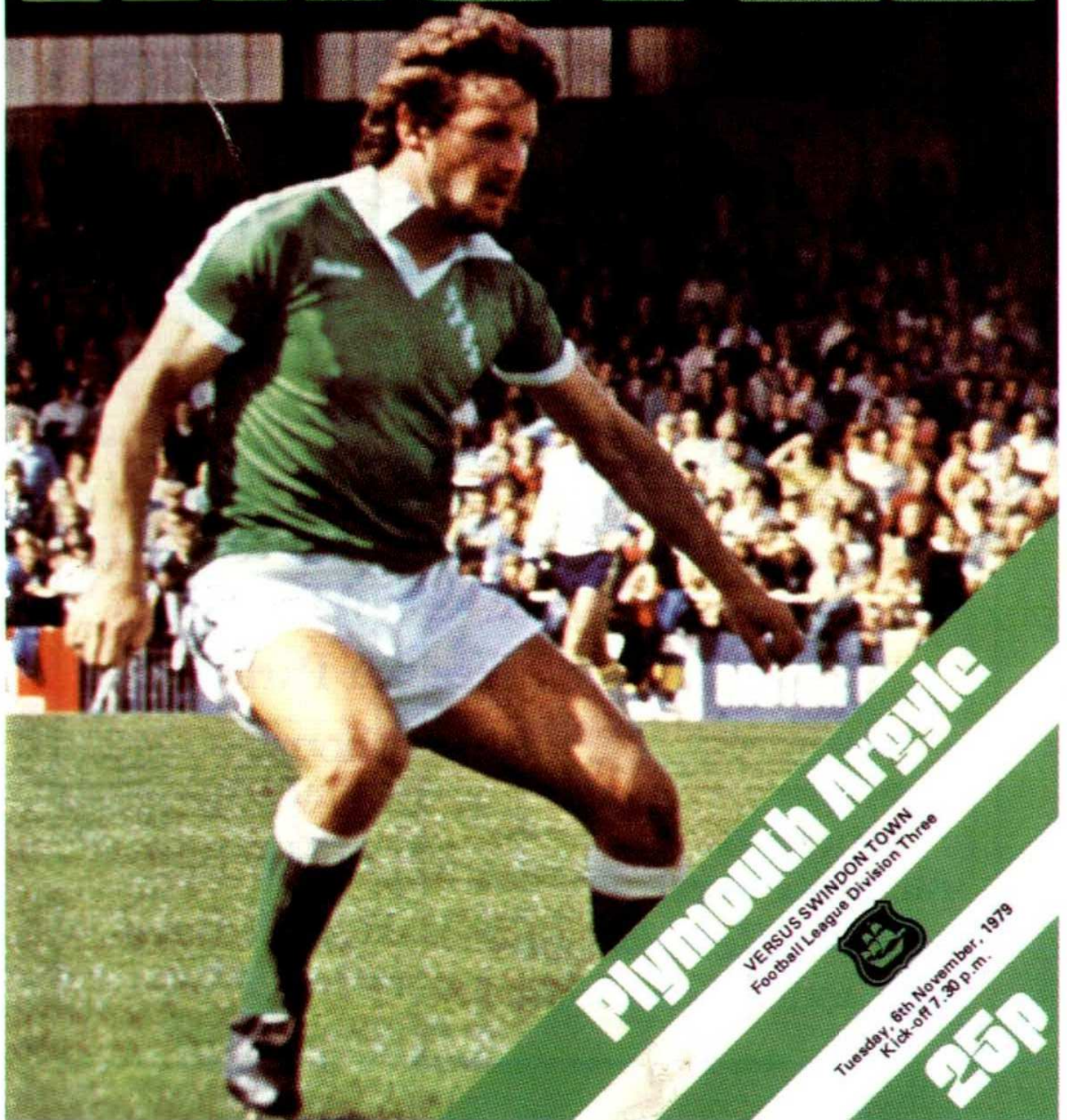

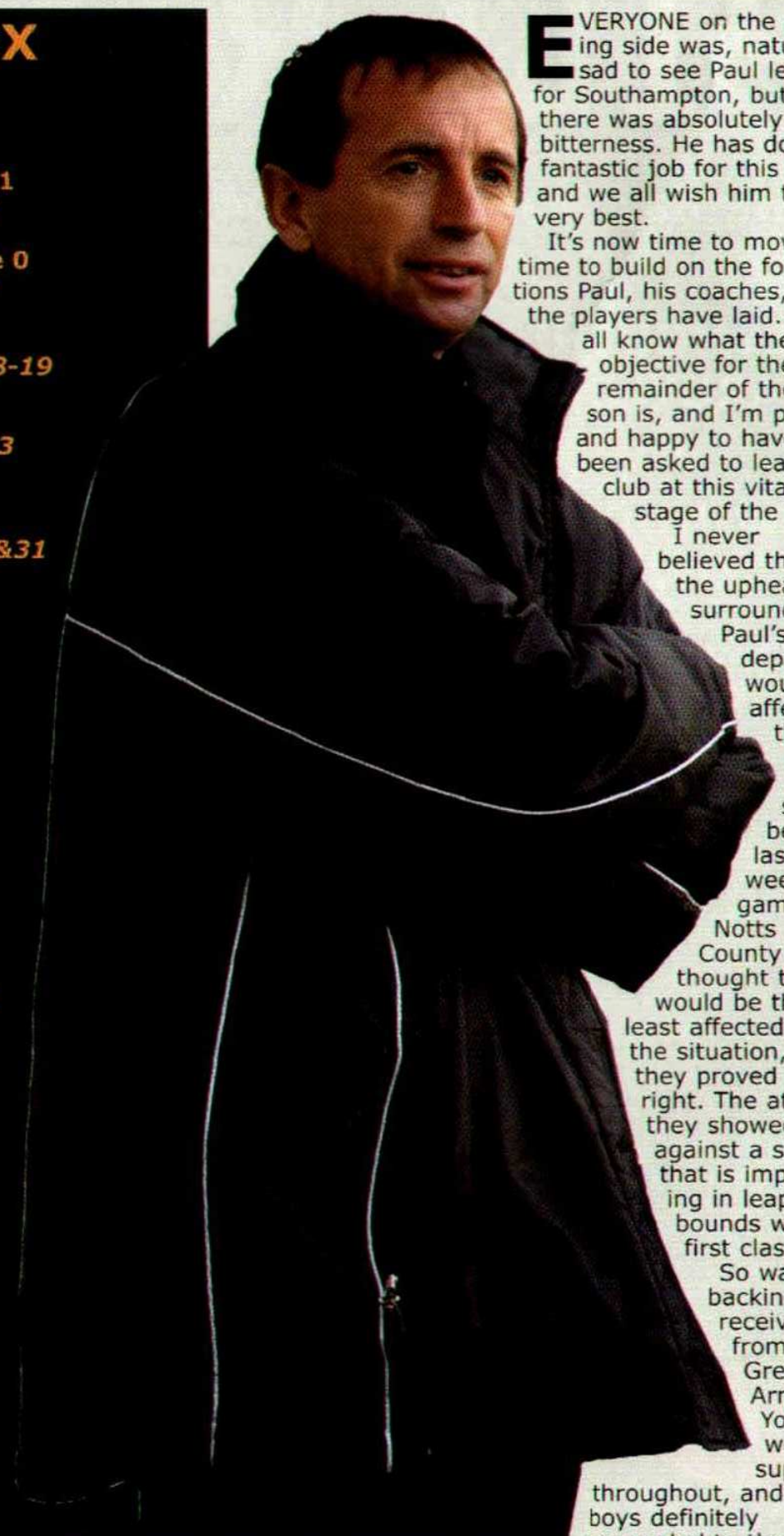

reception you gave Blair was something special. At the end of a traumatic week, the whole day was an illustration of what can be achieved by team-work, on and off the pitch

The message is: 'Keep it going'. We've got 11 games to go and our goal is still in our sights. Your backing will be important.

We are determined to keep focused on our goal. None of the players are the least bit interested in discussing what might or might not happen in the long-term - we are concentrating on one thing.

I don't want any of the players drawn into any speculation over anything, and, to be fair, they don't want to talk about it either.

It only takes one misplaced word, or one misinterpretation of what is said, and suddenly you find an issue arises which deflects us from our purpose.

At the end of the day, it does not matter what the players think or want, the board of directors will make any decision as they see fit.

So you will not hear many opinions coming from our dressing-room. We are focused on the job we have

got to do, not everything that's going on around us. You may feel you need comments from myself or players, but that's not in anyone's best interests.

The players' mood at Notts County was typified by Paul Wotton. He did not play but he was still a vital member of the team. His attitude before, during and after the game was absolutely first class. He did as much as anybody to get the boys together. He showed all the right credentials why he's the club captain.

Today, with Hasney's suspension, he has got the opportunity he has been waiting for, it could not be a better test for him - Sam Parkin and Tommy Mooney are two strikers that everyone in our division admires.

If we can keep a clean sheet against Swindon and Wotsy plays his part, it's going to be difficult for Hasney to get back in, but that's the competition that has got us to where we are.

ARGYLE are laying on free coach travel for the Pilgrims' trip to Barnsley next month. Pilgrims' chairman Paul Stapleton said: "We have always said, and truly believe, that our away support is the best in the country.

"For our last two matches, Argyle fans have comprised more than a quarter of the gate, and the turn-out at Notts County last weekend, when more than 2,000 turned out at the end of a turbulent week for the club was remarkable.

"This is our way of showing how much the players, and everyone else at the club, appreciates their backing."

A Message from the Argyle Board

LOSING Paul Sturrock was the last thing we wanted to happen - ever, never mind at this stage of the season - but we are not going to put on a big black cloak - we've had our period of mourning.

We haven't fallen out with Paul. We all loved him to bits, but now we have got to concentrate on doing what is best for Plymouth Argyle.

Kevin Summerfield has been appointed caretaker manager until further notice and we have every confidence in Kevin, and John Blackley and Geoff Cradgington, which was underlined by last Saturday's great result.

We wanted to have continuity and Kevin has our support and, I hope, the respect and support of the Green Army.

As everyone by now must know, Paul had a clause in his contract allowing him to speak to a Premiership club. After our game at Brighton game, Southampton asked if they could have an informal chat with Paul, which, of course, we agreed to.

Then the trail went cold as Southampton put out a couple of media statements. The first said that Glenn Hoddle was the person they wanted to replace Gordon Strachan.

They also said that they were not going to appoint a manager until the end of the season, and that Steve Wigley would carry on as caretaker manager until then.

Then, and possibly because they were worried about Southampton's league position after failing to win again the Saturday before last, they decided to go for Paul.

We have started the process of looking for a replacement. We want to see who is interested in becoming manager of Plymouth Argyle Football Club. It's a major decision to make. Whether it's Kevin or someone from outside the club, we will have to see.

Sometimes this can be a long process, so we felt it was important to get the ball rolling. We took the decision to advertise the post after talking to Kevin, and he is very comfortable with that.

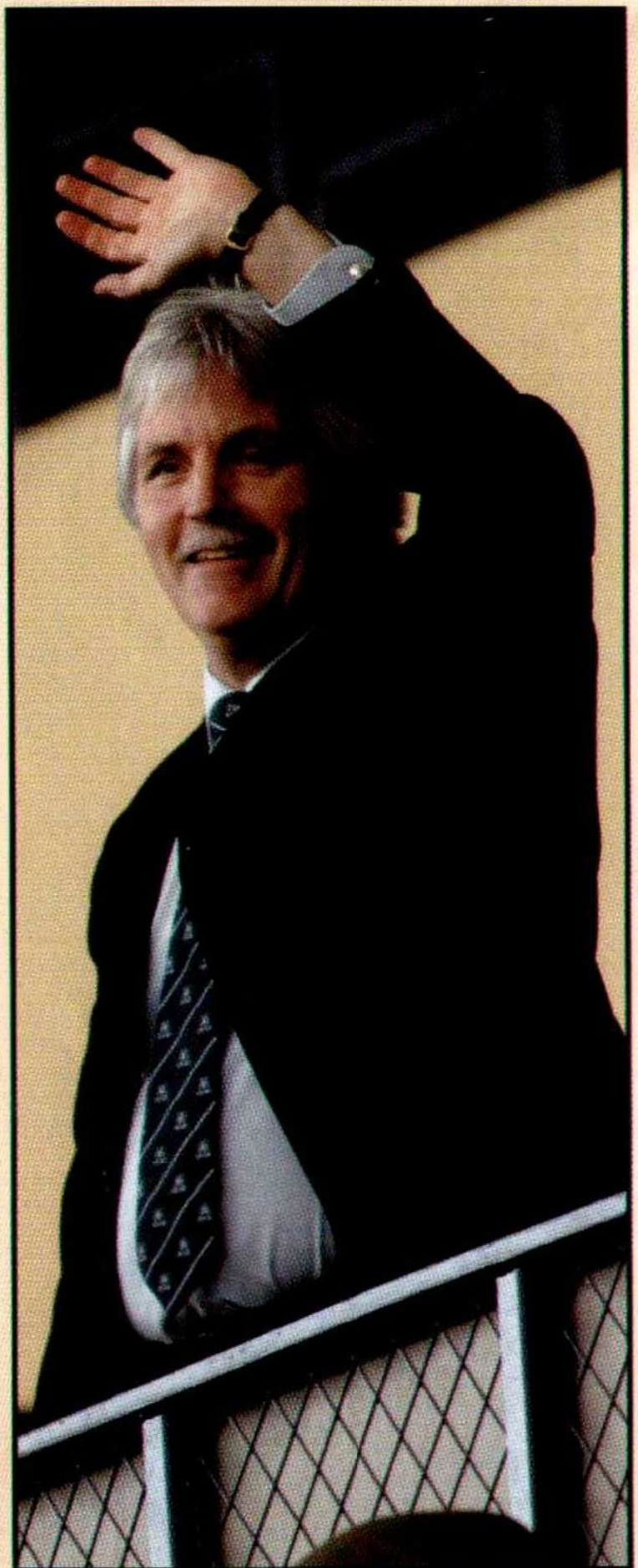
We don't have a favourite; we don't have a short-list. In fact, this is designed so that we can draw up a long-list and whittle it down to a short-list.

There's been so many names mentioned in relation to the vacancy that it's sometimes difficult to remember who has applied and who has been mentioned in the Press.

We expect there to be a good deal of interest, which reflects the growing standing that Argyle have achieved.

Confidence Remains High

PLYMOUTH Argyle captain Paul Wotton and French midfielder David Friio think that former manager Paul Sturrock's move to Southampton will not affect the Pilgrims' bid to win promotion to the Nationwide First Division.

Argyle are five points clear at the top of the Second Division with 11 games of the season left, and have appointed Sturrock's former number two Kevin Summerfield as their caretaker boss, with coach John Blackley as his assistant.

Wotton said: "When the gaffer told us, my first feelings were ones of disappointment I will never work with him again, but it never entered my head that this club will collapse without him."

"He is a great manager and I was proud to play for him and proud to be his captain, but I can't see the future being a problem for the club, not with the coaches we have and the set of players we have."

Friio, one of Sturrock's first signings for the club which he guided from the bottom of the Third Division to the top of the Second in three and a half years, agreed. He said: "We are on a good track at the moment and we have to keep going."

"Summers is the right man to do the job - that's my opinion and I think the rest of the lads will follow me in that opinion. We are in a good position - I'm sure we can do it."



"The thing we have to do now is to keep on the same rails. We are doing well. We are top of the league, we have got 11 games to go - it is not that far, and I am 100 per cent confident that we can do that."

"Of course there was an influence from Paul Sturrock

on his players. He chose everybody. I think maybe Wottsy, Steve [Adams], Stoney [Ian Stonebridge] and Buster [Martin Phillips] were at the club when he came, but I am confident and 100 per cent behind Summers and Sloop."

"They have known us for three years and Summers is like our manager. I'm totally sure he will do a great job. It's not like another manager coming in and we have to get to know each."

Friio revealed that Sturrock's farewells to his players had been an emotional affair. He said: "He didn't play-act. He was himself. We could feel that it was very difficult for him to talk to us. It was very emotional."

"Everyone likes him at the club - he brought the players here. He decided to have a small squad this season and everybody was able to play in his team, so there was a link between us and him."

"We'll miss him. That's for sure - but that's football - but the first focus this year is for promotion and I'm totally convinced that, without him, we will do it."

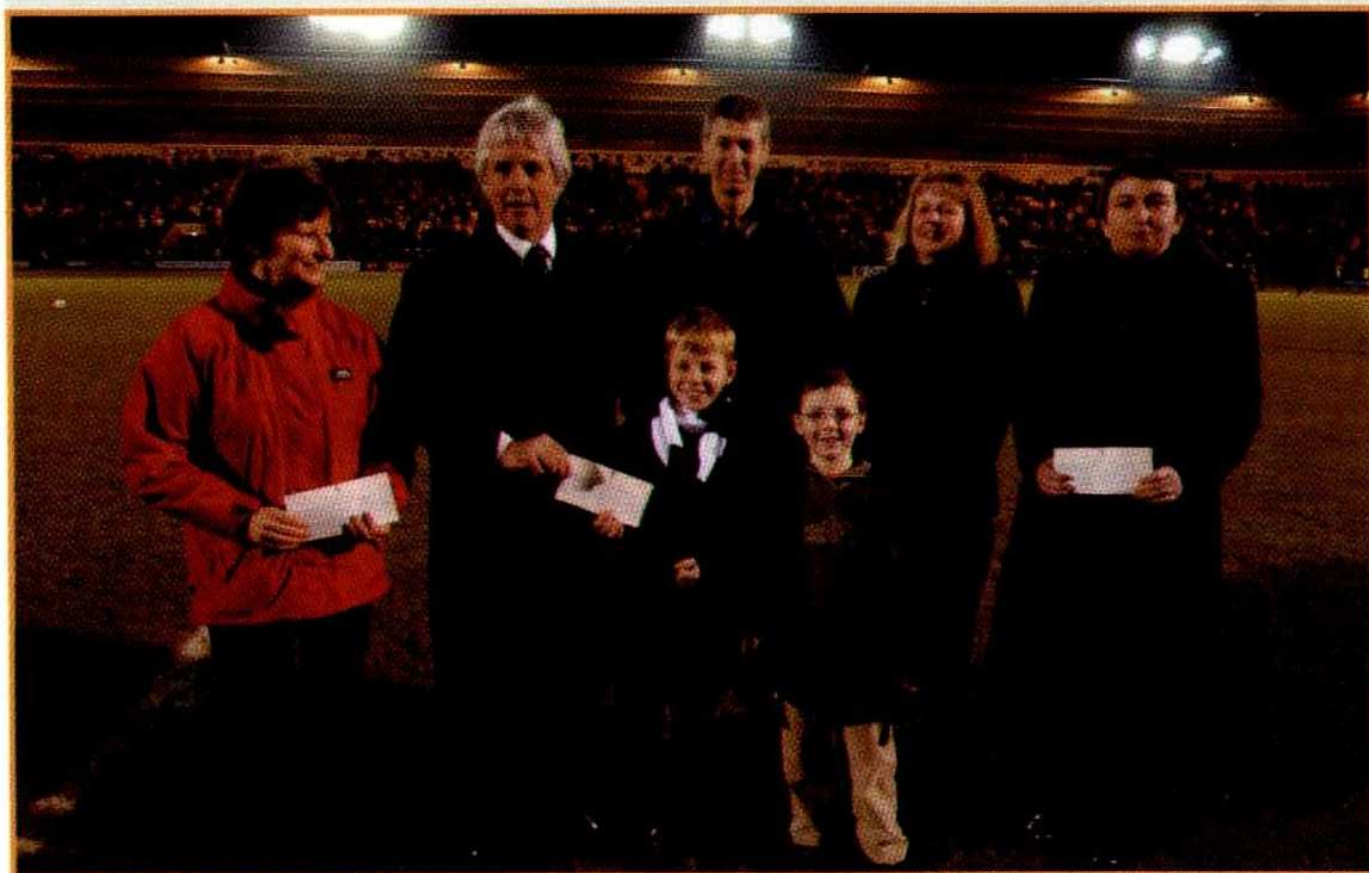

Summerfield said: "Unfortunately for Has, who's done really well, the booking against Blackpool has cost him his place. Paul's the number one pick to go straight back in."

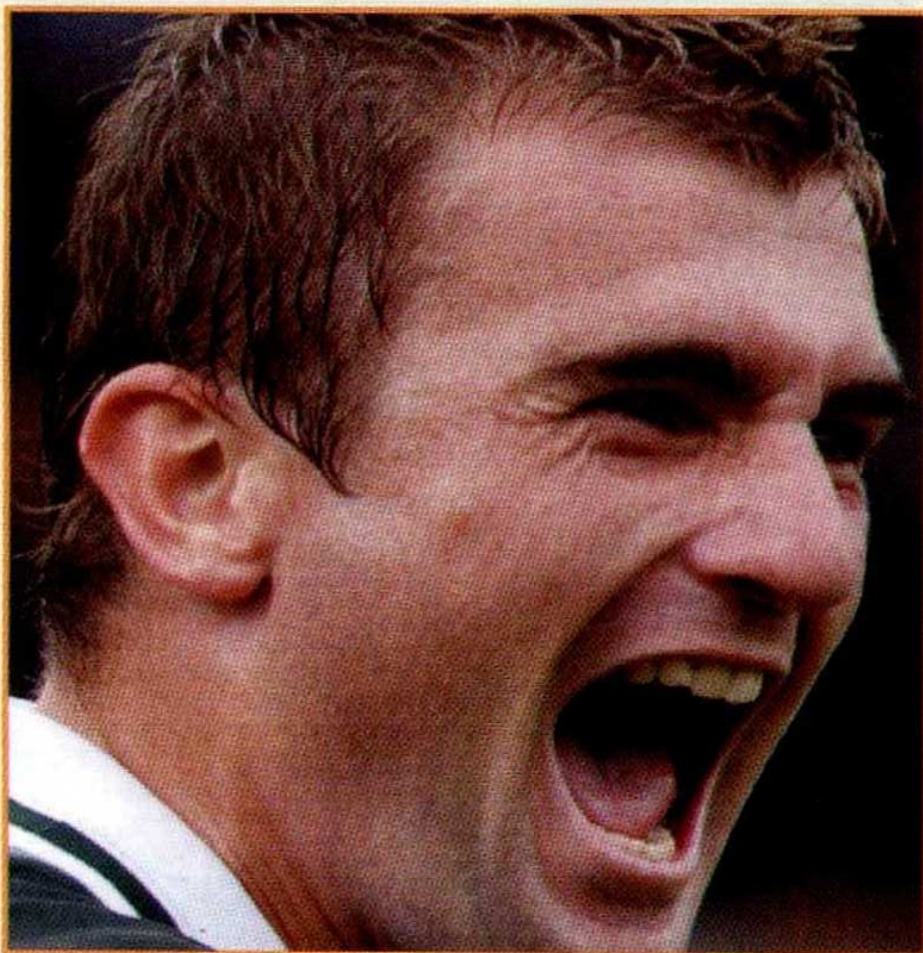
Wotton's time on the sidelines has been frustrating for a player who has

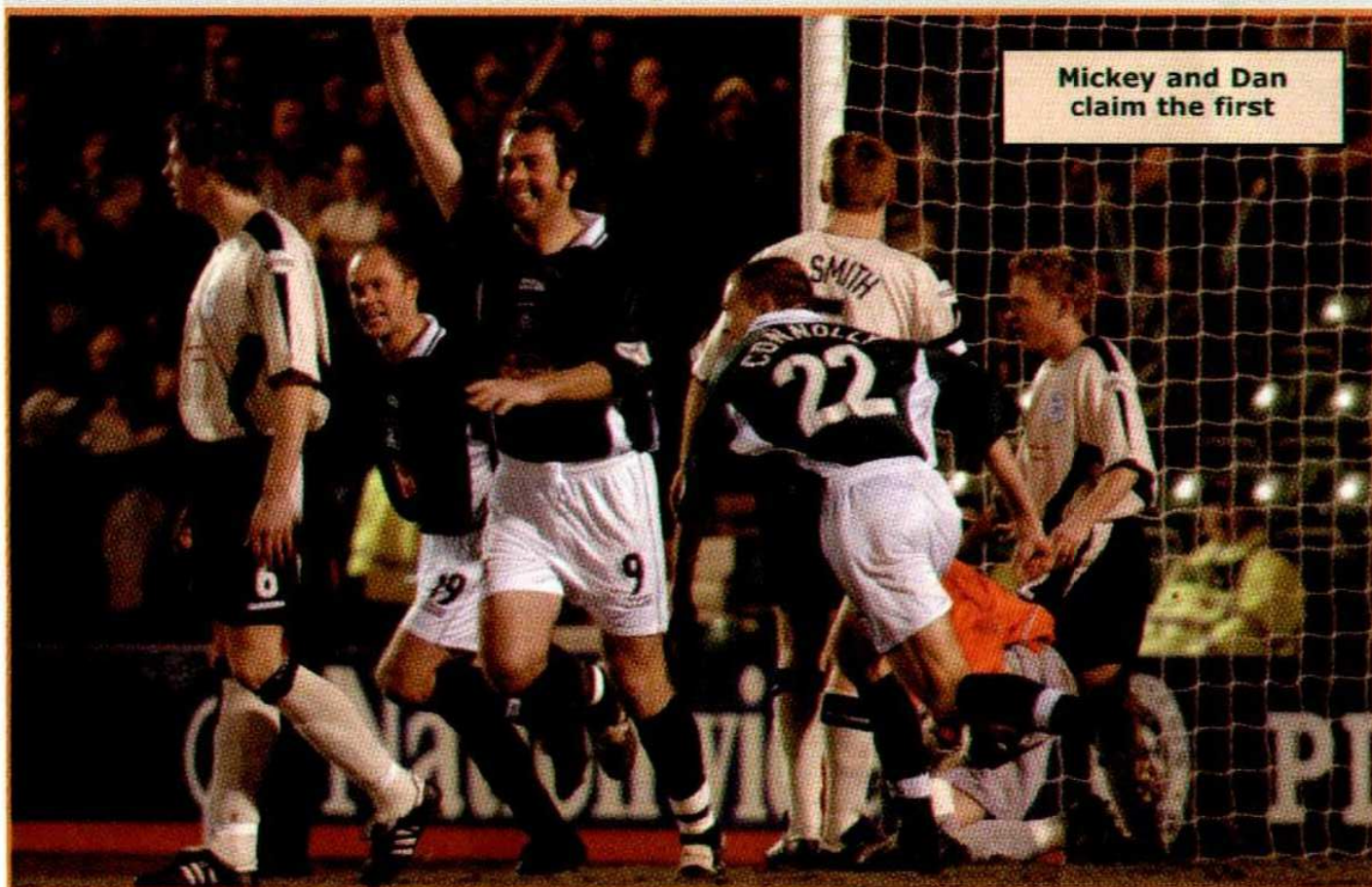

Mickey and Dan claim the first

PAUL Sturrock paid tributes to the old heads in the Argyle line-up after his final match in charge of the Pilgrims.

Veteran forward Mickey Evans opened the scoring in the eighth minute, and team captain Graham Coughlan finished off a stubborn Wednesday with 13 minutes to go as the Pilgrims maintained their course for promotion.

Sturrock admitted that Evans and vanguard partner Marino Keith – in for the injured Nathan Lowndes – had run Sheffield Wednesday ragged, and themselves into the ground, in the first half.

"The first-half performance was excellent," said Sturrock. "In the second half, we looked very leg-weary. The front two, who had obviously not trained or played at that tempo for a while – Mickey missing a couple of days' training, Dan not being

involved – definitely looked leg-weary.

"We needed the injection of [substitutes] Blair [Sturrock] and Hodgy [Lee Hodges] when they came on and I think I was maybe five minutes too late in doing it, but they were involved in the second goal.

"That's the pleasing thing, that we got the victory. Sheffield Wednesday made it very hard.

"They set their game-plan out to disrupt the flow of our game on the width and it worked the longer the game went on.

"With Mickey's presence in the air dwindling as the game went on, we couldn't get up the park to get around their box, and, to be fair, they've had a couple of

half-chance they maybe could have done better with.

"Dan put himself about, did all the right things, looked much better at linkage, had a bit of zest about him. I thought he and Mickey, in the first half, worked really good together, but as it wore on, they dropped those standards and it meant we couldn't go up the park and stay up the park."

Sturrock, however, was not able to separate the two players – and centre-back Graham Coughlan, who headed on Ian Stonebridge's corner which Evans and Keith followed up for the opening goal.

"They are all claiming it," he said, "so we'll have to wait and see. Cocko's claiming that Mickey's missed it and Dan's saying it wasn't over the line. We'll let video evidence sort it out over the next couple of days."

Sturrock picked the same

front midfield and front two as he had for Argyle's historic 3-1 victory at Hillsborough earlier in the season. He said: "I felt the six of them had played very well there as units and I felt Stoney [Ian Stonebridge] merited being on the pitch, with two goals in his last two games.

"He did okay, but I did feel there was too much running for him to do and he got tied up coming back the park, rather than running forward."

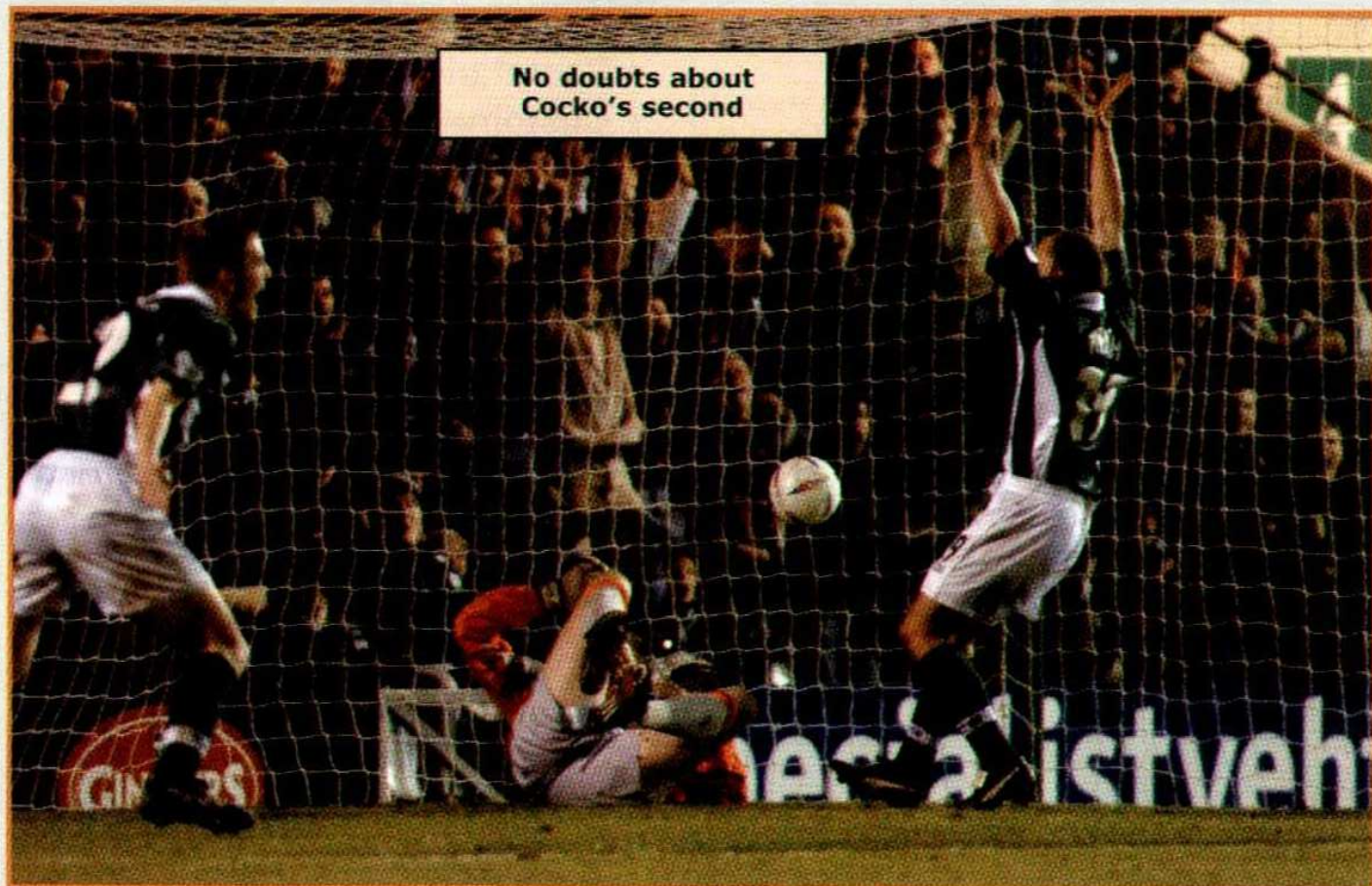

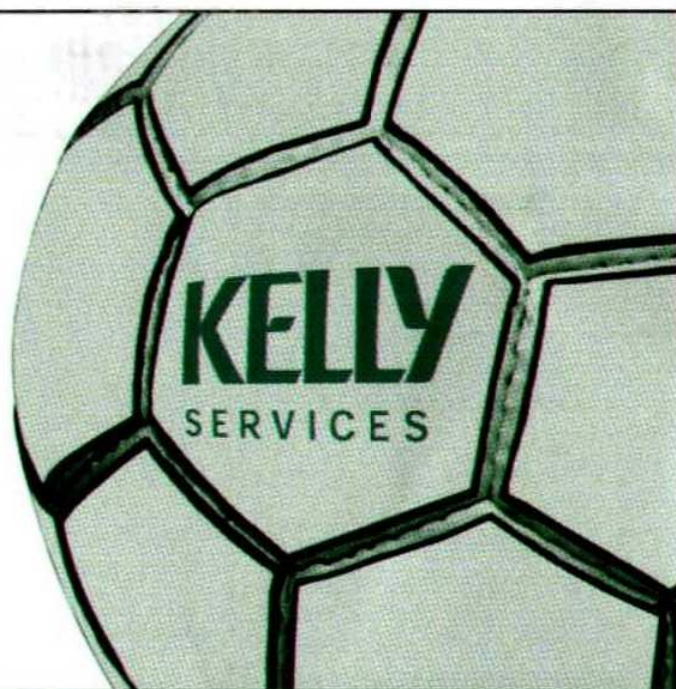
He said: "There are some youngsters that didn't taste this – your goalie, your two

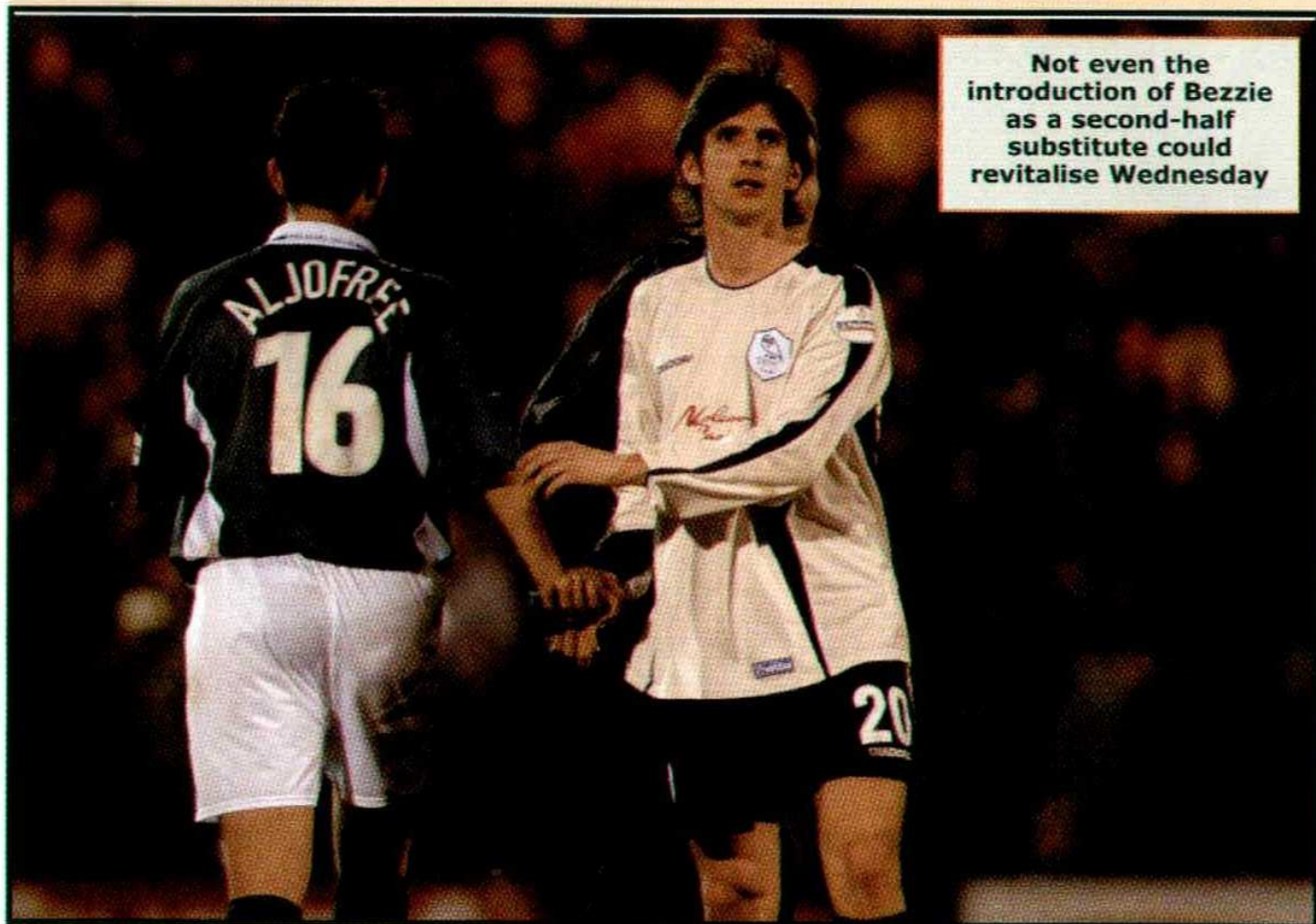

full-backs. If you look at that team, we are a very young side. Hasney Aljofree's not the oldest; Chuck [David Norris] is not what you would call old; Stevie [Adams] is a youngster and you've got Stoney. When you look at that, we're a very, very young team – hopefully they've got old heads on young bodies."

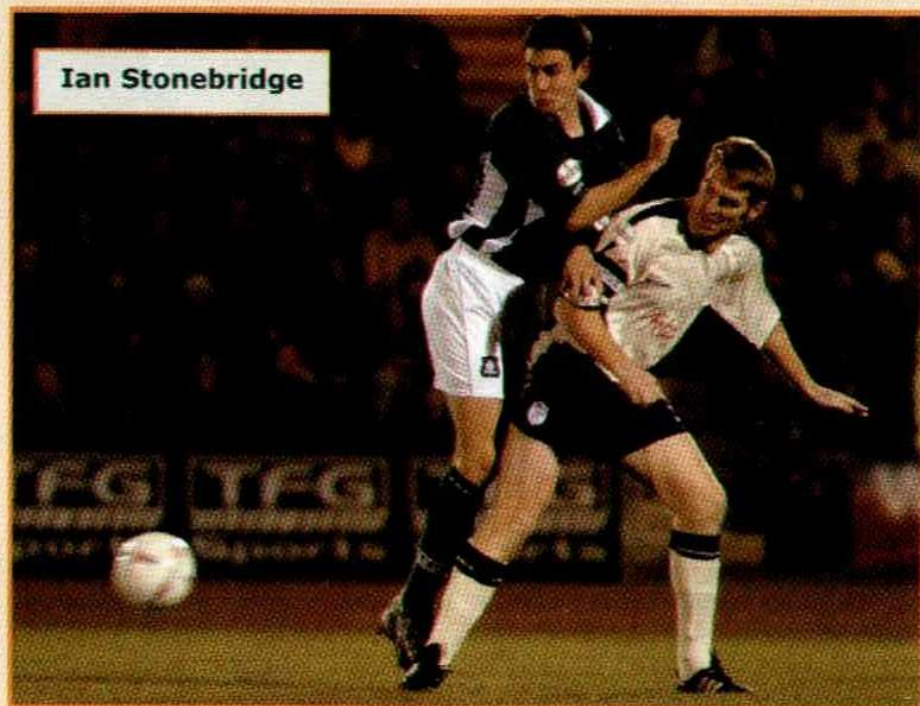
"I'm just hopeful they can get themselves down here for the last six games and we can get that kind of backing.

ARGYLE caretaker manager Kevin Summerfield paid fulsome tribute to the club's traveling support after the Pilgrims passed their post-Sturrock test with flying colours.

The point they won in a thrilling tussle with resurgent Notts County extended their lead at the top of the Nationwide Second Division to five points and was watched by 2,022 members of the Green Army - more than one quarter of the total crowd.

Summerfield, who took the reins after Paul Sturrock moved to Southampton two days before the game, was convinced his players responded to the massive backing.

"After the goings-on of the last week, they gave everything for the fans," he said. "The fans turned up and got behind us and gave us an absolutely massive lift before

the game. They've not stopped throughout the game and they've kept the lads ticking over.

"It's been a big week for the fans. That shows the mettle of the people, especially the away supporters. I would imagine there were a lot of people who traveled today who don't normally travel - that's their backing of the players, and the players responded to it."

Summerfield revealed that a smart piece of homework by Luke McCormick was responsible for preserving a point after the young goalkeeper saved a penalty controversially given by referee Neil Miller.

He said: "[Luke]'s got a habit that he always comes to us - we have all the

reports we have done on the opposition team - and he asks 'Have they got a penalty-taker and what do they do?'

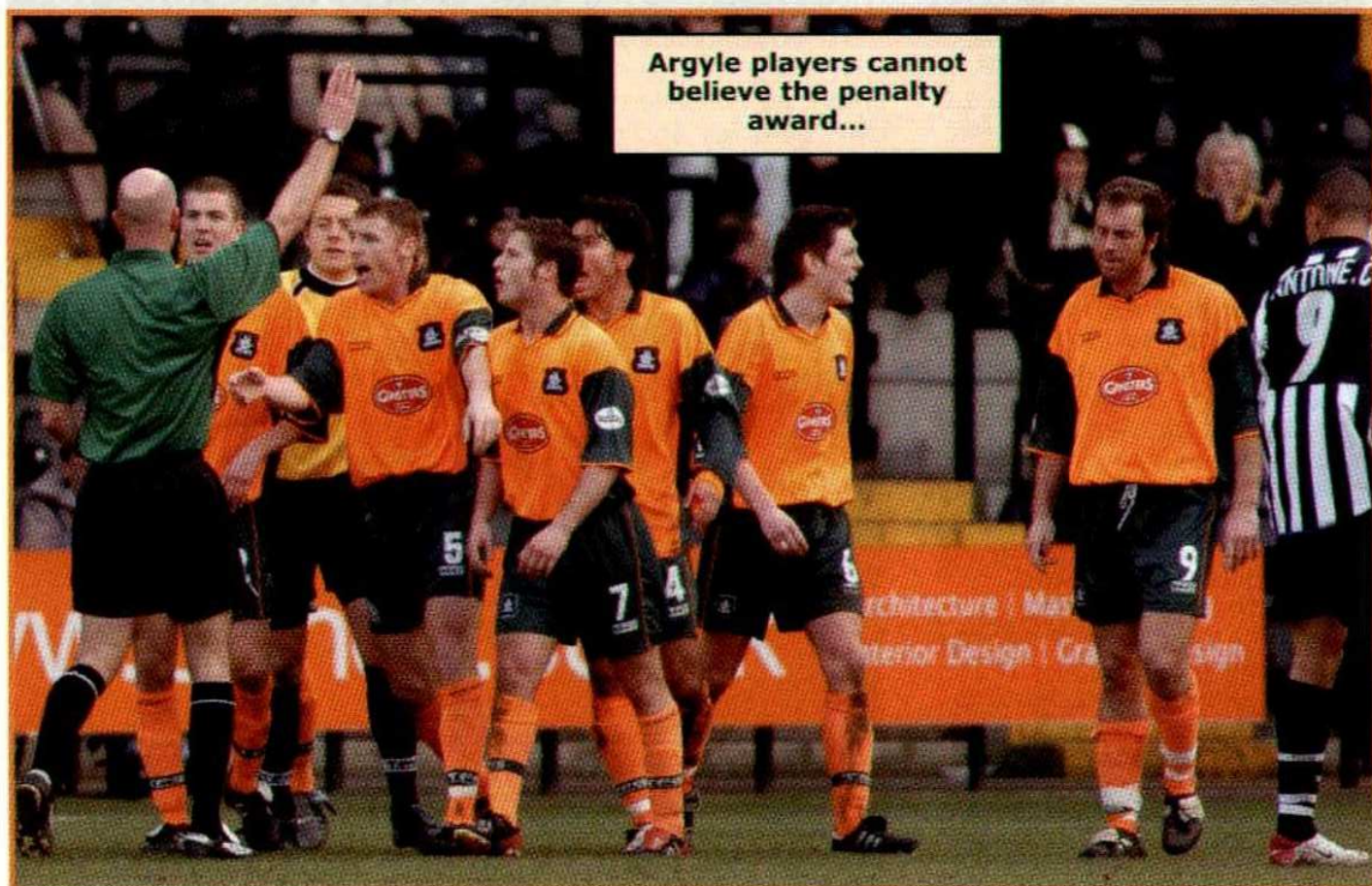
"So we dug the sheets out, showed him the sheets - 'low to your left'. So he knew where he was going.

"He'll always ask it. It's credit to the guys that come and do all the scouting for us, because these are the little things that they will pick up on. At the end of the day, that conceivably saved us a point."

Like most people in the ground, including County manager Gary Mills, Summerfield was baffled by Miller's decision to award a handball against Peter Gilbert when the Argyle defender clearly chested the ball. Miller was immediately surrounded by the entire Argyle team.

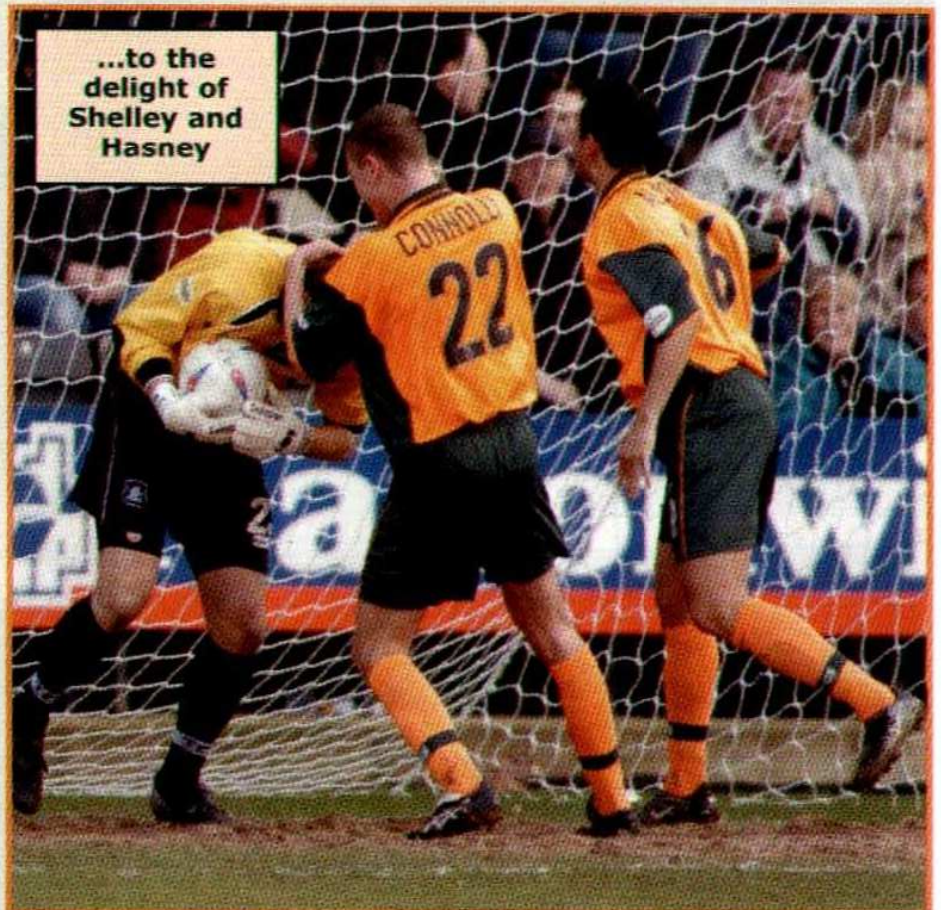

in the ground who gave it - and he was in the wrong position," said Summerfield. "Gary [Mills] said 'He's standing behind the player - he can't give it.' There's no way on earth.

"You can tell by the reaction of our lads. Our lads don't do that sort of thing they'll accept anything and not complain. That incensed the boys a little bit, so that gives an indication."

Summerfield's first team selection mirrored Sturrock's last. "They are the same set of lads," he said. "We don't look on them any different. They will all get their chance and it's up to them to play and keep in the team, come what may. That's been the secret of the whole of our success over the eight or nine months we've played already this season - competition.

"They have got to keep on their toes and, when they get

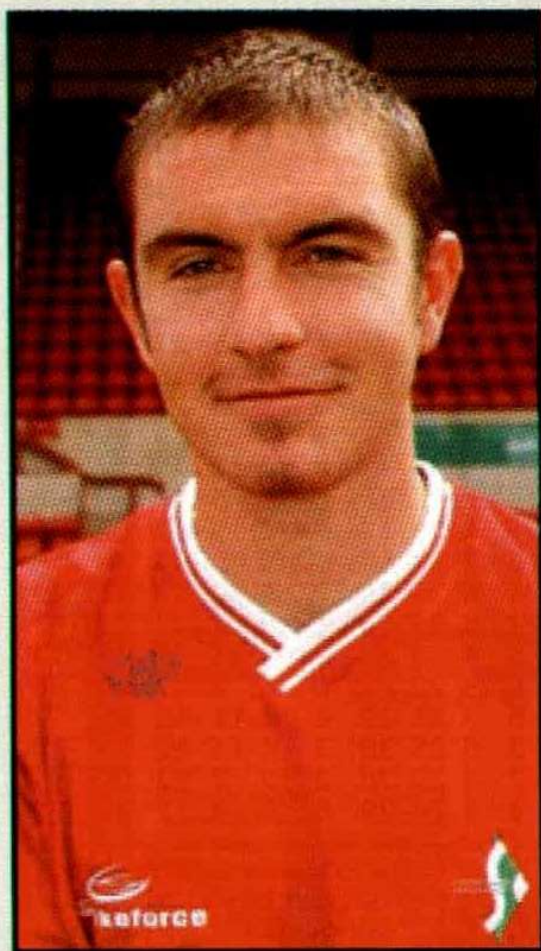


MINT: Paul Murray scores against QPR at Loftus Road

3 GRANT SMITH

JOINED Swindon last summer after being released by Sheffield United and was strongly recommended by United boss Neil Warnock. Played several games for Argyle on loan from Bramall Lane last season. Has had little chance to impress in the first team and a blight of niggling injuries. However, the Scot has continued to perform excellently in the reserve side and is now regular skipper of Town's second string eleven. When called upon for first team action he has only ever been sturdy and committed.

1 BART GRIEMINK

GIANT Dutch goalkeeper signed by Colin Todd on a free transfer in the summer of 2000. A former Dutch Under-21 international who spent a loan spell with the Robins before eventually joining the club. He came to English football in 1995 with Birmingham, playing in the 1995 League Cup semi-final. He then followed Barry Fry to Peterborough but lost his place to Mark Tyler. Started 2000-01 as first-choice but ended on the bench as Steve Mildenhall took his place. Following Mildenhall's departure to Notts County, he played every game last season and was a most consistent performer.

2 SEAN O'HANLON (on loan from Everton)

DEFENDER previously a trainee at Everton. The club is

attempting to sign the young right-back on a more permanent basis after some superb performances at the heart of the defence. Strong in the air, good on the ball and going forward, he has become an important member of the team.

4 MATTHEW HEWLETT

AN attacking central midfielder, the former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad early in his career, but a number of injuries hampered his flourishing career. Hewlett made more than 100 appearances for City, but left them to join Town on a Bosman in the summer of 2000. He was a regular for Colin Todd until being hit by injury again but was a regular last season until a reoccurrence of his knee injury kept him out for the majority of December and

January. Other than that he was pretty consistent and even managed to bag his first goal for the club.

5 ADRIAN VIVEASH (on loan to Kidderminster)

STARTED his career at Swindon and returned, after spells at Reading and Walsall, and a trial at Argyle, last summer. After starting the season as a regular choice on the left side of three centre-backs, he found himself on the bench following a poor run of games in the winter.

6 ANDREW GURNEY

SNAPPED up on a Bosman transfer in the summer of 2001. The former Torquay player crowned an impressive home debut performance against Tottenham with a long-range goal and proved to be one of King's best buys. Missed just four games last year, all through through suspension.

7 SAMMY IGOE

JOINED in the summer of 2003 from Reading and has brought a fresh enthusiasm to the Town side, quickly becoming a crowd favourite with his quick feet, skills and turn of pace. Capable of chipping in with goals, and making decisive contributions in the middle of the park, he is always a threat to the opposition. Scored with a free-kick on his league debut against Sheffield Wednesday on the opening day of the season.

9 SAM PARKIN

JOINED from Chelsea where his development was hindered by a glut of international stars. Announced his intentions at the County Ground with a devastating hat-trick against Barnsley on the opening day of last season. Strong on the ball and devastating in the box, he then went on to bag 26 in all competitions, finishing third in the Division's goal-charts.

10 STEFANI MIGLIORANZI





THE 22-year-old is a Brazilian born American, but holds an Italian passport: as a footballer, the genes do not come much better. What is more, Miglioranzi is versatile: he can play in defence or as a central midfielder and has impressed in the middle of Town's midfield. This campaign has seen the midfielder go from strength to strength at the heart of Town's midfield and after chipping in with his fair share of spectacular goals. A classy player who always looks calm and collected he has good body strength, which enables him to shrug off challenges.

11 DAVID DUKE

LEFT-SIDED midfielder who arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000. Appeared regularly in his first season with the Robins, combined well with Sol Davis down the Robins' left and is a good crosser of the ball. Duke

can also play at wing-back and consistency is the key for the Scotsman, who has shown glimpses of what he is capable of, especially when running at defenders with the ball. Was in and out of the side last season but with a bit of consistency, can make the left side his own following the departure of Sol Davis.

12 IAN HERRING

RIGHT-SIDED defender who earned a six-month contract after making his debut as a third-year scholar in April last season. A product of the Robins' youth set-up, he has also played on loan for Salisbury and Chippenham.

14 JONATHON STEVENSON

LIVE-WIRE young striking prospect signed his first professional forms in February 2001 with Leicester City. He then signed for Swindon after a recommendation from Foxes director of football

Dave Basset. With bags of pace and skill, he has proved to be a good summer addition to the squad and continues to develop into a hot prospect for the future.

15 ANDREW NICHOLAS

A FORMER Liverpool trainee who has appeared in 19 league games this season at the heart of the defence. A regular member of Liverpool's under-19s in 2003, his way to the first team was blocked and King snapped him up. With good height, and terrific pace and recovery, he has proved to be a valuable asset to the defensive line up this season. He also possesses a long throw which he claims is of the longest in the division.

16 RORY FALLON

A RECENT signing from Barnsley, the big striker made quite an impression against Town in the past two seasons, scoring on many occasions and catching the eye of Andy King. He joined Barnsley as a professional in 1999. He had just began to cement his place in the first team when he suffered a stress fracture of his foot at the end of February and it was not until the closing stages that he rejoined the first-team squad. King had become a keen admirer of the striker by that point and Town eventually agreed a fee to take him to Wiltshire. With Parkin and Mooney in such good form, he has found it difficult to gain many first-team chances.

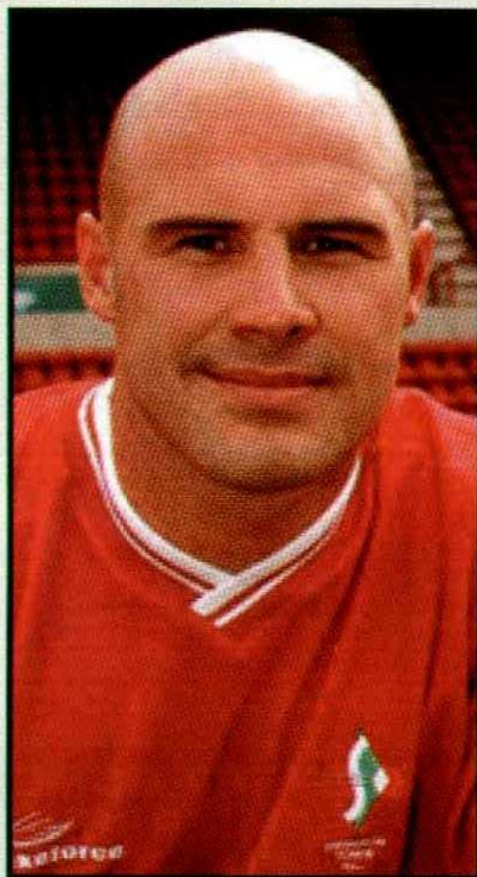
17 BRIAN HOWARD

Swindon Town's 10-Year Record

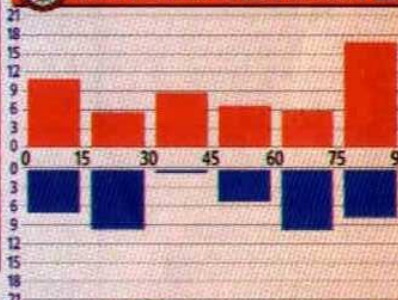

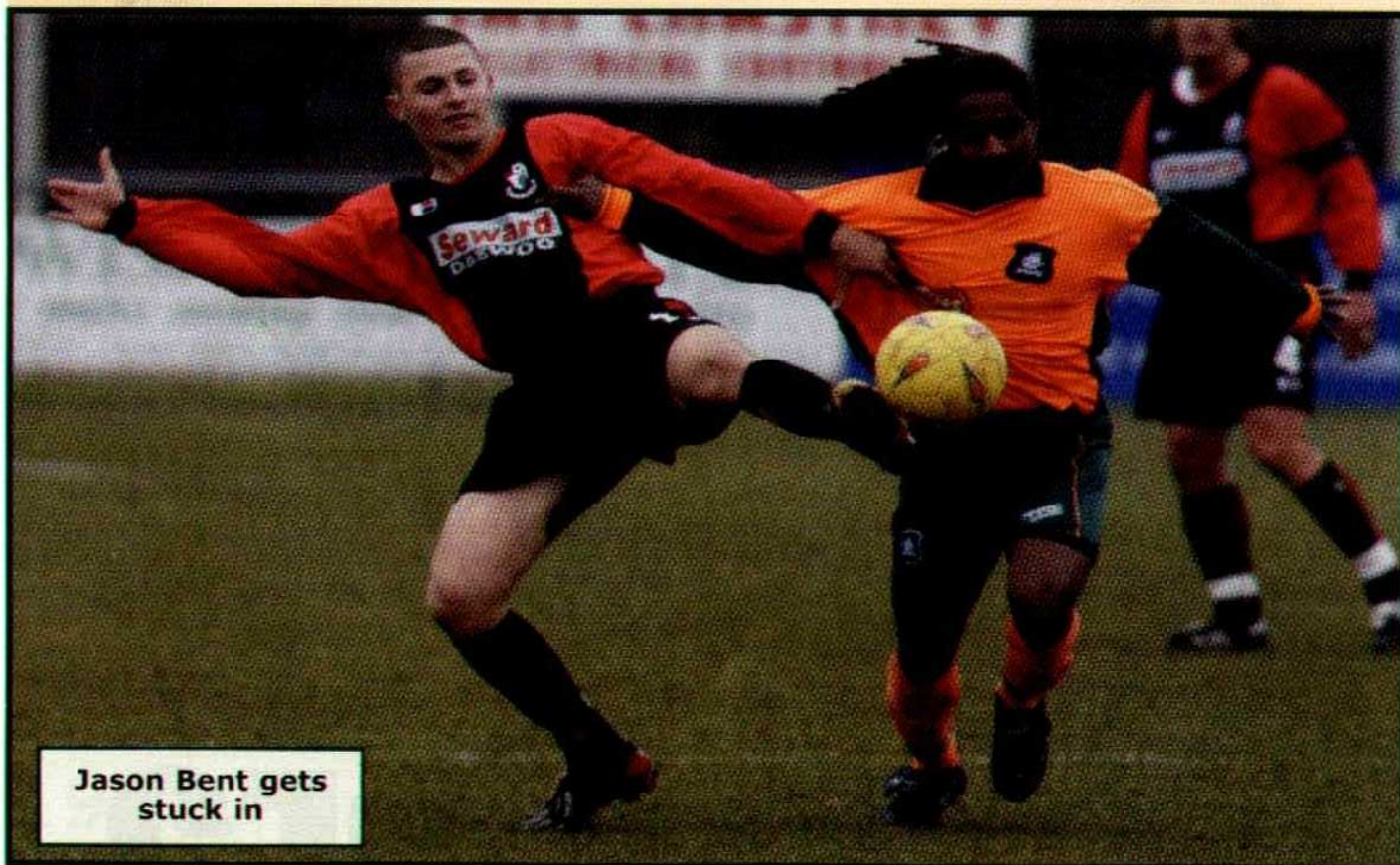

Argyle, who were up against a stronger Cherries outfit than the one they had demolished 6-0 at Home Park earlier this season, almost equalised when Lee Hodges's drive was pawed away by Scriven.

But the Cherries' stopper could do nothing about Capaldi's late leveller and was rooted to the spot as the midfielder's spectacular free-kick sailed past him.

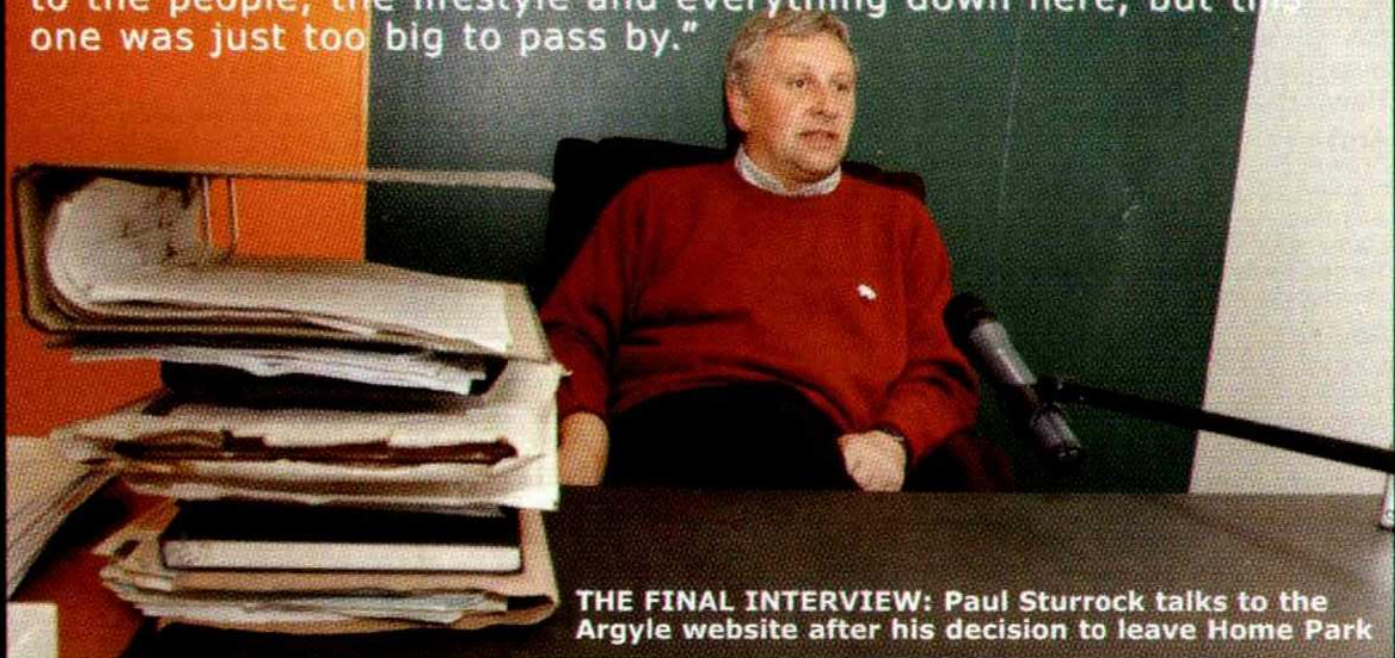

THE FINAL INTERVIEW: Paul Sturrock talks to the Argyle website after his decision to leave Home Park

WHEN former Dundee United manager Paul Sturrock arrived at Home Park in October 2000, Argyle were floundering like never before. Once a proud club with a solid reputation, years of mismanagement on and off the pitch had seen the Pilgrims slump to a regular mid-table slot in the basement league. Sturrock surveyed a squad going nowhere and quite literally ripped it apart.

Just 18 months later, Sturrock's new recruits had stormed to the championship with a staggering 102 points. 'Luggy' consolidated his efforts with a commendable top-ten finish in the Second Division last season, took the Pilgrims to top spot with 12 matches to go, and had cemented his place amongst the greatest managers in Argyle's history long before Southampton came calling last week.

He was forced to make a decision, or let the job go by, and those circumstances meant it was an offer he could not refuse.

The board, the players, the fans and those behind the scenes at Home Park helped turn the club around, but Sturrock was the catalyst that made it all happen.

The one day that everyone knew would come - but hoped against hope would not - turned out to be Thursday, March 4. Cheerio, Luggy, all the best, and thanks for starting us out on the road to a golden Green era.

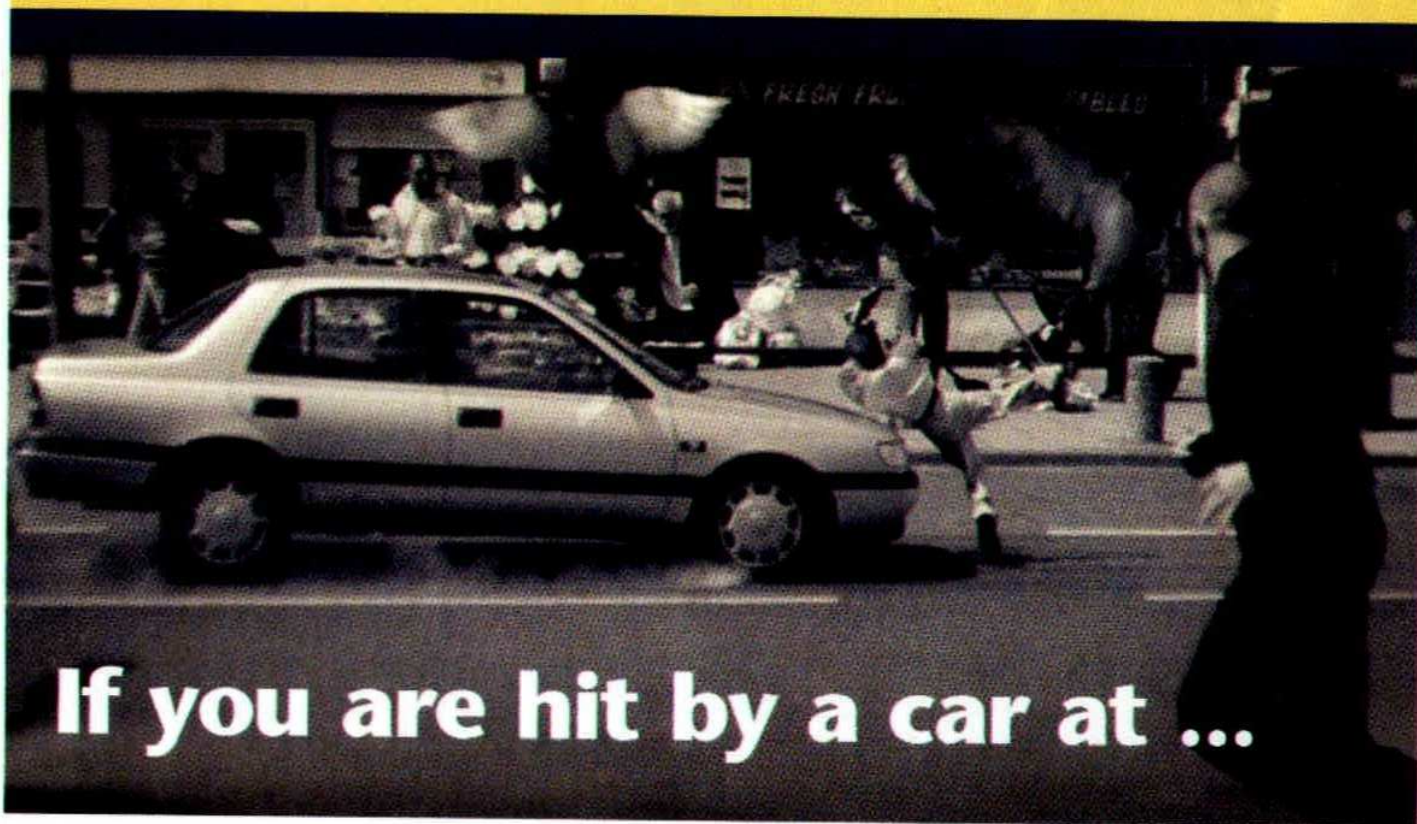

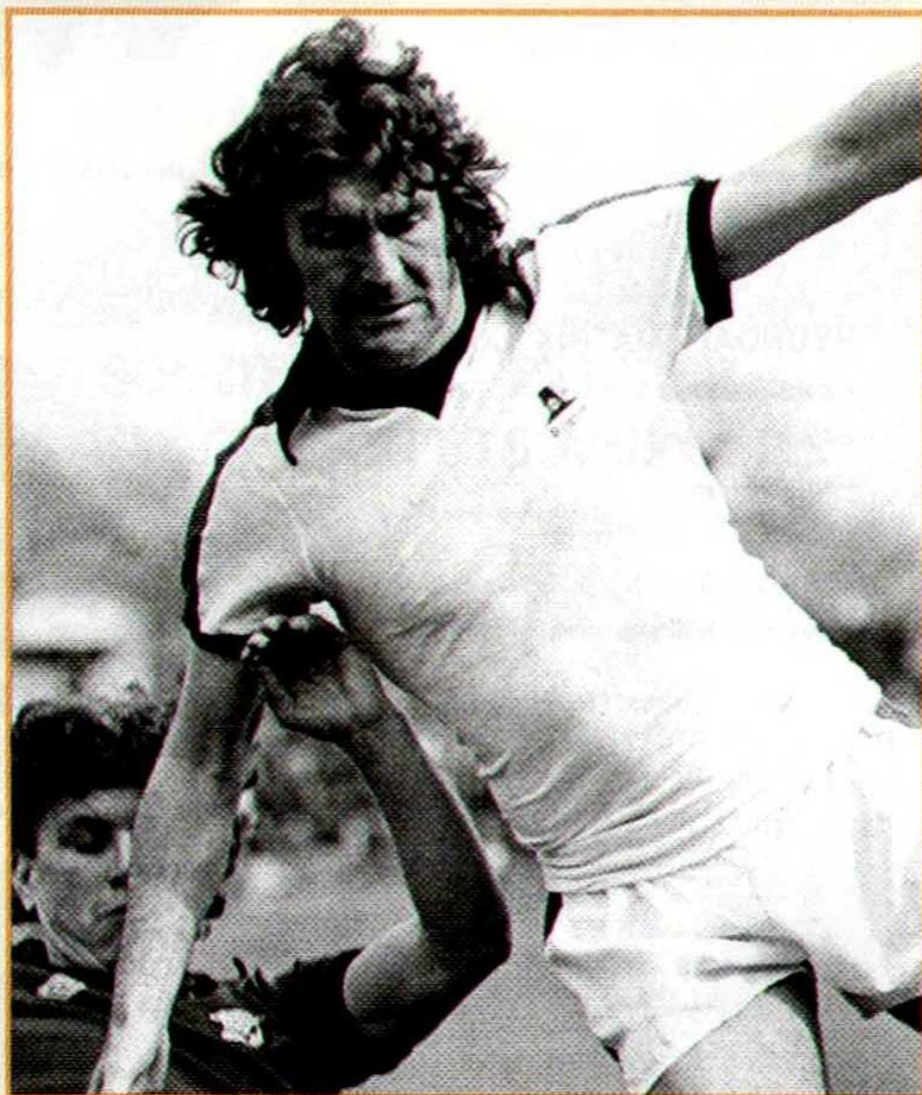

Watch this space.

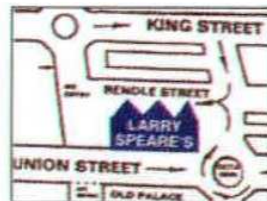

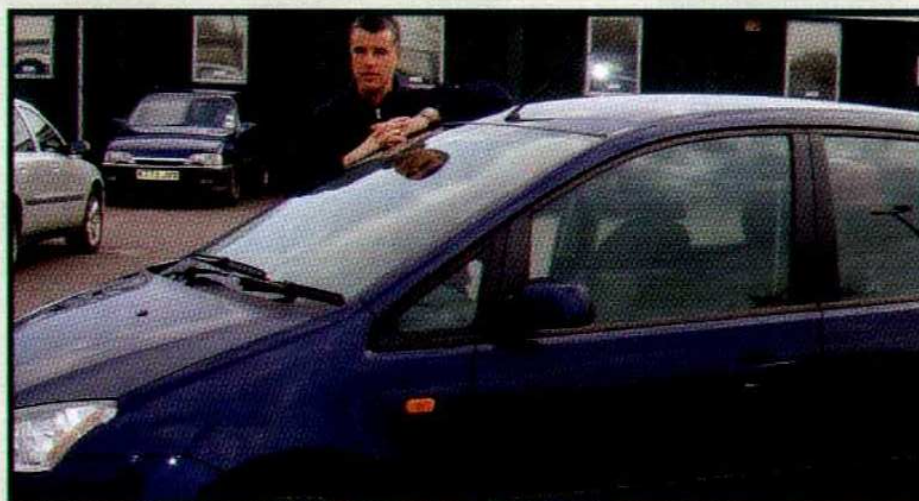

Preparing for Easter

SINCE the February half-term holiday, the coaching staff in the Community Department at Home Park have been continuing to fulfill the football coaching programme to the feeder primary schools to Tamarside Community College.

Joining these city winners will be representatives from primary schools in Cornwall and Devon, where we have been invited to carry out coaching sessions since last summer.

It is an exciting occasion for the youngsters, taking penalties against an Argyle Centre of Excellence goalkeeper with thousands watching. Each participant will receive a certificate and a medal, plus a trophy for the winner of each group which the school will hold for a year. This will be presented to them by an



Argyle player at the end of the tournament at half-time.

By Road

Exit the M1 at Junction 10 (signposted 'A1081 Luton (S)'), and, at the roundabout, turn right on to the A1081. Turn left at Junction 10A (the next roundabout, signposted 'Stockwood County Park, Mossman Collection') into London Road. Turn left at the next roundabout (signposted 'Ring Road, Bedford A6, Dunstable A505') onto the flyover. Go straight on for half a mile, and then, immediately before the roundabout, turn left into Dallow Lane. Turn right into Clifton Road. The ground is over the bridge at the end of the road.

By Rail

The closest station to the ground is Luton. The ground is some way from the station, and the route is not really very easy to follow, so a taxi is recommended but...follow signs to 'London Luton Airport, Railair Coach Link' down steps into Station Road, and turn right. Straight across Old Bedford Road into Mill Street, passing Job Centre on left. At T-junction by Pizza Palace, cross road and turn right. Follow road round, passing To Pigathki on left, and, before the roundabout, turn left through pedestrian area towards Sainsburys and the gents toilets. Turn left along dual carriageway and up the pathway. Keep on path until there is a roundabout below. Bear right on walkway to central ironwork pagoda and take first walkway down into Dunstable Road. First left to ground.

Car-parking

There is no parking at the ground, but there is plenty of street parking. Best to arrive early as the streets close to the ground get filled up very quickly. You will obviously be leaving your car at the mercy of the thieves, as with all grounds.
