A warm welcome this afternoon to everyone who is here as part of the free guest offer to season ticket holders. We hope you enjoy your afternoon supporting the Cobblers and we look forward to seeing you again soon.

Northampton Town Chairman Ken Good has admitted that the decision to relieve Terry Fenwick of his duties was not an easy decision. That decision was taken 48 hours after the 2-1 defeat to Bristol City and Mr Good said, "This was certainly not an easy decision. I had been talks with my fellow Directors for most of the day and while it might be unusual for Managers to be released after just 7 games, we can't run a football dub in isolation from our supporters and the fans reaction was so overwhelming it was having an effect on the players and we could only see that getting worse.

"Having Martin Wilkinson already on the staff was one of the reasons behind the decision. Martin has a lot of experience and I'm sure he can do a good job. There are still plenty of points to play for and now we need everyone to stand up and be counted."

Caretaker Manager Martin Wilkinson is looking to draw on his vast football experience to try and keep Northampton Town in Division 2. The Cobblers boss is keen to get everyone connected with the club back to enjoying their football, and said, "I want to try and take the fear factor away,



and for us to just go out and enjoy what we are doing, but with that we have still got to keep a good shape, and keep our discipline. We did the same thing last year, by rolling our sleeves up and by beating teams that were in the same position that we were and we can do it again. If we try and stop teams playing and win the ball, we have got the players to create good opportunities for

"Under Kevan Broadhurst I was quite involved with the first team, especially during the last few months that he was here and I know most of the players quite well.

"We need to increase the options going forward, be positive and win matches because draws will



not keep us up.

"I want to keep things reasonably low profile, get some organisation and morale back into the team, get some smiles back on the players faces. and if we do that, work hard, roll our sleeves up. then we can get ourselves out of the mess we are in, and make sure that we stay in division 2.

"I'll be very disappointed if we do go down. Our first priority has got to be to stop in this division and I think we have got the players and the attitude to get out of the trouble that we are in There are a lot of clubs in the same position that we are and if we can roll our sleeves up and compete a little bit better then we will be ok."

Northampton Town covered the cost of a supporters coach for each of the three Travel Clubs for the trip to the McAlpine Stadium last Saturday.

The club paid the coach hire fee for one coach for each of the Trust Travel, Sixfields Travel and Cobblers Independent Supporters Clubs coaches Chairman Ken Good said, "We made this gesture to our regular supporters who travel away to say a big thank you for their support so far, and to emphasise the important role they have to play in helping us move away from the bottom of the

"We want to give something back to the fans, and hopefully this gesture, as well as the free guest for season ticket holders offer for today's game, shows fans we really do value their support."

There was a big panic just down the road last



week with the news that Bernie (the mascot for Northampton Saints) was struggling to be fit for their big Powergen Cup semi-final showdown with London Irish last Sunday. Clarence threw his name into the ring about a possible loan move to help out our friends from down the Weedon Road.

Representatives from both clubs were in negotiations about a possible temporary transfer to cover Bernie's possible absence from the cup clash at the Kassam Stadium. "I was quite keen on the idea," admitted the loveable Cobblers' rogue. "I spoke to Bernie and I knew he wasn't feeling too great. I was pleased that he was fit enough to eventually take his place at the game. That's in the past now, and I am looking forward to doing my bit to help Mr Wilkinson and the players out in Operation Survival."

TERRY FENWICK AFTER THE 2-1 LOSS TO **BRISTOL CITY**

"I am disgusted with our first half performance. We showed little heart or desire. We need to be prepared for a scrap, in the second half we put our foot in and we battled. We felt sorry for ourselves. We wait to be punched before we fight back. We ought to be going out there throwing the punches when the bell goes. I thought Chris Hargreaves, Darryn Stamp and Paul Harsley all did well when they came on. We need characters to show some balls out there. We did a bit more of that in the second half and we were a better side for it."

JERRY GILL ON THE BRISTOL CITY DEFEAT



That first half display was unacceptable from all of us. We went in at half time very down and disappointed. We showed no fight, no spirit and no tackles had been won. In the second half it was a totally different side that went out there. We showed a lot more and really could have come away with at least a point. We are bitterly disappointed with

the result but we have to knuckle down and get back to work on the training ground."

KEN GOOD ON THE DECISION TO RELIVE TERRY FENWICK OF HIS DUTIES

"One of the reasons behind this decision to relieve Terry of his duties is that in Martin Wilkinson we already have someone who has a lot of Managerial and coaching experience. There are a lot of points to play for and I will work with Martin and the Board and we want to see everyone roll their sleeves up and get on."

MARTIN WILKINSON ON TAKING OVER THE MANAGER'S ROLE



"I know how I want to play. Yes we can defend, but we need to win matches. Supporters come here and pay their money to see a good football team play. You don't want to just watch a team defend you want to see exciting football and goal mouth action."

PAUL REID AHEAD OF THE HUDDERSFIELD TRIP

"The atmosphere at the club is a lot more relaxed at the moment. A lot of the players have worked with Martin already, so they feel comfortable working with him and it's just a case of someone bringing in some fresh ideas. Under Terry we played a certain way and I think Martin will be looking to change that. All the lads just want to get behind Martin and start getting a few good results."

KEN GOOD ON THE LATEST SIXFIELDS **DEVELOPMENT NEWS**

"The first plans have been prepared. We want to redevelop the North and South stands to increase the capacity to 3,500 for each stand. We would also wish to see Executive Boxes at Sixfields."

WILKINSON AFTER LAST MARTIN SATURDAY'S GAME AT HUDDERSFIELD

"We said last Monday that the season started here and all the games we've got left are important but we've only had a few days to work with the players and in that respect I think we've done reasonably well. We can look forward with confidence. It was a generally a good performance but unfortunately we didn't take our chances. We have conceded two sloppy, awful goals and that has cost us. The first one was offside until the deflection and the second was also, in our opinion, clearly offside."

PAUL TROLLOPE POST HUDDERSFIELD

"We could have been one or two up before they scored. We thought we were on top at nil-nil and to lose one goal before half time is a blow but to lose two was a hammer blow. If we had gone in front I think we could have gone on to win but we paid for those few minutes before half time."

respectable half way up Division 2, and the next season we finished runners up to Newcastle just one point behind them and we were in Division One, or today's Premiership. The fact that we had several gates over 20,000 at the old County Ground (with a top attendance of 24,523 against Fulham) never ceases to amaze me. How did they get in without any problems?

Up to 1975/76 is best forgotten as we plodded along but we finished runners up to Lincoln in 1976 and were promoted, but came straight back to Division 4 the next year. Things continued poor until Graham Carr arrived late in 1985 to save us from a certain re-election spot. Derek Banks became Chairman and Graham brought a lot of new players to the club mostly from non-league and I joined the Board of Directors. We had a good year in 1985/86 and the seeds were sown for the following season


The 1986/87 season was certainly the most exciting ever for me. Graham had perfected the style of play with a great team scoring 103 goals in the league, and 18 more in cups. Whenever David Gilbert took a free kick or corner, more often than not it would be a goal. We won Division 4 comfortably with Preston as runners up. Even Jack Charlton told me he learned a lot from Graham's style of play and as we know used it to good effect for Ireland. We dropped back to Division 3 (the old Division 4) in 1990.

We had to wait until 1996 and Ian Atkins to arrive for an improvement. Then we were at Wembley for the first time ever in our Centenary Year. This was after finishing

fourth in Division 3. Frainy won it for us with that left footed free kick. I savoured the moment from the Royal Box. Ian took us to Wembley again the following year only to lose 1-0 to Grimsby and while they have hung on to Division 1 status ever since, we managed to get relegated but came straight back up again.

I won't mention McRitchie. I won't mention coming bottom, but staying up in the league because Kidderminster's ground was not good enough. Somehow I have managed to get to 75% of the Football League grounds. Fitted in with running a fishing tackle and country clothing business and have been a professional fisherman for over 30 years. I am telling you, Arsenal are good to watch, so are Manchester United, but when I see others it's not the same feeling as when watching the Cobblers!



CHAIRMAN Ken Good and managing director David Cardoza issued a statement this week in which they confirmed that Martin Wilkinson will be the Cobblers boss until the end of the season, and that he will work with the current coaching

staff of Mark Kearney, Paul Curtis and Jim Blyth. It is a sensible move by the board as it means everybody at the club can now concentrate on the one thing that really matters between now and May 3 – keeping the Cobblers in division two.

There has been enough turmoil and chopping and changing at Sixfields in recent months to

last for four or five seasons never mind three months, and it is vital that the club at least enjoys stability off the pitch between now and the end of the campaign.

On the field on course it is down to the players to get themselves out of a very big hole, but it can be done despite Tuesday night's defeat at Colchester United.

Of the Cobblers' final 11 games of the season six are at home and with things still tight down at the bottom of the table, a couple of wins could see the team out of the bottom four again.

Town's home form has of course been dreadful, with the team failing to win at home since way back on November 23.

Some fans have, wrongly in my opinion, hurled abuse at the team and certain individuals during that bad run and that is up to them as they have of course paid good money to watch – but it is not 'support'.

And it is going to be whole-hearted support and nothing else that will help the players get the results they need to haul themselves out of the relegation zone.

So if you have turned up today to try and cheer the team to victory against Swindon Town, welcome to the match and enjoy the game.

If you have come to Sixfields with the sole intention of getting stuck into your own players and generally making the Cobblers feel as though they are the away team, well you can turn around and go back home because you are not wanted.

Yes supporters have every right to grumble and throw a little wobbler if their team aren't performing, but when that dissatisfaction turns to personal and vitriolic abuse of their own players what is the point?

You might as well go and sit in the south stand with the away supporters because you are doing a better job to ensure the Cobblers play below par then they ever will.

When a team plays at home they are supposed to feel as though the majority of the crowd are willing them to win, they should be inspired.

But in recent games at Sixfields it seems as though the only noise generated by the home fans is when they are moaning about their own, and that has to stop.

Every Cobblers fan has to get behind the team 100 per cent from the first minute to last.

Boss Wilkinson has already said that the fans are a crucial part of 'Team Northampton', so let's make some positive noise and help turn

Sixfields into the fortress that it used to be not so very long ago.

First Cobblers Up the Cobblers!

100 per cent from the first minute to last." THERE aren't many times in a season that something happens on a football field to take your breath away.

There are of course great goals and sublime pieces of skill that always

amaze, but it takes extraordinary special to stop you in your tracks and make you think: 'Did that really happen?'

One such incident occurred at Villa Park on Monday night, an unfortunately it was nothing to do with football.

Aston Villa striker Dion Dublin's double assault on Birmingham midfielder Robbie Savage was simply unbelievable. If I had been eating a bacon sandwich I would definitely have dropped it...

The first lunging tackle that floored the Welshman was stunning enough, but the for big man to then follow up with a thumping head-butt the like of which is usually reserved for Glasgow city centre at closing time was incredible.

I mean we have seen players head-butting before, but Dion Dublin? He is normally such a gentleman and is regarded in the game as a real sport.

It was an extraordinary loss of control from Dublin.

Then to top it all, after the referee had shown him the red card – he's lucky it wasn't a warrant for his arrest - I had to laugh when Dublin was clearly seen to ask 'what for?'

Incredible...but at least the Villa man had to guts to publicly apologise for his actions the following day.







1. BART GRIEMINK

Giant keeper signed by Colin Todd on a free transfer in the summer of 2000. Griemink is a former Dutch Under-21 international who spent a successful loan spell with The Robins (as cover for Frank Talia) before eventually joining the club. He came to English football in 1995 with Birmingham and deputised competently for the injured lan Bennett, playing in the 1995 League Cup semi-final. He then followed Barry Fry to Peterborough United but lost his place to Mark Tyler. Griemink started the 2000-01 season as first choice goalkeeper and even deputised as captain, but ended up on the bench as Steve Mildenhall took his place in goal following Griemink's two dismissals and subsequent lengthy suspension. However, following Mildenhall's departure to Notts County Bart played every game last season and was one of the most consistent performers - he was also in contention for the Player of the Year Award.

2. GARETH EDDS

21-year old Australian formerly with Nottingham Forest signed a one-year deal with Town after playing for Town on a non-contract basis for one-month. His early season performances convinced manager Andy King to tie him down to a longer deal. Edds played nearly 40 games at Forest before joining up with the Robins in the summer and has been excellent in the right-back role.

4. MATTHEW HEWLETT

An attacking central midfielder, Matt Hewlett was once tipped for the top by all at Ashton Gate. The former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad, but a number of injuries curtailed his flourishing career. In the end Hewlett made over 100 appearances for City, but left them to join Town on a Bosman in the summer of 2000. He was a regular for Colin Todd until being hit by injury once again and went on

to play just 26 league games. Matty was a regular last season until a reoccurrence of his knee injury kept him out for the majority of December and January - other than that he was pretty consistent and even managed to bag his first goal for the club, a close range effort during Town's 2-0 victory away at Port Vale in September.

6. ANDY GURNEY

Andy joined Reading from Torquay in January 1999 for £100,000 as an attackminded, right-sided defender that could also play in midfield. He started his career at hometown club Bristol Rovers, where he spent four seasons before moving to Torquay for one year and impressing during their surge to the play-offs. Established a regular starting place with Reading in 1999/2000 and figured in the Royal's promotion push last year. Was keen to join Town after their impressive performance against Reading and King snapped him up on a Bosman in the summer of 2001. Crowned an impressive home debut performance against Tottenham with a long-range goal and proved to be one of King's best buys.

7. KEITH O'HALLORAN

Irish midfielder who was one of several Bosman signings Colin Todd made in the summer of 2000. O'Halloran is a talented right-sided player who became first choice on the right side of midfield, a position Swindon struggled to fill in 1999/00. O'Halloran started life as a trainee at Middlesbrough, but only made six appearances for Boro before moving to Scotland in 1997. He was a success at St Johnstone, and was offered a new contract but preferred to try his luck in Division Two. A good striker of the ball, O'Halloran proved one of Swindon's best signings of 2000, netting seven goals from midfield (most of them from the penalty spot). Had it not been for injury, O'Halloran probably would have played in every game for Town during the 2000/01 season, Started 2001/02 well, converting three goals from the penalty spot before enduring an horrific tackle at Bournemouth in August. Keith subsequently missed the rest of the season.

9. SAM PARKIN



A young and very promising forward who joined the club from Chelsea on August 1, 2002. The transfer followed months of speculation, with Andy King, a huge fan of the player, tracking him for several months. Parkin joined the club from Stamford Bridge where his development was hindered by a glut of international stars. However, whilst at the club he joined several other clubs on loan (including of course the Cobblers) and it is with them that he built up a reputation as a quality striker. Sam joined Millwall in September 2000 and made his debut in the Football League for the Lions in a 5-0 demolition of Oxford United. Netted a brace on his first ever appearance and made it three two with another against Peterborough at London Road. He then went on loan to Wycombe Wanderers in November 2000 after having a trial with Queens Park Rangers. He also had the option of a temporary move to Luton but decided to join the Adams Park outfit. Scored twice in 13 games for the Chairboys. Went on loan once again to Oldham Athletic before joining Northampton Town last season.

10. STEFAN MIGLORANZI

W

Miglioranzi is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer. Stefani helped St John's University win the 1996 NCAA Division I Championship and played for MLS team Chicago Fire before joining Everton on trial. They were keen to sign him but no deal came about. Portsmouth then out jumped Liverpool

in inviting him for a trial and signed him soon thereafter. The 22-year-old is a Brazilian born American but holds an Italian passport. As a footballer the genes don't come much better. What's more, Miglioranzi is versatile; he can play in defence or as a central midfielder and since joining the club in July, has impressed in the middle of Town's midfield.

11. DAVID DUKE

Left-sided midfielder that arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000. Unfortunately, Duke never managed a start for the Black Cat's first team. Duke appeared regularly in his first season with the Robins. He combined well with Sol Davis down the Robins' left and is a good crosser of the ball. Duke can also play at wing-back and will want to build on a decent start for Swindon. Consistency is the key for the Scotsman who has shown glimpses of what he is capable of, especially when running at defenders with the ball. Was in and out of the side last season but with a bit of consistency, can make the left side his own following the departure of Sol Davis.

14. ERIC SABIN

Few had heard of the young Frenchman when he joined the club last summer, but with Andy King comparing him to Thierry Henry he brought a lot of flair and excitement to Town's front line. Sabin joined Town from French Second Division club Wasquehall who finished 18th in season 2000/01. Sabin contributed with seven goals in 58 starts in France and last season, he didn't get the goals he deserved scoring just five in total. However, in terms of hard work Sabin brings much more to the team and in the first few games alone he earned four penalties. Sabin looks particularly dangerous when the ball is played behind the opposing defence for he has blistering pace. With a bit more confidence in front of goal, Sabin could prove to be a great acquisition.

17. DANNY INVINCIBLE

Australian midfielder who endeared



himself to the fans having been recommended to Colin Todd by Harry Redknapp at West Ham. Danny subsequently joined the Robins on a free transfer when Todd watched him in a trial game. After a slow start (although he did score on his debut against West Brom), Danny showed the club what he was capable of with five goals in four games in October/November in season 2000/01. The former Marconi Stallion and Aussie Under-21 star would later become Town's top scorer with ten goals, arguably his most important coming in the last home game of that season against Peterborough in the ninetieth minute - a goal that some say kept the club up. Danny is at his most dangerous when he is running at defenders and he was ever present again last season with eight goals to his name - attracting a lot of interest from a number of clubs. A crowd favourite, fans will be pinning the sides' hopes on his shoulders this season.

18. CRAIG FARR

Goalkeeper who was an unused substitute for the Robins in the 2000-01 season and will hope the departure of Steve Mildenhall gives him more of a chance. Has impressed greatly when given the chance in Town's second string and could become Bart Griemink's understudy this season.



As we approach the final 10 games of the season, there is nothing like a reminder of successful teams of the past to lift spirits and boost the confidence, and today we feature the 1986/87 Division 4 Championship side, as mentioned by President Bob Chruch elsewhere in today's programme.

BACK ROW L-R

PHIL CHARD: Phil joined the Cobblers from Peterborough in time to make his debut against.... the Posh! He also won Championship medals in three consecutive seasons (Div 4 Northampton 1987), (Div 4 Wolves 1988), (Div 3 Wolves 1989).

RICHARD HILL: Graham Carr signed Richard and Trevor Morley from his old club Nuneaton for a combined fee of £30,000. Two seasons and 50 league and cup goals later, Hill was on his way to Watford for a club record fee of £265,000.

BOB COY: After service with Wolves and Chester, Bob came to Northampton and took over as one of the first team central defenders. Midway through the season he lost his place and spent the remainder of his contract out on loan. He later became a policeman.

RUSSELL WILCOX: After failing to make the grade at Doncaster Rovers, Russell dropped in to non-league football with Frickley. He then became an integral part of Cobblers defence for the next 4 seasons, although he did miss almost all of the 1988/89 season with injury.

GRAHAM REED: Rambo joined the club as a forward but was converted to a defender within a few weeks of arriving. Graham always gave 100%.

EDDIE MCGOLDRICK-Eddie was another Nuneaton old boy, who after leaving the Cobblers also gave service to the likes of Arsenal and Crystal Palace

MIDDLE ROW L-R

DENIS CASEY: Ex Cobblers youth team player who spent most of his playing career with Wellingborough Town. He was physio at Nuneaton when Graham Carr brought him to Northampton. At present he is the longest serving member of staff.

MARK BUSHELL: After Aidy Mann, Mark was the youngest player ever to wear Northampton's colours. Unfortunately he was restricted to one game in three seasons. He later played for a host

of non league sides and even had a spell in the oval ball game.

IAN BENJAMIN: There have been some strange twists to lan's career. He was signed by West Brom for £100,000 but only played twice and he left Exeter for Southend because he was homesick! He now covers even more ground than he did as a player - he's now a postman! ALAN HARRIS-Understudy goalkeeper to Peter Gleasure, and another Nuneaton old boy.

GLENVILLE DONEGAL: Locally born Glen was one of the stars of the youth team but failed to make the first team on a regular basis. He later dropped in to non league football with Aylesbury, but Graham Carr later took him to Maidstone.

PETER GLEASURE: Peter was one of the few players who remained once Graham Carr started his clear out. He missed just five league games in nine seasons, but the arrival of Theo Foley saw him dropped and transfer listed.

KEITH MCPHERSON: Keith was on loan to Cambridge United when they lost 5-2 at home to the Cobblers. He showed enough though for Graham Carr to take him to the County Ground and after 5 seasons at Northampton he joined Reading.

PAUL CURTIS: After more than 100 games for Charlton and Northampton, Paul is now the club's Director of Youth Development. Paul also mode a playing comeback in 1992/93 season.

CLIVE WALKER: After leaving Northampton in 1990, Clive has been assistant Manager to Graham Carr at Maidstone, Dagenham and Kettering. He has managed Maidstone himself and also been assistant at Dover, taking over several times for short spells.

FRONT ROW L-R

DAVID GILBERT: David was released by Lincoln and given a one match trial by Scunthorpe. He then spent four years in non-league football with Boston United. The first club he played for the Cobblers against was...Scunthorpe!

AIDY MANN: The youngest player ever to appear for Northampton at 16 years and 297 days. He became something of a footballing nomad, taking in 16 clubs. He also was Manager at another three, all in a 20 year period.

GRAHAM CARR: As a league player Graham had a small amount of success, but when he moved into non-league football he became a valuable asset. He was captain of Telford when they won the FA Trophy. TREVOR MORLEY: After being discarded by Derby, Trevor signed for Corby and then moved to Nuneaton for a record £7,500. His transfer to Northampton for £30,000 (combined with Richard Hill) was also a record for Nuneaton.

WARREN DONALD: Warren joined the club as part of the Graham Carr revolution. Warren arrived from West Ham - initially on loan - and became a real crowd favourite before he left the club to join Colchester United.

Last weekend, our under 12s, 13s and 14s took on their Walsall counterparts.

The Under 12s turned in an excellent team performance to emerge victorious. Manager Stuart Hardy was delighted with the performance of all the players, especially Michael Jacobs, Jamie Forbes and Gary Ridgeway.

The under 13s were beaten by what coach Stuart Parkes describes as the largest and physically strongest under 13 team he has ever seen. The players did well to compete and scored through an excellent free kick from Sam Maude. Lee Burgoyne was another who did well and all of the boys can be pleased with how they competed against a physically stronger side.

The under 14s were also surprised by the physical size of their opponents and coach Kevin England was forced to field a depleted side with a number of players missing through injury. We went behind but responded well and competed for most of the game until the size of the Walsall side told and our lads ran out of steam in the closing stages.

Youth Recruitment Officer Charlie Brewster provides us with a recruitment update as our planning for next season continues;

Leicester City, Aston Villa, Peterborough United and Rushden & Diamonds are just four of the clubs we regularly compete with here at Northampton Town for the signatures of young players. Putting together the latest squad of players we have had to fight off stiff competition from more than one of our illustrious Premiership counterparts for their signatures. How old are these players you might ask? just eight years old.

Research has shown that being able to play and train in Centre of Excellences or academies from the age of eight, with access to the latest technology, facilities and coaching methods has meant that in general, players who are not in the system from and early age are unlikely to make that elite band of players playing professional football.

The squad we are currently putting together will form the under nine squad for season 03/04 and have been selected mostly from our under eight Masterclass system, with players from as far a field as Stamford in Lincolnshire, Oakham and Market Harborough in Leicestershire, Milton Keynes and of course Northampton. Some of these young players have been connected with the Cobblers from the age of five. Every six weeks the under eight players, from ten Masterclasses, will travel to Northampton to play against each other and let the Centre of Excellence staff see the promising youngsters on show, [unfortunately we are unaware of and unable to stop our competitors watching). On these days we will regularly see up to a hundred and twenty under 8 players.

We have currently offered five places to players for next season, although our efforts to find a goalkeeper of the correct standard are proving difficult at the moment. The five players we have taken so far have started to mix with the current under nine squad to give them an understanding of expectation for next season.

So you can see here at Northampton Town we have to be on our toes and be as active as possible in order to compete for the signatures of talented young players - the challenge now of course is to turn them into first team players.






