This week we reflect on defeat against Luton, community success and do you fancy working at Swindon Town FC?

S windon Town's first home game of the new League One campaign ended with defeat on Wednesday night after going down 3-2 to an energetic Luton Town side.

An improved second half performance almost saw Town claim an unlikely looking draw but the damage had already been done in the first 45 minutes.

Sean O'Hanlon was adjudged to have hauled back Rowan Vine and Kevin Nicholls fired the visitors into the lead from the penalty spot after 24 minutes. In the 37th minute Rory Fallon made it 2-0 as he headed the ball past Rhys Evans before Sam Parkin made it 2-1 just before the break with a well-taken goal.

In the second period imposing striker Steve Howard made it 3-1 before Alan Reeves reduced the deficit with a bullet header on 65 minutes. Despite bombarding the Hatters goal in the final stages, Town come into today's game pointless after a second defeat in as many games.

After the game Andy King told Swindontownfc.co.uk: "When we got our second goal I expected us to get a third but the bottom line is that you can't give these sorts of teams a start like we did. The reaction and effort from us after going 3-1 down was good but we gave ourselves an uphill battle. We have to concentrate for ninety minutes and be defensively sound, we weren't against Luton."

I still feel that the side is capable of achieving this season. Hopefully as you read these notes now we will be coming into this game with a victory against Luton.

Manager Stuart Murdoch brings his recently re-named Milton Keynes Dons to the County Ground for the first Saturday home game of the new campaign. Relegated at the end of last season, the Dons arrive looking to start afresh and bounce straight back into the Championship. A home draw and an away defeat has seen them off to a tough start to life in League One.

or most clubs pre-season brings a few new players and maybe the odd change in management, but for today's visitors it meant a total face-lift.

Relegation to the third tier of the professional game last term was a blow to Wimbledon Football Club after a fairytale rise to the top of English football over the previous two decades. However, big changes have followed with a new name, a new kit, a new badge and perhaps new successes on the field.

With the move to the National Hockey Stadium in Milton Keynes on 27th September the club opened a new chapter in its history. Support for the move has split the clubs fan base but the relocation and subsequent rebranding has created the opportunity for the people of Milton Keynes to make the club their own.

Don's boss Stuart Murdoch was an active man during the summer with 8 players coming into the squad while 15 players waved goodbye, including Warren Barton who retired and Dean Holdsworth who joined nonleague Havant & Waterlooville. Amongst the new faces is Gareth Edds who will be familiar to Town fans after spending a year at the County Ground.

Life in League One began last weekend with a 1-1 draw at home to Barnsley followed on Tuesday night with a 3-2 loss at Port Vale.

GarySmith

S tuart Murdoch again secure the services of skilful midfield man Gary Smith for the current campaign after signing the player on a free transfer from Middlesbrough. Smith had begun his footballing life as a trainee at the north east club.

The 20-year-old Riverside youngster had already impressed last season after arriving at the National Hockey Stadium on Ioan in late March. He made 10 starts at the end of the league campaign and made his mark with 3 goals. At Ipswich he scored a consolation for the Dons in only his second game for the club. He also hit the target against Bradford and Gillingham.

Smith is the first choice in central midfield being both good on the ball and aware of goal scoring opportunities. Although not fully match fit last season he proved to be one of the high points of a tough campaign often making a late impact on games. This season will bring high hopes that he will prove his potential, linking in the middle of the park with tough tackling ball winners like Laurent Herve and Ben Chorley, thereby offering them an outlet for creativity and goalscoring flair from midfield.

StuartMurdoch

How many managers travel an extra 70 miles to go to work but without moving clubs? Stuart Murdoch is such a manager having travelled with the Dons as part of the relocation. Since taking over the hot seat in June 2002, Murdoch has been in charge for just over 100 games.

He began as caretaker boss after Terry Burton's departure and impressed the board into giving him the job on a permanent basis. Having steered the side into 10th place during his first season in charge he was unable to stop the slide last campaign as the Dons finished bottom of the table. This was more to do with the loss of players through a difficult financial period than through Murdoch's skills as the man in charge.

Murdoch's association with the Dons began in 1998 when he joined the club as goalkeeping coach after holding a similar position at Watford. He worked under Joe Kinnear amongst others and looked after such notable keepers as Neil Sullivan.



GarethEdds

Marshall

K Dons midfielder Gareth Edds needs no introduction to The County Ground having been a member of Andy King's squad during the 2002-2003 season.

Gareth is an Australian U23 international defender who joined MK Dons in July from Bradford City.

He came through the youth ranks at Nottingham Forest, before spells at The County Ground under Andy King and with the Bantams. He made just 18 appearances in a Town shirt before being handed a free transfer and after a season at Bradford, joined up with the newly named MK Dons.

During his time at Forest, he became acquainted with then reserve coach Jimmy Gilligan, who is now of course first team coach at Milton Keynes Dons. Edds was on the bench for the Dons in last weekend's home draw with Barnsley and returns to Wiltshire for the first time this afternoon.



Firstly Gareth, tell us a bit about yourself.

"I went to a sports school in Australia where they had football as a specialist sport as part of the lessons. A brilliant coach called David Lee helped me a lot and I eventually came over to Leeds United on what they call a 'Big Brother' scholarship, where you went to a club for five weeks to see how you get on. Harry Kewell was also on it.

I learnt my trade, working with people like Paul Hart, Jimmy Gilligan, Steve Wigley and David Platt. They were the people that helped me through.

"After six years at Forest I went to Swindon, where I stayed for about nine months until I was snapped up by Bradford City. There were some experienced players like David Weatherall and Wayne Jacobs there, and they were really excellent for saying we were allowed to go. A lot of players made the decision to leave because of the financial troubles.

"There were problems in paying the wages and we had to make a decision both in financial and playing terms. I knew Jimmy Gilligan from my days at Forest and that was a big influence on my move to the Dons."

So how are things going so far at your new Club?



definitely got a good chance of being in the top half.

"I've played in this division before with Swindon - it's a tough division but I think we've got what it takes to make the jump up."

And how was preseason in Iceland?

"It's was good fun out there. It was cold, but apart from that the lads enjoyed it. We got through a lot of hard

"Current Barnsley manager Paul Hart was leaving Elland Road at the time to join Nottingham Forest and I followed him there. I ended up having six years at Forest, which I enjoyed tremendously. It was a great club to be at, the professionalism was unbelievable, and that's basically where

me. I really enjoyed it and it got me back on track to basically where I am now."

What was the situation at Bradford City?

"Every player there was on a free transfer. The administrators were in charge of the club and they gave us all a letter "I'm very pleased with the club. I think it's heading in the right direction. I think we've got some good players and to be honest I think we've got a good chance this coming season if everyone stays fit. We've got some experienced players and also some young players with great enthusiasm, and we've

hose that turned up to watch Town's charges warm-up against last season's FA Cup runners up, Millwall in July, could have been forgiven for thinking that Andy King had pulled off a transfer coup of titanic proportions.

For playing in the centre of the usual suspects in midfield appeared to be a 'continental' looking midfielder (hair tied back with alice band - you know what I mean), stroking the ball around nonchalantly and looking comfortable on the ball amid the snappy legs of messrs Wise and Morris. Could it be that the gaffer had managed to prise Totti away from Roma? Crespo from Chelsea perhaps? Alas no, for on closer inspection we find out it's none other than the boy from Brazil, Stefani Miglioranzi! "I'm not as good as Totti, for starters," laughs our Mig when I quiz him on his flowing locks. Having seen Totti's tempestuous performances in Euro 2004 I'm not so sure - but at least the gaffer will feel like he's landed a European to boss the midfield this season!

The current campaign will be the former Pompey midfielder's third successive season in a red and white shirt - not bad for a player signed initially on a month-to-month contract in July 2002. Complimenting Hewlett's robust style of play and Turbo Robinson's tireless efforts the County Ground faithful have enjoyed watching Miglioranzi getting his foot on the ball, slowing the game down to his own pace and bringing other players into play from his central midfield position - a rarity in these parts since the days of John Moncur and Micky Hazard. Not only that, but who can forget his infamous strip on the pitch at the end of the 2002/03 campaign, when he left the pitch wearing nothing more than his under-crackers? You made your debut against Wimbledon two years ago in a pre-season friendly - what do you remember about your impressions of the club back then?

It was such a long time ago now, but I remember being grateful for a fresh start at the time. I was happy with the club - I had seen evidence of some good players and so I was looking forward to the challenge. I remember playing against Wimbledon as well, they were very physical and I'm sure probably still will be - even if the name has changed!

They were a difficult side to beat then - what do you know about them this time around?

Like a number of sides in this division now; very little. I have played against them a few times in my career and they have always been a tough side to beat - and I can imagine that it will be more of the same now. I must say I'm surprised by the way in which they have come down the divisions - but a lot of the old players have gone and they'll be very much an unknown quantity.

Playing on a monthto-month contract back then, did you ever expect to be here two years on, to have played so many games and experienced so much?

That was the plan - I'd been injured and so was hoping for a regular spell in the side to make an impression - and so far it's worked out well. I have always worked hard to try and maintain a high level of performance because inside me there is always a small hope that perhaps one day I can play at a higher level?

Last year was a good season for you personally consistently good form and four goals - what's your aim this year?

To be better, not just for myself but for the team. Yes I'd like to score more goals, but playing to a higher level and helping the team achieve its goal is what I'll be hoping for.

How did you relax in the summer after the exertions of last season? Was it a case of spending time with the family - did you get back to New York or Brazil? It was difficult to forget what happened at the end of the season. I tried to involve myself with family things but it's hard, the pain of something like that doesn't go away. It is possibly my worst experience in football, other than being injured, but these things can often drive you on and I think it will be the motivation we need to succeed this year. But I managed to get over to Brazil to see my auntie, uncle and cousins - my Mum joined us from New York and my sister travelled over with me from England too - it was the first time we had all met up for five years, so that was cool.

We hear you've started playing the guitar in your spare time too...

I have a lot of free time as a footballer and it's a calming influence for me. I've been playing for a year-and-a-half now and I'm getting better, although there's no plan for a rock band just yet! I think I'm at the stage where I need more direction, but it's nice to play when with the family and stuff.







A little birdie also tells me you can sleep for England - is this true?

(laughs) I do like to relax, especially after training. It's not been unknown for me to sleep after training, straight through to the next morning - I suppose it depends how much sleep I get the night before!

And you've also defected to Oxfordshire? Had you had enough with lift-sharing with Sam Parkin...

No, I had some good times with Sam and we became good friends when travelling up from London - he was good company. But the travelling was getting to me and where I live now, it's so much quieter. I spend less time in the car and I appreciate it. After the coach told me to bulk up, I probably went to the gym every day for about seven years..

Is it true that when you were in America, you were once told you were too skinny to make it?

Yeah. I was building up to university and was playing for a local uni side. The coach back then suggested that I needed to bulk up if I was going to progress any further and so he put me on this weight programme. I did it religiously, and probably went every day for about seven years...

Good effort, and it's paid off....

Yes it has, but it was a lot of hard work.

When you arrived in England you had clubs fighting for your services - looking back on your career changes do you ever regret not staying with Everton?

No, because I would have been playing reserve team football.

But you could have played with Wayne Rooney...

I suppose so, but I don't really remember many young players from my Everton days, just the likes of Don Hutchison and Nick Barmby... But Portsmouth gave me a chance of first team football and I took it. And after my first season, when I received offers from clubs like Bolton, I decided to stay on because Alan Ball had convinced me I was part of his plans.

I suppose if you hadn't joined Pompey you wouldn't have teamed up with Mr Igoe...

(laughs again) He was introduced to me as 'the lizard', I've never known why - you'll have to ask him. He was shorter back then...

What's the story behind the new haircut? One fan behind me at the Millwall game thought we'd signed Totti!

I decided to grow it last year for a bit of a change. I'm not sure if it'll be around much longer, though...

Everyone knows you as a nice guy, but the gaffer has always gone on about us being too nice as a team. You've only been booked twice in



your time here, has he ever tried to toughen you up?

I don't think the gaffer sees it as a character flaw, and that ruthless edge isn't really me - I can't change myself.

Fair enough. One final question then: apart from us (fingers crossed) - who do you think will be at the top end of the table come May?

Bristol City, Tranmere and Hull - they're a bit of an unknown quantity but have a bit of money. But we have enough talent here, if we apply ourselves well we won't have to worry about anyone else.

A fter the City derby on August 21st it's the Carling Cup, where we visit Nene Park, home of Rushden and Diamonds, the only senior club in England named after a Breakfast TV presenter.

Getting there:

Unfortunately, another unique thing about Nene Park (pronounced Nenn by the locals for some unknown reason) is that it is the furthest senior club ground from a railway station, Wellingborough being all of six miles away, so with it being mid-week, road transport appears to be the only feasible option as follows: A420 then A34 round the top of Oxford, carry on through the Pear Tree interchange until you hit the M40. Go north for one junction until the A43. Follow A43 to Northampton, then A45 to the junction with the A6, turn left towards Irthlingborough, ground is on your right where there is acres of parking space. It's about 90 miles.

Pubs:

None immediately around the ground. Try the Needle and Awl, Northampton Road, Rushden, just off the A45, one junction before the A6. It's a typical Tom Cobleigh pub, i.e. huge! Excellent selection of food, Sky TV, serves Fosters, Stella, Guiness, Greene King IPA and Abbott amongst others.

Ground:

A) The perfect blue print for all small clubs to follow or B) dull, soulless with no atmosphere or character depending on your point of view!

Fave game:

Only been once (like most Town fans I expect) last Boxing Day, the only memorable moment being Rory clumping Barry Hunter after 20 minutes of his full debut and getting red carded. I wished I'd stayed in the Needle and Awl!

On the last League game of last season, Town faced Hartlepool United with both teams chasing a play-off place. Just three home game later on 28th August, 'Pools return at the start of 2004/5 to begin the process all over again.

Hartlepool's new campaign started at home to Bradford City when goals from Adam Boyd and Hugh Robertson overturned a goal deficit to start the campaign on a winning note. Then Robertson was on target again last Tuesday when he opened the scoring at Tranmere, a game



that ultimately ended in defeat after Rovers replied twice.

Ex-Torquay United striker Eifion Williams finished last season's top scorer on 13 with Boyd just one behind.

Manager Neale Cooper retained most of his squad through the summer including his two top scorers. 21 year-old keeper Jim Provett missed just one game last term after coming through as a trainee and he is again between the posts, while ever present midfielder Richie Humphreys beat even Provett's appearance tally.

That 46th game of the season last May ended in a 1-1 draw, a result which gave both clubs a top six finish, although 2003/04 ended in disappointment for both Town and Hartlepool, beaten in the play-offs by Brighton and Bristol City respectively.

A play-off place must be considered the minimum requirement for both clubs this time around. How important will the points on offer in two weeks time turnout to be for either club in nine months time?
