BoardroomTalk

Director Bob Holt talks about recent behind the scenes events and gives us his thoughts ahead of today's game...

Who said lightening does not strike twice in one place?

First there was Sheffield Wednesday back in October and now wallop 'the local Derby' against Bristol City at The County Ground, on the year's traditionally most popular sporting day, is postponed till Wednesday 13th April. There must be unseen hands working against us.

Our two biggest gates have been scuppered by the Football League agreeing to International Matches being played, first on a weekend, and now unbelievably on a Bank Holiday Monday. What on earth are they thinking, the League Clubs are already strained at the seams with regards cash and Swindon, as we all too well know, is no exception. Michael Proctor pulled one back before the interval, but a late strike from Peter Holmes' sealed a 3-1 success for the table-toppers.

After getting off to a flyer with victory over Town at The Racecourse Ground in August, Wrexham have had a turbulent season so far. Having come perilously close to going out of business, the Dragons now find themselves just three points away from safety after being hit with a ten point deduction for entering Administration. With striker Juan Ugarte now hitting top gear, the race is on for League One survival...

The Dragons Squad

n the field, the 2004/5 season began well for the Welshman who recorded four wins from their opening seven games of the new campaign.

However, it was off the field problems that dominated much of the headlines with the now mandatory ten-point deduction enforced in December for a club entering Administration.

Having battled well in recovering from the blow, Denis Smith's men now find themselves just three points away from safety having been beaten just once in their last nine league outings. Victories such as the 6-4 win at Hartlepool United illustrate the fighting spirit which encompasses the survival quest at The Racecourse Ground.

Interestingly, The Dragons have similar form on the road to Andy King's men. Today's visitors have registered five wins, five draws and eight defeats whilst on their travels, picking up a total of 20 points. In comparison Town's record also reads five wins and five draws with nine defeats away from The County Ground.

There will be some interesting battles across the pitch this afternoon after a closely fought game between the two sides in August. The Town defence will also have to be on their guard against the precocious Juan Ugarte if the three points are to stay in SN1 today ...

A veteran of 17 professional clubs, the experienced stopper was signed in May 2002 and also coaches the younger keepers at The Racecourse. Recently returned to the bench after injury.

6 **DennisLawrence**

Signed in 2001 from the Defence Force club in Trinidad, Dennis stands at 6'7" and makes his presence felt. A seasoned performer on the international stage, he also scored on the opening day against Town.

Still only 19 years of age. Colwyn Bay born Craig made his first team debut last season and when scoring at Cambridge, made the record books by being the youngster Footbal League scorer in the club's history

One of five new signings in the summer of 2004, he joined from Hull City and possesses a long throw which could be a threat today. Has scored 4 goals in 36 league outings so far this term.

Having been described as 'supersub' after last weekend's winner at Oldham. Sam could be in line for a similar role this afternoon. Signed in 2001 and is a full Trinidad International although still only 23.

He pointed out that those shenanigans made the success of the next season so much sweeter, a then record points haul in securing the old fourth division championship. Who can forget the 4-2 victory over visitors Chester to clinch promotion? A year later, I'm on the pitch with "Charlie Charlie Henry" who's scored the goal to take us to Selhurst Park for the game against Gillingham to determine who goes up to the second tier, what is now

the Championship. Steve White does the business, almost swears in front of a live microphone and most of the players re-appear on the pitch in a state of undress!

1987/88, a campaign of consolidation before the play-off heartbreak against Crystal Palace, Wright, Bright et al and the manager's departure for West Ham.

Enter Ossie Ardiles, with the maxim "play play play!" - it takes us to Wembley. What followed is well-documented, in the words of the Argentinian World Cup winner "we were the sacrificial lambs on the altar of hypocrisy".

Glenn Hoddle takes over



the following Easter, just keeps us up, then comes close to the top-six following the tactical purchase by Blackburn of Duncan Shearer and then Wembley again: the seven-goal thriller!!

Chelsea beckons for the boss. His right-handman John Gorman steps in the hot-seat. Only one season in the topflight, 16 games before a victory, 100 goals conceded but it was great to be there!

After a Bristol City defeat, a parting of the ways and the arrival of Steve McMahon. Do you recall the other names in the frame at that time: Steve Bruce, Steve Nicol, Graham Rix, Gordon Strachan and Chris Waddle. Some haven't fared too badly subsequently!

A second successive relegation, but then an immediate promotion as champions and a memorable civic reception. Folk-heroes of the day included "Ooh Shaun Taylor" and free-scoring midfielder Kevin Horlock.

The ups and downs of the next three years ended in 19th, 18th and 17th places in the table, the last of those achieved by Jimmy Quinn who had returned to one of his former happy goalhunting grounds.

A miserable winless streak followed and demotion was made mathematically certain at Stockport the next Easter Monday, Bring on "The Brady Bunch", Colin Todd and a major investment in the squad. He departed for Derby soon afterwards. Andy King was left to shop at Tesco rather than Harrods, avoided the drop, was dismissed and then returned following Roy Evans' brief reign. The progression, 13th, 10th, the play-offs. What happens next? It looks like Easter can be a crucial time at this club (see references above!) On the pitch and off with so many out of contract players, the longer-term picture could become clearer although the revenue from the big Bank Holiday derby here will clearly be lost.

I met the lads the day before the game and then played without really knowing them that well. But everyone made me feel welcome and I've really enjoyed my time here.

It was a nice way to start my loan spell. Plus we got the three points, which was the most important thing – it's just a shame the last two results haven't gone our way.

It must have been odd, though - travelling down, meeting fans and your new team-mates and playing almost immediately?

It was tough. I met the lads the day before the game and then played on the Wednesday night without really knowing them that well. But everyone made me feel welcome from the moment I joined and I've really enjoyed my time here.

You've been on loan at a number of clubs - Hivdovre, Halifax, York City and Bradford City - do you feel like you just want to settle down at one club?

Yeah, I've been on loan a few times. I'm getting to the stage in my career now that I want to settle down. It's been a tough season at Rotherham, for the team and me, but hopefully next year will be better. I have a year to go on my contract there so I just hope I can take my form here back into the Rotherham team.

What's been your best loan experience? The Bradford fans gave you a standing ovation when you returned there with Sunderland didn't they?

They've all been good to be honest, including this loan spell here. Bradford were great to me, they gave me the chance to get some Championship games under my belt and play regularly at that level. I scored a few goals and it was good.

Another goal for you at Luton last week, it must be nice to be hitting the net regularly again?

Yeah, but the result didn't go our way – the goal means nothing if the team doesn't win. I thought we played well enough to win the match, a few things went against us and in the end the scoreline was a bit harsh.

As a striker with Premiership experience, what

do you make of our strikers here?

Sam has proved he's top quality and I've really enjoyed playing with him. Christian's just come back from injury and so I haven't really had the chance to play alongside him, but he looks sharp in training and again, he's a proven name. Young Andy Caton too, he looks very sharp in training, he could be a very good player.

What can you tell us about the young David Duke - you played together at Sunderland...

He was a couple of years older than me and so I didn't play with him that often. But he showed the kind of pace and hard work that has made him a regular here.

What do you think went wrong for you at Sunderland, because you actually played a number of first team games?

I played a few games under Howard Wilkinson and then I was in and out of the side under Mick McCarthy. In the end McCarthy gave Kevin Kyle and Marcus Stewart a run in the team





and they started scoring regularly, you can't argue with that. But I needed to play first team football...

Michael Reddy was another former Mackem forced to ply his trade in the lower leagues



having been on loan here... one Sunderland website includes you both up front in a team of players once destined to do well at Sunderland...

For me it was a huge decision to leave because I grew up at the club and had supported them all my life.

The fans definitely seemed to like you, though. They voted you most improved player in 2003...

I had a good rapport with them; they were always good to me.

There seems to have been a high turnover of strikers at the Stadium of Light?

When I was younger Niall Quinn and Kevin Phillips were the starting front two. They were probably the best partnership the club had had for years, they scored goals and so you couldn't argue with their inclusion. But later, when Kyle and Stewart were playing, they were scoring too and so you can't complain if they're producing the goods.

I suppose in a way you had plenty of good strikers to learn from. Kevin Phillips, Niall Quinn...

Kev's probably the best striker I've ever played with, probably the best I ever will play with – he just didn't miss the target. Hopefully I picked up different things from players like him and Marcus Stewart.

Were you surprised that David Bellion signed for Man United, nobody seemed to know much about him?

Not really. He has pace to burn and bags of ability. He's been in and out of the United side but he's a good striker, hopefully he'll get his chance at some stage.

I guess your highlight

"The Blonde Klinsmann"

Believe it or not, this was Michael's nickname at school. That's according to his old head of PE at Monkwearmouth School, Adam Walter...

"He was called 'the blond Klinsmann' at an awards evening once. He was my boy, an excellent centre forward. He scored goals galore - he had a great eye for goal. We used to pump balls for him to run on to and he'd stick it away.

"I remember taking a school team to Holland in 1994, there were about 20 other teams competing. We won the tournament and he was leading scorer, he was obviously a cut above the rest in the tournament. He had everything, pace, strength..." Adam was pleased to see Michael doing well at Swindon, and hopes the forward can settle at one club to return to the kind of form that saw him emerge as fans' favourite at Bradford and Sunderland. "They loved him at Bradford, but he was played in his right position and was given a run of games. I saw he was playing right wing for Rotherham, he's not going to score from there.

"He had an excellent record for Sunderland's reserves and even bagged a few for the first team. I just hope a club takes him on and gives him the chance he deserves. Sunderland's relegation hit him hard and he's been a bit low on confidence, but he's shown that he can score goals by notching two in four games for Swindon."

And how well did you know Andy (King) while at Sunderland, I assume that's how your move to Swindon came about?

Yeah, he was the Gaffer's chief scout when I was younger. He's a great character, a good personality and it's been nice to have the opportunity to meet him again and to try and do a job for him. Oh What Fun it is to see Swindon win Away...

... at MK Dons, Fri 25th March, National Hockey Stadium

Having never been to Milton Keynes in my life, the following information is taken from the excellent www. footballgroundguide.co.uk

Getting there:

By car: Leave the M1 at Junction 14 and take the A509 towards Milton Keynes. At the first island turn right onto the H5 Portway (signposted A509 (A5) Central Milton Keynes). Keep straight on this road crossing eight roundabouts. At the ninth roundabout turn left. The stadium is over on the right. If you do happen get lost, follow the signs for the railway station, as the stadium is located close to it. There is plenty of pay and display car parking around the stadium. This is mostly £1 for five hours immediately behind the home end, but other parking areas can cost as much as £5 for the same period (these areas

are indicated by red markings on the roads around the car park bays, so check carefully).

Pubs:

From the football ground guide website, Milton Keynes certainly looks like living up to its reputation as the most soulless place on the face of the earth. but here is what it says anyway. "On my visit the Police were helpfully pointing away fans in the direction of a bar called Chicagos which has been designated as an away fans pub. It is only a five minute walk away from the stadium, being located above the bus station, which is just in front and to the right of the railway station. Although it was fairly easy to get served in Chicagos, the venue is more suited to being a night club and for me it was a bit soulless. A better bet if you arrive a bit earlier is to make the slightly further walk to



the Wetherspoons located behind Abbey National's head office."

Ground:

Here's what the website says: "To be honest I had not been looking forward to visiting the stadium as it had formed a negative image for me. But I was actually pleasantly surprised. There was some atmosphere being created from the home fans, the stewarding relaxed and the facilities inside weren't that bad, plus the leg room and view from the away stand were good. My only real grumble was that on each side of the away end there were blocks of portakabin type toilets, which in the mens case seemed to have poorly designed entrances that allowed passers by to look directly in onto the urinals, Refreshments were provided by two burger vans selling the usual array of burgers, hot dogs & chips and on my visit they did quite well in serving the sold out away end. I and the away fans around me were quite amused with the loudspeaker request before the game for away fans to refrain from jumping up and down, in case it caused structural problems!"

With the rearrangement of the Easter break's match with Bristol City, the next home match at the County Ground will be on 9th April when Paul Merson brings his Walsall team to Wiltshire.

Ex-Arsenal star Merson took the reins last May as the club faced League One football through relegation from Division One.

He's had a mixed bag of results in his managerial debut season. Threatening to quit the club after a 5-0 defeat by Colchester towards the end of January, by mid February the Saddlers were eight points off the play-off zone and the boss felt a top six spot was still there for the taking.

Last week, top scorer Matt Fryatt scored the quickest goal in the League One season with his seven-second opener against Bournemouth. It was his 13th of the campaign, but couldn't prevent the Cherries fighting back for a 2-1 win at the Bescot Stadium, leaving Walsall back in 17th place.

Second in the goal scoring stakes is Jorge Leitao on 10 and Darren Wrack has seven. The player boss himself has chipped in with two. At the beginning of February, defender Lee Vaughan arrived on a non-contract basis from Portsmouth until the end of the season while striker Kris Taylor signed new two-year contract in mid March. The ex-Manchester United trainee had previously been on loan at Burton.

Our own Iffy Onuora started the season in a coaching capacity at the Bescot and Paul Merson lost another of his backroom team when assistant manager Frank Barlow left to join Gary Megson at Nottingham Forest. Barlow was appointed after Megson failed in a bid to bring an ex-County Ground legend, Frank Burrows as his second in command. Burrows and Megson had previously teamed up at West Bromwich Albion.

The game should be Town's 40th of the season and both teams are likely to need the points to assist the campaign. Walsall have lost five out of their last six away games, with the one success on their travels coming against Bristol City at Ashton Gate.

Let's hope that's not an omen for when Walsall travel south on the M5.
