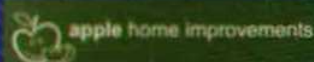

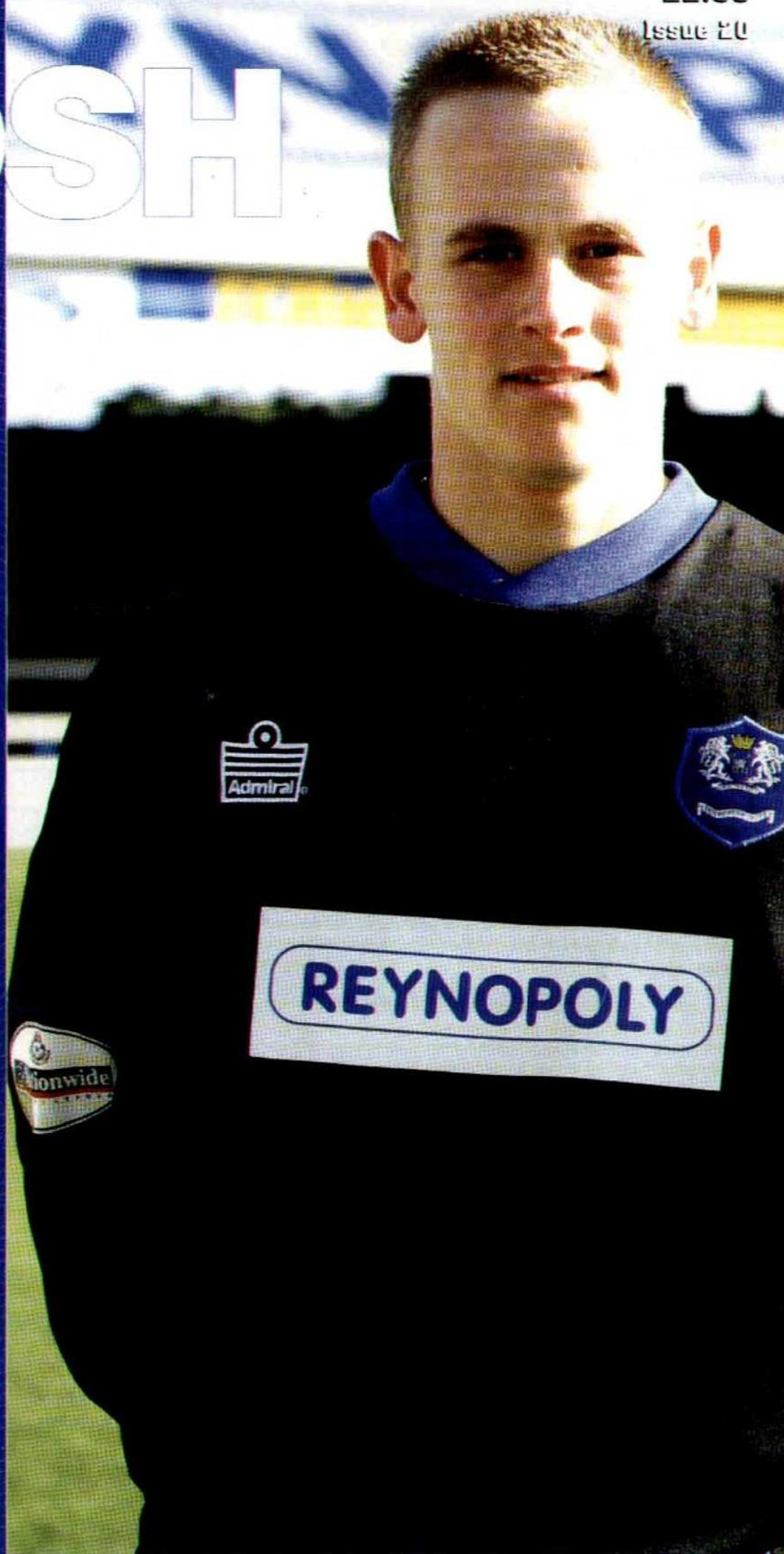

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In the unlikely event of an emergency at London Road requiring the evacuation of all or part of the ground, spectators are requested to remain where they are, stay calm and listen for announcements over the public address system. All emergency announcements will be preceded by a distinctive chime. The announcements may direct spectators in specified areas to evacuate through exit gates to the outside of the ground, or on the pitch. Club stewards and police officers will assist in directing spectators to the safest locations. If requested to vacate a particular area in the ground, spectators should do so as calmly and quickly as possible to assist in a safe and speedy evacuation. STUART FENSOME (Safety Officer, Peterborough United)

Ground Regulations

Persons are admitted to this ground subject to their acceptance of the Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and the Football League which are posted in and outside the Stadium. Entry to the ground shall constitute unqualified acceptance. The club reserves the right for its stewards, servants, agents and Police to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with these rules and regulations, or whose presence within the ground is, or could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. Throwing of any object within the ground. Taking part in chanting of an indecent or racist nature. Entry onto the field of play or the surrounding track without lawful authority or excuse. Additionally, the use of threatening behaviour or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in ejection from the ground.

Parking

During last season numerous complaints were made by the public regarding illegal, dangerous and inconsiderate parking. In response to these justified complaints and to minimise the dangers/inconvenience caused by such activity, the police will actively enforce the parking regulations.

Supporters are advised to use a common sense approach when parking and to fully utilise specified parking areas, thereby avoiding on street parking and minimise any congestion. Your assistance and co-operation regarding this matter will be appreciated.

Talking of working in partnership the Club has been fortunate that one of its fans has offered his services free of charge to help us develop a detailed program of change off the pitch.

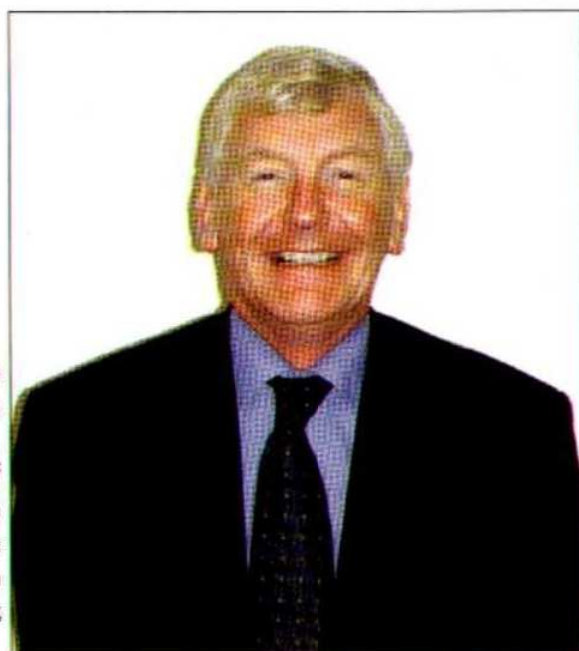

This season Swindon have been up near the top of the table from day one and Andy has got together a fine mixture of youth and experience in his squad. A major contribution to the club's success this term has been the front two of Tommy Mooney and Sam Parkin.

Although the whole team has been well disciplined, well organised and has a great shape about it, these two guys have produced the goals that have put Town in the play-off position they are in at the present time. I know Andy will still be pushing for an automatic promotion slot and speaking to Kevin Summerfield, the Plymouth Argyle manager when we went down to Home Park recently, he has no doubt whatsoever who the best team in the league is at present - Swindon Town.

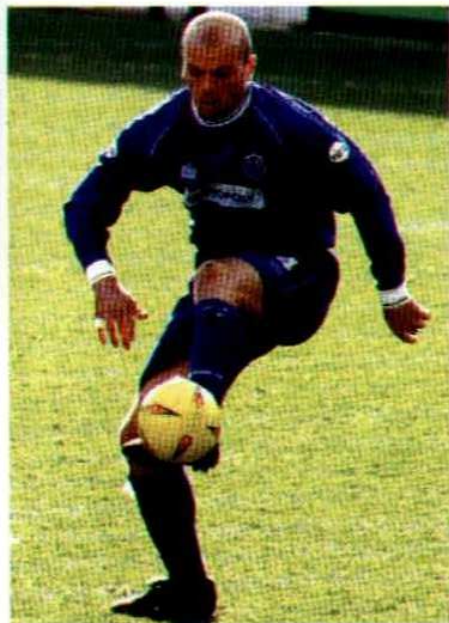


it is a certainty they will pick up points. At the end of the day, it could come down to our superior goal difference to help retain our Second Division status.

Coaching Perspective

Welcome to today's game with Swindon Town and I hope you enjoy this crucial Division Two fixture. If I take a look back at the game at Colchester United last week, there were positives and negatives to take out of the O-O draw.

I think the players coped reasonably well after Wayne Andrews was sent-off for Colchester because it is always hard to adjust to playing 10-men because the opposition will get men behind the ball. I thought the 10 minutes immediately after the dismissal was disappointing though, as I think they had their best spell of the game.

In saying that, we put in enough decent crosses from Dave Farrell and Adam Newton in the second half and the disappointing factor was that the players didn't attack the ball when the delivery came across. We had enough possession and chances to win the game and it was frustrating that we only collected one point, because a win would have given us some breathing space.

We tried to make the game wider, when the opposition loses a player to a red card it is important to try and make the 10-men work hard and cover the whole width of the pitch. Farrell was an outlet for us and he got plenty of crosses in to be fair to him, but unfortunately nobody was there to convert them.

We have some tough matches coming up, Swindon are pushing for promotion, as are Port Vale while Oldham Athletic are struggling like we are towards

the lower reaches of the division. They are three teams fighting for things, so it will be difficult, but if the lads show the same commitment and the same work ethic that they have been showing of late, then we should get out of it.

It is ironic that after the 6-1 win over Wrexham last month, we have failed to score in our last three matches. As a matter of fact, the same thing happened after we had beaten Notts. County 5-2 - we went on to lose at Hartlepool, draw with Brentford and lose at Sheffield Wednesday without finding the back of the net. Hopefully, this goal drought will end this afternoon, we have been working on it in training and the strikers are confident.

The season is coming into the final straight now, there are very few games remaining and it is still so tight at the bottom. I don't think clubs can actually have a points target this season, we definitely need three more wins, without question, but there is a long way to go.

We are four points clear of Notts. County who are second bottom and with our superior goal difference, that means they are two wins away from us, but we are only a point clear of the other two. If a team puts back-to-back wins together then they soon get clear of trouble as Tranmere have shown.

I think in recent seasons, Rushden and Diamonds would have considered themselves safe from relegation, but because so many teams are involved and the fact they are playing each other in the run-in,



the Nene Park outfit are still in trouble.

Rushden have 47 points and they are far from out of it. If they keep losing or even just picking up draws, they will need to look over their shoulders, because everyone is scrapping for their lives. I think it is going to go down to the wire, we have to concentrate on what we do.

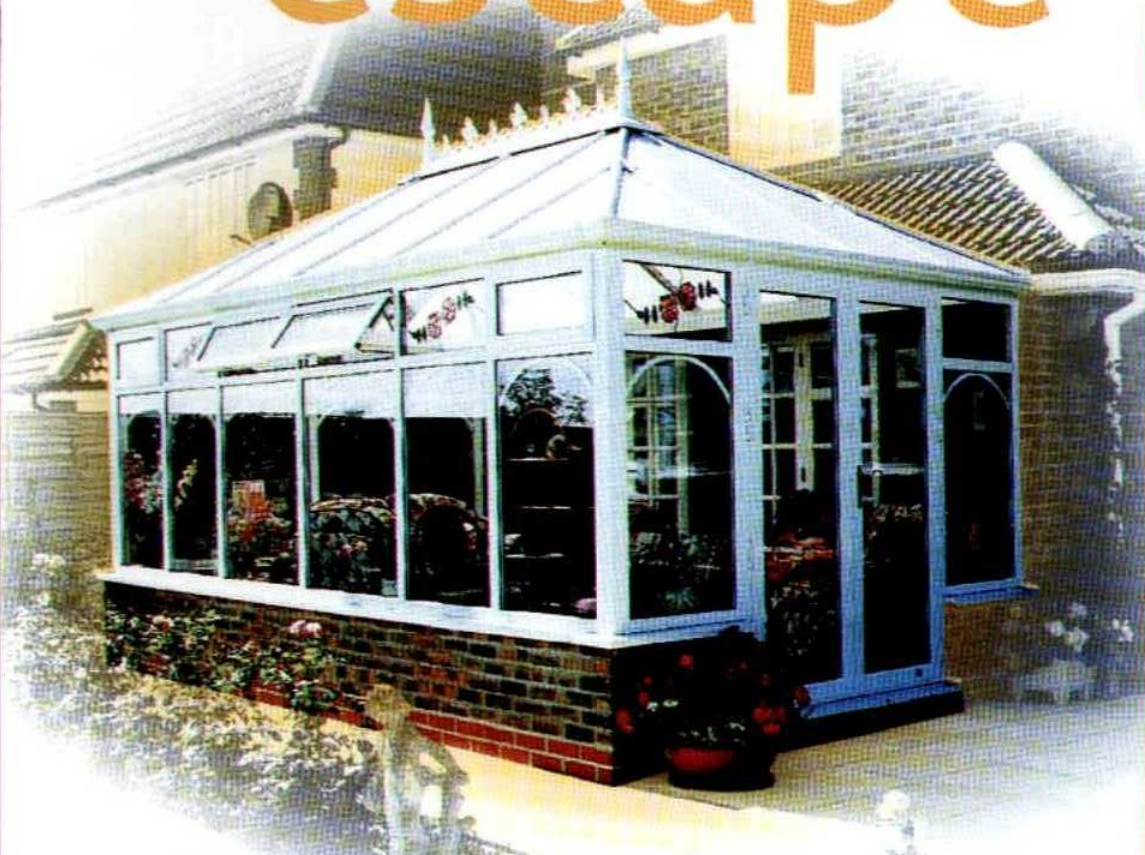
We have only lost once out of the last six games, but we should have won more of those matches. We look hard to beat at the minute, we have virtually dominated the last six games, with the exception of the Plymouth match, and hopefully we can do the same today.

The lads are determined, there is no hiding place, we have to stand up and be counted. The players can play at London Road now with confidence. We are looking forward to today and we need the three points, simple as that.

Welcome to Our Visitors



Swindon Town are the visitors to London Road this afternoon and the Robins will be hoping to get back to winning ways after two games without a victory, which included a disappointing home draw with Paul Hart's Barnsley at the County Ground last week.

Robins boss Andy King remained positive after the 1-1 draw with the Tykes, which kept Town in fourth place in the league table, following Brighton's failure to get anything from their encounter at Sheffield Wednesday. King told his club's official website:

'The first half performance was poor but second half we picked it up. In the end we may have just deserved to grab the result but the main thing is that we didn't lose. I think we forced the issue, as we had to in the second half. There was a good work ethic and good determination and if they continue playing along those lines then we won't have too much of a problem in the remaining fixtures.

'You have to give fairness to them and Paul Hart, the system they play is very difficult to play against. It is a diamond shape and sometimes it is very narrow and there is no width in the game,' King explained following the home draw. It is not difficult to explain why Town have scored so many goals this term - just look at their strike-force.

Sam Parkin has scored 19 goals this term and was on target in the score draw with the Tykes, but his strike partner Tommy Mooney has also managed to get into double figures and the pair have been shooting Town up the league table.



However, there was a hint of disharmony in the Town dressing room at half-time last week as Mooney was bitterly upset to be substituted by manager King after continually arguing with the referee and his team-mates following a frustrating first period.

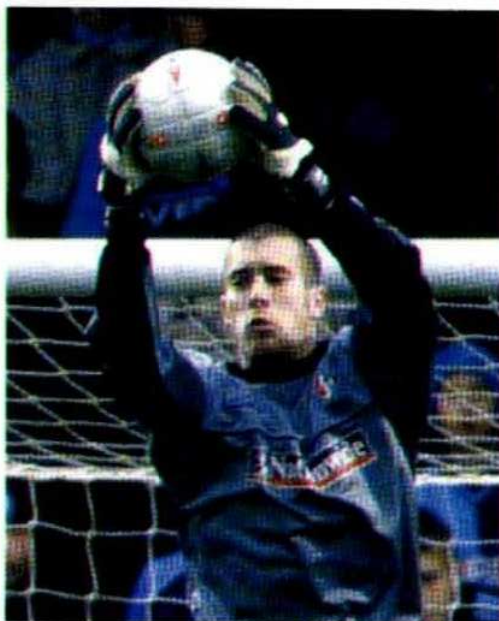
The signing of Sammy Igoe has given the Robins plenty of width this term with the former Reading midfielder man also chipping in with some vital goals. Ex-Posh goalkeeper Bart Griemink **(pictured above)** is still on the books at the County Ground, but the big Dutchman has not been in the starting line-up of late.

Earlier in the campaign, Swindon beat Posh 2-0 at the County Ground after two late goals from Sam Parkin and then on-loan winger James Milner. Posh held out until the final six minutes of the match and they will need to be at their best to get a positive result this afternoon.

The promising young keeper joined Leyton Orient on a three-month loan deal last August. He proved to be an excellent shot stopper and showed good command of his area. A Town fan at heart he is glad to be playing for his local team again. He continues to work hard with goal keeping coach Fraser Digby in a bid to push him into a more prominent England spot.

Andy Gurney

Started his career at hometown club Bristol Rovers, where he spent four seasons before moving to Torquay for one year and impressing during their surge to the play-offs. So far this season, he has continued as captain and is one of the clubs most influential players, picking the team up when needed with a 'quiet' word or a spectacular free kick. Comfortable on the ball, he is a versatile defender who can appear at right back or in midfield if required.

Matthew Heywood

It has been another consistent year for Town's most effective defender and after a slow start, he returned

to the kind of form that saw him clean up in the 2001/02 Player of the Year Awards. Strong in the tackle and good in the air, he is proving to be a great asset to the club. It is no coincidence that Town's defensive record improved dramatically following his arrival.

Andrew Nicholas

Was a regular member of Liverpool's under-19 winning team in 2003 and won plaudits with his consistent performances at left back, resulting in a flattering comparison to Anfield legend Sami Hyypia. With good height, terrific pace and recovery he has proved to be a valuable asset to the defensive line up this season. He also possesses a Dave Challinor-style long throw, which he claims to be one of the longest in the division.

David Duke (pictured below)

The Scotsman arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000 having never managed a start for the Black Cat's first team. He appeared regularly in his first season with the Robins. He combined well with Sol Davis down the Robins' left and is a good crosser of the ball - last year he became more effective beating

players and he contributed more to the team with his hard work and endeavour.

Matthew Hewlett

The former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad, before joining Swindon. Despite some criticism, he tends to be the engine room at the heart of the team and the side never quite looks the same when he is missing. He also possesses good passing skills and although his goal scoring efforts are few and far between, they often tend to be memorable.

Sammy Igoe

After making his way up through the ranks at Portsmouth, where he began as a trainee, he went on to secure a first team spot at the south coast club and made his mark with some impressive performances. Capable of chipping in with goals, and making decisive contributions in the middle of the park, he is always a threat to the opposition. Scored with a free-kick on his league debut against Sheffield Wednesday on the opening day of the season.

Brian Howard

The youngster joined Town from Southampton in 2003 having played for the Saints reserves for two years. The 20-year old left-sided midfielder even turned down a late move to go to Chelsea, choosing instead to opt for some first team football under Andy King. The left sided midfielder has proved to be a revelation on the flanks this season.

Sam Parkin

Young and very promising forward who joined the club from Chelsea in 2002. The transfer followed a mass of speculation, with Andy King, a huge fan of the player, tracking him for



several months. Strong on the ball and devastating in the box, he then went on to finish third in the Division's goal charts last term. The striker has picked up where he left off last term and in tandem with Tommy Mooney, has begun to terrorise defences and fire Town further up the league.

Tommy Mooney (pictured above)

Joined Town from Birmingham in July this year. His grit and determination made him a cult hero, and after a fantastic start to the season he is now well into double figures along with strike partner Sam Parkin. On regular occasions King has referred publicly to the strike pairing as the best in Division Two and with a work rate and character as strong as Mooney's, he looks set to fire the team further up the table and into the play off's.

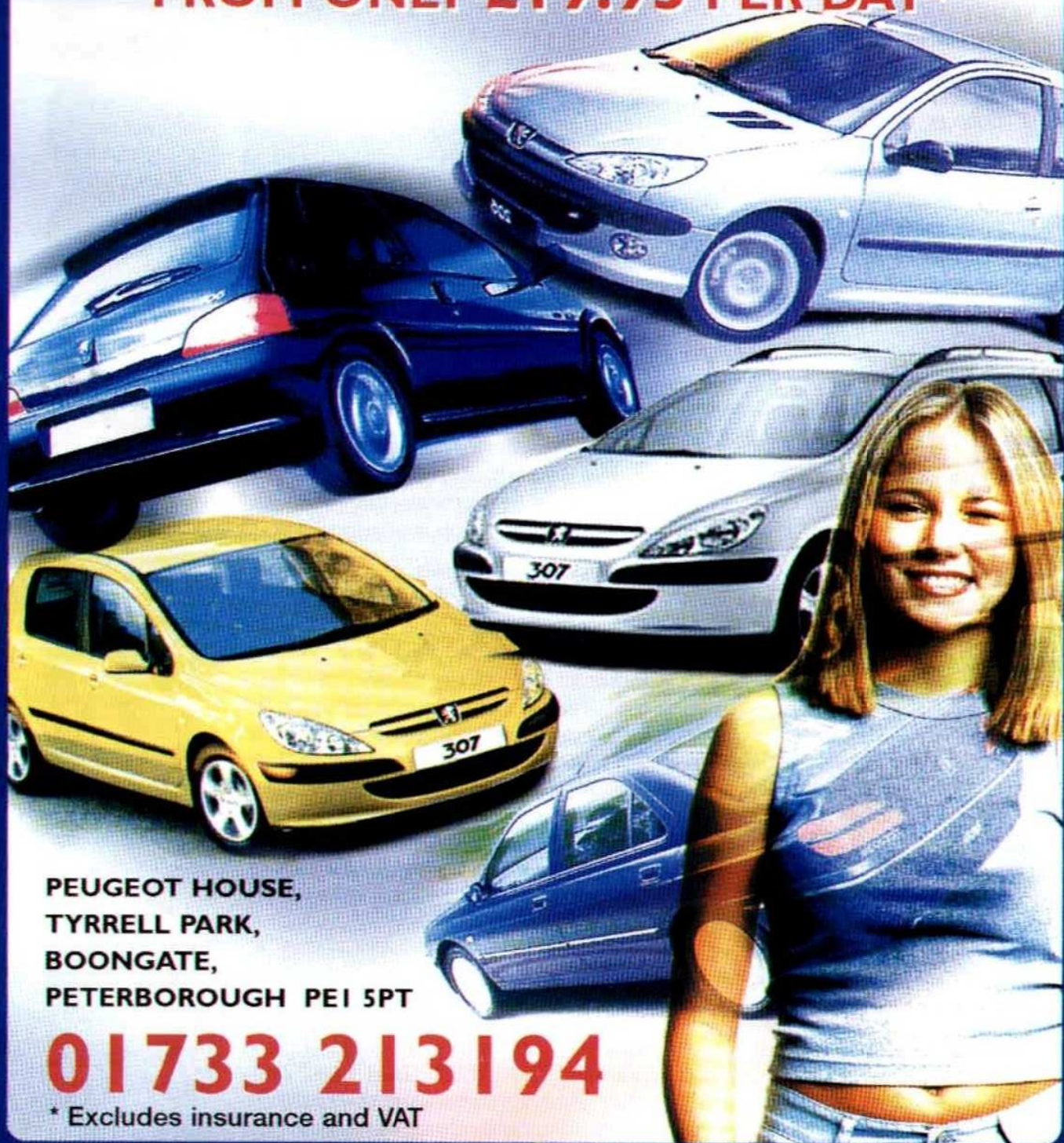
Rory Fallon

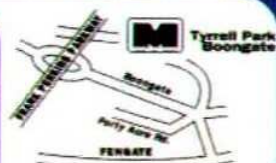

Meet The Swindon Manager



Born in August 1956, in Luton, Andy King made his name as a lively midfielder having joined his home town club in 1974. His next stop was Everton, the club with which most people associate him, who he signed for in 1976 for £35,000. He made 150 appearances for The Toffees, scoring an impressive 38 goals in four seasons at Goodison before joining QPR.

One season with the Superhoops was followed by another at West Bromwich Albion before a return to Everton for the 1982-83 season, where he played a further 43 games and added another 11 goals to his tally for the Toffees. A short period with Dutch side Cambuur followed, before Andy returned to England with Wolves, for whom he played 28 times scoring 10 goals. A very brief spell back at Luton in 1985 (just three appearances) preceded Andy's final move as a player when he joined Aldershot and notched 11 goals in 36 games for the Surrey side.

Having retired as a player, he turned to coaching, and was given his first managerial appointment at Mansfield Town in 1993 following George Foster's departure. Having been relegated from Division Two, Mansfield were low on confidence but King managed to steer them to a mid-table finish in his first season at the helm. The following season saw The Stags in with a chance of promotion back to the Second Division, having finished in 6th place in the table, but they were beaten in the play-off semi-finals by John Duncan's Chesterfield.

The 1995-96 season saw Mansfield drop down to 19th position in Division Three and Andy was replaced at Field Mill by Steve Parkin. Andy spent some time out of management but was still



involved in the game, and was working with former Everton team-mate Peter Reid at Premiership club Sunderland as a scout when Colin Todd took him to Swindon as his assistant manager in the summer of 2000.

When Todd got the call from Jim Smith to be his assistant at Derby County, King was given the opportunity to impress chairman Terry Brady, and after four games in charge he was given the job full-time, on November 6, 2000. Swindon struggled to keep themselves out of the relegation zone for most of the season but a win over Peterborough in the penultimate game of their league campaign, coupled with Bristol Rovers loss to Wycombe, ensured their Second Division survival. The great escape act was not enough to ensure Andy King's survival however. Despite his efforts in keeping The Robins up he was replaced at the County Ground by former Liverpool boss Roy Evans in June 2001.

But he was not gone for long. Evans left the club before the end of the year, after new owners arrived at the County Ground, and Andy King - who had taken legal action against Swindon with regard to his dismissal - was reinstated as manager on December 20 2001.

The Visitors

Flashback to Plymouth

Nathan Lowndes stepped off the substitutes bench to help Plymouth Argyle to maximum points and end Peterborough United's winning run as the Greens ran out 2-0 winners at Home Park to dent Posh's hopes of avoiding relegation.

After a rather comical announcement from the match day announcer who described Peterborough United as Portsmouth prior to kick off, the two teams settled into the Division Two encounter in front of a large crowd at Home Park. The Greens started confidently, spraying the ball about in the middle of the park as Posh tried to soak up the early pressure.

Midfielder Steve Adams dragged an effort wide of the target on three minutes after a good surge from the middle of the park as Posh struggled to contain the hosts in the opening exchanges. A few corner kicks from the hosts had the Posh back-line worrying, but Adams over-hit both set pieces.

A long through ball from Friio had the Posh defence panicking

on seven minutes as goalkeeper Tyler and Arber failed to clear the danger, but Evans slipped at the crucial moment and Arber got back to clear the ball to safety.

A fine pass behind the back four from Williams on 17 minutes found Farrell in a rare Posh attack, but Willock slipped inside the area and Wotton calmly cleared. A great last-ditch tackle from Williams stopped Norris from getting a dangerous cross into the box at the other end after a swift counter attack.

A cross-cum-shot from Williams had McCormick scrambling at his near-post, but the shot-stopper gathered the ball comfortably. Frenchman Friio fired wide on 28 minutes from distance after Posh stood off the talented midfield man after he found space in the middle of the park.

Friio was then inches away from converting a bobbling centre from Adams at the far post as Plymouth turned it up a notch, thanks to the backing of the home fans. Norris then hooked



a volley over the crossbar with the aid of deflection off Williams as Posh dropped deeper.

Keith then wasted a decent opportunity on 36 minutes as he dragged a shot wide from fully 30-yards as Argyle became a bit too keen to have a shot. Plymouth wasted another cracking chance on 42 minutes as Evans knocked the ball into the path of the onrushing Keith, but he blasted miles over the crossbar from inside the box.

On the stroke of half-time a glorious pass from Arber found Willock ahead of the defence, but Coughlan got back to make a great tackle with the rebound falling kindly for McCormick. It was a satisfactory half for Posh, especially when you consider this time last year, Argyle were four goals to the good against Posh at half-time. Goalkeeper Tyler had to make his first real save of the night on 50 minutes as he tipped a Lowndes shot around the post after good work from Evans on the edge of the penalty area.



Plymouth 2 - 0 Posh

Posh looked dangerous from a Williams in-swinging free-kick moments later as Arber got in front of his marker, but he couldn't direct his header goalwards and Willock was flagged offside. Plymouth found the opening goal of the evening on 55 minutes as Connelly pulled the ball back for substitute Lowndes who scuffed the ball past Tyler and into the net.

Barry Fry's men made a swift response with Platt seeing a goal-bound volley deflect off Wotton for a corner kick. Burton fired the resulting corner straight at Coughlan for another corner as Posh pressed. Defender Arber hooked a volley wide after Burton kept a deep Williams corner alive by knocking it back across goal as Posh tried to get back into the encounter. Burton, who scored with a free-kick against Wrexham on Saturday, fizzed a 35-yard free-kick inches past the post on 72 minutes after Willock had been fouled by Adams.

Posh were piling on the pressure in search of the equaliser with the hosts getting a bit nervous in their back-line as Legg and Gill both saw efforts blocked. McCormick didn't help matters as he tried to claim a hanging



Williams centre, but the ball bounced kindly for the Argyle defence when the goalkeeper failed to hold on.

The hosts doubled the lead on 79 minutes from the penalty spot after Arber was adjudged to have pushed Friio inside the area and Wotton stepped up to ram the ball past Tyler and low into the left-hand corner.

It was certainly a controversial decision by referee Mr Ross. Williams saw a free-kick charged down by Coughlan and the official moved the ball forward for the set-piece to be re-taken.

Young winger Jamie Day's season looks set to be over after the highly-rated midfield man fractured his ankle, but the talented 17-year-old can look back on a successful campaign, which included a trial at First Division West Ham United.

The teenage midfielder, who spent a similar spell at Manchester United last year, impressed Hammers chief Alan Pardew and the Upton Park outfit are set to keep an eye on his progress at London Road.

'John Morling phoned me during the Christmas period when I was at home with my family and made me aware of West Ham's interest. When I returned to London Road in the New Year, Barry told me that West Ham wanted me to spend a few days with them.

'I trained with the first team as the Hammers practised crossing and finishing and it was really enjoyable. I was working with former Posh winger Matthew Etherington on the left hand side and it was a great experience. I

found out about a reserve team game the next day at Crystal Palace and I managed to play 90 minutes as we won 1-0.

'The next day, Alan Pardew called me into his office and told me he 'was impressed with my performance', but during that game I picked up an ankle injury. That turned out to be the injury which has ruled me out for the rest of the season, but it does mean I can work hard during the summer to be ready for pre-season,' Day said.

The youngster has been working with the London Road physiotherapist in the past few weeks and has been regularly down at the swimming pool as part of his rehabilitation. Day has been a regular in the reserves at Posh this season and will be hoping to push on next term.

'It is a bit disappointing to miss the last few games of the season, but I had to get my injury checked out and the x-ray showed the fracture. Obviously I am happier I didn't suffer the injury at the start of season



because it gives me the chance to get myself fit for next season.

'To train at West Ham was a great experience for me and it all helps my development. Hopefully this will stand me in good stead for next season and I can push on and put myself in the first team picture,' Day added.

'Pasty' as he is known at London Road, last year helped the Manchester United youth team to victory in the Milk Cup and the flying winger had a major part to play in the winning goal in the final against Preston North End.

Day spent two weeks with the Premiership side and after five days of training he was selected in the squad for the Milk Cup, which takes place annually in Ireland. The youngster played five games in five days and helped the Red Devils lift the trophy.

Flashback to Tranmere

The heavy winds were the winner at London Road as Peterborough United and Tranmere Rovers played out a determined goal-less draw, which did no good to either side in their quest to move away from relegation trouble.

Posh kicked off in gale-force winds with the big gusts at the backs of the visitors in the opening 45 minutes of the encounter. The weather was obviously going to be a big problem for both sides and defender Arber was immediately caught out as the wind blew a Mellon pass over his head, but Tyler was alert to claim the ball.

A good pass from Platt found Willock in space on the right hand side, but as he battled with the conditions he lost his bearings and fired into the side-netting. A marauding run from Woodhouse, which saw him beat two defenders, ended with a good challenge from Allen as the wind continued to ruin the spectacle.

An in-swinging centre from Harrison was missed in the middle by an unmarked Goodison as Tranmere pressed for the opening goal. A good cross from Platt was well cut-out by Allen with Willock lurking inside the area after Legg had created the movement with a good run down the channel.

Posh were trying to adapt to the conditions and on 29 minutes, Farrell hooked a skidding volley inches past the post. A long clearance from Arber nearly deceived Achterberg in the Tranmere goal, but the boot forward was the only real shot to get the home crowd excited.

As the game approached the half-time interval, it was fair to say that there was nothing between the two sides as they battled the horrendous weather conditions, with gusts reaching up to 60mph inside the stadium, making the football on pitch a battle. Platt did get on the end of a Williams cross in stoppage time, but he couldn't guide the ball towards goal.



The referee indicated four minutes of injury time and a forceful run and cross from Newton flick off Goodison's head, but the ball flew inches over the crossbar. Posh then hit the post after Achterberg fumbled Woodhouse's volley and Willock looked set to convert from close-range, but the goalkeeper somehow managed to tip the ball onto the foot of the post.

Both sides trudged out of the dressing room for the start of the second period and there was still no let-up in the wind as Achterberg sliced a clearance out for a corner kick, but Legg then over-hit his set-piece and the ball drifted out for a goal-kick.

Woodhouse saw a free-kick blocked on 52 minutes after Allen was cautioned for tripping Platt as he looked to get on the end of a Farrell pass. Arber then headed across the goal from a deep Williams corner as Posh began to get on top.



Posh 0 - 0 Tranmere

A great header from Willock on 56 minutes was superbly tipped over the crossbar by Achterberg after another Legg throw had caused confusion inside the six-yard box. Willock volleyed wildly wide just on the hour mark as Barry Fry's men used the wind to their advantage.

A deep Williams corner picked out Rea at the back-post, but the defender was penalised for climbing all over Connelly and the referee awarded a free-kick to Tranmere. On 68 minutes, Posh hit the woodwork again as a superb curling 25-yard shot from Woodhouse struck the inside of the post before Roberts hacked the ball to safety. Canadian youngster Hume tested Tyler with a long-distance strike, but the low effort was easily saved by the Posh shot-stopper.

Posh had the ball in the back of the net on 82 minutes as Achterberg fumbled a Willock header under pressure, but the referee awarded a free-kick to the relieved shot-stopper. It was all one-way traffic in Posh's favour, but they couldn't break



the deadlock with Woodhouse the latest to try his luck as he hooked a volley inches past the far post.

Striker Platt then saw a goal-bound effort blocked by Beresford as the pressure intensified by the home side as the game entered the final stages. Posh had appeals for a penalty kick turned down in four minutes of stoppage time as Williams went down under Roberts' challenge, but the official waved away the protests.

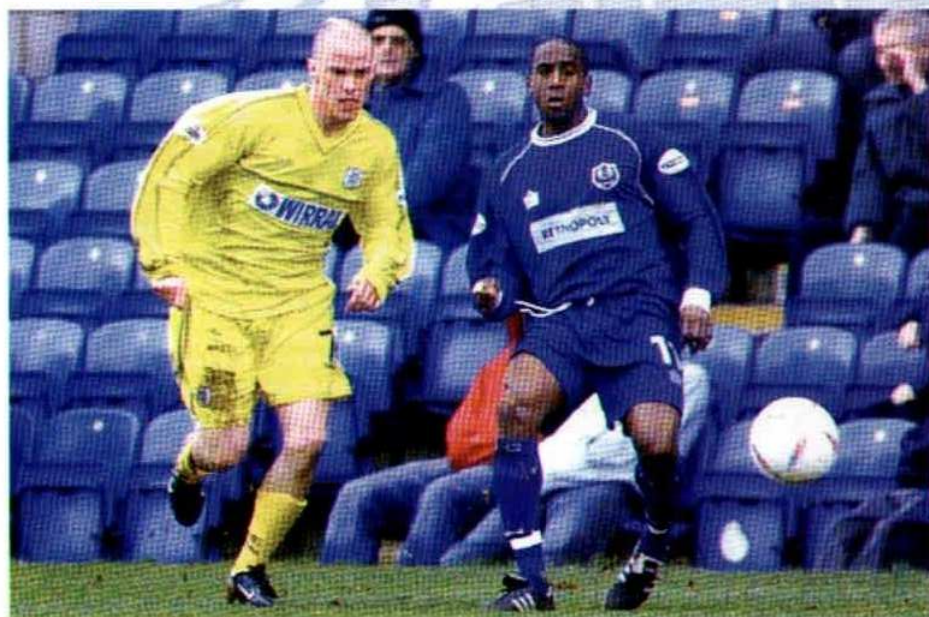

Flashback to Colchester

Wayne Andrews saw red in the second half for kicking out at defender Mark Arber, but Peterborough United failed to capitalise on their numerical advantage as they were held to a goal-less draw by Colchester United at Layer Road.

Posh made a bright start and won an early free-kick on the edge of the area after Farrell was fouled by Pinault 25-yards out, but Woodhouse curled his left-foot effort narrowly wide of the goal. Farrell then forced Brown to clear under his own crossbar as Barry Fry's men made a fast-paced start. Striker Platt ballooned a shot wide moments later as Posh dominated the early exchanges.

Colchester had the first effort of the match on nine minutes as Johnson got ahead of Arber at the front post, but he fired wide of Mark Tyler's near post. Centre back Branston was forced off the field on 17 minutes with a cut before Andrews scuffed a long-range effort straight at Tyler.

Tyler was then called upon to deny a low Johnson shot after Branston had mis-judged his leap. At the other end, Posh were inches away from breaking the deadlock as a long-range Farrell shot was fumbled by Brown, the ball bounced against the post and back into the grateful arms of the shot-stopper.

Johnson then headed over the crossbar from a well-worked corner as the home side pressed for the opening goal. Posh wasted a good opportunity just before the half-hour mark as Willock flicked a Williams pass into the path of Newton, but the winger took a poor first touch and was forced to toe-poke the ball goal-wards, but Brown was well-placed to gather.

Goalkeeper Tyler made a superb save to deny a fierce 25-yard strike from former Barnet defender Stockley on 77 minutes before the U's missed a glorious chance as Halford got away with a challenge on Tyler, but he somehow managed to miss from six-yards when the ball squirmed loose.

A good turn and shot from Willock on 83 minutes forced Brown into a smart low save before the home side applied a bit of pressure. At the other end, Newton forced Brown into another save as Posh piled forward in search of the winner. A minimum of three minutes



were indicated by the fourth official but both sides settled for the point.

Manager Barry Fry commented: 'We had enough chances to win the game, but in truth we never really looked like scoring, which is a worry at this stage of the season. The players gave effort and commitment, but it wasn't enough for all three points.'

Physio's Focus

Welcome to today's game with Swindon Town. The treatment room has been fairly quiet this week, although we have had a few minor injuries that players have picked up. Gareth Jolleyman is nearing fitness, I would say he is 10 days away from re-appearing in the team following his right ankle ligament injury, which he sustained in the game at Queen's Park Rangers in February.

Gareth is currently working on grass and in the swimming pool, we are happy with the progress he is making and he should return soon. It was a bad injury that he suffered, we expected him to be out for six weeks and that has proved to be an accurate assessment.

Young winger Jamie Day is now back training on grass following the confirmation that he had a broken bone in his foot as well as ligament damage. Jamie will work in the next two weeks building up his strength, then maybe he will have a reserve team game to see if the fracture has healed. If it hasn't healed, then we will surgically correct it.



Shane Huke (pictured below left) has a tight hamstring, but he may be available for Heybridge Swifts, where he is currently on-loan, for today's fixture. Following our game at Colchester United last week, Andy Legg picked up a knock to his right knee. We feel it is just bruising, so he should be OK for today.

Curtis Woodhouse (pictured below right) has got a tight right hamstring, he trained perfectly on Monday, but reported to London Road on Tuesday a bit sore. Mark Arber has a long-standing muscle imbalance problem with his pelvis and on Wednesday, his right hip had locked.

We worked on him throughout the week and with a bit of luck he should be fine for this afternoon's encounter with Swindon. The knocks these players have picked up are part and parcel for this time of the season, we just give them a couple of days rest to recover.

Barry Fry managed to complete the permanent signing of Tom Williams until the end of the season at the start of the week and Tom has seen the chiropodist this week to sort out his toes. He had them dressed because they are very sore. This has been caused by tight boots, the pressure builds up and cuts off the blood supply, which is why he is now having a few problems.

We have been thinking about pre-season for next term for quite a while now. We have known about a few friendly matches, so we have to plan for next year. If I am in charge of the



training schedule, which I have been in the past two years, then I don't envisage changing much. The last two years have been successful, we haven't suffered greatly with injuries, so long may it continue.

Thanks for your continued support and get behind the players for today's clash with Swindon Town. It will be a difficult game as Town are in the play-off positions, but the players are focused on getting the right result..

A warm welcome to all of the younger fans here today to watch the match against Swindon Town. Let's hope it's not as windy as the last home game we had here. Hooray! It's now officially the start of the Easter holidays, no more school for two weeks! Even better news, it's only six days till you can open your Easter Eggs. (If you haven't already)

Have any of you got any exciting activities planned for this holiday? If you're not lucky enough to be going away somewhere hot, then make sure you come to support the Posh on Easter Monday, which is the 12th April, for our match against Port Vale. It's also "Bring a Mate and Boost the Gate" day, so it's a great excuse to bring your mates along too, especially if they're starting to get bored.

As I'm writing this column, it's the day after transfer deadline day. There was huge activity, with many players moving from club to club. This made me begin to think about all of the players that have "FLOWN THE NEST" from London Road in recent years, and where they are now. So, here is what has happened to a few of them.

PLAYERS THAT HAVE MOVED UP IN THE WORLD

ADAM DRURY: Adam was transferred to Norwich City in March 2001, where he gained the number 3 shirt. Last season, he only missed one game for the Canaries, and was voted "Player of the Season." He has also often been described as the "best left back outside the Premiership" by pundits.

JIMMY BULLARD: Jimmy was transferred to Wigan Athletic on a very sad day in January 2003. He has starred in nearly all of Wigan's matches since moving there, and has scored three goals and made many more. One of Jimmy's claims to fame is having played alongside Rio Ferdinand as a schoolboy.

NEALE FENN: No, I'm not joking, Neale Fenn has gone up in the world! Neale can now be found playing for Irish Premier League side Cork City. Shortly after leaving Posh, Neale moved to Waterford for a season, where his potential shone through, and he scored many goals and was headhunted by Cork. He has recently been voted the "Best signing in the Eircom League." (Bet you're sorry you let him go now Baz!)

LUKE STEELE: Luke got a dream move to Manchester United at the end of May 2002 after a month's loan at the club. Luke made 19 appearances for the under 19's in the 2002/03 season, and played for the reserves twice. He also played in the FA Youth Cup winning side in his first full season at Manchester United.

LEON MCKENZIE: Since moving to Norwich earlier this season, our top scorer made an immediate impact by scoring the two winning goals on his debut in a local derby against Ipswich. He has the number 14 shirt and has already scored 5 goals for Norwich.

PLAYERS THAT HAVE MOVED DOWN IN THE WORLD

DAVID OLDFIELD: After leaving Posh in the summer of 2002, David went to Oxford United, where he still is up to the present day. He has the number 22 shirt and has a player/coaching role at the club. He was also caretaker manager for the day, when the previous manager was released just a few weeks ago.

JASON LEE: Jason now plays for Scottish Division One side Falkirk, who are a respectable 5th in their league. He joined there in August 2003, and has scored nine goals in 23 appearances. (probably more than he ever did for us) You never know, next season we may see him playing against the likes of Celtic and Rangers!

HELGI DANIELSSON: Helgi returned home to Iceland in May 2003, after failing to get regular first team action. He joined Icelandic side Fylkir for £25 000, a record fee for the club. The club is now top of the "Premier Division" in Iceland and have played a part in the UEFA cup qualifying rounds for the past two seasons and are one of the biggest clubs in Iceland.

HOWARD FORINTON: Surely one of the most memorable players in recent years for all the wrong reasons. After leaving Posh, his career again took a turn for the worst. He has been at clubs including Torquay, Yeovil, Stevenage, Oxford and Farnborough. Unfortunately, he has been unable to retain a place at many of them because of long term injuries and deteriorating fitness levels.

Fry Completes Williams Permanent Signing



Peterborough United manager Barry Fry has completed the permanent signing of Birmingham City defender Tommy Williams **(pictured above)** until the end of the season after the Premiership side cancelled his contract at St. Andrews by mutual consent.

Williams' loan spell at London Road came to an end following the O-O draw at Colchester United on Saturday and the youngster spent the weekend mulling over the offer from the Blues. Williams agreed to the offer and the forms were completed at the 11th hour on Monday to the delight of Fry.

'I am absolutely delighted with the signing of Tom Williams until the end of the season. I have called in a few favours and Birmingham City have been absolutely fantastic with everything. Tom has had his contract cancelled by mutual consent and has agreed to come here until the end of the season to try and help us avoid relegation.

'We will try and reach an agreement about a longer deal at the end of the season, but Tom has other irons in the fire. Posh will be one of those options, but to get a player of Tom's calibre here until the end of this season is a real coup for the club,' Fry exclusively told theposh.com.

Williams started his career as a trainee at West Ham United before moving to London Road with Jimmy Bullard in March 2001. After 32 impressive league starts, the defender made the £350,000 move to Birmingham, but the dashing left-back has struggled to make an impact at St. Andrews.

After a loan spell at Queen's Park Rangers, Williams suffered an injury, but the loan move to Posh has re-vitalised him and he is looking forward to helping Barry Fry's men stay in the Second Division.

'I have signed until the end of the season and I am looking forward to keeping Posh in this division. I do look back on my time at Birmingham City with a bit of frustration but when a big club comes in for you like what happened with the Blues you have to have that experience.

'At the end of the campaign I will become a free agent, so I will be working hard at Posh to keep fit and play games. I am still only 23-years-old, so I have time on my side, and there is still plenty of time for me to move back up the leagues,' Williams said.

Bobby Gould Signs Marshall Car On-Loan

Bobby Gould **(pictured right)** received a new car from Marshall Peugeot in Boongate

last week with the dealership lending the Peugeot 207 to the former Wales boss while he is at London Road.

New Vehicle Sales Manager Matthew Callow is pictured with Gould, who is helping manager Barry Fry on the management team at London Road until the end of the current campaign. Marshall Peugeot were pleased to help out and the loan is to keep Gould mobile while he is at Posh.

Meanwhile, on Friday 30th April, Marshall Peugeot are playing their annual charity football match against the Posh Legends with several former Peterborough United stars expected to line-up for the Legend outfit in the game, which is being held at London Road.

The Posh team will again consist of many ex-Posh stars of the past including Tommy Robson, Ken Charley, Mick Gynn and Dave Gregory. The game kicks off at 7.30pm and entry will be via the main stand with refreshments available and the Executive bar open after the game.

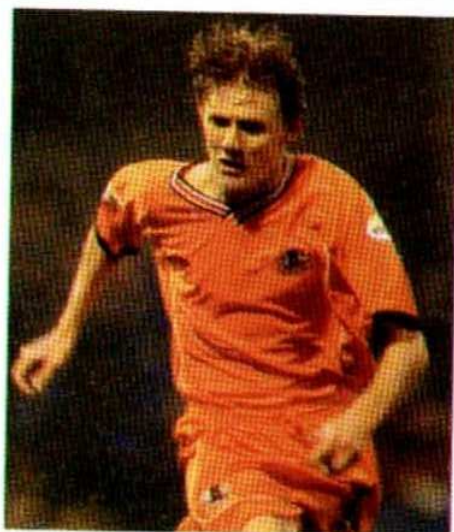

Tony Shields' goal helped Posh earn a 1-1 draw on Swindon's last visit to London Road on April 5, 2003. Jimmy Bullard's (pictured below left) goal had given Posh a 1-1 draw at County Ground four months earlier. When the sides met in Wiltshire earlier this season, late goals by Sam Parkin and on loan Leeds youngster James Milner proved sufficient to end Posh's unbeaten away record. Swindon's last League victory here was 2-0 in March 1996 - one of an impressive 13 away wins stacked up by Steve McMahon's side on their way to the Second Division championship.

RECORD BREAKER

Italian striker Guiliano Grazioli became part of Posh folklore



when scoring a club record five goals in the 9-1 away win at Barnet in September 1998. Initially moving to London Road in October 1995, he spent his first three seasons kicking his heels with the reserves, spending time out on loan to various non-League clubs or being laid up with injury.

After showing what he could do during a successful loan spell at Stevenage, for whom he scored FA Cup goals against Swindon and Newcastle, Barry Fry finally gave him his chance during 1998-99. In addition to his record-breaking feat at Underhill, he found the net a further ten times to finish as leading goalscorer - a fitting reward for his persistence. It was a surprise when he refused new contract terms in June 1999 and moved to Swindon, then managed by former Posh team mate Jimmy Quinn. Peterborough fans will doubtless remember his sending off in a County Ground clash with Posh on the opening day of 2001-02.

CUP WINNER

One-time Posh winger Don Heath won several honours with Swindon Town including the 1969 League Cup triumph over Arsenal at Wembley. Moving to

the County Ground for £10,000 from Norwich City in September 1967, he scored twice in 88 League appearances for Swindon. He was a key part of the side that lifted the League Cup and won promotion to the old Second Division in 1969 then scooped the Anglo-Italian Cup in Naples a year later.

Two years at Oldham followed before Jim Iley (pictured below right) brought him to London Road in July 1972. Heath spent one season in Posh colours and missed just two matches in 1972-73. Although he retained his place after Iley's dismissal, new boss Noel Cantwell released him on a free transfer ahead of the 1973-74 Fourth Division championship-winning season.

IN SAFE KEEPING

Former Swindon Town goalkeeper Jim Barron finished his playing career with Posh in the early 1980s. Moving to the County Ground from Nottingham Forest in August 1974, he starred in 79 Third Division





games for Swindon before taking his talents to Connecticut Bicentennials in the North American Soccer League. He came to London Road on a free transfer in August 1977 and shared the number one jersey with Keith Waugh in 1977-78 as Posh conceded just 33 League goals to set a new Third Division record.

After taking up a coaching position at the club, he returned to first team duty after a two-year absence when stepping in for the injured Waugh in a 5-2 home defeat of Southend in October 1980. He left London Road the following summer for the assistant manager's job at his first club, Wolves.

FOR THE RECORD:

* Goals by Archie Styles and Bob Doyle gave Posh a 2-0 League Cup third round replay win over Swindon at the County Ground on November 7, 1978. Defender Styles was also on target in the drawn first meeting at London Road the previous

month. The sides also met in the FA Cup way back in December 1955, when Swindon won a second round replay 2-1 at London Road after Posh, then of the Midland League, had held their Third Division (South) opponents to a 1-1 draw at the County Ground. Denis Emery was on target for Posh in both matches.

* Posh first welcomed Swindon to London Road for a Third Division clash played in front of a 12,509 crowd on November 18, 1961. Trailing 1-2 at half-time, Jimmy Hagan's men recovered to record a 3-2 victory courtesy of goals from Billy Hails, Roy Senior and George Hudson.

* Leon McKenzie scored twice and created another goal for David Farrell as Posh recorded their biggest ever home win against Swindon with a 4-0 success on November 11, 2000. Richard Forsyth's late strike completed the scoring as Posh produced a slick display in driving rain to make it a miserable London Road return for Robins goalkeeper Bart Griemink.

* Goals by Trevor Slack (pictured above left), Phil Chard, Colin Clarke and Micky Gynn sent Posh into a 4-1 half-time lead against Swindon at London Road on April 9, 1983. Town's only reply came from highly rated young striker Paul Rideout, who beat David Seaman from close range. It was a different story after the break as Swindon



scored twice through ex-Posh loanee Leigh Barnard and veteran forward Andy Rowland to make for a somewhat nervy 4-3 Posh win.

* Live television cameras came to Peterborough for the first time when Swindon visited for a First Division encounter on November 29, 1992, and the 5,976 who sacrificed their armchairs for a place on the terraces were treated to a six-goal thriller. It finished 3-3 with Posh's Tony Adcock (pictured above right) and Town's Shaun Taylor each bagging a brace. Taylor also scored and an own goal, while Craig Maskell was also on target for the visitors.

* Popular goalkeeper John Turner made his Posh debut in a 1-1 draw against Swindon at the County Ground on Sunday October 7, 1984. Trevor Slack scored Posh's goal, but John Wile's team were grateful for Turner's late save from Town goalscorer Alan Mayes.

Our quiz night a couple of weeks back attracted a good attendance and we raised almost £200 on the night for the Supporters Club. Many thanks to everyone that

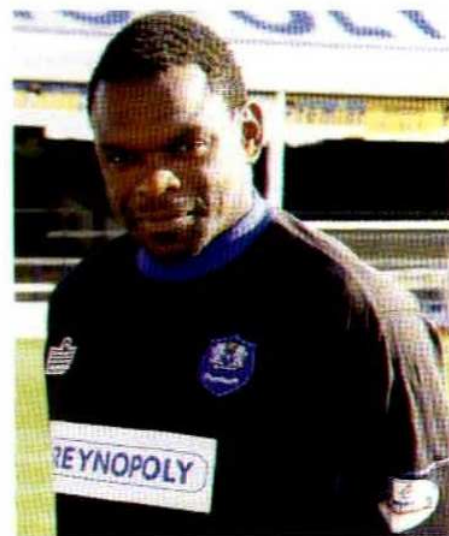
attended, particularly IKEA who probably made up 50% of the teams.

Today we extend a special welcome to members of TrustSTFC. Putting match results to one side, our visits to the County Ground are always a pleasure, because we enjoy calling in at the TrustSTFC office and hearing their latest news.

During the month of April the trust is holding two sportsmen's dinners in aid of the Red Army Fund, which helps to pay for new players - this can mean paying all or part of a player's salary, funding a loan signing or paying a transfer fee for a player that the club could not otherwise afford. The amount raised recently passed £3,000.

This season TrustSTFC is sponsoring the club's training facilities at Wanborough at a cost of £8,000.

These initiatives go to prove once again that the agenda within each supporters' trust is totally different to that of other trusts. The objectives that trusts set themselves are usually driven by the state of the football club and the relationship between the club and the trust.

A MESSAGE TO MEMBERS OF THE POSH SUPPORTERS' TRUST FROM SUPPORTERS DIRECT*

First of all, Supporters Direct is an Industrial and Provident Society, and accountable to its members - that's your trust and 108 others around the UK. We take pride in what our members are doing at their trusts (and in many cases, clubs) and are keen to publicise and celebrate those achievements. With every new trust that joins us, every new member recruited, every

shareholding bought, every seat gained on the board and every club taken over, supporters' trusts are showing that they can not only have a serious voice in the game, but can run it better. With Bees United (Brentford) and the K's Trust at Kingstonian in negotiations to buy their clubs, we're now tantalisingly close to our trust-owned first eleven! Don't forget, whether your trust

is in England, Wales or Scotland, you're all part of this increasingly influential organisation and we're proud of what you're all doing to change the face of football.

You may have heard that the Treasury was recently discussing, with Supporters Direct, the possibility of tax breaks for our trusts. This has moved on since the first announcement of a review in last November's 'pre-Budget Report'. Hidden away in the Budget Report published in March, the Treasury has pledged to seek a way for trusts to 'maximise the benefit they receive from the contributions of their members'. To the untrained eye, a short statement in a report of this size may not seem like much, but this now means the Treasury is moving the idea to the next stage and is in continuing dialogue with us over the best way to achieve this. The Posh Supporters' Trust will keep you in touch with developments.

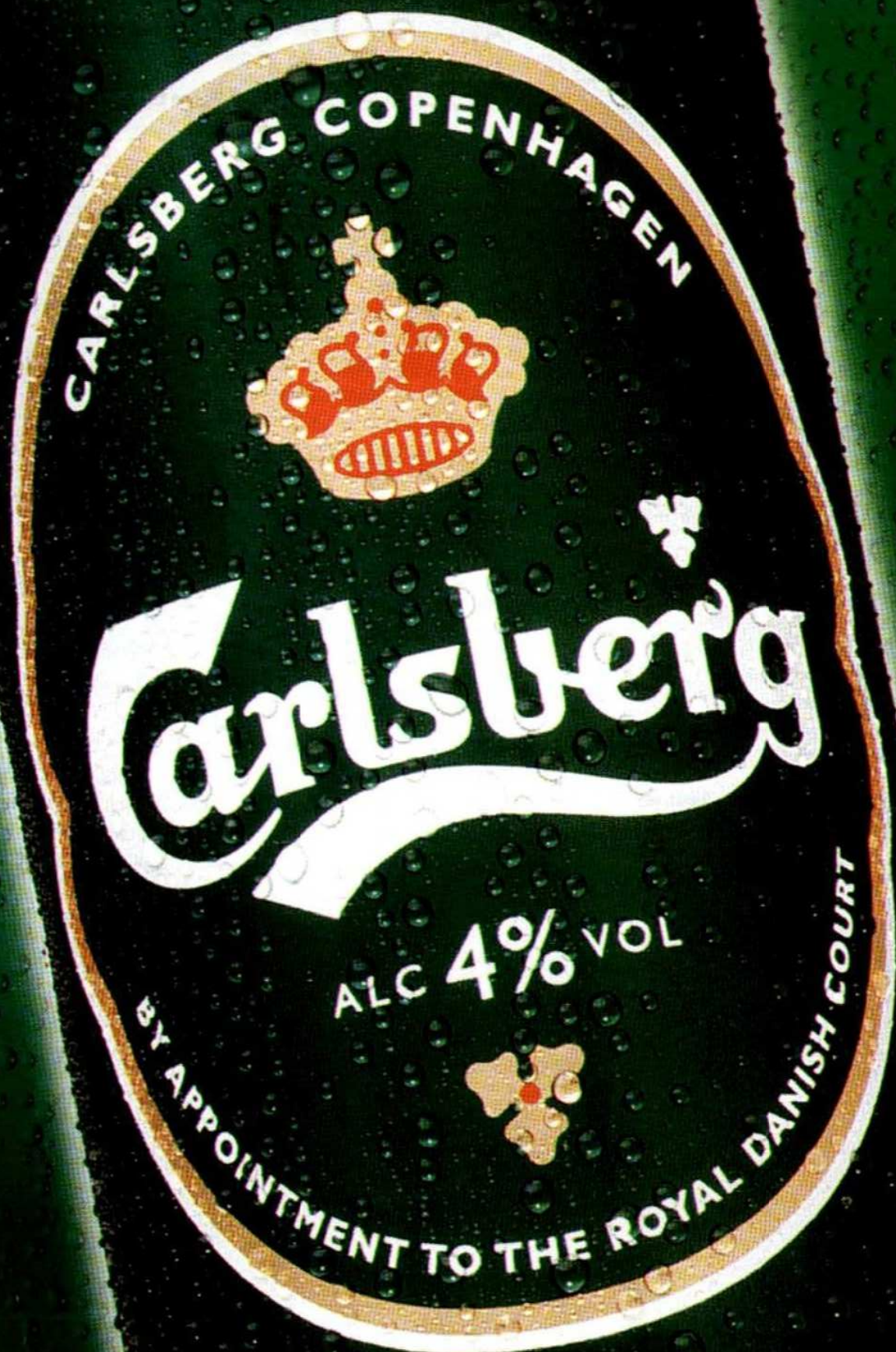

Bristol City On The Slide

It is getting into the business end of the league season and Danny Wilson's Bristol City are hitting a sticky patch at the worst possible time. The Robins are without a victory on the road in four matches as they suffered a 2-1 defeat at Port Vale last weekend.

After boosting their squad on transfer deadline day with the arrival of Scott Murray (moving back to Ashton Gate from Reading), Tony Rougier (from struggling Brentford) and Posh target Darren Caskey (on non-contract terms from Notts. County), a win at Vale was more than likely.

However, Stephen Brooker and Marc Bridge-Wilkinson scored the goals to earn Vale three points to keep them in the hunt for a play-off spot, with Lee Peacock firing a last-minute consolation for the Robins, who will be desperate for a victory against promotion rivals QPR today.

QPR themselves will be hoping for

maximum points after they were held to a 1-1 draw by Luton Town at Loftus Road, despite taking the lead through ex-Chelsea front man Paul Furlong. Enoch Showunmi scored the equaliser for Mike Newell's Hatters.

It seems that whenever one team thinks they have lost ground by not picking up maximum points, their promotion rivals stutter too and Plymouth were thankful their 0-0 draw against nine-men Wrexham was not catastrophic for their automatic promotion hopes.

Swindon Stutter Ahead Of Posh Meeting

Swindon Town remain in fourth slot in the league table, but are without a win in their last two matches after they were held to a surprise 1-1 draw by Barnsley at the County Ground. Having said that, Barnsley are the draw specialists with 16 already from their 38 matches.

Paul Hart has yet to see his side win, but he would have been pleased with the battling performance against Swindon, especially after falling 1-0 behind to a Sam Parkin strike. Daniel Nardiello grabbed the equaliser for the Tykes on 36 minutes to earn a share of the spoils.

Brighton and Hove Albion missed the chance to leapfrog Swindon as they were undone by a last-minute Robbie Mustoe (pictured left) strike at Hillsborough as Sheffield Wednesday earned a 2-1 win. Chris Brunt had given the Owls the lead before Richard Carpenter levelled. Of course, all the attention at Hillsborough was on Ken Bates, who is desperate to put some of his considerable fortune into the Owls.

Eight-Goal Thriller At Saltergate

Some supporters leave games early, but if anybody chose to leave Saltergate 10 minutes before the end of last week's encounter between Chesterfield and Grimsby





Town then they would have been in for a shock when they looked at the final score on teletext when they got home.

The relegation six-pointer incredibly ended 4-4 with three goals in the final three minutes. Glynn Hurst, playing his last game before a three-match ban, put the Spireites in front, but Iain Anderson and Jamie Lawrence put the Mariners in control before the break.

However, David Reeves scored twice to put the hosts back in front and with a few minutes to go it looked like Roy McFarland's side had earned a valuable win. However, Darren Barnard levelled and then 60 seconds later Isiah Rankin scored again to make it 4-3 to the visitors. With the tension mounting, the referee awarded a spot-kick to Chesterfield and Reeves stepped up to complete his hat-trick.

Also at the bottom of the table, Wycombe secured their first win in 2004 with an edgy 3-2 win at Oldham Athletic. Nathan Tyson scored twice and Craig Faulconbridge was also on target for Tony Adams side at Boundary Park. Tranmere Rovers hammered Notts. County 4-0 to ease them away from relegation trouble, but County are now facing an uphill

battle. Eugene Dadi and Iain Hume **(pictured above)** both scored braces in that game.

The other side in the bottom four is Stockport, but they will be buoyed by their 1-1 draw at Blackpool, although by all accounts Aaron Wilbraham's equaliser looked at least two yards offside. Mike Sheron scored for the Seaside and LDV Vans Trophy winners.

Best of the Rest

To wrap up the rest of the action, Brentford moved out of the bottom four with their second win in a row as they earned a creditable 2-1 victory at Hartlepool United. Jay Tabb and Matt Dobson scored the goals for the Bees. The team to watch is Rushden and Diamonds - after losing their manager Brian Talbot to Oldham - they went on to lose five first team regulars on transfer deadline day and then suffered a 3-0 mauling by AFC Bournemouth at Nene Park.

Player-boss Barry Hunter has a major job at the Diamonds and they are far from safe, especially with Onandi Lowe, Paul Hall, Paul Underwood, Daniel Talbot and Rodney Jack all leaving for pastures new.
