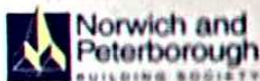

Emergency Procedures

In the unlikely event of an emergency at London Road requiring the evacuation of all or part of the ground, spectators are requested to remain where they are, stay calm and listen for announcements over the public address system. All emergency announcements will be preceded by a distinctive chime. The announcements may direct spectators in specified areas to evacuate through exit gates to the outside of the ground, or on the pitch. Club stewards and police officers will assist in directing spectators to the safest locations. If requested to vacate a particular area in the ground, spectators should do so as calmly and quickly as possible to assist in a safe and speedy evacuation. Ground Regulations

Persons are admitted to this ground subject to their acceptance of the Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and the Football League which are posted in and outside the Stadium. Entry to the ground shall constitute unqualified acceptance. The club reserves the right for its stewards, servants, agents and Police to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with these rules and regulations, or whose presence

within the ground is, or could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. Throwing of any object within the ground. Taking part in chanting of an indecent or racist nature. Entry onto the field of play or the surrounding track without lawful authority or excuse. Additionally, the use of threatening behaviour or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in ejection from the ground.

Parking

During last season numerous complaints were made by the public regarding illegal, dangerous and inconsiderate parking. In response to these justified complaints and to minimise the dangers/inconvenience caused by such activity, the police will actively enforce the parking regulations.

Supporters are advised to use a common sense approach when parking and to fully utilise specified parking areas, thereby avoiding on street parking and minimise any congestion. Your assistance and co-operation regarding this matter will be appreciated.

Posh Defender Arber Escapes Suspension

Defender Mark Arber collected his fifth booking of the campaign in Peterborough United's 5-1 win at Mansfield Town last week, but the former Barnet centre-back has just been warned of his future conduct after he was booked for time wasting.



The South African-born defender has escaped a ban as he did not accumulate five cautions until after the last day in February 2003 and will be available for the clash at Barnsley on Saturday 12th April.

Fry Makes Two Deadline Day Signings

Posh boss Barry Fry swooped to sign midfielder Andre Boucaud and winger Tony Scully on-loan until the end of the season prior to the transfer deadline. Boucaud joins from First Division Reading and made his debut in the win at Mansfield, while Scully made the



move to London Road from Third Division Cambridge United.

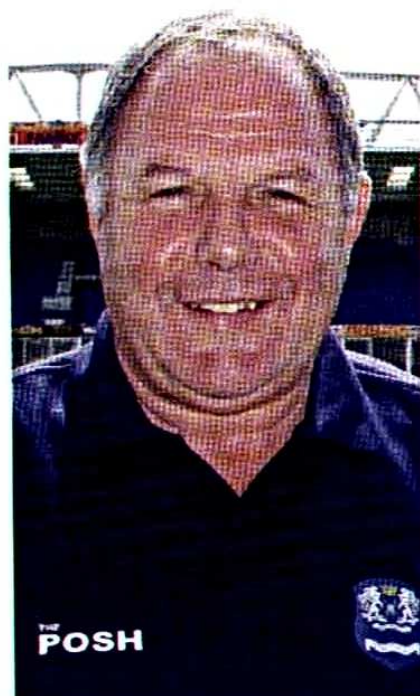

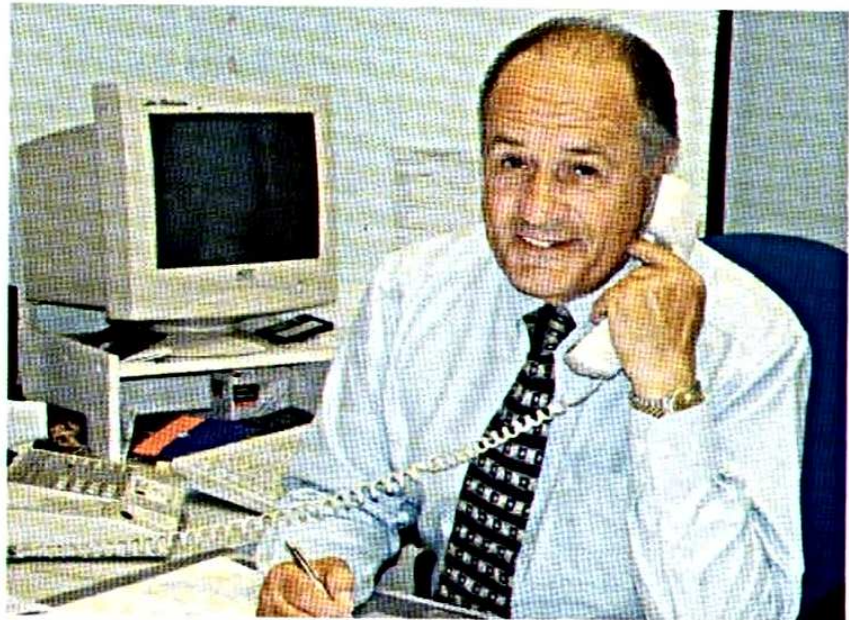
From The Chief Executive

View On Two



Last weekend was certainly a fruitful one for Peterborough United in the battle against the drop. The 5-1 success over relegation rivals Mansfield Town certainly put some breathing space between Posh and the bottom four, with results elsewhere also going in favour of Barry Fry's side.

Stallard Spot-On

Rock-bottom club Huddersfield Town, who just a few seasons ago were battling it out at the top of Division One in real contention for a place in the Premiership, look destined for the Football League's basement division after their latest defeat last Saturday – although opponents Notts. County were somewhat fortunate.

Huddersfield, whose players have not been fully paid since last September and two weeks ago forced the start of administration proceedings, did actually take the lead at Meadow Lane when former Sheffield Wednesday striker Andy Booth headed home on 19 minutes. And although County shortly equalised via Paul Heffernan, Huddersfield went in at the break leading 2-1, thanks to Danny Schofield's first goal of the season.

Things started to go wrong for the Terriers 20 minutes before the end. Nat Brown felled Mark Stallard in the penalty area, and the prolific front man picked himself up to convert from the spot. Huddersfield, playing under

new boss Mel Machin for the first time, looked content to depart Nottingham with a point but it was a case of de ja vu in stoppage time – when Adi Moses handled in the box and Stallard smashed home his second penalty of the afternoon to give County the three points.

Youngs Kept At Bay

Deadline day signing Tom Youngs failed to make an immediate impact for Northampton Town as Brentford ran out comfortable 3-0 winners at Griffin Park. Highly-rated striker Youngs, a £50,000 capture from Cambridge, was kept firmly under wraps by a Brentford side who stamped out their own fears of relegation with the success.

On-loan Frenchman Mickael Antoine-Curier opened the scoring for the Bees eight minutes after half-time, before Martin Rowlands and Stephen Hunt sealed the victory. Youngs could be facing his former club sooner than he had perhaps hoped, in Division Three.

Crewe and City March On

Stockport sit one place above the drop zone following their narrow defeat at neighbours Crewe.

Rodney Jack proved the demolition man, bagging his 16th of the season to condemn Stockport and keep Crewe on the road to promotion.

Alex are currently in second spot, four points above Cardiff City. The Bluebirds have two matches in

hand however, one of them being against Posh at London Road next Wednesday. Bristol City should not be ruled out for the runners-up spot either. Their 2-0 win over Barnsley kept them firmly in contention for automatic promotion, with Scott Murray and Christian Roberts netting the goals.

Oldham Jinxed At Home Once Again

Oldham Athletic's home form could cost them dearly however. The Latics have one of the finest away records in the whole of England but have struggled to pick up maximum points on numerous occasions in front of their own supporters – with last week's draw with Port Vale being a fine example.

David Eyres had put Iain Dowie's men in front with a 28th minute header, but his side failed to deliver a killer second before Michael Cummins levelled for Vale – who are still in the thick of the relegation scrap.

Langley The Lone Ranger

The Second Division's star of the day was arguably creative midfielder Richard Langley, who almost single-handedly secured a

3-1 win for Queen's Park Rangers at Blackpool with a hat-trick.

His first goal of the afternoon arrived in the 35th minute when he swept home a delightful free-kick off the underside of the crossbar. Langley then grabbed his and Rangers' second with a fine finish 20 minutes after the break before completing his treble with a smart header six minutes from time. QPR look set for a top six finish although Blackpool, whose own push for the play-offs now look over, did score a consolation goal in injury time.

Wigan Drop Rare Points

Paul Jewell faced a rare home defeat as his Wigan Athletic side slipped to defeat by Plymouth Argyle. Marino Keith caused the damage for Plymouth, crashing the ball home from 20 yards to inflict the league leader's second defeat at home this season.

Elsewhere Colchester United continued their fine form with a Kemal Izzet strike separating the sides against Swindon Town, and Tranmere kept up the pressure just outside the play-off positions with a 2-1 success against Chesterfield.

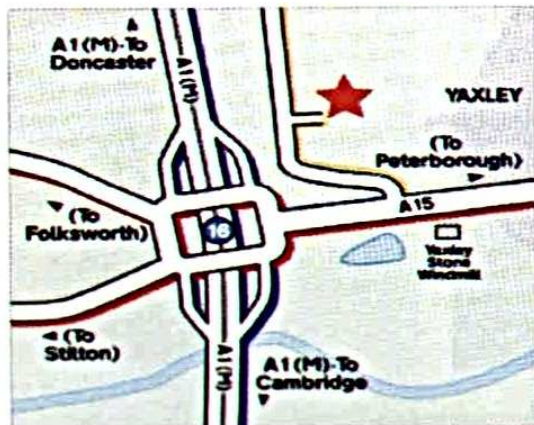

Chapple's Corner

I think the performance at Mansfield last week was effective more than anything, it probably wasn't the prettiest of games, but we got the all important three points. We started the game well and got our noses in front, but then they put us under a bit of pressure, but I felt we were dealing with it OK and then the penalty was awarded.

I thought the penalty made us wobble and we stopped doing the things, which had allowed us to dominate the early period of the game. If they had scored again then who knows what would have happened, but Leon McKenzie made it 2-1 and just to underline our superiority we scored again through Ian Hendon just before the break.

We went into half-time 3-1 to the good and we just told the lads to keep doing the same things and make sure you don't make any mistakes. We knew we would get more chances in front of goal, but it was a question of keeping it tight at the back, especially in the first 15 minutes of the second period.

The next goal was always going to be crucial and the longer the game went on the desperate they would become to score it, but I didn't think Mansfield looked like scoring. They had a lot of possession, but they didn't force Mark Tyler into a save in the

entire game, which is good away from home.

I thought Sagi Burton and Matthew Gill were outstanding, but it is unfair to single players out because the team performance was so good. We scored from a set-piece which was pleasing from the coaching aspect of the game and I feel we under-achieve a bit with our dead-ball situations. We have scored a few goals, but set-pieces can be so crucial in tight games.

Looking at today's game against Swindon and we will be looking to get another three points. The lads felt they deserved three points from the game against the Robins at the County Ground earlier in the campaign. Jimmy Bullard put us ahead, but a penalty decision cost us the game and to be fair since that match the lads mentality has been spot on apart from two blips.

We need to pick up three points this afternoon, it is no good taking a step forward after last week's win and then suffering a defeat as you are back where you started again. I think three wins from seven games will see us safe and the quicker they come the better. It is a lot less pressure to be playing games knowing you are safe and Swindon are in an enviable position in the lower half of the table.

Sound Bites

Following the massive boost of last Saturday's five-star five-goal display at Field Mill, the countdown to Second Division survival continues right here this afternoon with today's fixture against mid-table Swindon Town.

The Wiltshire side, who have lost four of their last six games, have, like Posh, collected five wins on their travels this season - at Chesterfield, Huddersfield Town, Stockport County, Tranmere Rovers and Wycombe Wanderers.

They have also gained shared results at Barnsley, Blackpool, Cardiff City, Notts. County, Plymouth Argyle and Port Vale, but the Robins have tasted defeat nine times on the road including their heaviest return - a 3-0 defeat at Luton Town.

Mansfield skipper Kevin Pilkington who, in his captains corner column in last Saturday's programme declared 'Every club that comes to Field Mill struggles to leave with a point.

Our strike force is confident, aggressive and accurate, the defence with Rhys Day and Adam Eaton forging a seemingly good partnership in the middle of the defence has been effective blighting the efforts of some of the best strikers this division has to offer.

And the midfield has been constructive creating breaks and linking to the forward players to attack the opposition from all angles - the proof, should you need it, is the goals scored column. Iyesden (Christie) chasing his 20th, Wayne (Corden) on 12 and Liam (Lawrence) on 10.

With form like this, the Posh custodian will not know which way the ball will be coming from, suffice it to say that he will surely be earning his keep this afternoon as the boys will be bringing their onslaught right from the outset and maintain it until the final whistle.

'Well, those words didn't exactly prove to be prophetic with Mark Tyler being charged admission money after the game - he was after all nothing more than a spectator for virtually the whole of the match!

'I will try and grab this chance by the scruff of the neck as I believe in my own ability. And I also believe I can become a player if I

work hard and hopefully stay injury-free,' the youngster added.

The confident player is looking forward to working with Posh chief Barry Fry and Boacaud has settled into life at London Road. The youngster was introduced by Fry as a second half substitute against the Stags and will be hoping to be included in the squad again this afternoon.

'Barry is well known in the game, knows his stuff and he should be a good manager to work under. I will continue to live at home in London and commute every day, which should be about an hour, which isn't too bad,' Boacaud continued.

Fry enthused about his new signing following the emphatic 5-1 victory at Mansfield Town last week and is looking forward to seeing more of the 18-year old before the end of the current campaign.

'He is brilliant for an 18-year-old and is a very confident young man. Reading have done me a great favour in allowing Andre to join us - they are paying all of his wages and we are very grateful to manager Alan Pardew and the club.

'In our position, it was a bit of a gamble fetching someone who is so talented into a side battling for points near the bottom of the table, but I think he is so

Peterborough United fielded their youngest ever side for the visit of a Swindon side still holding on to slim hopes of a promotion place. By half time, caretaker boss Bill Harvey's young Posh team, brimming with confidence and ideas, were justifiably given a standing ovation after storming into a 4-1 lead.

Swindon goalkeeper Jimmy Allan looked vulnerable on crosses right from the start and it was no real surprise when Posh centre-back Trevor Slack got in a powerful header from Steve Collins' 14th minute corner to open the scoring.

The visitors equalised five minutes later through leading scorer Paul Rideout, but Posh continued to impress with some fine flowing football, and they restored their lead after Russell Lewis hauled down Phil Chard inside the penalty area on 27 minutes.

Chard's spot-kick was parried but he followed up to slam the rebound into the roof of the net. Posh's third goal came after an excellent through ball from Mario Ippolitto, Colin Clarke lobbing the ball over Allan and, two minutes later in the 34th minute, Micky

Gynn outpaced the Swindon defence to clip a well-placed shot into the bottom corner. It was the little midfielder's 18th goal of the season.

Peterborough United ought to have built on that impressive opening half, but perhaps their inexperience told in the second period as Town hit back to almost steal a share of the spoils.

The visitors gained control of the midfield and the twin strike force of Rideout and Andy Rowland – who had hit nearly 40 goals between them – regularly threatened David Seaman's goal.

Rideout hit the bar three minutes into the second half before Leigh Barnard – who spent time on loan to Posh from Portsmouth the previous season – made it 4-2 after a goalmouth scramble on 52 minutes.

When Rowland got the better of young Posh debutant Steve Mercer to make it 4-3 in the 68th minute with a low drive, it seemed likely that Swindon would go on and win the game.

Fortunately for the meagre home crowd Harvey's young braves held their nerve to claim three points that they just about

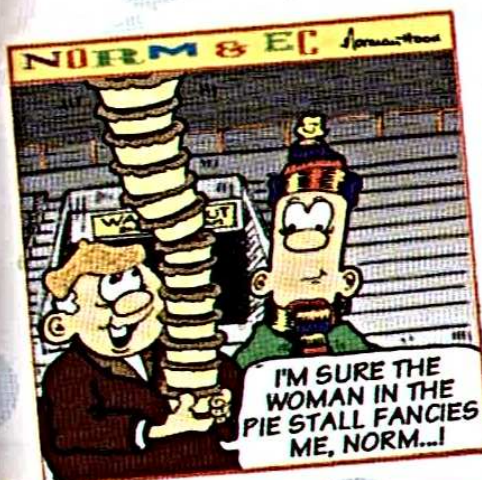

Introducing Swindon Town

A Closer Look At Today's Visitors

Swindon Town arrive at London Road on the back of an indifferent run of form, which has seen them hover around the fringes of the play-off positions and look nervously over their shoulders at the teams clambering away from the relegation zone.

Town were struggling earlier in the campaign and went six games without collecting a point in Division Two and the fans were consigned to a season of struggle, but a 6-1 win over Southend United in the LDV Vans Trophy seemed to turn their season around.

Even runaway league leaders Wigan Athletic suffered a defeat at the County Ground against a rejuvenated Swindon side, although three straight defeats in March has seen the nervousness

return to the Town faithful and with teams below them in the table winning, it is going to be a tense finish to the campaign.

The Swindon squad seems to be lacking in the fire-power front with only former Chelsea and one-time Northampton Town striker Sam Parkin finding the back of the net on a regular occurrence. Parkin has notched over 20 goals this term, while the second leading goalscorer for the club is Andy Gurney with a mere seven goals to his name.

The defence has been pretty shaky all season and when you take into account the last goal-less draw involving Swindon was 34 games ago, you can see why Town are not pushing for a play-off place. Former Posh goalkeeper Bart Griemink is in between the sticks at the County

Ground and it will be interesting to see what kind of reception he gets this afternoon.

The fantastically-named Danny Invincible lived up to his name last season with some vital goals, but he has been largely quiet on that front this time around, although the Australian is still a firm fans favourite with the County Ground faithful.

Earlier in the season, Town earned a share of the spoils against Posh as Sam Parkin beat Mark Tyler from the spot after a debatable penalty decision. Jimmy Bullard had opened the scoring for Barry Fry's men minutes earlier after an incisive counter-attack.

Over the years, Swindon shade the victories against Posh with 16 wins to 14, although in recent seasons it has been tight between the two sides with plenty of draws, 1-1 being the favourite. Posh will be hoping for a repeat of the score-line in season 2000-2001.

On that day, Leon McKenzie scored a brace, Richard Forsyth and David Farrell were on target in a 4-0 rout at London Road in front of just under 6,000 fans. Griemink was in goal that afternoon and Bristol Rovers striker Guiliiano Grazioli played up front for Town.



Meet The Manager ANDY KING

Born in August 1956 in Luton, he made his name as a lively midfielder having joined his home town club in 1974. His next stop was Everton, the club with which most people associate him, who he signed for in 1976 for £35,000. He made 150 appearances for The Toffees, scoring an impressive 38 goals in four seasons at Goodison before joining QPR.

One season with the Superhoops was followed by another at West Bromich Albion before a return to Everton for the 1982-83 season, where Andy played a further 43 games and added another 11 goals to his tally for the Toffees. A short period with Dutch side Cambuur followed, before Andy returned to England with Wolves, for whom he played 28 times scoring 10 goals.

A very brief spell back at Luton in 1985 (just three appearances) preceded Andy's final move as a player when he joined Aldershot and notched 11 goals 36 games for the Surrey side. Having retired as a player, he turned to coaching, and was given his first managerial appointment at Mansfield Town in 1993 following George Foster's departure.

Having been relegated from Division Two, Mansfield were low on confidence but King managed to steer them to a mid-table finish in his first season at the helm. The 1995-96 season saw Mansfield drop down to 19th position in Division Three and Andy was replaced at Field Mill by Steve Parkin.

He was given the opportunity to impress Swindon chairman Terry Brady, and after four games in charge he was given the job full-time, on November 6, 2000. Despite his efforts in keeping The Robins up he was replaced at the County Ground by former Liverpool boss Roy Evans in June 2001.

Evans left the club before the end of the year, after new owners arrived at the County Ground, and Andy King - who had taken legal action against Swindon with regard to his dismissal - was reinstated as manager on December 20 2001.

Giant keeper signed by Colin Todd on a free transfer in the summer of 2000.

Is a former Dutch Under-21 international who spent a extensive and successful loan spell with The Robins before eventually joining the club. He came to English football in 1995 with Birmingham before a spell at Peterborough United where he was mainly used as understudy to first choice goalkeeper Mark Tyler.

GOALKEEPER

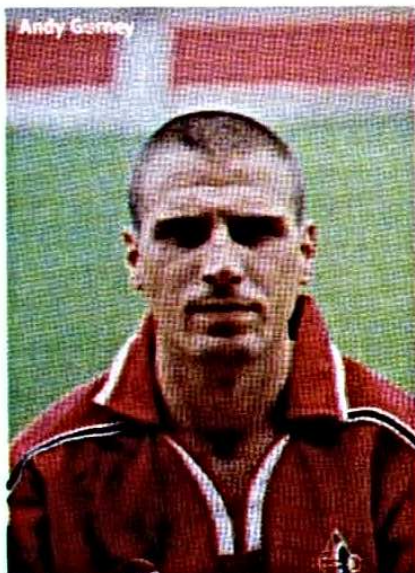

Young Australian who, having joined Town on a month's loan from Nottingham Forest, has now signed for a year. Was a consistent performer at the start of the season but has since had to fight for his place with Andy Gurney.

DEFENDER

Centre back who was revitalised under Colin Todd and awarded a new contract. The tall defender has been superb this season, and is very highly-rated at the County Ground by the Swindon management and the faithful watching him from the stands.

Andy Gurney
DEFENDER

Joined Reading from Torquay in January 1999 for £100,000 as an attack-minded, right-sided defender that could also play in midfield. He started his career at hometown club Bristol Rovers, where he spent four seasons before moving to Torquay for one year and impressing during their surge to the play-offs.

Alan Reeves
DEFENDER

Experienced centre back, who is particularly strong in the air and

always causes problems from set pieces and for a brief period in season 2000-01 he was the club's top goalscorer. Before joining Swindon in 1998, he spent four years at Wimbledon, where he had the tough task of replacing John Scales.

Matthew Hewlett
MIDFIELDER

An attacking central midfielder, he was once tipped for the top by all at Ashton Gate. The former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad, but a number of injuries curtailed his flourishing career. Has been the midfield general this time around and Town sorely miss his presence when he's injured.

Stefani Miglioranza
MIDFIELDER

Highly-rated midfielder who is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer. Is a versatile player, who can play in defence or as a central midfielder and since joining the club in July, has impressed in the middle of Town's midfield.

David Duke
MIDFIELDER

Left-sided midfielder that arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000. He combined well with Sol Davis down the Robins' left and is a good crosser of the ball. He can



also play at wing-back and will want to build on a decent start for Swindon.. Was in and out of the side last season but with a bit of consistency, can make the left side his own following the departure of Sol Davis.

Physio's Focus

The major news from the last week has been the double fracture picked up by Ryan Semple. Ryan broke his right leg playing in an under 19 game away at Wycombe Wanderers last Saturday on a pitch with an awful surface.

The fracture came about after a somewhat innocuous, if not awkward challenge and fortunately Ryan was not in too much pain at the time.

Peter Corder was covering the game and made sure Ryan immobilised the leg and went for an x-ray.

This was done at the local district hospital where I met him later that night and the fractures of his tibia and fibula were confirmed.

Fortunately the fractures are not severe and there was little displacement of the bones, therefore he was placed in a cast and there was no need for surgery.

Ryan will be in a full leg plaster cast for around six weeks when he will have a check x-ray and his fracture will be reviewed. He will obviously miss the rest of this season but I am confident he will not miss much of next season if in fact any.

The physio room at the moment is occupied with mostly youth team

players but we expect three of them to be back next week.

The professionals who are currently injured are Dennis Pearce who has a calf strain, Adam Newton who has an ankle ligament sprain, Steve Laurie who is suffering with a thigh strain and Francis Green, who has compartment syndrome.

I expect Francis to return to training very soon and the others will be available within the next 10 days or so.

With just the four injuries we still have a good nucleus of players for the manager to select from and at the moment we are very near to fielding our strongest side.

This was reflected in the performance against Mansfield last week when we were solid, affective and took all three points with some clinical finishing.

You can judge the quality in the squad at the moment by looking at the bench and with Jason Lee, Andrew Fotiadis, David Farrell,

Tony Scully and Andre Boucaud, we have strength in depth for one of the few occasions this season.

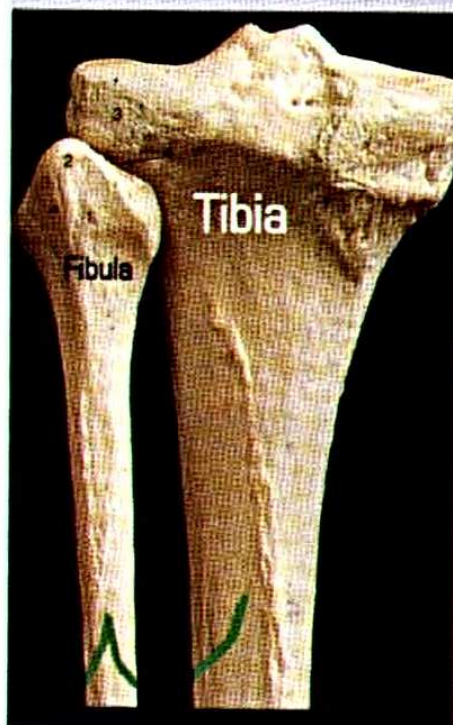

Flashback

Mansfield

Peterborough United chalked up a vital victory at Mansfield Town as Barry Fry's men recorded an emphatic 5-1 win at Field Mill with Simon Rea, Leon McKenzie, Ian Hendon, Andy Clarke and Andrew Fotiadis firing Posh to all three points.

Mansfield got the game underway in front of a sizeable crowd at Field Mill, but it was Posh striker Andy Clarke who had the first effort of the game with a wayward volley, which flew well wide of Keith Welch's goal. A good through ball from Clarke found McKenzie racing towards goal at the angle, but the former Palace front man fired over the crossbar.

The deadlock was broken by Posh on eight minutes as centre back Simon Rea rose highest to direct a header past Welch and into the corner of the net. Former Sheffield Wednesday defender Hendon drilled a cross-shot across the box on 12 minutes, but it didn't trouble

Welch. Mansfield were given a great chance to get back into it from the penalty spot after Rea was adjudged to have handled and Wayne Corden coolly slotted home from the spot. Posh got their noses in front once more on 37 minutes as McKenzie powered a header into the corner following Gill's precise cross.

At the other end, Clarke ballooned an effort over the crossbar after latching onto a clipped Jelleyman pass as Barry Fry's men tried to get the ball forward quickly. The pace of the game was relenting with both sides keen to get the ball into the opposition box with Mitchell and Christie both seeing shots blocked by Arber.



Scott fired a deflected effort wide and from the resulting corner, the same player drilled a powerful drive just past the post. Posh got a third goal on the stroke of half time as Hendon got to the by-line and managed to chip the ball over Welch and into the roof of the net via a slight deflection.

Arber saw a header cleared off the line by Lawrence on 53 minutes following a Gill corner. Tyler had to tip a Christie header over the top as the hosts piled on the pressure with the backing of the crowd.

Posh boss Barry Fry introduced Andrew Fotiadis for McKenzie midway through the second half. Clarke saw an effort blocked Eaton on 68 minutes as Posh went in search of a fourth goal.

Substitute Fotiadis beat the offside trap as the game entered the final 10 minutes, but his shot rolled inches past the far post to

Fotiadis nearly made it 5-1 as he connected with a Scott shot from just outside the penalty area, but Welch got back to palm the ball to safety. The former Luton Town striker did get his name on the score-sheet in stoppage time as he tapped home following a fine assist by substitute Farrell to seal the three points.

It was a superb three points for Posh and a performance which delighted manager Barry Fry. The win moved Posh three points clear of the relegation zone with a game in hand and the 735 fans who travelled to Field Mill will be hoping of a repeat performance from Posh this afternoon.

Posh Old Boys

JIMMY QUINN

Belfast-born centre-forward Jimmy Quinn is remembered fondly by Posh and Swindon fans for striking fear into opposing defenders with his aerial expertise and fierce shooting. Having originally fled trouble-torn Belfast with his family and set up home in Salisbury, Quinn arrived on the League scene with Swindon in the early 1980s.

He had a brief stint at Blackburn Rovers before returning for a second spell at the County Ground, where his 30 League goals in 64 appearances earned him a £210,000 move to Leicester City in 1988. The genial Irishman also served Bradford City before enjoying his biggest move, to West Ham for £320,000 in 1989.

After leaving Upton Park two years later, he topped the scoring charts at Bournemouth and Reading – where he was later joint player-manager alongside ex-Posh favourite Mick Gooding – before coming to London Road. Jimmy also won 46 international caps, notching 12 goals to become Northern Ireland's second highest scorer behind another ex-Posh player, Colin Clarke.

Several eyebrows were raised when Barry Fry signed a then 37-year-old Quinn in the summer of 1997, but the charismatic target



man repaid Fry's faith with a hatful of goals. Posh soared to the top of Division Three as Quinn found the net at a phenomenal rate early in 1997-98, particularly in front of his adoring home crowd.

He scored in all but three of Posh's opening 15 League games at London Road, including a hat-trick in a 5-1 thrashing of Barnet and a late winner in front of

nearly 11,000 against local rivals Cambridge. His goal in a 1-0 win over Rotherham in January 1998 took his tally to 20 in just 29 League games, which made him the first Posh player to bag 20 League goals in a season since Robbie Cooke twice achieved the feat in the early 1980s.

Sadly the goals dried up during the run-in and without Jimmy's firepower Posh's promotion push faltered badly. Quinn became Fry's number two following the sacking of Phil Neal in March 1998, but remained on the playing staff until leaving London Road to return to management with Swindon the following October. Jimmy kept Town in Division One in 1998-99, but his first full season in charge proved to be a disaster as Swindon fell into administration.

Players were sold and with no money available for replacements, Town were rock bottom from mid-November until the end of the season, setting an unwanted club record of 19 games without a win. Although into his 40s, Quinn was even forced to turn out as an occasional player. After relegation was confirmed, Jimmy was shown the door. Since his dismissal, Quinn has scored goals for non-League sides Northwich Victoria, Hereford, Highworth Town and Hayes before becoming manager at Northwich.

DEAN HOOPER

Dean originally joined Posh on loan from Swindon during 1995-96 before returning to complete a four-year London Road stint that ended last season. 'Deano' started out with non-league sides Marlow, Yeading, Chalfont St Peter and Hayes, where his bright performances earned him a contract with Steve McMahon's Swindon in March 1995.

He struggled to make much progress at the County Ground, making just four League appearances in two seasons, but a loan spell at London Road was going well until a knee injury forced his return to Wiltshire. Released by the Robins in the summer of 1996, Dean turned out for Hayes, Stevenage Borough and Kingstonian, for whom his

all-action displays earned him England semi-professional honours.

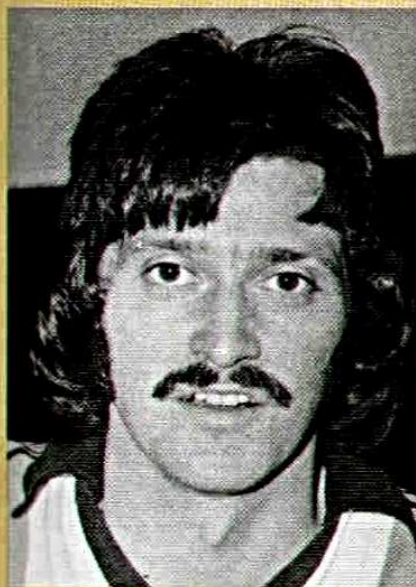
Posh boss Barry Fry gave him another chance of League football in 1998, and Dean emerged from his first full season at London Road with credit. Quick, strong and competitive, he established himself at right-back, combining his fierce tackling with subtle skills and surging forward runs. A succession of injuries put paid to his involvement in Posh's promotion campaign of 1999-2000, which meant he missed out on a Wembley play-off final appearance at the end of that campaign.

He returned to the fray in Division Two the following season and even improved his poor disciplinary record until being



sent off in the penultimate game – ironically at the County Ground, home of his former club, Swindon. The 2000-01 season proved a frustrating one for 'Deano', and after losing his place and spending time on loan at Dagenham & Redbridge, the former builder left London Road before the end of the campaign.

TREVOR ANDERSON



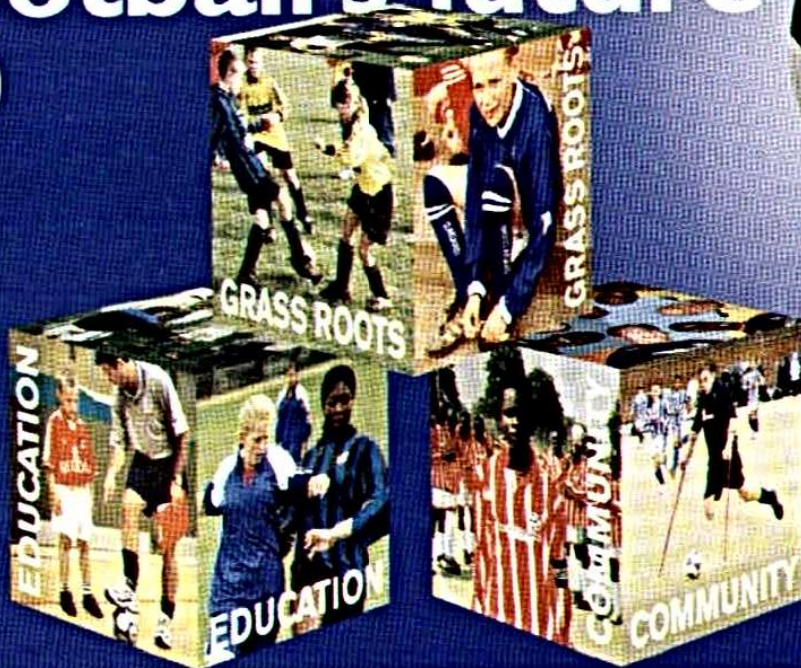
A skilful Ulsterman who won four of his 22 caps for Northern Ireland as a Posh player, left-sided winger Anderson began his League career with Manchester United, where he was hailed as 'the new George Best'.

He made 19 League appearances in two seasons at Old Trafford before joining Swindon Town for £30,000 in November 1974. Trevor proved to be a big hit with the County Ground faithful, scoring 35 goals in 131 League games – prompting John Barnwell

to pay £20,000 to bring him to London Road in December 1977. After making his debut in a 0-0 draw at Hereford United on Boxing Day, he figured in every game until the end of the season as Posh missed out on promotion to Division Two on goal difference.

After relegation to Division Four a year later, Anderson returned to Northern Ireland to join Linfield, where he later had a spell in the manager's chair, before leaving football to work at Belfast City hospital.

Semple suffered a hair-line fracture of his tibia and fibula and will be out for the rest of the season. The highly-rated winger had earlier helped to create several chances for Posh after the home side had made a bright start with the crossbar saving John Morling's side.

The teenage winger delivered a fine ball to the back post and as Jamie Day steadied himself to fire the ball home he was pushed and a penalty kick was awarded. Shane Tolley stepped up to take the spot-kick, but was denied by a good save by the Wycombe goalkeeper.

Tolley then headed wide from close-range following a superb Day centre before Huke side-footed the ball inches past the post after racing onto a Burton through-ball. Midfielder Burton volleyed just over the top of the stroke of half time and just after the interval directed a long-range effort narrowly wide.

On the hour mark, Posh got their noses in front as Tolley made up for his earlier misses by calmly stroking the ball past the

goalkeeper after bursting from midfield, where he was deployed in the second half. The heavily-involved Tolley fired two long-range efforts straight at the goalkeeper before Huke trickled a shot wide.

Goalkeeper John Chatfield was called upon to make two saves to preserve the points and Morling was pleased with the overall performance from his side. 'It was a good performance by the lads on a difficult pitch and it was pleasing to get the victory.

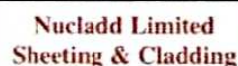

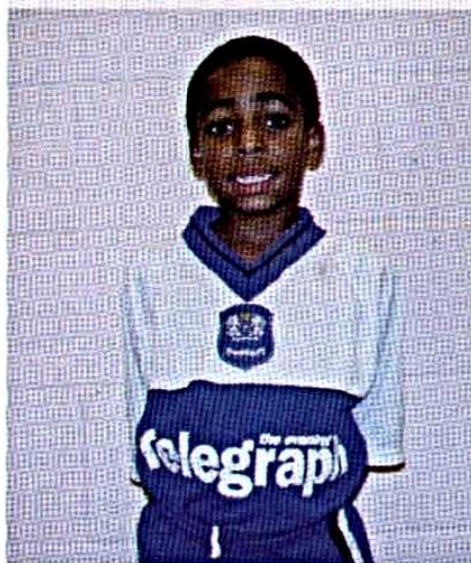

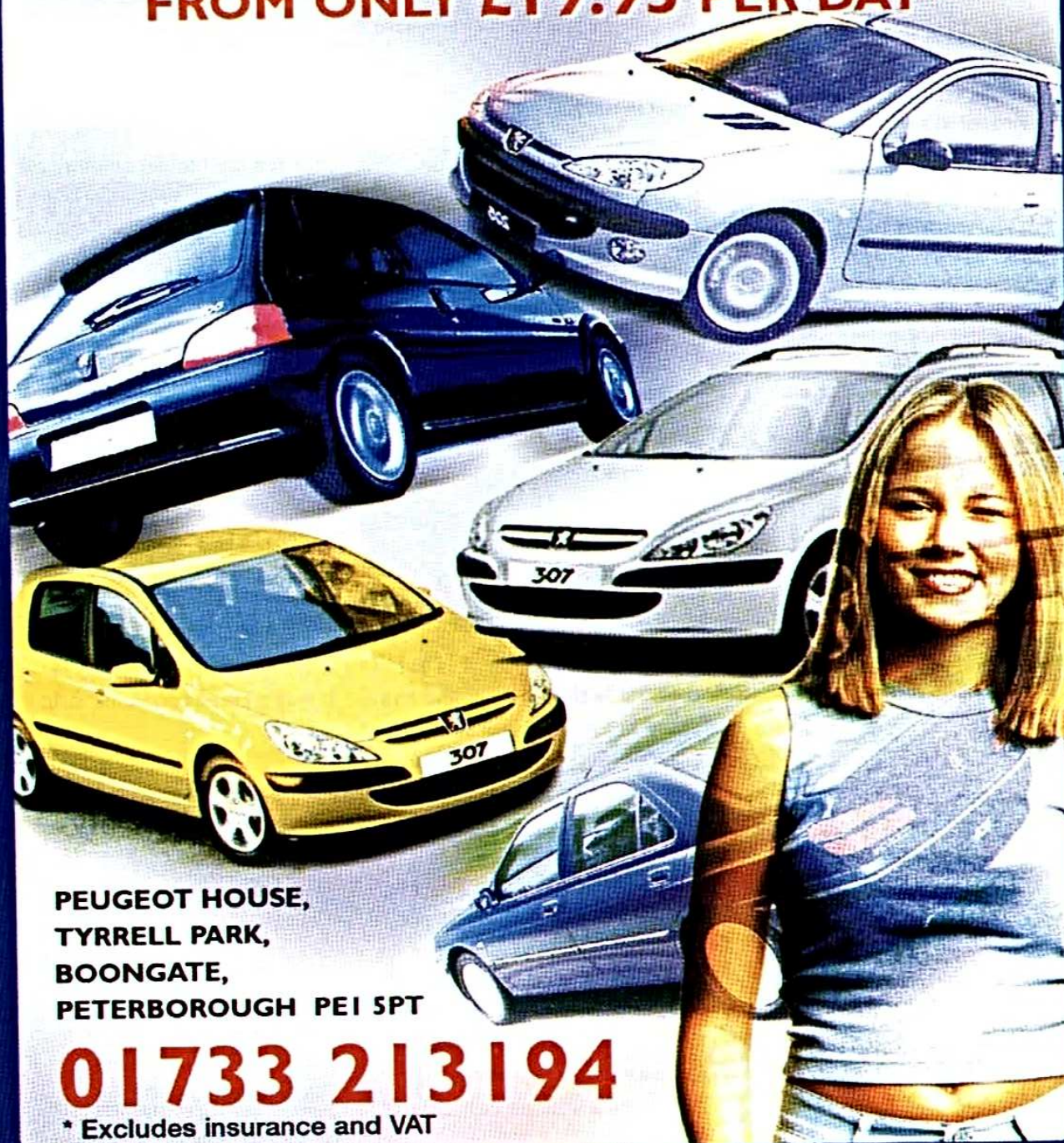

The original meeting was postponed on Saturday 15th February due to a frozen pitch and the encounter was due to take place on Tuesday 15th April,

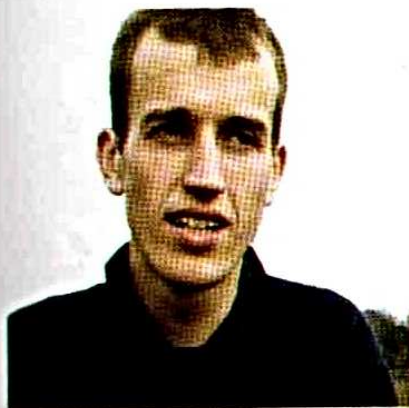
but Cardiff have requested that the match be put back 24 hours as the Bluebirds are in action on Sunday 13th April at Chesterfield.

Extra Time Allowed Procedure

Time allowed will be indicated at the end of each half and the procedure to be adopted is outlined as follows:

Two minutes before the expiry of each half the Fourth Official will position himself at the half way line and establish eye contact with the referee.

During the two minutes before the expiry of each half, the referee must inform the Fourth Official either visually or verbally of the amount of time allowed.

The Fourth Official is to acknowledge this information using a pre-determined signal between the Fourth Official and referee.

At the expiry of each 45 minute periods and not before, the Fourth Official will display the minimum time allowed to all points of the ground by use of the board provided.

Any subsequent injuries, or additional delays including time wasting, will result in further time being added on. No further communication with the Fourth Official will be necessary. Referees are to ensure that the full allowance is made for any time lost.

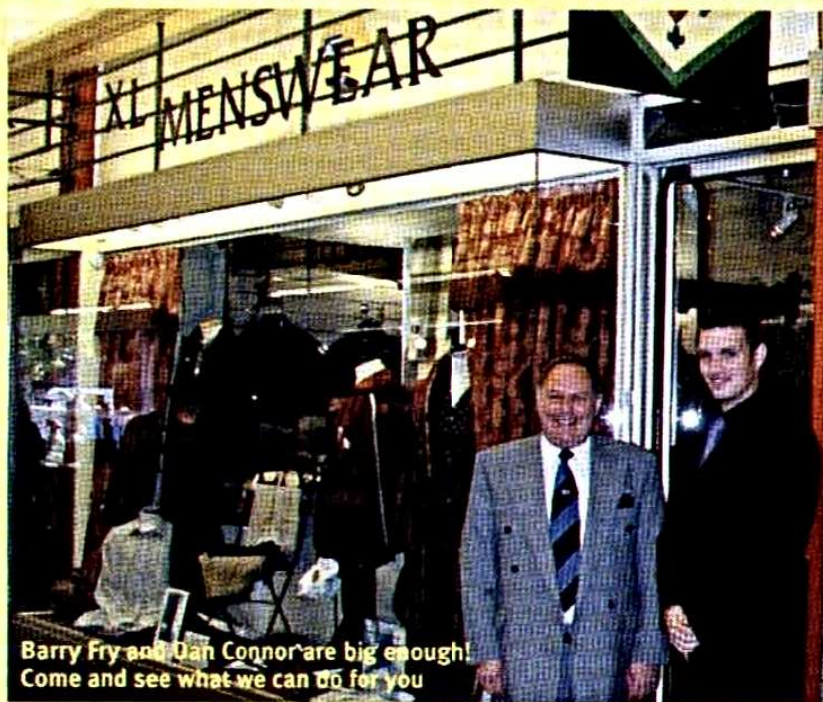
Ilkeston deserved the result because they were better for longer periods. The girls worked hard, but that hasn't been enough to get us points consistently all season.'

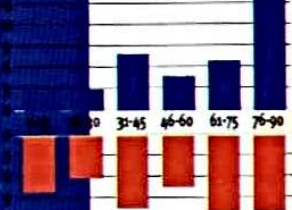

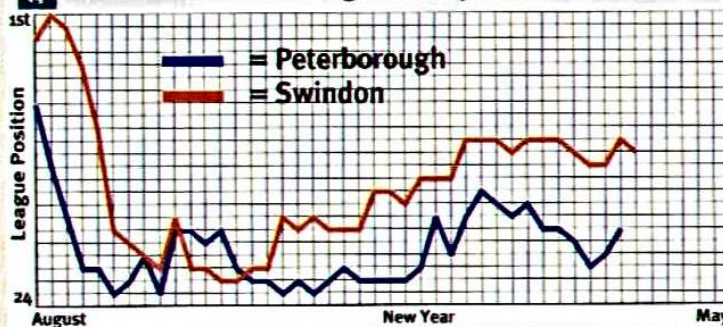

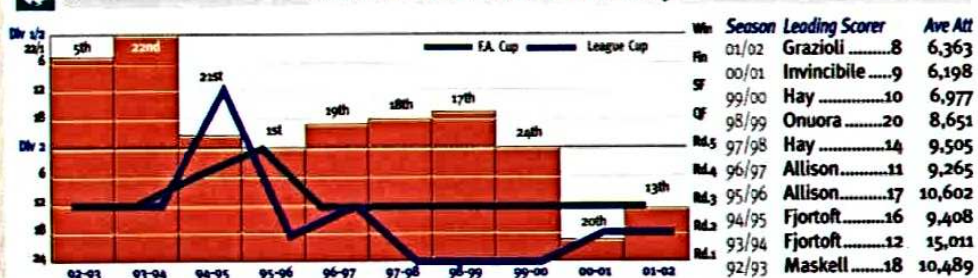
