












Hello and welcome once again to Victoria Park for this afternoon's game with Swindon Town. I would like to extend a warm welcome to all the people who have made the long trip to Hartlepool today.

We know it won,t be easy this afternoon because Town have made a solid start to the season. They are currently on the same number of points as us and it seems that Andy King is doing a good job there.

I have to say that I am hoping for a much better performance this afternoon than the one we saw last weekend at Plymouth Argyle. The display at Home Park simply wasn't good enough and we told the players that. We had a meeting on Monday morning at the training ground to talk about things and since then the lads have been really buzzing in training. They have looked confident and in good spirits - they are great set of boys. We saw glimpses of the way the lads can play during the last home game with Rushden and Diamonds and I hope we can build on that performance today.

Since the last match we have added a couple of new faces to the squad. Danny Byrne has joined the club on a month's loan from Manchester United. We have watched him a few times and we have been fortunate enough to be allowed to take him. We spoke to Manchester United about a couple of lads and Danny was one of the priorities because I feel we don't have a player of his type in the squad. He is predominantly a wide player but he can play anywhere in midfield and he can deliver quality in to the box.

Obviously taking Danny was the main deal we completed this week but another couple of lads have also agreed short-term contracts. Dimitrius Konstantopoulos (is that the right spelling?) has agreed to stay at the club for a further month. He has looked a good keeper and we need him here as cover for Jim Provett now that Anthony Williams has moved to Swansea City on loan.

Joel Porter is the other player we signed. He is an Australian internation-

al striker who has been training with the club for the past few weeks and has done well. He is a left-footed player who reads things well - he sees things in games that maybe others don.t. He is very unselfish in front of goal for a striker and can spot opportunities for others. His movement is good and he is clever in and around the box so hopefully things work out with him too.

I just want to say as well a big thank you to the people at the Club who helped me celebrate my birthday. I turned 40 on Monday and when I got back to Victoria Park after training there were balloons and banners all over my office and a birthday cake on my desk. The cake had that photograph of me on it that I'm sure you've all seen - the one with the curly blonde hair! It was a great gesture and very much appreciated.



Pools recorded a 1-0 victory that day and a repeat result would be more than welcome this afternoon.

The emergence of youngsters like Darren Craddock and Jack Wilkinson into the first team in the last few weeks is a tribute to the hard work being done in our Youth Department, although the down side is that, with up to four players missing on a Saturday, our Youth Team have to contend with older and more experienced teams. This was evident last Saturday at Chesterfield when Paul Stephenson fielded a side containing three 16 year olds and five 17 year olds and although they turned in a spirited show, went out of the Youth Alliance Cup by three goals

Speaking of young, up and coming stars of the future, Freddy Adu, the 14 year old Ghanaian born US starlet has just signed his first professional contract with DC United, guaranteeing him \$1 million dollars over the next four years. Paul Stephenson spotted this lad playing for the US National Under 18 side in last season's Dallas Cup and he came back raving about his skills and talent. Adu has since received the Golden Ball for being the outstanding player in the recent Under 17 World Cup. I'm sure Paul would have liked to bring him to Hartlepool!

However, this youngster looks set to take the football world by storm, but be aware! Recent winners of this prestigious award include Landon Donovan, who has progressed to the USA, national side and played in the last World Cup finals but still plies his trade in the States with San Jose Earthquakes, Nii Lamptey, who "starred" briefly with Aston Villa in the 90's and is now playing in the United Arab Emirates and Jim Will, the Scottish keeper from 1989 who, after leaving Arsenal at 20, spent a season with Dunfermline Athletic before joining the police and is now playing

amateur football in the north east of Scotland. Other winners include such "household names" as Philip Osundo (Nigeria). William de Oliveira (Brazil) and Mohammed Al Kathiri (Oman) who all starred in the tournament only to disappear from the football map afterwards. Perhaps a lesson to our youngsters who have made the step up recently of the need to take this game one day at a time and to work as hard as they can to fulfil their potential! Do not get carried away and expect one or two good games to take care of your (or your team's) future.

Back to this afternoon's match which could see the Pools debut of yet another promising young star of the future. Daniel Byrne has joined the Club on a month's loan from Manchester United and will be looking to enhance his reputation at Victoria Park. We all wish him the best of luck.

We believe it will be good for the lad to get exposure to first team football and it shows how far we have come as a recognised football club for Sir Alex Ferguson to recommend Daniel to join us on loan.

This column cannot end without a mention of the superb achievement of England's Rugby team in winning the World Cup in Sydney last Saturday and, of course, the part played by local lad Jonny Wilkinson. It was refreshing to see a team so hyped up by the English press live up to their billing and actually come back with the trophy. They worked so hard for each other, did not arque with some questionable decisions by the South African referee but instead allowed the quality of Wilkinson to shine through. Congratulations to coach Clive Woodward and all his lads.

A lesson there perhaps for overpaid and, in some cases, under performing "superstars" in other sports?

goalkeeper b: Swindon 27.1.82 Returned to his home-town club when signed on a free transfer during the summer. A former Chelsea trainee and England Under-20 international who was never given a firstteam opportunity at Stamford Bridge. but impressed during loan spells at QPR and Leyton Orient last season, and has become the Town number one since claiming a starting place early in the season. 2003/04 League stats:

BART GRIEMINK

goalkeeper b: Holland 29.3.72 Former Dutch Under-21 keeper who first came to these shores to join Birmingham City in November 1995. Followed manager Barry Fry to Peterborough for a fee of £25,000 a year later and after a loan spell at the County Ground towards the end of the 1999/2000 season, signed on permanently for the Town the following summer. A tall and well-built keeper who missed just two League games last season, but who has found himself on the bench for recent matches.

ANDY GURNEY

defender b: Bristol 25.1.74

A right-sided defender who clearly prefers playing his football in the south-western part of England. Started out on the Rovers side of his home-city, playing over 100 League games before moving on a free to Torquay in July 1997. Transferred to Reading for £100,000 in January 1999, he moved on to the County Ground on a Bosman free transfer during the summer of 2001, and has been a first-team regular for Town ever since. Skipper of the team and capable of scoring spectacular goals

THE STORY SO FAR....

It's been a rollercoaster season so far for Swindon Town, who arrive at Victoria Park this afternoon as one of three teams with an identical record of seven wins, seven draws and five defeats, being one place and one goal behind Pools, and one place and one goal ahead of Bournemouth.

After losing at home to Sheffield Wednesday on the opening day of the campaign, Town then went undefeated in their next ten games, climbing to second in the table, before four consecutive defeats sent them quickly out of the play-off places.

A goalless draw at home to Port Vale halted the slide, and since then Town have won two and drawn one of their last three games to take them back into contention two points off the coveted seventh position.

The fact that last season's leading scorer Sam Parkin was missing through injury during the losing streak was more than a coincidence, and the former Chelsea reserve has netted twice since his return to action. He also committed himself to the club recently by



signing a contract extension, and if nothing else that signature keeps a healthy price tag on the sought-after

Town manager Andy King brought in Deon Burton on loan from Portsmouth to cover for Parkin's absence, and has also used the loan system to previously bring in the likes of James Milner from Leeds and Junior Lewis from Leicester. Defender Jerel Ifil from Watford recently returned for his third loan spell at the County Ground, and he has been a key figure in the defensive solidarity that has seen just one goal conceded in the last four League games.

That was against leaders QPR last Saturday when Town let in a late equaliser, and manager King was disappointed that his team were unable to collect all three points, saying after the match: "Unfortunately the truth of it is. if we want to achieve what we want and what we are capable of in years to come, then we just have to start winning games like this one. We need to start getting across that winning line when we have got the game.

"It's been a long time since something happened here and maybe there is nervousness in tight games like this." Town's highest finishing position in the past seven seasons was their tenth place last campaign, but their combination of youth and experience looks a good blend, and it will be a major disappointment for all concerned at the County Ground if they are not in the promotion shake-up come next May.

ALAN REEVES

defender b: Birkenhead 19.11.67 Very experienced central defender who played for Chester and Rochdale for making the step up to the Premier League with Wimbledon for £300,000 in September 1994. Joined Town on a free transfer in June 1998 after making 57 League appearances for the Dons, and for the past five seasons has been one of the mainstays of the club's defence. Now also involved on the coaching side, he has played over 400 League matches and was a used substitute against QPR last Saturday 2003/04 League stats: 12 games, 0 goals

ADIE VIVEASH

defender b: Swindon 30.9.69 Strong and determined central defender now back where he started his career, having signed on a free transfer during the summer from Reading. Spent eight seasons at the County Ground before joining Walsall on a free transfer in October 1995. and made over 200 League appearances for the Saddlers before switching to the Royals on another free in July 2000. Had a spell on loan at Oxford last season, began the current campaign in the first team, but has been missing for the past few games. 2003/04 League stats: 14 games, 0 goals

ANDY NICHOLAS

defender b: Liverpool 10.10.83 Promising young defender signed during the summer after being released by his home-city club. Failed to get any first-team opportunities at Anfield, but made his League debut for Town at Chesterfield just over a month ago, and appeared off the bench during last Saturday's draw with OPR.

2003/04 League stats: 4 games, 0 goals

MATT HEYWOOD

defender b: Chatham 26.8.79 Former Burnley trainee who made his League debut for the Clarets against Blackpool in November 1998 and played a dozen more games at Turf Moor before joining Town on a free transfer in January 2001. Since then he has been a first-team regular, and is a tall, powerful central defender who was an ever-present last season, but who will miss his first game of the current campaign this afternoon due to a suspension following a sendingoff a fortnight ago. 2003/04 League stats: 19 games, 0 goals

DAVID DUKE

defender/midfielder b: Inverness 7.11.78 Versatile and consistent performer signed on a free transfer from Sunderland in August 2000. Made his League debut later that month against Colchester and apart from missing some games at the end of his first season with a knee injury has been a first-team regular ever since. A midfielder by trade, he often fills one of the wing-back positions, where his crossing and long-throwing ability can be used to good effect. 2003/04 League stats: 18 games, 0 goals

MATT HEWLETT

midfielder

b: Bristol 25.2.76

A former England Youth international who spent seven seasons with his home-city club before leaving Ashton Gate for the County Ground during the summer of 2000. Apart from missing a few games in his first season with a cruciate ligament injury he has been a fixture in the first team ever since, and is a skilful, attacking midfielder not averse to making a tackle when required. An ever-present in the starting line-up so far this season, he recently made his 250th League appearance. 2003/04 League stats: 19 games, 1 goal

STEVE ROBINSON

midfielder

b: Nottingham 17.10.75


A former Birmingham City trainee who had a couple of decent seasons appearance-wise for the Blues in the period 1997-99. Six other seasons either side of that period were quieter, and after a total of 81 League games he joined Town for £50,000 in February 2001. Two match-winning goals soon after at local rivals Oxford United quickly endeared him to his new fans, and his energetic displays on the right side of midfield have kept him in the first-team line-up ever since. Made his 200th League appearance in Town's win at Oldham a fortnight ago, was stretchered off against QPR last Saturday, but is expected to be fit for today's game. 2003/04 League stats: 13 games, 1 goal

STEFANI MIGLIORANZI

midfielder

b: Pocos de Caldos, Brazil 20.9.77 Skilful midfielder who can also fill in





at the back when required. Moved to England and Portsmouth in March 1999 from playing US college soccer. making his League debut for Pompey later that month against Crystal Palace. Never really cemented a position at Fratton Park, and after being signed by Town on a free transfer during the summer of 2002 played more League matches last season (41) than the previous four put together. b: Winchester 23.1.83
Left-sided defender/midfielder signed

and is a very highly-rated youngster
who is gradually coming to terms
with the physical side of the game.

midfielder
b: Spelthorne 30.9.75
Busy midfielder signed on a free transfer during the summer from Reading. Started out with
Portsmouth and spent seven seasons at Fratton Park, playing 160 League games, before joining the Royals for £100,000 in March 2000. A regular in his first two seasons, he spent a short spell on loan at Luton at the end of last season, and after establishing himself in the Town line-up at

the start of the current campaign, recently broke a wrist that has kept him on the sidelines for the past month.

GRANT SMITH

midfielder/forward b: Irvine 5.5.80 Scottish-born midfielder signed during the summer on a free transfer from Sheffield United. So far, and at the age of 23, his career has taken him to Wycombe, Reading, Hearts, Livingston, Clydebank, Halifax and Plymouth, where he played five games on loan last season as well as three for the Blades. Can also fill one of the striking positions when required, where his height and pace come into play, and was a non-playing substitute for last Saturday's match with QPR. 2003/04 League stats: 3 games, 0 goals

SAM PARKIN

forward b: Roehampton 14.3.81 Powerful young striker who failed to get a chance in four seasons at Chelsea, but who became a major player in Division Two last season. Loaned out to Northampton for the 2001/02 campaign, after having previously been loaned to Millwall, Wycombe and Oldham, he scored just four League goals from 40 matches. but after joining Town at the beginning of last season really found his form to hit 25 goals from his 43 League games. Out of action recently for a month with a knee ligament injury, he has netted in last two League games and just prior to last Saturday's match signed a new contract that keeps him at the County Ground until June 2006.

TOMMY MOONEY

forward b: Billingham 11.8.71 Former Aston Villa trainee who started out his League career with Scarborough, then moved to Southend for £100,000 in July 1993. Joined Watford in March 1994, and enjoyed considerable success at Vicarage Road, playing 250 League games for the Hornets and scoring 60 goals. Switched to Birmingham on a free transfer during the summer of 2001 and helped the Blues into the Premiership, but after only one start last season spent the rest of the campaign on loan to Stoke. Sheffield United and Derby County, Joined Town during the summer, and is an experienced, hard-working, left-sided player who is particularly good in the air and is another ever-present in the starting line-up so far this season 2003/04 League stats: 19 games, 8 goals

RORY FALLON

forward

b:Gisbourne, New Zealand 20.3.82 Tall striker whose main strength is his aerial ability, and who was recently signed for an undisclosed fee from Barnsley. Made his League debut for the Tykes against Preston in April 2001, and scored a total of 11 goals from 52 games for the Oakwell club. including one against his new employers earlier in the season. A used substitute in the past two League matches, he may have to initially bide his time before being able to claim a regular place in the starting line-up. 2003/04 League stats:

WREXHAM





Peter Scantlebury

M.B.E. (Wimbledon)

Before playing sport took over Peter Scantlebury's life, he was a regular supporter of his local football team Wimbledon F.C. As his tastes matured, the Londoner also developed an allegiance with Arsenal and spent much of his schooldays leisure time commuting between the two.

Today happily settled in South Yorkshire, the new head coach of the Westfield Sharks Sheffield has made an amazing start in his first campaign in the British Basketball League. The Sharks have started the season with eight wins out of eight including a BBL cup win against its holders Brighton, in the first round. Peter was born in Camberwell and grew up in Mitchem where he attended Eastfields High School. Former Dons players Brian Gayle and Glyn Hodges shared their education with Scants, Brian in the same year and Glyn the one above. He first recalls attending Plough Lane with family friends who took the 9 year old along to experience initially non league football.

"It was in the Southern league days playing teams like Dulwich Hamlet. I soon got hooked though and striker Alan Cork became a favourite of mine, he seemed to score in every game I saw. I only stopped going because of my own involvement in sport, I was playing cricket, football, basketball and competing in athletics at 200 and 400 metres. In most of those sports I was lucky enough to play at County level so eventually I found it impossible to watch Arsenal or Wimbledon,

I've had to make do with following them ever since. I always look for the two results but I must admit the Dons are like a different club these days, it was never the same once they left Plough Lane."

Aged 17 his future began to take shape when he joined a professional Basketball club in Guildford. Then known as 'Team Talbot' they are personified today as the Thames Valley Tigers, key opponents of the Sheffield Sharks. He enjoyed three different spells with the Tigers over 10 years, initially leaving for a brief period in the states. He also had two separate seasons with the Newcastle Eagles and two with the London Towers, before completing his playing days in Sheffield. His time in the USA was thanks to a scholarship awarded to him by the Winthrop College in South Carolina. The plan was for four years but after twelve months, Peter decided that he would have more opportunity in the British League. His faith was rewarded as he went on to achieve an impressive 131 caps for England and last year was awarded the M.B.E. for services to the game. In the year 2000 he also took on the role of Assistant Coach to the national side. Peter had hoped to play for at least another season but the opportunity of Sheffield Head Coach was too good to miss. However he is under no illusion about what is ahead and he knows he has a hard act to follow.

"Chris Finch left the Sharks as BBL Champions, you can't get much higher than that! Before the season began my ambition was to make the top four in the league and the final of one of the cups. However with the start we've had I will now be disappointed if we can't get our hands on a trophy. I've brought in a few new players, including Richard Windle, who is a Sheffield lad and H. L. Coleman has come over from Florida. The vastly experienced lan McKinney is captain so overall I'm pretty confident."

Who better to consider those thoughts than two of those players mentioned.

Richard Windle: 'I had no hesitation in signing for Peter and took the opportunity to return home. Everyone who has played with or against Scants has tremendous respect for him.'

lan McKinney: "I'm very proud to be captain and I think we will continue with Pete in the way we left off with Chris. Pete is a more laid back character than Chris but all the disciplines continue as before and our tremendous start speaks for itself."

From their home base at Ponds Forge, Sheffield, Westfield Sharks have the league, the play offs and two cup competitions to aim for and it is quite clear that Messers Scantlebury, McKinney and Windle mean business. Just a note for anyone who thinks their ambition is something of a tall order, the threesome are six feet four, six feet one and six feet eight inches respectively.

IN SAFE KEEPING

Hartlepool United's former loanee

goalkeeper Frank Talia featured in Swindon Town's 1995-96 Second Division title triumph. The extrovert Aussie joined Hartlepool on loan from Blackburn Rovers in December 1992 and made his League debut in the following month's 0-0 draw at Leyton Orient, He played 14 consecutive Second Division games and Hartlepool managed to score just two goals during that period. Moving to Swindon for £150,000 in September 1995, he contested a first-team slot with Fraser Digby and made 107 League appearances prior to joining Wolverhampton Wanderers in August 2000.

WEMBLEY WINNER

Former Hartlepool winger Don Heath featured prominently in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final triumph at Wembley. Moving to the County Ground from Norwich City in September 1967, he also helped Swindon to win promotion in 1968-69 and scored twice in 88 League games for today's opponents prior to joining Oldham Athletic in July 1970. He joined Hartlepool from Peterborough United in July 1973 and was an experienced figure in the 1974-75 League Cup run, netting two goals in 37 Fourth Division outings before moving to Gateshead in December 1974.

EVER-PRESENT

One-time Swindon Town goalkeeper Norman Oakley was ever-present for Hartlepool United in 1962-63. Moving to the Victoria Ground from Doncaster Rovers in September 1958, he made his League debut in Hartlepool's 5-1 defeat at home to Port Vale that month and featured prominently as 'Pool battled to avoid the re-election zone in successive seasons. He made 182 Fourth Division appearances for Hartlepool prior to joining Swindon in March 1964. Contesting a first-team slot with Tony Hicks, he played 21 League games while at the County Ground before moving to Grimsby Town in September 1966.

WING WIZARD

Winger Dave Cunningham played for both Hartlepool and Swindon Town during his career. Moving to the Victoria Ground on loan from Southend United in March 1977, his solitary goal in 12 Fourth Division games clinched Hartlepool's 1-0 victory at fellow strugglers Rochdale the following month. He joined Swindon in June 1977 and contested a first-team place with Northern Ireland international Trevor Anderson, netting three goals in 23 League outings for today's opponents before moving to Aston Villa in December 1978.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED

Former Hartlepool midfielder Bobby Smith achieved managerial success at Swindon Town. Moving to the Victoria Ground from Chester in October 1971, the England Youth international netted seven goals in 69 Fourth Division games for Hartlepool prior to becoming Bury's player-coach in August 1973. He succeeded Danny Williams as Swindon's manager in May 1978 and guided them to the League Cup semi-finals in 1979-80, losing to eventual winners Wolverhampton Wanderers. He remained in charge at the County Ground until dismissed in October

SMITH'S SUCCESS

Former Hartlepool United centre-forward Jack Smith featured prominently in Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Signing professional at the Victoria Ground in May 1953, he was ever-present for Hartlepool in 1959-60 and netted 49 goals in 119 League games for his home-town club before being sold to Watford for £3,000 in July 1960. He joined Swindon in June 1961 and formed a lethal partnership with England U-23 star Ernie Hunt, scoring 37 times in 97 League outings while at the County Ground prior to joining Brighton in January 1964.

CUP HERO

Former Swindon Town wing-half Joe Musgrave helped Hartlepool United to hammer Darlington 4-1 in the 1938-39 Third Division (North) Cup en route to the semi-final that season. Moving to the County Ground from West Ham in July 1936, he netted three goals in 23 Third Division (South) games for Swindon prior to joining Hartlepool in July 1938. He scored three times in 20 League outings while at the Victoria Ground before moving to Spennymoor United in July 1939. Centre-forward

Cyril Woods made four League appearances for Swindon prior to joining Hartlepool in July 1938.

TITLE TRIUMPH

One-time Hartlepool goalkeeper Kenny Allen was an important figure in Swindon Town's 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph. Moving to the Victoria Ground from Tow Law Town in August 1968, he made his League debut in Hartlepool's 2-2 draw at home to Torquay United five months later and played seven Third Division games overall prior to joining Fulham in August 1969. He joined Swindon from Torquay in September 1985 and also featured in their 1986-87 promotion campaign, making 45 League appearances before returning to Torquay in December 1986.

LOAN SPELLS

Goalkeeper Kevin Dearden spent loan spells at both Hartlepool United and Swindon Town during the 1989-90 campaign. Moving to struggling Hartlepool on loan from Tottenham Hotspur in August 1989, he made ten consecutive Fourth Division appearances including six goal defeats against Stockport County and Doncaster Rovers. He joined Swindon on loan from Spurs in March 1990 and his solitary League appearance was as cover for Fraser Digby in that month's 2-1 win at AFC Bournemouth. Fellow keeper Jack Rutherford also played for both clubs.




Let's hope that we can keep our wonderful home record going and we get another 3 points today.







Bristol City clinched promotion to the First Division as Clive Whitehead's goal gave Alan Dicks' side a 1-0 victory over Portsmouth at Ashton Gate on 20th April 1976. Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS traces what happened to the team that took Bristol City back to the top-flight after an absence of 65 years.

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO BRISTOL CITY'S TEAM?

RAY CASHLEY

Ever-present goalkeeper who made 227 League appearances and briefly retired after a loan spell at Hereford United. He revived his career with Bristol Rovers in August 1982 and subsequently played for Trowbridge Town, Chester City and Weston-Super-Mare where he became lottery manager.

GERRY SWEENEY

Versatile Scottish right-back who netted 22 goals in 406 League games until released during City's financial crisis in February 1982. After spells at various clubs, he coached Walsall and became a postman based at Portishead either side of a period back at Bristol City as assistant-manager.

BRIAN DRYSDALE

Long-serving left-back who scored three times in 282 League outings prior to joining Oxford United in July 1977, then was player-boss of Frome



Town, Shepton Mallet and Clandown. Now a semi-retired carpenter living in Stockwood, his son Jason played for Watford and Swindon Town.

GERRY GOW

Ever-present Scottish U-23 midfielder who netted 48 goals in 374 League outings before being sold to Manchester City for £175,000 in October 1980, then played for Rotherham United and Burnley. Later manager of Yeovil Town and Weymouth, he has since managed several pubs in Portland.

GARY COLLIER

Central defender who scored three times in 193 League outings before moving to Coventry City for a record £325.000 in July 1979. Joining Portland Timbers for a similar fee in March 1980, he subsequently played for San Diego Sockers and has since become a soccer coach based in Florida.

GEOFF MERRICK

Ever-present defender who skippered Bristol City to the top-flight and netted ten goals in 367 League outings before leaving during the financial crisis in February 1982. He then had spells with various clubs including Yeovil Town and Bath City and is now a self-employed builder in Nailsea.

TREVOR TAINTON

Long-serving midfielder who was ever-present in 1975-76 and netted 24 goals in 486 League games until leaving during Bristol City's financial crisis in February 1982, then played for Torquay United and Trowbridge Town. He has since become a security officer at Oldbury Power Station.

TOM RITCHIE

Lanky Scottish striker who was leading marksman and moved to Sunderland in January 1981, then was loaned to Carlisle before rejoining Bristol City in June 1982. He netted 102 goals in 414 League games overall prior to joining Yeovil Town in December 1984 and is now a postman in Clevedon.

DONNIE GILLIES


Scottish U-23 star who scored 26 times in 220 League outings before following Terry Cooper to Bristol Rovers for £50,000 in June 1980. Subsequently with Paulton Rovers, Gloucester City, Bath City, Anorthosis and Yeovil Town, he became a sales rep and currently lives in Winford.

PAUL CHEESLEY

Powerful striker who netted 20 goals in 64 League outings until a knee injury against Stoke in August 1976 ended his top-flight career. Later with Shepton Mallet, Frome Town, Odd Down and Yeovil Town, he became a building materials salesman and is now a matchday host at Ashton Gate.

CLIVE WHITEHEAD

Versatile England Youth winger who scored ten goals in 229 League outings before moving to West Brom in November 1981, then played for Portsmouth, Exeter City and Yeovil Town. He rejoined Bristol City as coach and is now a financial adviser for the PFA, living near Axbridge.

However, two minutes later I did witness United pull a goal back, when Darrell Clarke pounced to score his first Pools goal since his summer move, striking the ball home after Flash had hit the cross bar. PFA Player of the year 1985





The Toffees' midfield general, the embodiment of sheer tenacity with a built-in never-say-die attitude, was one of the key players in the club's table topping exploits of 1984-85. Indeed, it was those very qualities that were recognised by the PFA membership as they held their annual winter election.

'We were enjoying a fantastic season.'
Peter recalls. "We always had that confidence in our ability even though we started off slowly and were beaten 4-1 by Spurs in the first game, at Goodison Park. Then we lost 2-1 at West Brom, but after winning the third game 1-0 at Chelsea we went from strength to strength.

'Howard Kendall had built a strong side that could really play. It had strength in the likes of Andy Gray. Graeme Sharp, Kevin Ratcliffe and myself. It had tremendous ability in Kevin Sheedy, Trevor Steven and Adrian Heath - a complete mixture that worked. Then we had Neville Southall in goal. That season Neville was the best goalkeeper I've ever seen. He went on to win the Footballer of the Year title from the Football Writers' Association, and no one deserved it more.'

As if all that weren't enough, Peter also attributes the Toffees' success to

the strength in depth of Kendall's squad. 'That's something all top sides need. We had players like John Bailey. Alan Harper and Kevin Richardson on the sidelines waiting to play their part whenever they were called upon.'

The "fantastic season" would culminate in Everton's eighth championship success. 'And we were in with a chance of a 'treble'. We reached the finals in both the FA Cup and the European Cup-Winners Cup."

The Blues were magnificent under the Rotterdam floodlights against Rapid Vienna, winning 3-1 with goals from Gray, Sheedy and Steven to bring home their first European silverware. The FA Cup final against Manchester United was played at Wembley that weekend. 'It was a baking hot day and we just didn't have enough left in the tank to play through two finals of such importance within four days of each other. It was hard going and United played well, even though they had the boy Moran sent off for fouling me as I was going through.'

In the event Everton's treble dreams were ended by a solitary goal from Norman Whiteside - the only disappointment in an otherwise magnificent season for Reid and his teammates.

Yet, just a few years earlier, few would have expected the former England Schoolboy international to one day be up there among football's elite, let alone collecting the game's most coveted individual honour. There was a time when he seemed destined to join that band of unfortunate players whose careers are cut short by injury.



Liverpool-born, he had started out as an apprentice with Bolton Wanderers. turning professional in May 1974. He became a regular in the Wanderers' line-up, missing few matches over the next three seasons. In April 1977 he progressed to the England Under-21 side and the following season became a vital factor in Bolton's Second Division championship-winning campaign. Then at the start of 1978-79 he broke his left kneecap, recovered relatively quickly and impressed the likes of Arsenal, Wolves and Everton who were all keen to sign him for around £600,000.

But further battles with serious injury were to plague Peter. Every day for a year he visited the Bolton treatment room following ligament tears in his right leg. 'And every day the physio, Jim Hedridge, got the last bit out of me. He made me keep my body in perfect trim and forced me not to swamp myself in self-pity when other were questioning whether I'd ever play again.'

Thus encouraged, Peter's persistence and fortitude carried him though and Everton eventually signed him for around £60,000. It was the bargain of the century.

Up and coming Manchester United striker Mark Hughes won the 1985 PFA Young Player of the Year Awardthus starting what would become a unique association with the Awards. The Merit Award went to former West Ham and England coach Ron Greenwood.

The Football Authorities take a dim view of this for safety reasons in as much as there are no safety barriers in the seated areas of the stand.


Spectators are asked to sit down during the games because if this practice of standing in the seated areas continues disciplinary action could be taken by the Football Association which may result in the deduction of points.
