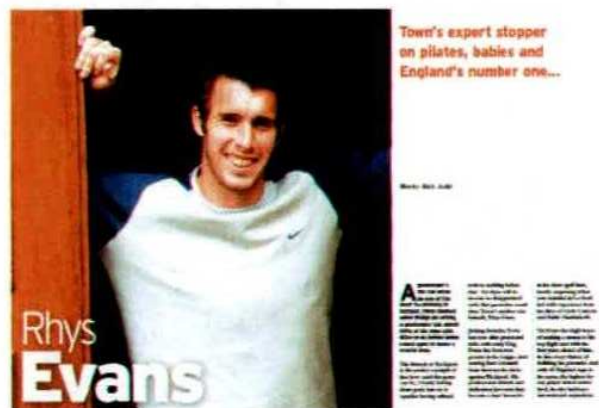

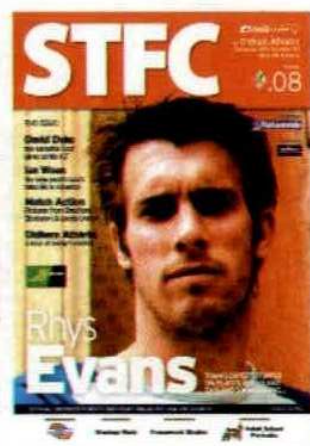

One fan even became involved during a melee of players following during the sending off of striker Sam Parkin. The supporter was escorted from the pitch by two players and was then apprehended by stewards.

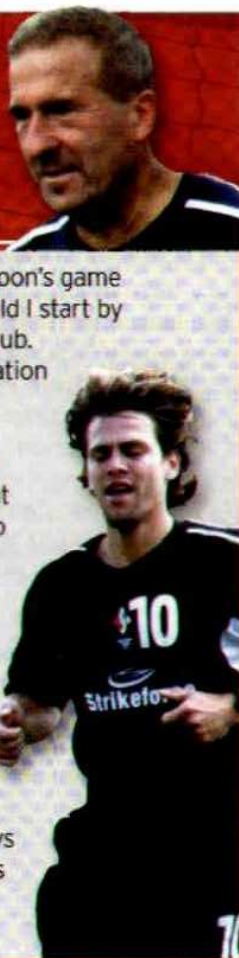
The Police then arrested both men and whether or not they are convicted in court, the club can confirm that both will receive life bans from the County Ground.

Shortly after completing his first training session with his new teammates, the Aussie spoke to Swindontownfc.co.uk

"I know a few of the players down here already, which makes it a bit easier coming into a place that you are not used too.

"I have played up front for the last three or four years but I originally came over here as a midfielder so I will just have to



wait and see what kind of system he wants to play. They play really good football down here and all the Leeds players were impressed when they came to Elland Road recently.

"At 21 I need to be getting a lot of games under my belt because my career has only just started. Things at Leeds have gone a little bit stale at the moment but I just need to come here and do well for Swindon and for myself."

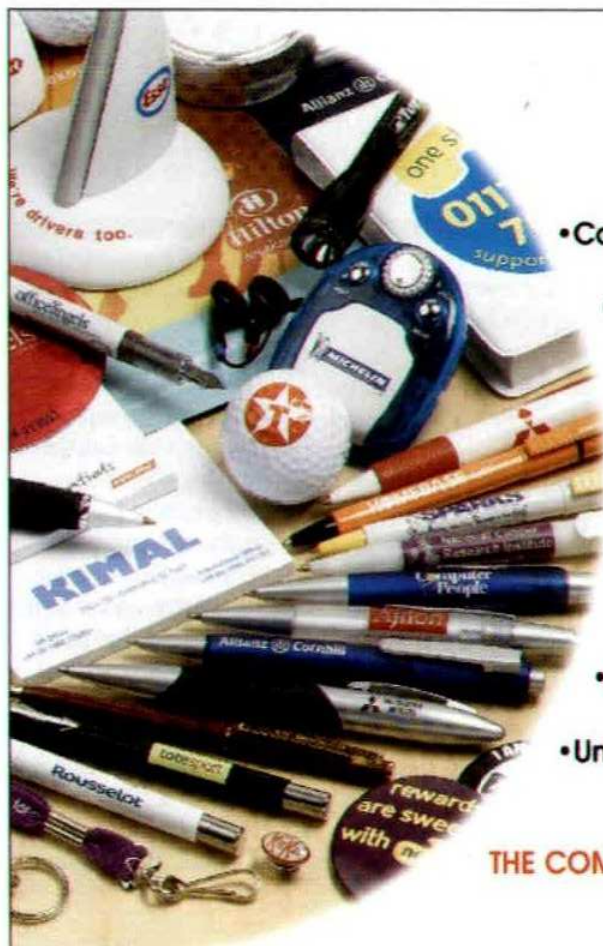

By now many of you will no doubt have heard that Sir Stanley Clarke Chairman of St.Modwen passed away peacefully last month at his home in Barton-under-Needwood Staffordshire.

St.Modwen, through Sir Stanley's stewardship, has been working with this Club in a Joint Venture to identify a suitable site within the Swindon area to develop a new stadium. I am sure you will join me and the Board by sending our heart felt condolences to his family, friends and

business colleagues. He will be sadly missed by all.

It seems a long time since we played our last game at the County Ground, in fact it is three weeks, but as they say three weeks is a long time in football! The postponement of the Sheffield Wednesday game could not have come a more inconvenient time. The match, however, is re-scheduled for 27th.October and although we will have the enjoyment of a mid week game the financial implications to the Club

are considerable. Apart from the immediate cash-flow implications, a mid-week game traditionally attracts less support than a normal Saturday fixture and as a result Sheffield Wednesday's support will be reduced by around 2000 fans. The financial consequences will be felt for the remainder of the season as the loss of revenue will be in the region of 40k.

Why on earth do the powers that control football agree to international fixtures which coincide with Football League games?

Now for the good news. Christian Roberts has signed for the Club in a deal with Bristol City that will see him playing at The County Ground until the end of the 2006/7 season. According to Andy, Christian will bring to the Club a greater depth and another dimension to the squad.

Let's get behind Christian this afternoon and give him a traditional Town welcome.

The past has proved to us that games against Oldham are difficult and that the divide in the division is minimal. Our results against them have proved what a challenging match this can be.

I watched them last Sunday against Blackpool and they were without two internationals in Rodney Jack and Jermaine Johnson. I am sure that if these two players return to action this afternoon they will strengthen the Latics side.

We have been without a game for two weeks after the call-off against Sheffield Wednesday. The break has given us the opportunity to review the game at Stockport where we played very poorly and showed no discipline. In the end it was a fair result and in that respect my pre-match team talk has been done for me. I look at the performances at Walsall and Stockport in particular as we look to put a run together, starting today. We need to put a string of results together if we are going to maintain a

challenging position. Hopefully we will have had a game behind closed doors in the build-up to today's game. We are five weeks without a reserve game and a game was organized in the week to give Andy Nicholas, Sam Parkin and Matty Heywood some valuable match practice.

'Woany' assures me that if I play him in 35 games then we will make the play-offs. What a wonderful thought!

As you may have read, Ian Woan has returned to the Club as Youth Team Coach. I believe he will be a major influence not only on the youth set-up, but also others around him. He tells me he played 35 games for his team in America and that they wouldn't have made the play-offs without him. He assures me that if I play him in 35 games then we will make the play-offs. What a wonderful thought! I

am open minded and he was due to play in the fore-mentioned practice game and as with Alan Reeves, I have no boundaries when it comes to age. It is a wonderful signing both on the playing and coaching side and I look forward to working with him.

The only unfortunate news on the injury front is that Stefani Miglioranzi has been diagnosed with an abductor strain. This means he may be out of action for up to five weeks, if you take into account the time it could take to regain match fitness. 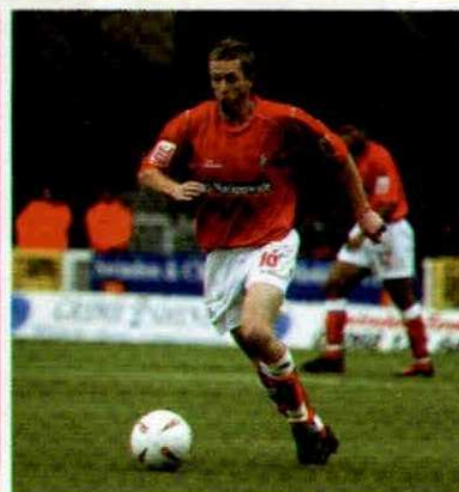

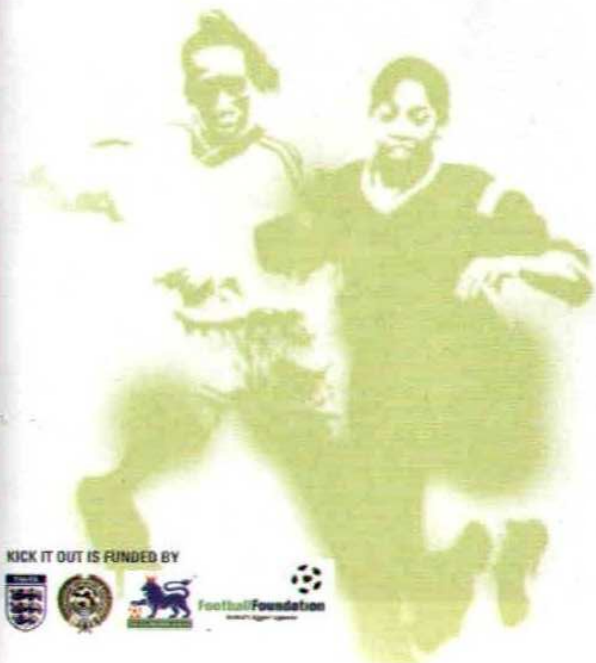

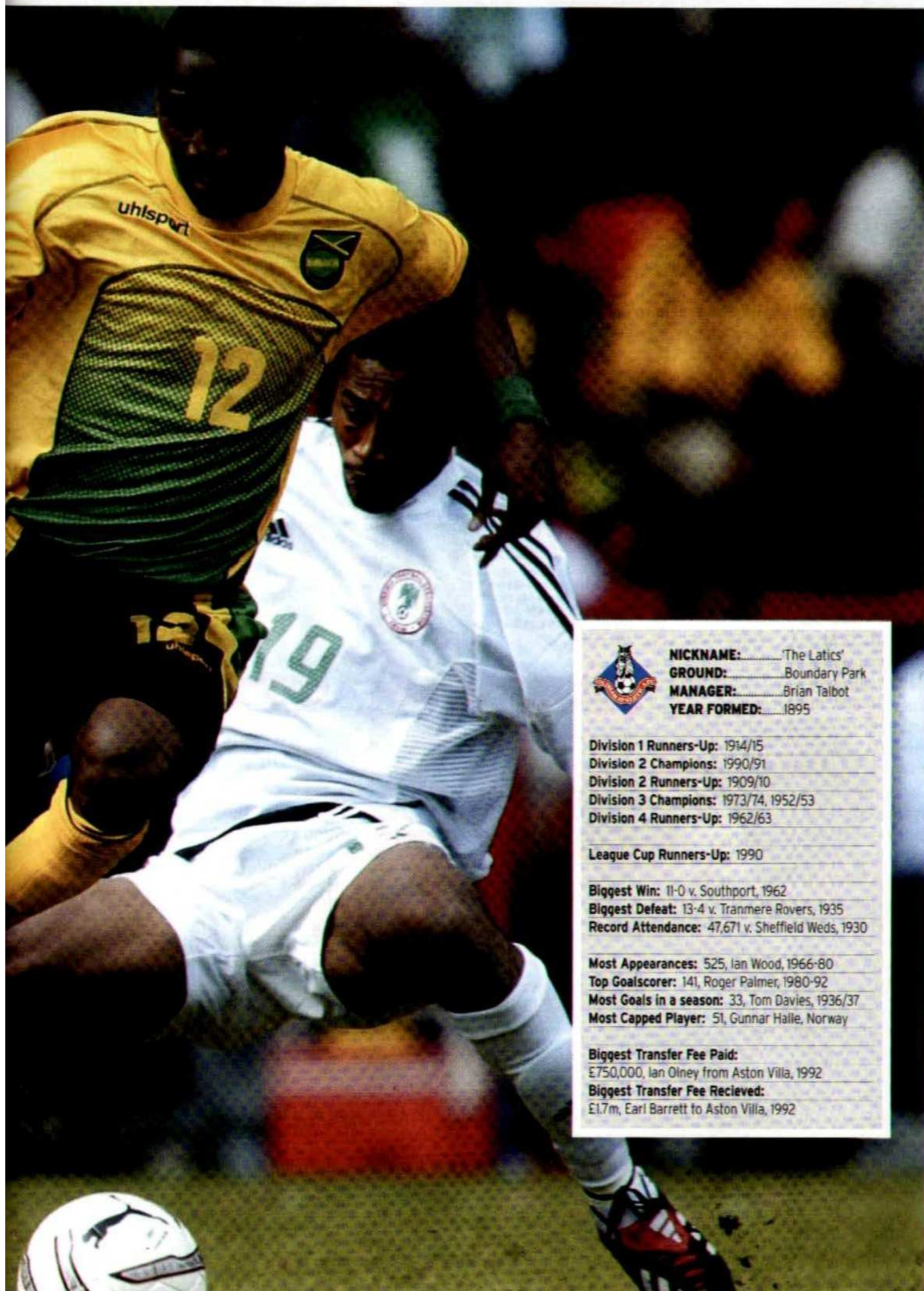

The Latics' Squad

Like many clubs, in what is now becoming an all too familiar story, it's been a tough couple of years for Oldham Athletic Football Club. But in the case of the Latics there seems to have been a pot of gold at the end of the rainbow.

Twelve months ago it looked like the end of the road for football at Boundary Park but just when all seemed lost along came hope for the future in the shape of three successful business men. Simon Corney, Simon Blitz and Daniel Gazal stepped in to buy the club around December last year giving the Latics fans the best possible Christmas present. The New York based Londoners made their money in telecommunications and followed up the rescue by agreeing a deal to buy back the ground from the local Council giving the club an opportunity to make plans for redevelopment.

On the playing side Brian Talbot took over from Iain Dowie in March this year following Dowie's earlier exit for Crystal Palace. His Latics side hasn't yet made a positive impression on League One this season currently sitting in 20th spot without an away win. Last Sunday they lost 1-2 at home to Blackpool leaving them on a run of 5 league games without a win.

1 LesPogliacomi

Regular first choice keeper who recently lost his place through injury. The giant Australian will be expected to regain the number one spot from the deputising Craig Mawson.



2 DeanHolden

An experienced defender, Dean, 35, was signed from Bolton in May 2002 after a lengthy loan spell at Boundary Park. Has played in every game this season.



3 AdamGriffin

Adaptable player who can play at either left back or left sided midfield. Came through the youth ranks at Boundary Park to establish his place in the team after an injury battle.



4 MarkBonner

Returned to the starting line-up last Sunday against Blackpool. The midfielder joined from Cardiff on deadline day last season and his performances were rewarded with a 2 year contract.



5 WillHaining

Began as a trainee at Oldham but now an established member of the first team. Will, 22, is a rugged central defender who has also played in every game this season.



6 MarkArber

Veteran, South Africa born defender who began as a trainee at Spurs. Made 188 appearances for Barnet and 75 for Peterborough before joining the Latics in June this year.



7 MattyAppleby

Middlesbrough born Matt, 32, is an experienced head in midfield. His Oldham career has been hit hard by injury and he is only just returning to action after a season out.



8 DannyBoshell

Another trainee who has now firmly established himself in the heart of midfield. Unlucky with injury in the past but this season is having a good run in the side.



9 RodneyJack

Followed boss Brian Talbot from Rushden to Oldham. The lightning quick St Vincent international began at Torquay before a £650,000 move to Crewe where he scored 42 times in 186 games.



10 JohnEyre

Began his career at Oldham before a £40,000 move to Scunthorpe in 1995 where he scored 50 goals in 190 appearances. Moved to Hull before returning to the Latics in 2001.



12 ChrisKillen

New Zealand international striker, Chris, 23, signed for Oldham from Man. City for £200,000 in July 2002. Has only netted once this season so far in 8 appearances.



23 KevinBetsy

Has already appeared at the County Ground this season as a substitute for Hartlepool in August. Joined the Latics from Victoria Park on a free transfer in early September.



28 DavidEyes

Vastly experienced attacking midfielder man. David, 40, continues to perform having made over 700 appearances for Blackpool, Burnley, Preston and Oldham scoring 165 goals. A model professional.

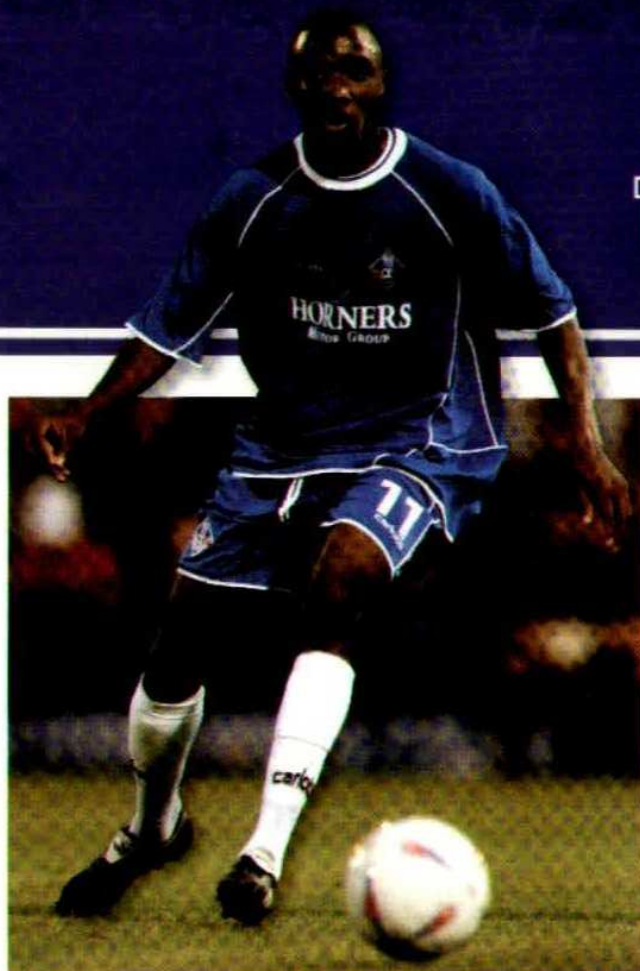

11 OnetoWatch Jermaine Johnson

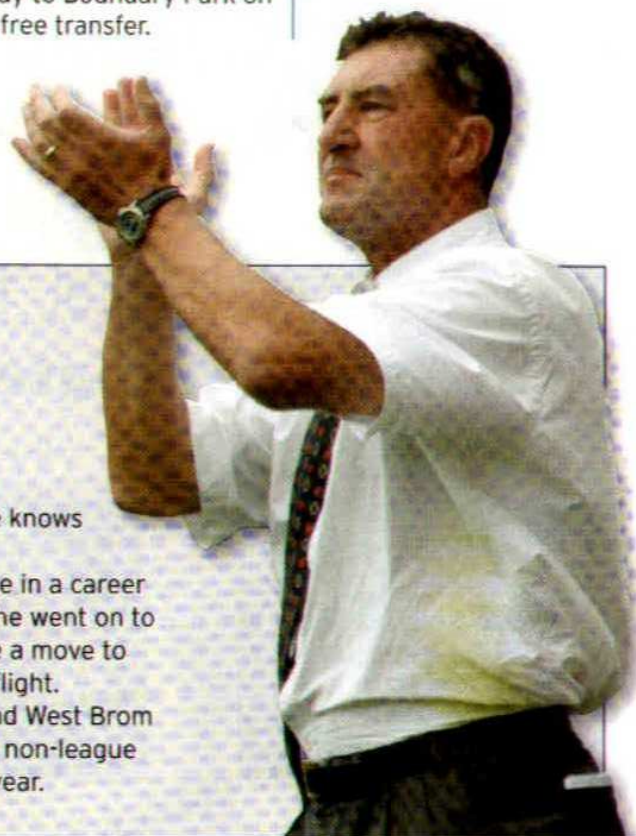
Full of pace and skill, Jermaine, 24, impressed previous manager Iain Dowie, who persuaded the Trotters to allow him to make the short journey along the M60 from the Reebok. Initially the loan spell was for one month in December 2002 but injury extended this to a second month, which then became a third. Finally, in March last year, following his return to Bolton, agreement was reached between the two clubs and Jermaine was on his way to Boundary Park on a free transfer.

During his successful loan spell the attacking midfielder had scored 4 times in 14 games. Since signing for the club full time he has added another 6 goals in 20 appearances but has added more pace to the Latics attacking options.

A regular member of the Jamaican international side, Jermaine and the Reggae Boyz this week visited Panama followed by a home tie with El Salvador.

The Latics eventually got their man when Jamaican international Jermaine Johnson finally agreed to sign for the Boundary Park club from Bolton

Wanderers on transfer deadline day last season. A deal was done lasting the rest of the campaign, which was followed in the summer by a further one year extension.



thegaffer Brian Talbot

As a player Brian Talbot had a reputation as a tough, no nonsense midfielder and as a manager he has proved he knows how to get the best out of limited resources.

Vastly experienced, Talbot played 533 times in the league in a career spanning 23 years. Starting as an apprentice at Ipswich he went on to make 177 league appearances for the Suffolk club before a move to Arsenal where he played a further 254 times in the top flight.

His early management experience included Aldershot and West Brom before spending 7 years at Rushden whom he took from non-league football into Division 2. He joined Oldham in March this year.

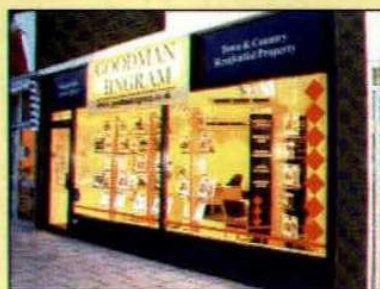

Jermaine Johnson

Jamaican International Jermaine Johnson had been a long-term target of former manager Iain Dowie before eventually arriving at Boundary Park on loan from Bolton Wanderers on November 28th 2003.

A skillful attacking midfielder, he spent three successful months on loan at Oldham last season and agreed a permanent move to the Latics having put pen to paper on a one-year deal.

It has certainly been a busy start to the campaign for Johnson, who has scored four goals, picked up a

Johnson has had various partners in the Latics frontline so far this season. Chris Killen has recently returned from injury meaning that a settled strikeforce has not been easy to come by so far this campaign. 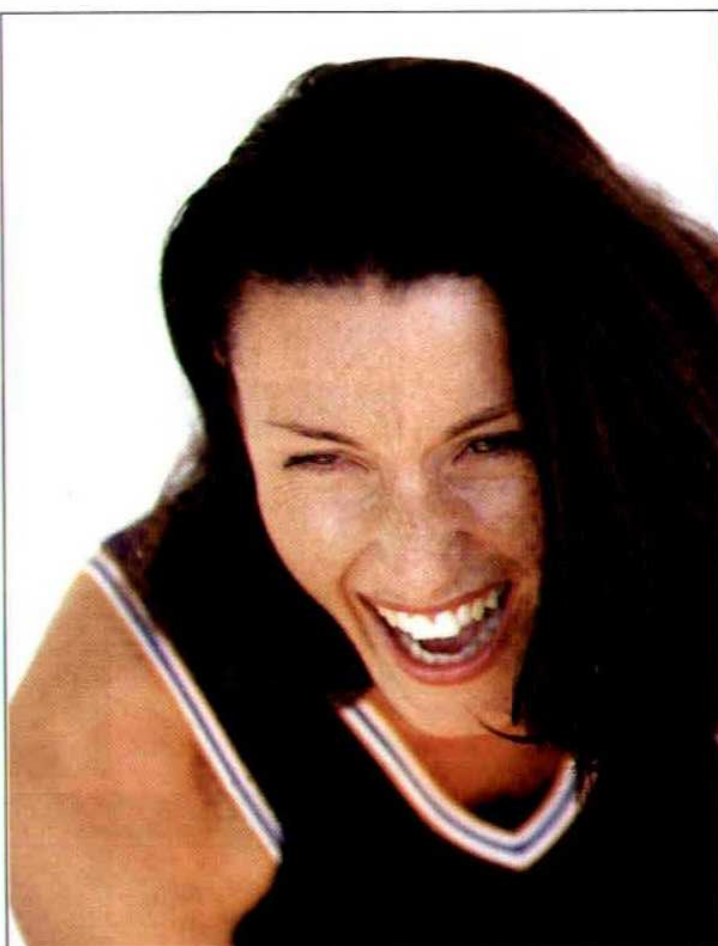

The instant joke was that it clearly wouldn't be because of Town players receiving such recognition - that may not really be a fair comment!

Last season, of course, Andy King offered up

Andy Nicholas for the England under-21s after seeing Sam Allardyce do something similar for Kevin Nolan. There was also temporary transfer James Milner and Brian Howard in the under-20s and Rhys Evans at one stage facing a potential club v. country choice. Previously, and again I must confess to writing these notes on the hoof rather than being surrounded by reference books, Kevin Horlock and Paul Bodin were our most decorated stars while at Swindon. I remember the Northern Ireland midfielder, now at Ipswich, even went on a run of regular scoring

which bettered that of an on-loan Gillingham striker's recent efforts. The Welsh full-back, so deadly with his 1993 Wembley play-off

spot-kick, is forever associated with That penalty which hit the bar for his country.

Colin Calderwood, now making waves at Northampton, is another to have played at the very highest level. I recall him first being touted for Scotland - it was suggested at the time that Ross McLaren and Duncan Shearer were also worth a look!

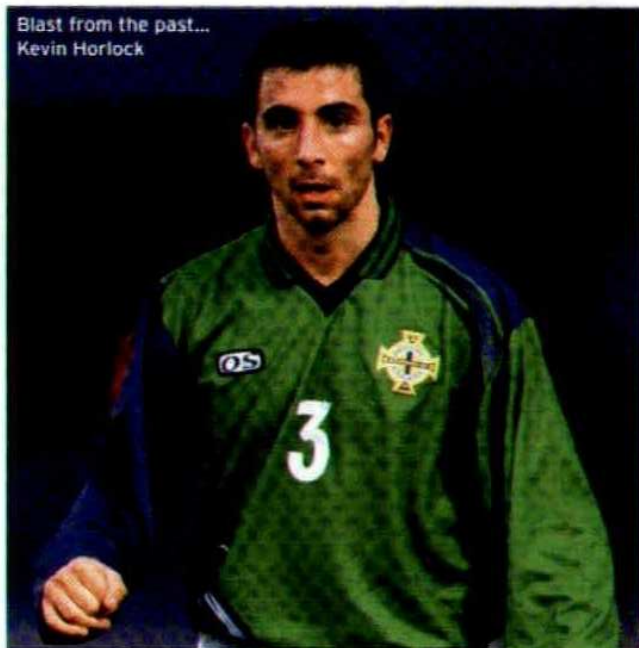
More recently, Chris Hay and Iffy Onoura had their names in the frame for the Tartan Army and then their goals seemed to dry up for the Town.

Town's expert stopper on pilates, babies and England's number one...

A goalkeeper's life can often be one of the most frustrating in football. Often blamed when things go wrong, a goalkeeper can spend 99% of his time with little to do before being called upon to make a crucial stop.

The debacle at Stockport is the perfect example of just how cruel the game can be, County hitting three goals late on to equalise having offered

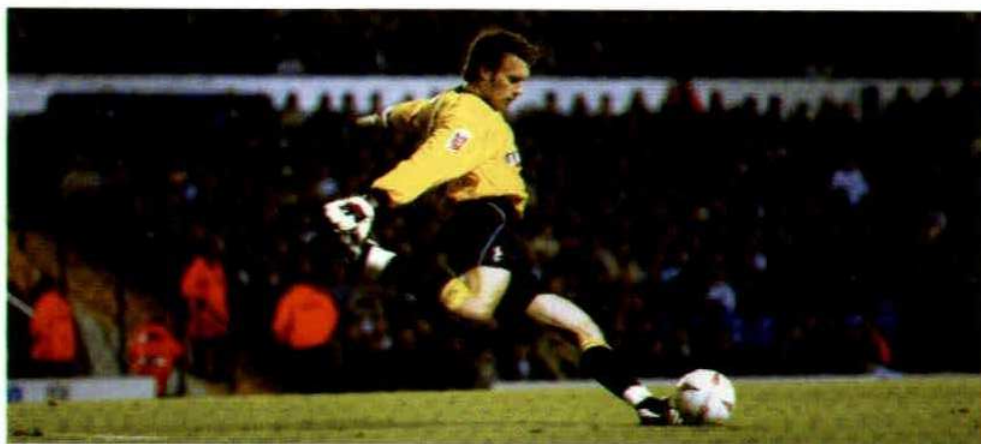
next to nothing before that. Yet there will be no-one as disappointed with that particular result than Town's number one himself, Rhys Evans.

Joining Swindon Town last year after protracted talks with Andy King, Evans has been ever-present in the League since ousting Bart Griemink from between the sticks against Blackpool. His professional attitude and dedication have seen him become a fans' favourite

in his short spell here, hardly surprising when you consider he's a local lad with experience from the likes of Carlo Cudicini and Eddie Niedzwiecki.

Yet Evans has high hopes of making a return to the top flight and with the best years ahead of him, he has every chance of fulfilling his potential. And with 45 England caps to his name, the highest for any player below senior level, he also harbours international aspirations...

Everyone's had two weeks to reflect on the 3-3 draw. It must have been frustrating for you in particular, to have nothing to do and then pick the ball out of the net three times...

It felt like we'd lost even though we picked up a point. But we've had two weeks off and for me it's been mentally refreshing. Remember that we're all playing under that pressure of having to win every week and so to have a week away from that has given me the chance to re-focus.

You mentioned in one of your Adver columns that we'd been cavalier in certain games, do you think that's what went wrong against Stockport?

No. I honestly think this team has a psychological problem in that we can't play consistently. We're so Jekyll and Hyde, you can't turn that bad over night and so there must be an underlying reason for it. Once we've sorted that out I'm confident we can win the league, comfortably.

Would you rather have had the chance to get the Stockport game

out of the memory by playing last weekend?

For me, no. As I say it's been good to have a break. It all depends on what happens in the next game because it can work either way.

Andy King has used the break to add Christian Roberts to the squad. You must have come across him before as a keeper, what will he bring?

Any new player creates interest both in the players and the supporters and that can only be a good thing. Having played against Bristol City it's fair to say he's aggressive and very physical - City's loss can only be our gain.

What have you made of the season so far, your own form in particular...

I've been happy. I've learned that people are quick to judge so whether or not I play well or not, I just try and keep my head down. There's been more good than bad and that's what you have to focus on.

Having watched Town from the stands, does it frustrate you when we play badly. Can you

sense fans' feelings from the terraces?

Of course, because I'm surrounded by people who have followed the club through thick and thin. These people want to see you succeed and they pay for the privilege of supporting you and are entitled to let you know what they think. Some people may have had a hard week and come to see us to take their frustrations out and we understand that. Sometimes you don't agree with them, though!

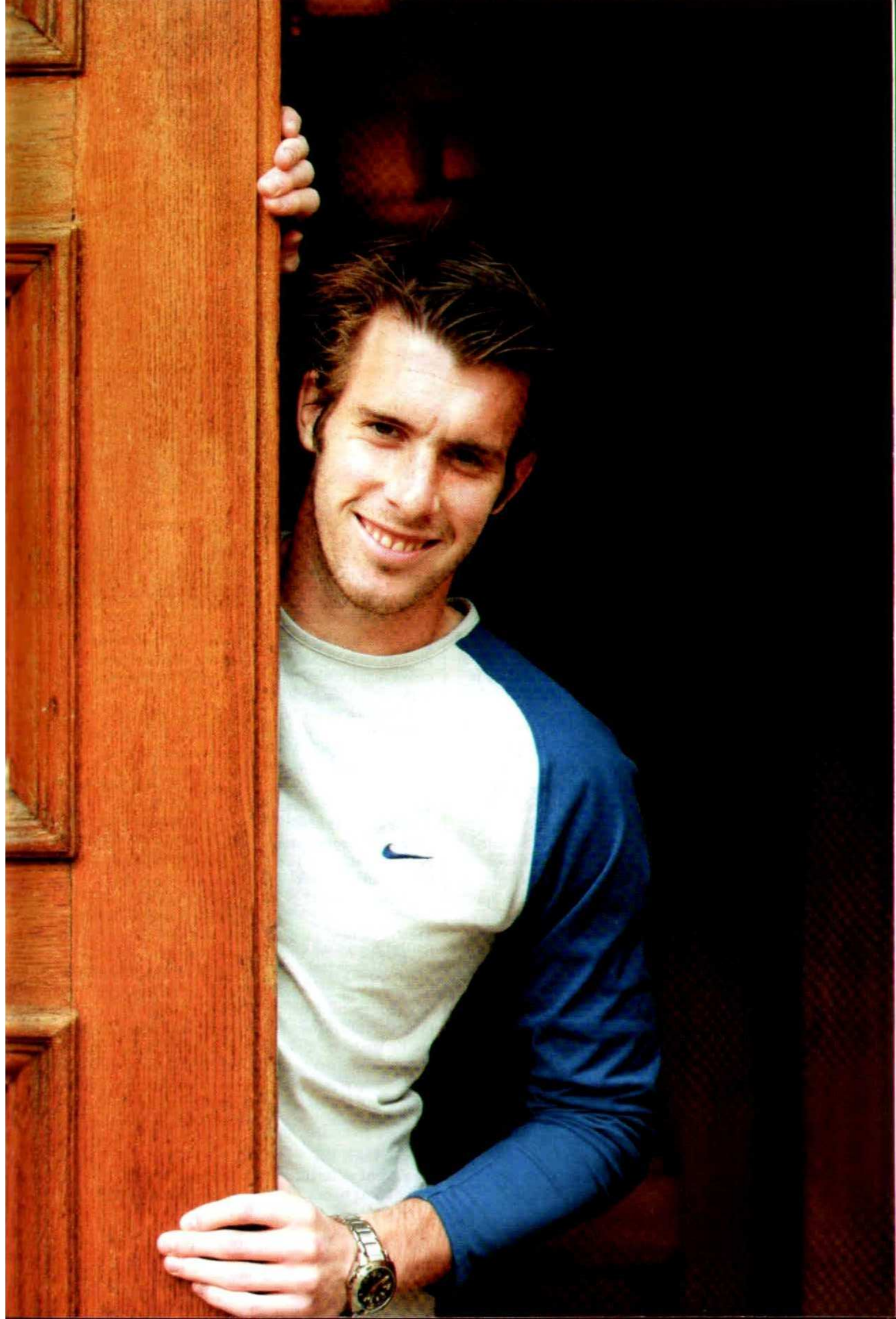
Steve Book, your deputy, what is he like to train with and do you get on?

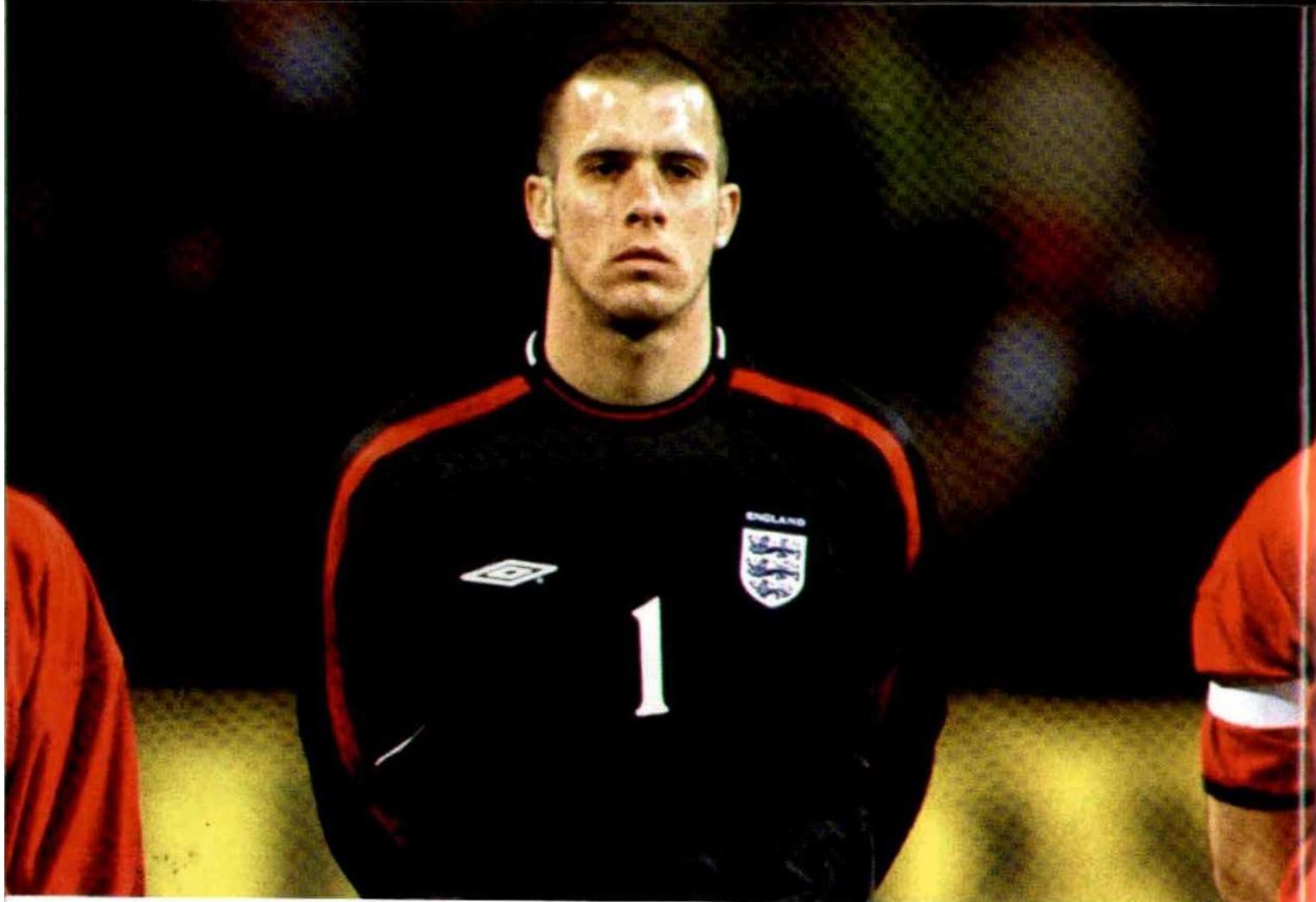
He's been great. He has had a different career to me and came into the game quite late, but he's very supportive. We get on well and training, along with Fraser Digby, is good fun.

I'd much rather that than derogative comments! I think it's because I try to play consistently, and probably because I'm a local lad - that was part of the reason why I joined the club...







We face Oldham today; they seem to be a bit of a bogey team for us in recent years...

You have to be positive. I always say (when asked about the opposition) that you have to concentrate on your game. On our day, when the right Swindon turns up, we can beat anyone. Convincingly. Oldham were the team that beat us as we looked to finish in the top two last season, so we have a score to settle in that sense, too.

Do you think playing in League One has hindered your England progress?

Of course it has, but in my mind I was aware of that when I came here. There's no denying you get more of a chance

playing in the top division and that's the carrot that is dangled at the end of the stick. But I'd much rather be playing first team football here than sitting on a bench somewhere else.

You have 45 England youth caps, a record for a goalkeeper below senior level: what has been your greatest England moment?

They've all been good, but playing for the Under 21's was the pinnacle. It's completely different to league football, the expectations are higher, but I'm under no illusion that if a youngster in the Premiership is playing well, they'll always get the nod over me.

Do you think the treatment of David James was harsh

following the Austria game, and who would be your number one?

For me, if playing regularly, Chris Kirkland is the most talented goalkeeper in this country. Yet the number one jersey belongs to whoever has it at the moment and Paul Robinson will hold on to it until he makes a mistake. As for David James, it happens to all of us. Unfortunately if we as goalkeepers make mistakes, that inevitably leads to goals going in, but people don't understand a goalkeeper's situation. The position is so unique, so specialized, and if we're honest about mistakes it sounds like we're making excuses: we can't win!

mention of his name give you nightmares of his late goal?

It's something I'll have to see a few more times I'm sure, but it happens. To be fair I was no where near it, any striker would have been proud of that header!

You weren't that far away from repeating the feat this time around...

I was more gutted about that than I was letting Paul's in. Looking back I think I made my run too early, I had to back-track a bit.

Like Sam you started life at Chelsea, what have you made of their progress since you left in terms of money put in?

My only question about Chelsea is what happens if Roman Abramovich gets bored? I hear from people there, though, that everyone's impressed with Mourinho. There seems to be more discipline than at any time I was there. That said, I'm glad I've moved on. I would never have got a game there, even more so with Mourinho in charge. With the pressure he's under he'd never take a chance on youth. He'll go for experience every

time. The young lad at the moment there, Leonard Pidgeley, he hasn't got a chance - it's a shame.

Do you still keep in touch with anyone down there?

Players no, but I do chat to Billy McCulloch on the medical team. He's a Swindon boy and keeps me up-to-date with all the latest news!

Claudio Ranieri: what was he really like?

His English was a lot better than he let on, he was very clever...

I'll be careful what I say here! Yeah, of course he is, but like Ranieri he's passionate and emotional.

You've become a father in the last month or two, there must be something in the air, you're not the only one are you?

It's funny, Jerel and I had a long chat about babies in the coach on the way up to Blackpool, about how it changes your life. I think it'll be a while before some of the other

lads have kids...

What's this about you taking part in some yoga, pilates is it? That seems to be all the rage these days, tell us about it...

I go once a week, it improves my flexibility. It certainly helps me recover after a game, I'm not laid up the day after anymore and the thought of playing twice on a Bank holiday weekend isn't so frightening.

Has anyone else at the club started doing it?

Rory has, but it's up to you, if you have the inclination or not. I just don't appreciate people making fun of it when they don't understand it, they don't know what they're talking about.

Finally, this week is "Kick Racism Out of Football" week - have you ever had any bad experiences?

Not personally, but when I played for England against the Czech Republic Leon Knight got some stick: it was disgraceful. It just shows how narrow-minded and uneducated some people can be.

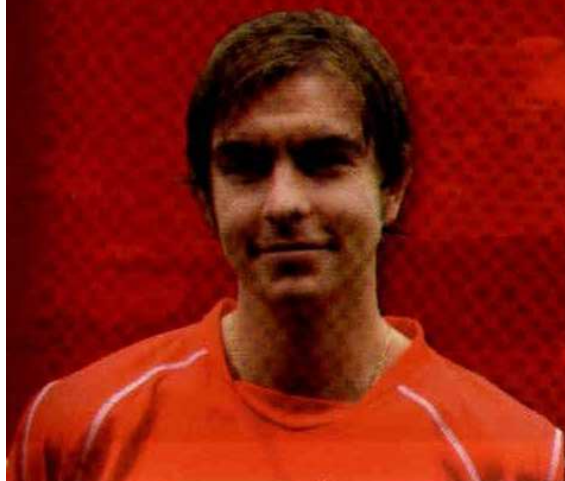

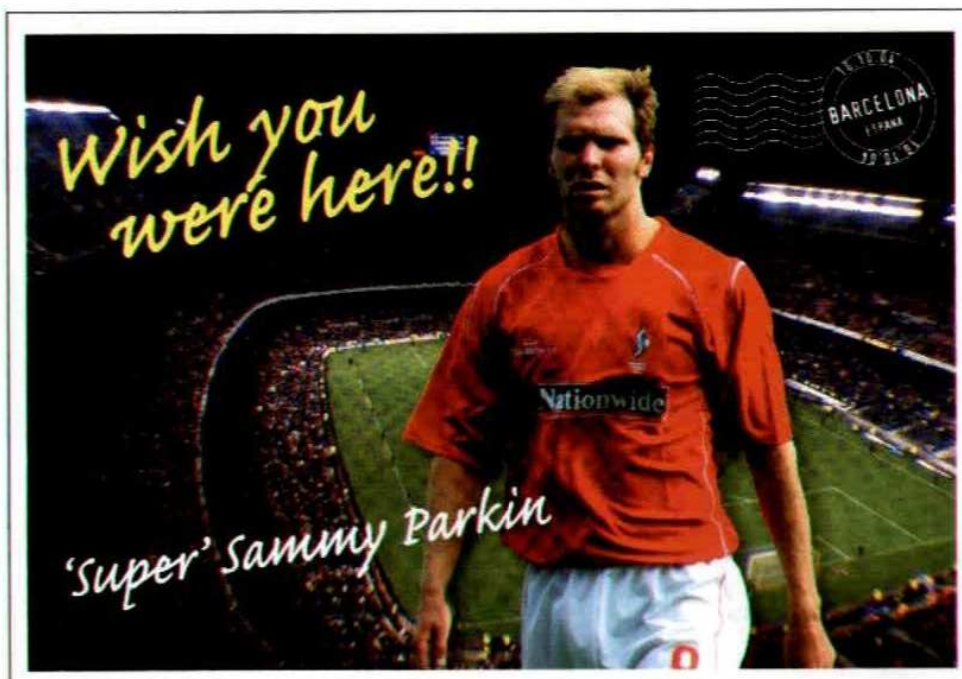

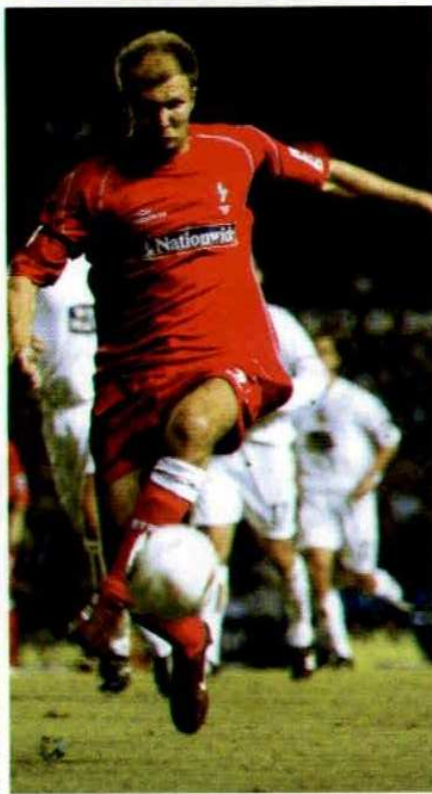

"I really enjoyed my time in the States," said Woan.

"Soccer is still relatively new over there and the Club I was playing for, Syracuse, is only two years old. The team had a good fan base, averaging around 8,000 per game and although we were playing in a baseball stadium on astroturf, there are plans for a new stadium.

"We made the play-offs last season and got beaten in the final by Montreal. The final was over two legs, getting beaten 2-0 at home before drawing 1-1 away.

"There are a few ex-pros from the English leagues playing in the USA including Terry Phelan, Steve Howey, John Spencer and Daryll Powell. It is tough to play in the states with the three foreigner rule and visa difficulties but things were made easier for me as I have a green card because my wife is American."

Life back in Wiltshire certainly started with a bang, with Woan travelling up to Blundell Park to watch the youth team lose 4-2 to a strong



Grimsby Town side. So, having enjoyed a successful spell at The County Ground first time around, what does he expect of his second spell?

"My primary role now is to look after the Youth Team and I am looking forward to getting involved. As far as playing for the first team, I suppose it could be an option for the Manager to throw me on the bench.

"I think getting into coaching is a natural progression. I have yet to get all my badges done and am now looking forward to getting involved."

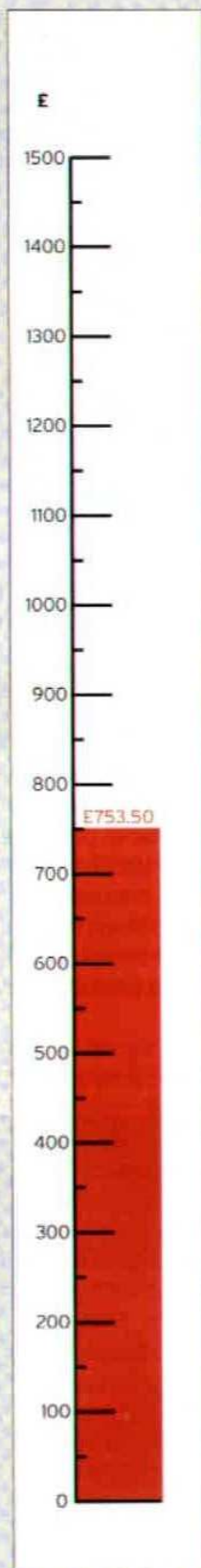

Moving Forward

Society is constantly evolving and one of the most visible and welcomed indicators over the last twenty years or so has been the increased ethnic diversity seen on the football pitch.

The 'Kick Racism out of Football' movement has helped promote racial harmonisation within the game and as with all clubs, Swindon have enjoyed the skills of many

players whose progress may have been strangely blocked in past generations.

Back in 1977, Middlesbrough-born **Chris Kamara** joined Town from Portsmouth and went on to play over 230 League matches for Swindon over two periods at the County Ground. Now a well-known TV pundit, Kamara had a hugely successful playing

career, spending two spells on the south coast at Fratton Park and making 150 outings for Brentford before the summer of 1988 took him to the Potteries and Stoke City.

Then in 1990 and after thirteen years in the game, Chris joined Leeds United and took his place on the very top football stage. 20 games later Kammy was on his way to Luton and loan spells at Sheffield United and home-town Middlesbrough preceded a free-transfer back to The Blades of Sheffield.

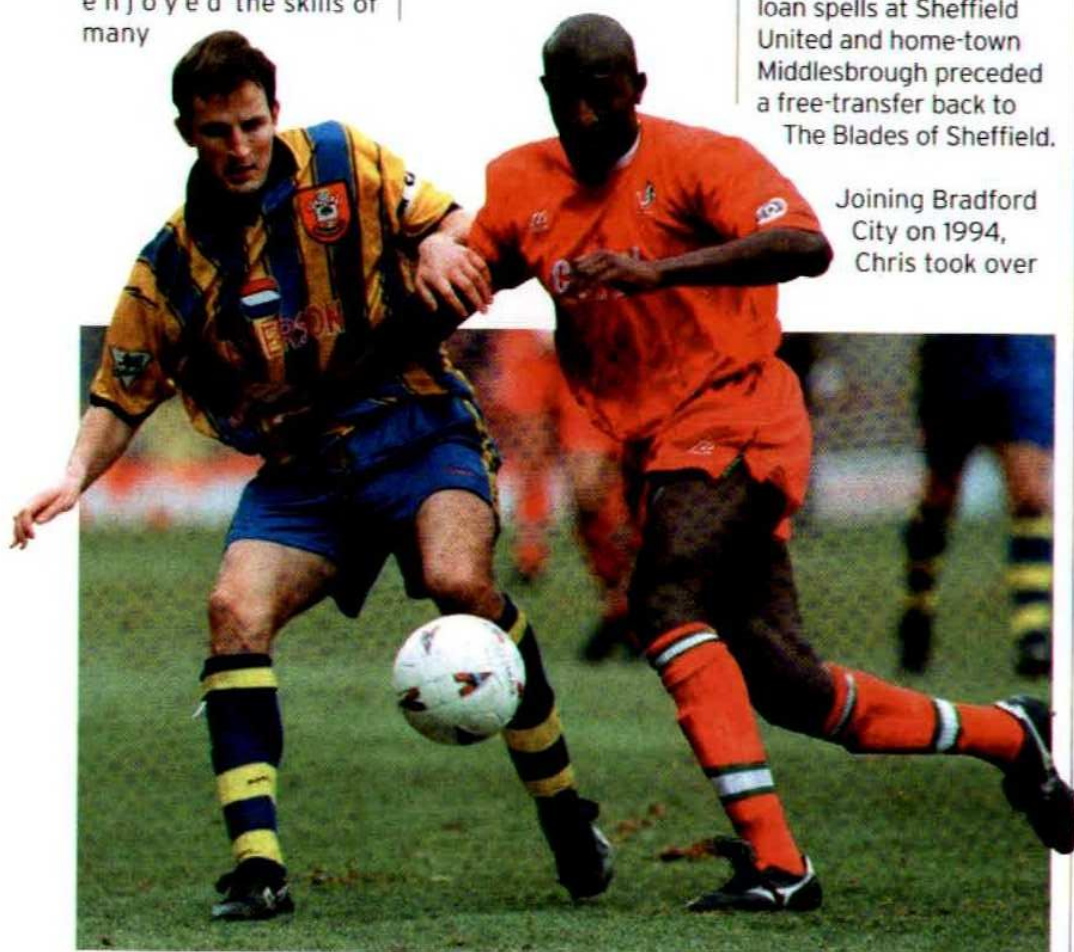
Joining Bradford City on 1994, Chris took over



the reigns at Valley Parade and added managerial experience to his CV before the watching masses benefited from the insight of almost 650 League appearances.

Another big hit in Wiltshire came about with the signing of striker **Wayne Allison** who took the path recently replicated by Christian Roberts when he signed for Swindon from Bristol City in the summer of 1995. The Chief had begun his career at Halifax before moving on to Watford and it took £800,000 of Huddersfield Town's money to prise him from the West Country in November 1997.

The move took him back to his birthplace,





but Tranmere and Sheffield United were subsequently to benefit from his goal scoring exploits. Almost as impressive as Kamara's total, Wayne made approaching 600 League outings in his career and the 101 made in Swindon Town colours produced 31 goals.

Big Wayne was followed by another well-built striker.

Glaswegian **Iffy Onuora** signed from Gillingham



in the March 1998 for £120,000 and the same fee took him back to Kent almost two years later. In between, Iffy had scored 25 goals in 73 League outings for Town and his career eerily mirrored that of Wayne Allison's in three aspects.

Onuora's first club was the one based in Allison's town of birth, Huddersfield, and after their spells at Swindon the two were to team up at Sheffield United in the latter stages of their careers. This summer saw Iffy join Walsall in a coaching capacity.

One player to bring vast international experience to the ranks of the playing staff at Swindon was ex-Liverpool and England winger **Mark Walters**. 'Wally' played 99 League games for Town and scored an impressive 23 times after signing in July 1996 and the Birmingham-born

man included time at Aston Villa, Glasgow Rangers, Stoke, Wolves and Southampton to his credit.

Subsequently moving on to Bristol Rovers, Mark took his skills to Ilkeston Town in August 2002 after almost 600 League outings.

So, three Englishmen and a Scot.

Ever since Viv Anderson became the first black player to represent England, prejudice and discrimination have been repeatedly challenged to the extent that it's rare that a team at any level of the game takes to the field without a healthy complement of races represented.

When drawing up a list of black Swindon Town players, Chris Kamara's was a name that sprung

readily to mind. It took some time before his name was joined by the much more recent appearances of winger Paul Edwards and striker **Eric Sabin**.

And that's the way it should be. The novelty of seeing a black player on the pitch has long since disappeared for all but the most hardened bigots to the extent that it's a surprise if any observation is made at all. Football is making a stand which all of society would do well to follow.

The Kick Racism out of Football campaign has sent a message to everyone connected with the game that bigotry will not be tolerated and has shown football is prepared to take a lead in what is really a problem of society.

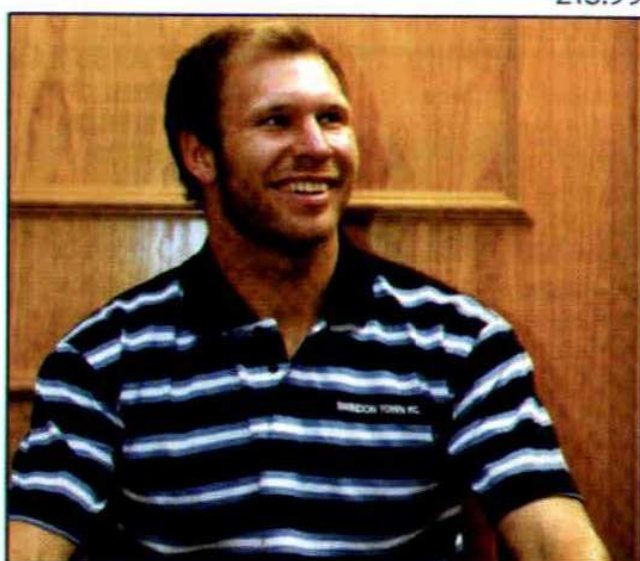

Pubs:

This is another nice friendly northern ground (Unless you're a Stoke or Crewe fan!) The Vine in Hamil Road is quite close to the ground and apparently is the main 'away' pub. I am also told it does a decent range of real ales.

Ground:

Doesn't quite live up to its billing of 'The

Wembley of the North' these days, but quite tidy none the less. The away end is quite big, all seated and under cover so it's all quite civilized really!

Fave game:

The 3-3 draw at Vale Park last season having been 3-0 down has to rank amongst the best games I've missed. How crucial it turned out to be as well with us eventually edging them out of the play offs on goal difference. The Vale games I've actually been to always seem to have been 0-0 or 1-1, not very inspiring really!

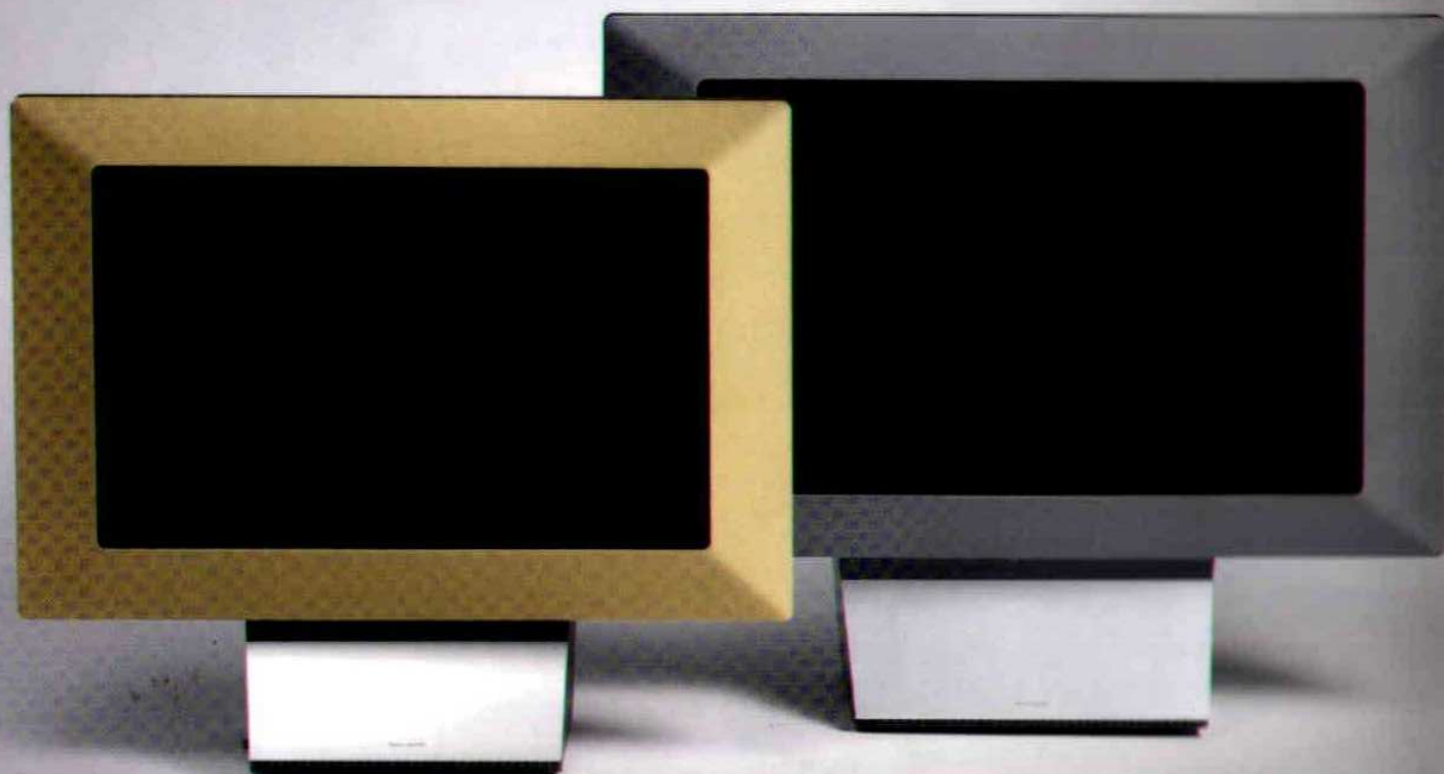
