

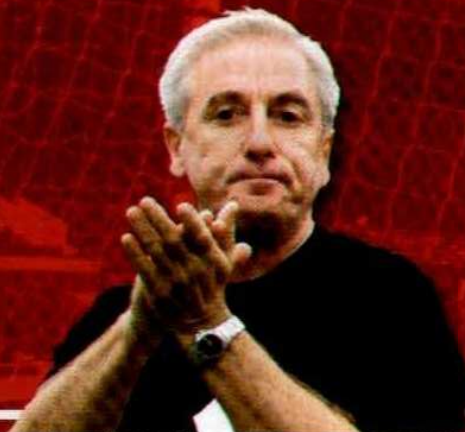

Wales have appointed former Town Boss Roy Evans as Assistant Manager to John Toshack.

Evans was in charge at The County Ground from August - December 2001 during which he won 10 of his 26 games in charge.

Toshack will also have his former number two at

Real Sociedad Salva Iriarte in his coaching team.

Roy Evans managed Liverpool for four years, winning the League Cup in 1995. He resigned in 1998 after an unhappy time as co-manager with Gerard Houllier.

After making only 11 first team appearances, Evans became the youngest member of

the famous Anfield boot room following the shock resignation of Bill Shankly in 1974.

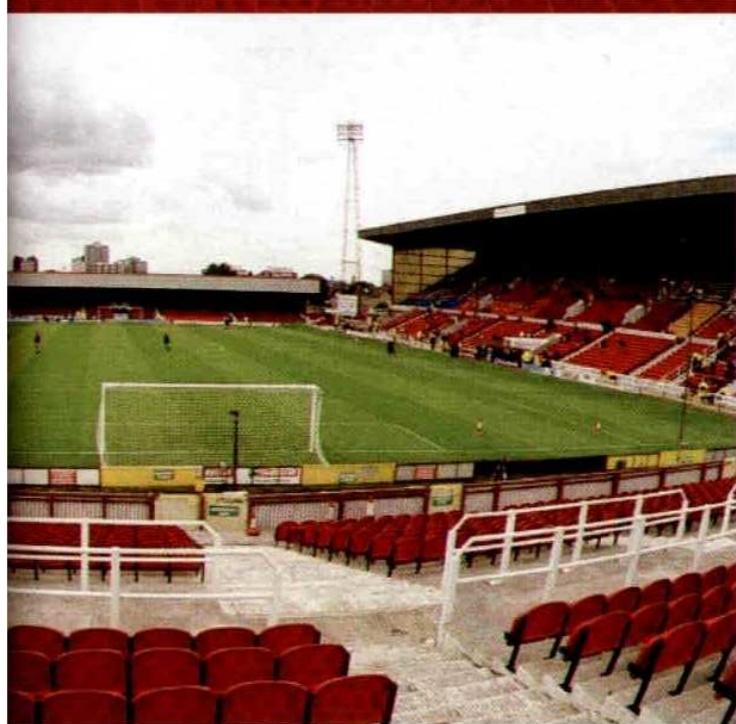
Hello, good evening and welcome to this LDV Vans Trophy tie.

Captain's Column Matt Hewlett

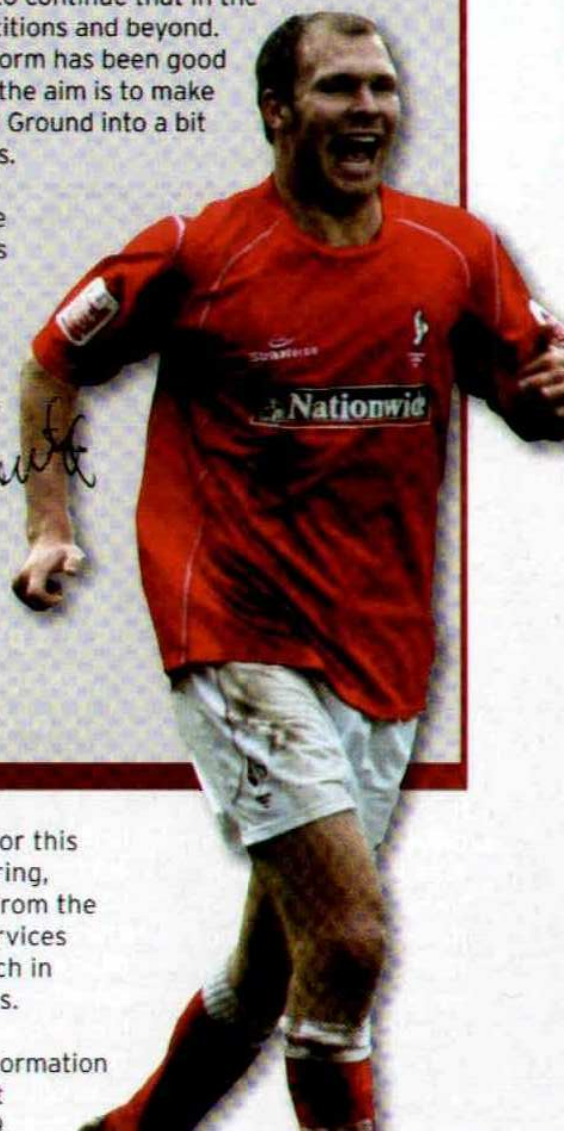
Good evening and welcome to tonight's game with Bristol City.

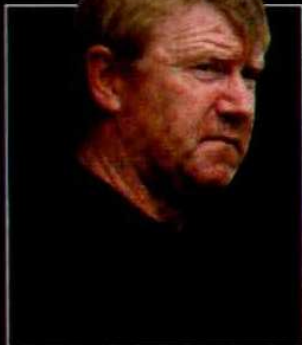

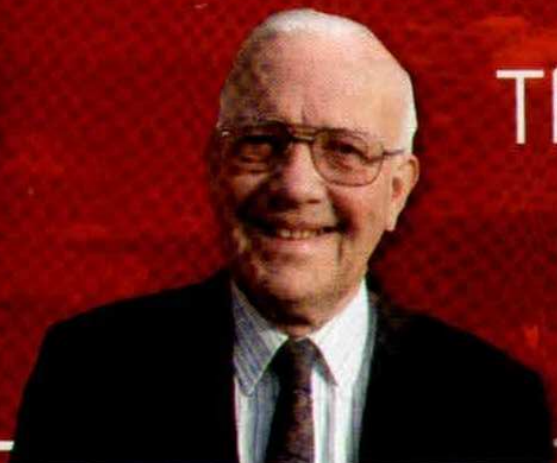

Those Were The Days

Matchday Press Officer Chris Scott takes a trip down memory lane with a look at previous encounters between Swindon Town and Bristol City...

Bristol City games bring back some wonderful memories for me from a time when the game was certainly different but not necessarily better. These were the games of the season with all the passion that a local derby can bring - nothing has changed there.

I first saw Bristol City at the County Ground in October 1946 in a crowd of 25,007 smashing an earlier record set in 1929. The Town secured a 1-1 draw on that day Billy Lucas, Alf and Bill Stephens, Jimmy Ithell, and Billy Lloyd among Town stars that season.

Ithell broke his nose that day and completed the game, in the words of the time "a passenger on the left wing" - substitutes were not invented then.

An average gate for four games at that time was 19,204 - what would we

give for those crowds today but the gate money was less than £6,000 for all four games.

As for many games, my favourite vantage point was standing on Stratton Bank among fans from both teams with plenty of argument, banter and humour. Half way up the bank gave a glorious view of "Slacker" Williams netting for us that day.

Next season saw a 2-2 draw with former City keeper Ferguson in goal for Swindon and an even bigger crowd than the previous year - 25,401 and 1,200 "turned away". Ferguson one of the oldest players ever to turn out for Swindon aged 43 years 103 days.

Maurice Owen had arrived by this time, his name on the score sheet almost as a matter of course, Maurice undoubtedly

the hottest property in Division 3 (South) a player dedicated to his club, not for him the lure of Wolves or other top clubs.

The best was 1948-49, a double - 2-1 at the County Ground and 3-1 at Ashton Gate was indeed very satisfying.

But the hero in that season was one of my all time favourites William Morris Jones signed from Port Vale for £2,500 the previous season - not a playmaker by any means but Morris put himself about a bit in front of goal. 2 goals in 13 minutes (his 9th in 11 games) won the County Ground game after we went a goal down after 30 minutes.

My abiding memory of that game from my Stratton bank viewing spot was the sight of Jones bundling City keeper Clack into the back of the net and referee Billy Griffiths hot footing it back to the centre circle for the restart. City appealed, gentle by today's standards, but Griffiths would have none of it.

As RCE wrote in the

Adver: "Not the slightest fault could be found with Jones' tactics as he bundled Clack over the line with a perfect shoulder charge." I can only guess what would have happened in the present game.

A great deal has changed on and off the pitch over the years as our national game changes as the world changes. The game is different to what it was then, but for me it will always be potentially wonderful entertainment - particularly when Town are on top and at worst a despairing and frustrating 90 minutes.

I've seen quite a few changes over the last 50 plus years, floodlights, substitutes, red and yellow cards, no passing back to goalies, all-seater stadiums, artificial pitches, logos.

I wonder how it will change over the next 50 - Swindon Town European champions? I doubt that, but its good to dream sometimes...

Three unbeaten Wembley appearances and a few promotions. Our record could be a lot worse.

The Robins' Squad

By Bristol City's recent standards, last season's encounter with the LDV Trophy was a big disappointment. Drawn away to league leaders Plymouth Argyle the Robins suffered a 4-0 loss.

However, six months earlier, in April 2003, the red side of Bristol were celebrating as City and their fans enjoyed a memorable day out at the Millennium Stadium. Over 50,000 fans watched as the Ashton Gate club defeated Carlisle United 2-0 to lift the Trophy through goals by Lee Peacock and Liam Rosenior.

City have an affinity with the competition having also reached the final on three previous occasions. In 2000 they were defeated 2-1 by Stoke City. Prior to that in 1987 they lost to Mansfield Town following a penalty shoot-out. However, 12 months earlier they defeated Bolton 3-0 to win the final.

In this season's competition City have, until tonight, played in front of their own fans. Peterborough, the visitors in Round One, were beaten 1-0 via a 7th minute Heffernan strike. Round Two brought the Milton Keynes Dons to Ashton Gate and they were despatched 2-1 thanks to a brace from prolific, in-form striker Leroy Lita who will tonight have Rhys Evans' goal firmly in his sights.

1 Steve Phillips

Bath born keeper joined City in November 1996 from local non-league side Paulton Rovers. Excellent shot-stopper, he earned his first team debut in December 1998. Now established as the club's first-choice.



2 Jamie Smith

Signed a one-year deal after arriving on a free transfer from Crystal Palace in August 2004. Began as a trainee with Wolves before moving to the Eagles in October 1997.



3 Mickey Bell

Signed from Wycombe Wanderers for a tribunal fee of £150,000 in the summer of 1997. Began career at Northampton Town, and is a free kick and penalty specialist.



4 Tommy Doherty

City's on-field skipper made his first team debut aged 17 in December 1996 and was a regular in City's Second Division promotion-winning side the following season. Capped five times by Northern Ireland.



5 Danny Coles

Product of the club's Academy who made his first team debut in April 2000. Voted Young Player Of The Year by the Supporters Club in 2002/03, he can also play at right-back.



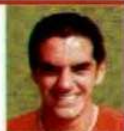
6 Matthew Hill

Can play at left-back or as a central defender. Another product of the club's Academy, Matthew made his debut in the old First Division in November 1998. Supporters Club Player Of The Year in 2002/03.



7 Scott Murray

Returned in March 2004 after a spell at Reading. First arrived at Ashton Gate in a £150,000 transfer from Aston Villa in December 1997. Capped by Scotland at B level.



12 Tony Butler

Experienced central defender signed on a free transfer signing from West Bromwich Albion in November 2002 following a two-month loan spell. Started as a trainee with Gillingham.



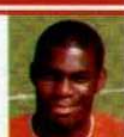
14 Luke Wilshire

Right-sided Australian midfielder who signed for City from Premiership side Middlesbrough in July 2003 for £250,000. Capped at under-23 level for his country, whom he represented in the 2004 Olympics Games.



16 Clayton Fortune

Central defender signed in March 2001 after being released by Tottenham Hotspur. Can also play in midfield. Turned down a £400,000 move to Preston North End in the summer to stay at Ashton Gate.



17 Bradley Orr

Midfielder signed on a free transfer from Newcastle United in the summer of 2004 whilst also being linked with Swindon. Began with Everton before moving to St James Park.



19 Steven Gillespie

Danny Wilson's final signing as City manager when he arrived at Ashton Gate in May 2004, after being released by Liverpool. Yet to score in 2 starts and 7 appearances as a substitute.



32 Steve Brooker

Brought in by Tinnion as a target man from Port Vale at the end of September for £150,000 and has notched up 5 goals in 9 appearances for City already.

8 OnetoWatch Leroy Lita

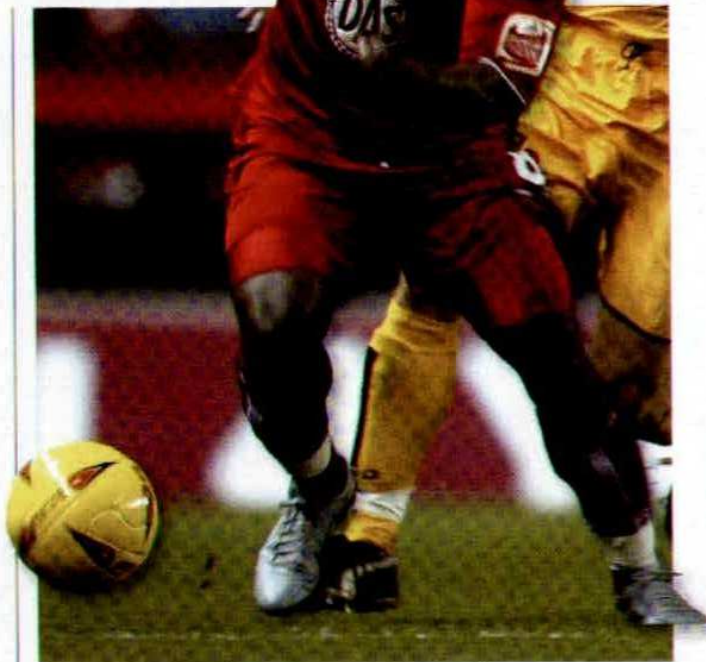
Still only a teenager, Leroy Lita has finally come of age this season. Born in Congo, Leroy, 19, was a prolific scorer for the reserve and Academy sides before being fast-tracked into the senior set-up, making his first team debut in August 2002.

A month later aged just 17 he opened his City account after coming on as



a substitute to score a last minute winner at Port Vale. He went on to end his first season with 4 goals from 18 appearances. Last season he appeared 31 times mainly as a substitute finding the net on 5 occasions.

Recently he has gone from strength to strength and this campaign he has been a revelation scoring 16 times already in all competitions placing him second in the League One scoring chart. Since scoring both City's goals at Walsall, Leroy has gone on to net 7 times in the last 7 games making him a formidable threat to any defence.



Spotted by City's Academy after being released by Premiership side Chelsea he signed a

professional contract in March 2003. He was voted Supporters Club Young Player Of The Year in 2003/04.

Brian Tinnion the gaffer

To the footballing world player-manager Brian Tinnion is "Mr Bristol City". Joining the club from Bradford in March 1993, Brian, 36, has since made close to 550 appearances for the Robins scoring 42 times. Beginning his career at Newcastle, Brian moved to Bradford in 1989, spending 4 years in Yorkshire before moving south.

When Danny Wilson departed in June this year Brian's loyalty was rewarded with a move into the managers office although he continues to appear in the City midfield. After a shaky start to the season he has moulded his team into a formidable side who score goals for fun and has masterminded a move up to 6th place in League One.

Tonight's visitors for our LDV Vans Trophy match have an enviable record in the competition, although it's necessary to view the tournament in all its identities to fully appreciate just how successful City have been.

Winners in 1986 when the competition was called the Freight Rover Trophy, City triumphed 3-0 at Wembley over Bolton Wanderers and in 1987 they were back again, this time losing on penalties to Mansfield Town

In 1999 the final was again graced by City's

presence, with the Bristol Robins this time going down 2-1 to Stoke City in what was then named the Auto Windscreens Shield. Then 18 months ago, City claimed the trophy under its present name when a 2-0 win over Carlisle at the Millennium Stadium installed the new silverware in the boardroom at Ashton Gate.

So, in the light of all that, Town's record paints a contrasting picture.

Fittingly, Swindon's first ever match in the competition was a 1983/84 3-1 win at Oxford United in a match

when even Oxford's goal was scored by a Town player (a Colin Bailie own goal), but in truth neither the competition or Town's performances in it have set the football world alight. Town left the tournament's inaugural year after southern quarter-final defeat at Millwall.

The following season was notable only for a goal by Lou Macari against Torquay before the Gulls won on penalties at the earliest stage, and a year later Town's progress was halted in a round robin stage by Hereford.

But the biggest

Swindon story in the competition came in 1986/87. Fighting their way through to the Southern semi-final, Town were drawn at home to Aldershot and raced into a 2-0 lead. Then keeper Fraser Digby hared out to face oncoming Shot's striker Martin Foyle and up-ended him. Off went Diggers, into goal went striker Jim Quinn and Aldershot turned defeat into victory in extra time.

That was to be Town's last appearance in the competition for some time as promotion took us above the qualifying level, but then in





1995/96 after Steve McMahon had taken the club back down to Division Two, Swindon went out to a Steve White goal at home to Hereford. Promotion at the end of the season again terminated Town's interest.

So to 2000/01 and again Town are involved. A bye in the first round was followed by a win

at Millwall on penalties. Then a 2-1 home win over Wycombe pushed Town to the area semi-final where defeat waited at Southend in a golden goal finish.

A year later saw first round elimination at Colchester and 2002/03 witnessed a 6-1 revenge over Southend followed by a 3-2 defeat at

Kidderminster. Last season produced first stage defeat at the hands of Boston.

To be honest, nothing much to write home about then.

The Associate Members Cup as it began was first competed for in 1983/84 and was open to all clubs in the lower two division of the Football League, then called Division Three and Four.

At the same time, the Full Members Cup (so called because of the club's full voting status on Football League matters) was introduced for clubs in the top two divisions, a tournament that never caught the imagination of the clubs involved and that was scrapped over ten years ago. The teams involved in the present LDV Vans Trophy fall into two categories. Those that

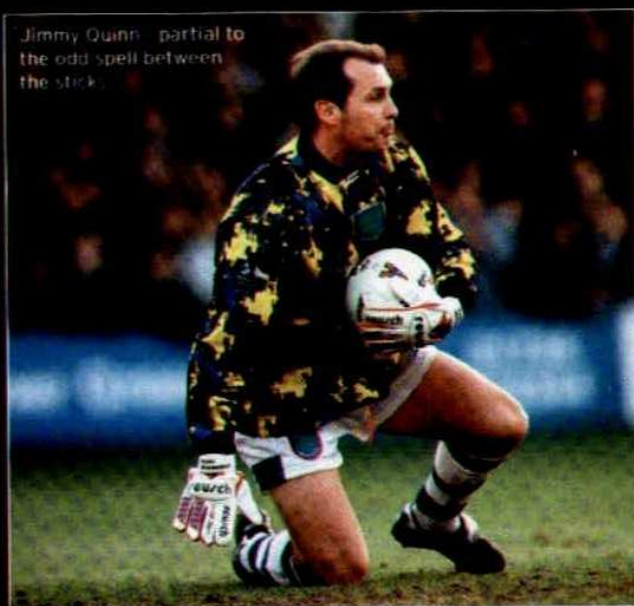
feel the tournament is a burden on the season and those that have experienced the joys and financial rewards that come with late-stage involvement.

And tonight's game epitomises those different views. Try telling City supporters that the competition is meaningless.

Once upon a time of course Manchester United had never won the FA Cup, but they seem to have put that right over the years. Maybe in 15 years time, Swindon's record will be so impressive that drawing Town in the LDV (or it's equivalent) will strike fear in to the hearts of the opposition (although it might be considered preferable that top two division status would make Town ineligible).

If so, why shouldn't that run start this season?

Friends Reunited

As if anyone needs reminding, two former City players take on their old club this evening. The LDV Vans Quarter Final draw has not only paired together two local rivals, but it has also presented an opportunity for Matt Hewlett and Christian Roberts to get reacquainted with their ex-teammates.

After putting their football knowledge to the test with our quiz, we caught up with club captain Matt Hewlett who spoke about his memories of the competition and his thoughts on the derby day win at City in August.

"The win at Ashton Gate earlier in the season was a great game. We had Darius Henderson back then and he made his debut that day. He put in a solid performance and it set us on our way to the three points. It's not very often you go to Ashton Gate and come away with the win."

However, tonight's encounter holds an entirely different meaning with a place in the LDV Vans Trophy Southern Semi-Finals at stake. Having made it down to the final two in the competition four years ago, Hewlett knows the value of the competition.

"I went to a final in 2000

when I was with Bristol City and that was a great day out. I had played in several of the games in previous rounds but I was disappointed not to be included in the matchday squad," he said.

"The competition is a good one and no matter what is said, as a player it is a chance to play at the Millennium Stadium. For the fans there is the opportunity of a magnificent day out to what is a brilliant ground."

"Having drawn Bristol City, it will no doubt be a good game for the supporters, players and everyone connected with both clubs. If we win this one then we

will have taken one of the best sides left in the competition out of the equation. If we beat City, there is no reason why we can't go all the way."

Incidentally, Bristol City's path to the final in 2000 also included a trip to St. James Park with a 4-0 win over Exeter City. Town's trip earlier this month was a little closer than perhaps many expected.

"It was never going to be easy facing Exeter. They were playing a team from a higher division and they will have wanted to impress. We had a few young lads involved and they did tremendously well that night."

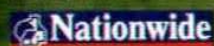

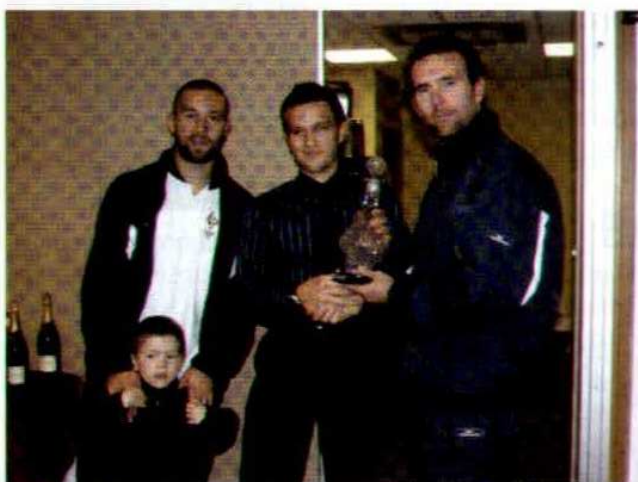

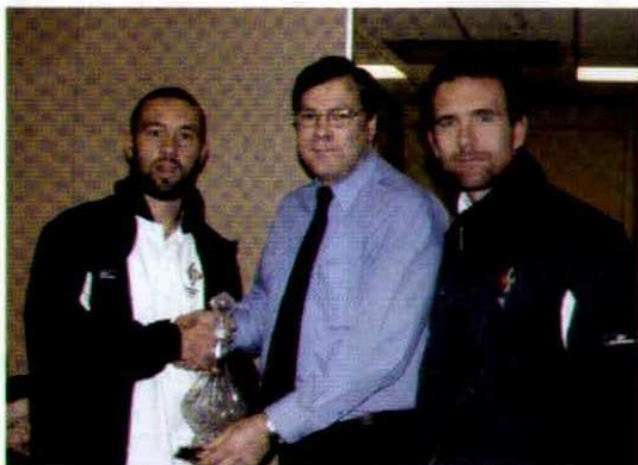

The FA CUP

Saturday 4th December '04
KickOff 3.00pm

After tonight's LDV Vans action there's cup excitement on the horizon once more. Saturday sees the visit of Notts County in the FA Cup Second Round tie, with the reward for the winners a place in the Third Round draw when the 'big boys' join the competition.

County dropped out of Division Two last season with a second-from-bottom finish, and this term sees the Magpies at the wrong end of the table once more. Caretaker player/manager Ian Richardson replaced Gary Mills in October when Mills seemed unable to halt the slide.

Originally joining the club from Birmingham



in January 1996 as a defender, Richardson cost £200,000 and has now made around 250 appearances for County. Mills himself had only been at the helm since January when he replaced Billy Dearden.

The man most in form in front of goal is Glynn Hurst who had scored 10 times in the first eighteen matches.

One man with a familiar face is Swindon-born keeper Steve Mildenhall who of course made over 30 appearances

for Town before moving to Nottingham in the summer of 2001 for £150,000.

He looked ready to leave Meadow Lane in the summer but remains in the Midlands and his place has recently been under threat, with ex-trainee and Republic of Ireland U-21 international Saul Deeney between the posts in the recent 1-0 defeat at Bury.

Steve might have mixed feelings about stepping back out on the County

Ground pitch. His last two visits have seen him conceded nine goals, and with Town scoring four in each of the last two home matches he could be forgiven for being happy to accept a place on the bench once more.

A third of the way through the season saw County fifth from bottom of League Two, but that was still above Oxford United. An FA Cup run could be just what both sides need to transform their seasons and top up the coffers.

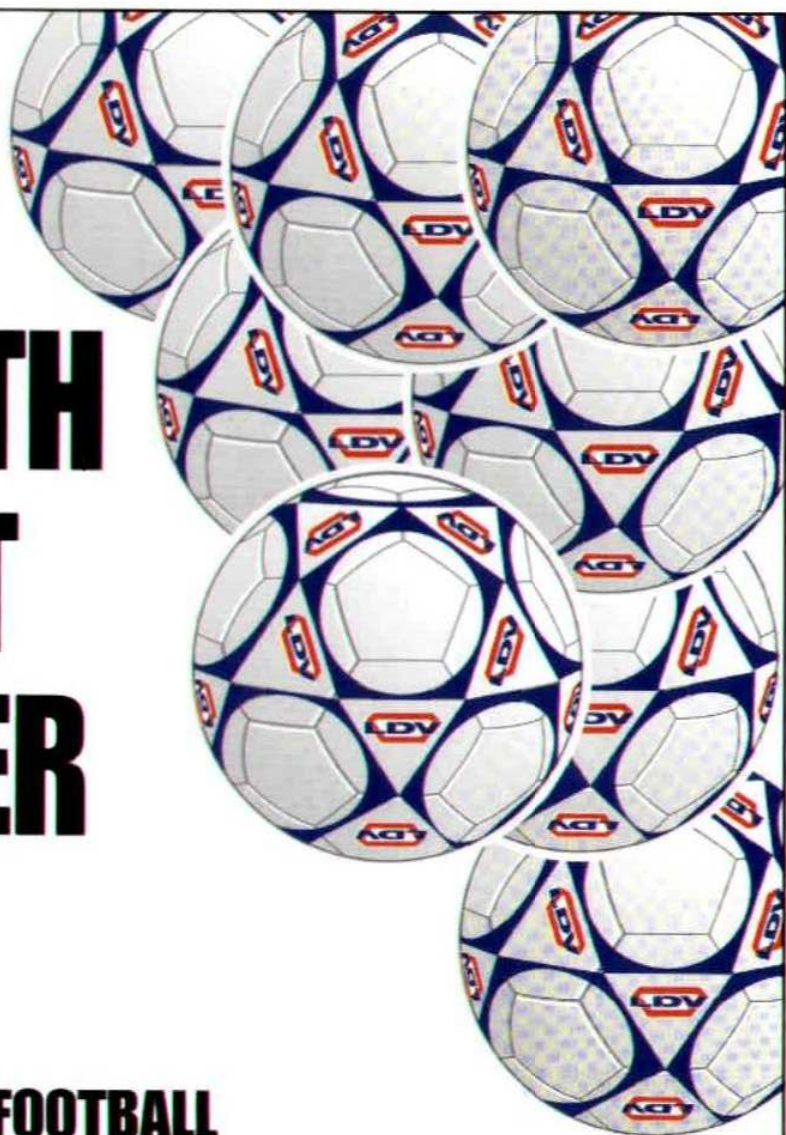
