thought, and vice versa – and by the start of the season I was signed on a month-to-month deal."

And what a move it's proved to be. Virtually ever present and in fine form since his league debut against Barnsley – it's been a good season so far for the 25-year old.

Yet despite his success it hasn't all been plain sailing for Miglioranzi. He missed a number of games due to a change in Andy King's formation earlier on in the season. Not only that, but despite his impressive displays 'Stef' still finds himself on a month-to-month contract, his reoccurring injury a worry to Andy King (and his contract a symbol of the state of many football clubs these days, with few able to offer permanent contracts).

"It's frustrating because the future is so uncertain. But I am hopeful of a more permanent deal and there is one on the table. I m happy here and would love to sign on a long-term basis – I just hope it all works out. But football is certainly in a bit of a mess at the moment, with teams in the lower leagues unable to offer the sort of contract that was on available a few years ago."

Still, today's game is just one of 13 that 'Stef' has to try and persuade the coaching staff that he is worthy of a more permanent deal next time around – even if it is against one of the strongest sides in the league.

"It's a make or break game for us because although our play-off hopes have faded, a win against QPR will reduce the gap between us and them. They're a strong side with a lot of experience, but when we played them last time we were on an abysmal run of form and so this game will hopefully be a bit closer." The visit of QPR will, no doubt, remind Miglioranzi of his recent move to the capital. The New Yorkan was keen to move closer to his family, as well as some of his team mates. Lets hope that come 4.45pm it will be Stef returning to the capital with a smile on his face and not today's visitors. Moreover, let's hope that a good performance today will also a certain Mr King to keep him here for another season.

#### VINTAGE RED DICK MATTICK TAKES US BACK TO 1998 AND JUST A WEEK PRIOR TO OUR ENCOUNTER WITH THE HOOPS, WE'D LOST 6-0 TO MIDDLESBROUGH. SURELY IT COULDN'T GET ANY WORSE?!

Swindon's only FA Cup victory of the 1970/71 season came at Loftus Road when Arthur Horsfield and Peter Noble scored the Town goals in a 2-1 Third Round victory. In more recent times it was Rangers who gave Swindon their first home victory and their only double of the Premiership campaign of 1993/94

Today's featured match took place on March 14 1998 just three days after the club had taken a 6-0 hammering at Middlesbrough. The signing of Iffy Onuora from Gillingham for £120,000 indicated Swindon were attempting to fill the gap left by 'The Chief' Wayne Allison and he lined up at the front for Swindon alongside George Ndah who was making his first appearance after a two month injury layoff. It was the QPR forwards who struck first with just eight minutes played when former England Under 21 man, Kevin Gallen, set up Nigel Quashie who finished coolly. Just over a guarter of an hour had been played when the electrifying pace of Ndah took him past Karl Ready only for him to be brought down. Mark Walters stroked home the penalty and it seemed that the match would be a closely contested one.

After 21 minutes, came the incident that looked likely to ruin Town's afternoon. Darren Bullock headed the ball back to Fraser Digby who had advanced to the edge of his area to collect the ball. Although his feet were inside the area the linesman flagged and after a lengthy consultation referee Alan Butler sent the goalkeeper off for handling outside of the area and denying the Rangers a goal scoring opportunity. Despite having three substitutes none of them was a goalkeeper so Alan McDonald donned the keeper's shirt and gloves on the ground where he. had been a firm favourite for 17 years. With only three wins in twenty matches this might have seemed likely to hand the match to Rangers instead it seemed to galvanise Swindon and every man seemed to be playing as though their very lives depended on it. To rub salt into the London side's wounds the time added on for the stoppage when Digby was dismissed saw Town take the lead. Ty Gooden and Mark Walters worked a short corner that ended with Iffy Onuora diving to head home and score on his debut.

It had been twenty minutes after taking over before McDonald was tested, but the Rangers certainly threw everything at him in the second half but with a combination of skill, bravery and luck he kept them out. He threw himself to tip away a 20-yard shot from Mike Sheron, dived under lan Dowie's feet and ten minutes from time when he got his body in the way of a shot from point blank range. His display even earned an ovation from the Rangers fans at the end but the contribution of Town's midfield was equally as valuable as the stand in keeper. Scott Leitch, Lee Collins and Darren Bullock, who was picked by Adver reporter John Cross as man of the match, all gave excellent displays. Town manager Steve McMahon picked out the tremendous work rate of Ndah and Onuora in his after match comments but in truth every Swindon player had raised their game to overcome adversity

PORT VALE, ALEX FERGUSON AND HIS INFAMOUS BOOT KICK AND GERARD HOULLIER ARE THE SUBJECT OF MARK HANRAHAN'S THOUGHTS THIS WEEK...

Many of the 350-odd strong party of 'Town' away supporters may have noticed the fresh wave of optimism that has swept Vale Park over the last fortnight following news that fans of our troubled Second Division rivals have taken the club over. The Valiant 2001 supporters group has won the battle to become the new owners after administrators confirmed they held status as the preferred bid. Whilst the decision still has to be officially approved at a creditors' meeting on March 17th, it seems that at the very least fears of a merger with fierce Potteries' rivals Stoke City have been finally quashed. Stoke's Icelandic owners were among those bidding to gain control of the club.

Manchester United have dismissed reports that Sir Alex Ferguson blames Arsenal for leaking details about his spectacular dressing-room bust-up with England skipper David Beckham. The Guardian has suggested that Ferguson believes the story about Beckham receiving a cut eye was passed to the press by a player or member of staff at Arsenal. The incident took place following United's 2-0 FA Cup exit at the hands of the Gunners. Old Trafford director of communications Paddy Harverson has moved quickly to deny the rumors that Ferguson is furious with Arsenal over the story describing the suggestion as. "...silly speculation," to the BBC.

Jorg Albertz, the former Rangers colleague of Paul Gascoigne has chosen to follow his erstwhile ex-teammate by opting to play for a Chinese club, Shanghai Shenhua. The 32-year-old German international has struggled to figure in the Hamburg coach's plans this term and has been released from his contract. "I was warmly welcomed in China and I got the feeling I could be useful there," said Albertz. This sentiment was shared by Gazza who pointed out that the buzz around him from players and fans at games and in training had dispelled any fears of isolation or Ioneliness. Indeed, Gazza even managed to notch a spectacular hat trick on his debut! Albertz is expected to sign in time for the start of the Chinese season in March. Nicknamed 'Der Hammer' by the Ibrox faithful, Albertz played five seasons in Scotland scoring 76 goals in the process. Middlesbrough's diminutive Brazilian International Juninho Paulista will return to action this week. It will be the first time the pint-sized wizard has donned his boots since injury wrecked his

Premiership return to The Riverside. The 30-year-old South American suffered a ruptured cruciate ligament during a preseason tournament in Italy - just days after securing a shock move back to Boro. The Middlesbrough reserve match against Bradford on Wednesday was moved to The Riverside Stadium to cope with the mass demand for tickets.

Gerard Houllier has this week ruled-out any suggestion linking him with the manager's seat at Monaco. Houllier insists he is "totally committed" to Anfield despite coming under increasing pressure after a dreadful run of results, culminating in the 2-1 defeat at Birmingham last week. Liverpool are currently five points off the critical Champions League qualification goal, the result of which can make or break a clubs future - just ask David O'Leary and Peter Risdale. The Frenchman was linked with the manager's job at Monaco a couple of weeks ago. Speaking in an interview with a French newspaper seemed to indicate he would be interested in returning to France. He said: "I would be hasty if I said that Monaco is a club that does not interest me," he said. "I know Prince Albert very well and if the club has a great project in the future, then why not?"

Jody could make a move across London to Spurs this summer after talks on a new contract have thus far failed to materialise. Morris is disillusioned with his failure to break into boss Claudio Ranieri's plans despite impressing on a number of occasions this season when standing in for either Frank Lampard or more commonly Emmanuel Petit. Chelsea have put all contract talks on hold until the summer meaning that Morris is not the only one left waiting. Both John Terry and Eidur Gudjohnsen are awaiting news of improved deals, although Morris' case appears more pressing as his current deal expires in the summer. Everton have signed Wayne Rooney's 12-year-old brother John.

The news comes hot on the heels of Wayne's impressive first full England cap in the disappointing 3-1 defeat at the hands of Australia. Guess what, sources at the club are already saying John could be an even better player than his big brother, 17 year-old Wayne. Now I am sure that surprised you! Finally, York City have confirmed that they have been given an eleventh hour stay of execution after fans bankrolled the stricken English Third Division club for the next three weeks. The York Supporters Trust said fans had donated around £50,000 in just four days. "It has been an overwhelming response, not just from City fans, but from football supporters around the country and beyond," says trust spokesman Steve Beck. Fears had been raised that Saturday's home match against Bury would be the last in the club's 81-year history.

#### WIN TWO TICKETS! 25 YEARS AGO by Dave Wallis

On March 4 1978, Swindon faced Lincoln City at the County Ground in a match that paired Town against a team nine places below them in Division Three. The game was won in the 49th minute when home debutant Chic Bates scored the only goal of the game, his first since his arrival from Shrewsbury 11 days earlier. The win meant Town had risen from 13th to 7th in the space of just eight days.

Three days later Town were in home action again when they faced high-flying Preston North End who were sitting at the top of the table. Goals from Michael Baxter and Alex Bruce clinched the game for the visitors in front of a crowd of 10,213. The game brought John Trollope's 832nd League and Cup appearance for Swindon, a record number of appearances for a single club. Meanwhile, QPR were having a titanic struggle with Nottingham Forest in the fifth round of the FA Cup. A 1-1 draw at the City Ground on February 20 was followed by a similar score at Loftus Road on the 27th. On March 2, Forest finally sealed a place in round six with a 3-1 win in a second replay in Nottingham.

#### NO. 18 TUNA PASTA BAKE

 You will need: 1 tin [185 grm] tuna in brine/oil, 1 tin [295grm] Campbell's® condensed mushroom soup, 200 grm pasta shapes [twists/bows/shells or penne], 1 medium onion, 1 small tin sweetcorn 2-3oz grated cheese

Cook pasta as packet instructions (approx. 4-8mins). Fry chopped onion in a little oil, add tuna, soup and sweetcorn to cooked onion and mix into cooked and drained pasta.

Place in a casserole dish. Top with grated cheese and place under a hot grill till cheese is bubbling and turning brown.

Alternative topping: add a crushed packet of cheese & onion crisps or mix the grated cheese with breadcrumbs (2 slices of bread) before grilling. Serve with salad or melba toast.

5. To make Melba Toast [1 slice of bread makes 2 slices of melba toast], toast both sides of a slice of pan bread [white/brown] and while still warm, cut off crusts. Slip carving knife sideways through the soft centre part of the toast and toast the 2 uncooked sides. If you don't have a grill or you're in a hurry, this will work ok in a toaster if the 2 toasted sides are placed back to backlinside], the untoasted sides are on the outside, and both placed in the same section of the toaster.

"The under 15s, despite playing incredibly well, lost 1-0. They were gutted when they came off the pitch, but they couldn't have done anymore than they did – it was one of those games where we did everything but score. Only when Swindon overturn our new local rivals will we able to forget that horrendous evening at Whaddon Road in September last year. Hopefully revenge will be sought this Wednesday when the two sides meet for their just second league clash, for the 2-0 defeat (as well as Sam Parkin's sending off) is still fresh in the minds of manager, players and supporters alike. It wasn't just the result that hurt Town's travelling army of fans – the nature of the performance will go down as many fans' worst of the season.
