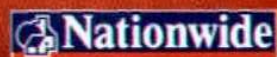

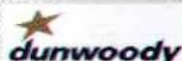

Boardroom Talk



Good afternoon and welcome you all back to the County Ground for this afternoon's encounter with Bournemouth.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to offer our customary welcome to the visiting Directors, Supporters and Players.

It is difficult to start anywhere else but with the events that followed last Saturday's match at Gillingham. As a relative newcomer to Swindon Town I was not aware, other than a few silly remarks on various messageboards, of the depth of feeling some of our fans have for their counterparts in Kent.

Whatever the rivalry, whatever may have been in the past there cannot be any excuse for the disturbances that took place in the streets surrounding Gillingham's stadium. Of course, it takes two to tango, but there is definitely blame to be attached to a number of Swindon fans for their part in the events.

My sense of dread was worsened at the start of the week, when I was informed that a couple of our 'fans' had also hurled some racial abuse at Gillingham's goalkeeper. We have spoken to Wiltshire Police, and we will work together to rid ourselves of these people, purporting to do it in the name of Swindon Town, who have dragged our good name (and our supporters do have a good reputation within the game) through the mud. They will not care too much about that, but we can at least do our best to stop them from attending matches at the County Ground in future. On a more positive note, I would like to thank the vast majority of our 630 fans for the support they gave at Gillingham despite the result. It is not easy to



keep the enthusiasm going on an open terrace with your team losing!

The events of last weekend have forced the club and the police into a rethink over the operation of the Gillingham game here on February 14. This will adversely affect the club because of the extra policing and stewarding costs, which is entirely regrettable, but we believe we have been left with no alternative.

You will notice around the ground today, the banners we've produced to encourage support for our redevelopment plans. We spoke to Brighton about their campaign for Falmer, and have taken note of some the suggestions made to us. The 'Save or Home' petition responses keep on coming, and the Trust and Supporters Clubs are continuing with their excellent support, for which we continue to be very grateful. Please, please, please, if you haven't e-mailed or written to your local Councillor to support our plans, then please do so. Their contact details can be found at the council website at www.swindon.gov.uk.

I read with great disappointment the letter from Councillor Martin to the Adver last week. Given that

we have a very important meeting at Reading next week, where some of our Councillors are meeting their counterparts from Reading and the people from the Madejski Complex, I was astounded to read his comments and views, before the Reading meeting and before any follow up meeting we have planned. We are not looking for the council to fund a brand new stadium for the club, but for the Town of Swindon and the community. We will still be rentpayers, albeit in a stadium that might help us to achieve a sustainable financial situation, instead of the constant battle we currently endure.

This club offers so much to the community, more than just a football club, and it would be a disaster, in my opinion, if the club are forced to look elsewhere. A full review on the Reading meeting will be covered in a future programme.

Thanks again for your continued support, and enjoy the game.

Doe's Saints Connection



Scott Doe, a member of the Swindon Town Under 18 side, was Theo Walcott's first strike partner and has described the Saints youngster's rapid progress as "quality".

Doe, 16, played alongside Walcott for AFC Newbury in 1999-2000, the season the Saints striker began his football career by hammering more than 100 goals.

He said: "Theo used to score five goals a game regularly, he had lots of pace even then and was a great finisher.

"I was a bit bigger than him so I tended to go for the balls in the air and he used to use his pace to run on to any flick ons! He was well known in the league and we played

together for the District side as well."

Reading-based Doe has made steady progress since then himself.

After turning down a move to Southampton in favour of a place at Swindon's Centre of Excellence, he is now a member of Ian Woan's successful Under 18 side here at The County Ground and is breaking into the reserve team.

Walcott joined the Saints academy after a spell at Swindon - and Doe has followed his former team-mates progress ever since.

He added: "I've been watching Theo's goals on TV and it's been quality to see him do so well. I speak to his Dad sometimes and I saw Theo recently. It was good to have the chance to say well done."

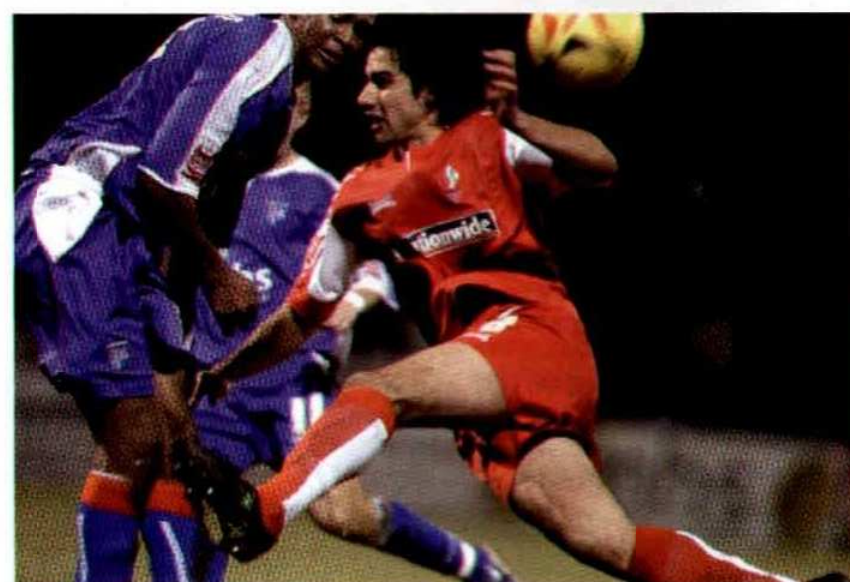
Rhys Evans was called into action for the first time in the 9th minute as he turned away a Danny Spiller effort from 14-yards before Byfield headed over the resulting corner.

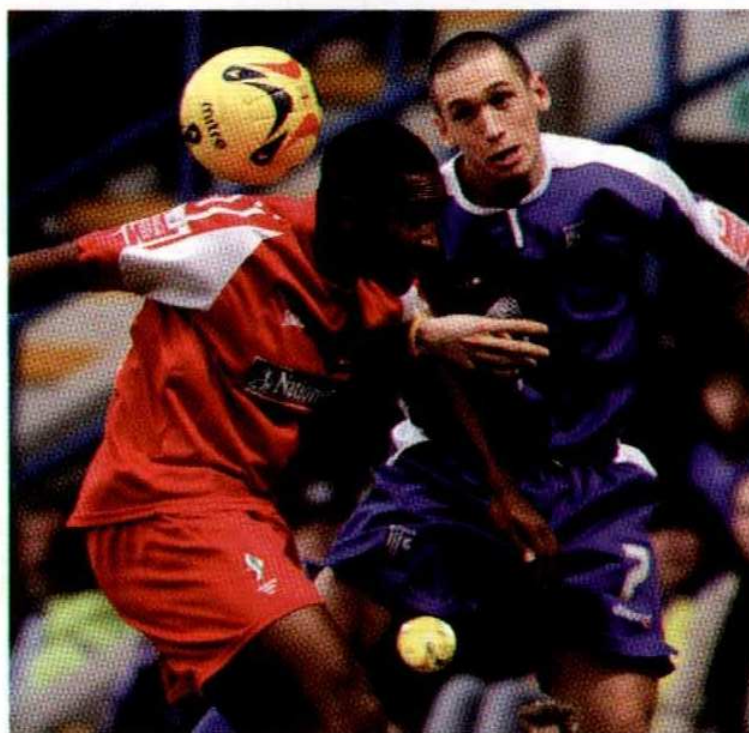
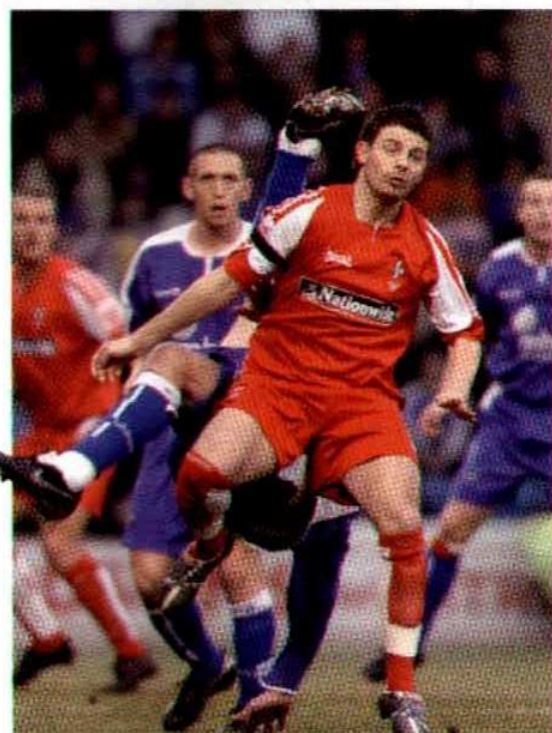
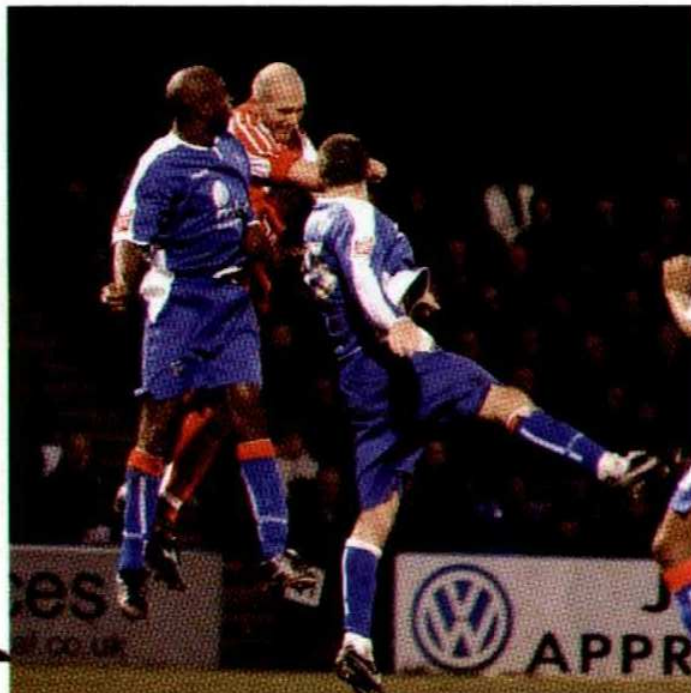
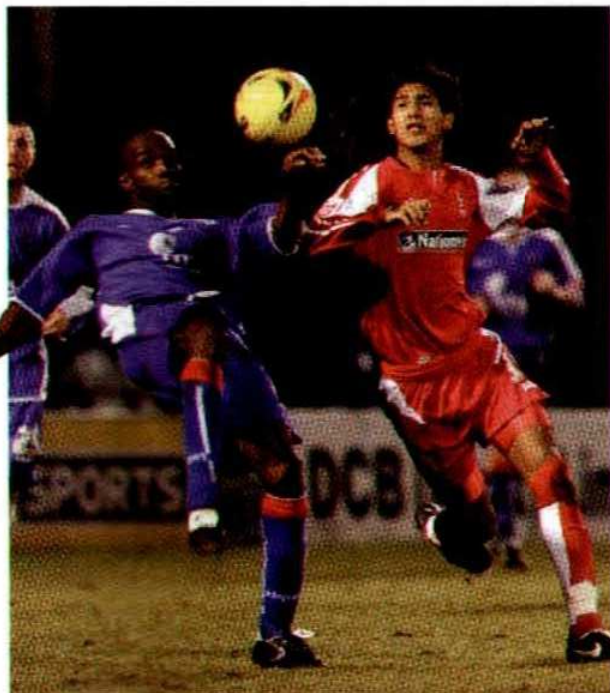
The Gillingham pressure eventually told as they opened the scoring on 20 minutes. Danny Spiller found space on the edge of the box and after turning his man hit a deep cross in which was fumbled by Evans, who had come to collect, and fell to Darren Byfield who was left with a simple tap in.

Town conceded a second goal on 73 minutes. A long ball down the right for Spiller was met by Aaron Brown who tried to shield the ball out of play, only for Spiller to nick the ball past Brown on the byline. Spiller advanced towards goal and squared for Mike Flynn who swept the ball into the net to double The Gills' lead.

With eight minutes remaining Town went three down. A corner into the box was not dealt with and former Millwall striker Neil Harris was on hand to seal an all too comfortable three points for the home side.

Sitting on the fringes of the play-off places, our visitors today will be harbouring thoughts of improving on last season's 8th place finish...

Bournemouth manager Sean O'Driscoll has led the club since August 2000 and in James Hayter he has League One's fourth top scorer on 14. Out of contract next summer, Hayter has already attracted interest from Huddersfield, but spurned the chance to join the Terriers this month.

Midfielder Brian Stock has four goals and he's another whose contract runs out at the end of the season. He could well be a Preston player by now after agreeing terms with North End last week. The

£125,000 fee could rise to £150,000 and represents sound commercial sense for a player who would have gone for nothing in four months time.

Between the two, Andrew Surman has struck six times in all and he will need watching carefully today.

Last weekend, Bournemouth did us a favour by beating Rotherham by two goals to nil and dragging the Millers further into the relegation dogfight. Hayter was on the score sheet that day,

along with Steve Foley.

Having not conceded a goal in the last two matches the Cherries defence looks a tough challenge, but three defeats in their last six travelling matches show that O'Driscoll's side can be beaten.

Earlier in the season we lost 2-1 at the Fitness First stadium, so we have a score to settle as we try to damage our visitor's promotion challenge and drag ourselves away from the other end of the table.

ONE TO WATCH: JAMES HAYTER

A long-serving player who made his debut for the club in 1996 whilst still a member of the youth team.

A regular on the scoresheet, Hayter has proved to be a very important member of the squad and never one to do anything by halves. In 2001, he netted four goals in one game at Bury and then last season, he came on as an 84th minute substitute. He scored his first goal to make it

4-0 in the 86th minute and 140 seconds later, had completed a hat trick in the 6-0 win, creating a new British record for the fastest ever hat trick.

His goalscoring feats have shown no sign of slowing down and he has registered seven goals in his last eight outings.

The Squad

Number one **Gareth Stewart** is a former Blackburn trainee and signed for Bournemouth in 1999. After an injury-ravaged spell he has now taken his chance and is established in the keepers shirt. In the reverse fixture between the two sides earlier in the season, he saved a penalty from Tony Thorpe and has since saved two more spot kicks. The experienced **Neil Moss** lists Southampton and Gillingham amongst his former clubs and has played over 200 games but currently is back up to Stewart.

After being released by Bristol City at the end of last season, **Callum Hart** linked up with Bournemouth during pre-season on trial and has a short term deal with the club. He made his debut in the Carling Cup win at Torquay and has since signed an extension to his deal. Long serving right back **Neil Young** joined Bournemouth in 1994 from Tottenham and made his debut against Brentford at Dean Court that year. He has now made over 350 appearances since then and has been a great servant to Bournemouth. Young is yet to register a goal this season though. Isle of

Wight born defender **Shaun Cooper** was released by Portsmouth in the summer. He joined The Cherries on trial, playing against Portsmouth in pre-season to earn a short-term deal. He has enjoyed a good run in the first team recently after recovering from an ankle injury and has been rewarded with an extension to his contract. **James O'Connor** signed from Aston Villa in the summer and has now made just over 30 appearances for Bournemouth. Former Portsmouth defender **Eddie Howe** is a name that Town fans may know after he spent an ill-fated two-month loan spell with the club during the 2003/04 season.

Left-sided midfielder **Steven Foley** is currently on loan from Aston Villa. He had a spell at the club in pre-season where he scored against Charlton before making his first League start against Swindon and has kept his place in the side since then. He has notched four goals in his last eight games. **Stephen Purches** signed from West Ham in 2000 and has been used in a number of roles, left back, right back and in the centre of midfield where he has put in a number of eye catching appearances and signed off with a superb goal against Lincoln in the play-off final in

2003. Purches has now scored twelve goals in his senior career, with Bournemouth winning all twelve games that he has found the net in. Commanding midfielder **Marcus Browning** joined from Gillingham at the end of the 2001/02 season and quickly snapped up by Bournemouth. He started his career at Bristol Rovers before making a big money move to Huddersfield and has also won international honours for Wales.

After making the move to England with Southampton for £170,000 in 1999, **Dani Rodrigues** has since spent time with Bristol City, Walsall, Yeovil Town and Ionikos (Greece). He rejoined The Cherries in the summer of 2004 and has scored 5 goals in 18 league starts. **Steve Fletcher** joined Bournemouth back in 1992 from Hartlepool. He was rewarded for his loyalty to the club with a testimonial against Portsmouth, a game in which he scored during the 5-4 win in 2003. He holds the club record for appearances with over 500 to his name for The Cherries. Youngster **James Coutts** has come up through the ranks and offers versatility in midfield and up front. The 17-year old is one for the future, but will no doubt be gaining valuable League One experience at the moment.

Sean O'Driscoll

Sean O'Driscoll is now in his 22nd year at AFC Bournemouth after initially joining on loan from Fulham in the 1983/84 season. He went on to become the Cherries all time appearance maker, having his last outing in the 1994/95 season.

Since then he has acted as Physio, Youth Coach, First Team Coach and then Manager in 2000. In his first season, he led the side from the relegation zone to three minutes away from the play-offs. The disruptive 01/02 season, where the side started using Dorchester Town as the home venue due to the new stadium being built ended in disappointment as the side were relegated.

His managerial skills were used to the full though in the 02/03 season as despite losing many key players to injury and having a transfer embargo on him for much of the season, he led the team to promotion via the play-offs with a thrilling 5-2 win over Lincoln City at the Millennium Stadium and with little or no resources plus a long injury list has worked miracles in the last two seasons to have Bournemouth challenging for a play off place.



- The Cherries were originally formed as Boscombe St. Johns Institute Football Club in 1890. After that team disbanded in 1899, a new club, Boscombe FC were formed. On election to the Football League in 1923 the club **changed its name** again to Bournemouth and Boscombe

Interesting Facts...

Athletic Football Club, before finally changing once more in 1971 to AFC Bournemouth as they are known today.

- The club's old ground, **Dean Court** (left), was named after the local benefactor who granted the lease for them to use the land in 1910. Their nickname



'The Cherries' comes from the fact the ground was built next to nearby cherry orchards.

- Bournemouth's **highest ever League finish** came in 1988/89 when they came 12th in the old Second Division, under the management of Harry Redknapp.

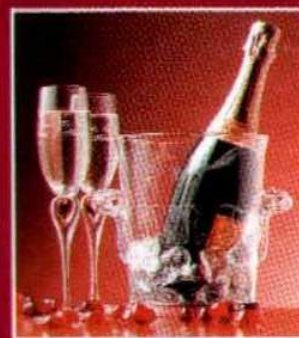

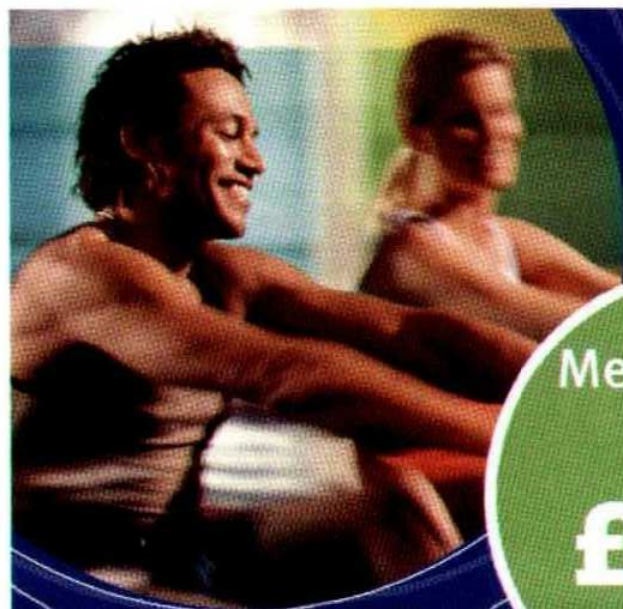

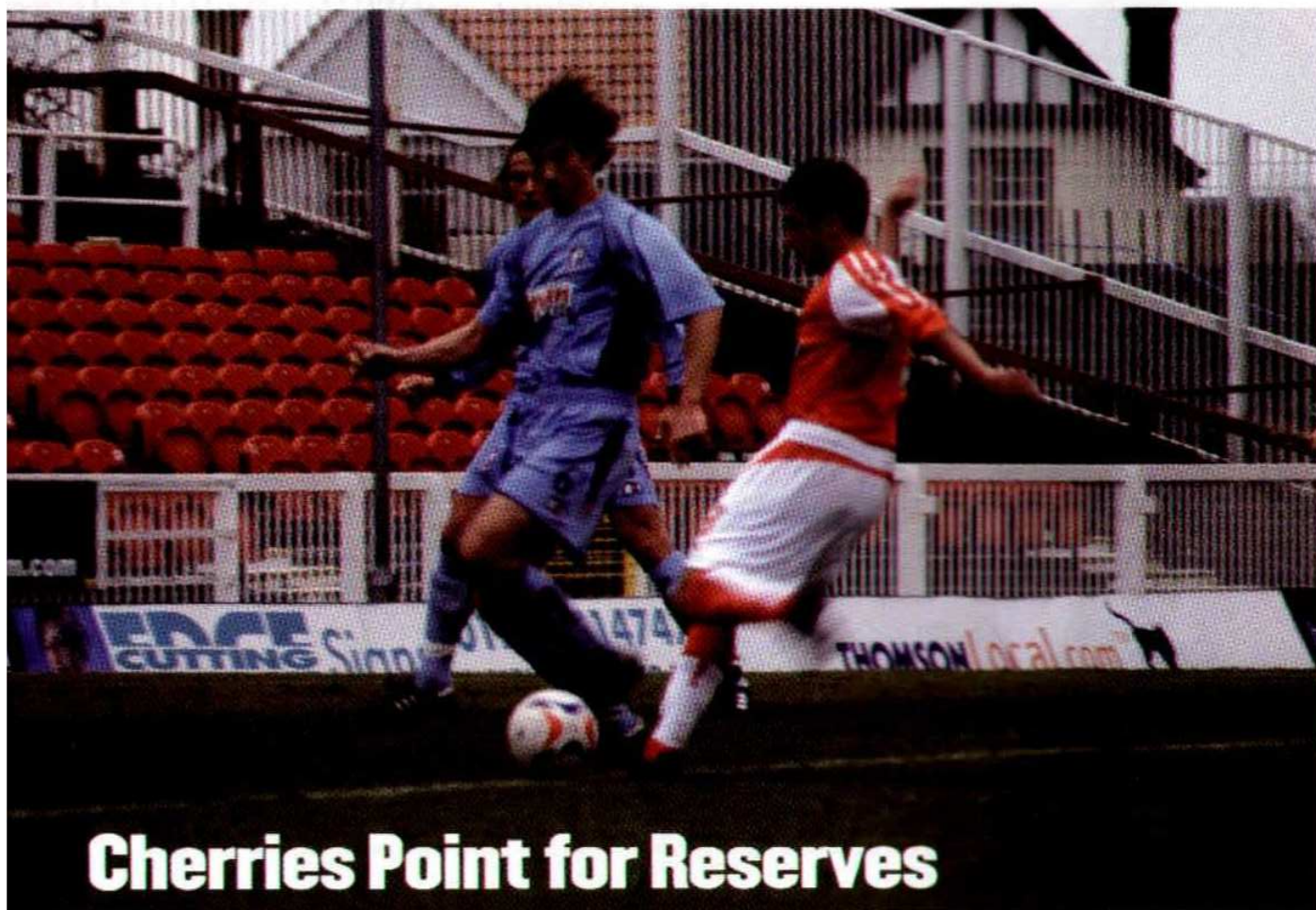

Cherries Point for Reserves

On Tuesday 10th January, Town's reserve clash with AFC Bournemouth ended in a 1-1 draw, with Nicky Nicolau scoring for the home side.

Town started the game with Gareth Whalley returning to action after a knee injury, as he lined up in midfield alongside Pook, Wells and Nicolau.

Visitors Bournemouth made a bright start on 5 minutes with Lee Mussell seeing an effort saved by Matty Bulman in the Town goal before The Cherries came closer four minutes later. Mussell once again was at the centre of the action and he saw his shot hit the post.

Alan Reeves' men got back into the game with a quarter of an hour gone when youth team striker Lukas Jutkiewicz tested Bournemouth keeper James Rae with a low drive.

The deadlock was broken on 18 minutes. Nicky Nicolau collected the ball 30 yards from goal and after making space for himself, hit a low drive from the left hand edge of the area which beat Rae and nestled into the far corner of the net.

It proved to be the only goal of the first half although Town continued to press for a second with Jutkiewicz coming close before the interval.

Holgate double sinks U's

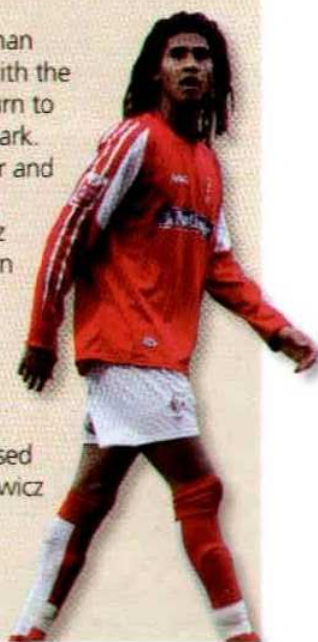

ON GETTING STUCK IN, SCORING
GOALS AND SHAKES' COOKING...

Nurtured by 'Big Sam' Allardyce and inspired by Tony Adams, Charlie Comyn-Platt is looking to establish himself in Town's first team. And he doesn't mind where either. Just don't ask him to cook...

It's been an eventful first season for you what with your recent run of games, the injury and disappointment at not playing earlier in the season. What have you made of it all?

It has been hectic. I mean the Christmas period is always busy anyway because of all the games, but on the whole it was a good few weeks for the team. But yeah, as soon as I got going here I pulled a muscle against Oldham and it was a setback, but these things happen in football.

Roy n' Razor fail to make an impact

Five years ago, Town and today's visitors Bournemouth were rivals in the same division as now, although it was then known as Division Two. At the end of 2001/02 eight places separated the two teams, and for one club that was one too many.

Just one point from the first nine left Town in 23rd place in the early table, and with Bournemouth claiming the same total they were similarly positionally challenged.

Town's season had been thrown into

confusion with the arrival of managerial duo Roy Evans and Neil Ruddock, and it was Ruddock's only League goal of the season on his home debut that gave Town a 1-0 win over Colchester on the first day of September.

By the beginning of December, the Cherries and Town were one place apart in mid-table but then when Bournemouth collected just one win in 19 attempts, the wheels were coming off their season.

The run dropped the south coast club to the relegation zone as March began, while

a 3-0 home win over Port Vale on the same day kept Swindon in the mid-table safety of 13th.

And that's exactly how things finished two months later, a fair reflection of both team's campaigns.

Town's results seemed to come in pairs. After an opening day draw with Peterborough, we lost two, won two and drew two. From the end January, the sequence was won two, lost two, drew two, won two and lost two, the sort of consistent inconsistency that brings mid-table obscurity.

But no doubt Bournemouth would have settled for that. Relegated on 44 points, they finished one place but five points adrift of safety and hit the bottom division along with Bury, Wrexham and Cambridge United.

At the other end of the table, Brighton & Hove Albion were crowned champions, with Reading claiming the other automatic promotion place. Stoke City were the successful play-off contenders.

Sean O'Driscoll oversaw the Cherries disappointing season but by the end of the following year he'd guided the club back to Division Two.

And over Christmas 2001, one of the three King's turned up again as Andy King regained the managerial office keys at the County Ground, re-installed to replace Evans. Ruddock was to hang around a little longer.

Goal scoring was a particular problem for Town. Twenty matches saw us fail to hit the net, including a run of

four games in February. Giuliano Grazioli finished top scorer on just eight, with Andy Gurney and Danny Invincible each on six.

Despite their lower League position, Bournemouth fared slightly

better in front of goal with Warren Feeney finishing on 13. Derek Holmes and Wade Elliott grabbed nine and eight respectively, but it was no surprise that the two games between the two clubs failed to produce a goal for either side.

Our next home fixture is the much re-arranged game with Walsall that was originally scheduled to take place on 7th January.

The Saddlers involvement in the FA Cup meant that date was double booked, and their subsequent draw with Barnsley meant the required replay then clashed with the new date of the 17th. Confused?

The outcome is that Walsall will now visit the County Ground on 31st January when Iffy's men will be hoping to avenge a 1-0 defeat at the Bescot Stadium back in September of last year.

The match could see Paul Smith involved against one of his former clubs for the second time this month. He scored Walsall's goal in a 3-1 defeat at Huddersfield back in October and he's not the only Smith with a special reason to look forward to the game. On 11th January, Grant Smith joined Walsall from Bristol City on loan to the end of the season.

Steve Staunton was released from his contract with the Saddlers on 12th January in order that he can take up the role of manager of the Republic of Ireland.

Defender Julian Bennett recently moved on to Nottingham Forest for an undisclosed fee while striker Matty Fryatt departed to Leicester City at the same time. That will have had consequences at both ends of the pitch.

Fryatt is Walsall's top scorer on 14 with Jorge Leitao on seven, but what an entrance ex-Chippenham striker James Constable is making to League football. He trialled for Town at Cirencester in the summer and has already hit three goals since leaving Wiltshire in December.

Manager Paul Merson was once assisted by our very own Iffy Onuora, and each will want to show their ex-colleague a thing or two.

Walsall have lost eight of their 13 travelling matches so far. Currently 16th in table nine points ahead of Town, a 2-0 home defeat by Colchester last weekend saw the Saddlers fail to extend that gap.
