Boardroom Talk



Good evening to you all and a very warm welcome to the County Ground for a much rearranged meeting with Walsall. On behalf of the Board of Directors I would like to offer our customary welcome to the visiting Directors, Players and officials.

A week is a very long time in Football. The contrasting results against Bournemouth and Southend clearly show that we should not go overboard when we win a game and neither should we plunge the depths of despair when we lose. Longer term I believe that Iffy and the players have got what it takes, mentally and physically, to get us out of our current predicament. It is difficult but we need to try to take a longer term view, and football is notorious for its short-termism, both in the boardroom and amongst fans. Once again the fixture computer conspired to make it as difficult as possible for our fans to get to an away game, Friday night in Southend is a far from straightforward journey, but your support was again tremendous in spite of a disappointing result.

The decision to sell Rory Fallon was not an easy one. Selling your top goalscorer when you are in a relegation battle is not, unsurprisingly, something we wanted to do. But when a player decides that his future lies elsewhere, and that his career would benefit from the move, particularly when he is taking guidance advice from his father, it is difficult to do anything other than try to obtain the best deal for the club. It does not help either party to keep someone who would prefer to be somewhere else. Barnsley benefited from a sell on clause,



and we have also agreed one with Swansea. We would like to thank Rory for his efforts, and wish him well in the future. Iffy has indicated that he would like to bring in a replacement for Rory, and we will do our best to support him in his efforts. Time is against us, as the transfer window closes at midnight today, but I hope that we have been able to add to the squad by the time you read these notes.

As many of you are aware, as part of our County Ground redevelopment campaign, we took several councillors and council officials along to the Madejski Stadium in Reading on Friday, to see for themselves how a local council and Football Club can work together for the benefit of a community. Our plans are based on the Madejski complex of stadium and hotel, and we have used the services of both the architects and financial advisors on the Madejski scheme to produce our proposals. In our next programme we will bring you many facts and comparisons between Reading, the town and Football Club ten years ago, and that

of today. Two figures particularly stuck out for me. Firstly Reading FC's turnover in their last year at Elm Park was just £2M, and the club was going out of business, it is now £12M, and if they reach the Premiership that will rise to approx. £37M. Ten years ago, pre-Madejski, Reading FC employed a solitary community officer, they now employ 15 full-time community officers, and London Irish also operate a very proactive community scheme. The two councillors from Reading Council also told us of the many benefits the council and town of Reading have enjoyed since the development went ahead, so it was clearly a 'win-win' situation for all involved. Now I hope we can get down to proper discussions and negotiations with our local council.

Enjoy the game, and please keep up your fantastic support for the players.

As expected Manager Iffy Onuora made one change during the interval with Jamie Cureton came on to replace Aaron Brown, with Town reverting to a 4-4-2 formation.

Jamie Cureton pounced on a defensive lapse on 57 minutes but having taken the ball on into the box could only drag his shot wide. Freddy Eastwood then hit a shot wide before Mark Bentley saw a low drive well-held by Evans but the home side finished the game 2-0 victors.

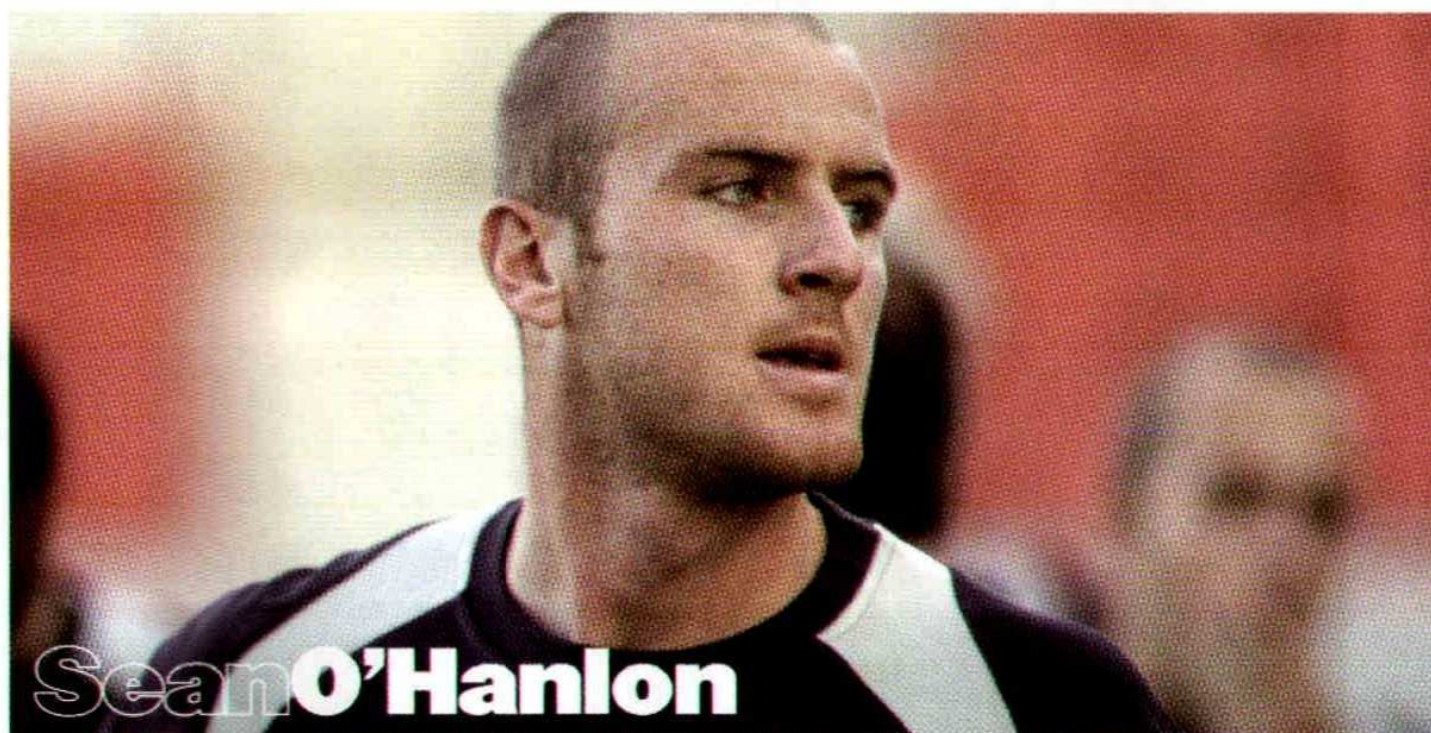

Before last weekend's fixtures, the Saddlers sat in 16th place in the table with 35 points from 28 games.

A week ago Walsall travelled to high-flying Swansea whom they met in the Southern semi-final of the LDV Vans Trophy. After twice coming from behind, penalties saw Merson's team lose out in fight for a place in the final.

Ex-Chippenham striker

James Constable had levelled the scores at 2-2 with five minutes to go, before a goalless period of extra time ensued. He now has four strikes to his name already after little over a month in the professional game.

He guested for Town in a pre-season match with Cirencester and no doubt would love to add to his tally against us.

Tonight could see a meeting

of the Smith's, with Grant on loan in the West Midlands from Bristol City and Paul now a permanent fixture here in Wiltshire. If involved, both would line up against ex-team mates.

And our own Iffy Onuora left the coaching staff at the Bescot Stadium to join us at the County Ground, so, like the fixtures with another former club Gillingham, he'll have a particular reason for us to do well today.

ONE TO WATCH: JAMES CONSTABLE

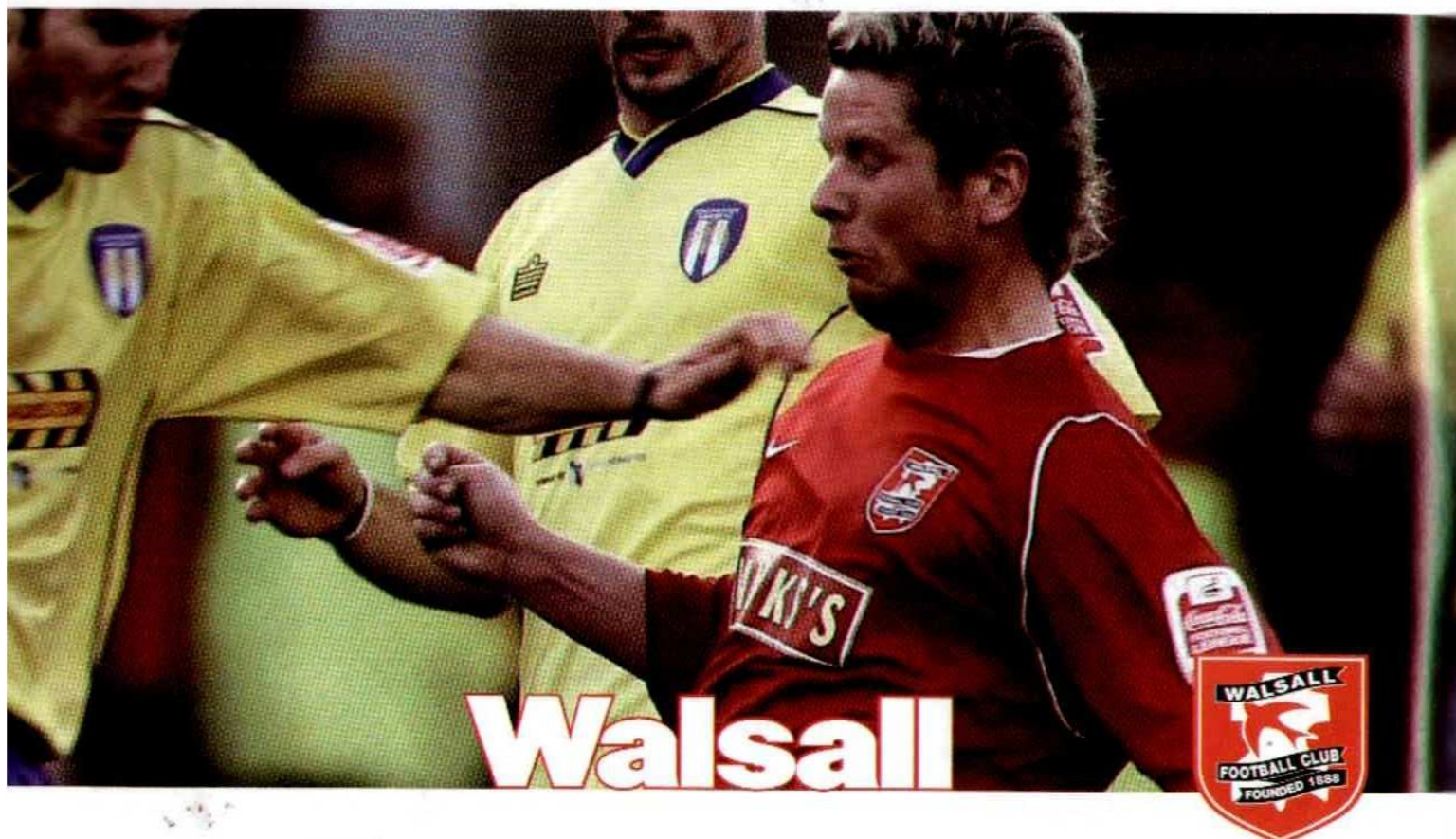
Constable signed for Walsall in November 2005 from Chippenham Town, where he bagged eight League goals in 13 League games for the Southern League Premier Division side.

The 21-year old, who also played for Cirencester Town, made his Saddlers debut in the LDV Vans Trophy against AFC Bournemouth and scored his first goal in professional football against Wycombe Wanderers in

the next round of the same competition.

However, it was on New Years Eve when the 'professional dream' turned into reality for 'Beano', as he scored both goals as Walsall beat Blackpool 2-0 in League One. He has now signed a permanent deal until the end of the 2006/07 campaign.

The Squad

Andy Oakes is now number one at Walsall and he has six previous clubs to his name, with his most successful spell coming at Derby County, who he joined for £460,000 from Hull City. Following the departure of Joe Murphy back to Sunderland, **Rene Gilmartin** has found himself elevated to the Saddlers bench and provides back-up to Oakes.

Craig Pead initially arrived at Bescot Stadium on loan from Coventry City on 23rd March 2005 until the end of

the 2004/2005 season. After an impressive eight-game spell, which saw him settle into his right-back role, he was signed on a permanent basis in May 2005. Former Hartlepool United Captain **Chris Westwood** signed in the summer of 2005. The 28 year-old, who hails from Dudley, developed into a solid and reliable centre-half during a six-year stay in the north-east where he was a well-respected figure both on and off-the-field during the course of almost 300 appearances in all competitions. Up-and-coming Everton defender, **Anthony Gerrard** made his loan switch permanent at



the end of last season. The 19-year-old former Republic of Ireland Under-18 International is the cousin of Liverpool's Steve Gerrard. Former Everton defender **Dan Fox** made the switch from Merseyside in June 2005 and has since made over 25 appearances at The Bescot Stadium.

Influential midfielder **Mark Kinsella** joined Walsall on 27th July 2004 from Premiership West Brom. Dublin-born Kinsella, who has 48 International caps with the Republic of Ireland to his name, arrived in England in 1989 with Colchester United. He was picked up by Charlton Athletic for a bargain £150,000 in 1996 and went on to play in 226 games for The Addicks, establishing himself as a key player in their rise to prominence. He then had a £750,000 move to Aston Villa before making the switch to The Hawthorns. A player well known to Swindon fans, **Grant Smith** joined Walsall on loan from Bristol City midway through January. Smith registered his first goal for The Saddlers in his second appearance at Chesterfield and during his time with Swindon Town, hit 10 goals in just 23 league starts. The experienced **Simon Osborn** lists Walsall as his eighth club, after notable

spells with Wolves, Reading and Gillingham. He has made over 400 league appearances and is currently also part of the coaching team. Scottish midfielder **Paul Devlin** was also another recent addition to the squad and an experienced one, with 10 international caps to his name. He has a plethora of league experience and after starting his career at Stafford, he has had spells with Notts County, Sheffield United, Birmingham City and Watford. He also returned to two of those clubs on loan, but made a move from Watford to join Paul Merson's squad two weeks ago. **Michael Leary** came up through the ranks at Luton Town and was another recent loan addition to the Saddlers squad.

Danish-born **Mads Timm** is another player currently on loan with Walsall from Manchester United and he has been another player to receive favorable reviews during his time so far. Like Grant Smith, Timm also scored his first Saddlers goal against Chesterfield.

Kevin James, on loan from Nottingham Forest, had previous spells with Charlton Athletic and Gillingham before signing a permanent deal at The City Ground. However, after failing to make an impression in the first team he spent time on loan at Boston United before making the temporary switch to Walsall in early January.

Paul Merson

A former England International with 21 caps to his name, Merson took charge at The Bescot Stadium on a permanent basis during the summer of 2003 from Portsmouth.

The midfielder burst onto the scene at Arsenal, signing professional forms in December 1985 and going on to win two League Championships, the FA Cup, League Cup and European Cup Winners Cup during 12 successful years at Highbury.

He then joined Middlesbrough for £4.5million for whom his displays prompted Aston Villa to pay out £6.75million to secure his services in September 1998 and he went on to achieve legendary status at Villa Park before joining Pompey.



- Walsall were formed in 1888 when Walsall Town and Walsall Swifts amalgamated to become **Walsall Town Swifts FC**. They were first admitted to the Football League in 1892 as founder members of Division Two. They were later renamed to Walsall FC in 1895.

Interesting Facts...

- Because of their location, Walsall hold the record for the team **most re-elected** to the Football League. They would often switch between Division 3 North & South, depending on who had been relegated the previous season.
- After being saved from extinction by a local businessman in 1989,

the club moved to the **Bescot Stadium** in 1990. At the time it was a state-of-the-art arena, and was only the second new Football League Ground since the 1950's.

- Walsall appointed their first **foreign manager** in 1997 when ex-Ajax and Danish international Jan Sorensen took over the reigns.

Peacock

looking to show his colours

FROM THE TOWN THAT BROUGHT YOU TOM CONTI, GERRY RAFFERTY AND, ER, DAVID SNEDDON, LEE PEACOCK IS PAISLEY'S LATEST EXPORT...

The Scottish striker joins the Town from Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer after a colourful career embracing Carlisle, Mansfield, Manchester City, Bristol City and the Owls - with his transfer fees totalling £1 million.

And while it may seem a long move for the 29-year-old hitman, from Sheffield to Swindon, he told STFC Magazine that it's good to be back in the West Country. "Having been around this area before with Bristol City it will be great to come back and be close to my family," he admitted. "I have always had a good relationship with the fans at the clubs I have been at so hopefully I can settle in, score goals and we can climb the league. There are a few lads who I know here so it will be good to catch up with them. It seems to be a good squad here and I've had a chat with a few already."

Peacock got off to a flying start on his debut against AFC Bournemouth when,

having come on as a 75th-minute substitute for new partner Jamie Cureton, he got his first Swindon goal just 15 minutes into his Robins career. But it's not just goals that Peacock can bring to his new team, the 6' 1" attacker looking to help out his teammates by defending from the front: "I am a hardworking player, pretty mobile and hopefully I can contribute some goals - everywhere I have been I have scored goals and I want to continue that here. It was nice to get off to a scoring start and to some extent took the pressure off a little bit. Jamie Cureton also scored his first goal for the club and everyone was pleased for him too, so it was a good day all round. We have to defend better as a team, though, and that's something we have been working on in training."

Having already got acquainted with his new buddies, the next task is the small matter of lifting Town to League One safety. A big

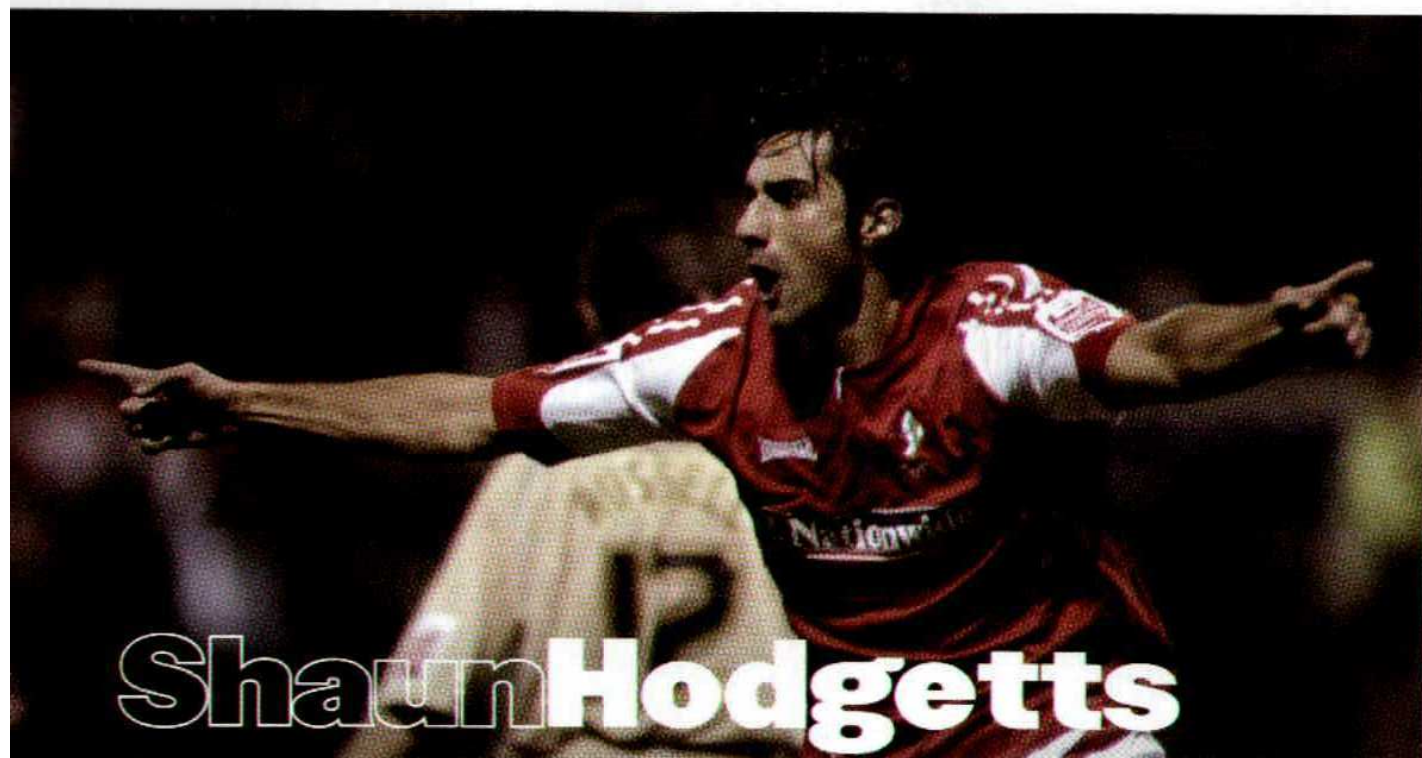
job, yes, but somebody's got to do it...

"We need to start picking up points and get out of the bottom four. It will be tough but I'm sure we can do it. I will be pushing myself to get that match sharpness back and then look forward to the games ahead."

Peacock assumes responsibility of the number 9 shirt - small boots to fill indeed. But as well as trying to pick up where 'Super Sammy' left off, Peacock is also aware that the pressure of scoring will now fall on his and Jamie's shoulders following Rory's defection to Swansea. Peacock is relishing the challenge... "With Rory going there is a challenge there for me to step up to the mantle. He wants to further his career and took the chance to do so with Swansea City. I want to carry on from where Rory left off in terms of goals and make an impression here."

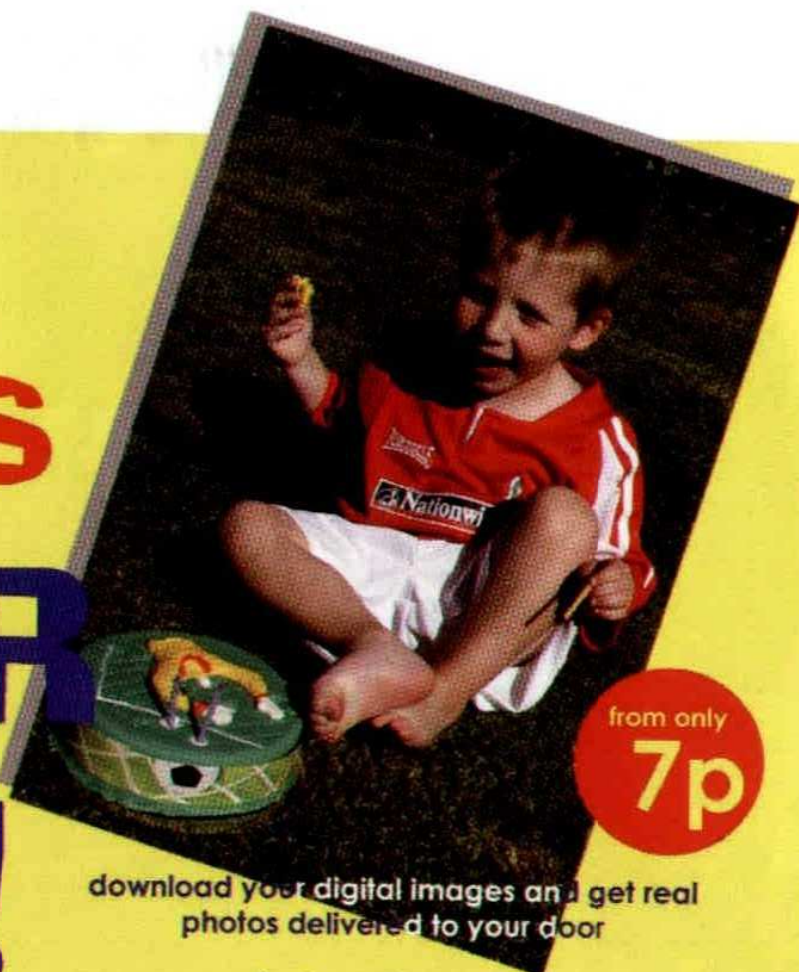

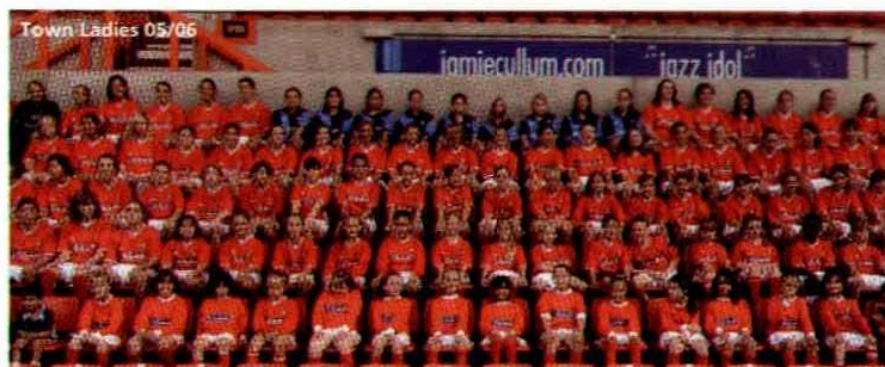

▶ **10/10 for diving**

The old adage that a goalkeeper can produce a dive for the cameras probably wasn't even fashioned when this picture was taken. Younger fans might not even recognise the ground, either, but believe it or not behind goalkeeper Mike Turner is where the Arkells Stand now lives here at CG HQ. Swindon-stopper Turner was unable to stop this shot against West Ham in the 1964 FA Cup fifth round despite his acrobatics, thankfully the cross bar in front of the Stratton Bank did!

▶ **Them were the days...**

...when you could still stand on the Shrivenham Road Terrace. This picture is so old both levels of the stand were still in use – for many fans will remember the top tier of the Shrivy Road Stand was closed for many years in the early 90s. The town winger in action is John Stevens, who bagged 10 goals in 24 appearances for the Reds. We'd like to think he managed to flick the ball past his marker, West Ham's Ken Brown.





◀ **Don on Don** (opposite page)

Some of the greatest sporting pictures have been ones that go behind the scenes, providing us with an access-all-areas insight into our heroes. Don Rogers was captured at home (so the caption says, although the room's décor here looks very much like the boardroom) the day after the game with the League Cup on his lap watching highlights of the Arsenal victory, in which he scored two goals.

◀ **And you are...**

There aren't as many pictures of the 1969 triumph as you'd see of a team that wins the tournament these days, (imagine if the same result happened today, how much coverage there would be), but this is a previously unseen shot of Town being introduced to Princess Margaret before the game.

▶ **Swing your pants**

No, not the game immortalised by Saturday morning kids' presenters, Trev and Simon, but the Swindon side of 1986. Few photographers gained access into teams' changing rooms, but after the Town defeated Arsenal in the League Cup (again, this time in the quarter-final) in 1979 – one lucky snapper got lucky and caught the lads drinking from beer cans and paper cups. 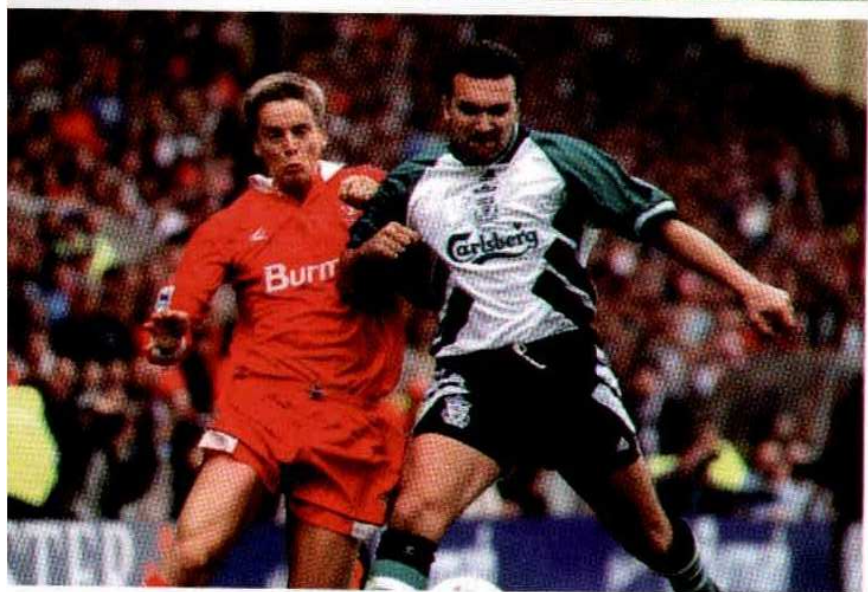


◀ **Crunch!**

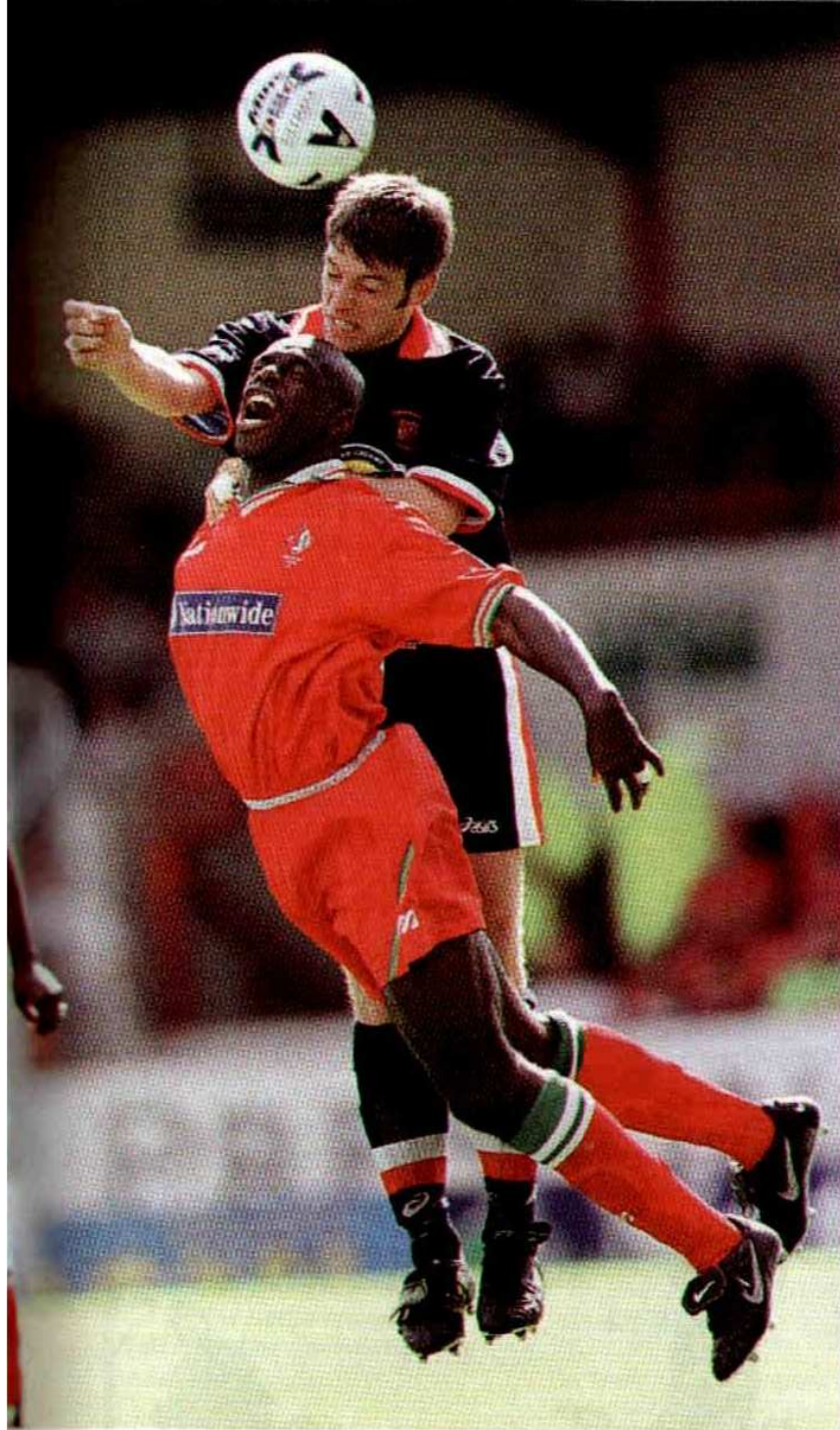
▶ **Sacre blue**

▶ **Back of the net**

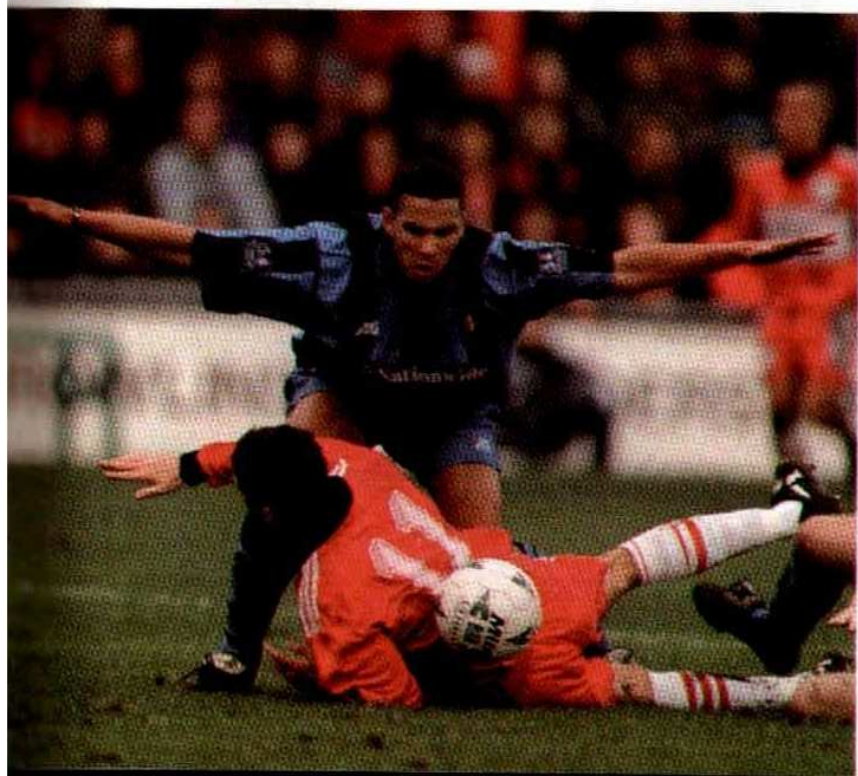

Town had had the sort of season that we are becoming re-acquainted with this term. The first Division Two win didn't come until the fifth game, when a solitary Alan Reeves goal brought a 1-0 at Bristol City, and by the end of November we had won just another three.

Inconsistent was the word that summed Town up. Starting

in November, we drew two then lost two, won two, then lost four. That was the trend for the whole season and by 28th April we were in desperate trouble at 19th in the table.

Thank goodness for the usual six points claimed against Oxford.

The last home match saw us entertain Peterborough and with 15 minutes to go Town still held the lead from a Gary Alexander 7th minute strike. Then Alan Reeves got on the score sheet again... but his own goal counted for the

With the match deep into injury time, Danny Invincible latched onto a through ball down the left, cantered forward and lashed the ball past Posh keeper Mark Tyler.

Pandemonium ensued, but we all suspected it would be too little, too late. Bristol Rovers had games in hand and it was either them or us for the last relegation place.

On the same day, Walsall did us that favour with a 2-1 win over Rovers, the first of three successive victories for the Saddlers. That left Rovers with three home matches and Town with just a trip to Stoke to come.

But by the season's last Saturday, it didn't matter. Rovers beat Wrexham 4-0 and Town lost 4-1 at the Britannia Stadium, but Rovers' inability to take anything from the previous two matches had left a four-point gap. Town were safe by a point.

For Walsall it was a far more successful campaign. Not out of the top three until March, the Saddlers dropped to fourth and stayed there to hold on for a play-off place.

A 0-0 draw at Stoke City was followed by a 4-2 victory in the second leg, and Walsall were Millennium Stadium bound, to face Reading. The game turned out to be a cracker.

On the half hour Jamie Cureton opened the scoring for the Royals in a side also containing Sammy Igoe and Adi Viveash. Walsall's Don Goodman restored parity three minutes into the second half, and just one minute of extra time had been played when Reading regained the lead.

Then two goals in two minutes took the score to 3-2 and Walsall into Division One.



For Town, hero Danny Invincible finished top scorer on nine League goals with Gary Alexander behind him on seven.

Walsall top scorer Jorge Leitao topped that total on his own and Brett Angel followed up with 13.

At the reckoning, Walsall's victory over Rovers coupled with Invincible's strike the same day cost Rovers their place in Division Two, kept us in it and assisted Walsall's push for promotion.

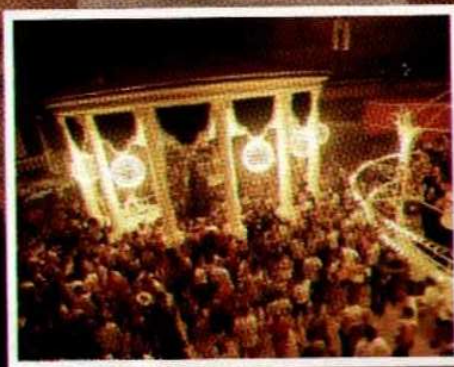

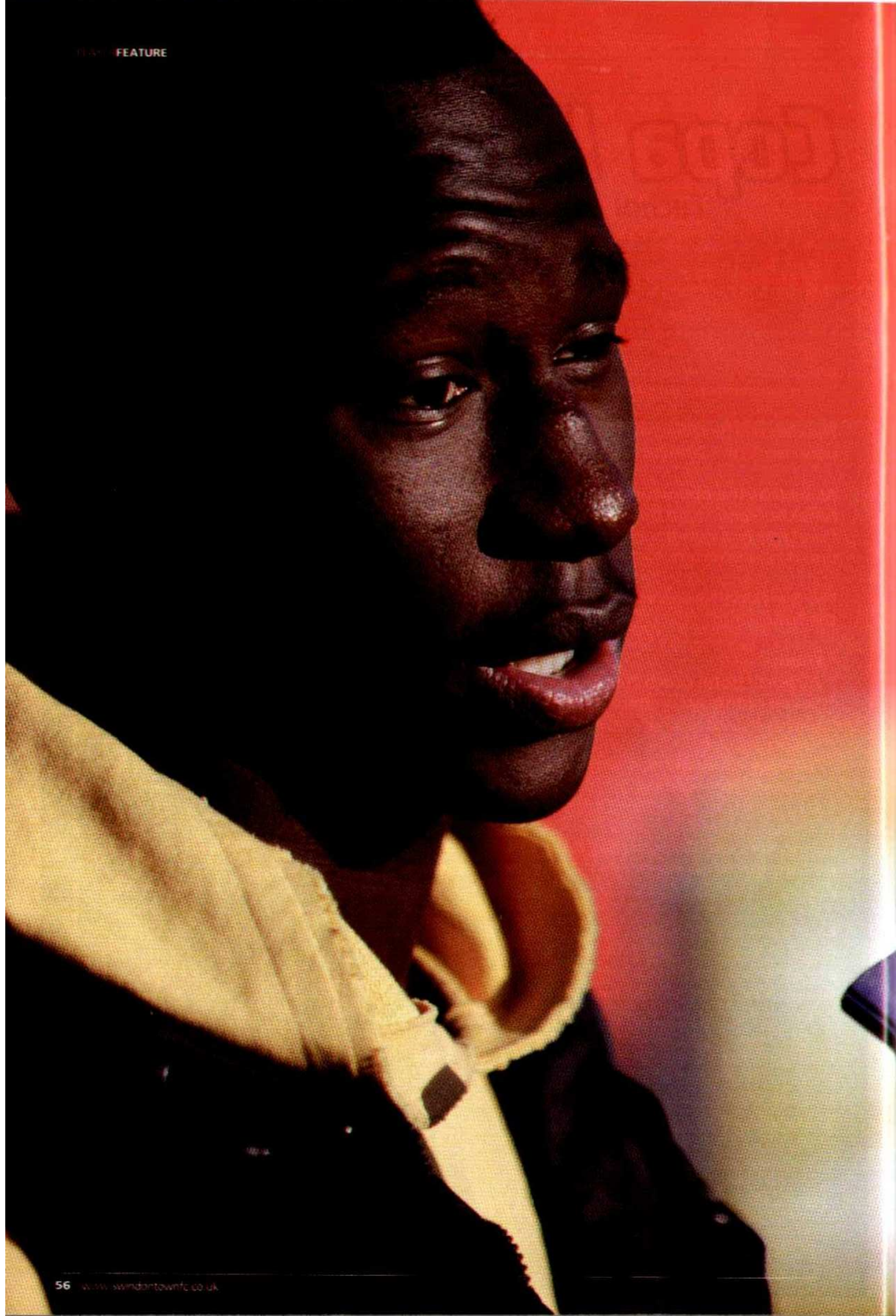

Aiming High

ALBERT JARRETT IS HOPING TO MAKE A BIG IMPRESSION DURING HIS LOAN SPELL WITH SWINDON TOWN, IN WHAT HAS BEEN LABELLED A 'MAKE OR BREAK' SEASON FOR THE FORMER ARSENAL YOUNGSTER...



The 20-year-old joined Iffy Onuora's squad on Thursday 19th January and made his debut against AFC Bournemouth just two days later – coming on as a second half substitute.

Jarrett arrived at The County Ground from Brighton & Hove Albion, where he had made 12 appearances in the Coca-Cola Championship so far this term. The Londoner looks back on his season so far in reflective mood.

"I had been enjoying a nice run in the Brighton side where I had played a few games, but then unfortunately got injured. When I came back to fitness the players in the side at the time were doing well, so decided to go out on loan and get some regular football under my belt. Whilst it is a step

down from the Championship but Swindon are a good club and I hope I can do well for them.

"It hasn't been a frustrating season – but some things haven't gone my way. I have come to Swindon hoping to work hard, impress a few people and make

the most of the opportunity.

"I want to add something to the Swindon team and I hope my time here can be beneficial for everyone. There are a few players here who I know already, such as Ricky Shakes and Aaron Brown. It is a young squad here, but there is a lot of talent in there," said Jarrett.

A former Arsenal schoolboy, Jarrett earned a three-year contract with the Seagulls after impressing Mark McGhee during a trial in the summer of 2004. He joined Brighton from MK Dons and also has spent time on loan at Stevenage Borough.

Manager Iffy Onuora was delighted to add the winger to his squad, with Jarrett signing in the same week as striker Lee Peacock.

"I was delighted with the players we added to the squad during the transfer window. To get Albert and Lee together was great and just what I wanted. Albert was someone who I had looked at for a while and was pleased to get him here," concluded the Town Boss.

However, Brighton & Hove Albion Manager Mark McGhee has previously admitted that this 2005-06 campaign is 'make-or-break time' for the player – as the Seagulls' Boss explained in an early season interview.

"Albert has got the ability. We know he can cross a ball and we know he can get past people. There are other aspects of his game that we need to improve for him to be able to play in the first team and win us games in the Championship. His attitude is spot on and he has given himself a chance," said McGhee.

With Town's focus on moving up League One, Albert Jarrett hopes to take any chances that come his way and impress the watching Swindon faithful.

"I am quite quick – a tricky winger and good on the ball. I have come into a new team and a new environment, but when things gel I would like to be able to provide that spark and creativity on the pitch. We will have to wait and see how things progress.

"The competition for places is high and I know that I will have to work hard to get into the team – but if I keep up the endeavour then I am sure a chance will come my way and it's one I have to take."

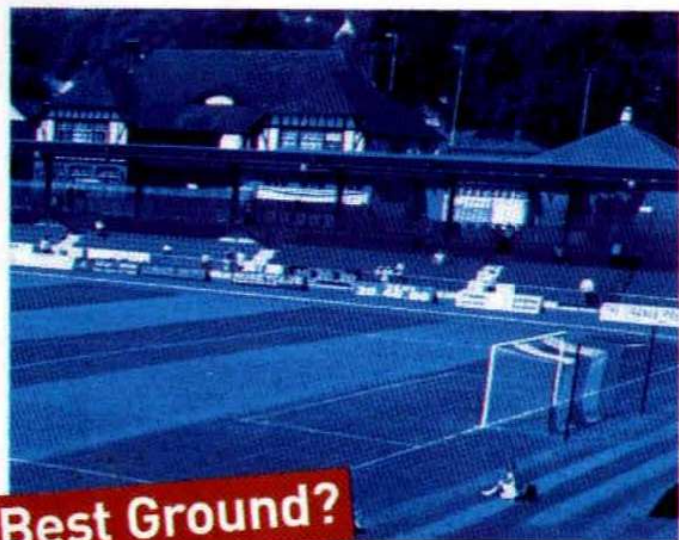

It's Doncaster Rovers next at the County Ground, a team who were sitting in the safety of mid-table as January entered its fourth week.

In Paul Heffernan and Michael McIndoe, Rovers have perhaps the deadliest strike force in League One. After 27 games, ex-Bristol City striker Heffernan had struck 13 times in all, with his strike partner following just one goal behind.

McIndoe (below) joined Rovers from Yeovil and is hoping to add a full Scotland cap to go with the B-international one he already holds. He was voted League One's player of the month for December.

Nineteen-year old striker Ross McCormack signed on a month's loan from Glasgow Rangers midway through the month, while centre back Graeme Lee made a permanent move from Sheffield Wednesday in return for £50,000. Keeper Alan Blayney is another transfer-window arrival.

One time Town trialist, English midfielder Jermaine McSparran is surely used to all the jokes about his name by now.

Rovers have already claimed three points against us when our first, post-King match back in September ended in a 1-0 win for the home side at the Earth Stadium.

Rovers caught national attention with their December League Cup match with Arsenal when they held the Gunners to a 2-2 draw before succumbing to defeat on penalties.

The match takes place in just four days time.

Manager Colin Todd held the reins here at Swindon for a matter of months before departing to Derby County, leaving Andy King to take the helm.

Striker Dean Windass has been prolific everywhere he has gone and this season is proving no different. Fourteen goals from 33 matches makes him amongst the best strikers in League One, and his strike three minutes from time in the match at Yeovil recently claimed all three points.

But the 36-year-old striker is currently unsettled, and interest from Barnsley was rebuked by City Chairman Julian Rhodes this month. With the January transfer window due to close, it remains to be seen whether Windass will feature for Bradford after today.

If he were to move on, Marc Bridge-Wilkinson, next top scorer on five, has a lot of ground to catch up to replace him.

At the time of going to press, The Bantams were 11th in the table on 38 points with 29 league matches played.

At home, City had won just four times over that period, a total which is fewer than Town have managed. With five defeats as well, we should be confident but not complacent that we can go north and get a desirable result.
