Luton Town who were crowned winners.





Swindon Town suffered two dismissals as they went down 4-0 at The Galpharm Stadium last weekend.





The Spireites' Squad

Chesterfield began the season brightly as they registered four wins and one defeat in their opening six games of the new League One season.

As August turned into September fortunes changes somewhat with early exits in the Carling Cup, FA Cup and LDV Vans Trophy coming at the hands of Rotherham, Scunthorpe and Macclesfield respectively.

Since then today's visitors have endured an up and down season with a number of narrow high-scoring defeats such as a 4-2 reverse at home to Wrexham and a 3-2 loss at home to Bournemouth. However, there have been highlights that included a magnificent 3-2 victory over Bristol City at Ashton Gate in late January with Allison scoring the second against another of his former clubs.

Top men in front of goal are Shane Nicholson and the tongue-twisteringly named, Congolese-born Tcham N'Toya who are both on seven. Level with big Wayne Allison is Caleb Forlan with six strikes.

Chesterfield's current league position is the lowest they've occupied all season, but their away form is little worse than Town's with five wins and six draws. The omens are good for Town today, as Chesterfield have not registered a win at The County Ground since the 1983/4 season.

21 Marton Fulop

Currently on-loan from Spurs, Fulop joined the Premiership side from MTK Hungaria in July 2004 and is gaining significant experience in League One. A dominant figure at 6'6, Town's strikers could face a challenge today.



2 Alex Bailey

Newham-born right back who joined from Arsenal, where he had been since the age of 12. He was a regular in the reserves at Highbury, making 17 starts and two substitute appearances.



5 Steve Blatherwick

Began his career in the Premiership with Nott'm Forest before joining Burnley. He signed for Chesterfield for £50,000 in 1998 after an initial loan period. Has scored 4 goals so far this season.



6 Derek Niven

Began his career in Scotland before being spotted by Bolton as a 17-year-old. Made his Chesterfield debut on loan in December 2003 before signing on a free transfer in March 2004.



8 Mark Allott

Signed on loan from Oldham in 2001 and completed his transfer to the Spireites in February 02. An excellent holding forward player, last season Mark played more in central or wide midfield role than as a striker.



10 Mark Hudson

A cultured midfielder signed on a free from Middlesborough in 2003, Mark was a familiar face at Saltergate already after spending three months on loan with the Spireites in the early part of the 02/03 season.



12 Gareth Davies

A player who can operate in defence or midfield, Davies began his career with Sheffield United before joining Buxton. Voted Young player of the Year for the 2001-02 season and was runner up last season.



14 Shane Nicholson

Now in his second spell at Saltergate after rejoining in the Summer of 2004 after being released by Tranmere Rovers. Previous clubs include Lincoln, Derby, Stockport, Sheffield United and West Brom.



16 Caleb Folan

Signed from Leeds United, Folan has played a full part in Chesterfield's season this term after recovering from injury, scoring six goals to date including match winners against Blackpool and Bradford.



20 Jamie McMaster

Australian midfielder well-known to Town fans after a loan spell earlier in the season. Scored 2 goals in a seven game loan spell for Chesterfield last term, before signing permanently until the end of this season.



22 Tcham N'Toya

N'Toya was a surprise deadline day signing last season initially on a short-term contract. Noted for his somersaulting goal celebrations he impressed immediately and was signed on a two-year deal.



23 Ian Evatt

Evatt was manager Roy McFarland's first signing for the Spireites in 2003 after his release from Derby. A versatile player having played in midfield, defence, striker and even as an emergency goalkeeper.



26 Carlos Logan

Left-winger Carlos Logan joined the Spireites in March 2005 on loan from Premiership side Manchester City. A player with bags of pace, Logan scored at home to Tranmere in the 2-2 draw at Saltergate.

'The Chief' made the short switch along the A61 to Chesterfield at the start of the current campaign and has been a success story during his first season at Saltergate.

He started his career with Halifax Town before a fee of £250,000 took him to Watford, where The Chief soubriquet was born. £300,000 was paid by Bristol City after a year at Vicarage Road, and five years later he arrived at The County Ground with Swindon paying £475,000 for his services.

During his time with


Swindon he became a regular feature in the line-up, scoring 31 goals in 100 league starts and helping the club to the Division Two Championship in 1996.

In November 1997 he went "home" to the Town of his birth, Huddersfield and then, after two years, Tranmere Rovers invested £300,000. In 2002 he signed up as a Blade and became a major part in Sheffield United's success as they reached the FA Cup semi-finals.

'The Chief' is still knocking the goals in at the age of 36. With six to his name this season,

he is level third top scorer for Chesterfield and Town fans take note, he scored the

winner against us at Saltergate back in November in a 1-0 victory for the Spireites.






Steve Jenkins

Worst Haircut







The lows include the



It didn't take long for a new face to make




claimed Town's man of the match award.

Farewell & **Good Luck!**

STFC Magazine remembers the best bits of those leaving the County Ground this summer...

Andy King may have opted to throw Giuliano Grazioli, Gary Alexander and Michael Reddy together in an attacking line-up to face Oxford United in March 2001, but it was the boot of Steve Robison that secured a valuable three points against our local rivals in a season that threatened to see Town demoted to the nation's fourth tier.

Down to nine men, Oxford threw everything (including their pocket change

at 'keeper Steve Mildenhall) at Town as they looked to safeguard their own future against relegation into what is now League Two, but Turbo's stunning strike added to his earlier impressive effort to ensure the U's went home empty handed and the Nottingham-

unsuccessfully trying to start from scratch in the summer of 2000. One of these new signings, Matt Hewlett from neighbours Bristol City, had struggled to adapt to the pace of life as a central midfielder in League One, despite showing promise at City and performing

midfield Hewlett and Robison enjoyed some good times. In 2000/01 Hewlett was often made a scapegoat for Town's poor performances, but after signing a new two-year contract in the summer ahead of the 2002/03 campaign he put in some of his finest performances. Hewlett was even given the captain's arm band in Andy Gurney's absence and as well as overseeing an 11-game unbeaten run, he kept the arm band on Gurney's return to the line-up before picking up the Supporters' Trust Most Improved Player award at the end of the season. Heck, he even bagged the odd goal - the midfielder notching a stunner against Notts County in last season's 4-0 win en route to his collection of



born cult status on the terraces. Unfortunately Robbo failed to match his opening two-goal salvo and it was a further 22 months until he added to his goal tally!

However, the dressing room funny man's arrival from Birmingham City in February 2001 coincided with a good spell for the Robins - Robbo adding a touch of experience and steel in to Town's young side. One defeat in nine games was a good return for a team that had struggled to gel all year, Colin Todd

for England's youth set up. Three years later and a further 200 appearances down the line, including a large number as captain, and the Bristol-born 29-year old will feel that he has served the club well.

Together in Town's



seven strikes in total.

Robbo shares a similarly prolific rate in front of goal, the diminutive



workhorse notching six goals in 156 games. Steve's tireless running and terrier-like tackling made him a favourite of the terraces, while his ability to dig in around the pitch (right wing-back, for example) made him a manager's dream. And while he didn't particularly command the biggest presence, his hard work has certainly served Andy King well in his time at the club.

Together Robbo and Hewlett surprisingly notched a goal apiece in the 5-2 romp at Stockport in January 2003 - yet they've also had their fair share of injuries between them.


Hewlett has missed chunks of past seasons with a variety of knocks, while Robbo has had to sit out the majority of the current campaign.

While Matty Hewlett is unlikely to play today, Town fans might get the chance to show their appreciation for Robbo's efforts in some guise. Whatever happens, next season won't be the same without Hewlett's Paul Radcliffe-style running in the midfield or Turbo's endless work.
