
We will have to work hard and continue what we have been doing and take that into tonight's game.



Che Wilson scored his first ever professional goal with his first touch after coming on as a second half substitute, while Efe Sodje also capped a fine home debut with the opening strike after just 19 minutes.

A packed Roots Hall was up in arms early on when the Nigerian defender was perfectly placed to head home Kevin Maher's left wing corner. The Blues were attacking with real purpose and even before the opening goal Wayne Gray came close with a header that was blocked by goalkeeper Stuart Nelson.


Nelson 12 minutes from time.

• DEBUT - Sodje scores Southend's first goal



• NO 2 - Gower double's Southend's lead







windon Town's 4-2 home win over **Bournemouth last** Saturday wasn't enough to raise their standing in the League One table, but it did take the County Ground outfit to within four points of the coveted 20th relegation-safe spot.

Since stepping into Andy King's shoes as manager at the end of September, former Town striker Iffy Onuora has slowly but surely brought about a significant improvement in the club's on-field position, turning around what looked to be a difficult case of seven points from their first twelve games into a current situation where 28 points from 28 games provides genuine hope for the remainder of the season.

Speaking after goals from Jamie Cureton, Stefani Miglioranzi, Rory

Fallon and new signing Lee Peacock had secured the victory over the Cherries, Onuora said:

"Psychologically, it was great to get another win, and the table has really bunched up now. It has made people sit up and take notice of us - and four goals at home is something to be pleased about." Especially as his team had only scored once in their four previous home games prior to last Saturday.

Town's line-up against the Cherries featured four other players as well as the aforementioned Peacock recently brought in to aid the club's survival chances. Experienced defender or midfielder Andy Gurney returned to the club on a permanent basis after spending just over a year with Swansea, and his knowhow along with that of former Blue Paul Smith will be vital in the coming months ahead.

Former Bristol City wideman Aaron

Brown should provide penetration down the left flank, and if he doesn't then the loan signing of winger Albert Jarrett from Brighton is there to provide an alternative delivery. And Peacock's arrival in attack is bound to give Rory Fallon a level of support he has been desperately lacking all season. The tall Kiwi striker has so far netted twelve League goals this campaign, nine more than his nearest challenger in the scoring chart, and without his consistent contribution Town might well have been in a very sorry state indeed coming into tonight's game.

As it is though, Town's recent run has given them a chance of survival, the sauad now has the experience and depth it so badly lacked early on, and whilst the gap between trouble and safety is still there at the moment, it's not one that will be impossible to close between now and the first




Rory FALLON



DAM Barrett is a local hero in the eyes of most Southend fans, as since joining his hometown club the defender has seen an immediate rise in the club's success.

The vice-captain recently showed his commitment to the cause when he penned a new two-year contract with Barrett fully aware that the Blues are going places. His local roots have meant it was easy for supporters to acknowledge his qualities, as the player himself admits, "I think everyone knows by now that I went to Belfairs".

Barrett has been a mainstream of a solid Southend rearguard and since being promoted to League One there is little sign of that changing. Having now gone 10 matches unbeaten and conceding just five goals in the process, a real impression is being made again this season.

Expectations were certainly not as high as they are now, but the progress being made is something that can only delight Barrett. "I think at the start of the season the main aim was for the club to stay in this division and look to progress, but I think we have exceeded everyone's expectations so far," he said.

"In a way it shows how far we have come to go up a league and kick on again the way we have done with a pretty small squad similar to what we had last year. It shows the quality we have got here and the togetherness because so far it has been a fantastic season and we seemed to have kept the

momentum going and find ourselves in a great position."

Despite Barrett's connections, he admits the club's ambitions were also a big factor. "I wouldn't have joined Southend if I didn't think the club could go places, but if I'm honest I didn't expect the success we have achieved to have happened quite as quickly as it has done," he said.

"It has been a fantastic 18 months for me here and the club really has moved forward a lot and that is a great credit to the manager and all the players and staff; we have all worked hard.

"Everyone knows my connections to the club and I was absolutely delighted to stay. It was important that the club were going forward because personally I want to play at the highest level I can and Southend are starting to achieve things."

He added: "It made it even easier for me to sign a new contract, it was an easy decision anyway, but to know the club is going in the right direction and are looking to get into the Championship and progress is where I want to be and hopefully I can do that with Southend.

"The team spirit here is superb and although it is a small squad, sometimes that helps as well because everyone is in and around the first team picture and everyone is good friends. You are playing for your friends as well as your team mates and that helps a lot. We have definitely got the quality as well though and it is a balance between the two and its been good for us."

The club have made a great start to life in League One, but Barrett isn't ready to start celebrating just yet. "There are still an awful lot of games to go, if there are three games to go and we are in a similar position then maybe we might get excited, but at the moment we are taking each game as it comes.

"They are all tough games at this level and every week there is a difficult game and you can't afford to look too far ahead. Hopefully we can keep our unbeaten run going for as long as possible and keep ourselves in and amongst the pack."

Barrett is now looking forward to tonight's encounter with Swindon, but despite their opponent's low table position he is aware the match could be more difficult for that very reason.

"We know that Swindon are struggling at the bottom, but they got a great result last Saturday against Bournemouth, so it is going to be difficult as they are fighting for their lives and want to stay up," he said. "Sometimes they are the harder games because people expect you to go out and beat them.

"Teams that have come to Roots Hall this season try and make it difficult for us, so we know what we are up against. Swindon have got goals in their team in Rory Fallon and have just signed Lee Peacock from Sheffield Wednesday, who are both big threats."




improve their computer skills. It was at last Saturday's session that the Playstation was used to enhance computer and literacy skills.





outhend were knocked off the top of League One by their bitter Essex rivals Colchester on Saturday as Phil Parkinson's men recorded a 2-1 win over Port Vale at Layer Road.

The north Essex outfit did not have it easy though, and needed substitute Richard Garcia to provide the inspiration. He met Chris lwelumo's cross within a minute of coming on to give the home side the lead, but former Southend striker Michael Husbands stunned the majority of the 4,319 crowd by equalising with eleven minutes left. However, Garcia headed home from point-blank range with 87 minutes on the clock to ensure that Colchester led the table. However, influential midfielder Kevin Watson will be out for a month after straining his medial ligaments.

With Colchester in FA Cup action against Derby this weekend, Southend have a chance to return to the top against Swindon at Roots Hall, and the Shrimpers did well to steal a point at in-form Tranmere after being under pressure for much of the match. The clash finished 0-0, but Southend went closest when Freddy Eastwood volleyed against the bar after Carl Pettefer's cross was cleared. Calvin Zola had chances for the home side, but they could not penetrate the Blues rearguard.

Swansea could not muscle in on the automatic promotion positions after being held at home by midtable Hartlepool. The Swans were within a whisker of claiming victory courtesy of Leon Britton's strike in the 20th minute. However, striker Eifion Williams levelled the match with a stoppage time equaliser after coming on as a substitute in the first half.

A key match in the promotion race went Brentford's way at Griffin Park as they leapfrogged Huddersfield into 4th. In-form



Dudley Campbell crossed for Lloyd Owusu to put the Bees in front with 25 minutes on the clock, and wrapped up the points with a long range strike in the second half. Bott sides had a player dismissed, midfielder Ricky Newman saw red for the home side for violent conduct, and Town goalkeeper Paul Rachubka went the same way in the second half.

A straightforward win over bottom club MK Dons saw Barnsle, keep the pressure up on Yorkshire rivals Huddersfield, but it took them until the 77th minute to break through at Oakwell. Marc Richards converted Martin Devaney's cross for the opener, and two minutes later Bobby Hassell doubled the Tykes advantage following another Devaney centre.

Chesterfield were held at home by Walsall to record their 10th draw in the last 11 matches. Mads Timm opened the scoring for the visitors just after the half hour, but it didn't take long for Wayne Allison to respond, heading home a free kick three minutes later. Five minutes after the break, Grant Smith netted to put the Saddlers back in the saddle, but with ten minutes remaining loan signing Kevan Hurst rescued a point for Chesterfield with a well-struck shot.

Luke Beckett came off the benchto score two headers to give Oldham victory over Gillingham at Boundary Park. His first came in the 84th minute, nine minutes after coming on, when he met Andy Liddell's cross. Three minutes later, David Eyres' delivery was finished off from close range by the former Specialist Building Services Official Programme Sponsors

Chesterfield striker to secure the points and leave Gillingham in 17th place.

Forest completed the signing of Sammy Clingan this week after drawing at Rotherham on Saturday. Nathan Tyson put the visitors into the lead after the half hour after good work by fellow transfer window signing Grant Holt. However, the million pound front-line could not add to their tally, and free transfer signing Paul Shaw marked his debut for the Millers with a goal with just four minutes remaining to leave Forest without an away win in the League for five months.

Swindon's new arrival Lee Peacock also made his mark as the Robins beat Bournemouth 4-2 at the County Ground. Peacock scored in injury time to round off the win after Bournemouth had come from two down to level in the second half. Swindon took the lead through Jamie Cureton, and doubled it when Stefan Miglioranzi followed up a save by Gareth Stewart. However, Dani Rodrigues volleyed home a James Hayter cross, before Hayter scored from the spot in the 68th minute. With 11 minutes remaining, the Robins regained the lead thanks to Rory Fallon's header, and

Peacock's tap in sealed the points.

Dean Windass was the matchwinner for Bradford at Yeovil but is the subject of transfer speculation linking him to Barnsley. Windass's late free-kick nicked the points for the Bantoms to take them above their opponents and into the top half of the table.

There was derby victory for Doncaster as they beat Scunthorpe 2-1 at Glanford Park courtesy of a late winner by new signing Graeme Lee. Lee's deflected shot gave the Rovers victory after they fought back from being a goal behind through Jim Goodwin just after the break. Michael McIndoe equalised before Lee's late winner. In injury time, Steve Torpey and Jamie Coppinger both saw red after a free-for-all.

Steve Brooker rescued a point for Bristol City away to fellow strugglers Blackpool, John Murphy rounded Adriano Basso to give the home side a 5th minute advantage, but Brooker scored from close range with 26 minutes gone to earn his side a point. Later, Robins boss Gary Johnson claimed his side deserved more, but they remain just one place outside the drop zone.





Born to R

have wondered over the last couple of days whether being a football manager is amongst the most thankless jobs that exist. By that, I am not saying that managing a football team is an intrinsically wretched vocation. Indeed, I imagine it is quite the reverse. It is hard to conceive of anything more fulfilling than spending your working hours outdoors, keeping physically and mentally active and being in charge of a group of likeminded individuals whose morale and future lies in your hands.

Instead, it has struck me that there are perhaps two reasons why being in charge of a football club must sometimes make the incumbents feel completely unappreciated. The first is that, on any given match-day, the stadium is half-filled with people who think that they can manage the team better than you can. This is something that almost never happens in any other profession - for example, few of us would tell a doctor or a car mechanic how to do his or her job. Yet, come 3.00 pm on Saturdays there we all are. wondering why so-and-so has been left on the bench or why a certain formation has been deployed.

I am as guilty of doing this as the next man. Last weekend, I joined the away contingent at Prenton Park and watched us battle our way to a deserved point. Yet, with about 20 minutes to go, I sat there and started muttering to myself that Shaun Goater should be coming on so that we could try to nick a goal.

I have neither a proper

explanation nor justification for my actions. I was a deeply mediocre footballer at school, so certainly cannot lay claim to understand footballers better than the gaffer. I have probably watched somewhere in the region of 5% of the number of football games that Steve Tilson has seen. Yet there I was, fuelled perhaps by the moronic belief that a successful season or two on Championship Manager had made me something of a living-room Shankly, wondering aloud as to why Tilly had prevaricated over making a substitution.

The reason why I was questioning the manager's timing of bringing The Goat on was, in truth, born out of the second reason why . being a club supremo must feel thoroughly futile at times: and that is because, in football as in life, give us an inch... and we will want a mile.

In recent weeks, Tilly and Brush have conjured from the team some of the best football we have seen in a decade. Only a Brentford fan could have failed to be exhilarated by our previous display at Roots Hall; and yet, only a week later there I was in the Wirral, wondering why we were not pushing for all three points. I must admit, however, that it is probably a good job that I am not in charge of the side. Ensuring that the Blues came away with a point and a clean sheet from Tranmere was almost certainly the sort of result that will keep us in the promotion hunt, which is after all what we must be aiming for.

The Blue-boys cannot play as well as they did against Brentford all the time, and we should not necessarily expect them to do so tonight against Swindon Town. Luckily, however, even if we sit in the stands hankering after more champagne football, at least there are two men in the dugout who really do have their priorities right which is to ensure that we keep on picking up points from now until May. Here's hoping for three more

Swindon Town ought
to be a celebrated
occasion in the Blues
centenary year of 2006, for it
was the Robins Reserves who
beat Southend United 1-0 in
the Essex Club's very first
fixture back on 1st September
1906 in Division Two of the
Southern League.

In an inaugral season that saw
United smash all goalscoring
records going, Southend amazingly
failed to score against Swindon,
drawing a goalless stalemate in
Wiltshire later in the year. In a total
of 65 matches, Southend could
boast 222 goals to their name and
the titles of both the South Eastern
League and the Southern League
Second Division. Promotion to the
First Division of the Southern League
didn't arrive until 1908 though, and
that only after a second successive
championship.

Town's first team came up against Southend for the first time in Division One of the Southern League during 1908-09, the games producing rather contrasting results with the Blues coming out 6-2 victors at Roots Hall, but Swindon triumphing 4-2 in the return fixture.

The very first Football League encounters between this evening's

sides came in United first League campaign, 1920-21. In what was ultimately a disappointing season for Southend, Swindon completed a double with 3-1 and 3-0 victories.

Of the total 122 clashes between Southend and Swindon, two of them have come in the FA Cup. United slipped to a 3-0 reverse at the Stadium in 1950-51, but in the 1968-69 Third Round the Blues, of Division Three, chalked up a mightily impressive victory at the County Ground against the Second Division leaders. Goals from Billy Best and Chico Hamilton sealing a 2-0 win.

More recent Cup action saw Swindon beaten 2-0 in their last visit to Roots Hall in last season's LDV Vans Trophy Southern Area semifinal. Goals in each half from Lawrie Dudfield and Nicky Nicolau, who joined Town in the summer, earned the Blues a triumph en route to a second successive Final in that competition.

United, despite a Graeme Jones strike, were well beaten, 6-1, at the County Ground in an LDV first round tie back in October 2002 whilst, in February 2001, an extra time 'golden goal' by Leo Roget booked a place in the Area Final of the LDV courtesy of a 2-1 triumph over the Robins. United ultimately missed out on a trip to the Millennium Stadium following a 4-2 aggregate defeat to Brentford in the Area Final.

Swindon also visited South East Essex in the first round of the League Cup in August 2003 and although Southend twice took the lead through Drewe Broughton and Kevin Maher, Swindon stole the tie, 3-2, with ex-Blue Tommy Mooney grabbing the winning goal.

In the League, goals from Adam Barrett and Wayne Gray sealed a 2-1 victory at Swindon back in September, whilst the last League meeting at Roots Hall brought a 3-1 First Division defeat back in August 1996

CHE: I GOT LOST

AVING got a taste for the high life after scoring his first ever goal, left-back Che Wilson will be boring his grandchildren with the tale for years to come.

The former Bristol Rovers man came off the Southend bench at the weekend to score Southend's fourth goal of the afternoon against fellow promotion rivals Brentford.

It took Wilson nine years to discover his shooting boots but despite the wait he hadn't a celebration planned - in fact he thought the goal might not have stood for one brief moment.

Talking to Blues World after the match he said: "Hopefully it is the first of a few, it has been a long, long wait but I was pleased to get into a position to score but the credit must go to Mark Gower who has put it on a plate for me.

"I got lost once it went in, I was facing the fans cheering and then I thought maybe the ref had disallowed it because nobody came to celebrate with me - they were all probably shell shocked.

"I take my hat off to the lads though because it was a very good performance. Brentford got a bit of a shock really but in the end it was a deserved victory I felt."

Wilson also admitted that a win against the Bees was vital if the Blues are to realise their promotion dreams.

"To win was vital because Brentford would have been level on points with two games in hand otherwise," he said.

"It is up there with our best performances of the season, there have been a few this term; but over 90 minutes it was an excellent display.

"The pressure is on Swansea now and everyone else around us as well.


"At the start of the season we set our sights on just making sure we were in this division next year."

"But having seen everyone around us we have learnt that there is no one to fear and our league position doesn't lie."

his car by smashing into the back of the nearest motor as he attempted to find second gear at the Rayleigh Weir chicane.


At least it did mean he was able to take his role in the passenger seat at the weekend to resume his role as chief celeb spotter.


Sadly the moment was a bit too much for him to take in though as he casually announced there was some bloke in a car nearby who was a footballer or something!

Pettefer also feels that there is no advantage to be gained through top spot at this stage of the season after Colchester jumped above the Blues and moved them into second place in League One.

"It doesn't bother us at all losing top spot, the other teams that have won will probably be playing away next week and we play Swindon at home on Friday night and it's something to build on," he said. "As long as you don't lose away and you win at home you are always going to have a chance.

"If you can get top spot back it does help mentally. If the other teams have seen that we've won again and they've been knocked off top spot it would help, but at the end of the day we have just got to win the game and that's that."

"There have been a few others lately as well, so I am happy with the way things are going and will keep working hard in training and hopefully that can continue."



He added: "I still don't think we




have played our best football this year, so hopefully if we can start hitting our peak for the final straight and enjoy our best run of form we can be in and around the top it in a few months time as well.

HUISH PARK REVIEW...

IN EIGHT days time Southend United pay their fourth visit to Yeovil Town's Huish Park, and seek their first win in competitive football at the Glovers 16-year old home.

United have won at Huish Park once before, 3-0 in a pre-season friendly in August 2001, but the two League visits thus for have resulted in frustrating 4-0 and 3-1 defeats respectively in 2003-04 and 2004-05.

Yeovil moved out of their famous home of 69 years - The Huish - in the summer of 1990 for new surroundings, and most importantly a flat pitch, at Huish Park with the around officially opened on 4th August 1990 with a friendly against Newcastle United. The very first League match at the ground saw Colchester United, freshly relegated from the Football League, defeated 2-0 in the Conference.

Yeovil's old Huish home held happy and famous memories for Glovers fans, none more so than Town's magnificent FA Cup giantkilling exploits, and notably a victory over Sunderland in front of a record 16,318 gate. United have themselves fallen foul of the Huish's graveyard, twice losing 1-0 in the FA Cup, during 1958-59 -in a replay - and 1963-64.

Little has changed at Huish Park since opening day 16 years ago, although the Westland Terrace received a roof in the summer of 2001, leaving just the Copse Road Terrace open to the elements. You'll be hardly surprised to read that this is where away supporters are housed!

The Copse Road End holds 1,700 on its twenty-odd steps, although it



was clearly supposed to be slightly larger than its current size, with girders protruding from the rear of the terrace that are perfectly shaped to fit steps of concrete. Instead these have been fenced off and the middle section occupied by a neat electronic scoreboard.

To the right of this stand is the cantilevered Main Stand. Holding 3,000 in green seats, the initials 'YTFC' depicted in white seats are the main feature of this structure which, to its rear contains the Club Offices, Club Shop and supporters bar, which I believe, is not available to visiting supporters on a matchday.

Continuing around to the right, we come across the Westland Terrace. where we find the more vocal element of the Glovers support. This is a terrace very similar to the Copse Road End, except here the back few steps have been completed and best of all, the home supporters have been gifted an impressive roof, which also has no supporting pillars obstructing the view of the pitch.

Finally, the Bartlett Stand is an identical twin of the Main Stand, although needless to say, it lacks the amenities of its opposite number.

Directions

From A303: Leave the A303 at the Cartgate Roundabout, and take the A3088 towards Yeavil. At the next roundabout take the first exit, and then first exit again at the next Roundabout. This should take you into Lufton Way, with the ground on your right.

For Away Fans

Southend supporters have been allocated 1,700 spaces on the uncovered Copse Road End Terrace with a very small number of seats -around 20 - also allocated at one and of the Main Stand

If previous seasons are anything to go by, supporters, unless they have already purchased a ticket, will have to buy a ticket from the Main Stand ticket office which is also shared with home fans and queues here can be quite lengthy.

It must also be stressed that the Copse Road Terrace only has two available turnstiles and, with each supporter thoroughly searched, massive queues develop leading up to kick-off and as a result it is highly recommended to enter the ground with ample time to spare before the game.





AMAL Campbell-Ryce has been left feeling "really crappy" after being forced into the footballing wilderness. The tricky winger made 16 appearances for Southend United during a three month loan spell from Rotherham which expired at the end of December.

But with the move yet to be made permanent, the former Charlton Athletic trainee has now spent four weeks on the sidelines and is fed up with being in limbo.


"I feel really crappy to be honest," said Campbell-Ryce, 22 speaking for the first team about the transfer situation.

"I don' t know what's going on, other people know more than me and I don't know whether there is a five per cent chance of it happening or a 95 per cent chance.

"It's really annoying though and it's without any doubt the most frustrating moment of my career so far. I'm fit to play but can't and there is nothing I can do about it.

"My fitness will have been affected too and because of that I did think about maybe going back to Rotherham to stay in shape. But if I end up there again I'm not going to be a happy bunny."

Meanwhile, new boy Efe Sodje may



have missed out on selection for the African Cup of Nations but he is still predicting his native Nigeria to emerge victorious.

The Super Eagles have been named in a tough group which also includes Ghana, Senegal and Zimbabwe.

But Sodje is backing Nigeria to lift the trophy for the third time. "I haven't seen any of the games yet but when Nigeria play I will definitely watch," said the centre back who has nine international caps to his name.

"There are a lot of good teams taking part but I'm backing Nigeria to

Sodje was speaking after again impressing during his side's 0-0 draw at Tranmere Rovers. But his unexpected arrival from Yeovil Town forced Andy Edwards down the pecking order and eventually led to the centre back deciding to join Grays Athletic last week.

"It was a very hard decision to have to make and I'm gutted to have left," said Edwards.

"I was fourth choice though and I didn't think there was much chance of getting a game. Now I'm at Grays who are also doing well and I hope

both they and Southend can go up this season so I will have played a part in two promotions."

Southend striker Freddy Eastwood, who joined Blues from Grays, echoes those sentiments and admits he is willing to swap his own personal glory for promotion at the end of the season.


The Basildon based forward, 22, is again leading the Southend scoring charts with 12 goals to his name.

What are your views on Southend?



Who have been your main performers?


Has to be Rory Fallon, although we look likely to lose him for nothing at the end of the season? In keeping him though, his goals may be the best chance we have of playing League One football next season.







WEBB - Four times Blues boss David Webb has bought the Glovers

THERE will be extra interest for Southend's visit to Yeovil next weekend now that former manager David Webb has recently been installed as chief executive.

Webb is certainly no stranger to Southend having previously been manager on four separate occasions. He also held the same position at Yeovil, but now has a new role at the club after becoming their majority shareholder.

Yeovil have certainly been hit by departures to some key players recently, most notably Efe Sodje, with the Nigerian defender joining the Blues and in line to face his former club.

Lee Johnson joined Scottish outfit Hearts for £50,000, while Darren Way signed for one of Southend's main challengers at the top of League One in Swansea for a £150,000 fee.

Transfer activity the other way has hardly caught the headlines with David Webb's son Daniel, who beforehand was plying his trade at non-league level, joining and at one time played for the Blues himself. But Chris Cohen did extend his loan spell from West Ham until the end of the season and is seen as a direct replacement for Johnson.

In fact, at the start of the season Yeovil were forced into a change of manager when Gary Johnson departed for Bristol City and his assistant Steve Thompson was promoted to the role.

Rumours continue to circulate about their 11-goal star Phil Jevons as well and if he is still at Yeovil he will be the main threat Southend have to look out for. In fact last season he scored the only goal at Roots Hall between the two sides that knocked Southend off the top of League Two and sent them into the play-offs while Yeovil went on to win the title.

The club are currently halfway in 13th position, but lost for the first time in five matches last weekend at home to Bradford. Their prior defeat beforehand saw them turned over 4-1 at Tranmere, the same side

Southend managed to earn a point from last weekend.

That statistic may mean little for this clash, as recent history certainly doesn't favour the Blues in their matches against the Glovers, although if this season is any omen to go by then perhaps that may be all about to change.

Back in September last year Southend came from behind to beat Yeovil 4-1 and will now hope it is a sign of the roles being reversed.

Despite their recent defeat to Bradford, Thompson felt his team should have won, but they are now without a match until they play Southend next Saturday. "We totally dominated the game apart from the last 10 minutes and had the most shots and chances, but that type of thing happens in football.

"We must have had 15 good chances to their one or two, but overall I am reasonably pleased with the performance. Perhaps we are missing that little bit of quality and movement in the penalty area and we will try and put that right in training, where we will have a full week now because we are without a match until we next play Southend:"

IT IS always important to have a decent supply line in football if you are going to score goals and if Mark Gower's form is anything to go by, then you'd imagine it won't be a problem for Southend.

Although naturally rightfooted, Gower has made the left wing role his own and having returned to full fitness and recovered his form there is no doubt he has been a prominent member of the team.

He scored his third goal of the season in the Blues last home match against Brentford and was arguably the best player on the park. It is these type of performances that saw Gower named 'player of the year' by the fans in his first season at the club, now of course, he is delivering at a level higher in League One.

Gower was happy with last week's showing at Tranmere, but admitted the club's recent form has been superb: "It was another solid showing from the back boys; we are looking at keeping clean sheets and if you can do that you always get a chance of winning games. Obviously it was

a point, but a point's a good result away from home at Tranmere.

"I don't think we can ask for anymore to be honest; we are looking really good again after the blip we had and are keeping clean sheets, scoring goals and

picking up points both home and away, so things couldn't be much better for us at the moment.

"We are only a point away from the magic 52 points we set ourselves at the start of the season. Obviously we are going to stay up, but if we do take each game as it comes and not look too far and get ahead of ourselves, the play-offs would be a massive achievement for the club."

He added: "At the moment though we're in one of the positions for automatic promotion and there is no cause to say we can't do that because we've done that for 29 games and there are only 17 left, so there is no reason why we can't stay where we are.

"For me personally playing on the left and being right footed gives me another option to cut inside on my strongest foot. Things are going well for me, but the main thing is the team and the team's doing well, so hopefully it will carry on."

With Southend in second place in League One and only behind leaders Colchester by a point, Gower admits both Essex outfits have been surprise hits this season. "We weren't tipped to be

where we are and I don't think Colchester were either," he said. "But we are both doing well and both on a roll and if we can stay in and around where we are at the minute it will set it us up nicely for the derby at their place in March."

Gower believes the togetherness in the camp has played a big part in Southend's success, alongside the obvious quality in the team. "I think the team spirit goes a long way, but we have got a good set of players, there is no doubt about that, because if we didn't we couldn't have achieved what we have," he said. "There are a group of players here with a team spirit that nobody is too big and everyone aets on.

"We are sort of a family where everyone has a laugh and a joke and when we need to get down and do the business everyone is up for it and I think that is one of the main reasons why we have done so well."

Gower is now hoping the club can continue where they left off from their last home match. "It was pleasing to put in such a good performance against Brentford because whenever we have big games before and we have capacity crowds at Roots Hall we haven't been able to deliver the goods," he said.


"But obviously we excelled ourselves against Brentford in what was a top of the table clash and won 4-1, so I think we have overcome that hurdle now and hopefully with another large crowd tonight against Swindon we can do the same again."

LEAGUE RECORD AGAINST SWINDON

Goals by Adam Barrett and Wayne Gray gave Southend United a 2-1 League One victory at Swindon Town on 10th September 2005. Kevin Watson, Steve Cowe and Steve Finney scored to give Swindon a 3-1 win over Southend on their last League visit to Roots Hall on 31st August 1996. Southend's last League victory at home to the Robins was 2-0 on 3rd December 1994 with goals from Roger Willis and Andy Edwards.

IN SAFE KEEPING

Former Swindon Town goalkeeper Bart Griemink featured in Southend United's 2004-05 promotion campaign. Initially moving to the County Ground on loan from Peterborough United in February 2000, he rejoined Swindon on a permanent basis five months later. He helped the Robins qualify for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04 and made 124 League appearances for today's opponents

prior to joining Southend in July 2004, playing 19 League games last season. Southend striker Wayne Gray scored twice in 12 League games whilst on loan to Swindon during the 1999-2000 campaign.

LEADING MARKSMAN

Ex-Southend United striker Tommy Mooney was leading marksman as Swindon Town qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Moving to Roots Hall from Scarborough for £100,000 in July 1993, he netted five goals in 14 First Division games for Southend prior to joining Watford initially on loan in March 1994. He joined Swindon from Birmingham City in July 2003 and scored 19 times in 45 League outings while at the County Ground before moving to Oxford United in July 2004. Former Southend striker Luke Nightingale had a loan spell at Swindon during the 2002-03 campaign.

EVER-PRESENT

Former Swindon Town left-back

Football Historian Leigh Edwards takes a look at the connections over the years between today's two sides Swindon Town and Southend United in his regular programme feature

Andy Ford was ever-present for Southend United in 1976-77. Moving to Roots Hall from AFC Bournemouth in May 1973, he helped Southend to reach the FA Cup fifth round in 1975-76 and netted three goals in 138 League games before following Dave Cunningham to Swindon in August 1977. He was ever-present in 1978-79 and featured in their 1979-80 League Cup run, making 98 League appearances for today's opponents prior to joining Gillingham for £30,000 in July 1980. Fellow left-back Tony Taylor also played for both clubs during that period.

TITLE TRIUMPH

One-time Southend United midfielder Derek Hall featured in Swindon Town's 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph. Moving to the County Ground from Torquay United in July 1985, he made ten League appearances for Swindon before reuniting with David Webb at Southend in August 1986. He made a significant contribution to the Blues' 1986-87 promotion success and scored 15 goals in 125 League outings prior to joining Halifax Town in July 1989. Former Southend fullback Chris Ramsey also featured in Swindon's 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph.

TOP SCORER

Former Swindon Town striker Chris Guthrie twice topped Southend United's goalscoring charts. Moving

to Roots Hall from Newcastle United for £12,000 in November 1972, the England Schoolboy international was Southend's 'Player of the Year' in 1973-74 and netted 35 goals in 108 Third Division games prior to joining Sheffield United for £100,000 plus Terry Nicholl in May 1975. He joined Swindon for £25,000 in July 1977 and scored 12 times in 45 League outings while at the County Ground before moving to Fulham for £65,000 in September 1978.

PROMOTION WINNER

Former Swindon Town midfielder John Cornwell featured in Southend United's 1990-91 promotion success. Moving to the County Ground from Newcastle United for £50,000 in December 1988, he helped Swindon qualify for the Second Division play-offs in two consecutive seasons and made 25 League appearances for today's visitors prior to joining Southend for £50,000 in August 1990. He netted five goals in 101 League outings while at Roots Hall. Ex-Swindon striker Garry Nelson featured in Southend's 1980-81 Fourth Division title triumph.

TWO SPELLS

Ex-Swindon Town full-back Paul Roberts had two spells at Southend United. Moving to the County Ground from Brentford in September 1985, he featured in Swindon's 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph and made 27 League appearances prior to joining Southend in July 1986. He helped the Blues to win promotion in 1986-87 and moved to Aldershot in August 1987. Returning to Southend from Exeter City in January 1989, he was a promotion winner again in 1989-90 and played 81 League games overall before joining Fisher Athletic in July 1990.

PROMOTION PLAY-OFFS

Former Southend United midfielder Martin Ling starred in Swindon

Town's 1992-93 First Division playoff final triumph. Initially moving to the County Ground from Exeter City in July 1986, he joined Southend three months later and featured prominently in the 1986-87 and 1989-90 promotion successes. He netted 30 goals in 138 League outings for the Blues before rejoining Swindon in March 1991. Gaining Premiership experience with today's opponents during the 1993-94 campaign, he scored ten times in 152 League games overall prior to Leyton Orient in July 1996.

MUCH-TRAVELLED


Much-travelled central defender Chris Turner played for both Swindon Town and Southend United during his career. Moving to the County Ground from New England Teamen in September 1980, he made three League appearances for Swindon prior to rejoining Cambridge United the following month. "Psychologically it was great to get another win and the table has really bunched up now. It has made people sit up and take notice of us four goals at home is something to be pleased about.


"Southend United will be another test next Friday and I am sure we can go there in good heart. We will respect them, but as always, fear no-one."

LUES' games over the years on today's date fall into a neat pattern. Of the 11 matches we have played the first six were played away and we did not win a single game while the most recent five were all played at Roots Hall and we remained unbeaten.

Our first action was back in 1923 when, in a division three south encounter, we travelled to Watford and thanks to a Harry Dobson goal drew 1-1, 11 years later and a visit to Coventry City saw United defeated 2-0 in front of

13,861 fans.

Amazingly it was 28 years before Southend tasted action again on the 27th of January when a division three game up at Hull ended in a 0-O stalemate. Another 0-0 was "enjoyed" in 1968 against Chester City as the Blues aimed, unsuccessfully, to gain promotion from division four for the first time.

After those two 0-0 draws the 1970 game against Crewe was more exciting but not for Southend fans as we were on the wrong end of a 5-3 defeat. The game, that came just four days after a 5-2 home defeat by Notts County, saw the Blues 3-1 down at half time and despite goals from Phil Chisnall (2) and Eddie Clayton end up well

beaten.

1973 and another defeat as we travelled to Notts County for a division three game and lost 2-0. Five years later and at last the rot was ended and in great style. During our successful promotion campaign the game saw United begin a run of six consecutive wins, 3-0 up at half time Southend eventually

triumphed 5-1 thanks to goals from Colin Morris (2), Gerry Fell, Peter Abbott and Micky Laverick, 4,865 fans enjoyed the game played in the season United were promoted behind champions Watford.

Another crushing win on the 27th of January was in 1990 when, during another successful promotion campaign, a hat trick from David Crown and two from Martin Ling helped the Blues see off luckless Aldershot. The result meant Southend had completed the double over the Shots with both games being won 5-0!

In 1993 during our spell in what is now known as the Championship Birmingham City visited Roots Hall and a Stan Collymore inspired Southend won 4-0 as they

attempted to avoid relegation. The goals came from Andy Sussex, Collymore, Steve Tilson and Pat Scully in front of only 4,065 fans on a chilly Wednesday night. I wonder what became of the goal scorers?

Southend's games on today's date ended with another two 0-0 stalemates. One in 2001 when Shrewsbury visited Roots Hall for a division three game and finally in 2004 when on a bitterly cold Tuesday night York made the long trip south and 2,943 fans braved the elements but did not see much to warm them up.

Players who perform well in games and sessions and show a positive attitude on and off the pitch will get this opportunity.





1962/63

Swindon Town won promotion to the Second Division for the first time in 1962/63. Bert Head's young side won just one of their first six games, then top scorer Ernie Hunt netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 victory over Brighton. Cliff Jackson scored three times in a 4-3 win at Millwall and Jack Smith did likewise in a 5-0 victory over QPR as Swindon overcame the 'Big Freeze' to maintain their promotion challenge. They hammered Colchester 6-1 and clinched promotion with a 1-0 win at home to Shrewsbury. Keith Morgan and John Trollope were ever-present, while other stars included Mike Summerbee and Bobby Woodruff.

1968/69

Don Rogers starred as Swindon
Town achieved an epic League Cup
and promotion 'double' in 1968/69.
Early pace-setters in the Third
Division, they lost 1-0 at home to
Watford in the title 'decider' watched
by 28,898 and finished runners-up
on goal average. Swindon defeated
Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3,
Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby
1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League
Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1

1969/70

Swindon Town challenged strongly for promotion to the top-flight in 1969/70. Fred Ford replaced Danny Williams as manager and Arthur Horsfield was signed from Newcastle, starring as Swindon were among the early leaders. Peter Noble grabbed a hat-trick as they beat Charlton 5-0 and maintained their promotion challenge with a 14 match unbeaten run. Swindon finished fifth in the Second Division, their highest position at the time. They also defeated Blackburn 4-0, Chester 4-2 and Scunthorpe 3-1 in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 to Leeds United in the sixth round, then beat Napoli 3-0 in the Anglo-Italian Cup final.

1979/80

Bobby Smith guided Swindon Town to the League Cup semi-finals in 1979/80. Swindon had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Alan Mayes scored twice in an early 4-0 win over Brentford. They defeated Portsmouth 3-1, Chester 2-1, Stoke City 2-1, Wimbledon 2-1 and Arsenal 4-3 in

the League Cup before losing 4-3 to Wolves in the semi-finals. Andy Rowland and Alan Mayes formed an exciting partnership as Swindon gained four successive wins, then trounced Bury 8-0. They took Spurs to an FA Cup fourth round replay but finished mid-table despite signing David Peach and Glenn Cockerill.

1985/86

Swindon Town stormed to the Fourth Division title with a record 102 points in 1985/86. Lou Macari's side made a poor start in the League but defeated Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday en route to the Milk Cup fourth round. Kenny Allen arrived from Torquay and Dave Bamber from Portsmouth as Swindon soared to the top of the table with 14 wins in 16 matches. They set a club record of 13 consecutive home victories with a 3-1 win over Burnley and clinched the title with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield. Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon scored 35 goals between them, while skipper Colin Calderwood was ever-present.

1986/87

Lou Macari plotted Swindon Town's 1986/87 Third Division play-off final triumph. Colin Gordon was sold to Wimbledon, while newcomers included Jimmy Gilligan, Mark Jones, Fraser Digby and Bristol Rovers pair Tim Parkin and Steve White. Six victories in eight games catapulted Swindon into the promotion race, then

King arrived from Torquay. They starred as Swindon gained seven straight wins and qualified for the play-offs in third position after remaining undefeated in their last 11 matches, Swindon beat Gillingham 2-0 in the play-off final replay after a 2-2 aggregate draw.

1989/90

Swindon Town won the 1989/90 Second Division play-off final but were denied top-flight status after an illegal payments scandal. Swindon had qualified for the playoffs the previous season and Ossie Ardiles replaced Lou Macari as manager. They soared into the promotion frame with seven wins in nine games including a 6-0 victory over Stoke and signed David Kerslake from QPR in November. Alan McLoughlin, Duncan Shearer and Steve White starred as Swindon maintained their challenge with just one defeat in 13 matches and finished in fourth position. They defeated Sunderland 1-0 in the play-off final at Wembley.

1992/93

Player-manager Glenn Hoddle was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992/93 First Division play-off final success. Swindon were early pacesetters and new signing Craig Maskell grabbed a hat-trick in a 4-1 win over Cambridge United. They went second after a 5-1 demolition of Notts County, then overcame a lean spell with Ross MacLaren's return inspiring a run of seven victories in nine games. Dave Mitchell netted three times in a 6-4 win at Birmingham and Swindon qualified for the play-offs in fifth position. They defeated Tranmere 5-4 on aggregate, then gained a thrilling 4-3 win over Leicester in the Wembley final.

Assistant-boss John Gorman replaced Glenn Hoddle in charge as Swindon Town prepared for the 1993/94 Premiership campaign. New signings included Jan-Aage Fjortoft, Andy Mutch, Luc Nijholt and Adrian Whitbread, with Swindon starting with a 3-1 defeat at Sheffield United. They drew 0-0 at Norwich but despite signing Terry Fenwick and Keith Scott, were already facing relegation by the time they managed their first win 1-0 at home to QPR in November. Swindon completed the double over QPR and also beat Southampton, Spurs and Coventry as well as drawing against Arsenal, Liverpool and Manchester United.

1995/96

Swindon Town stormed to the Second Division title under playerboss Steve McMahon in 1995/96.

They had plummeted from the Premiership to Second Division and newcomers included Wayne Allison, Steve Finney and Mark Seagraves. Swindon were early leaders, winning seven of their first nine games, and Kevin Horlock netted a hattrick in a 4-1 victory at Bristol Rovers. They remained in pole position and took Southampton to an FA Cup fifth round replay. Ian Culverhouse and Mark Robinson were ever-present, while leading scorer Wayne Allison and Shaun Taylor also starred as they won the title by nine points.



THE PROGRAMME

AS HAS often been the case in LDV Vans Trophy or Associate Members Cup matches, United produced a programme that was reduced in size and content from their normal publication.

In this instance, United's regular matchday programme - which had replaced an experimental ten A4 editions issued at the start of the campaign - of 48 pages at £2 was reduced to 16 pages at £1.50.

These reductions didn't detract however from what was still a neatly produced publication, with enough reading material for supporters to get their teeth sunk into.

The regular features were still there, such as manager David Webb's notes, full fixtures and team line-ups as well as full profiles on the visiting side, albeit in a truncated version.

One-off features in this edition included an interview with young defender David McSweeney and a similar article with another defender, this time veteran Rob Newman, who also appears on the programme cover. Both these articles were penned by current Evening Echo correspondent Chris Phillips.

Another Phillips-penned effort reviewed United's impressive 2000-01 LDV run which had already seen two sides from a higher division knocked out, with Swindon soon to make a trial

With Cheltenham Town, Cambridge United and Bristol Rovers already brushed aside at Roots Hall, David Webb's men fancied their chances of a first Cup Final when Martin Carruthers neatly headed United into a first half lead, but Michael Reddy brushed home a late leveller for the visitors from Wiltshire.

In an exhausting game, it was Blues defender Leo Roget who created history by heading home on 110 minutes Southend's only ever 'golden goal' meaning that United had immediately won the tie.

The following Southend side lined-up against Swindon on this mid-February evening: Darryl Flahavan, David McSweeney, Damon Searle, Roget, Phil Whelan, David Lee, Leon Johnson, Kevin Maher, Daniel Webb, Carruthers and Ben Abbey whilst Chris Porter, Rob Newman, Michael Black, Russell Williamson and Tesfaye Bramble warmed the bench.

Unfortunately, United lost out 4-2 on aggregate to Brentford in the Area Final, unluckily losing 2-1 both home and away.
