
TREATMENT ROOM

Last Saturday's result will fade into the memory if we win tonight, so please keep up your fantastic support and help the players on to three vital points.





PROMOTION CAME THREE POINTS CLOSER AS TOWN **EXTENDED THEIR UNBEATEN RUN TO 11 GAMES WITH A** HARD FOUGHT 2-1 WIN OVER BATTLING BRENTFORD WRITES STEC SPORTS REPORTER SIMON COY.

Swindon took an early lead through Andy Gurney before his error gifted the Bees an equaliser against the run of play, however Sammy Igoe made sure of the point with a superb volleyed winner.

Brentford had the first meaningful attack when they won the first corner of the game after 7 minutes but the ball to the near post was headed behind for a goal kick.

Andy Gurney came close to scoring one of the goals of the season soon after when he let fly with a vicious

drive from fully 35 yards which fizzed narrowly wide.

In the 14th minute a confident looking Swindon took a deserved lead when Gurney bundled in a free kick from Howard following a flick on by Parkin.

Minutes later Sam Parkin robbed Somner and surged into the box but the recovering defender blocked his shot as he tried to curl the ball into the far corner.

Another good Town move involving Igoe and Howard saw Mooney released into the box but keeper Nelson was alert to the danger and raced off his line to block the ball from the onrushing striker.

Just before the half hour Brentford were level after a moment of indecision at the back by Gurney. The Town defender taking too long to clear was robbed by Jay Tabb who slipped the ball through to Ben May and he made no mistake from 12 yards.

Right on half time Tommy Mooney caused keeper Nelson to panic into a punch clear as the big number eight almost found himself on the end of a deflected Gurney drive.

Five minutes into the second half Rhys Evans was hurt as he collided with Matt Heywood when they both raced to meet a through ball under pressure from goal-scorer Ben May, but the Town keeper soon recovered and was able to carry on.


Shortly after Brentford almost took the lead after excellent work by Stewart Talbot on the right. He forced his way into the Town box before sliding a good ball across the face of the goal, but May mis-hit his shot and Evans was grateful to claim.

After 57 minutes a Town corner was cleared as far as Sean O'Hanlon who tried to strike a shot on the volley but didn't catch it cleanly and his effort flew high and wide.

Just after the hour a long Nicholas throw from the left was cleared to the edge of the box and Hewlett volleyed narrowly over. Two minutes later another long throw was nodded down by Parkin to Hewlett again who repeated his effort by again firing high.

After 73 minutes Brentford were unlucky when a snap shot from a corner struck Kevin O'Connor who blocked the goal-bound effort from his own team-mate.

With fifteen minutes left Andy King sent on Rory Fallon for Andy Nicholas and his first touch nearly resulted in Towns second goal as he headed goalwards from a Howard corner but Nelson made a superb save diving to the right to deny the Town substitute.

In the final ten minutes Swindon began to increase the tempo. A good ball from Duke was met by Parkin on the volley but he was unlucky to see his effort strike Mooney in the centre of the box.

With eight minutes later the pressure paid dividends as a long ball towards Mooney was headed out into the path of Sammy Igoe who struck a sweet volley past Nelson at the keepers near post from 12 yards.

A minute from time Brentford won a free-kick on the right edge of the Town box, which was well cleared by Mooney as the Bees strikers lined up looking for the equaliser.

Although not as convincing as recent performances Town hung on well to record their seventh consecutive home win and pick up yet another valuable three points on the push for promotion.





MATCH ACTION PLYMOUTH ARGYLE 2 SWINDON TOWN 1





A BIZARRE SECOND SEALED VICTORY FOR TOP OF THE TABLE PLYMOUTH AFTER **GURNEY SAW RED WRITES** STFC SPORTS REPORTER SIMON COY.

The Pilgrims took an early lead through Marino Keith before Gurney went for an early bath. A controversial own goal by Rhys Evans led to a furious final few minutes as Mooney narrowed the deficit but the league leaders held on for all three points.

Shortly after the start Town conceded an early free kick when Sammy Igoe handled 25 yards from goal. David Friio played the ball short to skipper Paul Wotton who fired a long range shot high and wide.

After neither team had managed to take advantage of the early exchanges Plymouth went ahead in the 11th minute when Marino Keith scuffed a weak shot low past Rhys Evans from 10 yards following a flick on by Mickey Evans.

Town began to pressurise looking for an equaliser and Sammy Igoe was unlucky with an excellent drive from 18 yards which shaved the cross bar.

Shortly after Nicholas sent in a superb cross to the back post where Mooney stretched to head back into the centre of the box but no-one was on hand to finish the move.

Ten minutes from half-time another Town corner swung in by Igoe was met by Parkin but his header at the near post was sent high into the stand.

Just before the end of the first period Argyle nearly increased the lead as Norris surged into the Town box and shot from 8 yards but an alert Evans saved well with his feet.

At the other end a good run by Howard found Sam Parkin in the centre of the box. He controlled well, turned and fired from close range but the keeper did well to get a hand and turn the ball behind off the post.

Plymouth continued to press in the early part of the second half as Town struggled to create their usual flowing football. After 52 minutes Howard tried to feed the ball into the feet of Mooney following a good run but again found his way blocked by a resolute Plymouth backline.


Another good run by Howard down the left in the 57th minute saw the Town midfield maestro send in a good early cross causing confusion in the Argyle box as Coughlan cleared almost out of the hands of his own keeper.


In the 66th minute an excellent run by Plymouth substitute Lowndes ended when his pull back to Norris was

Argyle keeper McCormick did well to punch clear a superb corner by Brian Howard from under his bar and his defence helped him out as the ball dropped to clear the danger.

Disaster struck with fifteen minutes remaining as Andy Gurney was sent off by referee Walton for a professional foul as he was deemed to have hauled back Lowndes on the edge of the Town box as the two players tussled for the ball. A furious Gurney vented his anger on the assistant referee as he was shepherded away by Malcolm Crosby. The resulting free kick was charged

down by substitute Duke. With a man down and playing in a 3-3-3 formation Town tried to push forward against the odds. However, with eight minutes left a controversial and bizarre goal saw Argyle double their lead. Under pressure Matt Heywood passed the ball back to Rhys Evans who inadvertently picked up the ball. The referee indicated an indirect free kick and Mickey Evans took it quickly. With no Town defender within ten yards he played a sidefooted shot towards the net which struck Rhys Evans before nestling in the back of the net. Arguments will run and run as to whether the goal scorer was Mickey Evans or an own goal by his namesake in the Town goal.

Within minutes Town had pulled a goal back when Igoe crossed towards Mooney whose superb diving header was well saved by the keeper but he reacted well and bravely bundled home from close range. Town





pressed forward looking for an injury time equaliser in a frenetic finish to the game and almost levelled when a long throw from Duke dropped to O'Hanlon in the box but his sidefoot effort trickled agonisingly wide of the right hand post.

Swindon desperately tried to get back on level terms as time ran out but the Plymouth defence held firm against a late barrage and the referee blew to end Towns long unbeaten run and cement Argyles positions at the top of the table.

A Day In The Life Of... Chris Adams Club Photographer

Perhaps the defining image of the Town's season so far is the stunning photo of Tommy Mooney featured on the cover of both the Notts County programme and the Merchandise Catalogue. Eyes closed and head back, water flows across his face and down his shirt screaming power and strength, coolness and calm in the heat of battle - the epitome of all that is the best in Swindon Town.

Living life through a lens, official Club photographer Chris Adams, 20, is the man whose skilled eye captures the images before you every week.

University student Chris has been in his role for two years while he also studies for a BSc in Geology at Cardiff. Having begun taking one or two shots at home games, the club liked his work and soon after appointed him as official photographer.

Amazingly, Chris's interest in photography only emerged in the last four years through his love of sport. "I like to be able to capture an instance in time such as the emotions that people go through".

Chris has been a Town fan since the age of seven. Although he lives in

Cheltenham his Dad, Jim, hails from Swindon and is responsible for his son's love of the Club. Amiable, enthusiastic and always helpful Chris does his work with a smile on his face and clearly loves what he does, "I would like to thank everyone at STFC for giving me the opportunity to work for the club. It's the best job in the world."

On A Matchday Saturday...

10.00am - 11.30am -

I get up early and check my camera gear, recharging batteries, cleaning lenses and picking clothing to suit the weather. It's surprising how cold you can get sat on the side of the pitch, particularly in the rain!

11.30am - 1.30pm -

I leave home in Cardiff for the station, past the Millennium Stadium, where I hope we'll be on the May 30th, and hop on the 12.30 to London Paddington. An hour later I meet my Dad Jim on the way to the ground.

1.30pm - 3.00pm -

After walking to the stadium I'll meet the programme team in the office and chat with Media And Communications Manager Chris Tanner about the focus of the next few programmes including which players we need pictures of during the game. I then grab any pictures of people we need for programme articles such as fans and club employees. Finally there is usually a presentation on the pitch or the Player of the Month Award to cover.

3.00pm - 5.00pm -

THE ILLUSTRATION ABOVE IS THE CENTRE SPREAD OF "THE MARINER" THE GRIMSBY TOWN PROGRAMME FOR THE MATCH WITH SWINDON TOWN IN OCTOBER 1961. IT COST 3D AND CONTAINED THE USUAL CLUB NOTES AND SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES.

The former drew attention to the fact that Ralph Hunt and Fred Jones would both be playing against their old teams. Harry Ditton's Soccer Topics contained the suggestions that the rules should be amended to prevent the ball being out of play while in flight, thus preventing referees blowing up as a shot headed into goal or a corner being ruled a goal kick if it curled out of play. The programme also contained a Quiz, crossword and a blank page for Half Time scores. Most unusual was the fact that a page and a half was given up to a diagram and explanation of parking arrangements around Blundell Park.


Both teams lined up as above. This meant that Swindon made one change from their previous match Ken Mcpherson getting the nod over Cliff Jackson for the number nine shirt which had been worn by Jack Smith who had been injured in the previous match. The only goal of the game of the game came five minutes from the end. Ralph Hunt had scored 33 goals for Grimsby just two seasons earlier but in this game it was his goal that proved his former clubs undoing. On three previous occasions he had headed or shot wide but with the ball just eight yards out he made no mistake. Bert Head attributed much of the success to wing halves Keith Morgan and Bobby Woodruff. "Our wing halves have been going up too much but last night we were much tighter," said the Robins manager.

The game was to be one of just two home defeats for A Grimsby side that would win promotion at the season's end along with Portsmouth. Brian

Keeble and Keith Jobling were ever present for them in defence while up front Ron Rafferty also appeared in every game and headed the scorers with 34, twenty more than the next highest scorer Cliff Portwood Swindon had to wait one more season for their promotion but only three of the players in the line up for this match were not around at the County Ground to enjoy it. Sam Burton decided to hang up his gloves at the end of the season which saw him set a record for most League appearances by A Swindon keeper that still stands today. Ken Jones league career also came to an end at the end of this season while Ralph Hunt was transferred to Port Vale having scored 15 League goals for Town in just 21 appearances. Only the week before a goalless draw with Grimsby at the County Ground broke a run in which he had scored in five consecutive games. A prolific goal scorer over 12 seasons in League football his career and life were brought to an all too early end when he was killed in a car crash in 1964.



In front of their own fans Grimsby have been involved in some pretty exciting and indeed high-scoring encounters. They have whipped Barnsley 6-1 and Chesterfield 4-0 and drew 3-3 while also running in 3-2, 3-1 and 2-0 victories.

On the road they have crashed 8-1 at Hartlepool, got walloped 6-0 at Oldham, were thumped 5-1 at Port Vale, lost 4-1 at bottom club Wycombe and succumbed to a 3-0 reverse at Wrexham.

Inconsistency without doubt has been in evidence all through the campaign and this has to stop (said club chairman Paul Furneaux). With games running out, at least half-a-dozen teams are hovering on the brink of relegation and Grimsby Town are one of them. The Mariners know what is required. They still have to play fellow strugglers Stockport County, Brentford and Chesterfield but they also have to contend with promotion and play-off-chasing Queen's Park Rangers, Bournemouth and Hartlepool United and of course the Robins!

Veteran Paul Groves began the season as the club's player-manager. Then the former Wolves and Coventry City defender Graham Rodger (an FA Cup winner in 1987) took over as caretaker-boss at Blundell Park before the appointment of Nicky Law last month. He, too, is an experienced campaigner and knows full well that from now on in it's going to be one almighty battle if the Mariners are to avoid the drop.



THE GAFFER

NICKY LAW was appointed as Grimsby's manager last month. A former defender who started his career with Arsenal and then served, in turn, with Barnsley, Blackpool, Plymouth Argyle, Notts County, Scarborough, Rotherham United, Chesterfield and Hereford United, he made almost 600
League and Cup appearances
during his 18-year playing
career. London-born in 1961,
he had been in charge of
Chesterfield (2000-02) and
Bradford City (since January
2002) before being replaced
by Bryan Robson at The Pulse
Stadium last year.

DANGERMAN PHIL JEVONS




Striker PHIL JEVONS - Out of favour earlier in the season with club chairman Peter Furneaux over pay, who has responded with some excellent displays, especially of late, and rammed in a fourtimer when the Mariners crushed Barnsley at the tail-end of last month. A Liverpudlian, born in August 1979, he played in eight Premiership games for Everton at the start of his career before joining the Mariners for £150,000 in July 2001. He has also had a loan spell with Hull City (September-October 2002) and to date has netted more than 20 goals. One pen picture last year described him as 'a lively striker' and the Robins;' defenders will certainly have to be on their guard to this evening. If not he" will pounce - just like he did to great effect against the Tykes!

DID YOU KNOW?

- The Mariners are the only club to have so far won League matches both at home and away by a 6-5 scoreline. They defeated WBA at The Hawthorns in 1932 and Burnley at Blundell Park in 2002.
- Grimsby Town have had 16 managerial changes since 1971 and among those who have been in charge of the Mariners include Mike Lyons, Alan Buckley, Kenny Swain and Lennie Lawrence.

LAST MEETING HERE

The last time the Mariners played a League game here at The County Ground was some four years ago, in February 2000, when a crowd of 5,784 saw them beat the Robins 1-0, thanks to a late goal from winger Lee Ashcroft. Unfortunately the Robins were relegated to the Second Division at the end of the season.



CRAIG ARMSTRONG

Out of form of late but still an important member of the Mariners' squad he's now with his eighth club, having previously served with Nottingham Forest, Burnley, Watford and Sheffield Wednesday among others. A left-sided midfielder, he has over 250 career appearances under his belt.

DARREN BARNARD

Welsh international midfielder (18 caps) he began with Chelsea and played for Reading, Bristol City and Barnsley before joining Grimsby in 2002.

CHRIS BOLDER

21 year-old midfielder from Hull who has been at Blundell Park three years following his release by the Tigers.

MICHAEL BOULDING

In his second spell with the club, having returned after assisting Aston Villa in 2002, he's a pacy winger who has also played for Mansfield Town and Sheffield United.

STUART CAMPBELL

Town's skipper and central midfielder formerly with Leicester and Birmingham, he's been at the club four years and has 200 career appearances to his credit.

STACY COLDICOTT

Midfielder who started his career with West Brom and had a loan spell with Cardiff before joining Grimsby for whom he's made 200 appearances.

TONY CRANE

He may well be missing tonight, having been sent-off right at the end of the Mariner's 6-1 drubbing of Barnsley a fortnight or so ago. He was signed from Sheffield Wednesday and is a former England youth international midfielder.

25 year-old ex-Arsenal, Crystal Palace, Portsmouth (almost 100 games) and Brentford right wing-back who joined the Mariners earlier this season.







Whatever the result, I'm sure it was a fantastic day with the reds doing their best to outsing the greens.


But that was then (well it will be by the time you read this) and with 11 games to play, the season is bubbling up to a terrific climax.




All Soccer Centres are very busy working through their structured programme. One topics we get the kids to practice is turning on the ball. There are many different types of turns, these include the drag-back, the stop turn and the famous cryuff turn. For this topic, we have Swindon's number ten Stefani Miglioranzi.

Picture One

This shows Stef taking the skills we have practiced into a match situation. Here Stef is producing the dragback. He is in a tight situation with two defenders on him. Stef then drags the ball across his body, changing direction and tricking the defender, still keeping his body in the way so he is protecting the ball at all times. As he drags the ball across his body he then pushes the ball into space and accelerates away from defenders.

Stef says: "There are lots of tricks and skills players use in the modern game. These are exciting to watch and good to practice. It is important to practice all these skills as it helps you trick and lose defenders."






WHO WINS? YOU DECIDE!

ASK THE FAN SITTING NEXT TO YOU WHAT THEY BELIEVE THE REASON FOR TOWN'S CLIMB UP THE TABLE IS, AND THEY'LL PROBABLY TELL YOU IT'S LARGELY DOWN TO THE POTENT PARTNERSHIP OF TOMMY 'THE GUN' MOONEY AND 'SUPER SAMMY' PARKIN. OK, THIS MAY NOT BE STRICTLY TRUE, AFTER ALL IT'S A SQUAD'S CUMULATIVE EFFORT, ALONG WITH THE HARD WORK OF THE TRAINING STAFF THAT **ACHIEVES POSITIVE** RESULTS. YET TOGETHER THE DUO HAVE NOTCHED 35 GOALS BETWEEN THEM IN ALL COMPETITIONS: THAT'S MORE THAN HALF OF TOWN'S TOTAL FOR LAST SEASON AND YOU'LL FIND STRUGGLE TO FIND A BETTER PARTNERSHIP IN THE DIVISION.

IN FACT, YOU'D HAVE TO GO AS FAR BACK AS 1995/96 TO FIND A SIMILARLY LETHAL PARTNERSHIP AT THE COUNTY GROUND (AND WE KNOW WHAT HAPPENED THAT YEAR...) WHEN WAYNE ALLISON, STEVE FINNEY AND PETER THORNE NOTCHED 39 GOALS. WHICH GOT US THINKING, JUST HOW GOOD ARE MOONEY AND PARKIN? **NICK JUDD DUSTED OFF HIS** HISTORY BOOKS, GOT OUT THE CALCULATOR AND WENT IN SEARCH OF THE MOST PROLIFIC STRIKE PARTNERSHIP TO GRACE THE RED AND WHITE.



When asked to compile a feature on Town's greatest ever strike partnerships, I must admit to feeling somewhat overwhelmed. After all, what makes a good partnership? Goals alone or does success (in terms of promotion or cups won) come into it? Not only that, but Swindon has spawned a number of lethal partnerships in its history, what if I left one out? With this in mind. I asked as many people for their views and what you'll find over the following pages are the opinions of others wrapped into one convenient list. If you disagree, why not tell us who you would have included/excluded...

Parkin had proved his worth to the Town side by notching 26 goals in his first season, an incredible return given that King paid just £50,000 for his services. The extent of the bargain will become evident the more you read this piece. The problem for King was, if he failed to find the net Town didn't look like scoring at all and so when Mooney arrived in the summer, there were more than few raised eyebrows around the division. Mooney's track record speaks for itself. A career embracing 14 years, eight clubs and more than 130 goals he seemed like the perfect foil for Parkin's bourgeoning talent. And so it proved, after a blank debut against Sheffield Wednesday, the dynamic duo both struck away at Southend in the Carling Cup and the duo haven't looked back. Mooney's never-say-die attitude and thunderous shooting accuracy compliments Sam's ability to play with the ball at his feet and together, they've formed one of the most prolific partnerships in the country. With 11 games to go, the duo described by King as 'awesome and the best in the division without doubt" have the potential to break all kinds of records. Let's just hope they'll be doing the same in Division One next season...

Unfortunately other recent favourites such as Danny Invincibile, Eric Sabin,

Guiliano Grazioli, Steve Cowe and Gary Alexander have failed to qualify for our list of all-time greats, but upon reaching season 1998/99 and the pairing of Iffy Onoura and George Ndah. A season earlier the duo had notched just two goals between them in 20 appearances, hardly inspiring form for the ensuing campaign! That was what made their combined performance a year later so tremendous, however, with Onoura notching 20 league goals in 43 appearances, Ndah 11 in 41. As a partnership their style of play couldn't be more contrasting. Ndah the exciting, dynamic and quick attacker that loved to run at defenders, Onoura the target man who scored most of his goals with his head. Unfortunately their fortuitous form was enough to see them move on to bigger and better things the following season, with Ndah joining Wolves and Onoura Gillingham.

In 1996 Town enjoyed a prolific threepronged attack with Wayne The Chief' Allison and Peter Thorne lining up alongside one of my own favourite players, 'There's only one' Stevie Finney. Allison had arrived from Bristol City ahead of the 1995/96 season with a lot to prove. Previous performances for the rival Robins against the Town had caused many Townies to consider him a poor acquisition, yet his powerful presence; coupled together with some excellent ball skills (much like Parkin) and the ability to finish under pressure led him to notch 20 goals in his first season. The fact that he helped lead Town to promotion in his first season was aided by the presence of Thorne and Finney. Another expensive buy of £200,000 (an amazing outlay when you consider Parkin cost just £50,000), Thorne became an instant crowd favourite, notching 11 goals in just 20 games, complimenting the 16 (12 in the league) from the boots (mainly his right one!) of Steve Finney. Thorne's only downside was his susceptibility to injury, while Finney failed to

reproduce the same form in Division One a year later. He was subsequently sold to Chester, while Thorne, who proved consistent in his goalscoring, joined Stoke in 1997 after a tribunal: their names forever etched in our memories.


A year before Town's promotion to Division One in 1996, Thorne had contributed to a blossoming partnership between himself, Jan 'The Man' Aage Fjortoft and Keith Scott. Again, like chalk and cheese in their approach to the game, the unlikely duo hit 36 goals between them. Fjortoft joined the club during Town's season in the spotlight from Rapid Vienna, but it wasn't until a year later than he really started scoring goals on a regular basis. The Norwegian striker, having bagged 12 goals in the latter stages of his first season, and having given birth to the infamous 'aeroplane' celebration, Fjortoft returned at the beginning of the 94/95 campaign having appeared in the World Cup Finals in America (only the second Town player to have played in the Finals at that time). His form continued where it had left off and 26 strikes (16 in the league) weren't enough to prevent a second consecutive relegation. Keith Scott, who somehow managed to keep adding his name to the score-sheet despite looking shattered aka Chris Waddle, added 12 goals to his tally having scored Town's first winning goal in the Premiership season against QPR a year earlier.

Fjortoft's arrival in 1993 effectively ended Craig Maskell's run in the side upfront, while Davie Mitchell had already left for pastures new when he invoked a clause in his contract to move to Turkey in the summer of '93. A year earlier the duo had played an integral part in taking Town up to the top flight, with Maskell playing alongside the Jeremy Beadle look-a-like on the first day of the season against Sunderland having signed from Reading (with Tom Jones moving in the opposite direction). Maskell

scored 22 goals in 36 league appearances, including a thunderbolt in the play-off final against Leicester. Mitchell was equally as effective, revelling in the lead role following Duncan Shearer's departure to Blackburn. Mitchell scored 16 league goals including a devastating hat trick in the 6-4 'ding-dong' Birmingham City at St Andrews.

Now we go back to my first season as a Town fan and the partnership of Duncan Shearer and Steve White. The season was 1991/92, the club had been promoted, demoted and reinstated before the prolific Shearer/Chalkie combo notched 47 goals (32 in the league), that despite Shearer leaving before the end of the season in March to join Blackburn (where, amazingly, he was deployed on the bench). Shearer was prolific, bagging an average of more than one goal per game while White, an unconventional striker to say the least (with shorts pulled up to his armpits and elbows as sharp as razors), managed the same ratio. Both were huge legends at the club, White staying to play his part in the play-off final of '93, Shearer moving on to coach in his native Scotland.

Moving back to before my time, the late eighties in fact, Town enjoyed 34 goals during the 1987/88 season from the boots (and heads) of Jimmy Quinn and Dave Bamber. The club were on a high following their promotion from Division Two the previous season.



Quinny had already left and re-joined the Town, but it was during his second spell at the County Ground that he joined Bamber (a steal at just £15,000 from Portsmouth) in a partnership that would go on to secure 49 goals in all competitions. Of those, 13 in the league came from Bamber, although it was his tomfoolery in the box that contributed more to Quinn's tally. Bamber was an expert in gaining the odd spot-kick! Quinn was appreciative of Bamber's efforts, scoring 21 goals (a goal every two games) in a league campaign that saw Town finish twelfth. Quinn's goals eventually forced Leicester City to propose a bid of £210,000, which, despite the best efforts of Lou Macari to persuade him to stay, was eventually accepted. Unfortunately Bamber moved on to pastures new too and when he joined Watford in June 1988, Town were forced to employ a new strike force.

The 1985/86 season saw another 34 goals from two Town players, this time it was the turn of 'Super' Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon whose, efforts contributed the winning of the Division Four Championship. Perhaps when making your decision on who was Town's most successful partnership, Gordon's mullet should be taken into consideration. The lad with the flowing locks notched 16 league goals which, when added together with Henry's 18, made for a successful partnership.


Henry, a local lad, finished the season as top scorer - not bad for a player that could also play at right-back!

During the early 80s Paul Rideout and Andy Rowland shot 34 goals during the 1982/83 season. Rideout had, two seasons earlier, become the youngest player to play for the Town at just 16 years and 107 days. In his first full season he notched 14 goals and finished as top scorer, the only highlight in an otherwise dull season. It was the year after, however, that is the focus of our attentions when he notched 20 goals (finishing as top scorer again) before he left, in true Town tradition, for a 'bigger club'. Andy Rowland had been a consistent goalscorer for a number of seasons before Jimmy Quinn's arrival had seen him drop back into Town's defence. His last season at the other end of the field, 82/83, saw him notch 20 goals (16 in the league), not bad for someone that had cost the club a mere £85,000 from Bury, and who would later go on to coach the side in later years...

Arguably Rowland's best season, however, came three years earlier when he played alongside Alan Mayes in 1979/8. This particular season is arguably, in terms of goals scored, Town's most successful partnership to date. Rowland bagged 28 goals (20 in the league) while Mayes, in his first spell at the club (he

would later resign after a spell at Chelsea) struck the same amount 56 goals, a phenomenal number, yet what was more remarkable was Town's lowly league finish despite this prolific partnership! It was Town's failure to match their home form on the road that had contributed to the poor mid-table finish.

Lack of success wasn't a problem for Arthur Horsefield and Peter Noble who, in the 1969/70 season (with Swindon having dispatched of Arsenal a year earlier), scored 37 goals in a campaign that saw Town win the Anglo-Italian Cup. Horsefield was signed for a then club record of £17,500 from Newcastle United and he bagged on the opening day of the season en route to scoring 18 league goals. Yet it was his goals in Europe that possibly sets him apart from other contenders. A hat trick against Roma (how times have changed!) and a goal against Napoli in the final endeared him to the Wiltshire faithful Noble was also signed from Newcastle and contributed 21 goals (12 in the league) to the cause. His best season had been a year earlier when he scored four goals en route to the League Cup Final victory. Amazingly, despite scoring 80 goals for the Town, he was used a full-back for Burnley when he joined the claret and blues in 1973!



WE MEET AGAIN...

Jimmy Gilligan

BORN IN HAMMERSMITH IN JANUARY 1964, JIMMY GILLIGAN WON ENGLAND YOUTH HONOURS AS A STRIKER AND COMPLETED AN APPRENTICESHIP AT WATFORD

Signing as a full professional in August 1981, he made his debut in a home win against Barnsley 3rd October 1981, a match which was to be his only appearance that season as Watford finished second and were promoted to Division One.

October 1982 brought a loan spell at Lincoln City where he appeared in three League matches but with Watford finishing second in the top flight, Gilligan made four appearances and scored both goals in a 2-0 win at home to Manchester City. When Jimmy scored he liked to do it pairs and his four goals in 1983/84 came in a brace against Aston Villa and another double over WBA. These were heady times at Watford, Jimmy scored at Kaiserslautern in the UEFA cup and then again at home to Sparta Prague as Watford marched to the Third Round. Competing with Luther Blissett and John Barnes for a place up front, appearances were few and far between and in the summer 1985 Jimmy moved on to today's visitors

Grimsby after 27 League outings and six goals. The Mariners were playing their football in the old Division Two and 1985/86 brought a 15th place finish with Gilligan recording four goals in 25 appearances.

In the summer of 1986 Swindon were celebrating the Fourth Division championship and manager Lou Macari was preparing a squad to challenge for successive promotions. Jimmy Gilligan arrived in June to team up with Steve White and Dave Bamber but his five goals in 17 League matches were insufficient to impress Macari. After a first team run which stretched from September to December, Loumoved to bring another Jimmy, this one of the Quinn variety, back to the County Ground and effectively ended Gilligan's Wiltshire spell.


So in February 1987 a loan spell at Newport County found the south Wales team in the death throes of their League existence. Finishing bottom of Division Three, County's League membership was to last just another dozen months. Gilligan's one goal in half a dozen games did little to postpone the inevitable, but he appeared even more impatient to drop out of the League. Signing for Lincoln City in March 1987, City

finished bottom of Division Four and entered the Conference.

Another move was necessary to maintain his professional status and Jimmy joined Fourth Division Cardiff City in the summer of 1987. The season ended with promotion to the Third and after a season of consolidation and the first seven games of 1989/90, Jimmy moved to Portsmouth in Division Two after playing 92 games for the Bluebirds. easily the most that he made for a single club in his career. His Pompey spell saw another 32 games but only five goals, then a switch to Swansea City in August 1990 for £125,000 produced the best scoring return of his career with 23 goals in 61 Division Three appearances. In the summer of 1992 he left the Vetch and dropped into non-league football with St Leonards.

At 6ft 2in, Gilligan's goal return rarely matched expectations, although there was never a shortage of clubs willing to give him a try. All three south Wales clubs witnessed him in their colours, and it seems that Jimmy was just beginning to demonstrate some consistency in front of goal when his career ran out of time.



FOR ONE SPECIAL COUPLE TONIGHT'S GAME MARKS A TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF DOMESTIC BLISS AS A PASSION FOR EACH OTHER IS REPLACED OVER 90 MINUTES BY A DIFFERENT AND OPPOSING PASSION

David and Janet Mouland live in Glenfield, Leicester, which as the crow flies is almost exactly equidistant between the County Ground and Blundell Park.
Coincidence? Unlikely, as David is a life-long Swindon fan and Janet an equally avid follower of the Mariners. Football brought them together and tonight football will keep them apart as Janet joins the Grimsby fans while David watches from the home end.

Our Sports Reporter Simon Coy renewed an old acquaintance this week when he spoke to the couple to find out the full story.

A common interest in the beautiful game drew David and Janet

together in 1999 when they began chatting via a football website, firstly via email and soon after over the phone. David was working in London and Janet lived and worked in Scunthorpe. It could so easily have been over before it started as David admits to making a major mistake when he began the conversation. The first thing I said to her was are you a Scunthorpe United fan'. That's almost like saying to a Swindon supporter are you an Oxford fan'.

However, Janet forgave him this basic, schoolboy error and six months later, in November 1999, they met for the first time in Trafalgar Square on the steps of the National Gallery. David, born and bred in Devizes, had lived in London for around 12 years and was a self confessed bachelor. After keeping in touch they met again on FA Cup 3rd Round day, in January 2000, when David travelled up to see Janet and watched Grimsby's game with Bolton.

A month later the Mariners played at the County Ground in a league encounter giving the couple another chance to see each other. David recalls this day as the one that changed his life having decided that Janet meant something very special to him.

"At this stage I probably realised that something was going on here and this might be somebody important in my life. She was in the away end and to this day I can remember seeing her jump up when Grimsby scored the only goal of the game. Within two or three months of that we realised we were going



to have a future together."

A year and a half later, on 15th June 2002, Janet and David were married in Market Rasen, Lincolnshire. The wedding coincided with the England v Denmark game at the World Cup Finals and the couple recall watching the game in the hours leading up to the service, changing at half-time in order to be ready. There was even a mention for both Swindon and Grimsby by the minister during the service.

At the end of their special day they decided to wear their respective football shirts as going away outfits. Their final touch was to swap scarves. "I think quite frankly the two mothers were disgusted," David adds. "They were expecting something nice, but we thought it was great."

Both David and Janet have an excellent record of supporting their teams going back many years. David, 41, first came to the County Ground in the early 70's with his grandfather. In the late 80's, when living in the capital, he was an active member of the Swindon Supporters In London Association (SSILA). During Town's season in the Premiership, when David was secretary of the group, membership grew to over 70 fans.

Janet, 41, was a season ticket holder in the Upper Smiths Stand at Blundell Park having first attended in the 1971/72 season. She has been a regular supporter for well over 20 years and followed the club home and away including the successes at Wembley.

They have lived in their
Leicestershire home since the
wedding making trips to both
football clubs manageable. The
couple gets to around 10 games per
season, which involves a two hour
drive either way. When they're not
following football David works in
the Accident Investigation

Department of Leicestershire County Council whilst Janet is a Probation Officer.

Janet feels that Swindon will be promoted this season and has been telling her husband this for a while. "I've been saying all season that Swindon will go up. Obviously I've seen them play quite a few times this season and right from the beginning I've said that you've got a good team here. My hopes for Grimsby are that we stay up and I also hope that I can follow Swindon, with David, all the way to Cardiff."

David states that it is the most positive he has felt for some years. "I don't see any reason, all being well, why we shouldn't at least make the play-offs. I've also seen Grimsby a few times this season and they're not a bad side and certainly not a side that deserves to go down. They have suffered from a lack of resources and the lack of a consistent goal scorer is their problem now. I hope they can stay up as I think my life's going to be hell if they don't."

Both David and Janet are hoping for three vital points this evening and whichever way it goes you can be sure that this happy couple will be talking again in the morning (but perhaps not about football).


LDV Vans Final between Southend United and Blackpool next month.




