It's tough times at the moment when you can't go into the market to cover for injuries and suspensions, it seems a strange time to close it.



Town have been stuck in the bottom slot since the end of September while the Millers slump has seen them slip from fourth position after the sixth game to their present third from the bottom. It is the 13th time Town have visited Millmoor for a league game with the first one being in January 1964 with the Division Two fixture ending goalless.

A Frank Casper goal was enough to give Rotherham a 1-0 win the following April while the teams didn't clash again until they met in Division Three in May 1969, the game ending all square at 1-1.

Again that was the last meeting for a few seasons and in October 1975 Swindon took all the points from Millmoor with a 2-0 win and it was all square at 1-1 the following season.

April 1978 saw Town yet again go home from South Yorkshire with a victory tucked under their belts, this time thanks to a 3-1 triumph and they repeated that scoreline in February 1979.

A much needed home win was recorded by the Millers in September 1979 with a 3-0 scoreline but Town gained revenge when they were crushing 6-2 home winners the following April.

A Mick Gooding goal was enough to give Rotherham the points in February 1981 along their way to lifting the Division Three title. Six years later Gooding was on the target again, this time from the penalty spot but it brought no reward as the home team were beaten 2-1.

Once again the teams were kept

apart for a long break and battles resumed again at Millmoor in Division Two in December 1995 when once again Town were the winners, this time by 2-0. The last visit here saw Swindon beaten 4-3 in March 2001 when Mark Robins notched a hat-trick and the victory for Rotherham was completed thanks to a Alan Reeves own goal.

This season for Swindon got under way with a 2-0 defeat at Barnsley and that was followed with a 3-2 home loss at the hands of Oldham Athletic.

A fine victory was then notched with Nottingham Forest beaten 2-1 at the County Ground. A point was taken from a goalless draw at Blackpool while Yeovil Town were then sent packing on the end of a 4-2 defeat as Town emerged 4-2 winners to occupy 14th position. But then came a very depressing sequence of results with eight successive defeats seeing Town drop down to the bottom of the table and they have remained there ever since.


The poor run was halted with three successive draws, against Brentford, Scunthorpe United and Huddersfield Town - all noteworthy achievements.


Then came a much needed victory with a 2-1 triumph against Bristol City in a televised game and after drawing 1-1 at Port Vale before Town suffered a 3-0 home defeat at the hands of Barnsley last Saturday.

stefani MIGLIORANZI

Miglioranzi is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer. Stefani helped St John's University win the 1996 NCAA Division I Championship and played for MLS team Chicago Fire before joining Everton on trial.

They were keen to sign him but no deal came about. Portsmouth then out jumped Liverpool in inviting him for a trial and signed him soon thereafter.

Swindon Town PLAYER PROFILES

RHYS EVANS

The promising young keeper joined Leyton Orient on a three-month loan deal in August 2002. He proved to be an excellent shot stopper and showed good command of his area.

SEAN O'HANLON

After impressing during an eight-game loan spell last season. Liverpool-born Sean O'Hanlon signed for Swindon Town in March 2004 on a permanent basis from Everton.

JACK SMITH

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith adds youthful experience to the Town side and arrives with a point to prove.

NICKY NICOLAU

Former Arsenal player who is equally at home in defence or in midfield. Signed from Southend United in the summer of 2005.

JEREL IFIL

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 02-04. Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004 and put in some solid performances during the following season.

STEVE JENKINS

Capped by Wales on 16 occasions, 'Jenks' was signed at the end of November 2004 and has provided added experience to the Town backline.

GARETH WHALLEY

Originally a trainee at Crewe, Gareth made over 200 first-team appearances for them before signing for Bradford City in July 1998 for \$600,000.

RORY FALLON

Signed from Barnsley, the big striker made quite an impression against Town in the past, scoring on many occasions and catching the eye of Town boss Andy King in doing so.

TONY THORPE

Striker Tony Thorpe made the switch along the M4 from Loftus Road in the summer of 2005, signing a 1-year deal. 31-year old Thorpe's overall goalscoring record stands at 136 strikes in 277 starts and he also scored one goal in five appearances for Rotherham United during a loan period at the end of last season.

RICKY SHAKES

A tricky winger with plenty of pace, Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club. Shakes spent time on loan with Bristol Rovers and Bury during the 2004-5 season and impressed Manager Andy King during a reserve game for STFC towards the end of the 2004-5 campaign.

RICKY SHAKES

A tricky winger with plenty of pace, Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club. He signed on for STFC in July 2005 and will be out to prove what he can do in League One.

Swindon Town PLAYER PROFILES

ALAN REEVES

Before joining Swindon in 1998, he spent four years at Wimbledon, where he had the tough task of replacing John Scales. Reeves has also played for Gillingham, Chester and Rochdale where he is considered to be one of the best players in the club's history.

KYLE LAPHAM

A fough-tackling former Centre of Excellence player, local-based Kyle progressed through the ranks and has made a number of appearances for the reserve team last season before signing a professional one-year deal in the summer.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town on Thursday 14th October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. Made a tremendous start to his Town career, scoring the winner on his debut against Oldham Athletic but was then ruled out with a hernia operation.

MICHAEL POOK

Third year scholar who has seen first team action on a number of occasions including the LDV Vans Trophy game at Boston United in 2003. An energetic 'box-to-box' midfielder.

BEN WELLS

One of three Centre of Excellence players who were signed on as first year scholars in June 2004.

ANDY CATON

A powerful striker, Andy Joined Swindon Town as a first year scholar in June 2004 after spending some time with GLS Hellenic Premier Division side North Leigh last season where he was a prolific scorer.

DAVID STROUD


'Stroudy' is another of Town's team with County Ground connections, with his Father Kenny starring for Swindon.

A skilful winger, he joined the Centre of Excellence before signing scholarship forms. He spent time on work experience with Basingstoke last season.

ASHAN HOLGATE

Tall, gangly figure who can operate as a striker or on the right of midfield. Scored on his senior debut against Millwall in pre-season 2004, after coming on as a substitute.

Made his first first team appearance in the first team this season, coming on as a late substitute in the FA Cup draw with Boston United.



charlie COMYN-PLATT

Charlie Comyn-Platt joined the Bolton Academy in the summer of 2002 after a long association with the club. The assured defender was called into the first team for the first time in

September 2003, and he was handed his debut when replacing Bruno N'Gotty for the final nine minutes of the 3-1 Carling Cup win over Walsall.

The worst possible display of refereeing by Trevor Kettle cost Rotherham United their first win in 13 league and cup games when they were cruelly denied at Oakwell as the official completely lost his way with a string of baffling decisions that were to prove so costly.

It meant the Millers were reduced to ten men on 56 minutes when Deon Burton was sent off for his second booking and it was even worse going down to nine men for the last ten minutes when Lee Williamson received the same harsh treatment. To rub salt into the Millers wounds the Tykes scraped a draw when they "netted" a goal in the fourth minute of added time and even that raised questions as it looked as if the ball hadn't crossed the line.

Then after the final whistle recalled skipper Colin Murdock was shown the red card for displaying his understandable anger at the referee. To make the officials actions even more baffling it had been far from a dirty game despite the fact that both teams gave their all as they battled for supremacy in the local derby game.

It was Rotherham who made the first launch on goal but Martin Butler's fifth minute shot was saved and two minutes later Burton received the first yellow card of the afternoon.


At the other end Shaun Barker did well to cut out a low cross from Devaney and then next effort on goal came from Rotherham but


after linking with Williamson, Burton's shot was wide.

On 23 minutes John Mullin's cross was headed down by debutant Paul Evans for Williamson to shoot wide and then a good Mullin cross was headed out.

Rotherham opened the scoring on 31 minutes when Paul McLaren curled in a superbly flighted free kick and Barker lost his marker to score with a close range shot.

It was no more than the Millers deserved and they had a great chance to increase the lead on 39 minutes when another McLaren free kick found Burton but he missed a great chance by heading wide. Four minutes into the second half two corners in quick succession saw the Millers fail to make anything of them while at the other end Burns fired wide after Neil Cutler had punched out a Devaney cross. Then on 56 minutes Burton was racing through when he appeared to be brought down by Watt but to everyone's disbelief it was the striker who was dismissed when it should have been the defender. That gave Barnsley fresh impetus and they started to push forward a lot

Last Saturday I wore the captain's armband for our game at Walsall and that's the first time I have done that for Rotherham United.

When I was at Luton Town I was captain there for a while but this time round it was a disappointing debut with that defeat at Walsall last Saturday.

We thought we had had the majority of the possession for 40 minutes when we were probably on top but then we conceded two stupid goals just before half time.

He packed a powerful shot in either foot and there was no better sight than when he used to cut in from the right to score from distance with his left foot.


He played such a starring role in a memorable

Rotherham FA Cup 3-1 win at holders Newcastle
United in 1953 that the Geordies tried to sign him
but they were turned down. Jack could also play at
centre forward where he played for England B.

After 11 seasons at Millmoor he finished his career at Lincoln City where he was able to maintain his record of scoring one goal in every three games - a fine ratio for a winger.





Another corner brought no reward to the Millers who at this stage looked well on top but they needed a second goal to capitalise on their superiority.

It might have come on 42 minutes when David Worrell found Monkhouse but he mishit his shot.

A 48th minute Evans free kick was just off target but the visitors gradually started to take control of the proceedings and Cutler had to make a good save on 53 minutes to keep out a superb shot from Parkin.

But three minutes later it was all square when Beresford crossed from the right and Parkin equalised with a powerful header.

In reply Jon Otsemobor shot wide but that proved to be a rare Rotherham effort on goal as play concentrated in the home half. Two visiting corners brought no reward before Beresford crossed again for Parkin's header to be blocked this time and from the follow up Townson fired wide.

A 79th minute shot from Evans went wide and he looked to be the only Millers player willing to have a good effort on goal. As the game looked to be heading for extra time it was Macclesfield who snatched a dramatic winner on 84 minutes when Sandwith curled a free kick from 20 yards into the top corner of the net.

Substitute Hoskins almost levelled matters on 90 minutes but his shot was deflected on to the post and out for a corner.





Football historian Leigh Edwards selects headline stories from this month covering 80 years of Rotherham United

1925 - HAT-TRICK OF WINS

After suffering a 7-0 hammering at Coventry City, the newly named Rotherham United recovered in fine style with successive 1-0 wins at home to New Brighton and away at Wigan Borough before they made it three on the trot with a fine 2-1 win at Barrow on 5th December with goals from Jackie Bestall and Bernard Chambers. The team on that occasion was John Mehaffy, Richard Jackson, Jimmy Turner, Tom Brelsford, Walter Picken, Hedley Bailey, Redvers Boulton, Jackie Bestall, Bernard Chambers, Jack Lee, Joe Scott. In their first season as United the Millers finished in 14th position in Division Three (North).

1929 - UNHAPPY TIME

The last game in November had seen Rotherham United hammered 7-1 at Southport in Division Three (North) and the following month didn't bring any early better results as on the 7th they were beaten 3-1 at Carlisle United. The next game saw another defeat, this time at Wrexham to make it three away defeats on the trot. The team at Carlisle was Tom Atter, Richard Jackson, Jimmy Turner, Charlie Robinson, Andy Smailes, Ernie Pattison, Billy Sellars, Vic Wright, Albert Parkin, George Murden, Albert Orr. It was very much a season of struggle for Rotherham as they finishe din 20th spot – three from the bottom

1948 - RECORD AWAY WIN

Hat-tricks apiece by Wally Ardron and Tommy Lowder plus goals from Jack Grainger and Jack Edwards gave Rotherham United a thrilling 8-1 Division Three (North) victory over Carlisle United in front of 14.639 at Brunton Park on 4th December 1948: Danny Bolton, Jack Selkirk, Arthur Radford, Jack Edwards, Horace Williams, Danny Williams, Jack Grainger, Gladstone Guest, Wally Ardron, Jack Shaw, Tommy Lowder. The Millers had lost 6-1 at York City in their previous League match two weeks earlier. It remained Rotherham's record away win until equalled by the 8-1 victory at Crewe in September 1973.

1950 - SHAW CUTS DOWN FOREST

Jack Shaw's hat-trick gave Rotherham United an exciting 3-0 FA Cup second round win over Nottingham Forest at Millmoor on 9th December 1950: Danny Bolton, Jack Selkirk, Norman Noble, Jack Edwards, Alf, Gibson, Colin Rawson, Jack Grainger, Danny Williams, Jack Shaw, Gladstone Guest, Jimmy Rudd. The Millers had crashed to a 5-0 defeat in the only previous FA Cup meeting between the two clubs in 1929-30. Ace marksman Jack Shaw had netted five times in the 7-2 victory at Darlington in the previous round and scored a club record 46 league and up goals that season as the Millers won the Division Three (North) title.

1956 - TOO SHARP FOR BLADES

Two goals apiece by Keith Bambridge, Brian Slater and Jack Grainger plus another from Roy Silman gave Rotherham United a stunning 7-2 Division Two victory over Sheffield United in front of 21,609 at Bramall Lane on 15th December 1956: Jock Quairney, Roy Silman, Lol Morgan, Ken Keyworth, Norman Noble, Danny Williams, Jack Grainger, Roy Stephenson, Peter Johnson, Brian Slater, Keith Bambridge. Long serving full back Roy Silman was making his first appearance of the season in place of Jack Selkirk. It remains Rotherham's biggest win over the Blades and they hammered Bristol City 6-1 a week later.

1957 - BROADBENT'S MILLMOOR MOVE

Much travelled outside left Albert Broadbent joined Rotherham United from Sheffield Wednesday in December 1957. Initially with hometown Dudley, he had moved to Notts County in March 1952 and joined Sheffield Wednesday in July 1955, starring in their 1955-56 Division Two championship success. He made his Rotherham debut in a 2-2 draw at home to Leyton Orient and scored nine times in 20 league games as the Millers avoided relegation that season. Andy Smailes also signed forward Glyn Jones from Sheffield United that month, the England Youth international having been an amateur with hometown Rotherham.

1961 - HIGH SCORING GAMES

This was a season that brought Rotherham United great success for the second year on the trot in the newly formed League Cup. On 12th December they drew I-I at home to Leeds United and went on to win the fourth round replay. Division Two the Millers were scoring plenty of goals and they had netted II in four November games before December got off to a losing start with a 4-3 defeat at Luton Town. But six days later six goals were shared with Huddersfield Town at Millmoor with two goals from Brian Taylor and one from Don Weston in front of an attendance of 10.241. The t that occasion was: Roy Ironside, Peter Perry, Lol. Morgan, Roy Lambert, Peter Madden, Ray Lancaster, Barry Webster, Don Weston, Ken Houghton, Alan Kirkman, Brian Taylor.

1964 - GALLEY'S DREAM DEBUT

John Galley's hat-trick plus goals by Albert
Bennett and Ian Butler gave Rotherham United a
thrilling 5-3 Division Two victory over Jimmy
Hill's Coventry City in front of 20,058 at
Highfield Road on 5th December 1964: Gordon
Morritt, Harold Wilcockson, Colin Clish, Roy
Lambert, Peter Madden, Richard Jackson, Barry
Lyons, Albert Bennett, John Galley, Ken Houghton,
Ian Butler. Centre forward John Galley was
making his debut after joining Rotherham from
Wolverhampton Wanderers earlier that week and
went on to score 46 times in 108 league games
for the Millers before moving to Bristol City in
December 1967.

1979 PORTERFIELD TAKES CHARGE


lan Porterfield succeeded Jimmy McGuigan as Rotherham United's manager in December 1979. He had impressed as a midfielder with Raith Rovers prior to joining Sunderland for £38,000 in December 1967 and scored their winner in the 1973 FA Cup final Also helping to win the Division Two title in 1975-76, he moved to Reading for £20,000 in November 1976 and played for Sheffield Wednesday before starting his managerial career at Millmoor Guiding Rotherham to the Division Three title in 1980-81, he remained in charge until leaving in June 1981 to manage Sheffield United. He later managed Reading and Chelsea.

1986 - GREEN REJOINS ROTHERHAM

Central defender John Green rejoined
Rotherham United from Darlington in December
1986. Locally born, he was an apprentice at
Millmoor and secured a regular first team slot
before turning professional in March 1976. He
was ever present in 1978-79, scoring in that
season's 3-1 League Cup second round win at
home to Arsenal. Overcoming injury problems to
score eight goals in 248 league games for the
Millers prior to joining Scunthorpe United in
September 1983, he moved to Darlington in
October 1985. He featured in Rotherham's 198889 Division Four title triumph and scored a
further three goals in 85 league outings.



Player Profile






Rapidly approaching his 100th league start for Rotherham United is Shaun Barker who is a fine example of the Millers youth policy having come up through those ranks to establish himself as a first team regular.

He started his career with the juniors and gradually worked his way up through the reserves to accomplish his current standing as an automatic choice at league level.


But obviously the poor current run of results has taken a little of the gloss off everything for Shaun who commented: "It has been very difficult recently as we have struggled to record an elusive win and the lads need to pick themselves up as quickly as possible, we all know that. "We have had a bad run. sometimes we have been unfortunate in some of those games while in others we have made mistakes that have cost us so we have to stop that and get back to winning ways." Looking back at his own personal form so far this season, Shaun went on: "I felt I started very well but recently I haven't been playing as

well as I know I can do. The gaffer asked me earlier this week why that was and I admitted I didn't know because if I did know then I could have changed that earlier. "Sometimes this happens so you just have to keep on working hard at the training ground and fingers crossed, cut the mistakes out. "Last Saturday at Walsall I was caught out for the second goal when the ball was hit up in the air and I tried to follow it but the striker sneaked in on the other side. It was a difficult one but I have to take responsibility for it." At least this season Shaun has been happy to have played in a settled position in the centre of the defence because last season he was asked to fill a variety of different roles. He tackled them all with his usual enthusiasm but it meant adopting contrasting styles of play.

"I have played for the first team for three seasons now and every previous season I have played in two or three different positions so this time round I have actually been able to nail down one specific position and that is doing me a world of good."



"When I first managed to get into the first team I couldn't have envisaged what a difficult time the club would be facing because when I first came in it was a successful time.

"But the last couple have been disappointing. We were relegated last season and we have to make sure that doesn't happen again. We have the players with the necessary quality to pick ourselves up.

"It's now a matter of getting that first win for some time to set us off on a roll that would see us climb the table.


"We now face two massive home games on the trot, especially today's, It's huge from our point of view and a win will give us a good starting point to turn the season round." One of the major factors leading to Rotherham's precarious current league position has been the poor home form and that has surprised Shaun.

"At the start of the season the fans knew we had a good side and they could see we could pass the ball around and play well. I honestly thought we had a great chance of being involved in the top section of the league but it hasn't happened.

"When you are desperate for a win you seem to get a bit nervous, it helps much more when things are going for you. Even considering our current position, a couple of wins would see us move up to mid-table.

"Before last Saturday's game Walsall were in the bottom half and their win against us lifted them four or five places while Colchester United are another team who have recently moved well up with a few wins.

"So let's hope the same can be said about us in the next two or three weeks."



The gap isn't that big...yet and with


another home game next Saturday what a great time to give the fans an early Christmas present. And with Bradford City,
