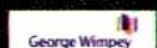

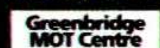

Town's biggest League win against Bristol City came on Saturday 3rd October 1953, when goals from Maurice Owen, Mike Bull, Jim Cross, Ken Lambert and Harry Lunn gave Swindon a 5-0 victory in front of 15,481 at The County Ground.

Good evening and a warm welcome to the Players, Officials and Supporters of Bristol City here for tonight's game at The County Ground...

I have mixed memories of games against Bristol City as a Town player. One occasion that sticks in the mind was a 3-2 home win in September 1998 here at The County Ground. We hung on at the end having had two players sent off, but we ended with the three points. One not so memorable moment was coming off injured in a defeat at Ashton Gate later that same season.

Bragging rights are at stake tonight for our supporters and I am sure there will be a great atmosphere

we can make a positive impression on those who are watching.

As the home team we will be approaching the game in a positive fashion. I don't think you can legislate for sending a team out to get a draw, but as always we will be positive in our play and with your excellent vocal support I am sure the players have it in them to do well.

Turning to playing matters, Hameur Bouazza has now extended his loan spell, so will come back into the fold after missing out on last weekend's FA Cup game with Boston United.

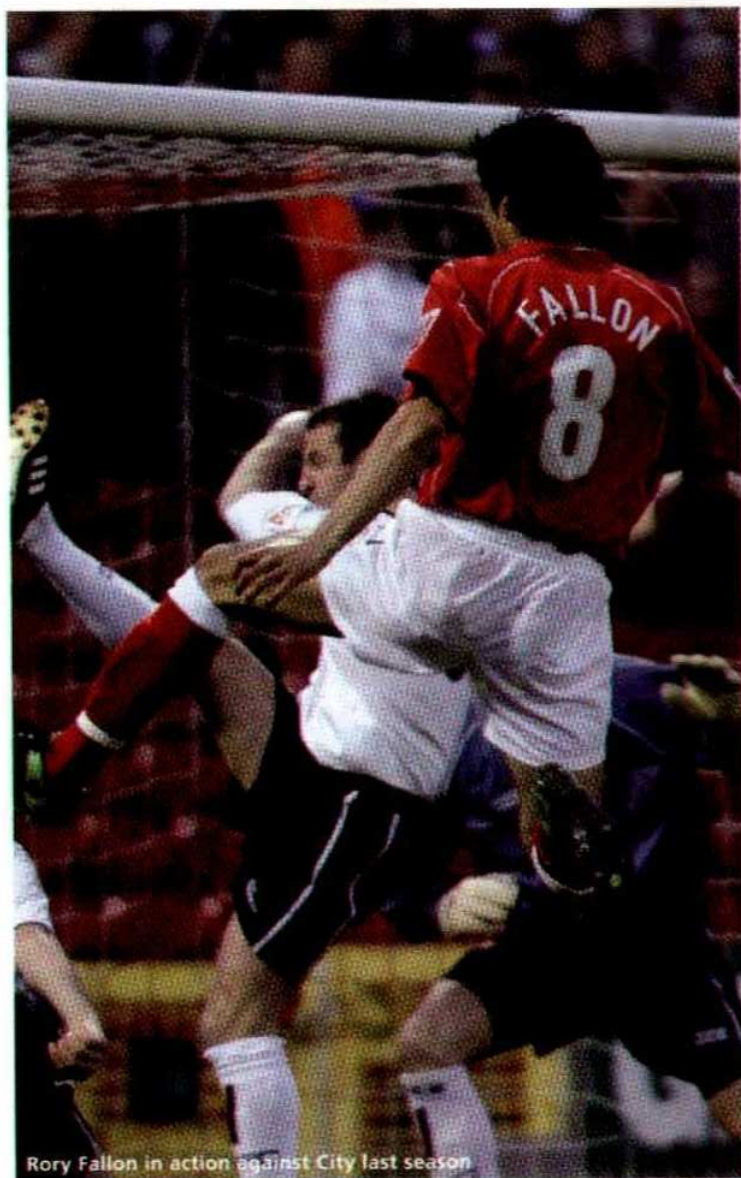
I would ask all our supporters to get behind the team this evening for what is an important night's football. The stage is set - the waiting is over. Enjoy the game.

Last year our home draw against Bristol City was one of two games postponed because of International call-ups. The rescheduled midweek game did not attract the same numbers and obviously the club suffered financially as a result. This season we have not had to reschedule this game and have the added bonus of having the game broadcast live Sky Sports. They have been here since Monday setting up with Council Officials monitoring their progress.

We are fortunate to have another chance to progress to Round Two of the FA Cup with the forthcoming replay at Boston on the 16th November. We can thank Charlie Comyn-Platt for his 87th minute goal to keep us in the cup! If we can win this match then a home tie against Doncaster Rovers awaits.

Super-sub Charlie Comyn-Platt earned a replay for Town after they had twice been behind to Boston United in this FA Cup First Round tie, wrote STFC Sports Reporter Adrian Smith.

Swindon lined up with several changes from last week's starting XI with Tony Thorpe making a rare start up front because leading scorer Rory Fallon was still struggling with a back injury. Michael Pook dropped down to the substitutes' bench and there was a home debut for David Stroud.

It was visiting Boston who took the lead through Simon Rusk in the 25th minute. After picking the ball up in midfield he unleashed a venomous shot from thirty five yards which saw the ball fly into the top right hand corner of the net past Tom Heaton.

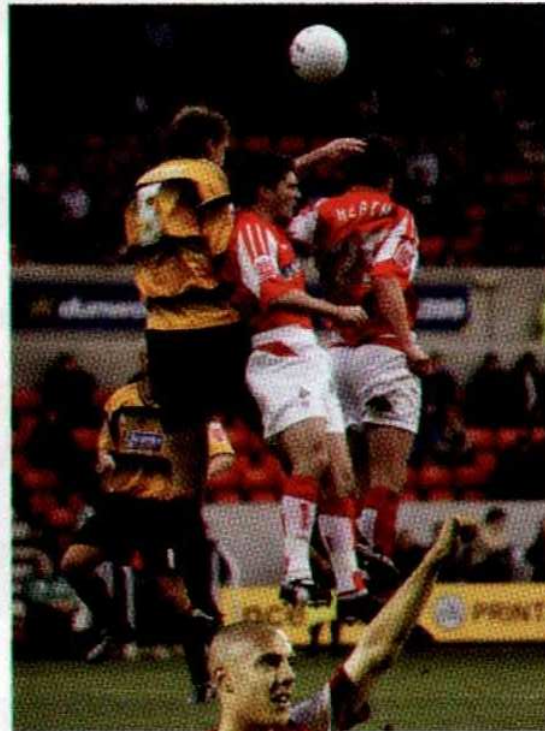
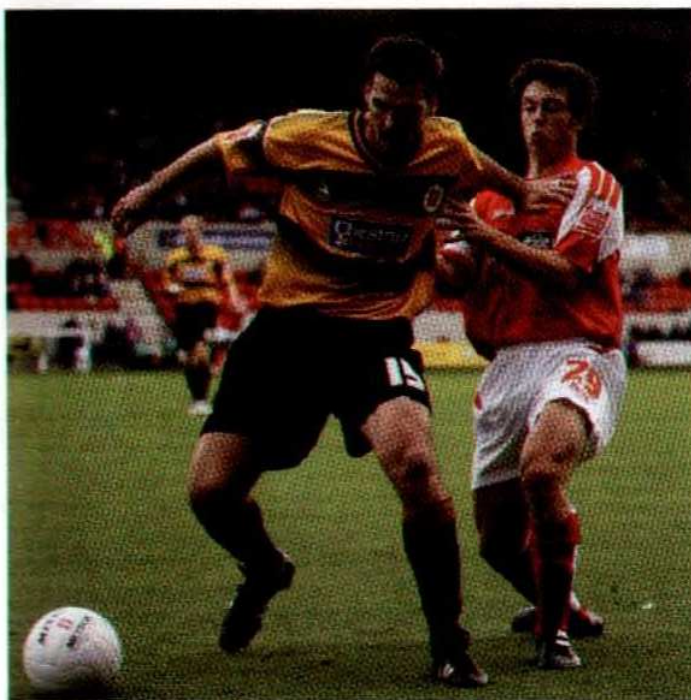
Town took a while to regain their composure but eventually won a corner in the 30th minute which was taken long by Colin Heath and saw Andy Gurney send a looping header goalwards which was caught by Nathan Abbey under the crossbar. Stefani Miglioranzi was fouled in midfield in the 32nd minute and up stepped Andy Gurney to send in a thunderous piledriver from the free-kick which Abbey simply could not save due to the immense power behind the shot.

Boston re-took the lead undeservedly in the 43rd minute with a freak goal when a shot from twenty five yards by Stewart Talbot struck the left hand post and rebounded off the unlucky Tom Heaton into the net.

Charlie Comyn-Platt replaced Stefani Miglioranzi in the 83rd minute and the substitution did pay dividends for Town when Gurney's long punt into the penalty area saw 'keeper Abbey collide with one of his defenders. The ball ran loose for Charlie Comyn-Platt, who gleefully fired home from 8 yards for his first goal in Town colours.

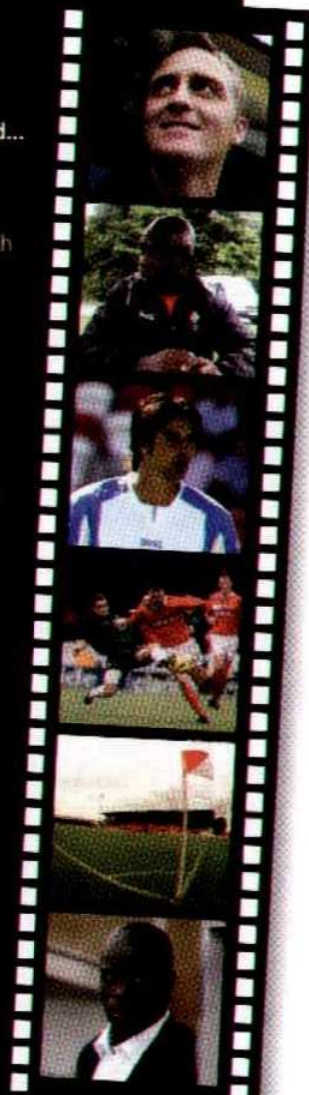

It's been a short trip along the M4 for our visitors, and we offer a warm welcome to players, supporters and officials of Bristol City for tonight's League One encounter...

There's the chance of renewing some old acquaintances this evening, with City's Matt Heywood and Grant Smith looking to face their former employers, while our own Christian Roberts will hope to play against the team that he left to join the County Ground.

It's been an eventful first three months for Swindon and City, with both seeing changes in the manager's office since the season kicked off.

City manager Gary Johnson brings a team to the County Ground for the second time this season. Back in August, his Yeovil Town side arrived for their first ever league match against us, and left on the end of a 4-2 defeat.

City crashed out of the FA Cup at the first hurdle last weekend at the hands of Notts County. It's a cliché, but nevertheless true, that the Ashton Gate side can now concentrate on lifting

themselves away from the wrong end of the table.

Neither club has made the sort of start that supporters will have wanted and now, with the season a third of it's way through, both clubs will know it's time to start putting things right.

It's a critical time of the season and there's more than just local kudos at stake tonight. An interesting encounter looks on the cards.

ONE TO WATCH: STEVE BROOKER

Striker Steve Brooker signed on a three-and-a-half year deal potentially worth up to £225,000 in September 2004.

He started his career as a trainee with Watford before moving to Port Vale, where he spent just over four seasons, winning a LDV Vans Trophy winners medal in 2001.

Brooker describes himself as a "targetman" and was bought by Brian Tinnion to fulfil that role and responded by scoring 16 goals last season. Named on-field vice-captain in February 2005.

The Squad

Goalkeeper **Steve Phillips** joined City in November 1996 from local non-league side Paulton Rovers. An excellent shot-stopper, he earned his first-team debut in December 1998. Now established as the club's first-choice keeper, he signed a new three-year contract in autumn 2003.

Once a target of former Town Manager Andy King, **Bradley Orr** was signed on a free transfer from Newcastle United in the summer of 2004. Began his career with Everton before moving to St James Park where he skipped

the club's reserve side. Made his professional debut in the opening game of the 2004/05 season. Well known to Town's fans, **Matt Heywood** made the summer switch to Ashton Gate after spending four seasons here at the County Ground. Started his career with Burnley. A £150,000 summer signing from Motherwell, **Dave Partridge** started his career with West Ham and has also played for Dundee United and Leyton Orient (loan). Capped six times by Wales. Academy product **Scott Golbourne** began the 2004/05 season as a first-year scholar before signing a two-year professional contract after making his debut away at

Colchester United in February 2004. Capped at under-17 and under-19 level by England. The versatile **Kelly Youga** signed on a one-month loan deal from Charlton Athletic, whom he joined this summer after leaving French champions Lyon. Youth product **Louis Carey** made his City debut in October 1995 as a right-back. Partnered Shaun Taylor in central defence during the 1997/98 promotion season before reverting to a right-sided role under Danny Wilson, with whom he helped win the LDV Vans Trophy in 2003. Left the club to join Championship side Coventry in the summer of 2004 only to have a change of heart and re-sign for his hometown club in February 2005. Capped once by Scotland at under-21 level. Central defender **Osei Sankofa** signed on a one-month loan deal from Charlton Athletic. Capped by England at youth level.

Club Captain **Scott Murray** was a transfer deadline day signing from Reading in March 2004, signing a three-year deal as he returned for a second spell at the club with whom he scored 61 goals in 271 games between 1997-2003. He first arrived at Ashton Gate in a £150,000 transfer from Aston Villa in December 1997. Capped by Scotland at B level, he started his career with Fraserburgh before moving to Aston Villa in a £35,000 deal in March 1994. A summer

Bosman signing, **Alex Russell** joined from Torquay United, where he gained a reputation for his passing skills and superb fitness levels. Started his professional career with Rochdale and also played for Cambridge United before joining the Gulls in August 2001. **Dave Cotterill** is a product of the club's Academy, for whom he was leading scorer in the 2003/04 season. Capped five times by Wales at Under-21 level, he can play up front or on either wing. Another summer signing from The County Ground, **Grant Smith** will be vying for a place in tonight's line-up.

Signed on a month's loan from Peterborough United on 21st October, Northern Ireland international **James Quinn** played in his country's 1-0 win over England in Belfast in September 2005. Has also played for Birmingham City, Blackpool, Stockport County (loan), West Bromwich Albion, Dutch side Willem II, Notts County (loan), Bristol Rovers (loan) and Sheffield Wednesday, with whom he won promotion to the Championship in 2004/05. **Guy Madjo** signed a two-month contract in September 2005 after scoring twice in three games for the reserves whilst on trial. Made his debut at Brentford in September. **Steven Gillespie** was Danny Wilson's final signing as City manager when he arrived at Ashton Gate in May 2004, after being released by Liverpool.

Gary Johnson

Gary Johnson was appointed manager of Yeovil Town on June 19 2001, having previously been coach of the Latvia national team.

A former Watford player, Gary's other League management experience was gained at Cambridge United.

Gary went on to work at Watford as their Academy Director under manager Graham Taylor. While there he was approached by Latvia and was appointed first team coach of Latvia in 1999 on two-year contract and is credited with helping to build a team that slowly but surely started to give the bigger footballing nations in Europe a run for their money.

At the end of his two-year contract Gary decided in the interests of his family to return to England where he took over at Yeovil Town at the end of the 2000-01 season. He took The Glovers up into League One before making the switch to Ashton Gate in September 2005.



- Bristol City reached the **FA Cup Final** in 1909, losing 1-0 to Manchester United at Crystal Palace, the club's only appearance in a major final.
- Widely regarded as City's finest post-war player, **John Atyeo** set the club appearance

and goal-scoring records during 15 years at Ashton Gate from 1951-1966. He scored 351 goals in 645 appearances.

- In 1982 City were relegated to Division Four, and the club plunged into financial crisis. A new club was formed: **Bristol City FC (1982) Limited**,



avoiding closure by a whisker.

As part of Swindon's anti-bullying week, Swindon Town F.C. Study Centre is hosting an anti-bullying event "Special day for special people" on Thursday 24th November.

Schools have been invited to bring a small group of students who act as peer mentors and peer mediators to the event as a reward for their work. The morning session will be in two parts, the young people will take part in a soccer skills challenge event led by the Football in the Community coaching staff. The students will also use the excellent computer programme Kar2touche. We have recently introduced this software to our study support programme and it has been very well received by students and staff. 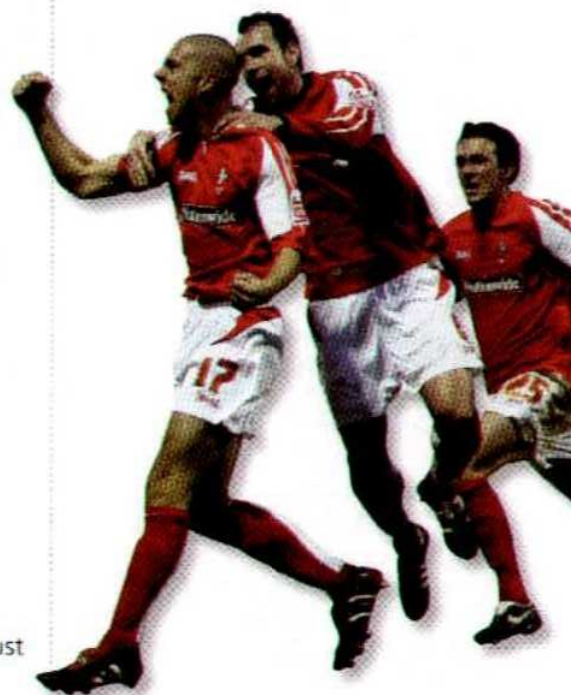

It closed the book there and then on goal of the season, goal of the decade, etc. Not too many years before, the Town finished with nine men, red-cards for Sol Davis and Robin Hulbert, as I recall. Kim Reeves

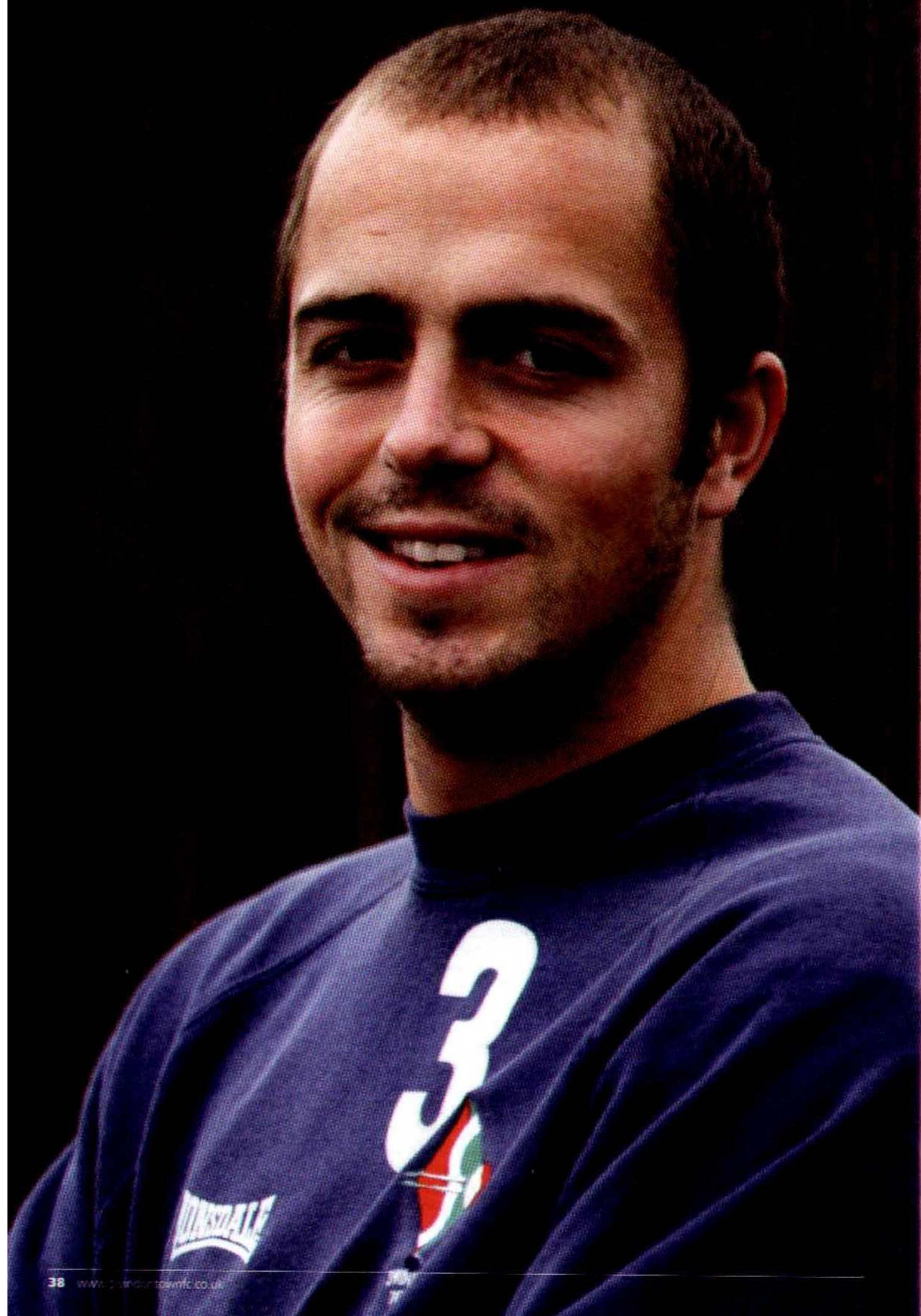


Kim started kicking a ball around with her Dad in the back garden before joining Coleview Girls team and played for the school team when she was at Drove Junior School.

Jack On the Box

JACK SMITH ON HORNETS IN THE ROBINS NEST,
MOVING UP THE TABLE AND SCORING GOALS...

Swindon Town's record in front of the television cameras is legendary. Rack your brains right now and try and recall the last time the red and white dynamite won with the couch potato world watching... hard isn't it?

You'll have to re-live painful memories such as Brighton away (play-offs) Notts County away (FA Cup), Oxford away (ditto - painful)... in fact I can't even remember when it was (answers on a postcard please folks)

Thank the lord, then, that we've got some players who are used to performing on the big stage. Take Jack Smith, for example, who scored the decisive winning penalty against Sheffield United in the third round of the Carling Cup last season, and who played against Chelsea's Adrian Mutu, Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink and Eidur Gudjohnsen in an FA Cup tie a year earlier. To Jack, tonight's game, televised on Sky Sports, is just another match.

In reality it's anything but – but at least the players are calm and focused! But with local rivals Bristol City six points ahead of Town and in the bottom four as well, tonight's game not only means there's local pride at stake, but also crucial points too. That, and there are players on both sides looking to settle a few scores...

"Thorpey says they'll bring a few," Jack admits, "But the team's changed a bit since he was there, so he couldn't give us too many tips!"

Tony Thorpe, like Christian Roberts will be eager to

you thought the Swindon-City derby was feisty, it's nothing compared to Luton-Watford apparently...

"You can't even walk down the street with your tracksuit on as a fan," admits Smith, who was on the bench the last time the two sides met in the League Cup in September 2002. "It was probably a good job really, there was a lot of trouble involved."

"I used to play up front – but since I was 16 I seemed to have moved further and further backwards! But look at Charlie [Comyn-Platt] last weekend, a goal like that can make you a hero and that's what drives you forward. I could definitely do a job up there if asked!"

It wasn't until Jack was reverted to a swashbuckling defender at Vicarage Road that his professional career really took off. Heralded by many Hornets fans as a rising star, it came as a surprise that Smith opted to move away in the summer – but the arrival of such players as Jack Chambers, Jermain Darlington and Paul Mayo made his role less and less secure, and saw him fritter away in the reserves.


"The manager bought in a lot of players and I guess in the end he preferred them, but that's football wherever you go. I could have stayed there and kept on doing what I was doing, but I wanted more regular football. "He offers something different, something we didn't have," explains Jack, who believe it or not, becomes the third Jack Smith to play for Swindon, one having signed from Watford, the other a left-back!

Jack remembers Hameur well from his Watford days, if not on the playing side then for stealing the 2003/04 Player of the Year Award from his grasp! "I'd played 20 games and scored two goals, and he'd played the last four or five and scored one – and still ended

up winning it – but I won't hold it against him!"

The former Watford trio now travel in together to training and while Smith is expected to be the only one not starting this evening, Bouazza in particular looking to double his tally, he'll be kicking every ball from the bench.

"It's a massive game, but at the end of the day we have to look at it as being another three points, and a win against our rivals would give us great confidence in climbing away from the foot of the table."

And that ultimately, is what it's all about... let's just hope we have some overdue luck in front of the live cameras...

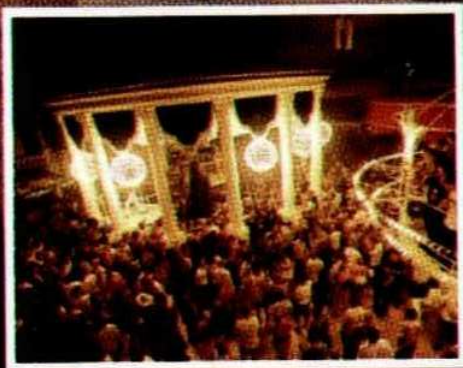

1985/86



Successful Season for both sets of Robins

At the beginning of any season there are few trophies on offer and few clubs will be able to call themselves winners at the end, but in the summer of 1986, both of tonight's clubs had silverware to polish. That made 1985/86 a season to cherish at the County Ground and Ashton Gate.

Town started their fourth season in the basement division of the Football League. Lou Macari had been appointed the year before and had suffered the ignominy of being sacked at Easter

before being re-instated as the Bank holiday ended.

Consecutive defeats at home to Wrexham and away at Hereford wasn't a good start and the first tables saw Town 23rd in Division Four. By the end of September, Town had played eight and lost five of them. Still in the bottom four, there was little evidence that things were about to change dramatically.

During the summer Macari had brought in midfielder Tony Evans, and Luton pair, keeper Jake Findlay and old-Town winger David Moss, but they had failed to click and were all

on their way out. The player/manager dropped himself to the bench, never to play again and Town launched into a run of five successive victories.

And that was just the start. Incredibly, over 19 games, 17 finished in wins and the 1-0 success at Torquay in the last match of 1985 took Town to the top of the table.

With four games to go, Town had opened up a gap at the top but Macari was not to risk letting things slip. Four straight wins took us to 102 points, 18 points clear of 2nd placed Chester City.

Surely the star turn was goal-scoring sensation Charlie Henry.

Converted from fullback where he'd showed little evidence of predatory tendencies, Lou saw something that no previous manger had spotted. Charlie finished top scorer on 18 goals, with Colin Gordon one strike behind. Peter Coyne followed on ten.

As for Bristol City, their silverware came with a 3-0 win over Bolton Wanderers in the Freight Rover Trophy at Wembley. Two goals from Steve Neville and a strike from Swindon old boy Howard

Pritchard took the much re-named cup west along the M4.

On the way, City had disposed of Plymouth, Walsall, Northampton and Gillingham.

Also in Cup competition, it was City who ended Town's involvement in the FA Cup at the first hurdle. A 0-0 draw at the County Ground took the tie to Bristol where a Steve Neville hat-trick and a goal from Glyn Riley put City through to round two, despite goals from Chris Ramsey and Leigh Barnard for Town.

City then went out to Exeter, a team featuring future Town man and current Orient boss Martin Ling. Finishing 9th in Division Three, City were to face Town on a level playing field the following season.

Ex-Town men Brian Williams and the afore mentioned Howard Pritchard played

their parts, and destined for future success, David Moyes and Bristolian Keith Curle were also part of manager Terry Cooper's squad.

Steve Neville netted the most with 19. Alan Walsh was a goal behind and Glyn Riley grabbed ten.

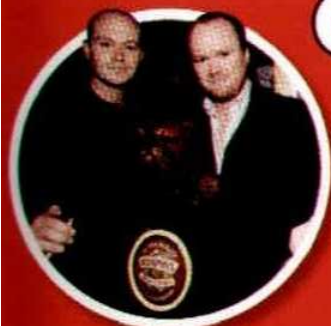

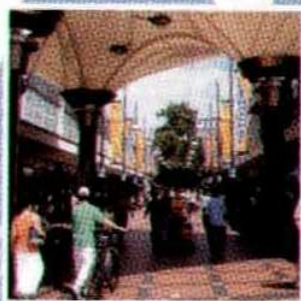

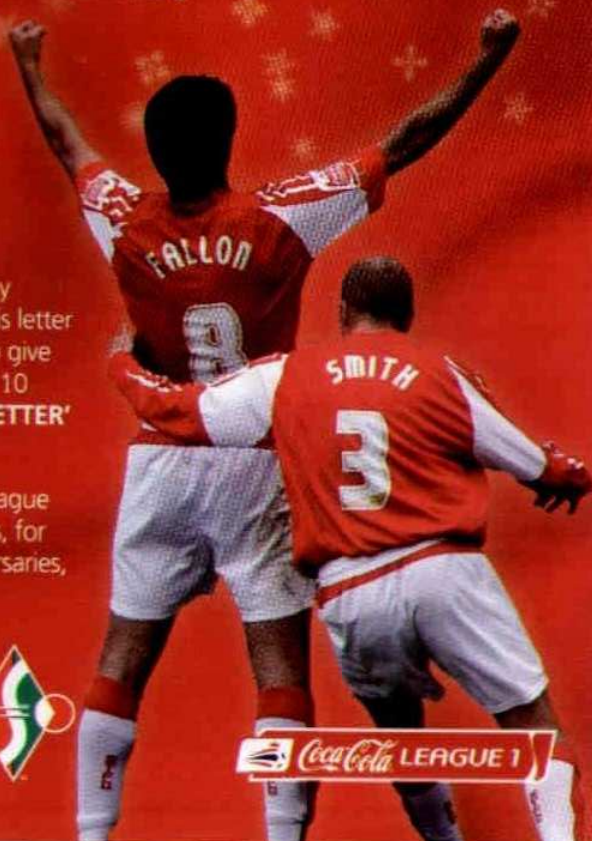

We Meet Again



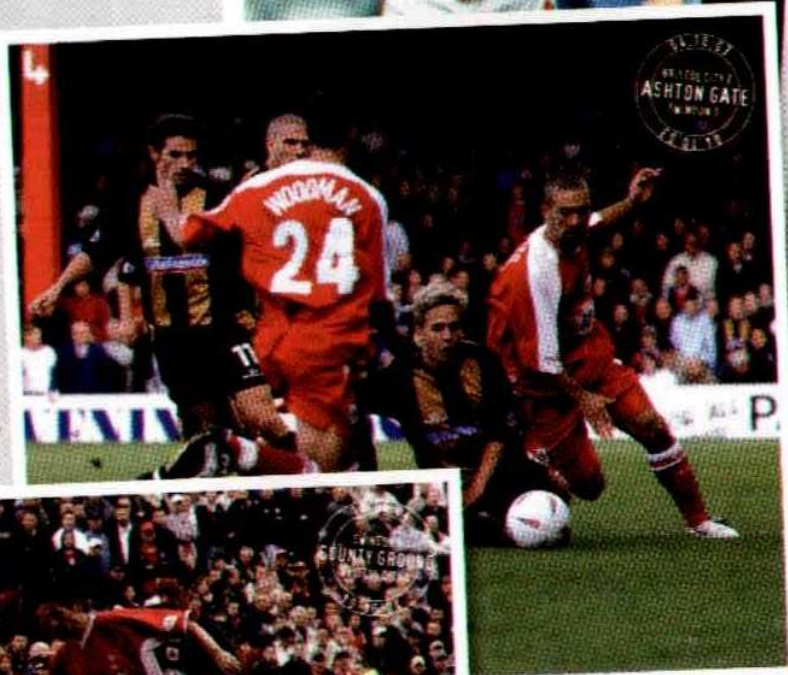
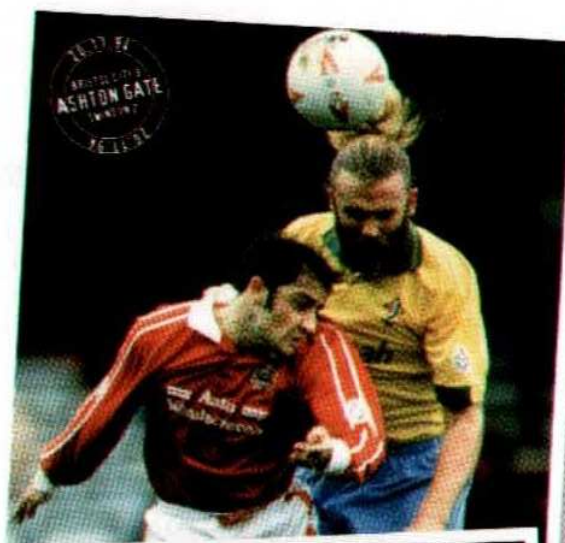

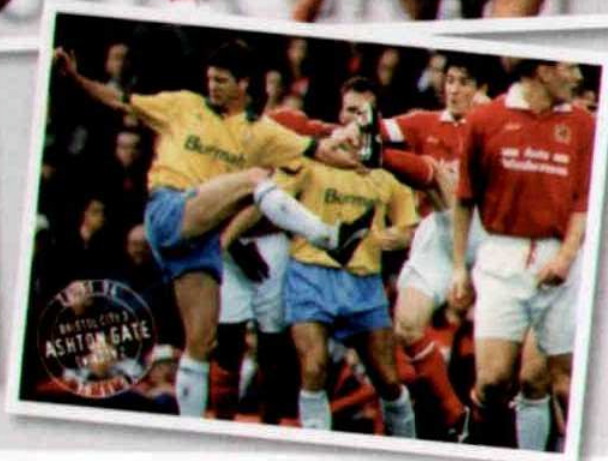
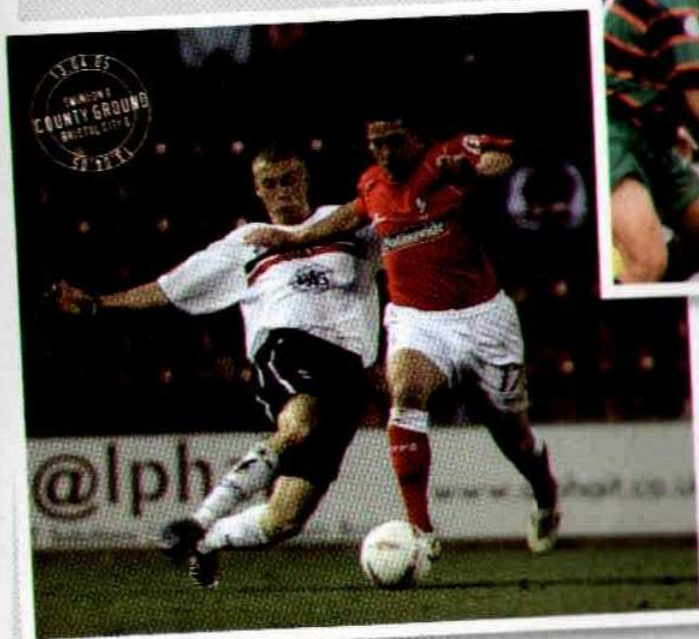
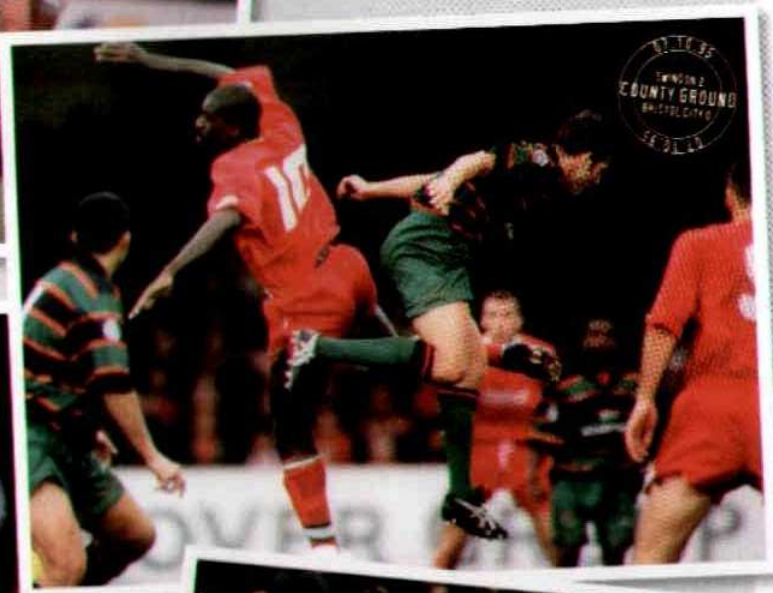
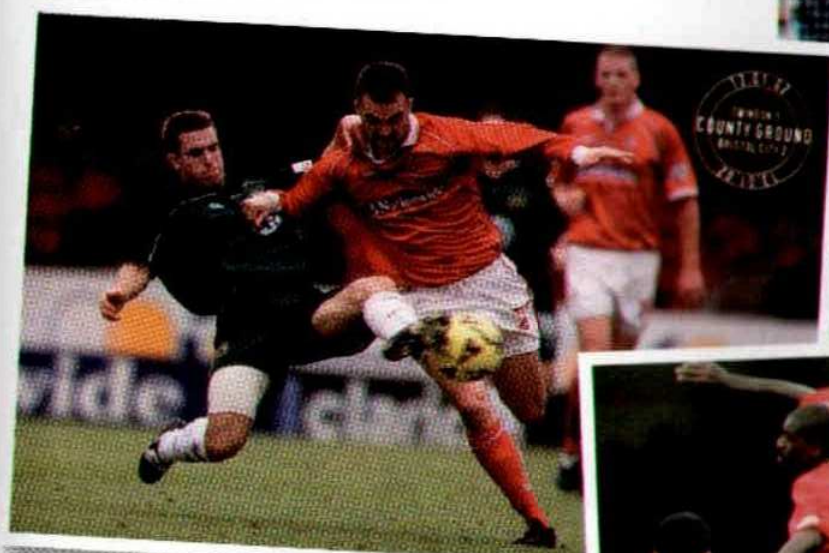
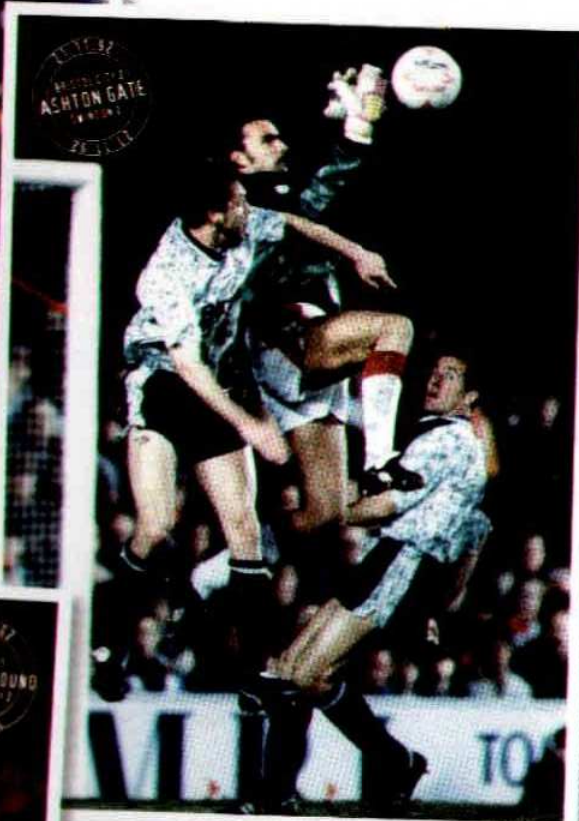
Tonight's game will no doubt be an entertaining one with both sides looking up at League One.

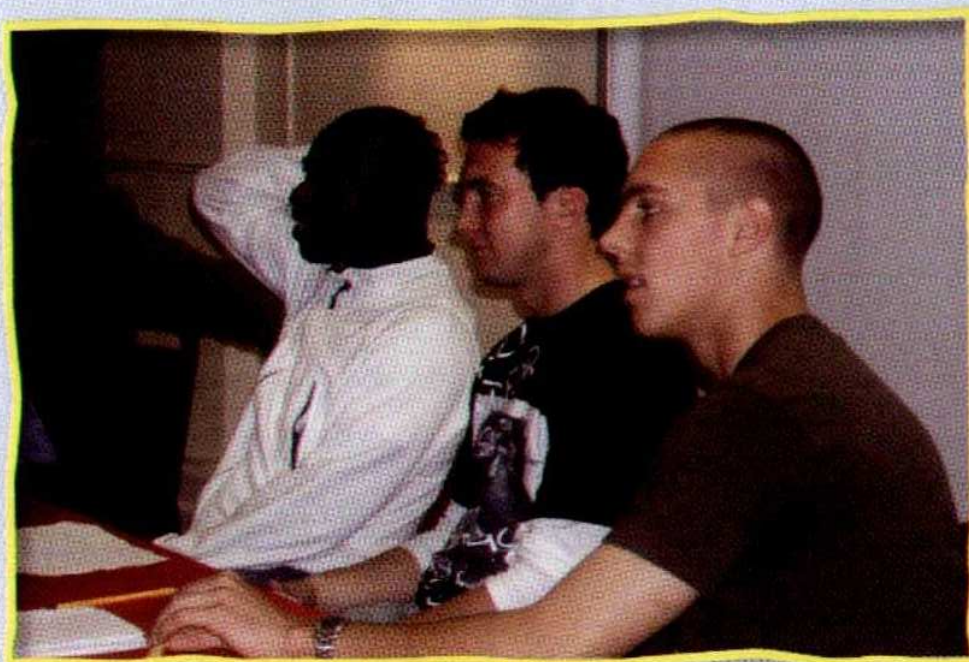

We seem to have had a succession of games over the last few weeks that have paired us against teams around the top half dozen in League One. Our next home match is no exception.

Barnsley venture south on 26th November and the first third of the season has taken them to a current position of fifth with a haul of 25 points.

Last season saw a 13th place finish, one position lower than Town, so progression has certainly been made. Then, after a 2-2 draw in October, a brace from Sam Parkin gave Town a 2-1 win in February this year with Jacob Burns grabbing the consolation goal.

Manager Andy Ritchie was named this October's manager of the month for League One after three wins and two draws left the Tykes undefeated throughout.

Just as tonight's game with City sees the return of some familiar faces, ex-Town midfielder Brian Howard can expect to be wearing a Barnsley shirt. His second goal of the season secured the points in the recent 2-1 victory over Walsall.

As this week began, top man in front of goal was Chris Shuker on five. Paul Hayes has four and it was his fifth minute strike last weekend that was all that was necessary to progress to the second round of the FA Cup at Darlington's expense. Jacob Burns and Daniel Nardiello (pictured right) both have three.

Chelsea Scottish U-21 defender Steve Watt signed on a month's at the beginning of October, so that deal will need to be extended if he is to visit the County Ground, and defender Robbie Williams may well be spotted. Let's hope he's not on song.

One man hoping to be involved as soon as possible is midfielder Richard Kell. He signed from Scunthorpe in the summer but a broken leg means he is still to make his debut for the Tykes.

At present, Barnsley's away form reads won two, drawn two and lost two over the last six games.

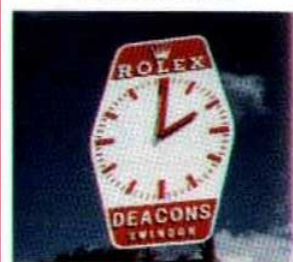

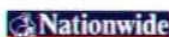
